Wei-Sender team strong in Wagar KO victory



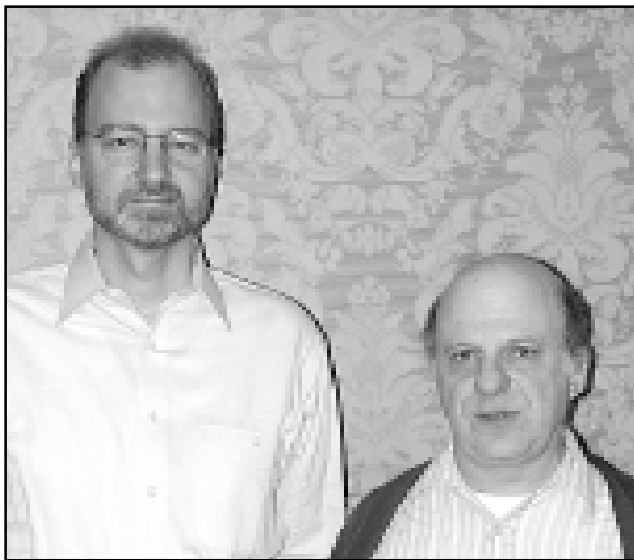

This is what Eddie Kantar, who provided the problem, had to say about Quiz #7

Your best chance is to make everything as simple for yourself as possible. It is unlikely that the opening lead was a singleton. With A J 6 3 2, East would probably have ducked to insure both communications and two diamond tricks. So play the *king* of diamonds. Even if West does ruff, you still have chances. If you play low and East is short, however, you are in deep trouble.

Assuming the ♦K holds, play the ♠A and a spade to the king, followed by the ♥A and ♥Q, discarding two diamonds if the ♥Q is not covered.

Now if spades have divided evenly, the contract is safe. West wins the ♥K, but you have two additional hearts in dummy to park your club losers. You wind up losing a spade, a diamond and a heart.

Ferguson led a spade to Hamman's jack, and he covered the ♥10, forcing the king and ace. Rossman led a spade through, Ferguson winning when Hamman ducked. Ferguson switched to the ♦J, taken by the king, and Hamman crossed to his ♠A, setting up a long spade. He led a heart to the 8, 9 and jack, and Rossman returned a diamond to Ferguson's ace. Ferguson switched to a club, and Hamman let Rossman win the queen. She cashed the good ♥7 and got out with the ♣10. Ferguson overtook with the jack when Hamman ducked, but both Ferguson and Hamman were down to all clubs, so Hamman's only remaining tricks were the ♣A-K. He was able to take only two clubs, two spades and a diamond,

Tale of the Club 10

The key card on this deal played by Genevieve Hewitt was the ♣10. When it appeared in the end position, she knew what to do. She played the hand in the Monday afternoon session of the Senior Pairs.

Hewitt won the spade opening lead with the queen, crossed to the ♥A and led a club to the 9, losing to the queen as she rectified the count for a squeeze. It worked! She cashed out her spade and heart winners, and East was in trouble when Hewitt led the good 13th heart from dummy. East had to hold onto all four diamonds so was forced to part with the ♣10. Since Hewitt was sure East was protecting diamonds, she was reasonably sure the other card in East's hand was the ♣K. So she sluffed her diamond and won her 12th trick with a small club.

The opening lead is the ♠3. Do you want to play or defend?

If you play, you win the ♠Q with the king. You lead a club to the queen and a club back to the king, losing to the ace. West cashes four spades as declarer pitches two hearts out of each hand. East can afford two hearts and a diamond. When West plays the ♥K, taken by North's ace, East is squeezed in the minors.

If you defend, you as West will lead the ♥K before cashing your spades. That kills the squeeze.

A hoary maneuver

I was able to use a hoary old maneuver on this Spingold deal.

Both tables played a partscore. I declared 2NT from the North seat and got a heart lead. I played the 10 from dummy and then won with the jack, trying to give the impression that I had the doubleton king-jack. I led a club to the 10, and when it held I had to block the spades by crossing back to my hand to try clubs again. East hopped up with the ace, and at the this point he could have held me to eight tricks. But he tried the ♥A and I would up plus 180.

At the other table, North-South bought the contract in 2♣ by South, which looks like a safe spot. Not so! On the defense of three rounds of hearts with a ruff by West and then a spade shift, declarer elected to cash the top three spades. This was the ending as the third spade was led.

Consider what happens if East pitches a diamond. Declarer's natural play is to do the same and then lead a club to the 10. South then leads ace and another diamond, and West leads a third diamond after winning. South has to ruff his own winner and give up two clubs in the ending.

So what is declarer to do?

His only choice in the ending it to pitch the ACE of diamonds! Then he leads a club to the 10 and follows with a low diamond toward the queen. Now he cannot be prevented from reaching dummy to play clubs up and make the contract.

Of course, at the table the defense erred – but in a different way. East ruffed the third spade and now it was easy for South to overruff and play diamonds to force an entry to dummy and make the contract.

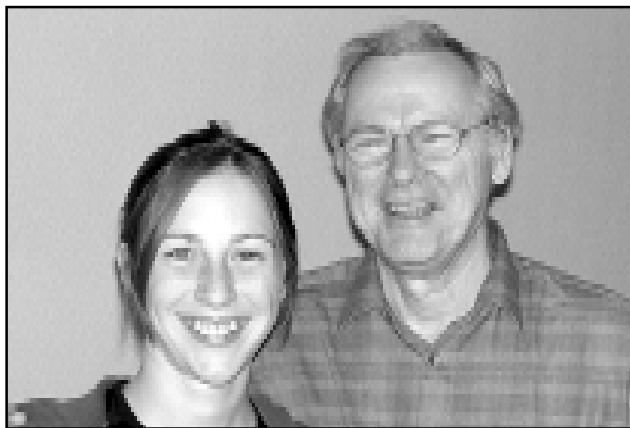
New Life Masters

Mother and Dad play, but Tina just caddies

Like so many sons and daughters of bridge players, Tina Sundelin of Stockholm, Sweden, does not play bridge – too big a flood of bridge at home. She knows hundreds of bridge players because of her parents, but the closest she gets to a card table is when she's picking up tickets as a caddy.

We said Tina does not play bridge. Well, she has played twice – in a caddy tournament at an NABC a few years ago -- “I came in fourth,” and in a caddy tournament here – “I came in third.”

She thoroughly enjoys playing in the caddy games. “It's fun. We fight just like real bridge players.” When we asked her if she won, she replied, “What? The fight?”

She and partner Taylor McFall of New Berlin WI beat one redoubled contract 1000 points. “We didn't fight that time – we danced!”

Tina is the daughter of P.O. Sundelin and Jill Mellstrom of Sweden. P.O. has been playing on the American circuit for many years – he won his first North American championship, the Blue Ribbon Pairs, in 1984 playing with the late Peter Pender. He also has won here in Toronto – his team placed first in the NABC Senior Swiss Teams. He is a world star – he has finished third in the Bermuda Bowl three times – 1977, 1987 and 1991. He has represented Sweden internationally 22 times.

What an exit card!

At the key point on this Spingold hand, Bob Hamman (East) had to find the card with which he could exit safely. He did so.

West led a diamond and Hamman won with the 10 when declarer called low from dummy. He switched to his singleton heart, won by Paul Soloway, who led back the ♥Q, covered by the king and ruffed by Hamman. How would you defend at this point?

If you didn't lead the ♠K (or perhaps the low spade), you've lost the game. A diamond lead clearly will fail. If you lead a club, declarer will let it ride to the jack, lead the ♦Q and ruff out the king, cash the ♣A, ruff a club, cash the ♦J for a club discard, come to hand with a trump and ruff the last club. Then he can lead a red card, ruff it and draw the last trump, making his game.

What did Hamman lead? The ♠K, of course.

No trump coup in notrump

A single deal made the day's effort successful for Alan Popkin of St. Louis in Sunday's A/X Swiss Teams.

West led the ♦10, taken in hand by Popkin, who led the ♠2 to dummy's queen. The appearance of East's ♠J brought the proceedings to a halt as Popkin pondered his chances of making the contract against a possible 4-1 trump break.

Becoming impatient with the delay, West briefly exposed her hand and offered to take her “two trump tricks” and concede the remainder. Alan politely turned down the offer, stating, “I think I can make it, ma'am.”

Declarer came to his hand with the ♣A and played the ♠8, which held. Next, he ruffed a club, led a heart to his king and ruffed another club. After cashing dummy's top hearts, Alan returned to his hand with a diamond, leaving this ending:

Alan led the ♣K and, when West followed suit, discarded dummy's ♦A. At trick 12, a diamond play created a 12th trick by forcing West to ruff in front of dummy. Although he was pleased with the outcome at our table, Alan expressed mild regret that 6NT might be bid and made in the replay.

“That's all right,” I assured him. “You can't make a trump coup in notrump!”

Double indemnity

Bad bidding was rewarded and good play punished in a dramatic 29-IMP swing on this deal from the Flight A Swiss last weekend.

At one table, North-South bid to 5♦. Declarer (South) won the opening lead of the ♣10 in hand. Faced with three possible losers, South made the good play of the ♦7 at trick two to force an entry to dummy.

Alas, West won the ♦K and gave East a club ruff. South still had to lose a spade and went minus 100.

At the other table, North-South reached 6♦. On the ♣10 lead, South had no option but to play the ♠A. When the king fell, the♦8 was an entry to dummy for a spade pitch on the ♥A. Declarer's only loser was a spade for plus 1370. That was 16 IMPs for the forces of darkness.

The Facts: 3NT doubled made three, +550 for N/S. The opening lead was a low spade. After South's 3NT bid a dispute arose over the tempo of South's pass over 2♠; and the Director was called. South said he did not hesitate over 2♠ and North said he did not notice any hesitation. E/W claimed there had been a hesitation. The Director ruled that a hesitation over 2♠ by South was quite possible (Law 16A), that pass was a LA for North when 2♠ was passed back around to him, and adjusted the score to 2♠ making two, +110 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. South denied he had hesitated over 2♠, stating that he took only two seconds to pass 2♠: He saw the ♠K and decided to pass. E/W stated that other hands in the match had established South's normal tempo and his call over 2♠ was out of tempo.

The Panel Decision: Three experts were consulted. All three said that they would never reopen with the North hand after South passed and that if someone did reopen with a double (after a hesitation by South) this was an egregious action. The Panel agreed with the table Director that South's hand suggested that he probably passed out of tempo, and the experts found that the reopening double by North was unwarranted. The score was adjusted for both pairs to 2♠ made two, +110 for E/W. The Panel also determined that N/S's appeal lacked substantial merit and assessed an AWMW to the N/S players.

The Facts: 4♥ went down two, +200 for E/W. The opening lead was the ♦10. The Director was called at the end of play. N/S complained that they were unfamiliar with the defense (Suction) E/W were playing to their 1NT opening, which caused confusion as to the meanings of their own calls in the subsequent auction. The Director determined that, as the General Chart was in use for this event, direct calls other than double and 2♣ over the opponents' notrump were required to have at least one known suit. Thus, E/W were playing an illegal convention. However, in such cases no "automatic" penalty or score adjustment is provided without proof of damage from the illegal method. In this case it was the Directors' judgment that once N/S learned that West had spades they should have been able to cope with the situation and that they had ultimately caused their own damage on the hand. Therefore, the table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. Only N/S attended the hearing. N/S told the Reviewer that they were unfamiliar with the opponents' defensive methods over 1NT and that this had confused them as to their own methods. They were playing methods for dealing with one-and two-suited overcalls when the suit(s) were known. They were an experienced 20+-year partnership and South had played for years in Saudi Arabia.

The Panel Decision: Three Flight B players were consulted and none felt that "Suction" was the cause of N/S's problem (specifically, South's 4♥ bid) as the nature of West's hand was known before South's final call. All three players believed that if North had the hearts South needed he would have bid them over 2♠-Pass-Pass. N/S's contention that playing in a foreign country for so long made them unable to cope with new competitive treatments and that they therefore deserved protection was not deemed a compelling argument (Law 21: "Until the end of the auction period... a player may, without penalty, change a call when it is probable that he made the call as a result of misinformation given to him by an opponent..."). E/W were not aware that Suction was not allowed at this level of play at this tournament since it was a very popular and widely used convention on the West Coast, where they play. Based on the above, the Panel allowed the table result to stand.

On Sunday evening Ryder reached 4♥ on this auction: 1♥ - 1NT - 3♥ - 4♥. This is a better spot than 3NT, especially if the defense finds the spade switch early against notrump.

Ryder won the spade lead and finessed in hearts. Next he cashed the ♥A and decided to take the ♥9 contributed by West at face value, trusting that the trumps were 4-2. He advanced the ♣K and the defense made the double error of winning and playing two more rounds of spades. Ryder ruffed, cashed the top diamonds and ruffed a diamond. The defender with the long hearts could pitch one club - not enough! Ryder could cash two clubs ending dummy to lead a plain card and score his ♥K-J via a trump coop for 11 tricks and a great score.

Moss led the ♥Q and shifted to a low club. Declarer's won dummy's ace and led another club to his king. Now he ruffed a heart, ruffed a diamond, ruffed a heart (as Moss pitched a diamond), ruffed a diamond and led another heart.

Moss ruffed with her ♠J and led a trump, but declarer had nine tricks - minus 140.

The good defense by Rigal-Moss was overshadowed by the action at the other table. "When you have Judi Radin declaring deals at one table," noted Rigal, "the result you bring in tends to be largely irrelevant."

If South discards, declarer cannot come to 10 tricks but South, unable to read the position, ruffed with the ♠J as Radin pitched a club from dummy.

South returned a spade and Radin won her king. Now she led the ♥J, pitching a diamond from dummy. North won the ♥A and returned a club to dummy's ace. Radin ruffed a diamond, ruffed a club and ruffed another diamond back to her hand. Her ♥10 and ♣7 were good and she had 10 tricks for plus 420 and a clear win on the board.

At death's door last year: now on the bridge circuit

Three times last year, Jue Wang was told to begin making funeral plans for her husband, Kuang-Wei Chiang, who was gravely ill with cancer.

On Friday, the Allentown PA couple played in two sessions of the IMP Pairs, after playing in the Spingold Knockout Teams earlier in the week, and were making plans for more bridge.

Says Chiang: "I feel good. I feel that I'm cured."

Wang's primary concern for her husband now is getting him to gain some weight.

Wang is from mainland China, her husband from Taiwan. They met at a Rye NY regional and were married five years ago. He is an electrical engineer. She is an investigator for the state of Connecticut.

Last June, their first child, Alex Chiang, was born. A month later, doctors found a neuroblastoma behind Chiang's nose.

He spent three and half months in the hospital, underwent five operations and at one point lapsed into a coma. Wang was told on three separate occasions that her husband was not going to make it.

In desperation, she found a man who practiced medicine in China. He took her to South Mountain near Allentown to pick some wild ginseng. Back in Allentown, Wang made tea from the ginseng and gave it to her husband, who was so weak he was on a breathing machine and being fed by tubes.

Within two days, he was on his way to recovery and by Jan. 2 of this year was able to return to work.

Wang believes the ginseng saved her husband's life – "He is getting better and better" – and that it is an ideal potion for bridge players because it "keeps you fresh" and allows you to concentrate better.

Since Chiang's recovery, the two have been back on the bridge trail, traveling to Las Vegas earlier in the year for the regional and driving from Allentown to Toronto for the Summer NABC.

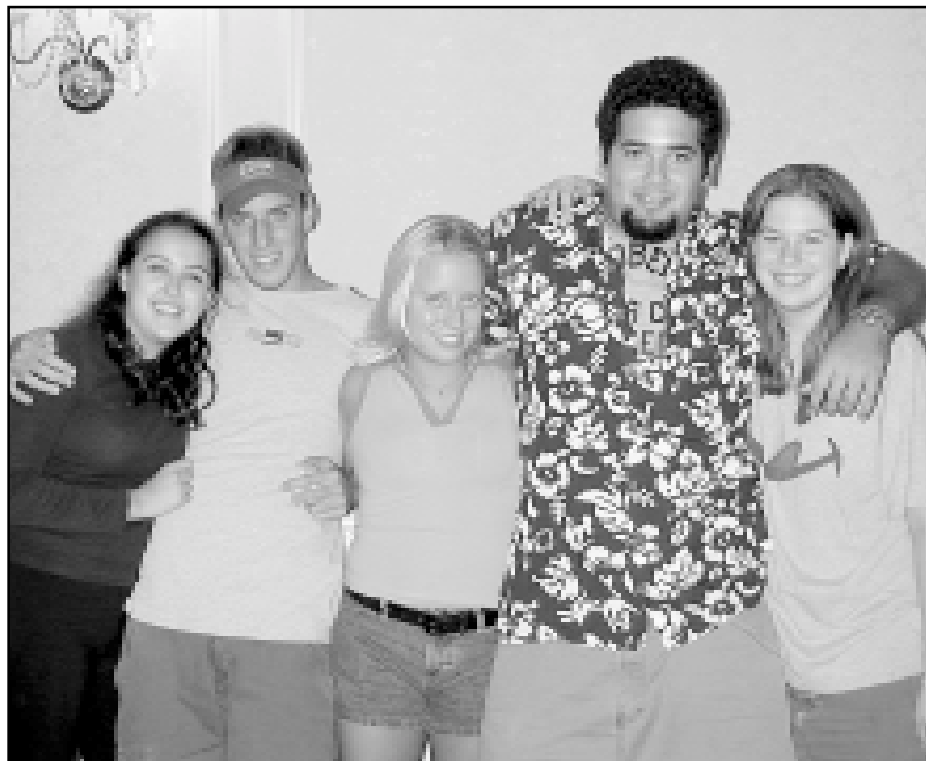

Schaffer, Frisco TX, and Mike Passell, Plano TX.

The winners triumphed in the IMP Pairs on the occasion of a major change in the scoring method. For the first time since the event was inaugurated in 1987, scoring was across the entire field, with potential for massive swings.

Boyd said he likes the change from the datum scoring method, in which each score was IMPed against an average of the other scores after high and low scores were discarded.

"The IMP chart," Boyd said, "is designed to magnify small differences and shrink large ones. Using a datum changes that."

On the other hand, Robinson said, in the new form of scoring "every time you go minus you lose IMPs – unless the opponents have had an accident."

Said Boyd: "The IMP Pairs is fun because you can push the accelerator down a bit."

Boyd and Robinson have been among the top ACBL pairs since they began playing together in 1980. They have won about a dozen North American championships together, mostly teams. Their previous pairs championship came in 1985 in what is now the North American Open Pairs.

Interestingly, in the final IMP Pairs session, Boyd and Robinson had their only bad round against Sidney Brownstein – captain of the team which eliminated their squad from the Spingold.

Being chairman was not a full-time job for Augustine – she also has a full-time job as a law librarian for a major Toronto law firm. But she had one more volunteer who gave her support all the way – her husband.

I won the opening heart lead with the ace, played a diamond to my ace and hooked the ♣Q. Next came the ♣A and I ruffed a club with the ♠10, overruffed with the jack. West returned a second diamond to my king, and I cashed the ♥K and ruffed my last heart. I then ruffed the fourth club with the 9, and when West overruffed with the king, it was all over. West tried another heart but my 5 was bigger than East's spades. I threw a diamond from dummy and ruffed in my hand, drew trump and claimed the last trick with the long club. Making 5♠.

West could have held us to 4♠ by returning a trump instead of a heart, but even making four would have been good for a top.

'Play the card you intended to play'

Bruce Ferguson dropped by to tell us what happened when he pulled a wrong red 2 in an endplay situation. He was playing in the Spingold against Bob White and Michael Kovacich, and the situation arose early in the match. This was the situation as he played 3NT.

Ferguson planned to lead the ♦2 to discover what card West would play. If he played the ♣Q, dummy's jack would be good. But if played the ♣10, Ferguson knew that his last three cards had to be the ♣Q and two hearts. That being the case, his three hearts would take the rest of the tricks because the outstanding hearts had to be 2-2.

But his mouth dropped open when he realized that he had led the deuce of hearts instead of the deuce of diamonds. Now he was going down in a contract that he had worked hard to make. But White and Kovacich understood the situation – they knew he had pulled a wrong card out of his hand. They told him to put it back and play the card he intended.

Ferguson came by because he wanted the bridge world to know about his opponents' kind and thoughtful act.
