## Education Foundation to present scholarships

Bridge sponsors will fund scholarships that will be awarded to winners of collegiate and high school competitions. More than \$100,000 has recently been committed by private individuals to provide these scholarships, according to Dudley Brown, who has been re-elected president of the ACBL Education Foundation. The gifts range from \$1000 to \$5000.



These scholarship awards can be used only at schools and universities approved by the sponsors. The purpose of this effort is to attract high school and college students to competitive events staged by the

ACBL and other related organizations. The events are likely to take place at North American, regional and sectional tournaments, as well as others that may be approved by the sponsors.

Additional substantial contributions are anticipated from other individuals and organizations. The sponsors believe this program will promote and rebuild interest in bridge in the younger generation. At the same time the project will provide the winners with funds that will help further their education.

The sponsors intend to begin these competitions before the end of this year – early 2003 at the latest. More information and details will follow in later publications.

## 'Double dipping' okay at Montreal tournament

The term "double dipping" usually has a negative connotation, but at the 2002 World Championships in Montreal, it will be perfectly okay for players.

The World Championships are scheduled for Aug. 16-31. Alongside that tournament will be a full ACBL regional tournament, scheduled for Aug. 16 to Sept. 2.

Besides the usual ACBL masterpoints, the top 10% of the overall finishers in the unrestricted regional events will receive instant World Bridge Federation masterpoint award certificates, which will indicate the number of WBF masterpoints to be distributed the following day.

For the first time, overall winners in intermediate events, depending on the number of tables in play, will also receive WBF masterpoints.

## Nickell roars into Vanderbilt semis

The Nick Nickell team has forged many comebacks in a decade of grand achievements, but it's difficult to imagine a stronger performance than the one they recorded Wednesday in the Vanderbilt round of eight.

Trailing the Roy Welland squad by a score of 82-48, the Nickell squad posted a 65-0 third quarter to turn a 34-IMP deficit into a 31-IMP lead. Bob Hamman-Paul Soloway and Jeff Meckstroth-Eric Rodwell picked up another 7 IMPs in the fourth quarter to make it to the semifinal round of the championship – the one major team event that has proved difficult for Nickell, Richard Freeman and company to win. Their only victory in the Vanderbilt came two years ago

Welland's teammates were Bjorn Fallenius, Brad Moss, Fred Gitelman, Steve Garner and Howard Weinstein.

Russell's 3♠ raise was preemptive.

Said started with the ♠A. When Russell followed with the 9, Said took it as showing interest in a diamond switch, so Said duly put the ♦J on the table at trick two. Declarer played low and Russell followed smoothly with the queen. Declarer won with the ♦A, pulled trumps and, believing he knew the layout of the diamond suit, played a low diamond to dummy's 9. He could only congratulate Russell on his good play when he won the 10. Minus 650 was worth nearly all the matchpoints to Russell and Said.

## New Life Masters

Cynthia Keaton of Coppell TX needed 3.34 golds, so she made Life Master easily when she finished tied for third in the 0-750 Knockout Teams and won 16.10 golds. Her partner was Art Faulkner of Tyler TX, and their teammates were Fred Stager of Montgomery AL and Masakazu Ochi of Yokohama, Japan. Faulkner also became a Life Master with those 16 golds -- he needed 11.

Shirley Sheridan of Oakley KS advanced to Silver Life Master, and Christopher Shaw of Carlinville IL now is a Bronze Life Master.

You win the king and immediately play a heart to the ace and ruff a heart. You enter dummy with a trump, both following, and lead a third heart, upon which East discards a spade. Now what?

*Kantar's answer:* Actually, things aren't all that bad. Ruff the third heart, enter dummy with a trump and ruff dummy's next-to-last heart. Now back to the ♠A, lead dummy's last heart and discard the ♦9. West is in, and must either lead a diamond or, equally good for you, a spade.

If you even as much as *thought* of monkeying with the diamonds, don't admit it in public.

## Exciting match

Overlooked because of the late hour at which the match ended was the thrilling come-from-behind victory by the Hugh Grosvenor team against Adam Wildavsky in the first round of the Vanderbilt. Grosvenor, seeded 44, trailed Wildavsky, seeded 21, by 37 at the half. They gained back 28 in the third quarter and picked up the other 9 in the fourth. Grosvenor won the eight-board playoff by 3 IMPs.

Playing with Grosvenor of Alexandria VA were Jeff Roman, Alexandria VA; Allen Kahn - Brady Richter - Aaron Silverstein, New York, and Robert Heitzman Jr, Suffern NY. They defeated Wildavsky, Jackson Heights NY; Dan Morse, Houston TX; Douglas Doub, West Hartford CT; John Rengstorff, New York; Larry Mori, Clearwater FL, and Venkatrao Koneru, San Antonio TX.

## That extra 10 points makes a difference

Making 6♥ on this deal from the first final session of the Silver Ribbon Pairs was worth well above average, but making 6NT was a tie for top – 35 matchpoints of a possible 38.

Genevieve Hewitt made no attempt to find a major suit fit — she just leaped to the slam after Dick Hewitt bid 3NT.

East led a diamond to the king and ace, and Dick immediately ran the hearts. East had to make four discards, finally pitching two diamonds, a club and a spade. West pitched a spade and a diamond. Next came the ♦Q, followed by the top clubs. West had to keep his clubs, so East was squeezed in spades and diamonds. East threw a diamond, so declarer took the last three tricks with the ace, king and 9 of spades.

## Slam makes off 3 aces

How often have you bid a makable slam off three aces? Preston Morrow of Dallas found himself in this situation on this deal.

Morrow wasn't bidding 4♣ to show a club suit — he just wanted to make sure that his action was forcing. But partner took him literally and leaped to the slam.

Preston ruffed the opening lead of the ♦K. He called for the ♠K and was happy to ruff when West produced the ace. He led the ♦A, pitching a heart from dummy -- but West ruffed!. West immediately saw his error and announced that he could follow suit. That put the ♣8 on the table as an exposed card. Declarer continued with the ♥K, discarding a spade. West won and of course had to return the exposed ♣8 to dummy's 10. Declarer ruffed a spade with the queen and led a low club to dummy. He drew trumps and ran spades from the top to make his slam.

The exposed card had nothing to do with whether or not the slam made.

## Coming through

When you bid 'em up, you'd better know how to play 'em. On this deal from the round of 16 in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, Eric Greco showed that he knows what he's doing when he gets his hands on a dummy. His farsighted play at trick two helped his team to a sizeable gain on the way to victory. Greco was playing with Geoff Hampson on the team captained by Malcolm Brachman.

East led a low diamond. Greco went up with the ace and made the key play of ruffing a diamond at trick two. He then cashed the top two trumps. The 4-1 trumps split was inconvenient, but Greco played skillfully to land the contract anyway. This is how the play went from there: heart to the ace, diamond ruff, heart to the king, diamond ruff, ♠A, spade to the king and the ♥Q, pitching his third spade. Dummy was now on the lead with two spades, West held the ♣J 9 and Greco held the ♣Q 10. The trump coup brought home the grand slam and 12 IMPs to the Brachman team. North-South played 6NT making six at the other table.

It seems that East's aggressive lead turned out badly for the defense because it gave Greco the timing to achieve the trump coup.

A heart lead would seem to defeat the contract because it removes from dummy a vital entry needed for declarer to reduce his trumps. Even on a heart lead, however, Greco could still prevail if he took the correct view in spades. The play would go heart to the ace, ♦A, diamond ruff, ♣A, ♣K, heart to the king, diamond ruff, spade to the 10, diamond ruff, spade to the king, ♥Q, pitching the ♠A, trump coup.

There is more to the deal, however. Suppose East did find the killing lead of a heart. Declarer might take the correct view in spades to achieve the trump coup, but East could foil the plan by putting up the ♠Q the first time the suit is led, leaving the suit blocked and limiting declarer to one dummy entry in spades. Of course, if North leads the ♠J first, East can kill the contract by refusing to cover.

## 6 tricks with this hand?

Robin Kay says she came to Houston with a very brave partner. "Most of us start out at the novice games and work our way up the ladder. Not my partner — he jumped right into the big leagues. He has already placed in his section twice.

"His name is Glen Bindelglass. He was a terrific partner on the following deal — he laid down the following 4-count and said, 'Good luck, partner. I'm sorry I have only one trick for you.' Imagine his amazement when his beautiful dummy took SIX tricks." This was his hand:

South led the ♥K but shifted to the ♣9 when partner's jack fell on the king. Declarer won with the king and played spades from the top, setting up dummy's spades. North won and returned the ♦5 in this position:

Declarer rose with the ♦A, played a club to dummy and cashed the two spades. South had to make three pitches — she couldn't throw a diamond of course, so she shed the ♥Q-9-8. So South put her in with her ♥A, and she had to lead a diamond away from her jack. So dummy was able to win the 10 and cash two good hearts. That's six tricks for dummy — two spades, two hearts, a diamond and a club. Nice dummy!

Helix' specialty involves peptides, small proteins found in every living thing. Peptides, according to Beatty, are an organism's first line of defense against invasion by a bacteria or virus.

Working with some of the world's top scientists, Helix has created and patented more than 100,000 peptides, some of which could play significant roles in the fight against certain diseases, including cancer.

Beatty, 52, spent 20 years in Birmingham working for Bell South, specializing in software and business processes. He retired from Bell South in 1994 and moved to Destrehan in the New Orleans area to see to a financial business he had started four years before he retired. Beatty Finance is still in operation in New Orleans.

Helix was started in 1988 by Keith Lanneau, who recognized the importance of the virtually new science involving peptides. Lanneau was operating Helix in Baton Rouge when he approached Beatty to help keep the company going.

Beatty contacted Ralph Katz about finding some investment money. After checking out the company, Katz and several other bridge players came up with \$2 million. Beatty says he was surprised when he was asked by the group to run the company.

"They wanted someone who knows business and finance," Beatty says.

Not long ago, George Steiner of the Seattle area advised Beatty that the company would benefit from moving to the Northwest, where Steiner could help Helix with access to top scientists. "George has absolutely delivered," Beatty says. "It's because of him that we are doing so well."

Beatty says the challenge of Helix is to take the peptides and "focus" them so that they work on particular invaders. The next step is to increase the peptide's potency by 10 to 100 times.

Helix has great potential, Beatty says, because "what the whole world is looking for is active molecules that kill diseases."

Once Helix develops a new peptide, it is patented. That means that any entity which wants to make use of the peptide must pay Helix a licensing fee, much as with commercial software.

Beatty says that Helix has been approached by six of the world's largest cosmetics companies "because our peptides do some things really well." Among them: stimulating the growth of collagen, which is important in eliminating wrinkles; attacking the bacteria that cause acne, and attacking the kinds of bacteria that can ruin a multi-million-dollar vat of cosmetic preparation.

Helix has attracted the interest of some chemical companies with plans to fuse bacteria-killing peptides on polymer surfaces to create permanently bacteria-free surfaces.

game, so she was dispatched to a bridge club to find out more.

Smederevac walked into the club and told the man she met that she wanted to learn bridge in 10 minutes. "He told me I should be a member of the club," she recalls, "but I was not a joiner."

She did agree to take bridge lessons, however. That, she recalls, was a revelation.

"After the first lesson," she says, "I understood that it is not possible to learn the game in 10 minutes."

From the beginning, Smederevac was fascinated. "You could do so many things," she says, "and every time it's a new experience."

Her first partner, Sascha Wernle, is also in Houston for the NABC. They won their opening match in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, playing with England's Mark Horton and Leonard Helman of New Mexico, before losing in round two.

Smederevac represented Austria in world Junior competition before becoming a member of the Austrian women's team. She was on the winning squad in the 1992 Women's Team Olympiad in Salsomaggiore, Italy. She was a member of the bronze-medal team in the World Transnational Mixed Teams in Maastricht, Netherlands, in 2000. In Paris last fall, she and her Austrian teammates made it to the semifinal round in the Venice Cup, losing to eventual champion Germany and to the USA in the bronze-medal playoff.

She and Wernle soon will return to Salsomaggiore as members of Austria's open team for the European championships.

Her visit to Houston is her first to the United States. Smederevac turns 37 on Friday. Ordinarily, being 3000 miles from home on your birthday might be a bit of a downer, but nothing much seems to depress her - not even bad results at the bridge table.

"I always think optimistically," she says, "and I like to laugh."

She also professes to enjoy action at the bridge table.

"You never know what my hand is," she says with a twinkle in her eye. "Sascha says it's not so easy to play with a bridge teacher."
