## Southern CA squad takes Senior Swiss title

The NABC Senior Swiss Teams was won by the foursome of Trudi Nugit, Los Angeles; Hamish Bennett, Menlo Park; Gene Simpson, Redlands; and Mike Shuman, Pasadena. The squad scored 118.0 Victory Points, outscoring their nearest competitors by 4 VPs.

This was the first NABC win for team captain Nugit. It was also the first NABC victory for teammate Bennett, although he already possessed one world

championship title, the World Senior Pairs from Albuquerque in 1994. Gene Simpson's last NABC win was the Grand National Teams, Flight A in 1998, and Shuman's most recent NABC title was the North American Swiss Teams in 1992. Shuman and Simpson are currently #24 and #44 respectively on the all-time masterpoint holder list.

There were 26 teams in the final of the event. The Nugit squad scored six match wins and two losses in the final on their way to the title.

In second with 114.0 VPs was the squad of Nels Erickson, Princeville HI; Edwin Malmuth, Cardiff CA; Gerald Bare, Pacific Palisades CA; Michael Savage, Downey CA; and, Rick Henderson, Los Angeles.

ACBL Senior events are restricted to players age 55 and older.



## Solodar becomes Grand Life Master

John Solodar is ACBL's newest Grand Life Master. The title is earned by those members who have at least one NABC win and more than 10,000 masterpoints.

Solodar, a Bermuda Bowl champion (1981) and winner in the Life Master Men's Pairs (1968), surpassed the 10,000-masterpoint milestone here in Anaheim to earn the Grand LM title. Solodar also has a third-place finish in the Rosenblum Knockout Teams in 1990.

Solodar, of New York, is a well-known bridge instructor, and was a long-time partner of the late ACBL Hall-of-Famer George Rapee. Solodar was formerly Financial Systems Director for CBS, Inc.

Solodar's world championship victory in 1981 (Port Chester NY) included teammates Russ Arnold, Bud Reinhold and featured the inaugural appearance of Robert Levin, Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell. Solodar and company defeated Pakistan in the final. The Pakistani team featured a new face at the world championship level, as well — Zia Mahmood.

## Fast Open Pairs premiers today

The newest NABC+ event, the Fast Open Pairs, will begin today. The two-day contest features a two-session qualifier today and a two-session final tomorrow. It will be held concurrently with the NABC IMP Pairs.

**The time limits for the Fast Open Pairs will be 11 minutes per session for two-board rounds or 16 minutes per round for three-board rounds. Please note that due to the nature of this contest, time limits will be strictly enforced. Penalties for slow play are mandated by the conditions of contest.**

Additionally, only conventions from the General Convention Chart may be used. (The special exemption for Mid-Chart defenses to INT that are being allowed here in Anaheim does not apply to the NABC+ Fast Open pairs.)

Please note that the starting times for this event will be 1 and 4:30 p.m. each day.

Play in the NABC IMP Pairs begins today.

Also, I/N players can get a taste of a national event by playing in the National 199er Pairs.

## Two comebacks highlight Wagar knockout action

Teams captained by Connie Goldberg and Kathie Wei-Sender came from behind over the final 16 boards to advance to the semifinals of the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams. The other semifinalists are captained by Petra Hamman and Cheri Bjerkan.

Goldberg, Rozanne Pollack, Beth Palmer and Lynn Deas trailed the Beverly Rosenberg team by 10 IMPs after 48 boards, but they gained 18 over the final 16 to win 136-128.

Wei-Sender, Juanita Chambers, Jill Levin, Betty Ann Kennedy, Janice Seamon-Molson and Tobi Sokolow closed their match against Jean Hume's squad by gaining 53 IMPs in the fourth quarter. They went from trailing by 5 to winning, 196-148.

Hamman, Peggy Sutherlin, Robin Klar, Mildred Breed and Shawn Quinn had an easy time against Jan Martel's team, 158-84.

Bjerkan, Sue Weinstein, Renee Mancuso, Pam Wittes, Judi Radin and Sylvia Moss carried a big lead into the final quarter, but Lynn Baker's squad rallied strongly and just missed, losing, 163-148.

## Schwartz hangs on to win shortened Spingold match

The team captained by Richard Schwartz had a huge lead over Richard Coren's squad with 16 boards to go in their Round of 32 match, but Coren put on a mammoth surge that just fell short, 95-87. The highlight of this match was that the third quarter was shortened by two boards. Because the play was ex-

## All systems "Go" for Red Ribbon winners

A pair from China posted the highest score in the Red Ribbon Pairs, topping the field of 156 finalists. Nie Wei Ping, of Beijing, and Christopher Leung, of Hong Kong, earned 2558.59 matchpoints (including carryover, 77 top) to win the four-session event by less than half a board.

Close behind in second place was the Chicago-based pair of David Yang and Xiaodong Shi who finished with 2532.99 matchpoints.

Leung is a comptroller for a hotel in Hong Kong. His partner, Nie Wei Ping, is a well-known figure in China, having won the world Go championships in the mid-Seventies. He dominated the game for more than a decade, and is currently the coach of the Chinese national Go team.

Through an interpreter, Ping explained that although he is an expert at the Eastern board game, he is still relatively inexperienced at bridge.

Vincent Demuy, of Laval PQ, and David Granger, of Etobicoke ON, recorded an extremely close third-place finish with 2524.46 matchpoints.

Players earn Red Ribbon qualifications by winning or finishing second in regionally-rated masterpoint-restricted events (1500 maximum). Players retain their Red Ribbon qualifications until they surpass 2000 masterpoints.

## Bell expresses the ACBL/ABA spirit

*Henry Bell, one of the prime movers in bringing the American Contract Bridge League and the American Bridge Association closer together, expressed the spirit of ACBL/ABA Day very clearly and very emotionally. Here is what Bell had to say:*

In this country for more than 200 years, we've had problems with each other, mostly because of the way we look. The birth of the American Bridge Association was a product of this environment. Sixty-five years ago people of color didn't feel welcome at the bridge table.

Today we exist in a totally different environment. I have stated many times that it will take the bridge players of the world to teach us how to do it right. We have taken a big step with the events and the activi-

ties at this ACBL North American tournament. This represents years of hard work and education by many caring individuals in both organizations.

Last night as I sat talking to Max Hardy and others at the reception, I was overcome with tears of happiness and pride because I could see that something of rare beauty was born. We are finally seeing the wisdom of walking side by side. I think that bridge, with the emergence of technology and the advent of Olympic status, is in transition to a new era.

Too many times selected cultures have been omitted from participating in the big game. Thank God the ACBL and the ABA have seen the wisdom of working together on an endeavor with such far-reaching implications for our future.

## Defenses to 1NT

At this NABC, in General Convention Chart events, the Board of Directors has voted to allow constructive defenses to 1NT openings, even when those defenses do not contain a known suit.

Since these are Mid-Chart conventions, it is the responsibility of the pair playing these methods to pre-Alert the opponents and to provide a suggested defense.

In order to help players counter these methods successfully, the tournament is making available copies of an article on the subject, written by Marinesa Letizia, that appeared previously in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. Look for "Counter-Defense to Interference vs. 1NT Opener" in the rooms where General Convention Chart events are played.

Ferguson decided to show where his strength was even though he fit hearts. He could bid the hearts later, perhaps, but it also was important to pinpoint strength in case his side ended up on defense.

This proved to be the key to the defense. Keller led the ♦K, a lead she was not likely to find without Ferguson's diamond bid. She continued with a diamond to Ferguson's ace, and he led the queen, earning Keller a trick with her doubleton ♠J. Declarer still had to lose a heart trick and go down one.

Michael Rosenberg cashed the ♦K and then shifted to the ♠K. Zia overtook with the ace and cashed the ♠J, indicating a club honor. This was reassuring to Rosenberg but did little else for the defense for they could only take three spades and three minor-suit tricks. If they organized a trump promotion, the club loser would disappear.

This was plus 500 to the Schwartz team for an 8-IMP pickup as the contract at the other table was 3♠ making three.

Former world champion John Swanson, who also watched this deal, felt the auction was routine but observed that Granovetter could have saved 200 points by raising 3♥ to 4♥. That would have made it impossible for Zia to double!

## Melvin Lawhorn

Melvin Lawhorn of Chicago, a pioneer of the American Bridge Association, died during the ABA Nationals in New Orleans recently. He is best known in ABA circles for inventing the zone double, which is the same as the more familiar negative double. ABA members believe Lawhorn was the inventor of the negative double – they can remember using the gadget years before they read about it in the bridge press.

## Of rules and rule violators

My wife, Jill, and I played the following deal in Sunday's Flight A Pairs:

This deal was previously reported by Roger Lord ("Outfoxing partner" from the Tuesday Daily Bulletin). Jill could not have bid the hand more differently than Roger, but the final contract was the same. Here was our auction:

In his amusing article, Roger defended his choice of the comic, first-round Pass with the North hand. Jill favored a strong 2♣, however, and I responded 2♦ which Jill explained to the opponents as "waiting, and semi-positive." We also play that 2♥ is an immediate double negative, and that others bids are constructive and natural showing a decent suit.

So what about my decision to bid 6♥? Well, my partner had opened a strong 2♣, and since it didn't seem likely she had much in the way of spade honors from the way the opponents were bidding, it seemed reasonable to play her for hearts, perhaps A-x or better. My failure to show a good heart suit on the first round of the auction, followed by my 6♥ call, should have allowed partner to figure out that I had K-J-x-x-x or better. Brilliant!

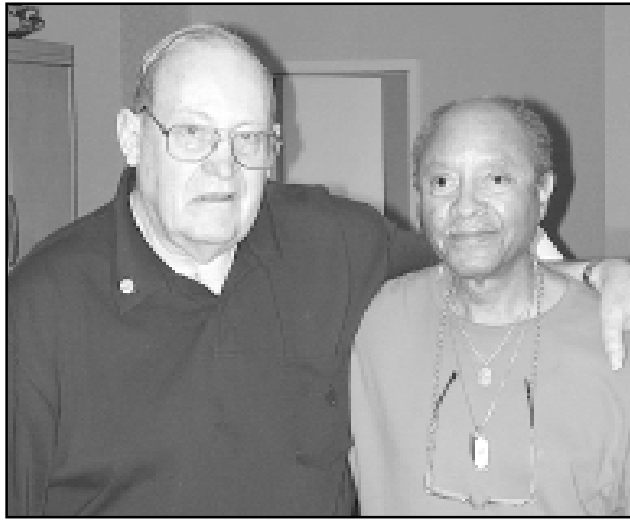
When West doubled, however, and Jill bid 7♣, my dreams of explaining the genius of my insight to Jill in the postmortem went up in smoke. I started to sweat.

"Didn't his 2♦ bid deny a suit with two of the top three honors?" queried East. My spouse's confirmation was polite and spoken in well-modulated tones, but to me, her mate of many years, it sounded as if it were spoken through clenched teeth.

When East's double was followed by two passes, we all started to put our bidding cards back in their boxes. "I haven't called yet," Jill said in a quiet voice. We all looked up. "Seven diamonds," she said, and I began to have hope. East doubled again.

When her hand hit the table (I was declarer since I bid diamonds first), I felt like a prisoner granted a reprieve at the moment when the executioner was about to pull the switch.

Despite the fact that the we landed on our feet, Jill was less-than-enthused with my 6♥ call. I had violated the rule espoused by Roger's partner, John Fox: "Never play me for anything I haven't bid." What does this say about Fox's rule and its violators? If you have Roger's or Jill's table feel, you can play partner for things they haven't shown (such as four-card diamond support!), and get away with either passing or bidding 2♣ with 7-6 14-counts. If you have total absence of table feel, however, your only hope is to be very, very lucky.

## Overcoming adversity

It's usually a good idea to play in your 4-4 fit, but once in a while the other five trumps break 5-0. That's what happened to Brenda Keller on this deal from the second session of the Life Master Pairs.

Keller, east, ruffed the second heart, and she got the bad news immediately when she led a spade. Dummy's jack went to North's queen, and North drew two more rounds of trumps with his ace and another spade. Keller crossed to the ♣9 and took the ♠K, carefully pitching a club, not a diamond, from hand, leaving North with the master trump.

Then she led clubs, and North ruffed the third round. He switched to a diamond and Keller guessed right - she put in the 10, covered by the king and won with the ace. Now the wisdom of pitching a club and keeping a diamond became clear. She now had an entry - the ♦Q - to get to her hand and run clubs. Down only one despite the 5-0 break - nicely done.

## Colchamiro making rapid recovery

Mel Colchamiro suffered a heart attack Tuesday morning and was rushed to the hospital by his wife Janet. He is making excellent progress, and chances are good he will be released tomorrow.

He wanted to go to the Dodgers-Mets game, but the doctor said no. He and Janet are hoping he can get a go-ahead to play in the Mixed Teams Saturday and Sunday.

The attack occurred after he had won his opening Spingold match. However, his team was forced to forfeit the second match as a result of the heart attack.

## Marshall Miles recalls his life with Betty

When we got married I was afraid I would have to cut down on my bridge playing. But Betty liked to play bridge as much as I did, and she practically shoved me out the door to play so that she could come along. We usually played together, a variation of Blue Team Club. Our nicknames for each other were The Big Club (me) and the Little Blue Team Club (her).

When we met, she was working for her father, a building contractor who built, among other things, the Landmark Tower in Las Vegas and San Bernardino County Museum. We took two trips that became our favorites. The first was to Italy where her older daughter was living with her serviceman husband, followed by a visit to Rome. While there, we played at Belladonna's club and won two gold coins in a pair game. As I told her afterwards, without understanding the language or the system the opponents were playing (they all said "natural" which we finally discovered meant the Roman Club), she played the best game of her life (up till then).

The second trip (just as she was showing the first indications of her illness, similar to Parkinson's disease) was a remote island in Brazil two degrees south of the equator. It was owned by a man she had met 45 years earlier and his brother, both educated in the United States. The island (about 10 miles long and two miles wide) was given to an Indian who was converted to Christianity by the emperor of Portugal, and sold to her friend's ancestors for the monetary equivalent of 250 head of cattle or five slaves. The island has more than 100 fresh water lagoons, lots of birds, alligators and armadillos, and was frequently visited by scientists.

Betty was extremely good-natured and well liked by everyone. One weekend we played in a sectional in Los Angeles where I had a court appearance to make the next day. All the big hotels and motels were fully occupied, and we stayed at an old hotel in the part of the city where the air conditioning wasn't working, the light globes had been stolen, and it was so filthy that Betty put newspapers on the floor to step on. The bed sagged toward the middle and we had to lie almost on top of each other. Because it was so hot, I got into the bathtub and then into bed without drying myself. It was so bad we started laughing, but we often remembered the incident with pleasure.

Betty still played bridge until a few months before her death when she could hardly hold the cards.
