Budd upsets Levine in Senior Knockouts

The team captained by Richard Budd of Portland ME came from behind to eliminate the defending champion team captained by Mike Levine of Boca Raton FL in yesterday's quarterfinals of the Microsoft Senior Knockout Teams. Budd will face the squad captained by Jan Nathan of Manhattan Beach CA in one of today's semifinals.

The other semi will see the Hamish Bennett (Menlo Park CA) team battling the Jim Sternberg (Jupiter FL) squad.

The LEVINE loss ended Zeke Jabbour's attempt to win the Senior Knockouts for the fifth time in the six years it has been played. Other members of the team also had been champions before -- Tom Sanders, Chuck Said and Fred Hamilton had two previous victories. Arnie Fisher was on last year's championship team.

Playing with BUDD were Robert Ryder, Caldwell NJ; Shome Mukherjee, Randolph MA, and Bill Hunter, Reading MA. LEVINE got off to a fast start, leading by 30 after the first 16 boards. In the second quarter BUDD rallied to cut the deficit to 3. LEVINE upped their lead to 5 in the third quarter, but in a tight finish BUDD eked out a 111-109 victory.

NATHAN eliminated the team captained by Marc Low, 162-145. STERNBERG scored an easy victory over the Louise Childs squad. BENNETT had a relatively easy time against Jack Coleman and company, 167-101.

In today's matches the teams will play a 64-board match. Tomorrow's final also will consist of 64 boards.

Justl, James victors in Jackpot Pairs

Paula Justl and Terry James of Columbus OH posted a 427.5 to win the Jackpot Pairs event by more than two boards. The partnership split the first prize of \$1080.

The Jackpot Pairs was held as part of Monday's Stratified Open Pairs. Participants who wanted to play for cash prizes in addition to masterpoints paid a higher entry fee. Cash prizes were awarded to first and second place overall, as well as for section tops.

Claire Alpert of New York NY and Larry Dusty of Lake Worth FL were second overall, with a score of 400, winning \$690 for their efforts.

Both partnership's scores were good enough to finish first and second not only in the Jackpot game, but in the larger Stratified Pairs field as well.

Participants in the Jackpot contest who earned section tops won \$20 per pair. The following pairs won two section tops (and \$40) in the event: David Meyer of Scranton PA and Albert Shrive of Clarks Green PA; Peter Stromberg and Frederick Nystrom of Sweden; Dave Wachsman and Janis Wachsman of East Meadow NY.

These contestants scored one section top each: Ed Ulman and Tony Glynn of Portland OR; Frank Allison of West Hempstead NY and Arthur Brodsky of Huntington Station NY; David Yang of Chicago IL and Xiaodong Shi of Highland Park IL; Marty Seligman of Philadelphia PA and Steve Catlett of Richmond VA; Franco Baseggio of New York NY and Timothy Goodwin of South Portland ME; Mark McCarthy of San Francisco CA and Lee De Simone of Alexandria VA; Alverto Dhers of Aventura FL and Franco Gusso of Pompano Beach FL; Larry Bausher of Hamden CT and Mark Aquino of Jamaica Plain MA; P.O. Sundelin of Stockholm, Sweden and Joseph Silver of Hampstead PQ.

Barrow shatters Top 500 record

Jim Barrow of Lake Charles LA has broken the record for the most masterpoints earned in a year, officially referred to as the *Barry Crane Top 500* masterpoint contest.

Barrow, who was a member of a winning knockout team Tuesday evening, earned enough masterpoints in the event to surpass the 15-year-old record of 3270 points established by Grant Baze. Barrow's unofficial total now stands at 3282 masterpoints.

"It's a full-time job," said Barrow, who has planned to perform this feat for many years.

"I first tried this in 1980, but at the time I wasn't experienced enough and, more importantly, I forgot to ask Barry Crane's permission." Crane, the renowned matchpoint wizard, dominated the contest for decades and was such a force that he frequently decided who would win the race (if he didn't do so himself) by playing with a particular person that he would designate as that year's heir-apparent.

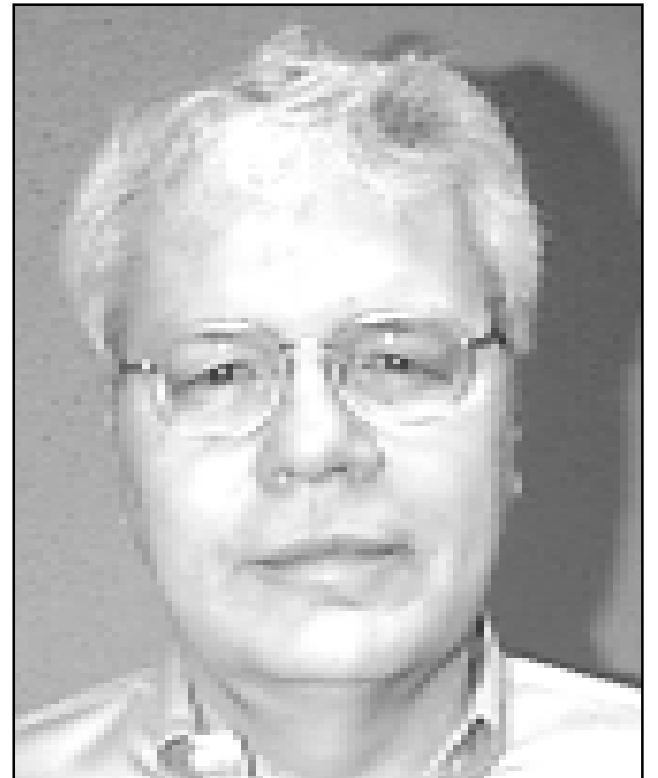
"I think I hurt his feelings by not asking, too" said Barrow who finished second in the 1980 race.

With Crane's murder in 1985, the cult-of-personality that so influenced the contest disappeared, but Barrow would have to wait several years for another opportunity to win the race to present itself.

Barrow, 57, decided he wanted to wait for a year in which he had the time and the money to pursue the race full-time. He also wanted to keep a day-to-day journal of the race in order to write a book about his experiences.

"A woman named Kay Blake, from Lake Charles, is putting together a book for me based on my notes," said Barrow. "I don't expect it to be a money maker, but there might be some players interested in reading about what the daily grind is like."

Barrow said that he has played with 150-175 partners and teammates over the course of 1999. He has semi-regular partnerships with David Adams, John Potter, Jim Robison, Hugh McLean and David Siebert, and Phil Brady. Brady was on the team that put him



over the top, along with Jim Murphy, Dar Afdahl, Judi Cody and JoAnne Casen.

"I knew that I would win this race unless someone like Soloway or Meckstroth set out to win the thing themselves. But it's a lot of work, a lot of travel and it wasn't always fun. In order to break the record, I knew that I'd have to win 75-80 masterpoints a week. Even when I did well at a regional, I knew I'd have to get up the next morning, travel to a new tournament and do it all over again."

The quest was a personal one for Barrow, but despite the tiring, year-long schedule, he seems philosophical about the race.

"I don't equate it with a national or world championship. It was just for fun."

Meckstroth leads Player of the Year, Decade races

The *Player of the Year* winner is that player who earns the most masterpoints in nationally-rated events, which pay platinum points. The "platinum race" includes events such as the Grand National Teams, Senior events and various Women's championships, but not Junior, Flight B or other restricted events.

Jeff Meckstroth leads the 1999 *POY* contest with 542.24 platinum points. Meckstroth added 340 platinum points to his total at this year's Summer NABC in San Antonio by winning both the Grand National Teams, Flight A and the Spingold Knockout championship.

Close behind is longtime partner Eric Rodwell who has 522.88 points.

The *Player of the Decade* race is an unofficial contest sponsored by *The Bridge Bulletin* magazine. It includes all nationally-rated contests from Spring 1990 to Fall 1999. Meckstroth leads this contest as well, with 4666.12 platinum points. Rodwell is second in this race also, with 4523.65 points. Zia Mahmood is third with 4319.85 points.

The Boston NABC is the last national event of the *POD* race.

Glubok, Larsen lead BRP qualifiers

Brian Glubok of Hampstead PQ and partner Kyle Larsen of San Francisco CA topped the list of participants in the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs after the first two qualifying sessions.

Glubok and Larsen scored 2140.76 matchpoints to lead the field. Next, with 2071.19 matchpoints, were Peter Boyd and Steve Robinson of the Washington, D.C. area. In third is the Italian pair of Humberto Bocchi and Giorgio Duboin with 2059.10 matchpoints.

Defending champions Zia Mahmood and Howard Weinstein are fourth with 2020.33.

A local player --- David Becher of Swampscott MA --- is in fifth place with partner Alan Watson of Malvern PA. They scored 2015.26 matchpoints.

The six-session Blue Ribbon Pairs is one of the premier pair contests in the world. Players become eligible to play in the event by earning Blue Ribbon qualifications, either by finishing first or second in an unlimited regionally-rated (or higher) event or by being on the ACBL Top 100 masterpoint list, which confers automatic Blue Ribbon eligibility.

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy. The contest was renamed the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs this year in honor of the legendary player, author and Laws expert.

Opening lead hits the jackpot

To be a first-class defender, it's sometimes necessary to visualize the entire deal before making the opening lead. That's exactly what Mark Itabashi did on this deal from Monday's Jackpot Pairs. Itabashi was playing with partner Sam Lowell.

Over Itabashi's frisky 3♣ preempt, East doubled. When West jumped to 4♠, East bid 5♠ to ask his partner about a club control. West passed to deny first- or second-round control of the club suit.

Itabashi, now on lead, reasoned that West must have a powerful hand with good trumps and either two or three fast club losers. The contract might fail on its own merits, but Itabashi decided that it might be necessary to try to give partner a club ruff for the setting trick. Since East had also denied a club control, Itabashi found the opening lead of a low club.

Lowell won the trick with the king and returned a club to Itabashi's ace. A third round of clubs allowed Lowell to score his ♠J.

Bridge really *is* an easy game.

I lose, but I win

Rona Levine led a heart to the jack, and Steve Levine played low! This destroys the later entry for the squeeze-endplay on South. Declarer went after diamonds and Steve won the second round. He continued with the ♥K, pinning the jack. Now West cashed out for plus 600, but the defenders received 9.5 points on a 12 top. This possibility was not mentioned in the deals booklet.

Cover an honor with an honor

In the Board-a-Match qualifying, both tables in my match reached 3♠ by North in competition over 3♣ after East had shown clubs and hearts.

Consider the play on a club lead. The best defense must be repeated club leads, but at both tables a trump shift at trick two went to the ace and a trump went back to dummy's king. Perhaps the best percentage line is to lead a heart to the ace to ruff a club, then to play hearts from the top. This is at least a genuine percentage line. Both tables however elected to lead a heart to the ace and run the ♥10. When this held, they could ruff a club and cash the hearts, claiming nine tricks. Of course on reflection East would probably regret his decision not to cover the ♥10 with the jack. That destroys the entries for the club ruff and holds declarer to eight tricks.

Both tables played 2♥ here, the contract played at most tables I expect. 3♣ goes for 300 on best defense, although it is easy to see how a heart lead lets 3♣ out for one down. Anyway, in 2♥ on a club lead best defense is to continue that suit (which leads to declarer making only 140 on the normal spade misguess). However, at my table the club lead to the queen was followed by a heart shift to the 10 and ace. I ruffed the club return, crossed to dummy and drew trumps. Now where is the ♠Q?

Well, since West, a sound bidder, has ♣A-K-Q and the ♥Q (11 HCP) and a very balanced hand, probably he needs the ♠Q for his opening bid -- unless he has the ♦J. So it seems appropriate to play off all the top diamonds to see if West has the ♦J. Rats, West does have that card! This is the ending:

I passed the ♠10 to West and claimed the rest. I was irritated of course, but not so irritated as to miss the fact in the post-mortem that West had the chance to be brilliant (and to save half a board) by ducking the ♠Q. When I repeat the spade finesse, West wins and plays the ♣A, and the spade blockage leads to my being able to make no more than nine tricks.

Casen and Cody help Barrow break record

When Jim Barrow broke Grant Baze's record, yesterday for most points won in a year, he was getting lots of help from the two women on his team -- Judi Cody and JoAnne Casen. The other members of the team were Dar Afdahl, Bill Brady and Jim Murphy, but this story is about the women.

Cody and Casen were playing INT forcing over an opening major-suit bid, but Casen decided there has to be an exception once in a while.

What do you bid over 1NT with Casen's hand? Rebid spades? Hardly! You have to rebid 2♦ on the weak three-card suit. Casen decided this was the exception -- she passed. Clearly it was the right time to do so.

The play was a bit on the bizarre side. The opening club lead went to the jack and king, and Cody led the ♠8, putting in the 9 when West played low. The 9 held the trick! So she cashed the top spades and gave up a spade. East continued the attack on clubs, dummy's ace winning. After cashing her good spade, Cody switched to hearts, putting in the 10 and forcing West to use his ace to win the trick. West cashed the ♣Q and was unhappy about the lie of that suit. West switched to diamonds, cashing the ace and leading a second on which Cody played the 10. This forced the king, and East was endplayed. He was able to cash his ♥K, but then he had to give Cody her seventh trick with her ♥Q.

The women found a classy defense on our next deal.

Casen got off to the ♠K lead, getting an encouraging card from Cody. She led low to Cody's ♣A and the defense then gathered in their third club trick. What next, wondered Casen. She decided that no spade was going to get away, but a heart might, so she shifted to the ♥J. Right she was. If she had gone after spades by leading the ace, declarer would have been able to park his losing heart on the ♠Q. Now the defense was poised to take a heart trick when they took their spade, and that meant a one-trick set.

The auction was quick and to the point on this next deal.

Casen figured her ♠Q was golden when Cody jumped in spades. When Cody showed three key cards in response to Blackwood, Casen went all the way to the cold grand.

The cruelty of BAM

Looking at the hands below, it is difficult to determine the best place to land. Vul vs. non-vul, these were our hands:

♠ K Q J 7 6 3 2
♥ J 10
♦ 5
♣ A K 3

Slam certainly is possible. 6♠ requires 3-3 spades. 6♥ requires the ♥Q onside doubleton or three times. 6NT combines some chances and perhaps is best.

Only three tables bid and made slam of the 26 that played the hand in our section. The most popular spot was 4♠ making four.

At our table the bidding went 1♥ - 2♣ overcall - Pass - Pass - Double - All Pass. When declarer slipped a trick, we took 11 tricks for plus 1400. Unfortunately it was not enough as our opponents bid and made 6♥ for plus 1430.

At IMPs, 1400 rated to win 12-14 IMPs. Even in this situation it would be a loss of just 1 IMP. At matchpoints we would have scored 21 on a 25 top. But at board-a-match (which I still love), it was a cold zero. And the 2♠ overcall on ♠ A 10 9 5 4 ♥ 8 6 4 3 ♦ 7 ♣ 7 5 4 won the board.

The most challenging suit preference ever?

Look at Board 33 and consider the defense to 3♥ by West.

On a spade lead and continuation, declarer draws two rounds of trumps and strips spades, then exits in diamonds, leaving this position:

It is only at this point that both South and North can really come to grips with the real point of the deal. South gets to cash two rounds of diamonds and then has to decide what to do in clubs. The auction and play thus far mark North with the ♣A. From South's perspective, if North has the ♣Q also, the defense has two tricks to come in the suit -- and if North does not have the 10 the defense has no chance! What's more, North with the ♣10 knows that if South has the ♣Q the defense have two tricks in the suit, and if he does not have the jack, the defense has no chance! So the key is who has the 8? If South has it, he shifts to a low club to get his two tricks. If North has it, he has to signal South to shift to a low club (by following with his two lowest diamonds on the second and third rounds.) That way South puts in the 10 and gets two tricks in the suit. But if North does not have the ♣8 (and South knows he doesn't have it), he must shift to the ♣J, giving declarer the losing option in the suit. If declarer goes up with the queen and finesses against North's ♣10, he deserves to make his contract!

And, believe it or not, Curtis Cheek, playing with Billy Miller, found the ♣J play -- but David Berkowitz guessed right to cover with the queen. Well done, everyone.

The Facts: 3♠ made three, plus 140 for E/W. The Director was called when it took East 10 seconds to double 3♣. All players agreed the pause had been 10 seconds. The Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative to West's 3♠ bid. The contract was changed to 3♣ doubled, made three, plus 670 for N/S.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East did not attend the hearing. West was in a hurry to catch a train. The facts not being in dispute, and the parties being amicable to it, an abbreviated fact finding session ensued with both sides stating their case. West then left. West stated that his own club length told him that East's double was manifestly not a trump stack. His own length in both majors detracted from his partner's tricks on defense while increasing the chance that 3♠ would make. He considered that bidding 3♠ was simply a bridge valuation and that the tempo of the double was irrelevant. E/W have played together twice in the last year — the length of the partnership. N/S believed that a slow double made removal to 3♠ by West more attractive. At the vulnerability the chance of plus 200 from 3♣ doubled and minus 200 from 3♠ were real.

The Committee Decision: The Committee was of the opinion that the correct bridge bid with the West cards was to remove the double of 3♣ to 3♠. While at any other vulnerability there would clearly be no logical alternative to this action because of the major-suit length, here it was worth further consideration to ensure that the same logic applied. How significant was the chance of turning plus 200 into plus 140 (or even minus 100 or worse)? The Committee decided that notwithstanding the vulnerability although passing might be an alternative it was not a logical alternative. The Committee changed the contract to 3♠ made three, plus 140 for E/W.

The Facts: 6♦ made six, plus 920 for N/S. All at the table agreed there had been a lengthy pause (about 30 seconds) before the 5♦ bid. The Director changed the contract to 5♦ made six, plus 420 for N/S (Laws 16A2 and 12C2).

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. South stated that she knew she had a heart control that might be the key to slam. North stated that her slow 5♦ was because she was trying to figure out how to ask partner about a heart control. Although N/S play Unusual vs Unusual they did not apply this to other two-suited situations.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that North's slow 5♦ bid in a forcing auction clearly showed an interest in doing something else. Although the South hand might well bid 6♦ because of the unannounced heart control, it might well pass also. Since the Committee believed that the slow 5♦ bid carried an unmistakable implication of having stronger (and not weaker) alternatives and since passing 5♦ by South was a logical alternative, the contract was changed to 5♦ made six, plus 420 for N/S. The Committee decided that the appeal had no merit because the players both had substantial experience and should have understood the laws sufficiently to know that this appeal could not succeed. N/S were each assessed an Appeal Without Merit Penalty Point.

2NT was for the minors and 4♦ was invitational. West bid what he thought he could make and North then bid what *she* thought she could make.

West decided to compete no further, hoping that 5♦ would fail or that the opponents had missed a cold, higher scoring 4♠ contact.

West cashed one high heart and switched to the ♣K. Declarer won the ace (good play!) and played a spade to the ace and a spade back to the king. At this point declarer decided that with eight hearts to the A-K-Q plus the K-Q of clubs, West would have continued to bid. East, therefore, must have at least two hearts. Declarer also noted the nice spots in his combined trump holding, so the line of play that immediately suggested itself was a crossruff.

Declarer began by ruffing a heart in dummy and a club in hand. Next came a spade and West showed out. Declarer ruffed low. The six-card ending was:

Having scored the low trumps in dummy, declarer was now home. A club ruff in the closed hand was followed by a spade ruff in dummy. Declarer called for another club from dummy, overruffing East. South played his last spade and trumped with the king as East helplessly undertrumped. The best East could do was eventually score his trump queen.

Board-a-match is a strange form of scoring -- it leads to attempting to justify non-bridge decisions. That is my excuse for opening 1NT from the North seat. Of course this rightsides all the side suits, but the 4-1 trump split and the heart honor location makes 4♠ tough on the third-and-fifth ♥3 lead.

The best I could do was to take the ♥Q, cash the ♦A and ruff a diamond. Then I led a low heart from dummy, and that set West a sticky problem. If I had the ♥J as either a doubleton and part of a four-card holding, it probably would be critical to take the ♥A now. Even if that was not the case, it was hardly clear that ducking the ace would gain a trick. Rightly or wrongly West took the ♥A and shifted to a club. When I put in the ♣10, that led to 10 tricks, as there were now just two trumps and a heart to lose.
