IMPressive win by Freed-Robison

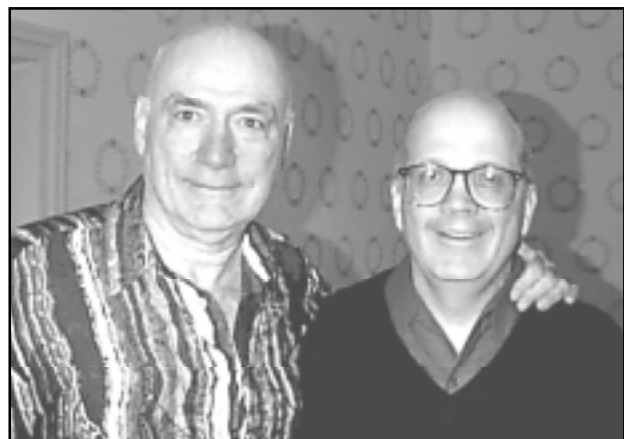
Gene Freed and Jim Robison topped the field in yesterday's IMP Pairs with a score of 136.

Freed is now the only person to have won the event twice.

Freed, of Los Angeles, has three previous NABC titles, while partner Robison, of Las Vegas, has five previous NABC wins.

The pair was not among yesterday's leading qualifiers, but jumped to the forefront of the 182-pair final and emerged with the win in the last round.

In second were Gary Cohler, Highland Park IL, and Jeanne Rahmey, of Brooklyn NY, who scored 113.19.

Promoting Junior bridge no easy job

"The cause of Junior bridge is advancing, but not at the desired pace." That's the assessment by Panos Gerontopoulos of Greece, head of the World Bridge Federation Junior program.

Panos is here to see old friends and make new contacts before he heads for the ACBL Junior Camp in Delafield WI next week.

"Advancing youth bridge is a difficult job," Panos insists. "The young have so many, many alternatives. Add to that the fact that we have to fight against so many prejudices when we try to get our kids interested in bridge. In some sections of the world, bridge is a no-no because people think it's gambling. In other areas, people consider that bridge is only for high society. And in many areas the young think bridge is a game for old folks."

"We have to try harder, coordinate better, move faster. This is not the time for resting -- it's the time for ideas and action."

Panos is the adviser, the helper, the idea man. "But it's the locals -- the zones, the districts, the units, the clubs -- that have to implement, that have

Last board lands Onstott in semis in Spingold KOs

Twenty-five IMPs were riding on the last board of the Spingold match between teams captained by John Onstott and Bart Bramley. Bart was playing six diamonds -- if he made it the match would be tied; if he went down ONSTOTT would win by 25. His trump suit was ace-king-fifth opposite jack fifth -- usually a no-loser suit. When he cashed the ace, right-hand opponent showed out and ONSTOTT was the winner, 135-120. Members of the Onstott team, the only non-seed to make the semifinals, are Onstott, Chris Compton, Jon Wittes and Ross Grabel.

Rita Shugart took the lead in the first quarter against defending champion Grant Baze, but BAZE took over in the second quarter and held on to win 150-103.

The team captained by Nick Nickell, winner of four out of the last five Spingolds, trailed George

On the very first hand of the final match in the Senior Swiss Teams when we were leading by a slim Victory Point, I was faced with a terrible dilemma.

We were playing lebensohl and 2NT would have been a relay to 3♣, while 3♣ would be constructive. Pass was a possibility, but going minus 670 is a terrible way to start a match! After some thought I decided I could probably make a third trump with a heart ruff or a promotion for my ♠7. So I passed!

The opening heart lead went to dummy, and a spade was led to the 8 and jack. Back came another heart, and declarer led a low club, taken with the ace. Partner gave me my heart ruff and I returned a low diamond to the king. Back came a low club but declarer rose with the king and held his losses to minus 200.

At the other table my teammates made 2♠ for a 7-IMP pickup. Whew!!

Our t3am went on to win a blitz, and I won my 11th North American title.

Neat play

In the match between the teams captained by Bridget Mavromichalis and Glickstein, Alfred Steinberg found a neat play to bring home a game that went down at the other table.

Plan the play on a low diamond lead.

Alfred won the queen with the king and led the ♥J, covered with the queen and ace. Next he played the ♠A and another spade, East following small both times. Alfred was now at the crossroads. If West had ♠Q-x and six clubs, together with what seemed to be a three-card diamond suit, there wouldn't be much of a chance to set up the heart suit for a diamond discard. So he finessed successfully and drew the last trump.

Now he advanced the ♥8, and when West followed low, he faced his second guess. Eventually he ran the ♥8, and when East took the king, he was home.

The Thursday Evening Pairs saw many North-Souths in serious trouble. With East-West cold for 3NT, the question was whether the North-South escape on this deal would go for too much:

On a trump lead (not best), declarer put up the queen to play spades. The defense can now prevail, but it takes a little care. West must win the ♠Q as East pitches a club. Now a diamond to the ace and two more top diamonds followed by the top clubs leaves this ending, with West on lead:

The ♠7 is ruffed by declarer, overruffed by West and the ♦7 promotes two trumps for plus 800.

South's lead of the ♣6 went to North's jack when declarer ducked. North, Diamond, continued with the ♣Q to partner's king, and Harris led a third club, taken with the ace. A spade was led to the 9 and king, and Diamond got out of his hand with a diamond to the ace. Declarer switched to the ♥J ... king, ace, and then took his diamonds, ending in dummy. Now declarer called for the ♥7, winning with the queen as Harris pitched a club. Declarer got out with a club to Harris' 10. Harris led his ♠10, and when declarer finessed the jack, he discovered that North had discarded down to the singleton ♠Q. Diamond showed the ♥10, the setting trick.

Seen at the Spingold

With the Spingold field down to 16 teams, none of the decisions were getting any easier Thursday. There were a couple of really tough ones that especially caught my eye, though. Here's the first, a pretty defensive dilemma with a game swing at stake:

You lead a top club against 4♠, partner follows with the 4 (upside down carding), and declarer contributes the jack. On your second top club, partner plays the 7, and declarer the queen. What's your next play?

More on this topic later, but now let's turn to the bidding problem Michael Polowan faced against Bob Hamman and Paul Soloway in another match during the same session. Polowan held ♠Q 10 4 ♥K ♦A Q 6 2 ♣K 8 7 5 4 and with no one vulnerable, heard Soloway open 3♥ on his right. He elected to pass this for now, and was

probably congratulating himself on this decision when he saw Hamman bid 4NT: ace-asking! But partner Mark Feldman doubled 4NT, and Soloway passed (no aces); now what?

They had reached seriously uncharted waters by now. What was the double of 4NT? Cards? Minors? Just designed to muddy the waters for the opponents? Polowan passed again, hoping for clarification, Hamman removed 4NT doubled to 5♥, and (two passes later) Polowan was again in the hot seat.

Reasoning (correctly, as it turned out) that Hamman had a huge heart fit but few high cards, Polowan bid 5NT, and Mark Feldman bid 6♣, which (undoubled) became the final contract. The bad news was that this failed when trumps were 3-1 (not a shock really). The good news was that it was a great save - the opponents were cold for 5♥ on their combined 15 points! The whole hand was:

Looking at three sure losers in 4♠ outside the trump problem, not to mention a probable club ruff, Tony Forrester made the beautiful, virtually no-cost play of jettisoning the queen and jack of clubs underneath the ace and king. When Kamil started to think, Forrester figured he now had a 50% shot at the contract. Clearly Becker must have the missing ♥A, so would Kamil shift to heart or a diamond now that he'd been talked out of a club continuation? That, Forrester thought, depended on the exact size of North's second club spot, which his partner would almost certainly try to read as a suit preference signal.

Kamil certainly knew his decision was critical: Forrester was marked with one red ace, and if he picked the wrong red suit to lead now, the losers in the other suit would likely disappear on dummy's winners. The pause lengthened, but finally Kamil played a heart, and the defense prevailed.

And of course, if he had returned a diamond, Forrester would have been well rewarded for a pretty deceptive play. Three rounds of diamonds would dispose of declarer's heart loser, then a ruffing finesse in hearts would establish two more winners. Crossing back to the ♠A, he could throw his two losing clubs on hearts, and concede the ♠K to chalk up his contract!

"Nice shift, partner," said Becker, with just a touch of irony!

Take full marks only if you cashed the ♠10 (but check your X-ray glasses at the door next time you play, please).

Politeness counts!

One sign of a good player is that he tries to make things easy for his partner. Have a look at this deal from the second final session of the Life Master Pairs:

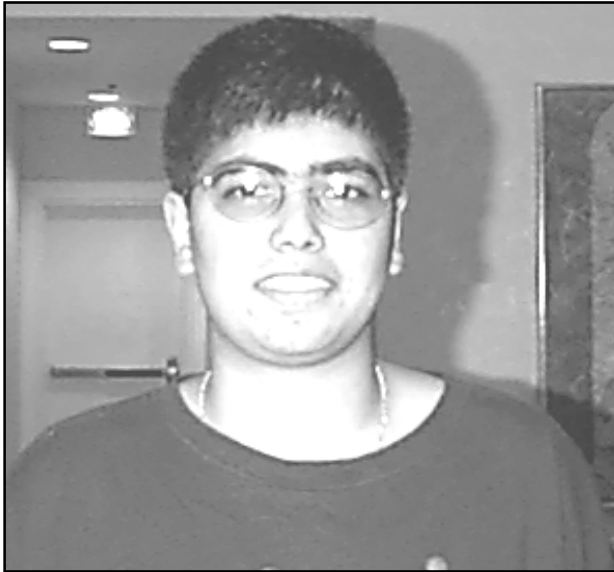

My partner, Allan Falk, made the normal lead of the ♦6.

Declarer played the king from dummy, so I won the ace and returned the jack. Declarer ducked and Allan followed with the 2. I continued the 9 so that Allan would know I originally had four, and declarer won perforce, Allan following with the 8. Since we lead low from three small and second highest from four small I should know what's going on in the suit at trick two. The ♦ 8 at trick three, therefore, should be suit preference for hearts.

Declarer played the ♠K to trick four and Allan won the ace while I attempted to give suit preference with the 8. I don't know whether Allan deciphered my ♠8 or not, but he figured out what was going on. Many players would play a diamond to partner, counting on him to have read the diamond signal at trick three. Allan realized that it would be hard for me to lead away from my presumed ♥K so he cashed the ♥A before leading a diamond to my 10 --- how considerate!

Allan's play made it easy for me to cash the ♥K and hold declarer to seven tricks, for 38 matchpoints on a 51 top. Letting declarer make an overtrick would have put us under average for the board.

Unjust Desserts

No doubt I made many bad bids in the Life Master Pairs, but one at least turned out well. Friday afternoon Allan Falk and I were trying to qualify when this deal came along:

I decided not to describe my hand and to see whether I could make the opponents pay a price for balancing.

West lead the ♥K. I ruffed and led a trump to the king which held. It seemed as though the ♠Q rated to be on my right, and I was better placed if it were, so I played a spade to the jack which held the trick. I cashed the ♠A, pitching a diamond from dummy and led the ♠K, ruffed and overruffed. I now ruffed three hearts in my hand and two more spades in dummy and cashed the ♦A for 11 tricks and 63 out of 64 matchpoints.

West had three chances to beat the contract, but none was obvious. Going up with the ♣A to play another trump works, as does ruffing the ♠K with the trump ace and exiting with a trump. West also could have pitched two hearts on the fourth and fifth rounds of spades and been in a position to overruff the last heart.

Why do I call 5♣ a bad bid and not just an overbid? Because I knew I would likely have bought the hand in 4♣, and we'd have scored almost as well for plus 150 as for plus 600, with much less risk. In fact, plus 150 would have been worth 59 matchpoints, and plus 130 would have been worth 55.

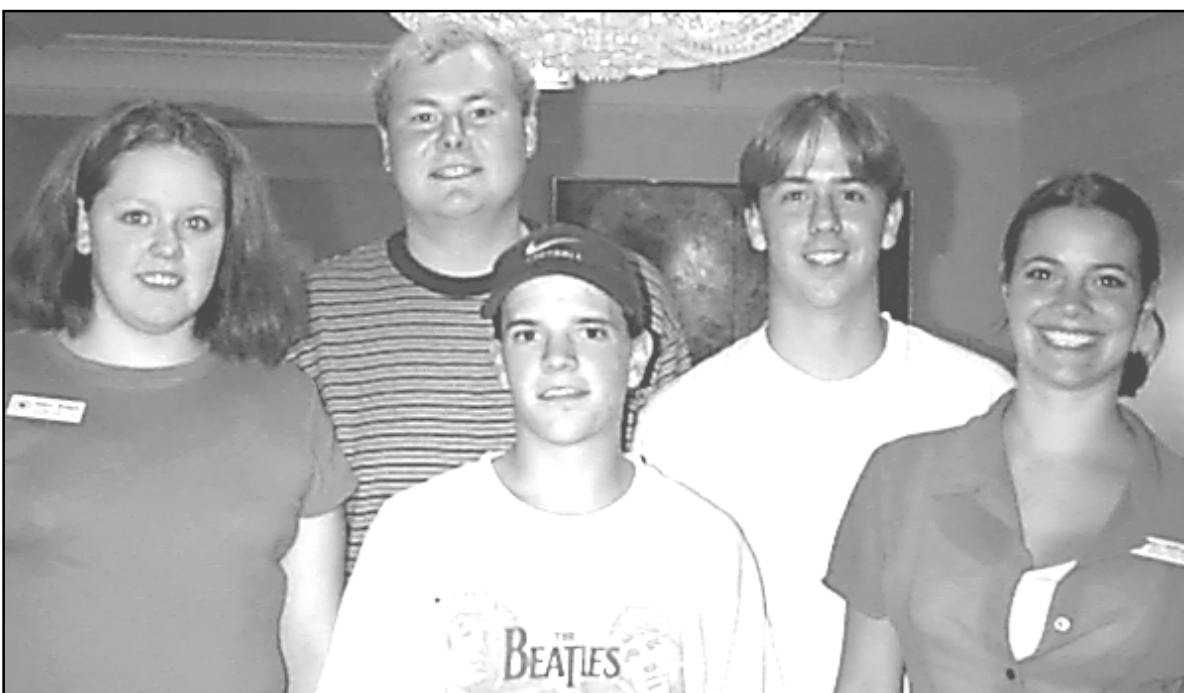

to make any plans we might have work."

He sympathized with the ACBL in its efforts to get more young people playing bridge. "There are so many activities available for American youth. The Junior Camp is a fine move, and other good efforts have been made to interest Juniors. But the road ahead is a long, long one. The situation is frightening." The ACBL sponsors a Junior Camp every other year.

"We've got to try harder," said Panos, "and the accent is on the 'we'. What happens in America affects the entire world, and it is up to the WBF to help out in any way we can. I personally am willing to do whatever I can to help."

Panos explained why the World Junior Camp is held only in Europe now. "To make it work financially we need a good crowd. We've had as many as 156 pairs in the Junior Pairs, which precedes the World Camp. That's because so many European countries are pursuing Junior bridge so strongly. If we tried this in the United States, we couldn't handle the financing. You have only 12 teams in the Junior Trials. We'd need a lot more youngsters from other parts of the world to make a World Camp with Junior Pairs pay off. And the youngsters from abroad wouldn't have the funds to get here."

Canadian controversy

In the recent Canadian National Teams Championships in Ottawa, the quarterfinal match between teams captained by Cameron Doner and Mike Hargreaves was decided in committee after an appeal involving the following deal (Doner lost by 2 IMPs as a result of the committee's ruling).

In view of the controversy surrounding the decision, Doug Heron (chairman of the appeals committee and president of the Canadian Bridge Federation) sought to disseminate the facts of the case and the committee's reasoning. Heron's account follows. The players were Gord McOrmond-Bryan Maksymetz (Hargreaves) and Gerry McCully-Felipe Hernandez (Doner).

(1) A hesitation of approximately two minutes, acknowledged by all players. The director was called to the table at that point.

Result: 7♣ made seven --- plus 2140 for North-South (at the other table, North-South stopped in 6♣).

Director's ruling: table result stands.

The facts: East-West appealed, claiming the long hesitation strongly implied that a bid other than 5♣ was being considered. Even though the auction was being carried out behind screens, it appeared to be obvious to all that the hesitation was by North, not by his screenmate (East).

East-West also claimed that North's slow 5♣ made it much more likely that bidding on would be more successful than passing. North argued that he was considering whether 4♣ was a request for a key card response, or for a cuebid. He eventually made the response which could be neither. Unfortunately, it took a considerable amount of time to reach this decision. North argued that considerable time had been taken by the opponents in other auctions (implying the delay in returning the bidding tray could well have been caused by East).

What follows is the committee's reasoning and decision.

It was easy to conclude that there had been a hesitation. It was also evident that North-South had no agreements in this situation. We nonetheless had valuable information from some of the things said by South during the hearing. Our reasoning was based largely on South's comments.

First, with respect to the 5♦ bid: had North decided to bid 4NT over 4♣, there would have been a strong argument to force South to pass that call.

The 5♣ bid, showing a fit, was at least somewhat encouraging. Note that while North-South did not have agreements here, North did indicate that a cuebid over 4♣ would have promised first-round control (he said he did not want to bid 4♥ as a response to Gerber since that would have shown the ♥A). South likewise indicated that he would have expected a 4♠ bid to have shown the ♠A.

Since South could still demonstrate that 6♣ was a possible contract (North might have the ♠K) and that 5NT would not be in jeopardy (if North does not have a spade control then he must have either both red kings or one red king-queen, either of which gives them 11 tricks in notrump) the committee was in fa-

Playing With Paul

by Henry Bethé

My son Paul first appeared at the bridge table during the Reno NABC in 1989 at age 11. In the meantime he has turned 20 and lately has become interested in playing. Last weekend he won his first regional title, one of the brackets of the Friday-Saturday Bracketed KO.

Paul's bridge is still in relatively early stages of development. His bidding is sophisticated but his ability to visualize play and defensive positions has some ways to go. This sometimes leads to difficult situations for the opponents to cope with as evidenced by this deal from the Continuous Pairs.

West led the ♦J to Paul's ace -- he hasn't yet learned that the right card to win with is the queen. He started spades, carefully leading the 5 to block the suit, and looked pleased when the suit broke 2-2. On the next two spades East pitched the ♥8-2 and West the ♥4 and ♣8. Paul now led the ♣2 which was ducked and the 10 won in dummy. Note how his failure to unblock the spades allowed him to lure the opponents into ducking the ♣K in the hopes that he would not be able to reach the fifth one. He now cashed the last spade, and he and East pitched clubs. He cashed the remaining minor suit winners, and when he led the ♥Q to trick 11, East was left with the ♥AK3 and had to concede an 11th trick. +460 was pretty good on this board -- better than you or I could have done.

GIB1 led the ♣J which ran to the ace. Declarer then ran five rounds of diamonds. What would you pitch as West?

Some human players, as well as Q Plus at the other table, would pitch two clubs, a spade and a heart. This allows declarer to drive out the ♥K safely, since the defense can then cash only three club tricks.

GIB correctly came down to ♠K ♥K 5 ♦--- ♣10 9 4 3, which beats the contract.

vor of allowing the 5♦ bid.

While it is true that the hesitation suggests that bidding on over 5♣ will be more successful than passing, the fact that North-South might have a slam and cannot get too high means that bidding on is not suggested by the hesitation, but rather by the cards held.

Note that one consequence of South's argument is that if North had bid 5NT over 5♦, that should have denied any spade control.

With respect to the 6♥ bid, some may argue that the 5♠ bid must promise the ♠A because North would have bid 6♣ instead with the ♠K. As a matter of theory that is debatable, but it is irrelevant here, where North-South clearly had no such agreements. Here again, a comment by South was crucial. When asked why he bid 6♥, he said it was because 5♠ promised a spade control, and he bid 6♥ "in case it was the ace". So South did *not* believe that North's bidding alone had promised the ♠A.

Now the reasoning was: North's bidding has strongly suggested that he does not hold the ♠A (and if he does, then his hand is somehow unsuitable for slam --- why else would he not cuebid immediately while holding trump support?). The hesitation over 4♣ suggests he was considering some other call that, in the light of subsequent bidding, *was almost surely 4♠* (the other option, 4NT, is far less likely with a hand now known to hold trump support). For this partnership, 4♠ would surely have shown the ♠A (see North's comment above). Therefore the *bidding* suggests that North does not have the ♠A, while the *hesi-*

tation suggests that North does.

South certainly has logical alternatives to the 6♥ call, namely 6♣ and 6NT, and the hesitation certainly suggests 6♥ over the other calls. In fact, without a strong likelihood that North has the ♠A --- a likelihood that in the committee's judgment was demonstrably suggested by the earlier hesitation --- 6♥ could be a very bad bid, since West would then be quite likely to hold both the ♠A and the ♥K, and in that case bidding 6♥ commits North-South to 6NT, while guaranteeing that it goes down by allowing West to double for the lead.

Thus, in the committee's view, it would be wrong to allow the 6♥ call, since it is demonstrably suggested over the logical alternatives by the hesitation.

The decision between 6NT and 6♣ remained. From South's point of view, 6♣ is in some danger of a spade ruff, while 6NT, played by North, is in some danger of a red-suit lead setting up a king in West's hand while the ♠A is outstanding. For instance, give North

♠K Q x ♥Q x x ♦K Q x ♣J x x x,

or any other hand missing the ♠A and ♥K, and not containing the ♦K Q J x.

In accordance with the Laws, when the offending side has a choice of actions, of which any could easily be right, they are assumed to obtain the least favorable result which is at all possible. In this case, that is a bid of 6♣.

As another point of interest, when on the actual auction the decisive moment arrived, the North-South pair judged to bid 7♣ and not 7NT.

Thus the committee felt there was no reason to assume that North-South would choose notrump as opposed to clubs at the six level.

As a final point, which was not discussed by the players at committee, the question of allowing a continuation over a theoretical call of 6♣ was explored by the committee. It was felt that had this been broached, it should be disallowed. The reasoning was that North, who was willing to play what he knew could be a likely slam in 5♣ (the bid was, after all, non-forcing, and he could instead have jumped to 6♣ at that point) out of fear of a greater disaster should they have a misunderstanding, was clearly not about to bid a speculative 6NT or 7♣ if his partner signed off in 6♣.

Decision: North-South 6♣, making seven. Plus 1390.

Foul play

Tournament Director Ron Geagley, of Washington D.C., was directing four sections of a pair game on Tuesday when he noticed something unusual on one of the boards. In three of the four sections, the results were almost all plus 450 for East-West. In the other section, the scores were plus 480 for East-West.

This is usually the indication of a fouled board and after a quick investigation, Geagley discovered the problem. The board had been improperly made because the ♣9 and ♣10 had been switched, which accounted for the score difference.

Players are cautioned to exercise care when duplicating boards.
