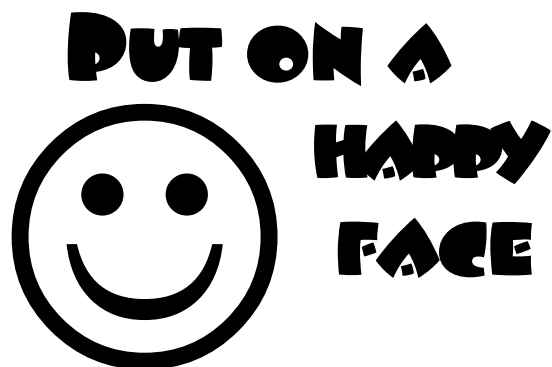
Caddies go international

Play will be completed today.

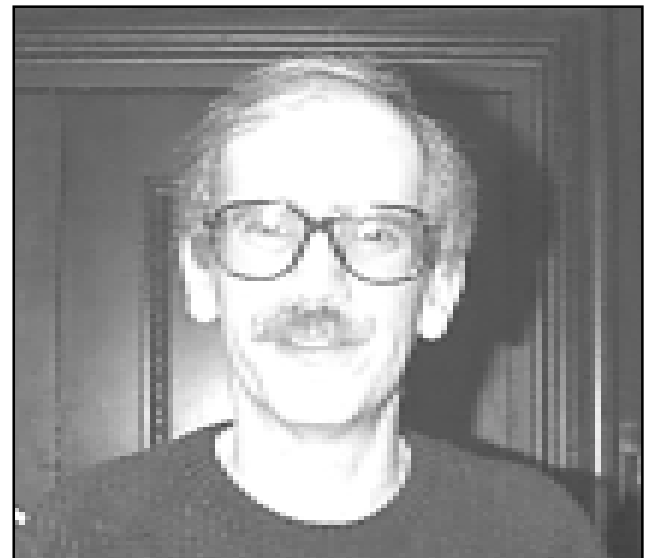
Senior Knockouts

Martel is Honorary Member for 2000

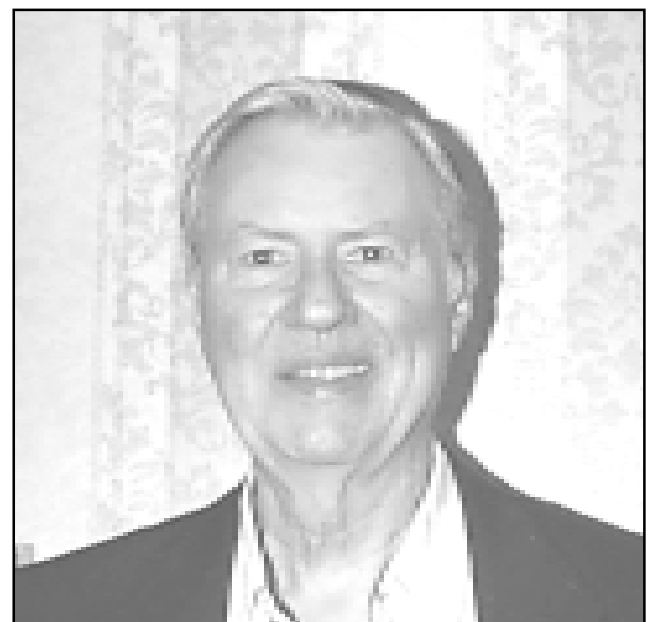
Chip Martel, 46, is a world champion, an able captain, an authority on the Laws, a bridge columnist, a consultant concerning computer bridge and an adviser on systems and conventions. No wonder the ACBL Board of Directors chose him to be the ACBL Honorary Member for the year 2000.

Martel thoroughly enjoys bridge in all its phases. "The combination of problem solving and human interaction makes the game especially appealing to me. Seeing all my friends when I go to a tournament is just as attractive as actually playing," he said. "And I like giving back something to the game that has done so much for me. I think all the top players should give something back to the game."

Martel considers himself lucky in the way that his bridge career has evolved. His parents, Ann and Martin, taught him the basics of the game, and he started playing with some of his friends in high school. He lived near the University of Illinois and came in contact with some of the young players who had been tutored by Kit Woolsey -- players like Cheri and Jim Bjerkan for example.

Then he moved on to MIT at the time when the likes of Mark Feldman, Steve Sion, Marc Jacobus, Charles Coon, Bart Bramley and J Merrill were active. Then it was on to the University of California at Berkeley for his Ph. D., and whom should he find as a partner but Lew Stansby. That was in 1977, so that makes the Martel-Stansby partnership one of the longest-lasting -- perhaps only the Eric Rodwell-Jeff

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Boston will be the last NABC for Associate National Director Max Hardy. An expert player with more than 10,000 master-points and a well-known bridge author, Hardy will retire from the directing scene as a 40-year veteran. He directed at his first NABC in 1972.

Coming up soon: the Bermuda Bowl

It won't be long before the bridge world turns its attention to the island of Bermuda, where the Orbis World Bridge Championships are scheduled for Jan. 7-21, followed by the annual Bermuda Regional, Jan. 22-29.

The schedule will be unlike any previous world championships. There will be the 50th anniversary Bermuda Bowl, the Venice Cup, the World Transnational Open Teams and the Orbis World Computer Bridge Championship. Everything will take place at the Southampton Princess Hotel.

If you are considering a trip to Bermuda for this bridge spectacular, here are a few things to bear in mind:

● The deadline for the World Transnational Open Teams was Nov. 1, but late entries will be considered. Contact your national contract bridge organization or visit the ACBL website at www.acbl.org. There is an entry form there that you can fill out.

The TNT, a very popular event in Hammamet, Tunisia (1997), could have as many as 100 teams. Qualifying for the TNT is not necessary and there are

no restrictions as to the nationalities of team members.

● The annual Bermuda Marathon is scheduled for Jan. 16, which means runners will be booking lots of airline tickets, in effect competing with bridge players for space on the planes. If you're registered for the TNT or other event, don't delay in making your plans to get to Bermuda.

● The fields for the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup will be the largest in history --- 20 teams in each. Eight ACBL teams --- four in each event --- will vie for the championships.

Restaurant maps

Some maps for the restaurant guide are available at the Registration Desks at the Marriott and the Westin. Both hospitality desks have a list of the 18 local restaurants that offer discounts to bridge players who show an ACBL convention card. The Marriott desk also has a poster-size version of the map.

Swiss Team event honors Richard Berk

Yesterday's A/X and B/C Swiss Teams were played in honor of Richard Berk, a familiar face on the New England scene both as a player and as a tournament director. The event was renamed the Richard Berk Memorial Swiss Teams.

One of the teams playing in the event consisted of his widow Elinor, his daughter Terry and her husband Allen McRae, and Bob LaFleur. They actually were leading the event going into the final match, but they lost in the last round and fell to fifth place.

According to his widow Elinor, "Richard loved life, his family, bridge and baseball. On the verge of becoming a major league umpire, Richard gave up baseball to spend more time with his family."

Richard supported himself through college by playing rubber bridge. He had a very active directing career in the Seventies and Eighties, and was a successful player for close to 30 years. He won an event at the Reno NABC, the last tournament he attended.

In the Nineties Richard and Elinor built a very successful travel agency. To them, finding the best flights at the best fares was a contest to be won for the customers.

"Richard was the perfect bridge partner and a wonderful person," said Elinor. "He is truly missed by all his old friends."

Small reward

Good technique was rewarded here, but only to the extent of an average minus.

When East opened 1♣ South overcalled in hearts, letting West declare 3NT on a heart lead. Now on a club shift declarer was due to make either 12 or seven tricks.

But when East actually opened 1♠ (not absurd even in a five-card major system), North led a club against 3NT. It was obvious for South to win his ace and continue with a club. Now declarer has to cash two top spades at once to take advantage of the doubleton ♠J to make 10 tricks. If declarer runs the diamonds at once without unblocking spades, North comes down to four spades and two clubs, holding declarer to nine tricks.

Fulfilling the prophecy

When Marty Seligman was attending Albany Academy back in the early Sixties, this was the entry about him in the class prophecy: "He will win a world bridge championship by executing a Vienna Coup."

Well, he has won a world championship -- he was playing captain of the American squad that won the OKbridge World Internet Teams championship. But what about that Vienna Coup?

Just before Saturday night's game, he was talking with his son David, with whom he was going to play. He joked about the class prophecy, but David said, "Well, maybe you can do your Vienna Coup today."

No doubt you've figured out what's coming. Here's the hand from the Saturday Evening Continuous Pairs.:

The opening lead was a diamond, and Marty ducked. West switched to the ♠K, and Marty ducked again -- the count was now rectified. He won the diamond return, cashed two rounds of hearts to see if they broke, and cashed the ♦A to set up the coup. Then he ran the rest of the hearts. And what was East to do? He had to keep three spades and two clubs, but nine tricks had already been played. So Marty took 11 tricks as the result of his successful execution of the Vienna Coup. The only problem was that it was a few days too late to fulfill the prophecy exactly.

The world's loudest suit preference signal?

On this unusual deal, North-South can't quite afford to play in hearts, the suit opened by East (the defense has five top tricks against 3♥ doubled for 200).

On the normal lead of the ♦J by South against East's contract of 3♣ after the unopposed sequence 1♥ - 1♠ - 2♣ - 3♣, North can see that the situation calls for desperate measures. When declarer cashes the ♥A, North follows with the king! When declarer leads a second heart, South ruffs with the king as North follows with the ♥Q. Now the defense get to cash their winners before declarer takes his discards on the diamonds. This holds East to just 10 tricks.

New Life Masters

The points he won in the Non-Life Master Pairs were enough to put WILLIAM BLAKESLEY of Martha's Vineyard into the Life Master class. His partner was David Donald.

Teams look for repeat in Women's BAM

Last year's winning squad in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams is now two teams and both are looking for repeat wins.

The New York-Texas squad -- Judi Radin and Sylvia Moss, New York; Peggy Sutherlin and Petra Hamman, Dallas; Mildred Breed, Bryan TX, and Shawn Quinn, Katy TX -- took the lead in the first final session and held on to win by a little more than a board.

Radin and Moss are playing with Carol Simon and Kitty Munson this year while the Texans have added two more Texans: Robin Klar, Spring, and Joan Jackson, Dallas.

That sextet won the Women's Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Vancouver and (with Hjordis Eythorsdottir instead of Quinn) finished third in this summer's Women's International Team Trials.

The Coffin Trophy

Winners of the Women's Board-a-Match Teams will have their names inscribed on the Coffin Trophy, one of the oldest and most historic trophies in NABC competition. For years there was only one "National" Women's Team championship -- and that was a board-a-match event.

Donated by Charles Emmet Coffin in 1933, the trophy was contested at the "Winter Nationals" in the days when there were only two NABCs -- Summer and Winter. In 1963 the event was moved to the new Spring NABC where it was in play until the format was changed to knockout teams in 1976.

For the next decade, there was no national Women's Board-a-Match championship. Swiss teams had become popular and a Women's Swiss with NABC rating was established in the early Eighties. But board-a-match play for women was not dead -- it was just in hiatus for a few years.

The Coffin Trophy was revived at the Fall NABC in Atlanta in 1986 and new life was breathed into women's board-a-match play.

Zeke & Co. look to repeat in Senior KO

Zeke Jabbour is looking for his fifth win in six years when play gets under way today in the Senior Knockout Teams, an event limited to players 55 and older.

Winners will have their names engraved on the trophy presented by the U. S. Playing Card Co.

Jabbour, playing with Mike Levine, Arnie Fisher, Fred Hamilton, Tommy Sanders and Chuck Said, won the KO last year in Orlando. He also won in 1994, 1995 and 1996. He was on the runner-up team in 1997.

"The aging of the ACBL has made this a really tough event," says Jabbour, who has won 25 of 26 Senior KO matches.

Door prizes

Today's door prize, offered by the Maine Bridge Association, is a handmade quilt in the "Winning Hand" pattern. The quilt was made by Lorraine Letourneau, wife of Maine's unit liaison and volunteer recruiter Dr. Fred Letourneau.

Baze squad seeks Open BAM repeat

The five-man squad captained by Grant Baze is seeking a repeat win in the Open Board-a-Match Teams. Baze teamed with Michael Whitman, Fred Gitelman, George Mittelman and Brad Moss to win the event by more than two boards last year. They will be competing for the Victor Mitchell Trophy, which honors one of bridge's most colorful characters -- a champion player, philosopher and mentor to the stars.

Mitchell, a Grand Life Master with more than 10,000 masterpoints, won five North American championships including the Spingold in 1956 and 1959, the Life Master Men's Pairs in 1962 and the Men's Teams in 1962 and 1963.

Mitchell claimed that he never played bridge for glory or prestige. "The people," he said, "are more important than the bridge. I've met some of the most fantastic people playing bridge. I've had a ball."

He was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

The game

The Open Board-a-Match Teams is a four-session event consisting of two qualifying and two final sessions. It was a men's event until 1990 when it became an open event.

Perhaps the event's high point occurred in 1977 when there were only three winners: Richard Doughty, Ron Smith and Lou Bluhm. Sidney Lazard was supposed to play with Doughty but after a good first set, Lazard became ill and Irv Kostal took his place for the evening session.

Lazard was better the next day and in his seat for the first final session. Suddenly he toppled over and a call went out for paramedics. They arrived quickly and rushed Lazard to a hospital.

Meanwhile, Doughty had to find another partner and Bruce Ferguson was pressed into service. Ferguson, whose team had not qualified the previous day, was technically ineligible but allowed to play only in the afternoon. In the evening, Doughty recruited Les West -- his fourth partner in four sessions -- and the team went on to victory by a margin of two full boards.

The grand route

Jim Batchelder and Joe Stubbe had a good auction to get to a grand slam in clubs on this deal yesterday. Then it was up to Batchelder to find 13 tricks.

Batchelder went up with the ace on the opening heart lead and led a club to the ace. Then he attacked diamonds, and the defense was helpless. He was able to set up his long diamonds with two ruffs as East helplessly discarded and West helplessly followed suit. He got rid of his losing heart on the ♠K.

South led the ♥10, won by Breed in hand. She then played a spade to the ace and called for dummy's ♣2, playing the queen when North played low. South won the ♣K and shifted to a diamond. North won the ace. A spade exit would have allowed the defense to prevail, but North erred by playing a heart.

Breed took full advantage. Noting North's takeout double from the auction, she ruffed the heart high and played a low club toward dummy, covering South's ♣4 with the ♣5. Having successfully finessed against the ♣7, Breed then had the entries to establish the heart suit. A low heart was ruffed high in the closed hand, and a low club to the 9 drew the outstanding trump.

Breed then ran the hearts, discarding her losing diamonds.

Plus 400 was worth 34.5 out of 38 matchpoints.

But wait! South missed her chance to foil declarer's plan. When Breed advanced the ♣3 to take the club finesse, South should play the ♣7. Now declarer has insufficient entries to pick up the remaining trump and run the hearts.

Joe Grue bid 2♣ to set up the game force, and East doubled to show clubs. But Ian Boyd had a good club holding, so he redoubled, leaving it up to Grue to decide what to do. Grue decided it wouldn't be too hard to take eight tricks with the combined holdings.

The score didn't have to be that big -- there was some help from the defense. East led the ♠J and West ducked to the king. Now Grue took the successful diamond finesse and led a spade. Once again West ducked, so the 10 won. Now Grue was able to cash two top hearts and pitch dummy's remaining spades. Now he had no losers outside trumps. Actually the defense managed to take only two trump tricks, so Grue made three overtricks at 400 a trick.

Meckstroth pairing has lasted longer among active partnerships.

Martel's record is one of the best -- he has won four world championships. The most famous was the Martel-Stansby World Open Pairs victory in Biarritz, France, in 1982. When the scores first were released, a Dutch pair was hailed as champions. But it soon became apparent that there was a major scoring error. After lots of refiguring, Martel and Stansby were proclaimed the winners. Martel also won two Bermuda Bowls (1985 and 1987) and one Rosenblum Teams (1994). Maybe he should be credited with a fifth world championship -- he captained the United States to the World Junior Championship at Ann Arbor MI in 1991. He also has 19 North American titles, including five Vanderbilts, four Reisingers and one Spingold.

In recent years he has played most of his bridge with either Stansby or his wife Jan. Strangely enough, both men have done better in pair events with their wives than with each other -- except for the world championship, of course.

He also has had success playing with Rodwell, Zia, Michael Rosenberg and Robert Levin.

Martel began his intensive work with Juniors in 1991 when Bobby Wolff prevailed on him to captain one of the American teams. He was a captain again in 1993, earning a bronze medal, and has been involved in Junior work ever since.

His other connections with bridge are far-reaching. They include co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission, vice chairman of the WBF Laws Commission, member of the WBF Systems Committee, member of the WBF Junior Committee, member of the ACBL Competitions and Conventions Committee, member of the ACBL Computer Advisory Committee, chairman of the Conditions of Contest Committee for the International Team Trials. He also has been commissioned by ACBL President Val Covalciuc to look at what's happened in bridge and look ahead to what's going to happen in the next century. He believes computers will have much to do with the popularity of bridge, so he feels that his work with the Computer Advisory Committee perhaps is the most important of his actions.

Oh yes -- Martel writes letters too. An article that appeared in the sports section of the *San Francisco Chronicle* told that urine samples were being taken for drug testing from a new sport -- chess. The reporter wrote that probably bridge was going to be next. Martel wrote to the paper telling them that bridge had already made the grade -- competitors in the Bermuda world championships are scheduled for drug testing. □

Look at that South hand and plan the defense.

The best way to beat 4♥ has to be to put partner on lead to play spades through declarer's presumed king --- isn't it? So our unnamed hero (or was it goat?) in the South seat led a low diamond. Imaginative and unlucky, but only if Fred put up the ♦Q --- and he did! That was his 10th trick, not surprisingly for a great score.

Of course the purists would point out that with hearts and clubs splitting there were always 10 tricks anyway except on the lead of the ♠A --- but this was more fun.

Ruff and discard

To give one ruff and discard looks like carelessness. To give two looks very like . . . brilliance? One of the most challenging deals of the tournament came in the consolation event on Saturday evening.

Most of the field played in a heart contract from the East seat, making 10 tricks. But consider the defense to 4♥ on a diamond lead. Declarer must cash the three top spades to get rid of his losing diamond.

Now it seems sensible to take the heart finesse. The defense wins the king to play a second diamond. Declarer ruffs to lead a club. The winning defense is to take the ♣K and force declarer with a spade or a diamond. Declarer ruffs -- it does not matter in which hand -- and plays a second club. The defense plays a second plain suit card, forcing declarer to ruff again. Whichever hand he ruffs in, he'll find the trumps blocked. Declarer can't draw all the trumps, and although he can draw a second round of trumps, he has to leave one trump out and then play on clubs. That lets the defense score the 13th trump, holding declarer to only nine tricks. This defense saves a very valuable trick.

After the above auction, one declarer received the ♠9 lead. He took this with the king and led the ♥4 to the 10 and ace. West cashed one high spade as East discarded an encouraging club. However, West chose to attack declarer's transportation suit and exited safely with the ♥5. Declarer won the king and had to play carefully. With the ♥Q as the only safe entry to dummy, declarer had to attack diamonds. He led the queen, covered by the king and ace. He continued with the ♦3, winning with the 10 when East ducked. Declarer then cashed one high club and could wait no longer to squeeze East. He led a heart to the queen and this was the position:

When declarer led the ♥8, East was caught in a three-loser squeeze. If East sluffed the ♦8, declarer would lead a diamond to East, endplaying her for an overtrick. Instead, East correctly tossed a club, so declarer led the ♣J to the queen and king. Now the club exit left East endplayed in diamonds. 3NT bid and made.

Calling the Director

Martha McGhee, co-chair of the 1998 Orlando NABC, was IN chairman at the 1992 NABC. This article appeared in the Daily Bulletin at that tournament.

Call the who ...? The Director! It's okay to call the director. If fact, if you don't, you may lose your right to call him later if you are damaged.

The director is the one who sold you an entry, the one who passed out the board, the one who passed out the hand records and said, "Duplicate, please." The director is the one who organized the players and the boards so that everything runs smoothly at the right time, the right speed and the right direction.

The director is the one you need help from if and when an irregularity happens at your table. The director gives rulings pertaining to the "Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge."

In order for the conditions of the game to be fair, everyone has to follow the same rules. The director is familiar with these rules and is responsible for seeing that they are correctly applied.

The director is also the one who calls the rounds when it is time for you to meet your new opponents. The director puts the results of each board into the computer and posts the computer print-out of results after each session.

When you need a director, raise your hand and call out "Director, please" -- loudly enough for him to hear but not so loudly that it disturbs the other players. When the Director arrives at your table, he will listen to what happened and explain to the players the ruling that pertains to the irregularity.

Some rulings have several options so if you don't understand them fully, don't hesitate to ask for them to be repeated.

Since the conditions at each table must be duplicated as much as possible, all the players must adhere to the same set of rules. The Director's main objective is to make the game as fair as possible for all the players involved, while ensuring that everyone has an enjoyable time.

Irregularities that may happen at your table for which you must call the director: a lead out of turn, an insufficient bid, a revoke, a card missing from a hand, a bid or pass out of turn, failure to Alert an artificial bid, changes of call, disagreements of tricks won, claims with trumps outstanding or disputed claims, bidding errors, etc.

The Director is your friend. Do not hesitate to call him or her. In fact, if you don't call the Director, you may have lost the right to call him later when you discover you have been damaged.

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as "transfer" -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

East led a low club. West won the ace and returned the ♦K.

Declarer seems to have three losers --- one club and two spades --- but Lau played for a particular layout of the spade suit to allow him to bring home the contract.

After winning the ♦A, he ruffed a diamond in dummy and returned to his hand with a trump. Another diamond ruff followed, and he again returned to his hand with a trump. Lau ruffed his last

diamond and now made the killing play of the ♠A followed by a low spade. East was forced to win the trick and give a ruff and a sluff to make 11 tricks.

Declarer's only chance to succeed was to find one defender with two bare spade honors.

Zero Tolerance, Truscott style

Alan Truscott submitted the following note to the Daily Bulletin.

Zero tolerance for directors?

I propose that in the rare situation in which the directors do something irritating, such as messing up the movement or, as happened here at the start of one of the games, send somebody to the wrong hotel from the correct hotel, they should be penalized. Penalty: villains buy drinks for the victims.

Answer by National Tournament Director Sol Weinstein: The directors will be happy to accept this, with one small proviso. The plan must work both ways. A player who causes a lot of trouble for a director must buy him or her a drink.
