ACBL's Tournament Director Appreciation is going on during this tournament. Check this space each day to meet one of the TDs working at the Fall NABC.

John Gram remembers his introduction to bridge. He was a student at the University of Missouri School of Journalism. One day in the student lounge, he sat down to watch some other students playing bridge. He couldn't resist making comments about what was going on, and when one of the players left, Gram was challenged to put his money where his mouth was.



"I had to join in," he said.

Gram, who lives in Salem OR, grew up in St. Louis, taking his journalism degree West upon graduation in 1970. He first went to San Francisco, where his brother lived, but he ended up catching on with

the Oregon Statesman (now the Statesman-Journal).

Gram mostly worked as a copy editor and business writer, but he did write some music reviews. He said he doesn't miss the newspaper business at all, but he brings the same attention to detail as a TD that he had as a newspaperman.

The squad led by Lynn Baker dominated the final of the Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams, finishing ahead of the field by more than six boards. Baker played with Kay Schulle, Lynn Deas, Beth Palmer, Daniela von Arnim and Sabine Auken. Their score was 43.12 — 20.75 in the afternoon, 17.50 in the evening and 4.87 carryover.

This is the same team that won the Wagar Women's Knockout at the Atlanta NABC this summer, with the exception of Schulle who took the place of Kerri Sanborn.

In second with 36.55 was the team of Sylvia S. Caley, Marjorie Michelin, Jean Talbot and Joan Van Geffen.

The first final session was marred by an flawed instruction that caused players and boards to move to incorrect tables mid-session. Fifteen boards were properly played while the remaining 12 were treated as fouled boards and scored using a formula designed for such a purpose.

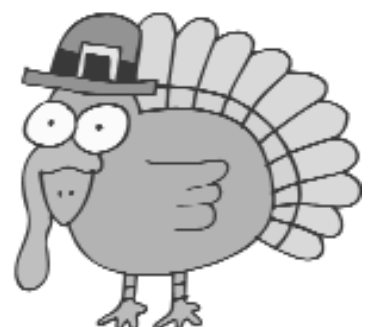

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Take advantage of competition

Usually we like to think that the auction is simpler when the opponents stay out of it, but that isn't always true. There are times when we can take advantage of action by the opponents to get a clearer picture of the full deal. Here's an example.

♠K J 9 4 ♥A 7 3 2 ♦6 ♣Q 9 6 4

Most of us would pass with this hand in first or second seat. It has only 10 high-card points, not enough to open. But what if your right hand opponent were to open 1♦? Then you could make a takeout double. Now you can count dummy points and use the double to describe hand short in diamonds and able to support the other suits. In fact, if my right-hand opponent opened 1♦ when it was not his turn to bid, I'd exercise the option to accept the bid just so I could double — the perfect opportunity to describe this hand should not be ignored.

You can also distinguish between preemptive and limit raises of your partner's major after competition.

♠K J 9 4 ♥A 7 4 3 ♦6 4 ♣Q 9 6
♠J 9 4 3 ♥Q 9 6 4 ♦6 ♣Q 9 6 4

Partner opens 1♥ or 1♠ and there's a 2♦ overall. With the first hand, I bid 3♦, telling partner that I have a limit raise or better in the major. With the second hand, I can jump to three of partner's major, promising four-card support but only single-raise values.

♠K 6 ♥9 3 2 ♦A K Q 10 6 3 ♣6

By agreement, you can use the cuebid of the opponent's suit to look for notrump. Take the hand above, for instance. Partner opens 1♣ and the opponent overcalls 1♥. A jump to 3♥ by you says, "Please bid 3NT with a heart stopper. I have a running minor suit." If partner doesn't have hearts stopped, it will be clear you should be playing in a minor suit. If you had long spades, you'd bid them: that's the nature of scoring. If the opponent had jumped to 2♥ over 1♣, your 3♥ bid would ask the same question, but the nature of your hand would be less obvious.

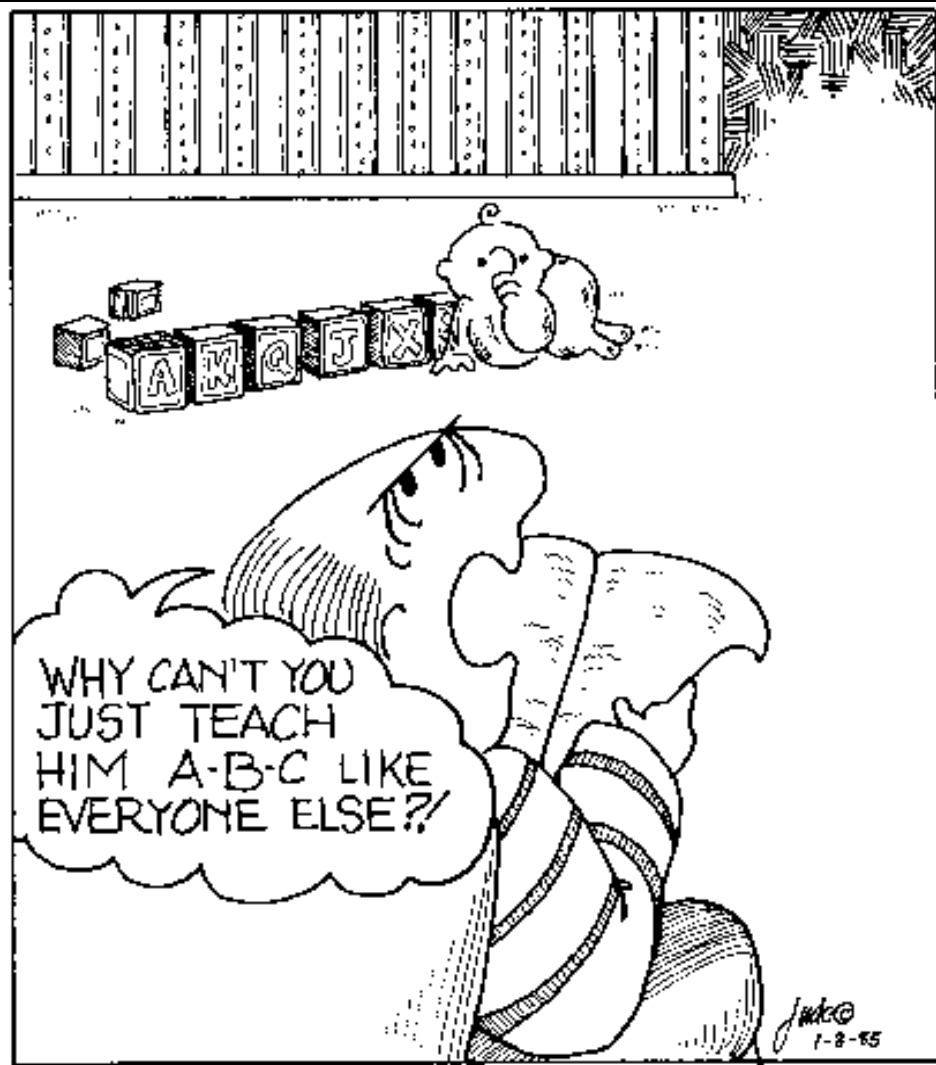
You can also double an opponent's artificial bid to let your partner know what to lead. A classic example is when an opponent opens 1NT and opener's partner uses Stayman or a transfer, e.g., 1NT - Pass - 2♦ - ?

Say you hold

♠9 6 3 ♥8 2 ♦A K J 9 5 4 ♣6 3.

You certainly don't want to bid 3♦, but you have a golden opportunity to tell partner what to lead. Just double the artificial bid.

Sometimes this can lead to good sacrifices. If you were in second seat, for example, after opener starts with 1NT. You pass holding



♠A 5 ♥9 7 5 ♦Q 10 8 7 3 ♣Q J 9

and hear your left-hand opponent transfer to hearts with a bid of 2♥. Partner doubles the artificial bid and opener bids 2♥ (in most partnership agreements, this means opener has at least three hearts — with a doubleton, it's logical to pass).

Not only do you know that partner must have no more than two hearts, you can also count the diamonds and be pretty sure that the opener's partner is short in that suit. At favorable vulnerability (they are, you aren't), you might decide to bid diamonds directly over 2♥ and to sacrifice at 5♦ if they bid on to 4♥. You won't make it, but you won't be down more than two or three, and with so many diamonds yourself you can be pretty sure your side isn't taking many tricks in that suit.

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♣2 (fourth best).

Bidding commentary: North's raise to 3♦ is invitational, showing at least four diamonds with 9-11 high-card points. South has more than enough to accept and makes the obvious 3NT rebid.

Lead commentary: West makes the normal lead of the ♣2, the unbid suit. At this point both East and South know that West started with four clubs, presumably headed by an honor or two. The lead of a low card in an unbid suit, particularly at notrump, shows strength.

Defensive commentary: East is destined to

be the hero or the goat! East knows (or should know) from the bidding that South has five hearts and four diamonds. East also knows from partner's lead that South has three clubs. Ergo, South must have a singleton spade! No matter what spade that is, East-West are slated to take four spade tricks if East bangs down the ace and then leads a low spade. Four spades and the ♣A spell a one-trick defeat. If East returns a club, South takes 10 tricks if he goes up with the king

and runs the red suits.

Further defensive commentary: What about returning partner's suit? It's usually a good idea, but when third hand can see a sure set by shifting to another suit, he should go for it.

Both defenders use the bidding to count declarer's hand. In addition, the opening lead may be so revealing that third hand will have the count of the hand at trick one! It's not magic. You can do it!

Bus Excursions to Colorado's Gaming

Enjoy a scenic drive to the town of Black Hawk, Colorado. The bus will leave the bus stop at 5 p.m. and returns you to the hotel by 11 p.m. Space is limited so sign up at the Information Desk to reserve your seat. Set in the mountains west of Denver, Black Hawk is the oldest town in Colorado's gold mining history. A number of towns that grew up in Gregory's Gulch, the narrow ravine where Georgia prospector John H. Gregory first discovered lode gold in 1859. Strikingly different today, Black Hawk maintains its rich heritage while at the same time welcoming its future with the spirit of adventure that brought forth those ambitious miners and merchants of the 1800s. And if the past is but prologue, Black Hawk's full story, yet to be told, will be a fascinating one indeed.



Pyramid Power: Egyptians won last year's Blue Ribbon Pairs

Egyptian experts Tarek Sadek and Walid Elahmady were the 2004 champs in the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. Sadek and Elahmady, longtime friends and business partners in a software company, posted a final score in the six-session event of 1722.22 matchpoints. They held off a furious rally by Steve Weinstein and Bobby Levin who finished second with 1708.38. (Top on a board was 51.) Weinstein and Levin's 69.46% (!) in the second final session was not enough to overcome the Egyptians' lead.

The event

The Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs ranks with the Life Master Pairs as one of the most prestigious — and toughest — pair events on the ACBL calendar. Like the LM Pairs, the Blue Ribbon Pairs is played over three days and includes two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions.

Entry is restricted to winners and runners-up in regional championships — plus high finishers in North American championships, members of current Grand National district championship teams, members of current official teams representing ACBL and the top 100 lifetime masterpoint holders.

The Blue Ribbon Pairs was renamed the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1999 to honor one of bridge's all-time great players, writers, administrators and the authority on the laws of the game.

Kaplan (1925–1997) won his first North American championship in 1953 — the Vanderbilt — and his last in 1997 — the Open Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Dallas.

Kaplan was recognized as the world's foremost authority on the laws of duplicate and rubber bridge. He became co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission in 1978 and was co-chairman of the WBF Laws Commission at the time of his death.

He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1993. In 1995 he was inducted into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame and the WBF Hall of Fame.

The trophy

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy, awarded for the National Open Pair Championship and donated by the Cavendish Club of New York in 1928. Since 1963, the trophy has been awarded to winners of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Verhees' splinter was very imaginative. If Levin bid 3NT, indicating spade values, Verhees would not like his hand as much. When Levin bid diamonds, denying spade values, the North hand zoomed upwards. Levin took full advantage when West failed to lead a high spade, starting instead with his singleton club. Levin won with the ♣A, pulled trumps, then played three rounds of hearts, discarding a club from hand. He could then ruff the clubs good and return to dummy with the ♠A to take all the tricks – and all the matchpoints.

Levin's 3♣ asked about five-card majors. 3NT denied four or five of a major. North started with a low diamond, won in hand by Verhees. With barely a pause, Verhees put the ♠Q on the table. North had no illusions about who had the ♠A, but if Verhees had started with three spades to the A-Q, it was necessary to duck that trick. When the ♠Q held, Verhees rattled off five rounds of diamonds, putting the opponents under pressure they did not handle perfectly. After finishing the diamonds, Verhees cashed the ♠A and exited with a low heart. Because of their faulty discarding, the opponents eventually had to play clubs for declarer and he finished with nine tricks.

On this deal from the second final session,

Verhees made another good bid to help Levin pick the right spot.

Verhees' fake cuebid in diamonds spurred Levin to bid Roman Key Card Blackwood, and when Verhees responded 5♠, showing two key cards with the queen (which Levin was looking at), Levin knew it was because he had a very long strong of clubs. Levin therefore placed the contract in the matchpoint-friendly spot of 6NT. When East failed to lead a diamond, Levin had 13 tricks and most of the matchpoints.

Tuned in

If some players seem to be able to see through the backs of the cards, it's because they are tuned into all the clues available from the bidding and play.

Check out Robert Levin in action on this deal from the first qualifying session of the Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs. He was playing with Louk Verhees of the Netherlands. This deal helped them finish second in the event.

West led the ♦2, fourth best, so Levin immediately placed his right-hand opponent with a doubleton diamond, therefore almost certainly 4-4 in the majors (he might have simply overcalled with a five-card major) and three clubs.

Furthermore, if West held a four-card major, he would have led that suit instead of a diamond.

Levin played low from dummy on the diamond lead, taking the 9 with his queen. Hoping for a defensive error, which he got, Levin played the ♥10 from hand at trick two. He was hoping that West would duck, forcing his partner to win, removing an entry to the East hand (Levin guessed correctly that East held good spades).

Indeed, East won the ♥K and played the ♠K, followed by the queen and then the 9. Levin, placing the ♣Q with East for the takeout double, took advantage of the spots, playing the ♣J from dummy, winning the ♣A when East covered. Now Levin played the ♣7 from hand, letting it ride, and he ended with four clubs, three diamonds, one heart and one spade for plus 150 and 22.5 out of 25 matchpoints.

On the lead of the ♦2, East didn't want to win the ace and set up two tricks for declarer if he had ♦Q 5, so he played the 9. This presented declarer with an interesting play for 12 tricks.

At trick two, Itabashi led the ♥J covered by the king and ace. Next the ♠A and the ♥Q were cashed. At trick five, he led the ♥9 and pitched his last diamond. West won the 10, but now had no winning option.

He tried leading a heart for his partner to ruff, to kill the pitch, overruffed by Itabashi. Trumps were drawn leading to this position:

Usually good bidding judgement will win team games. Sometimes, though, a bidding gadget can help you win a board. Jim Sternberg and Sid Golub, West Palm Beach FL, bid to a slam using their pet bidding methods on this deal from the Monday Compact KO Teams, Bracket A.

2♠ was 10 to 15 high-card points with six or more spades. Sternberg almost just bid 4♠ but decided partner might have the perfect cards so he made a 2NT inquiry. The 3♦ response showed extras (the seventh spade) with shortness somewhere and 3♥ asked where. 3NT showed specifically a singleton club since they have another way to show a void. The 4♣ bid was 1430 RKC and 4♥ showed three key cards.

Steinberg was still worried about the queen of trumps so inquired once again with 4NT. 5♦ promised the ♠Q but denied a king. Notice that the first nine bids were all Alerts or delayed Alerts. Only the 6♠ bid was not.

The players at the other table did not get to slam and so this was a nice pickup.

Today is Boulder Unit 359 Day

In the early Sixties, a group of Boulder bridge players borrowed \$35 from a local country club to buy bridge supplies. The players had been meeting at the University (now Flatirons) Country Club for rubber bridge games, and had decided to become a unit and start playing duplicate. They repaid the \$35 by charging 50 cents a session.

The first Boulder sectional tournament was organized in 1962 at the Harvest House Hotel by Broma Lou Reed, now Boulder's only Grand Life Master. Also that year another Boulder Bridge tradition was born. The McKenna trophy, named after Boulder's first life master, Kay McKenna and husband Jim, was awarded to the person winning the most masterpoints at the tournament.

Boulder Unit 359 is home to the University of Colorado, where, in the 1960s, a student duplicate game affectionately known as "the zoo" grew under the direction of Mike Kaplan and Gary Steiner.

In the 1970s, bridge in Boulder flourished under the direction of Carol Hansen. And in that decade, every January more than 40 women made the annual women's retreat for a weekend of bridge in YMCA Camp of the Rockies in the popular and picturesque tourist town of Estes Park.

Today, Unit 359 stretches from the rich farmlands of the Boulder Valley and the Great Plains past the fantastic foothills of the Flatirons and the Front Range to the splendor of the Rocky Mountains and the Continental Divide.

Now, sectionals happen twice a year, spring and fall, at the Boulder County Fairgrounds in Longmont. With the area's large aerospace industry, it's possible to play bridge against a rocket scientist or even a Pulitzer Prize winner from the University of Colorado's famed research science departments.

Into the jaws

This deal no doubt proved enormously frustrating for the East player, who has a simple, albeit counterintuitive, solution to his problem. The deal occurred in the second qualifying session of the Victor Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams. Wafik Abdou, playing with Connie Goldberg, was declarer.

Abdou showed a semi-balanced hand of invitational strength with five spades. On the lead of the ♣8, Abdou ducked. East won the ♣Q and shifted to the ♥Q. Abdou took the ♥K in hand (West played the 7, upside-down, to show three hearts) and played the ♠J to East's king. East got out with a trump, taken by the ace in dummy. Abdou then played a low diamond away from the king.

East tried to avoid the endplay by rising with the ♦A and returning the suit. This now led to a beautiful ending (from the North-South perspective, at least) after Abdou pulled the last trump:

When declarer leads a diamond to the king, East is caught in a trump squeeze. If he pitches a club, declarer cashes the ♣A and the ♥A, ruffing a heart to cash the good ♣10. If East pitches a heart, declarer cashes the ♥A and ruffs a heart, returning to dummy with the ♣A to enjoy the good ♥8.

There are two points of interest: if, after winning the ♦A, East exits with the ♥J instead of the diamond, declarer can win with the ace and lead the ♥8, pinning the ♥6 to establish the ♥5 as his 10th trick.

The more subtle point of defense comes earlier on. Look at the East hand – can you find the simple (not necessarily easy) way to set 4♠? The answer is that all you have to do is return a club at trick two! Now you win the ♠K to give partner a club ruff – and Bob's your uncle!

The attempt to duplicate the field

The field reached 2♥ at most tables. Many made 12 tricks after a diamond lead. They won in hand, cashed three spades, pitching a club, and took a heart finesse. If West played a fourth spade, East could pitch a diamond and declarer would not be able to reach dummy for another heart finesse. He would make "only" 11 tricks. Some Wests anxiously tried to cash the ♣A instead of leading the last spade. At those tables declarer ruffed the ♣A, led a diamond to the jack and took another heart finesse, making six!

Most of the North players passed 2♥, thinking that they would simply duplicate the auction at the other table. So everybody duplicated everybody else's losing auction. Perhaps that's why we call it "duplicate"?

It's certainly possible that 2♥ will make on the nose in some layouts, but in this case South made 11 or 12 tricks, and when you make 11 or 12 tricks in 2♥, you have to stop and ask yourself if you're in the ballpark.

At one table, North invited game with a bid of 2NT and South bid 3NT, down one. South should rebid 3♦ over 2NT, or, if he really wants to hide those diamonds from the opening leader, simply rebid 4♥ with his strong playing hand.

That brings us to South. He had a two-and-a-half heart rebid over 1♠. At IMPs, the right bid is 2♦, a compromise, planning to raise a preference of 2♥ to 3♥. This describes the hand nicely. At matchpoints, you hate to play in 2♦ when you hold such a nice heart suit, and that's why everybody was rebidding 2♥. I guess the fault lies with the form of scoring – matchpoints makes us do things we'd never do at the "real" bridge table.

Facts: South hesitated between 15 and 20 seconds before passing the double. The director was called after North started considering acting after the double. The 5♣ made 11 tricks, plus 600 North-South.

Director's Ruling: The hesitation expressed doubt about the advisability of playing 3NT doubled. Pass is a logical alternative. Accordingly, by Law 16 the director adjusted the result to 3NT doubled, down one, plus 100 East-West.

The Appeal: North described his 3NT bid as "squirrelly," "not a good bid," and a result of

"matchpoint mania." Once his left-hand opponent told him he had erred by doubling, his only consideration was whether to bid 4♣ or 5♣. He was sure the double was based on a good diamond suit – there were no other logical possibilities. He thought that playing 3NT doubled would have been foolish and, therefore, not a logical alternative. East-West contended that running from 3NT is right only when 3NT will not make and they suggested that seven clubs in the South hand would often make 3NT cold. They also supported the director's finding that the hesitation suggested doubt about the success of 3NT doubled.

The Decision: The committee considered South's hesitation carefully. While the director thought that it showed doubt about the success of 3NT, the committee thought that South had insufficient information about North's values to be considering a call based on doubt. He might instead be considering redoubling. (South had testified that his hesitation was the result of thought about the meanings of pass and redouble in this sequence. He finally decided that the partnership had no agreement for the meanings in this sequence.) Hence, the hesitation may not have demonstrably suggested the run from 3NT doubled.

The committee, however, based its final decision on there being no logical alternative to North's bidding over the double. Certainly, the 3NT bid was flaky when made, but when his LHO tells him he has made a mistake and he has a chance to reconsider such things as his defective diamond holding (for 3NT) and his general weakness, and his good club support, passing is not a logical alternative. If North is permitted to bid in this situation, then there is no reason for the committee to interfere with North's choice of bids. Accordingly, the committee permitted the 5♣ call and reinstated the table result of plus 600 North-South.

Barbara Nudelman, who represented District 13 on the ACBL Board for many years, said that when Wingard first joined the Board "he was different from most of us because he smiled all the time. With all that, he was one of the hard workers, and he always had a lot to give. We thank you and we love you."

Bonnie Bagley, District 17 secretary and one of the committee chairs for the Fall NABC, said she doesn't know Wingard as well as some of the others who spoke, but she did say she likes him so much that she is willing to go miles out of her way to pick him up and take him home when they play bridge together in the snowy season ("Bob doesn't drive in the snow," she related).

Wingard, floored by the honor, told the crowd, "I'll try to keep smiling and helping whoever needs help. I hope that whenever you go home you will share your happy memories of Denver with your friends."

Osofsky started the celebration by reminding the group that they were attending the final meeting of the year of the 50th anniversary of the establishment of the Goodwill Committee. She acknowledged the passing since the summer meeting of three members of the committee – Terry Michaels, Alan Truscott and Karl Johnson.

ACBL President Roger Smith told the crowd, "It's been a great 50th anniversary year. Let's keep it up. Thanks for all you do to make sure everyone enjoys the game." Smith and Osofsky were partners for the evening game Monday.

NABC Co-Chair Roy Weinstein welcomed everyone to the meeting with the reminder that it has been 27 years since Denver hosted an NABC. "We're thrilled to have the ACBL back, and we hope we don't wait another 27 years," he said.

Jerry Fleming, ACBL Treasurer and District 17 representative to the ACBL Board, took the opportunity to honor John Grossman, president of Unit 360 in Colorado Springs. Grossman, said Fleming, has been the leader of a movement to renovate the bridge club in Colorado Springs and has sparked a sharp increase in membership in the unit. Grossman even cooks for some of the events at the club, Fleming said: "Brats and bridge are a John Grossman innovation."

Grossman said the willingness of the Unit 360 board to experiment has been a boon, not to mention the "activist" attitude of the board members. Fortunately, he said, "most of our experiments have worked."

Linda Granell, ACBL's director of marketing, handed out tee shirts advertising the new bridgeiscool.com web site, part of the ACBL's initiative to attract more young people to the game and reminded participants to check out the site.

The World Bridge Championships ended earlier this month in Estoril, Portugal, and many of the players who participated there are attending the NABC. Accordingly, Osofsky invited team members to attend the Goodwill Committee meeting to be recognized. Those included the Bermuda Bowl champions from Italy, USA1 (the Nick Nickell team) and USA2 (Russ Ekeblad), the silver and bronze medalists, respectively, in the Bermuda Bowl.

Also honored was the USA1 Junior team that won the World Youth Team Championship in Australia in August, and the Canadian Junior team that came home with the bronze medal.

Finally, Osofsky recognized this year's Jane Johnson Award winners, Dave Smith and Carol Robertson (Headquarters) and Janet Case (tournament directors). The award is given annually to the ACBL employees who best exemplify the late Jane Johnson's dedication to service.

What is high-altitude or mountain sickness? Sometimes people get sick at high altitudes. This is called mountain sickness or high-altitude sickness.

What causes this problem?

Lack of oxygen causes high-altitude sickness.

As altitude increases, the air becomes "thinner," which means less oxygen is in the atmosphere. You get less oxygen in your lungs with each breath, so the amount of oxygen in your blood declines. All people can experience mountain sickness, but it may be more severe in people who have heart or lung problems.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms usually begin within 48 hours of arriving at high altitude. Symptoms include:

- headaches, breathlessness, fatigue
- nausea or vomiting
- inability to sleep

• swelling of the face, hands and feet
 Recommendation

Most people adjust or "acclimatize" to the high altitude within a few days. Here are some tips:

- Avoid strenuous activity for the first day or two.
- Drink extra fluid.
- Be careful of drinking alcohol. Its effect is magnified at high altitude.
- Your doctor may prescribe medication to help prevent or treat altitude sickness.
