Meet Your TDs



This is one of a series of profiles of tournament directors working at the NABCs.

Growing up in Victoria BC, Matt Smith knew a lot of bridge players. He couldn't help it – they were his parents and six siblings. Besides Mom and Dad, there were Brenda, Duncan, Janet, Louise, Charlie and Nick.

"At various times," Smith says, "they all played bridge."

Luckily for the ACBL, Smith is the one who decided to make a career out of the game.

Now a national tournament director and a regular at NABCs, Smith is also sought after by the World Bridge Federation for that organization's big tournaments. He has been working at WBF world championships since 2000.

Smith's father, Paul, taught math at the University of Victoria and, when Matt was a teenager, his dad ran the Victoria Bridge Studio for about five years. "At 14," Smith recalls, "I made part-time money as a janitor at the club."

Smith knew about the game but not how to play, until his father took him along for some lessons he was giving. There was no turning back at that point, and soon Smith was directing at the club and running a newcomer game.

He attended the University of Victoria, studying political science and history, but he left after three years because the owner of a local bridge club left town and Smith "took some time off" to run the club. He did that, plus a bit of work for the provincial government, before becoming a full-time TD in 1994.

The move from club director to TD came at the urging of Phil Wood and Roger and Margo Putnam.

Smith says he finds the job immensely satisfying, in large measure "because of the people I work with."

He says he also likes the fact that the job of TD "is not predictable. It's always something different."

Smith says he never thought about the possibility that growing up in a big family might

Starting young

sectional tournament.

"We expect players as young as six," said Patty Tucker, the President of the Atlanta Junior Bridge Organization, the sponsoring group.

The AJB has had great success with more than 400 children ages six to 18 involved in their teaching classes. It's not all class instruction — they hold special games for the children to play.

"To see the joy in their faces is special," said Tucker, the driving force behind the group. "We had a six-year-old boy who bid his first slam. He was so excited. We had to ask him to be quieter," she said.

The project began when three teachers in the

Atlanta area joined forces. Tucker taught a bridge camp during the summer of 2005. There were 11 students in the camp. Carolyn Eckert taught bridge classes in an advanced mathematics class in an elementary school. Barbara Heller, a school librarian, taught a bridge class in a middle school.

They decided to have a special game for the youngsters at the Atlanta NABC in July, 2005. Besides schools, they decided to hold classes in and recruit students from other places.

"Schools are a good place to teach, but there's another world out there," said Tucker. "We have taught and recruited students from community centers, church groups, YMCAs and many other places," she said. "Unless you have an 'in' with a principal, it's hard to get classes established in schools. Also, schools close for the summer or students graduate. We wanted to find a place where they could always play."

Students were recruited through bridge clubs, libraries, schools and other places. Clubs grew as the word spread and the students invited their friends. There are now more than 400 youngsters in classes.

Notice to players who live outside North America

Participation in the Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs is limited to those ACBL members who have earned a Blue Ribbon qualification (or for those members on the Lifetime Top 100 masterpoint list), and participation in the Life Master Open and Women's Pairs is restricted to ACBL members who have achieved the rank of Life Master.

Foreign players who do not meet these criteria, but feel they are otherwise eligible, must receive a waiver in writing prior to the commencement of these contests. Please contact ACBL Chief Tournament Director Rick Beye here at the tournament. He may be contacted through the Tournament Operations office and he will be available at the selling sites.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

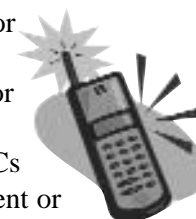
If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention

card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

No calls, please

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.





JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Limit raises

You hold

♠7 ♥K Q 7 6 4 ♦A J 10 5 3 ♣6 2.

Would you open this hand as dealer, vulnerable against not? Today, many players add for length when opening the bidding. The fifth cards in both red suits bring you up to 12 total points. Still not sure?

In *Points Schmoints*, Marty Bergen introduced the average player to the Rule of Twenty, which suggests opening "light" when the total of your HCP (10 here) and the number of cards in your two longest suits (10 in the example above) totals 20 or more.

The Rule of Twenty works best when your meager high cards are in your long suits, as they are in this case. Marty and I would suggest opening 1♥.

Good news – partner makes a limit raise to 3♥. What does 3♥ show in your system? My suggestion is for a jump raise of opener's major to be a limit raise, showing a good 10-12 points and at least four trumps. We are used to looking for an eight-card fit, but I am suggesting that partner should have better than that to make an immediate limit raise.

There is a very good reason for this suggestion. It will let you bid more games. The ninth trump is valuable – so valuable that opener should accept the game try with a minimum hand as long as it has good shape. Given that you opened this hand, would you carry on to 4♥? I would!



Here is one possible complete deal:

♠ J 10 6 5
♥ A 9 3 2
♦ Q 6 4
♣ K 5

♠ K 8 4 3
♥ J 10 5
♦ K 7
♣ A J 9 4

♠ A Q 9 2
♥ 8
♦ 9 8 2
♣ Q 10 8 7 3

♠ 7
♥ K Q 7 6 4
♦ A J 10 5 3
♣ 6 2

As you see, 4♥ makes even though North-South have only half the total 40 HCP in the deck. Two-suited hands are powerful – especially when you have a nine-card trump fit.

If you missed this game, the form of scoring could affect your result. In a pairs game where 10 or more other pairs play the same deal, there are likely to be other pairs missing game, too, and you might salvage some matchpoints. As North-South, you score one matchpoint for every North-South pair whose score you beat and one-half matchpoint for every North-South pair you tie.

In a team game, you have only one other opponent – the pair sitting in the North-South seat at your teammates' table. If that pair bids game, you will lose big time. A vulnerable game scores 620 points. 3♥ making four scores 170 points. Your team's score is the net difference between the results at the two tables – minus 450 points on this deal. When that is converted into IMPs (the scoring scale used in team games), your team loses 10 IMPs. Many team matches are won or lost by less than that! Missing a vulnerable game in IMPs is a blow, so don't do it. In fact, team players are advised to push to bid a vulnerable game even if they think

there is a bit less than a 50% chance to make it. The loss would not have been quite so great if you were not vulnerable. In that case, you would be comparing a score of minus 420 to a score of 170 for a net loss of only 250 points, which converts to 6 IMPs.

The advice for non-vulnerable games in teams is to bid any game that has a 50-50 shot. At matchpoints, you'll get a decent result for bidding a 50-50 game, but you can also get a reasonable result for stopping in a partscore.

If you find yourself competing in a team event – and they are fun – remember to bid your games (especially vulnerable ones) and slams, and focus on setting any contract that your opponents bid. Greed isn't necessary – if you can see the setting trick, take it.



Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♥5

Bidding commentary: The proper opening bid with this distribution is 1♦. Also, it is a bit better to rebid 2♣ over the expected 1♠ response with a low singleton in spades as opposed to 1NT. Rebidding one notrump with a low singleton in partner's suit is misleading. A singleton king or ace is okay, but partner expects at least two spades. South's rebid shows six, not five spades, along with 6-9 HCP. North should

subtract a point (or two!) for a singleton in partner's main suit (it only hurts for a little while) and pass 2♠ like a flash. A 2NT rebid in this sequence with a singleton in partner's suit and no long suit of one's own shows 16-17 high-card points, minimum.

Lead commentary: The unbid suit is usually a wise choice of opening leads. Don't even think of leading a trump when the auction shows the opponents are in a misfit.

Defensive commentary: West leads a heart, and East does best to win the king, cash

the ace and continue with a third heart, ruffed by declarer. South will probably enter dummy with a club and lead a spade to the king. At this point, the contract can be beaten. If West wins and plays a fourth heart (or cashes the ♦A and leads a fourth heart), East has to come through and uppercut with the ♠10 (key play). Now declarer loses three spade tricks (check it out) along with two hearts and a diamond for down one. If East neglects to uppercut, declarer loses only two spades and makes the contract.

Solid inference

On this deal from the second qualifying session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs (hands rotated), declarer missed a fairly solid inference – and one that comes up time and time again.

West led the ♣J against 3NT. Declarer won dummy’s ♣A and cashed the ♥A. West made a nice play when he dropped the 10. How declarer would have played had West followed with the ♥5 we will never know, but now it was easy to continue with the ♥K, then the ♥9 for four heart tricks, when all five had been a possibility.

Declarer ducked the club continuation to East’s queen but won the next club and cashed the hearts. East threw two diamonds to keep the spade guard and West threw two spades, while declarer came down to the ♠A 10 and ♦K J 8.

Declarer led the ♦10, and when East played low, ran it to the queen. Down one.

This was a clear misplay. It is easy to throw low cards from the ace and hard to throw them from the queen. Unless the defenders are very good (or very, very bad), West holds the ♦Q, and declarer should have led to his king to make his contract.

Entry fees

Players *must* be ACBL members whose service fees or dues are current in order to compete in any of the following nationally ranked events: Nail Life Master Open Pairs, Smith Life Master Women’s Pairs, Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, Keohane North American Swiss Teams, Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Marsha May Sternberg Women’s Board-a-Match Teams and the Senior Knockouts. The entry fees for these contests are **\$18** per player per session.

Players must also be current ACBL members to play in the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Miles Non-Life Master Pairs or National 99er Pairs. The entry fee is **\$16.50** per player per session.

Regional championships are **\$15.50** per player per session for ACBL members, **\$17.50** for non-members.

All other events are **\$14.50** per player per session for ACBL members, **\$16.50** for non-members.

Under the microscope

Bridge is a game of mistakes. You have to take advantage of your opponents’ errors and hope they don’t take advantage of yours.

On the deal that follows, the suit combination of J 8 in dummy facing A 7 in hand comes under the microscope.

At a suit contract, when the defense lead the suit at trick one, you are pretty sure to lose one trick and one only (unless this is your trump suit, in which case I suggest you revisit your bidding textbooks).

If the suit is led, there are clear deceptive advantages to putting up the jack. Why? Well, imagine you play low and take your right-hand opponent’s 9 or 10 with the ace. When your LHO gets the lead, he will be able to lead to his partner, knowing he has a high honor in this suit. By contrast, if the layout is something along these lines:

J 8
 K 9 6 5 2 Q 10 4 3
 A 7

and the first trick goes 5, jack, queen, ace, how will West know if South has A-10 doubleton (in which case an underlead costs a trick) or the actual layout?

But that is by the by. Here is the deal in question (hands rotated).

Dlr: North ♠ A 10 6 4
 Vul: Both ♥ 8 2
 ♦ J 8
 ♣ A K J 10 2

♠ 8 ♠ Q 7 3
 ♥ A Q 6 5 3 ♥ J 10 4

What actually happened was that Vandana Vidwans, playing with Rajeev Gupta, declared 4♠ on an informative auction.

Since East had shown both suits himself, he was a little cornered when his partner led a fifth-highest ♦2. Could this be an underlead of the ♦A? Trying not to spoil his partner’s brilliancy, East played the ♦K on the 8 – and that was all the help Vandana needed. She won the ♦A, played a spade to the ace and finessed in trumps, drew East’s queen, cashed the ♣A and ♣K and exited with the ♦J to West.

West could now open up hearts and hold declarer’s losses in the suit to one trick – or lead a diamond and concede a ruff-sluff. Either way, declarer had her 10 tricks.

"We originally met every other week," said Tucker, "but as the classes grew, we started meeting every week. Last January we formed the AJB organization."

Lessons are held for three classes a month. On the fourth class, a game is held. It is duplicate style with boards, bid boxes and a typical game might be six to nine tables. The students are so open," said Tucker. "They don't mind if they goof or misplay a hand, but they hate it if someone calls the director."

An offshoot of the program is that some of the children's parents want to learn how to play. Some of the students have joined the ACBL. "They tend to join when they get their first masterpoint," said Tucker.

The AJB group is trying to recruit more teachers. They are sponsoring a Teacher Accreditation Program (TAP) in January. Support from Unit 114 and the Duplicate Bridge Association

of Atlanta has been "awesome" according to Tucker.

The youth state championship game is to be sponsored by the Art Matthews family. Matthews, who died last year, was an influential player in the Atlanta area for many years. "He would be happy to know his family was sponsoring this," said Tucker.

Picus sent for the higher-scoring game and found herself in a delicate spot. Andresen led a top heart and could have assured the defeat of the contract by continuing with another high heart.

Instead, he shifted to a club, which looked to Picus like a singleton. Perhaps it is best to win that lead in the South hand and run the ♠J, but if East wins and gives partner a club ruff, another heart dooms the contract.

So Picus ruffed a heart to dummy and played the ♠9, letting it ride. Had Andresen taken this and played another heart, Picus would have won in dummy, crossed to the ♦A and drawn trumps. Even on a club return, declarer can win and give up a diamond and still have the rest. But Andresen ducked the ♠9! Declarer was now dead, twist and turn as she might.

Open BAM begins today

Play begins today in the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams. The winners of the 2005 Open BAM Teams were Roy Welland, Bjorn Fallenius, Chip Martel, Lew Stansby, Cezary Balicki and Adam Zmudzinski.

The Mitchell Trophy

Players will be competing for the Victor Mitchell Trophy, which honors one of bridge's most colorful characters -- a champion player, philosopher and mentor to the stars.

Mitchell, a Grand Life Master with more than 10,000 masterpoints, won five North American championships including the Spingold in 1956 and 1959, the Life Master Men's Pairs in 1962 and the Men's Teams in 1962 and 1963. He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1988 and inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

The game

The Open Board-a-Match Teams is a four-session event that consists of two qualifying and two final sessions. It was a men's event until 1990 when it became an open event.

Perhaps the event's high point occurred in 1977 when there were only three winners: Richard Doughty, Ron Smith and Lou Bluhm (plus these players eligible for session awards only: Bruce Ferguson, Sidney Lazard, Leslie West and Irv Kostal).

Lazard was supposed to play with Doughty but after a good first set, Lazard became ill and Kostal took his place for the evening session.

Lazard was better the next day and in his seat for the first final session. Suddenly he toppled over and a call went out for paramedics. They arrived quickly and rushed Lazard to a hospital.

Meanwhile, Doughty had to find another partner and Ferguson was pressed into service. Ferguson, whose team had not qualified the previous day, was technically ineligible but was allowed to play only in the afternoon.

In the evening, Doughty recruited West -- his fourth partner in four sessions -- and the team went on to victory by a margin of two full boards.
