

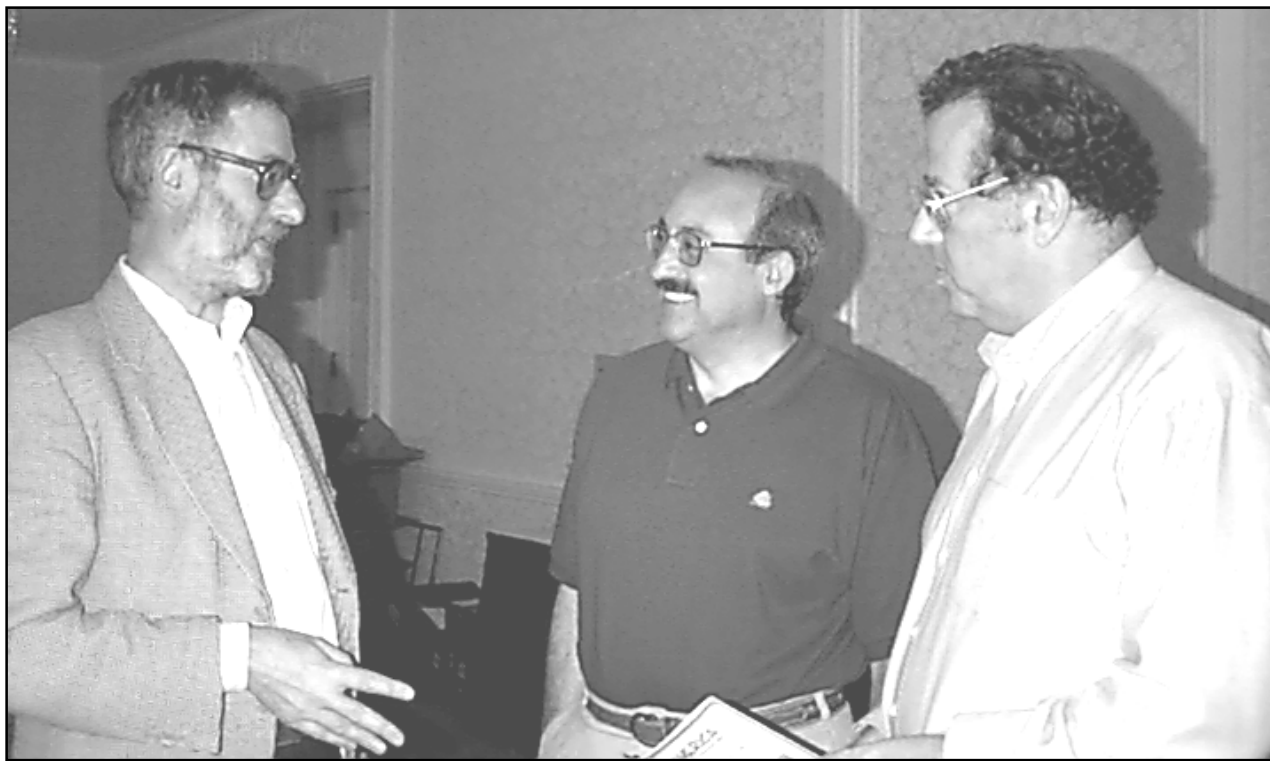

## Munson vs. Wei-Sender in Wagar KO final

The team captained by Kitty Munson upset the defending champions in the Wagar Women's Knock-out Teams to advance to the final.

MUNSON (Susan Wexler, Margie Gwozdzinsky, Carol Simon, Linda Lewis and Karen Barrett) jumped out to a 62-28 lead in the first quarter of play against the #1-seeded team of Jill MEYERS (Randi Montin, Renee Mancuso, Shawn Quinn, Tobi Sokolow and Mildred Breed). MEYERS never recovered as MUNSON went on to win the match 162-125.

In the other bracket, the team of Kathie WEI-SENDER (Juanita Chambers, Stasha Cohen, Pam Wittes, Irina Levitina and Jill Levin) handily defeated the squad captained by Edith FREILICH (June Deutsch, Janice Seamon, Rita Seamon, Rhoda Walsh, and Shannon Lipscomb) by a score of 185-68.

MUNSON will play WEI-SENDER in the 64-board final beginning at 1 p.m. today.

## Europe president offers views on American bridge

Bill Pencharz of England, president of the European Bridge League, is taking a close look at how the ACBL runs a major tournament as he makes his first visit to a North American Bridge Championship tournament.

### Sponsorships

"I want to see how you do things," he said. Major European tournaments, which depend financially on sponsorships, are suffering because major sponsors just aren't available. Pencharz had learned that ACBL tournaments frequently make money, and he wanted to learn what the ACBL does differently. So he came to Chicago to find out.

"In Europe, we hold the European Team Championships, and the only thing that is happening is the main event. Here you are staging the Spingold, approximately the equivalent of our European Teams,

but you have all sorts of other events going on at the same time. I think maybe the answer for Europe is to do something like this -- perhaps have a bridge festival in which the key event is the team championship."

Pencharz was talking strictly about major championships. "At the local level it's always possible to find a sponsor to help defray the costs. We sometimes get the local representatives of multi-national companies as local sponsors, but they do this out of their local budget. We actually had some sponsorship from Mercedes Benz at the European Mixed Championships in Aachen, Germany -- but it was strictly the local branch of Mercedes Benz.

"We have just gained a major sponsor -- Prokom, a Polish computer software firm. They are going to be a full sponsor of the European Pairs Champion-

## Tournament directors honor Doe, MacCracken

Su Doe of Irving TX and Charley MacCracken of Memphis were honored yesterday by their fellow tournament directors. Su was presented with the Tom Weeks Award as the most improved director of the year. The Fred Friendly Award, which goes to the director who best exemplifies the spirit of Fred Friendly (the late Paul Stehly), went to Charley. The awards were made at the meeting of the Professional Tournament Directors Association.

Su, a full-time director, works most weekends and mostly in the Texas area. "I really enjoy being a director," she said. "I like people and it's mostly fun. No two days are alike. I love working with intelligent, different people."

She started playing bridge with her mother when she was in junior high. She continued playing through college, but temporarily gave up the game when she went on to graduate school. Finally she started playing again, but she had one major problem -- she was too terrified ever to call the director.

So she decided to learn the rules. She pestered Tom Whitesides with questions and problems. She took Edith McMullin's course for novice-intermediate directors. And then one day Whitesides needed another body, and he called on Su. Thus began her directing career.

Charley came up with a prize quote the PTDA dinner. "After all these years, finally I can be grumpy."

His initiation into bridge came through honeymoon bridge with his grandmother. Then his great

## Onstott ousts Cayne from Spingold

Once again, a comeback is the story. This time it's the John Onstott team -- they were 13 down to Jimmy Cayne with 16 boards to go, but they came up with a 50-27 final quarter to win, 119-109.

As a result ONSTOTT, who had trailed at every quarter, took over CAYNE's #4 seed. Playing with Onstott are Chris Compton, Ross Grabel and Jon Wittes.

Richard Schwartz also had to come from behind, but the drive was not as dramatic. SCHWARTZ was down only 7 IMPs to Luella Slaner, but SCHWARTZ made it look easy over the last quarter, outdistancing SLANER, 87-18.

The other six seeds made it to the quarterfinals. Most of the matches were not close, but BRAMLEY and SHUGART had to work a bit to advance. Bart Bramley and Co. held off a fourth-quarter surge by John Sutherlin to win, 117-102. Rita Shugart was ahead by only 18 heading into the final heat against Mike Lawrence, but the best LAWRENCE could do was a 20-20 tie over the last 16 boards. SHUGART prevailed, 135-117.

Among her contributions to bridge theory are the unusual jump to show a singleton and support for partner's suit (a splinter bid) and responses to Blackwood after interference (DOPI).

Meyer won the opening lead of a low club with the queen. The ♠A was cashed, and Meyer now led the ♣3 towards dummy. South, unsure of whether North or declarer held the ♣J, ducked. Meyer then cashed out, taking eight tricks altogether. Note that the opponents are cold for 11 tricks in hearts.

Plus 120 was good for 74 out of 77 matchpoints.

## Promoting the 6 of trumps

Hagar the Horrible (*aka* Haig Tchamitch) shared the following amusing deal from the second semifinal session of the Life Master Pairs:

Tchamitch, East, led a low spade to dummy's ace. Declarer, strapped for entries to the closed hand, now cashed the ♦A and led another diamond. West, Vivian Kilstrup, won the king. Kilstrup played the ♠K, ruffed in dummy with the ♣10.

Declarer now tried the ♦Q, ruffed by West with the ♣9, and overruffed with the ♣Q. Declarer ruffed his last spade in dummy with the ♣J, and played another diamond. This time, West pitched a heart, declarer ruffed with the 7 and Tchamitch pitched a spade.

A low heart was played toward dummy, and declarer misguessed the position by calling for the king. Kilstrup won the ace and returned a heart to Tchamitch's queen. Tchamitch exited with a heart: East ruffed with the 5, declarer overruffed with the 8.

The ♣A was now cashed and Tchamitch took the setting trick with the six of clubs.

# The Teachers Convention

By the time this article appears, I hope to be back in Israel (direct flight, El Al, Chicago-Tel-Aviv). I left the tournament a bit early because I had arrived early, in time for the 41st annual American Bridge Teachers Association convention.

This was the first time I went to one of these affairs and I have never had so much fun. Little did I realize that bridge teachers like to live it up (when class is out). Some of the teachers made speeches about their methods and offered interesting tips of the trade. The speakers would often disagree with each other's approach. For example, I suggested we teach our students to think more and follow rules less. The other 100 teachers disagreed.

Another cause of contention was how long to speak to the students before giving them practice hands to play. One person suggested a half-hour lecture. Another said 15 minutes was all they could take before losing concentration. One suggested telling lots of jokes. Another said keep things deadly serious. And still another (Audrey Grant) said make them sing songs to the tune of "Row, row, row, your boat," for example:

## Opening Bids

(lyrics not by Cole Porter)

*Bid, bid, bid your hand,  
But alas, alas--  
If you have fewer than 13 points,  
I guess you'll have to pass.*

The three-day program, which featured numerous delightful speakers, was worthwhile to anyone who wants to learn about teaching bridge (or just be entertained). All the participants were splendid, but my favorite was New York bridge teacher Roberta Salob. She is a dynamite speaker and gave this deal as an illustration on how to use the same hand for many levels of classes:

Roberta first showed how she would teach a beginners-plus group. In this illustration, she doesn't

care too much about the bidding artistry (she keeps it simple, as you can see), but is concentrating on the cardplay. West leads the ♣A. Roberta recommends "ace from ace-king" because it's consistent with leading the top of touching honors all the way down the line. After the ace lead, West continues with the king and East in the meantime should be thinking, "Hey, I've got a lot of diamonds and dummy's got a lot of diamonds. Too bad we're not partners. Oh well, but hey, maybe somebody is short in diamonds. Could partner be the one? If he's void, perhaps I could give him a ruff. But how in the world will I gain the lead?"

In due course, East may realize that if he trumps his partner's king, he can gain the lead, return a diamond and hold the contract to 10 tricks.

"This is the only time I ever regretted teaching ace-from-ace-king," said Roberta, "because it would be so much more pleasing to have my students trump their partner's ACE."

Meanwhile, in the intermediate-plus class, West leads the ♣A and must next lead the 3, taking a risk, but in a winning effort to FORCE East to win the trick (West hopes that East was not dealt the 10-7 doubleton). East now returns a diamond because of the suit-preference nature of the 3. Indeed, from a high-level point of view, the return of the king by West (or better yet, the jack) should ask East to ruff and return a HEART. This would be the right defense if West started with a singleton diamond and the ♥J.

But in the advanced class, the students are asked to consider how the contract could be defeated. They are all excited to hear that West should lead the ♣3 on opening lead! East wins the 10, returns a diamond, ruffs the next club lead and leads another diamond, for one down.

Final thought: The saying goes, "Those who can do and those who can't teach." Not true, at least when it comes to bridge teachers, some of whom are the leading players of the last four decades. The bridge teachers deserve our respect. I know. I've tried to teach beginner classes and it's impossible for me. Beginners don't understand me. Once I tried Kantar's joke methodology. They didn't understand my jokes either. Once I tried to teach my children, but I quickly brought them to tears. Now I stick to the advanced-advanced. (PS. If you are a good beginners' teacher, please send me an email -- I may have a good job for you at my Internet bridge university.)

# The Heisenberg Trophy

The following hand from Wednesday's Swiss Teams pitted seasoned competitors against one another. You will now see a demonstration of "Heisenberg's Uncertainty Principle" applied to a bridge hand. For those of you who don't remember this law of physics, it simply states as "You never know the location of anything with certainty."

Suzi led the ♥5. I won the jack and returned the king. Gail Greenberg was now *certain* that I did not hold the ♣A! After all, she knew I held the AKQJ of hearts and therefore could hold no more than a queen outside of that suit. Gail crossed to dummy's ♦Q and led the ♣2 to her 8. This was sure to work since Suzi certainly held the ♣A. Gail was also "certain" that the club suit would break 3-2 unless I had opened 1NT with a singleton club. She already knew that I "could not" hold the ♣Q-J because that would give me 13 HCP.

As Dr. Heisenberg told us, "YOU CAN NEVER BE SURE OF THE LOCATION OF ANYTHING!" The moral of the story is "never trust an innocent looking woman."

## Excellent defense

Brad Moss and Fred Gitelman put together an excellent defense to get virtually all the matchpoints on this board from the second final of the Life Master Pairs.

The ♠8 went to the 9, 10 and a ruff. When declarer tried the ♦J from hand at trick 2, this went to the ace, and Gitelman returned the suit to get his ruff. Now a low club to the queen and king saw the fourth diamond ruffed by declarer.

North now led the ♥A and drew two more trumps, leading to this ending:

Gitelman defended very well by pitching his ♠5 and ♠Q to retain his lowly clubs. Declarer now had to lose two more clubs and go for 1100. If Gitelman pitches a club, declarer escapes for 800, which would have been worth quite a few matchpoints.

# How did he know!?

Peter Weichsel had sat out the first quarter of the second-round Spingold match between JACOBS and KAY. His team was 3 IMPs behind as he sat down to play. On the very first board he found himself playing a mundane notrump game.

♠ A Q 7  
♥ A 9 8 5  
♦ Q 8 7  
♣ Q J 8

♠ K 10 8 4  
♥ J 10  
♦ A J 5  
♣ A K 5 3

West led the ♥6, and Weichsel ducked in dummy to East's queen. East switched to a club, won in dummy, and Weichsel successfully finessed the ♦J as East followed with the ♦9 and West with the ♦4.

At this point Weichsel turned to his opponents and said, "Hey guys, didn't you play this hand in the previous quarter?" Lo and behold, his red-faced opponents had to admit that they had indeed already played the hand as North-South.

## BUT HOW DID WEICHSEL KNOW?

In fact, all that Weichsel had known was that there was a hand in the first quarter where a slam would have been makable if the ♦6 and ♦5 had been reversed. He correctly deduced that this was the very hand! Incredible!

The full hand was as follows:

The heart lead told Weichsel that East had both heart honors, and the diamond play suggested that East held K-10-9. If the spades were good for four tricks, then declarer had 11 tricks after the ♦J held. East could not be squeezed between hearts and the ♦K because he was sitting over the dummy, but if South's ♦5 had been the 6, then East would have been squeezed.

It requires a heart lead to defeat 6NT by South. When the board was played the first time, Ralph Katz doubled for a heart lead and the slam had been duly defeated for an 11-IMP swing to JACOBS. Jacobs' team eventually won comfortably after trailing by a single IMP with 16 boards to go.

## Ethical

James Barry, of Twain Harte CA, reported that opponent Jack Margid of San Francisco called attention to a scoring error that benefited Margid.

"My partner and I were plus 200 on this particular deal, but it got recorded as plus 100," said Barry, who was playing with partner Noe Mallori. "There was a big difference in the number of matchpoints for those two scores."

Margid reported the error, even though it lowered his score.

"Jack called the director's attention to it directly after the scores were posted. I wanted other people to know what an ethical player he is," said Margid.

ship in Warsaw next year.

"We also have Generali, which sponsors the European Individual in even years and the European Teams in the odd years."

### His impressions

When we asked Bill what impressions he has drawn concerning our NABC, he surprised us by naming three negatives:

1. Not enough vugraph. He believes there should be vugraph available throughout the tournament -- or at least throughout the Spingold. When asked if this would affect attendance in a negative way, he was very positive in stating that it would not. "If you have enough media coverage, people will come off the streets to watch the vugraph. And the people who came to play bridge will still play bridge. Maybe some of the people who come off the street will try a few games as well."

2. Not enough technology. "It would be much better if scores and other information were available on TV monitors throughout the playing area -- perhaps even in the hotel rooms. This would make it far easier to keep track of happenings and to find out how you're doing."

3. Not enough play behind screens. Pencharz feels that ALL matches in the Springold, and the Wagar as well, should be played behind screens. Early rounds here were not played behind screens.

He also offered some positives.

1. The standard of the field in the Spingold is excellent. "Clearly the Spingold attracts the best players from all over the world."

2. Everyone is friendly. "And I mean everybody. Not just the officials, but everyone. It's a very good feeling."

3. The Daily Bulletin is excellent. "It is superior to the publications we produce at our European championships."

### About Europe

"In Europe we have a goal -- half a million registered players by 2000. That's a big order since we now have only 400,000, and we have only two years to go.

"We have two areas where we are hoping for major growth. The first is Germany, which bridge-wise is almost virgin territory. The federation there is really going places. The other is Poland. Poland is experiencing the benefits of capitalism, and we're hoping that will mean more members for the European Bridge League."

Holland has more players registered than any other member of the EBL. Out of a population of 16 million, 100,000 are registered members. Second is

France with almost 100,000 and with every intention of passing Holland. Great Britain is third with 40,000, followed by Italy with 35,000. Sweden, Norway and Denmark also have large memberships relative to population.

"Every one of our European Championships is better than the previous ones -- we're always striving to improve. In Aachen we had 400 pairs in the Mixed, and screens were used throughout. The same was true in the teams, in which 100 were entered. We also had vugraph throughout, and lots of people came off the street to see what was going on."

### Education and membership

Pencharz strongly believes that children should be taught bridge as early as possible. "If we don't teach them early, we may never get them later. We've got to teach them the basic skills -- we've got to build the base of the pyramid."

Mini-bridge is being used to enable young players to start playing the cards almost instantly. Mini-bridge is a staple in the seven major bridge-playing nations.

It's an interesting concept, designed to get young players actually playing the cards as fast as possible. After the hand is dealt, each player counts his high card points and announces the total. The one with the most points is named the declarer, and the one with the second most is his partner. The player assigned to be declarer then names the trump (or notrump) after seeing the dummy and play proceeds. The players soon learn to take advantage of the knowledge of how many points each defender holds.

Mini-bridge also is used for school classes in the United States with one modification. Whereas in Europe partnerships change, in the U.S. the players stay with the same partner. When one player becomes declarer because he has the most high card points, his partner automatically becomes dummy.

### The last word

"Chicago is the right place for my first visit to a North American tournament," said Pencharz. There are Polish clubs in the Chicago area that are associated with the Polish Bridge Union rather than the ACBL. That makes them my people, members of the European Bridge League."

**The Facts:** 5♦ doubled went down one, plus 200 for N/S. The Director was called after the double of 5♦ and was told that West had broken tempo before he passed 4♥. The Director found that there had been a break in tempo that suggested action (Laws 73F1 and 16A2). East bid 4♠, successfully pushing his opponents to the five level and into an unmakeable contract. The Director determined that a pass by East was a logical alternative to 4♠ and changed the contract to 4♥ made five, plus 650 for N/S (Law 12C2).

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling. They acknowledged that West took 2-3 seconds to pass over 4♥. However, they contended that this was not a break in West's tempo. East said that he noticed no break in tempo and West said he thought a moment about what was happening, but tried to do that all the time. East noted that there was nothing in West's hand to suggest a reason for him to hesitate. Both East and West said that they had discussed as a partnership the importance of even tempos and had agreed to never bid fast.

East referred to his hand as a "classic," a pure sacrifice. He said that he expected to "buy" 10-12 HCP in his partner's hand with at most two hearts, three or four spades, and three or four clubs. He said that if West's values were well placed there might be a very good sacrifice at favorable vulnerability.

East said that his team finished the first quarter about two boards after the rest of the field and that this was largely because of the deliberate tempo that he and his partner employed, even in pass-out seat when they had no intention of bidding. E/W also submitted that this kind of bid is not out of character for East. East noted that he had gone down 1100 earlier in the match in a solo dive he took against a game. E/W presented a witness (a friend and former teammate from their part of the country) who attested to their high ethical standards and the fairly consistent and slow tempos used by the pair. He also noted East's proclivity for taking flyers ("he makes highly unusual bids").

N/S asserted that the reason for the slowness in the earlier quarter was that East took a very long time to play a couple of hands. N/S said that the E/W tempos were erratic. They presented the testimony of a teammate who had played against E/W in this match who concurred with that evaluation. N/S said that West took 2-3 seconds to bid over South's 4♥ bid. They asserted that this was a small but decided break in tempo.

N/S presented another witness (a friend from the home area of one of them) who was kibitzing this table when this incident occurred. They asked him whether he noticed an erratic tempo by E/W. He said that he did not, but he was not paying much attention to the opponents. They asked him whether he noticed a break in tempo over 4♥. He said that he did not, that he quit paying attention when 4♥ was bid and "the next thing I knew, the Director was called."

N/S contended that there was a break in tempo and that it suggested action to East, which he took by bidding 4♠. N/S said that East made no other bids when they played against him which were notably unusual. Since the action was successful (pushing them to the five-level) and pass was a logical alterna-

five, they said that the contract should be rolled back to 4♥, which would make five. Finally, N/S also said that the double of 5♦ was noticeably faster than the pass over 4♥.

**The Committee Decision:** Both sides agreed that about 2-3 seconds had elapsed between South's 4♥ bid and West's pass. N/S contended that this constituted a break in tempo and E/W contended that it did not. The Committee considered West's hand and found nothing in it to suggest that West paused to consider bidding or doubling. This lent credence to E/W's claims. On the other hand, the bizarreness of East's 4♠ call lent credence to N/S's claims.

The Committee carefully considered the testimony of the kibitzer at the table, who was a witness provided by N/S. He was unable to confirm N/S's claim that E/W were erratic in their tempos in general and also unable to confirm that there was a break in tempo on this hand. His qualification that he was not paying much attention to the E/W tempos certainly affected the weight which the Committee attached to his observation, but did not render the observation worthless.

Law 16A says, in relevant part: "After a player makes available to his partner extraneous information that may suggest a call or play, as by means of . . . unmistakable hesitation, . . . the partner may not choose among logical alternative actions one that could demonstrably have been suggested over another by the extraneous information." After considering all the evidence, the Committee found that there was no unmistakable hesitation.

Therefore, East was free to bid 4♠ — or whatever he wished. The Committee changed the contract to 5♦ doubled down one, plus 200 for E/W.

At the other table the Onstott pair bid and made the slam for a 14-IMP gain. That was crucial, of course, because the final margin was only 10 IMPs.

He moved in with Doug Drury (inventor of the convention) and his wife Peggy, "and that's where I learned a lot of what I know today." Through this period he often played as a pro. When Doug died, there was no one around that he was interested in forming a serious partnership with, so he was ready when he was asked to help as a director.

In 1972 he moved into ACBL Headquarters in Memphis to work as assistant head of the Tournament Division. When Buddy Spiegel resigned, Charley moved up to the top job. He resigned this position in 1989 and went back to his first love -- directing.

A few years later he was promoted to National Tournament Director, and he is now the field representative for District 9 and 10 (most of the South).

The Fred Friendly Award certainly was well deserved. We haven't found anyone yet who can remember Charley being grumpy.

Your opponents reach 4♠ by West, and you lead the ♥J around to declarer's queen. Declarer lead a diamond to the ace as partner produces the 10. Now declarer draws the ♠A-K and cashes the top clubs, pitching a heart from dummy.

When he leads a diamond from hand, Jeff Aker hops up with the king, crocodiling his partner's queen. He cashes the ♦J and plays a heart to let partner cash out for down one.

By contrast, when Susan Wexler declared the same contract, she won the ♥Q and led a low diamond, DUCKING when North produced the 5. She won the club return and cashed the top black cards, pitching a heart from dummy. When she crossed to the ♦A, she had reached this ending:
