Diamond (Brian Platnick, Eric Greco, Geoff Hampson, Fred Gitelman and Brad Moss) earned their spot in the final with a 121-89 victory of the team led by James Cayne (Michael Seamon, Alfredo Versace, Lorenzo Lauria, Antonio Sementa and Giorgio Duboin).

The Diamond-Cayne match was interrupted for about 30 minutes during the second quarter when Sementa began feeling ill. Medical help was called for, and Sementa was taken to a local hospital. Two boards were thrown out and additional boards were put in play. Sementa later returned and finished out the match playing with Duboin. Lauria and Versace

Second place went to Steve Shirey of Fort Worth TX and Allan Stauber of Palm Beach Gardens FL.

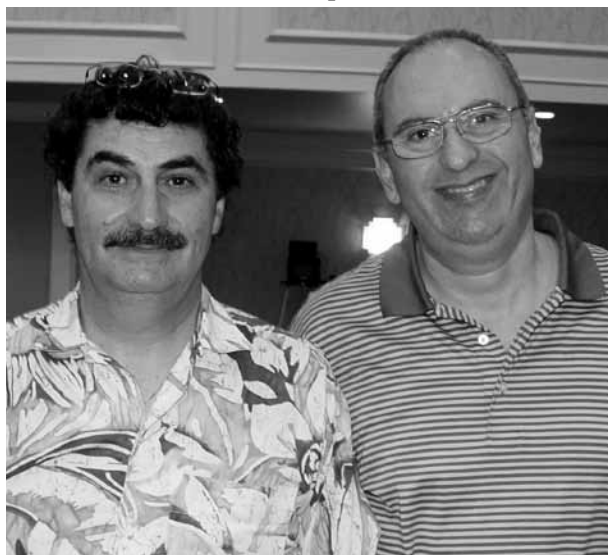

Those extra chances

How would you play the following 4♠ contract from a bracketed knockout teams match? Two highly capable declarers, one a former world champion, missed the extra chance that would have brought the contract home.

Dir: North ♠ 9 7
Vul: N-S ♥ K Q 10 2
♦ 10 9 8 7
♣ 10 5 3

♠ A K J 8 6 4
♥ 7 3
♦ 4
♣ A K 8 4

South opens 4♠ in third seat, and West leads two top diamonds.

You are going to play for the spade finesse as that is the percentage play in the suit. Our two declarers simply ruffed the second diamond, forced an dummy entry in hearts, then took the spade finesse. After drawing trumps without loss, they played three rounds of clubs, but when East turned up with ♣Q 9 x x, that led to one down.

The extra chance is to find East with the ♠10 as well as the queen for which you intend to play him.

Play three rounds of clubs at tricks three to five. When you regain the lead, you can ruff the fourth club in dummy and take the spade finesse.

Sure enough, East had ♠Q 10 x of trumps along with his four clubs, so this extra chance wins your contract.

Could this play instead cost your contract? Well, not if clubs are 3-3, but if West has the ♠10 and either player has ♣Q J, ♣Q 9 or ♣J 9, the defense may get a trump promotion when you would have succeeded on the more straightforward line.

The answer is to cash one top club at trick three. If one of the queen, jack or 9 appears, revert to Plan A, leading a heart to dummy to take the spade finesse. If only low clubs appear, continue with a second and third round. And if a defender has played the ♣9 from a doubleton ♣9 x – good luck to him.

Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

Roth Open Swiss starts today

The four-session Open Swiss Teams, which is now named in honor ACBL Hall of Famer Al Roth, begins with today's two-session qualifier. The nationally rated event was first held in 2005.

Alvin Roth

Al Roth (1914-2007) is generally considered the premier bidding theorist of his bridge generation, perhaps of all time. He and longtime partner Tobias Stone are credited with developing the negative double, the unusual notrump, 1NT forcing and the weak two-bid.



Roth, an ACBL Grand Life Master with more than 12,000 masterpoints, won 26 national titles — including the Spingold five times, the Vanderbilt three times and the Reisinger twice.

He represented North America in the Bermuda Bowl in 1955, 1958 and 1967. A WBF Life Master, he placed second in the World Team Olympiad in 1968.

During his first world championship appearance, Roth was declaring a 2♠ contract and felt he played the hand before — but as a defender. The director, Al Sobel, did not believe him since the hands had been dealt at the table. Sobel made Roth call out all the cards in each hand — including the spots — before he threw out the board. No one ever discovered how this happened.

Roth retired from active bridge competition in the Seventies but remained active as a staff member of *Bridge Today* and on panels of *The Bridge World*, *Bridge Today* and *Australian Bridge*.

He was the author of *The Roth-Stone System*, *Al Roth on Bridge* and *Picture Bidding* and co-author of *Bridge Is a Partnership Game*, *Modern Bridge Complete* and *Bridge for Beginners*.

Roth retired to Boca Raton FL, but was a longtime resident of New York, where he owned and managed the Mayfair Club.

Staying out of trouble

Help prevent partner's revoke.

My side is defending and declarer is pulling trumps (spades). My partner fails to follow to the first trump trick. I immediately look him in the eye and say, "No spades, partner?" If he does find a spade, he can correct the revoke immediately, saving our side from a one- or two-trick penalty. The card he tried to play initially becomes a penalty card, which may or may not cost our side. If I don't protect my partner from revoking, then I should take partial responsibility for the revoke. The dummy is also allowed to protect declarer in this manner. However, if the revoking side has played to the next trick, the revoke can no longer be corrected. So make it part of your routine to double check with your partner next time he fails to follow suit.



Don't save your opponents from revoking. Playing at the club recently, I was defending and did not follow to a trump trick. The declarer, my opponent, asked me, "No spades?" And sure enough, I found a spade and corrected my play to the trick. My original played card became a penalty card, but it turned out to not cost our side anything. Had the declarer let my revoke become established, there would have been a one- or two-trick penalty and his side would have benefitted from my mistake. You are under no obligation to protect your opponents. Let them make their mistakes.

Stop sacrificing when vulnerable. I must've tried this about 100 times in my first five years of playing bridge. It worked twice. The opponents will usually double you for penalties (especially after reading this column) and you'll sometimes go for minus 800 or more. Let them have their game. Even a below-average matchpoint result is better than a zero.

Stop rescuing your partner. Many of you are still rebidding 2NT as a further denial of support for partner's long suit. If both of you have minimum hands, you need to stop below 2NT.

Return partner's opening lead as soon as you can. If you don't, you'd better have a good explanation ready for the post mortem.

Don't lead "ace from space." Leading an ace from a suit headed by the A-K is very powerful. Leading an *unsupported* ace as an opening lead is rarely the right move. The bridge goddess invented aces to capture kings and queens. When you lead an ace, all you're going to get is the 2, 3 and 4. Hold onto those aces until an opponent attempts to win a trick with a king or

queen, *then* pounce on it. If you or your partner has the jack or 10 of that suit, it'll be that much closer to being a winner!

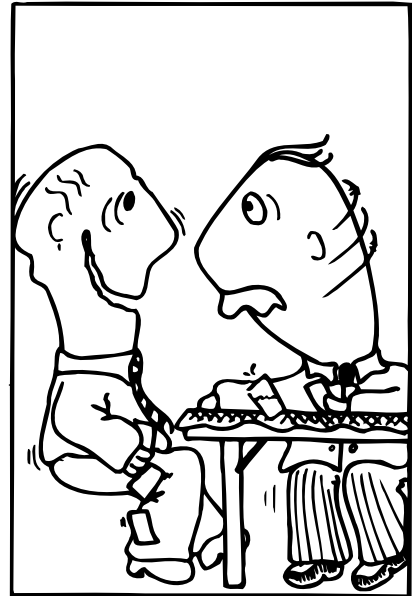
Don't lead singleton honors. When the declarer is missing a king or queen in a certain suit, he often will finesse for that card, and I've scored many a singleton honor for that reason. But leading it (in an attempt to get a ruff later) only puts it out there, begging to be captured. It's different if partner has bid that suit.

As responder, don't jump on your first bid unless you absolutely, positively, know what the trump suit is going to be. Keep the bidding low (a new suit would be forcing) to get more information from your partner about his hand. Regarding final contracts: *If you don't know, go slow.*

Stop misusing Blackwood and Gerber. Anyone can bid a slam – just reach into your bidding box, pull it out and lay it on the table. Your goal should be to bid a good slam (one that makes) and to stay out of a bad slam (one that goes down). Blackwood and Gerber should be used to make sure your side isn't missing two aces before going to slam. You should be willing to continue to slam missing only one ace. Don't use Blackwood or Gerber as a shoehorn to wiggle your way *into* a slam. Use the conventions to wiggle your way out of bidding bad slams.

Don't lead a doubleton unless your partner bid the suit. This is one of the most abused opening leads ever. It's probably my sixth choice of possible opening leads. By the time you've created a void in your hand, the declarer has pulled your trumps and all you've done is set up his side suit for him.

Don't lead a singleton if you're partner is broke. And how would you know he's broke? Add up the points around the table. If the opponents are in a game contract, you can assume they have around 26 HCP. If you're looking at 13 HCP in your own hand, that would leave your partner with one lousy, stinkin' point. He's never



getting the lead to give you a ruff, so why bother leading your singleton?

As responder, use the proper rebids after a Jacoby Transfer. The transfer shows at least a five-card major, so don't bid the suit again unless you have six or more! In response to partner's 1NT opening bid, your plan should be to:

- With a five-card major
- 0-7 HCP: transfer and pass.
- 8-9 HCP: transfer and bid 2NT.
- 10+ HCP: transfer and bid 3NT.

- With a six-card major
- 0-7 HCP: transfer and pass.
- 8-9 HCP: transfer and raise to three of your major.
- 10+ HCP: transfer and bid game in your major.

Opening lead: ♥3.

Bidding commentary: A 19-point balanced hand with four aces plus a five-card suit headed by two honors should be upgraded by at least one point and treated as a 20-point hand. This hand is oodles better than a balanced 20-count with a 4-3-3-3 or some 4-4-3-2 pattern. It is also the reason not to open 1NT with a balanced 17 high-card points with a five-card suit headed by any two honors. Treat it as an 18 point hand.

Play Commentary: You start with seven top tricks and have to develop either clubs or spades

for two additional tricks. But which suit should you attack? If either suit breaks 3-3 (36%), it doesn't matter which one you attack. However, there is a decided advantage in attacking spades starting with the ace and then playing low from both hands on the second spade play. Why?

Assuming a 4-2 break (3-3 doesn't matter), you will take three spade tricks anytime either opponent has honor doubleton (16%). Once second hand plays low, you have to hope fourth hand is the one with honor doubleton. An extra 16% is not be sneezed at.



Thrice 3NT

The deals in the final of the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams were exciting.

In the final, Valerie Westheimer, Disa Eythorsdottir, Betty Ann Kennedy, Mildred Breed and Marinesa Letizia took the early lead, gaining 45 IMPs in the first quarter against Sam Dinkin (non-playing captain), Lynn Baker, Karen McCallum, Lynn Deas, Beth Palmer, Irina Levitina and Kerri Sanborn. The Dinkin team reduced the margin to 6 IMPs at the half, but Westheimer moved 11 ahead with one session to play.

Against 4♥, Sanborn led the ♠4, ducked to North's king. Levitina shifted to the ♦K and continued with another diamond. From there declarer had to lose two trump tricks for down two.

Against 3NT, Disa led her fourth-highest spade. Palmer won with dummy's queen and ran the ♦J, North winning and exiting with a club to dummy's king. After a diamond to her queen, declarer, correctly not relying on 3-3 diamonds, led the ♣10. Kennedy won with her queen and returned a spade, but West won with her ace, cashed her two club winners, and played another spade. Palmer took three spades, two hearts, one diamond and three clubs.

Plus 100 and plus 400 gave Dinkin 11 IMPs – the match was tied.

Westheimer gained 9 IMPs over the next five boards. Then:

Disa showed no lack of courage in overcalling 1NT vulnerable opposite a passed partner and only ♠Q-6-4. I was surprised Kennedy didn't raise to 3NT. Eight points, a five-card suit and partner able to place the cards well seemed to suggest blasting game. Not that 3NT would have made, because Deas had led fourth-highest from her longest and strongest (hearts). The defenders took the first five tricks and declarer had the rest.

It was Levitina who bid aggressively at the other table, and 3NT by South was "unbeatable" because West was "always" going to lead a spade. And that was what Breed did. Now Sanborn had two spades, five diamonds and two clubs for her contract.

Minus 120 and plus 600 gave Dinkin 10 IMPs and the lead by 1.

Westheimer immediately regained the lead when Deas-Palmer overbid to an unmakeable 4♥ and Levitina went down one in 1NT at the other table.

Westheimer was 4 IMPs ahead with three to play. Then:

5♦ looks like a reasonable spot until you notice the 5-0 split. Breed had no chance but conceded an unnecessary second undertrick in an interesting way.

Levitina led the ♠K, which was ducked. Declarer took the next trick with dummy's ♠J, crossed to her ♥A, and led a diamond, getting the bad news. Sanborn won with her ♦A and returned the ♣K. West won with dummy's ace and cashed the ♠A for a heart discard, giving this position:

West called for a club, South threw a heart, and declarer erred by ruffing with her ♦4 instead of the ♦8 or ♦9. West tried to cash her hearts, but South ruffed the last and led her spade. West had to ruff and was endplayed into giving South another trump trick for down two.

Note that if Breed had ruffed with a middle diamond, when South led her spade, declarer could have ruffed with her ♦4 and overruffed

with dummy's ♦6. Then a club lead would have executed a trump coup for down one.

In the closed room, Kennedy led her fourth-highest diamond, Disa discarding an encouraging ♠2.

Deas, after winning that trick with dummy's ♦9, ran the ♣10 to South's ♣K. Kennedy shifted to a spade, East taking North's ♠Q with her ♠A. Declarer won the next trick with her ♦K, played a heart to the dummy, and continued with the ♦Q. South took her ace and led another spade, North winning with her ♠K to give this position:

Deas needed five more tricks and sort of had them: ♠J, ♥K Q, ♦J and ♣A. But she had no hand entry.

North exited with the ♥J. Declarer took dummy's three red-suit winners then had a choice of which defender to make a stepping stone to her own hand. She could lead a heart to use North or a diamond to go via South.

Plus 100 and plus 400 gave Dinkin 11 IMPs and the lead by 7.

On the last two deals Westheimer gained 4 IMPs on a partscore board and 1 overtrick IMP, but it was not enough. The Dinkin team had won by 2 IMPs, 125 to 123.

That trio of 3NT contracts had been worth 32 IMPs.

Electronic Device Policy

The electronic device policy is revised as follows:

1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.

2. For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.

3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

Scores as reported in the Daily Bulletin are subject to change because of score changes or corrections.

The masterpoint awards as shown are, therefore, also subject to change.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Ana Urrutia of New Orleans earned her gold card in the Wednesday-Friday Morning KO,

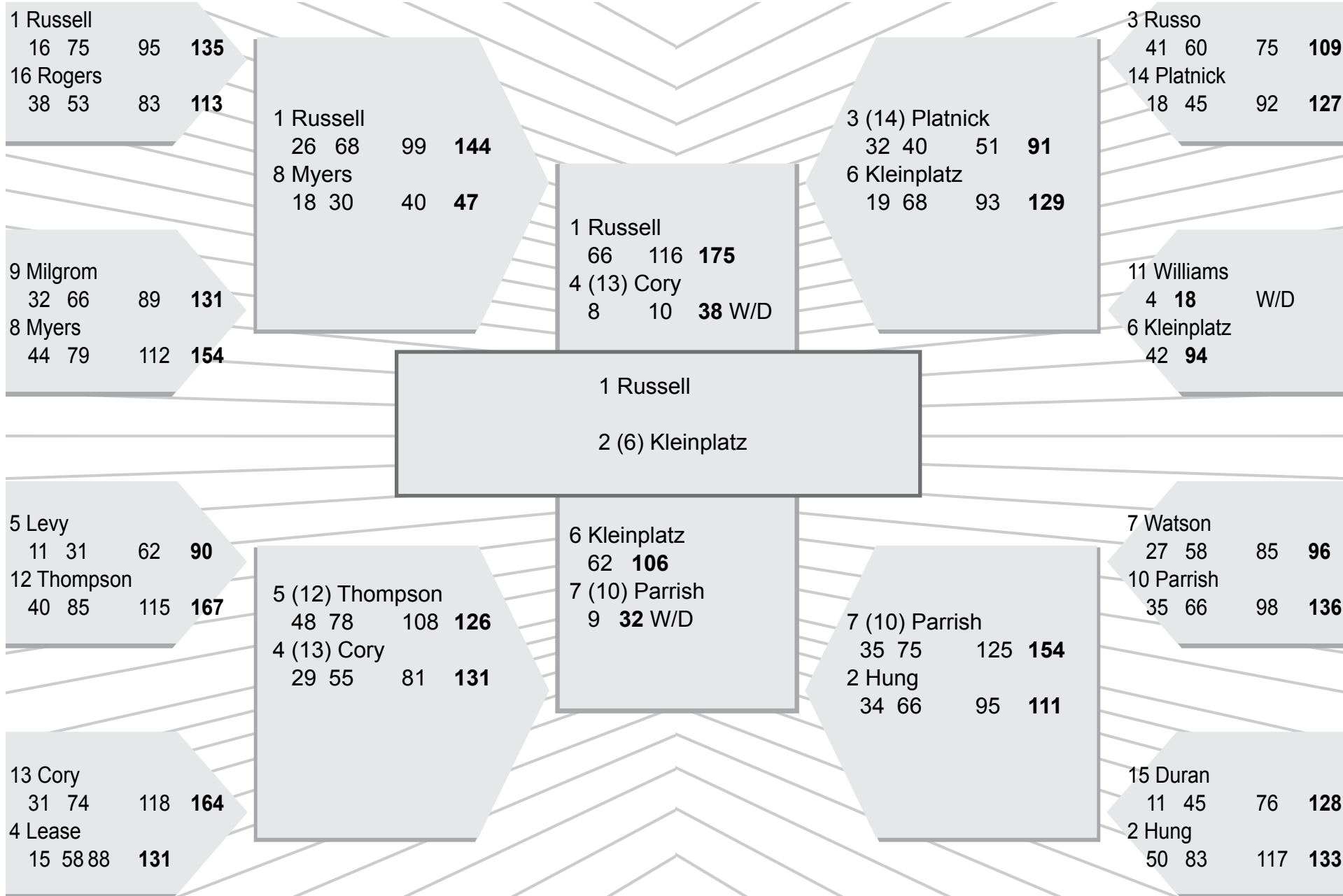

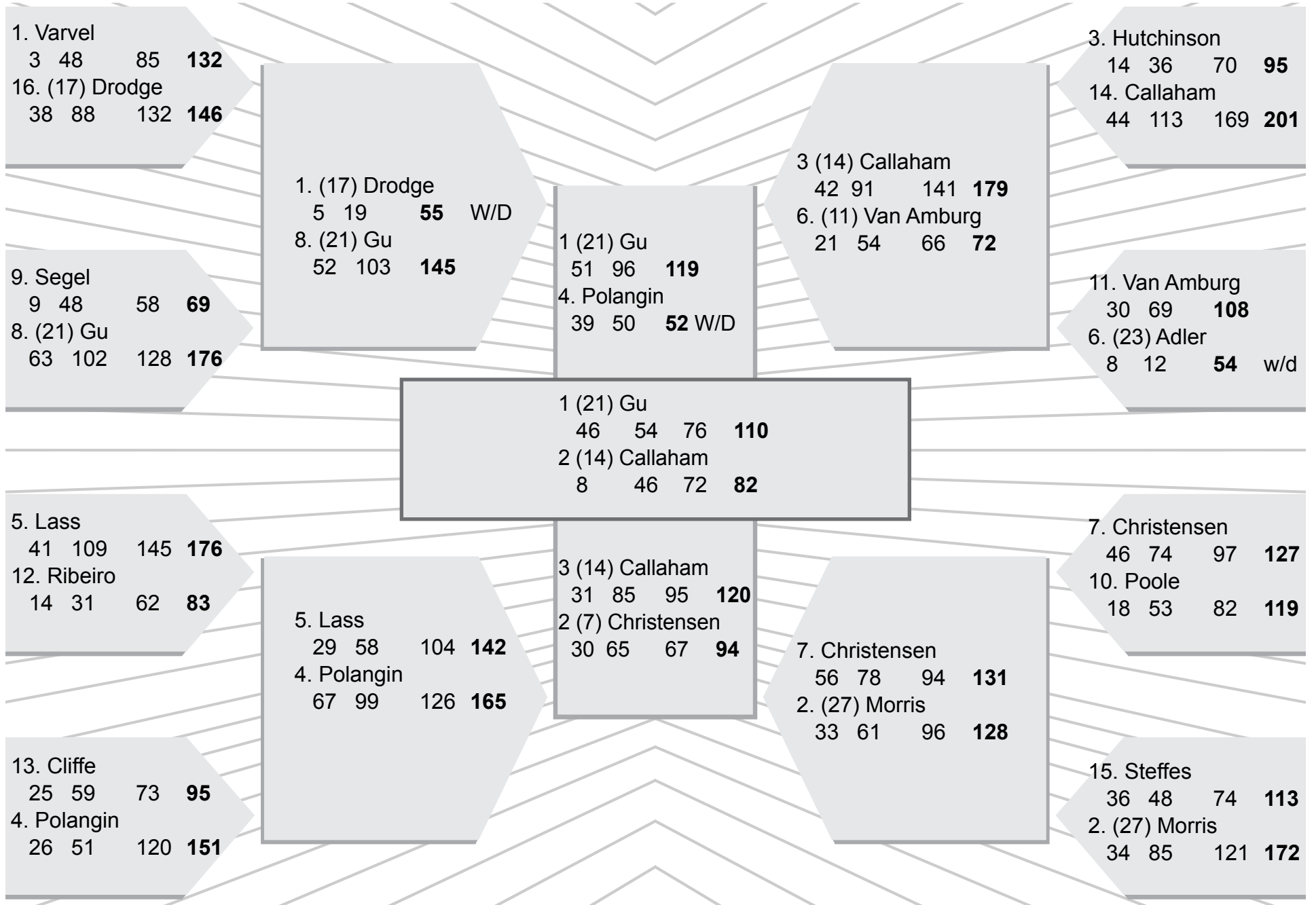

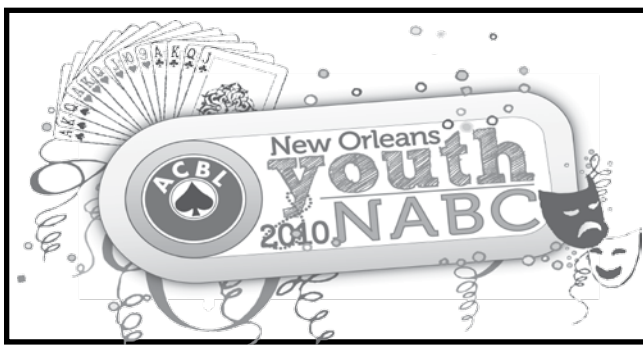

Bridge is a great game, but what do parents think about it?

"Bridge makes them think," says Mark Kedzierski of Marietta GA. He doesn't play bridge, but has opinions about it. "Bridge is above and beyond an ordinary card game," he says. "I have two daughters who've played for three years, and I've seen them grow in it. They really enjoy it."

Annie Rizzo, mother of Zandy Rizzo, agrees. "I've seen when my son has made connections, when he puts two and two together," Rizzo of Alpharetta GA says. "One of the big benefits is learning how to figure things out on their own outside of the structure of a school."

"Besides being mentally stimulating and encouraging social interaction, bridge is an activity where rules, manners and decorum are expected," says Laurie Wexel of Lilburn GA. "That's important."

Minjane Jan of Alpharetta GA agrees. "Bridge is a disciplined game with rules to follow," she says. "There's a proper etiquette."

"My son loves bridge and winning is secondary," says Jeff McCurdy. "He loves the complexity of the game, but he loves the social aspect even more. He doesn't want to disappoint his partner."

Carol Krug of Sarasota FL is a bridge player who is active in bridge governance. "I see the joy in the kids' faces and the fun they have," she says. "I see them learn and how quickly they catch on." Krug, along with Gloria Bart and the late Dean Cohler started an active youth program in her area. There are about 80 kids in schools and in Boys and Girls Clubs."

Irina Ladyzhensky is a bridge player who has won an NABC+ event. She is also a parent with three children who play. Her daughters Asya and Alexandra are here.

"Bridge helps children with math and science skills, but also it teaches them to make good decisions," says Ladyzhensky. "When they play with others, it expands their circle of friends."

David and Michelle Ziebarth of the Memphis TN area are here with daughter Piper. "She likes the numbers and the strategy," says David, "but it's also a way to socialize with friends. She plays at the local bridge club against adults and is not intimidated."

Other parents say similar things.

Bridge for Parents – Start to Play

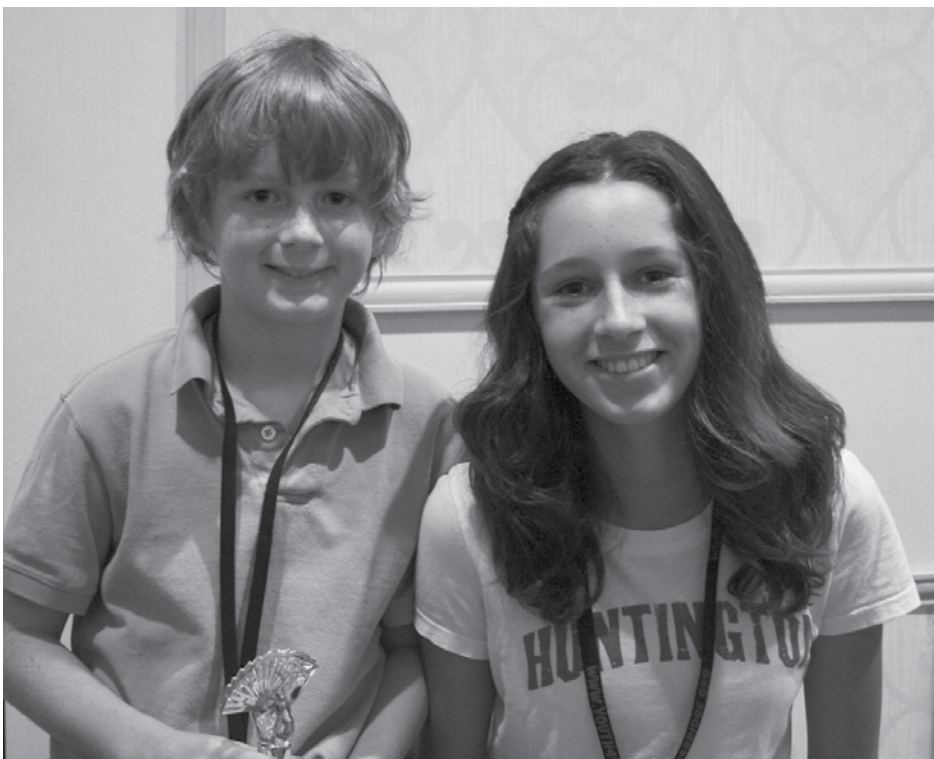

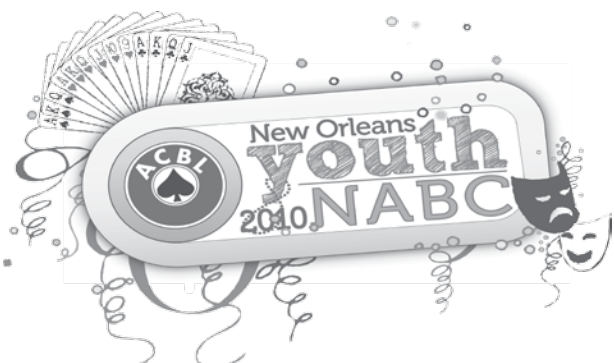
