Your charity donations -- where do they go?

Just about everyone knows that the ACBL Charity Foundation donates major sums to the ACBL Charity of the Year. Not so well known is the fact that the Foundation helps many, many other charities with lesser grants. And you can even help out your local charities through the Foundation.

More than \$6 million -- \$6,163,887 to be exact -- has been donated to charities since the inception of the Foundation in 1964. In addition to the Charities of the Year and the NABC Specials, there have been 166 donations to selected charities.

Altogether you, the bridge players of America, have made charitable donations to more than 200 charities. That's awesome.

The Charity of the Year program has made major donations to American Cancer Society, American Diabetes Association, Arthritis Foundation, National Association for Mental Health, Cystic Fibrosis, United Cerebral Palsy, National Kidney Foundation, National Commission for the Prevention of Child Abuse, Arthritis Foundation, American Foundation for AIDS Research, Hospice, Multiple Sclerosis, Alzheimer's and the National Council on Alcohol and Drug Dependence. Altogether \$3,702,334 was given to these charities.

That's quite a list, but it's only the tip of the iceberg.

Another major program consists of special \$5000 donations to a charity chosen by the committee at each NABC. The recipients include Meals on Wheels (San Antonio), San Diego Children's Hospital, Health Help (Portland OR), Special Opportunity Fund (Toronto), Johns Hopkins Hospital (Baltimore), John Hopkins Hospital (Anaheim), Opryland Retirement Fund (Nashville), Washo Association for Retardation and Nevada Self-Help

ACBL, Grand Slam take major step

Oklahomans victors in Cash Prize game



James Kraft of Tulsa and Chris Compton of Oklahoma City are the winners of the two-session Cash Prize Pairs that took place Saturday and Sunday mornings. By topping the 12-pair field, they won the top prize of \$460. They finished with slightly more than a one-board margin over runners-up David Metcalf of Arlington MA and Thomas Rozinski of New York City, who won \$340.

Metcalf and Rozinski topped Strat B by more than three boards, but the prize money for second in A was greater than for first in B.

Third place in A (\$250) went to James Fellows of Omaha and Hugh MacLean of Gonzales TX. Pat McDevitt of Brighton MA and Lloyd Arvedon of Medford MA were fourth (\$200).

In second in Strat B were David Liss and Michael McNamara of Morristown NJ (\$240). Another board and a half back were Sali Ma of Cincinnati and Randolph Johnson of Billerica MA (\$190).

Three-way matches reduce Vandy field

The Vanderbilt Knockout Teams was reduced from 84 teams to 32 teams yesterday, as a result of three-way matches, and the field will be cut in half again after today's head-on matches.

Each team played three-way matches yesterday, with the loser going out at the end of the afternoon session. The two remaining teams continued play last night.

When playing in an event governed by the MidChart or SuperChart, players may consult their own defenses as well as the defenses in the pamphlet and those offered by opponents during the auction and play.

Brissman co-chairs Appeals Committee

Jon Brissman of Ontario CA, an attorney who has a private practice, has been appointed co-chairman of the National Appeals Committee. He will work with Ray Raskin, Appeals Committee chairman, and Alan LeBendig, the other co-chairman.

A Diamond Life Master with more than 6500 masterpoints, Brissman was the first ACBL official recorder back in the early Eighties. He also served as a co-chairman of the Appeals Committee from 1982 to 1988, at which time he left bridger to pursue law studies.

He also has served on the President's Advisory Committee under Bobby Wolff and was chairman of the Conventions Committee.

Brissman says that the current Appeals Committee does not plan to strictly enforce the rules just for the sake of enforcing them. "We'll give redress wherever damage is caused," he said. "If the claim is technical without damage, there will be no redress."

Good poker makes good bridge!

When Marshall Miles and Mark Bertusek played in the Open Pairs final, they produced an accurate defense to a part-score contract to produce an elegant ending.

Miles, West, led a club to the queen. A spade back to the queen and a club to the ace made it easy for Bartusek to count out North as a 5-4-0-4, so he switched to a diamond. At this point declarer could have succeeded by ruffing the diamond and playing a crossruff. He eventually would emerge with eight tricks via a coup *en passant*, but he threw a spade on the diamond. Miles won the ace and played a trump. Declarer finessed and Bartusek won the ♥Q and returned a trump. Declarer cashed a third round of trumps, cashed the ♦K to throw his ♣9 and finessed the spades again.

Miles won in this ending, with the defense already in possession of six tricks.

Miles played the ♦Q and Bartusek's ♥8 became the seventh defensive winner. But look at his hand -- all four eights as his last four cards. Have you ever seen that before?

Laws Seminar set

National Tournament Director Roger Putnam will conduct the seminar. Subjects include interpretation of new laws and rulings on questions asked by participants.

The seminar will become a regular feature -- the "Club Director's Refresher Course" -- beginning with the Summer NABC in Albuquerque. The course is scheduled for Monday, July 28. Cost is \$30 which includes a new Laws book.

Patron Member: Cohen has "gotten better!"

For Arleen Lehman, playing with Larry Cohen for the first time in 17 years was "such a pleasure - and believe me, he's gotten better!"

Lehman, who lives in Boca Raton FL, won the Patron Member drawing to play with Cohen, who also lives in Boca Raton, in Thursday's Charity Pairs. The game offered two chances to win masterpoints: the usual matchpoint scoring plus a chance for section or overall placement by IMPs.

The pair finished fifth overall at IMP scoring with a section first at IMPs and a section third at MPs.

Lehman recalls that the pair first played together about 17 years ago at a regional in New York. "I didn't play transfers and he wasn't a Life Master yet, so it may have been longer ago than that," she said. "Believe me, he's gotten better."

Lehman had planned to come to the Dallas NABC until two partners were forced to cancel. She decided to postpone any decision about the trip until she knew the results of the Patron Member drawing. "I must have known," she said, "because I was getting my clothes ready."

And the game? "It was such a pleasure. He's there -- he's a backboard."

For his part, Cohen was also pleased. "We had a good time. She played very well."

Lehman, who says she doesn't like to play the hand, played several hands early. "I told Larry that had to stop and he apologized but said he wasn't a handhog."

Soon, however, Cohen began playing a few hands "and he was very pleased with my dummies. In fact, he finished one hand and said he felt like he'd just finished the last round of the Vanderbilt."

Cohen was put on the spot by that 4♠ bid. But he had more than his share of high cards, his partner was marked with spade shortness, and he knew he'd find at least five hearts opposite, so he bid 5♥. East promptly doubled.

The opening spade lead went to the ace, and Cohen led a heart to the queen and ace. East shot back the ♣9 to West's ace. At this point West could have defeated the contract by returning a diamond, and considering the Michaels bid there was a good case for doing exactly that. But he tried the ♠J, ruffed. Cohen drew the rest of the trumps and considered the diamond situation. There would be no problem with a 3-2 or a 4-1 break -- the only holding he had to worry about was a 5-0 split.

He already knew East had started with five spades (from his bid) and four hearts (from the play). But East had opened the bidding and had showed up with only 7 HCP so far. So the ♣9 had to be third best from the king-queen. Cohen decided that East likely was 5-4-0-4, so he led a diamond from dummy and put in the 9! That's right - a first-round finesse for a 10! And he was right, so he wrapped up a top by making his doubled contract.

Check cashing

Check cashing is available to ACBL members daily for an hour before afternoon game time (noon to 1 pm). The check cashing desk is located across from the Partnership Desk on the second floor. Checks up to \$250 will be cashed, but picture identification is a must.

The Alert strip

It is ACBL policy to have players tap the Alert strip and say Alert out loud at the same time. When an announcement is made, once again the player should tap the Alert strip.

When using spoken bidding, players are required to announce and Alert aloud.

If there is some reluctance about complying, players should summon a tournament director rather than get into a hassle with an opponent.

Only one was already an ACBL member but everybody picked up membership applications.

There's no bridge club at Rice right now, but "I'm hoping eventually to run duplicate games at Rice," said Dan.

The sportswear company has several bridge-related items, including t-shirts with these slogans: "Born to double" and "Minus 1400 is character building."

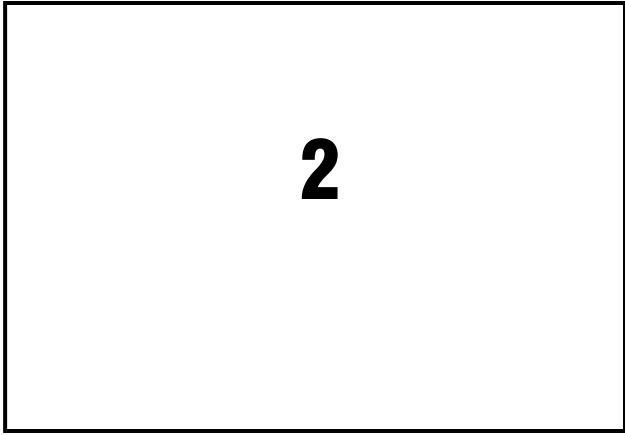
Adolphus Hotel Shuttle

First-time partnership wins Open Pairs I title



Heir Gelgemo (left) and Tony Forrester were runners-up in Open Pairs I.

For Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson, their first matchpoint event as partners was a winner -- they captured the Open Pairs I title by a margin of less than one board.

Greco, 21, and Hampson, 28, are the youngest pair to earn an NABC title since Jeff Meckstroth, then 23, and Eric Rodwell, then 22, won the Open Pairs title at the Spring NABC in Norfolk VA in 1979.

This was the first NABC title for Greco, a senior at the University of Virginia and a former *King of Bridge*, and the third for Hampson, who won the North American Swiss Teams in 1992 and the Mixed Pairs in 1994. His Canadian team was second in the World Junior Team Championships in 1991.

Greco earned his side a good score on this deal from the second final session.

East led the ♥6 to West's ace, and West returned the ♥2 as Greco won his queen and discarded a low spade from dummy.

Five rounds of diamonds followed. East followed to one round and discarded the ♠2, ♣7 and two hearts.

Now Greco cashed the ♣A and exited with his ♥J. West could cash two hearts and the ♠A but was forced to lead into dummy's ♣K-J. Plus 150 was good for 62 of 77 matchpoints.

The pair also earned top marks on defense. This deal is from the first final session.

Against South's 4♠ contract, Greco led the ♦J. Hampson won his ace and shifted to the ♣2.

Declarer followed with a low club and Greco could have won his jack and cashed the ♣A. Instead, he won with the ace and returned the jack. Hampson won the king and returned another club, ruffed for down one -- and 56.5 of 77 matchpoints.

In the same session, Hampson found the only

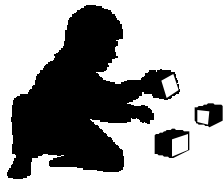
lead to defeat a 6♠ contract.

West had advertised long, strong clubs plus spade support and a heart void. Accordingly, Hampson led the ♦Q. Declarer won the ♦A and cashed the ♥A, discarding a diamond from dummy. When he led a spade, Hampson hopped up with his ace and led a diamond to Greco's king. Plus 50 was another near-top.

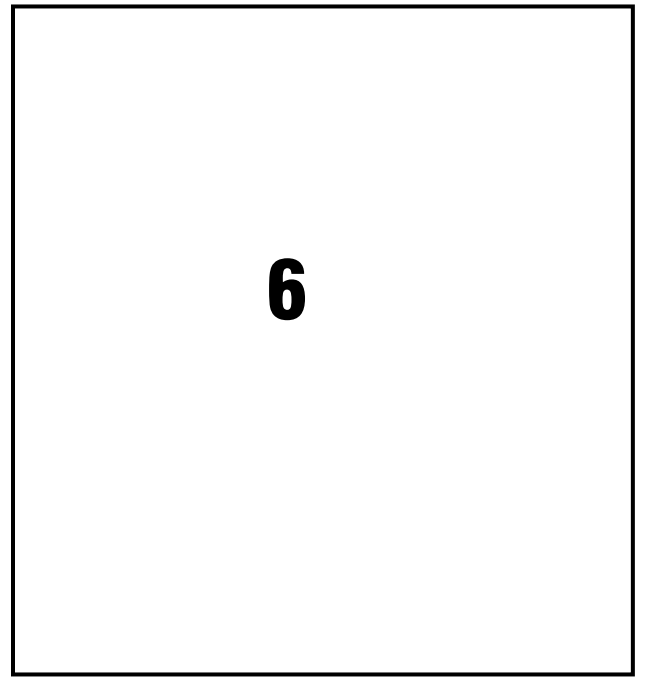

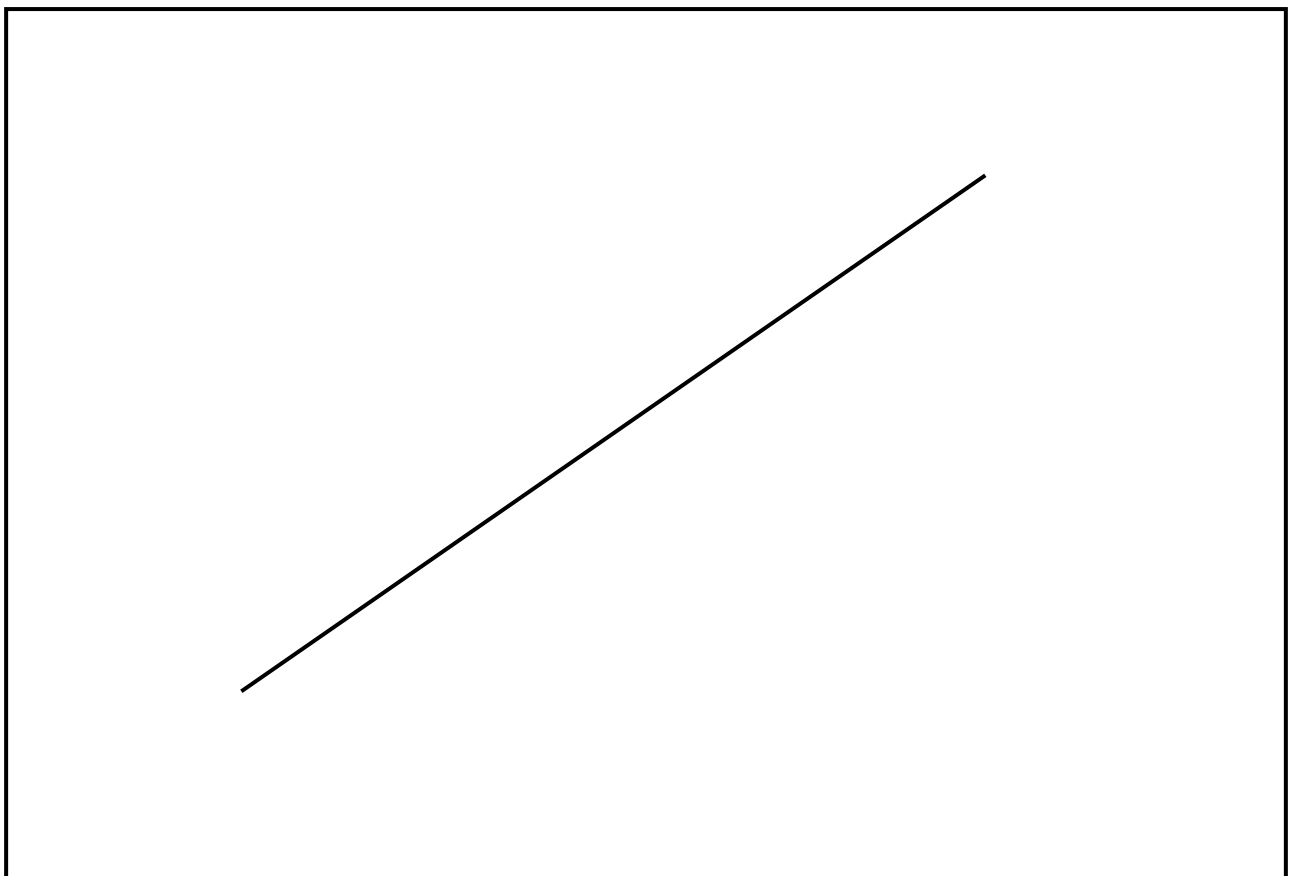

Twin wins for Italy in Forbo; US second

Italy, the dominant power in world bridge from 1957 through 1975, may be making a move toward regaining that supremacy. At the Forbo--Krommenie tournament in The Hague, the Netherlands, in late February, Italy, defending Nations Cup champion, won both the Nations Cup and the Forbo--Krommenie Teams.

The Nations Cup triumph is particularly significant. Competing were Italy as reigning European champion; United States as reigning Bermuda Bowl titlist; France, winner of the 1996 World Team Olympiad, and the Netherlands, victors in the 1993 Bermuda Bowl. Italy defeated all three opponents to far outdistance runnerup United States, 66 Victory Points to 47. France was third with 35 and the Dutch finished with 32.

The finish in the other team event was incredibly close. First-place Italy had 125 Victory Points, followed by the United States with 124 and France with 123.

Playing for Italy were Alfredo Versace, Norberto Bocchi, Massimo Lanzarotti and Andrea Buratti.

America's team in the Nations Cup was made up of Bobby Wolff, Bob Hamman, Nick Nickell and Richard Freeman. America's runners-up in the Forbo-Krommenie consisted of Zia, Peter Weichsel, Sam Lev and Piotr Gawrys (Poland).

Sixty-four teams from all over world were invited to play in the Forbo-Krommenie. The format for the two--day event succeeded in keeping the competitive spirit alive from top to bottom --- even the team that finished in last place on the first day had a chance to win a money prize the second day. Here's how it worked.

The 64 teams were seeded into eight groups for the first day's play, and each octet played a complete round-robin. The top two teams in each group advanced to the 16--team A final, run as a seven--round Swiss. Then all the third--place finishers went into Group B, the fourth--place teams into Group C, etc. There were money prizes for the top five teams in A and for the top two finishers in Groups B through G.

The prize--giving ceremony was wonderfully different. Elly Ducheyne, tournament chairman, knows how dull such events can be, so she brought in a magician, Hans Kazam. He teased and kidded the winners, including them in some of his tricks.

The tournament was a delight from beginning to end, with excellent conditions, directing, vugraph and Daily Bulletins.

A simple guess can make a tremendous difference. Here are two hands where huge numbers of IMPs changed hands because of guesses. The first is from the Nations Cup match between the United States and the Netherlands.

The play at trick two made all the difference here. Bauke Muller won the opening club lead and led a heart to the king! He tried to cash the ♦A, but Wolff ruffed and cashed his two high hearts. Now declarer could manage only eight tricks for minus 800.

Freeman won the opening club lead and lead a heart to the jack! Next came the ♠K, covered by the ace and ruffed. Berry Westra won the heart switch and led a spade to Freeman's queen. Freeman cashed the ♥K and gave up a trump to the queen. He ruffed the club return and led his last trump. Enri Leufkens, South, was squeezed --- he kept his ♠J and three diamonds. But now Freeman had the rest of the tricks by picking up diamonds -- plus 850 for 17 IMPs.

Hamman was the victim on this Nations Cup deal against Italy.

Lanzarotti didn't try to guess the trump queen. He won the diamond lead and finessed clubs, losing to the king. He led the diamond switch ride to his queen, cashed the ♣A and ruffed a club with the 10 --- and Buratti discarded! Apparently he didn't have the queen! So Lanzarotti came to hand with the trump ace and ruffed his last club with the 10. He crossed to his ♥K and was happy to see West drop the queen. He drew the last trump, then led to the ♠K to make 11 tricks --- plus 650.

Hamman won the opening diamond lead and immediately led the ♥J for the heart finesse, which lost. Versace returned a heart to the 10, and Hamman took the club finesse, which also lost. Versace returned the ♣J, pinning the 10 as Hamman won the ace. Hamman led to the ♠K, then gave up a spade to the ace. Versace led the ♣9, and Hamman was forced to try the trump 6 since he still had two clubs to ruff. But Bocchi overruffed for the setting trick and a gain of 13 IMPs.

Damage? Not likely!

The player led out of turn, and declarer opted to let his partner play the hand. The opening leader had heard the original declarer open 1♠ and rebid 2♣ over the 1NT response. The 2♣ bid was Alerted as possibly as few as three cards. But during the play it turned out that that player held only TWO clubs.

"DIRECTOR!" called the player who had led out of turn. He explained to the director that he would have made a different lead if he had known the declarer could have held as few as two clubs.

"But you led out of turn," said the director.

"I know, but I would have led a different suit out of turn," said the defender.

However, after fulfilling that requirement, sanctioned games can hold two additional games for local charities before holding another game for the Charity Foundation, provided that one of the two extra games is for the local chapter of the Charity of the Year.

A matter of trust

It is a good idea to have the partnership agreement that against preemptive opening bids you should lead the king from ace-king (to get a count signal) since we quite frequently lead an unsupported ace against such contracts.

So what happens in the rare instance of your holding a doubleton ace-king? Lead the ace, then the king. What happens after that is up to your partner. If North-South had been on the same wavelength on Board 25 from the Friday evening game, they would have achieved a top for themselves.

After East preempted 4♠, as South you lead the ace and king of diamonds, partner following with a discouraging 2 followed by a suit-preference 4. Declarer should follow with the 6 and 8, but people have been known to let go of their lowest diamond spots to make the 4 an unambiguous signal for clubs.

Now will South have the courage to underlead the ♣A for the diamond ruff? All I can tell you is if you make the play you deserve your excellent score!

What else could she do?

It didn't happen here, but it's too good a story to pass by.

The first call was a pass, and the next player said, "Double". The call for the director quickly followed.

After the director explained the options, the woman showed him her hand. "But I had to double. See? My hand was too good to bid just one spade."

Mott-Smith Trophy honors top performer

The Mott-Smith Trophy is awarded each year to the player with the best overall individual performance at the Spring NABC.

The trophy was donated by friends in memory of Geoffrey Mott-Smith in 1961 and made retroactive to 1958 to include all the winners.

Mott-Smith (1902-1960) was co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission, editor of the *ACBL Bridge Bulletin* 1935-36, a contributor to *The Bridge World*, a writer and cryptographer.

Mott-Smith was one of the first to operate a bridge club and to direct bridge tournaments. He was the director of the annual intercollegiate tournaments and other "par" bridge events.

He worked with Ely Culbertson in the organization of the United States Bridge Association and with William E. McKenney in the early days of the ACBL.

During World War II, Mott-Smith served as chief instructor for the OSS in the training of cryptographers and cryptanalysts.

He authored or co-authored more than 29 books on games and served as games consultant for the Association of American Playing Card Manufacturers.

Mott-Smith was regarded as a great player, brilliant theorist and one of the soundest and most lucid of the early writers on contract bridge.

Standards of Department

Contract bridge is a competitive game, played by people who enjoy winning and dislike losing. The basic responsibility to play the game in the proper manner rests with each player. To ensure that all have maximum opportunity to enjoy the game, District 25 will have a policy of zero tolerance for inappropriate behavior. Please report all instances to the district or unit recorder, who will take appropriate action.

We expect all players to:

1. Behave in a polite, courteous and pleasant manner.

2. Avoid any actions which might be considered intimidating, threatening or condescending, particularly to less experienced players.

3. Call "Director, please" promptly to settle irregularities, questions of behavior or supposed misconduct.

4. Control comments and actions so as not to disturb others.

5. Realize the director's function is to apply the Laws to restore equity and/or defuse a difficult situation, not to afford your side automatic benefit from an infraction by the opponents.

6. Observe proper dress and personal hygiene.

7. *Be guided by the spirit as well as the letter of the Laws of bridge.*

Cavendish Invitational moves to Las Vegas

The 23rd annual Cavendish Invitational Pairs and the 14th annual Cavendish Teams will take place in a new location this year --- the Mirage in Las Vegas. Make Haste slowly

Mark Aquino, playing with Charley Coon in the Charity Knockouts last Thursday, was faced with what seemed like a straightforward defensive problem.

Mark sat East, and after a spirited auction doubled 6♥ for what doubtless were convincing reasons at the time. Coon led the ♣4 to the 2, 8 and jack. Back came the ♥K on which Coon threw the ♦8. What is your plan on defense?

Well, perhaps Coon has eight diamonds, so there is no particular future there. Since declarer has only five hearts, he presumably has either a 3-5-0-5 or a 4-5-0-4 distribution. If it's the former, we cannot prevent 12 tricks whatever we do, so let's assume that declarer's hand is 4-5-0-4. Therefore he must be

for it to matter what we do.

The first thing to do is to note that dummy's trumps are notably poor -- there are hardly any entries to dummy. If declarer can ruff two diamonds in hand he has the makings of a dummy reversal and a squeeze on us in the black suits.

If we duck the first two trumps, declarer can play off all the diamonds and spades and endplay us with the ♥A, so we must win the first or second trump and exit with a major-suit card. If we exit with a diamond, declarer has the entries to ruff out diamonds and run the trumps to squeeze us. If we exit passively, the entries to dummy are just not good enough.

Declarer can ruff out the diamonds, but he can't finish with the lead in dummy necessary for the squeeze. The full hand:

The Facts: 2♥ made two, plus 110 for N/S. South stated that their methods did not require



that a support double be made with any hand that had three trumps. The Director ruled the table result would stand and that there had been no infraction.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. The N/S pair revealed to the Committee that they were not a regular partnership but they had agreed that the failure to double was either less than

three-card support or three-card support with a terrible hand.

The Committee Decision: Since there was no evidence that South forgot their agreement (and that the Alert woke South up), the Committee accepted the N/S explanation of their agreement. Therefore, the failure to double was not a violation of the partnership agreement and there was no reason to conclude that the Alert procedure influenced the actions at all. The Committee thought South's bidding was more than aggressive, but that was not a reason to take the result away. Therefore, the table result 2♥ made two, plus 110 for N/S, was allowed to stand.

There was some discussion of the merit of the appeal. Some Committee members thought that E/W made an effort to win through the appeal process what they could have achieved at the table if West had simply bid 2♠. The prevailing opinion was that the appeal had merit since their opponents' agreement was more detailed than they had thought it may have been.

The Facts: The opening lead was a heart that was won in the dummy with the ace. Declarer then played a low spade toward the jack. While West was thinking, declarer claimed, facing his hand. Law 68C states that a claim should be accompanied at once by a statement of clarification as to the order in which cards should be played. Here the declarer said he was going to win four spades, three hearts, two diamonds and one club (clearly an error) without stating a line of play. E/W immediately contested the claim. The Director was called and ruled that the contract would be 3NT by South, down one, plus 100 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. E/W pointed out that if declarer played a low spade at trick three, East would win the ace and play a heart. In the discussions between the players and the Director at the table, after all the players had faced their hands, declarer said he would play diamonds if the play took that course.

The Committee Decision: In the analysis of the hand, the Committee decided that the only way the contract could go down was if West discarded two minor suit cards on the spades and declarer cashed the third heart prior to playing diamonds. Declarer's statement that he would play diamonds if the defense played another heart after winning the ♠A was deemed to be a new statement of play rather than an expansion of the existing line, and as such, was discounted.

Law 70D states that no successful line of play should be accepted after a claim if there is an alternate normal line of play that would be less successful. Normal is defined as including play that would be *careless* or *inferior* for the level of player involved, but not *irrational*. Here, since declarer did not state this winning line of play at the time of making the initial claim, the claim is considered a new claim and declarer is now to be held to a very high standard of care; if there is any possibility of a normal and unsuccessful line of play declarer would be considered to have made it. The Committee believed that this decision revolved solely around the issue of whether playing the third heart prior to playing diamonds was careless or inferior as opposed to irrational. The Committee, after long deliberation unanimously decided that the play of the ♥Q (the third round of hearts) prior to playing diamonds would be irrational for this declarer or his peers. The Committee changed the contract to 3NT made three, plus 600 for N/S.

Obviously this incident should never have occurred. The Committee strongly admonished South for making this claim regardless of any reasons he may have had such as attempting to speed up play. The Committee hopes that others will learn from this unnecessary fiasco and refrain from making unclear or unfounded claims, while realizing that this hope is wildly optimistic.
