## Hall of Fame inducts eight new members

Eight all-time greats were inducted into the ACBL Hall of Fame at the annual banquet last night.

Eric Murray and Sami Kehela became the first Canadian members when they were presented as the winners of the VonZedtwitz Award for outstanding contributions to bridge. Alan Truscott became a member by winning the Blackwood Award.

Also inducted were Lew Stansby and Richard Freeman. Three deceased persons also were added to the Hall – Peter Leventritt, Bobby Nail and Sally Young.

The ceremonies were often moving and emotional, with many family members and friends present to watch the inductees receive their honors.

Here is a brief rundown on the new members and their presenters.

### PETER LEVENTRITT

**Presenter:** Ralph Cohen, former chief executive officer of the ACBL, co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission and a member of the WBF Laws Commission, outstanding player who finished fourth for

Canada in the 1964 Olympiad. A happy note: Ralph, who was beset by three crippling and often killing diseases at once back in March, has come through the multiple operations and is rapidly getting back to the good health he used to enjoy. He learned, in one day, that he was suffering from a perforated ulcer, multiple aneurysms and kidney cancer. Glad to see you back at the table, Ralph.

**Hall of Famer:** Leventritt was outstanding as a bridge player, administrator and teacher. He and Edgar Kaplan founded the Card School in New York. He represented North America in the Bermuda Bowl three times – 1961, 1963 and 1965 – and finished second to Italy's Blue Team each time. He also won major North American titles in three decades. He served as ACBL president in 1954 and was a member of the Board of Directors for many years. He was president at the age of 38, the second youngest president ever.

He also pioneered the use of the Schenken Big Club system in partnership with Howard Schenken. His partner in a couple of North American Championships was

none other than Sally Young, who also was inducted into the Hall last night.

### BOBBY NAIL

**Presenter:** Gerald Michaud, a fine player who counted Nail as "my friend always, my partner often."

**Hall of Famer:** Nail was a major force in bridge for four decades. "He was exceptional in many respects," said Michaud. "He had unerring accuracy on defense." Michaud called him a Gentleman of Bridge – "he practiced Active Ethics long before the ACBL adopted that program."

Nail represented North America in two Bermuda Bowls, finishing second in 1963, and he earned several North American titles. He was a Grand Life Master in the ACBL and a Life Master in the World Bridge Federation. He also was a bridge teacher and a writer.

## Life Master Pairs kicks off today

The Life Master Pairs, one of the top events on the ACBL calendar, begins today with Zia Mahmood and Michael Rosenberg back to defend the title they won last year in Anaheim.

The LM Pairs is one of only two six-session matchpoint events – the other is the Blue Ribbon Pairs in the fall – and has grown in stature as more and more international stars turn up at NABCs.

This year's field will read like a who's who of the bridge elite, including members of the Italian team which claimed the World Bridge Team Olympiad last fall in Maastricht, Netherlands.

Last year, Zia and Rosenberg won the LM Pairs by two boards over runners-up John Mohan and Sam Lev, who won the event in 1999.

The event has two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions. It is restricted to Life Masters. At stake is the von Zedtwitz Gold Cup.

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*The Patron Member reception is scheduled for Saturday, July 21, after the evening session in the suite of ACBL President Jim Kirkham (Room 16-161 at the Royal York).*

## 3 Western teams reach GNT semis

Three teams from the Far West and one from New York-New Jersey remain in the chase for the Grand National Teams Open championship after two days of play.

The team that will try to keep the East in the running is the District 3 (New York-New Jersey) squad made up of Ethan Stein, Michael Kamil, Rozanne Pollack, William Pollack, Joel Friedberg and Ilya Levitin. They will play an all-day match against Jill Meyers, Iftikhar Baqai, Mitch Dunitz, John Mohan and Ed Davis, who represent District 23 (California).

Rose Meltzer and her all-stars from District 21 (California) will oppose the District 17 team (Arizona-Nevada) captained by Lou Ann O'Rourke. Playing with Meltzer are Lew Stansby, Chip Martel, Kyle Larsen, Hugh Ross and Peter Weichsel. O'Rourke has Garey Hayden, Marc Jacobus, Billy Miller and Roger Bates.

The Flight A competition also has reached the semifinal stage, and it will be an East-West final. A Canadian team from District 2 captained by Ray Jotcham will battle against a District 6 team from Maryland and Virginia captained by Lyle Poe. In the other match, Merlin Vilhauer of District 20 (primarily Oregon) will go up against Jerry Premo of District 21, a California district.

In both Flight B and Flight C eight teams remain.

In Flight B Kefu Xu of District 6 (Maryland-Virginia) will oppose Lawrence Dubrofsky, a District 19 team from Edmonton AB. In a Midwest battle, Robert Sievers will lead his District 8 team (Illinois) against Michael Alioto of District 12 (Michigan). The match between Mark Robichek and Richard Soderstrom will be international. Soderstrom is from District 1 in Canada while Robichek has a team from the San Francisco area representing District 21. The fourth match will pair the District 13 (Chicago area) team captained by David Hemmer against Gary Moore of Southern California representing District 23.

Two Canadian teams and six U.S. squads are still in the running in Flight C. The District 1 (Ontario) squad led by Mark Mackenzie will take on nearby District 3 (New York-New Jersey) headed by Lee Ohliger. Stephen Young of District 2 (also Ontario) will take on Texas (District 16, captained by Bob Wilkin. David Ruppert of District 6 (Maryland) will oppose Randy Potter of District 23 (Southern California). District 14 (Minnesota-Iowa), led by Rod Halvorson, will battle District 20 (Oregon, captained by Rohan Coehlo.

## WBF President Damiani eyes Salt Lake City

"Keep your eye on Salt Lake City during the Winter Olympics next year," WBF President Jose Damiani told attendees at last night's Hall of Fame dinner. He pointed out that bridge will be a demonstration sport there, and he added that this could be the forerunner of bridge's participation in the 2006 Winter Olympics in Turin, Italy.

He also called attention to the Transnational Teams event that will take place in Bali, Indonesia, this fall.

## Canadian currency used for entry fees

Entry fees for Canadian NABCs have always been set in Canadian dollars. The entry fees here are based on the closing U.S./Canadian exchange rate on July 3, the first business day of the month. The exchange rate at that time was \$1.5137 (\$1 U.S. equaled \$1.5137 Canadian). Entry fees of \$11, \$12 and \$13 were converted to Canadian on that basis. They then were rounded either up or down for ease of purchase, to be fair to players, and to protect the ACBL membership at large from exchange rate losses.

There will be no exchange desk, but check cashing services will be available daily at 11 a.m. at the Royal York (Convention floor) and the Convention Centre (800 level).

## Junior coupons

Junior players (25 and younger) may compete for only \$9 (in Canadian funds) per player per session – with a Junior coupon for each player and session. The coupons are available at the ACBL Information Desk, at the Intermediate Newcomer selling station or from Charlotte Blaiss, ACBL Director of Junior programs.

The coupons are available only to Juniors who have not yet celebrated their 26<sup>th</sup> birthday and whose membership dues or Life Master service fee is current.

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ing women bridge players in North America and a bridge writer.

**Hall of Famer:** Young was asked to play bridge by a hyperactive young man in 1931, and result was one of the most formidable partnerships in history – Sally Young and Charles Goren. She was Player of the Year in 1939 and just missed in 1938 (she was edged by Goren, her partner, who did a bit better in the Master Individual.).

Martel learned a lot about Young as a result of a batch of clippings Judy Kay found in the attic. She learned that Young started playing bridge at age 15 – auction bridge, that is. She learned by watching, as so many of us did back then. She went on to win 26 North American Championships including three Chicagos (now the Reisinger). She was a member of the only women's team that ever won the Reisinger.

### ALANTRUSCOTT

**Presenter:** Dorothy Truscott, Alan's wife, who already is a member of the Hall of Fame. She is one of the most outstanding women players in the history of bridge – one of two women ever to represent North America in the Bermuda Bowl (the other was Helen Sobel Smith). She is a four-time world champion in women's events and holds dozens of North American titles.

**Hall of Famer:** "Alan's biggest accomplishment was not in bridge," said Dorothy. "He ran – and finished – in the New York Marathon when he was in his sixties." Dorothy said she had no idea how many things would change when she married him. "I lost my dining room and my living room to his equipment and his books."

Alan has been the bridge editor of The New York Times for 37 years, but the biggest single achievement in bridge was producing the very first Encyclopedia of Bridge back in the middle Sixties. He has been a major contributor to every encyclopedia since, including the present edition which is expected off the presses in September. "He's also a very good player," Dorothy added.

When Alan took the podium, he pointed out that Dorothy preceded him to the Hall by four years and that he had been saluting her as a superior all those years. "I now salute you for the last time," he told Dorothy. "Now we're equals."

### RICHARDFREEMAN

**Presenter:** Nick Nickell, a friend of Freeman's for 30 years and his bridge partner for 20 years. Like Freeman, Nickell is a Bermuda Bowl champion and has a long string of major North American team victories over the past half dozen years.

**Hall of Famer:** Freeman was famous long before he made it to the top in the bridge world. When he was just a kid, he was the mathematics expert on the Quiz Kids show. He would perform incredible math feats, solving problems in his head while mathematicians tried to work them out on paper.

Bob Hamman wrote in his autobiography that Freeman started college when he was only 15. Freeman took issue with that – he *graduated* from college at 15. Old-time tournament directors remember his amazing speed in scoring a game – nobody could compete with him. He is also a fabulous bridge player and one of the fastest and most accurate analysts in the game.

When Freeman took the podium, he said that he considers bridge to be more than a game, more than a sport – "it broadens your perspective." He credited his wife Louise with teaching him how to win.

### LEWSTANSBY

**Presenter:** Chip Martel, who else? Martel has been

Stansby's partner through just about all of their major successes, including a sweep of the major world championships – the Bermuda Bowl, World Team Olympiad and World Open Pairs.

**Hall of Famer:** "My partner has won either a Vanderbilt or a Spingold – or both – in each of the past five decades," said Martel. "He has won the International Team Trials five times and he has represented his district 28 times in Grand National events." Martel pointed out that Stansby has tremendous concentration, a fabulous memory and a great temperament. "I've been lucky to have him as a partner."

Stansby said that he has met most of his friends playing bridge. He remembered playing bridge with Mike Lawrence in college – "you might say we majored in bridge." He also paid tribute to his wife JoAnna "who always sees the positive side of everything."

### SAMIKEHELA

**Presenter:** Eric Kokish, one of the foremost bridge writers in the world and a fine bridge player in his own right. He has been the editor of the World Bridge News for many years, and he has been a major contributor to world championship bridge books for the past two decades.

**Hall of Famer:** "It became apparent very early in my life that I was not ready for honest toil," Kehela revealed. He learned bridge aboard a cargo ship – "first I learned that you needed 2 1/2, and then later I discovered you needed 13." He learned a lot by watching Adam Meredith, one of the great British players.

He also was proud of learning how to handle Eric Murray's bidding. "I listened to the opponents' bidding and I believed them, not my partner. It worked during the 30 years of our partnership."

Kehela has been a frequent champion and also has come close in Bermuda Bowl competition, although no world championship, thanks to the incredible reign of the Italian Blue Team.

### ERICMURRAY

**Presenter:** John Carruthers, a fine Canadian player who told how Murray asked him to be his presenter. "He called me up and said, 'John, all my friends are dead. Would you do this for me?'"

Carruthers called Murray an expert in bridge, oratory and litigation. "You're going to find out about oratory in just a moment."

**Hall of Famer:** Murray proved he was better at oratory than bridge, if that's possible. He offered side-splitting comments on Kehela's lack of ability at the bridge table, but he concentrated primarily on Larry Cohen, who called him to tell him about being named to the Hall of Fame. "He wrote a book about some kind of law," said Murray. "Somewhere it says to be aggressive at the three level whenever you have 18 trumps. Must have been a typographical error. Larry lives in Florida – maybe he had something to do with that election down there."

Murray, like Kehela, has an outstanding record in bridge, with many North American championships and high finishes in several world championships. But that hardly measures up to his abilities as a stand-up comedian.

Like Kehela, he is a great card player with many championships to his credit. □

## ZT update

The Zero Tolerance program, started in Ontario clubs more than four years ago, is going strong and receiving credit for moving of players from intermediate games into open games.

Barbara Seagram, owner/manager of Kate Buckman's Bridge Studio in Toronto, says ZT "has made such a huge difference. We have always provided our less-experienced players with a separate room in which to play, along with their own director.

"This has made for an expensive but flourishing newcomer/intermediate program. The downside was that the players got so comfortable there that they were petrified of moving into the open game in the big room."

ZT has changed that, according to Seagram. "Over the past two years, the atmosphere has improved so dramatically among the open players that there has been a huge exodus from the intermediate games into the open games. We have had to hand out very few scoring penalties for Zero Tolerance, but the fact that the policy is in place seems to keep the players in line and the perception that we are monitoring behavior at all times makes everyone happier.

"The players now never hesitate to report unpleasantness whereas before they considered it a part of the game that they had to tolerate."

Seagram added, "We have had to ask several players to take a vacation from our club. They must be subjected to an interview with us before they are permitted to return. The bad ones don't."

## Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time. When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as "transfer" -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

## Thank you, David

Once again David Ezekiel of Bermuda did a first-rate job as the master of ceremonies for the Hall of Fame banquet. He has been the MC at all of the ACBL Hall of Fame ceremonies, and his wit does much to enliven the long program.

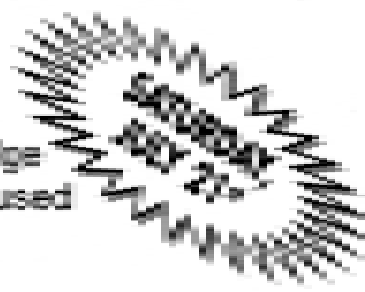

# Life Master Pairs

Continued from page 1

In 1930, Waldemar von Zedtwitz donated the Gold Cup, which was presented to the winners of the Life Master Open Pairs. The first winners: von Zedtwitz and P. Hal Sims.

The trophy was initially contested by master players who had qualified by winning a national championship. It was then a four-session event, and the field was limited to 64 players so that a complete movement could be played.

The trophy was originally presented on the basis that three wins by one player would secure him outright possession of the trophy. This feat was achieved by Howard Schenken in 1934. (Schenken won in 1931 and 1933 with David Burnstine and in 1934 with Richard Frey. He also won in 1941 with Merwyn Maier and in 1943 with John Crawford.)

The cup, put back into competition by the donor, was stolen in 1954 while in the possession of John Hubbell, who held the LM Pairs title. The theft followed a television appearance during which Hubbell had exhibited the trophy and given the address of his bridge club where the cup was normally displayed.

The trophy was never recovered and the present cup is an exact replica.

Women have been occasional winners in the LM Pairs -- Helen Sobel, playing with Charles Goren, won in 1942 and 1958; Ruth Gilbert and Leo Roet, 1949; Helen and Morris Portugal, 1960; Dorothy Truscott and B. Jay Becker, 1964; Hermine Baron and Meyer Schleifer, 1966, and Barbara Rappaport and Al Roth, 1971 and 1972.

Mary Jane Farrell and Marilyn Johnson are the only women's partnership to win the event. Their victory came in 1978.

The record score for the event belongs to S. Garton Churchill and Cecil Head, who won in 1948 -- scoring 65% as an average for four sessions and 77.4% in a single session.

This was a key deal for last year's winners.

East led the ♠Q. From the auction and the opening lead, Rosenberg could be reasonably sure that East held six spades headed by the Q-J-10 (or 9). This meant West had to have the top clubs and the ♥K to open the bidding.

The position of the ♥J was not clear, however, making it dangerous for declarer to attack the suit himself. Rosenberg found a way to avoid a guess in the heart suit.

The opening lead was won perforce in dummy and declarer called for a low club. West won the queen and played a second spade. Rosenberg won his king, cashed four rounds of diamonds and continued with the ♣J. This brought down East's 10 as West won his king.

Rosenberg now knew that West started with two spades, three diamonds and at least three clubs (prob-

ably four), making his likely pattern 2-4-3-4. West cashed the ♣A and shifted to a low heart, ducked to dummy's ♥Q. Making four for plus 630.


