Meet your TDs

ACBL's Tournament Director Appreciation is going on during this tournament. Check this space each day to meet one of the tournament directors working at the Fall NABC.

For a long time in his youth, Roger Putnam resisted his mother's attempts to get him interested in bridge. It wasn't until he left home to attend the University of Washington that he finally came around.

Learning bridge turned out to be a very good move for the Redmond WA resident, now a national tournament director.



Putnam was actually in the U.S. Air Force when he took up directing, helping out at a club adding sheets. Someone mentioned that a tournament in the area could use some help, and a new career was launched. It was goodbye math and science – his interests while in college – and hello, bridge.

"I was very happy," Putnam said, "when I found out I could make some money at bridge."

It has been nearly 40 years since Putnam joined the TD ranks, and there's one aspect of the

Goldberg, Churchill named to Hall of Fame

The ACBL Hall of Fame Committee has named Richard Goldberg and S. Garton Churchill as inductees into the 2006 class of the ACBL Hall of Fame.

Goldberg was named the recipient of the Easley Blackwood Award, given in recognition of meritorious service to bridge. Goldberg, who died in 1999, was ACBL executive secretary and general manager from 1971–1984. Goldberg was instrumental in the transition of ACBL Headquarters from Greenwich CT to Memphis TN in 1972. He was also active in international bridge affairs.

Churchill was named the recipient of the Waldemar von Zedtwitz Award, given in recognition of extraordinary talent. Churchill (1900–1992) was a great player and bidding theorist. He developed the Churchill System, unpopular at its inception but adopted by many years later. He was a two-time winner of the Life Master Pairs and held a longtime record (recently broken by George Jacobs and Alfredo Verace) of highest percentage score in a national matchpoint game.

Meyers, Zia win LM Open Pairs

Jill Meyers and Zia Mahmood, practicing to get ready for next year's world championships, took the lead after the first final session of the

Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs and won with a solid evening session.

Their score of 2594.61 on a 77 top put them about 53 matchpoints ahead of the runners-up – Robert Levin, Bronx NY, and Louk Verhees of the Netherlands. Floridians Ed Schulte of Tampa and Jeffrey Hand of Casselberry were third.

Meyers and Zia had played together only one time previously – in the Mixed Pairs at the first European Open Championships in Menton, France, in 2003. They are scheduled to play in the World Mixed Pairs next summer in Verona, Italy, at the World Bridge Championships.

Zia said he asked Meyers to play because "I'm very impressed with her. We are alike in that we are both emotional about bad results, but she is a very pure and warm human being and a great bridge player."

The two said good luck was mainly responsible for their victory, but Zia noted that they both drank a fair quantity of wine at dinner between sessions, just as Zia claims to have done with Hugh Ross when they won the event in 1990 and 1991.

Andrade, Levin take Women's LM title

New Yorkers Malle Andrade and Jill Levin paired a 56.85% game in the first final session with a 54.28% game in the second final to win the four-session Helen Sobel Smith Life Master Women's Pairs.

It was the first NABC win for Andrade. For Levin, who has multiple NABC titles, it was her first victory in the contest.

Their final total of 966.36 matchpoints was good enough to edge Mildred Breed and Claudette Hartman of Austin TX who finished with 962.59.

Top on a board was 31.

The winners had played together only three times previously, and those occasions were a mere two weeks prior to Denver.

Levin said, "For the first three sessions we started with several bad boards. I mean we were having a 35% game each time. It was necessary to steady the ship and regain composure for each of those sessions and Malle was always up to the task. She showed tremendous poise."

The victory had a tinge of irony for Levin. In the mid-Eighties she and former husband Bob Blanchard filed suit against the ACBL to alter its policy of gender-segregated national contests. The ACBL responded by changing national-rated men's games to open contests in which men and women both could play.

This was the first time Levin has participated in the Life Master Women's Pairs since well before the lawsuit.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

What kinds of mistakes were they?

So, you had a bad game, did you? That's a pretty vague statement if you think about it. When you look at the list of winners with their scores below (the recap sheet, it's called), you'll see not just the numeric scores but also the percentages for each pair.

As a real beginner, you might have had a 25% game, even playing in a limited environment. I've done it, so I know. But the next time I played, partner and I went up to 31%, and the next time all the way to 45%.

It makes sense not to look at just your score on any given day but rather to keep track of your percentage and see if the general trend is up. But that's not much consolation when you and partner are licking your wounds and trying to figure out whether it was a semi or a bus that knocked you over.

There are several tools you can use to look at your results and figure out what went wrong. First, you may be able to get a summary of your game, a list of all your scores with the matchpoints for each. Your total and the percentage will be at the bottom.

For now, look at the top: you will see what score is top on a board. Half of that would be average on any board. Now you can pinpoint which boards were worst—and also which were best. Don't forget to note what you did right, even in a losing cause. Then look at the recap sheet, either on the wall or on a web site. The pair numbers read across, the board numbers up and down, so it's easy to find your own scores. Now look at the boards which were worst for you. For each one, look at the other scores to see what the good scores were. If you are going through this process here in Denver, you can also check the hand records.

Now, what are the questions you can ask to find out what went wrong? And can you detect any theme or trend which will help you avoid

these problems next time?

Here are some possible problem areas.

- Are you underbidding? It's a common problem for new players and new partnerships to be very conservative. Review in any basic text the requirements for game, and don't be afraid.

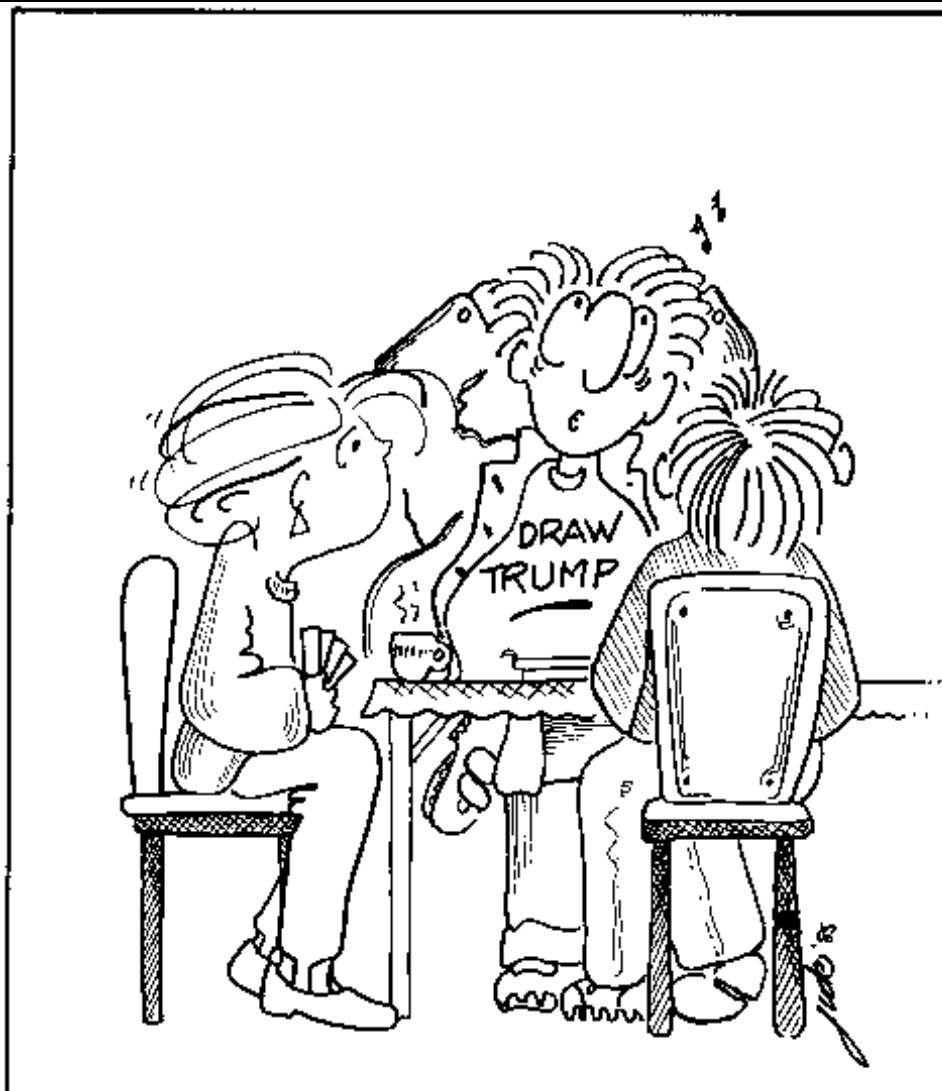
- Are you drawing trump at the right time? Whole books have been written on the "drawing of trumps and its postponement." You should always ask yourself, "Is there anything I should do before I draw trumps?" This may be the most important way of improving your declarer play.

- How's your defense? Do you and your partner have agreements about your leads and signals? Do you keep track? It's difficult but worth the effort.

- Were you just unlucky? If a game was bid only two times during the session, including once against you, chalk it up to bad luck and forget about it.

- Did you just make one of the silly mistakes we all make from time to time? If you revoked or pulled the wrong card or any other costly miscues, you shouldn't worry too much.

Good players can tell the difference between



a goof, a fix (that game almost no one else bid except for your opponents), a bad result caused by an unwitting but lucky opponent, a bad board caused by the skill of the opponents, a mistake and a systemic error.

That last might seem esoteric, but it's not. A systemic error might be one in which you were playing a bid to mean one thing and partner thought it was something else. You can fix these problems more readily than others. It's important for you and partner to be on the same page.

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♣4.

Bidding commentary: South transfers to hearts then rebids 3NT showing 10-14 high-card points with five hearts, balanced. The presence of four 10s must be worth at least one extra point! North, holding a doubleton heart, passes. Holding three hearts, opener usually converts to 4♥, though he may opt to pass with a 4-3-3-3 pattern containing double stoppers in the other three suits.

Defensive commentary: West plays the ♣K at trick one (denying the queen). The king holds the trick if West woodenly returns the ♣7

(higher of two remaining cards), East's correct play is to duck. By ducking, East preserves the opportunity for the defense to take four club tricks if West gets in early enough. Ducking is the right play, but it doesn't work here. North races off with nine tricks: five diamonds, three spades and a club. But the culprit is West. Before returning a club, West should cash the ♥K, implying the ♥A K J. Now East will win the ♣A and return a heart, allowing the defenders to take the first five

tricks.

The best defenders are the most thoughtful ones. When they know what the best defense is, they try to let partner in on the secret.

When third hand plays high, third hand denies the card directly beneath the one played.

When returning partner's suit with two cards remaining, return the higher. With three cards remaining, return the lowest.

Bill Bailey, won't you please come home?

As Michael Rosenberg has remarked, Deep Finesse, the creation of Bill Bailey, is a two-edged sword.

Sometimes when Deep Finesse tells us a contract can or cannot be made, double-dummy lines of play are required. On other occasions it brings to your attention the fact that proper play will produce an unexpected result. See which category you think the following deal falls into. It was played in the first qualifying session of the Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs.

Dlr: North ♠ K 10 6 5 4
 Vul: Both ♥ 6 4
 ♦ A 9 7
 ♣ K 6 2

At most tables, South will open 1♥ in third seat and North will respond 1♠. At this point South will wish he had stayed in bed, but perhaps his best option is to pass.

So what is the outcome in 1♠? At just about every table where North declarer 1♠ he came home with seven tricks (the lead of the ♣Q is not terrible but is highly unsuccessful).

Deep Finesse tells us, however, that eight tricks are available. Indeed they are, and not by an absurd line of play. A group of experts could not figure out how eight tricks could be made, so consider yourself a competent analyst if you spot the play on a low diamond lead from East to West's jack.

If you duck the diamond lead, a club shift sinks your chances of an eighth trick, so you win the ♦A and play three rounds of hearts, ruffing low, and exit with a diamond. West takes the ♦Q and shifts to a club to the jack., at which point East cashes the ♦K. This the end position:

East is endplayed in a way, though the spade exit does not seem that damaging to the defense. North takes the ♠Q with the king and plays another spade to the ace. Now the fourth heart forces West to ruff – otherwise North pitches a club and East ruffs with the master trump and can take only the ♣A from there. So West ruffs, North overruffs and East can choose his poison: overruff himself, leaving him on lead with only clubs, or discard, postponing the endplay by one trick.

Wild thing

This deal from the Friday night pairs games is the kind that makes players mumble about computer-dealt hands. It produced a lot of comment – and an amazing variety of results.

As you can see, a grand slam in hearts is trivial for South (Deep Finesse points out, absurdly, that North-South can make 2NT).

How North-South fared on the board – it seems you never see these deals when the opponents are vulnerable and you're not – depended in large measure on what East did in third seat. The Easts who opened 1♠ put their side in better position to find the profitable save against the Souths who simply leapt to 7♥, as many did.

At one table, this creative auction got North-South to the top spot in a round-about way.

It's not often one gets to put a hand such as South's down as dummy.

Bill Hugenburg of Grand Junction CO revived an old theme from the days of Benito Garozzo on this deal from the second qualifying session of the Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs. Hugenburg was West.

Hugenburg cashed two high hearts but was then awkwardly placed. He solved his problem by exiting with the ♠9 – and it worked better than he could have hoped. Declarer covered the ♠9 with the 10 and won East's jack with the ace. Two rounds of clubs allowed Hugenburg to exit with a third club, ruffed in the South hand.

Declarer played the ♦J, covered by the queen and king, and now declarer finessed in spades, losing to Hugenburg's singleton queen. Hugenburg got out with a club, providing a ruff-sluff for declarer that didn't help. Hugenburg still got his diamond trick for two down and all the matchpoints.

Marsha May Sternberg Women's BAM



Play in the Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams get underway today, with two qualifying sessions followed by two final sessions tomorrow.

At stake: the Marsha Sternberg Memorial Trophy, honoring a woman who died in 2001 after a six-week battle with cancer.

Her husband, Dr. Jim Sternberg of West Palm Beach FL, donated the trophy.

The winners of the 2004 contest were Hansa Narasimhan, Sue Picus, Irina Levitina, JoAnna Stansby, Jill Levin and Debbie Rosenberg.

Marsha Sternberg was a former *National Enquirer* associate editor and the first female writer for the tabloid. Sternberg, once reported to be the highest paid female journalist in America, left the *Enquirer* in 1989 and married Dr. Sternberg, a radiologist and bridge enthusiast. She joined ACBL in 1990 and became a Life Master in 1997.

Sternberg was outstanding in many fields – she was an excellent pianist and a sailing instructor. She was also very successful in gold and tennis.

Her husband tells this story about the 1994 world championship in Albuquerque NM. "I had lost in the quarterfinals of the Rosenblum and went to sleep. When I woke up, a trophy was on the table in our hotel room. I asked, 'Marsha, did I win something?' She said, 'No, I won the novice Swiss.'"

Coffin Trophy

The previous trophy for this event was the Coffin Trophy, one of the oldest and most historic trophies in NABC competition. It was retired.

For years there was only one "National" Women's Team championship — and that was a board-a-match event.

Donated by Charles Emmet Coffin in 1933, the trophy was contested at the "Winter Nationals" in the days when there were only two NABCs — Summer and Winter. In 1963 the event was moved to the new Spring NABC where it was in play until the format was changed to knockout teams in 1976.

For the next decade, there was no national Women's Board-a-Match championship. Swiss teams had become popular and a Women's Swiss with NABC+ rating was established in the early Eighties. But board-a-match play for women was not dead — it was just in hiatus for a few years.

The Coffin Trophy was revived at the Fall NABC in Atlanta in 1986 and new life was breathed into women's board-a-match play.

Many experts consider board-a-match the most exacting form of the game. Equal weight is accorded each deal and every trick is important when scoring is board-by-board.


