



It's official! Bridge demonstration in Salt Lake City Olympics

Bridge will be a demonstration sport at the Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City next year. The news comes directly from Jose Damiani, president of the World Bridge Federation. This is a major step forward in the ongoing effort to have bridge become a full-fledged Olympic sport in time for the 2006 Winter Olympics in Turin, Italy. The news was unexpected because it had been reported that facilities for play weren't available in Salt Lake City.

Damiani got the word yesterday from Marc Hodler of Switzerland, vice president of the International Olympic Committee and long-time president of the Swiss Bridge Federation. "Bridge has been given the opportunity to demonstrate the competition at the Salt Lake City Olympics before the public and before IOC officials," was the wording in Damiani's message. "If

the demonstration goes well, the sport will be formally introduced at the Olympic Games four years later."


Today's news caught the bridge world by surprise. The WBF began a massive effort in 1998 to bring bridge to the Olympics. At that time it appeared that all the facilities for the athletes and for play were fully booked. "We were always facing the logistics problem of available facilities to demonstrate the game," Damiani said. "Mr. Hodler informed me today that the IOC was able to allocate space for a bridge attraction at the Grand Americana Hotel in Salt Lake City."

The event will take place about two days before the official opening of the Winter Olympics (they are scheduled to open on Feb. 8, 2002). "We will bring teams to three categories – open, women and junior,"

said Damiani. "The WBF will have to decide within the next few months on the criteria for team selection and how many teams will participate. The WBF faces a rather difficult task in selecting the teams. On the one hand we would like the best players to participate. On the other hand, however, we must show the IOC the true global reach of our game. The WBF will be sure to devote its best efforts to determining how best to combine these two objectives to produce the most successful demonstration."

"After a successful demonstration in Salt Lake City, the logistics factor for the 2006 Games could not be an issue as we have an organizing committee. However, we still have to go through one final formality. The IOC must amend its regulation that allows only sports con-

Holding the cards

David Holzman of Olathe KS has been playing bridge on the internet. This North American Bridge Championship has offered him a series of firsts: first time to fill out a convention card, first time to use bid boxes, first time to hold the cards.

David, 13, played with his dad, Richard, in the 0-50 game. "It's fun because you actually get to hold the cards rather than click on an icon," he said.

He was playing a 2♠ contract and paused to consider his line of play. "This is where a father would love to help," Richard said to his opponents.

David eventually went wrong and ended down one. "You should have been here three hands ago," he said. "I had a good hand and I made it too."

Richard played in the afternoon while David kibitzed, then the two played in the Monday night game. "I thought this (the NABC) would give David an opportunity to see bridge in a relaxed atmosphere. Sometimes the club games are not too friendly to newcomers," said Richard.

The two finished fifth overall and David had his first masterpoints – .98 red points.

He'll be back – "oh, yeah, definitely – but I'll get better first."

The Hal Halstead Achievement Stratified Open Pairs, scheduled for 1:00 and 8:00 p.m. today in the Hyatt, Exhibit Hall B, will honor one of Kansas City's top players.

"Hal has always been a presence at the bridge table whether playing with his frequent partner, Dick Arnett, or with the many players who enjoyed the good game that he played – and the humorous barbs that he shot at partners and opponents alike," noted Jerry Mandelkehr.

"You may not realize that he was president of the Kansas City unit at different times for a total of 17 years, as well as president of District 15 for two years.

"He was a very successful basketball coach at Jefferson City, one of his prize players being Larry Belt, as well as the captain of the MU basketball team and a good basketball and tennis player in his own right. He has accumulated almost 5400 masterpoints and just recently celebrated his 58th year of marriage to Virginia."

Cayne falls in Vanderbilt

The ACBL version of "March madness" – also known as the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams – moves into the sweet 16 today with the team captained by Jimmy Cayne on the sidelines.

Cayne (Grant Baze, Michael Seamon-Mike Passell, Robert Levin-Steve Weinstein) had a 30-IMP lead after the first quarter against Bill Eisenberg (Bryan Maksymetz, Peter Stromberg, Fredrik Nystrom, Richie Coren). The lead shrank to 4 IMPs at the half-way mark and Cayne had a 6-IMP lead going into the last set. Eisenberg won that set 31-16 and the match 133-124.

Soloway to receive Lazard award

Paul Soloway has been named the first recipient of the Sidney H. Lazard Jr. Award for Sportsmanship.

"I've known Paul ever since he was a kid," said Sidney Lazard, "and I've always found him to be a model of ethics and sportsmanship."

"It's truly an honor to be considered for this award," said Soloway who turned to Lazard and added, laughing, "I'm not sure you've got the right guy."

Lazard is sure. "Sportsmanship," he said, "involves being generous in victory and gracious in defeat. It involves pleasantness and the realization that this is a game for ladies and gentlemen, not just a total obsession with winning."

"Now that bridge is going to become an Olympic event, I feel it's proper to urge the top players to follow these precepts. I want this award to become one of the most prestigious awards in bridge."

The award was established by Lazard in honor of his son who died in 1999 after a year-long battle with cancer. The younger Lazard was 41.

"My son was a fine player," said Lazard. "He was also a true sportsman and I know he would be pleased by this."

The award will be administered by the ACBL Educational Foundation and will be limited to top players – the top four finishers in major national events. Its object is to "enhance sportsmanship among the top players," said Lazard.

The award will be determined by a three-man committee: Lazard, Zia and Lew Stansby -- "both of whom would be excellent candidates for this award,"

Subtlety of Smith

Keith Garber and Bob Heitzman were part of a team that won the Sunday Swiss by two full matches. Their teammates were Margie Gwozdzinsky and Bill Rosenbaum.

Here is a deal indicating the subtlety of Smith Echoes and defensive signaling.

The auction was 1NT-3NT. On this occasion, 3NT has a lot of chances, despite the fact that declarer is off the entire heart suit. On Garber's club lead, declarer won his jack, crossed to the ♠A and led a spade to his jack. Heitzman followed with the ♠7 and ♠8.

Since East-West play Smith Echoes, it looked to Garber as if partner might be saying that he did not like clubs. Conversely, if he had some choice of which spade to play from an original three-card suit, he did have some interest in the higher-ranking suit – hearts rather than diamonds. So Garber shifted to the ♥Q and the defense cashed out for down two.

Dad wins too

Junior whiz Joe Grue is not the only Grue grabbing headlines these days. While Joe was busy with the Juniors in the Vanderbilt, his dad, Tom Grue, helped a Minnesota team win the Monday night Board-a-Match Teams.

Don Rockstad (known everywhere as "Rocky") and Al Nisides of Duluth MN were looking for a pair for the BAM. Tom Grue played for the first time with Mark Krusemeyer from Northfield MN and this makeshift team gathered 17.5 board-a-match points (out of a possible 24 points) to win the event.

The whole team used good judgment to win Board 17.

At one table, Rocky played 4♠ from the South seat and held his losses to minus 100 when West led the ♥A. At the other table, however, North played 4♠ doubled without the same lead advantage and suffered a two-trick set.

After winning the event, Rocky, who was celebrating his 62nd birthday, said, "Do you have any pull with the *Daily Bulletin* editors? Can you tell them that we won because we had Joe Grue's dad on the team?"

Hamilton considered bidding 1♠ but felt he had no guarantee that contract would fare any better.

North led the ♣K and continued with the ♣J, ducked all around. He shifted to a low diamond: 3, jack, queen.

Now came the key play. Catlett cashed the ♠A K, then led a diamond to the 9 and ace. South cashed the ♣A and led the ♠Q. Catlett ruffed with the ♥10 and North overruffed with the ♥J. He exited with a diamond to dummy's king. Catlett led dummy's ♥9, ducked by North.

Another heart, ducked by Catlett. North was forced to win the trick and, down to all hearts, return a heart into the ♥A Q. Plus 160 was good for almost all the matchpoints.

The winners collected another bundle of matchpoints on this deal from the second qualifying session.

(10) "If he can ask about the queen, I can bid the slam," said Hamilton.

East got off to the killing lead: the ♠A. If he continues a spade, Hamilton is down at trick two. Hamilton, however, false-carded with the ♠9 and East shifted to a diamond. Now to find the ♣Q.

"When someone leads an ace against a slam, they usually think they may have a trump trick," said Hamilton, "so I led the ♣K, then the ♣J. The queen fell but if he (East) had followed low, I was letting the jack ride."

Anything you can do . . .

The first-round Vanderbilt match between the Wei-Sender team and a top-flight Junior team featuring four members of the USA 1 team provided many exciting hands.

An interesting side contest developed at the table where Juanita Chambers and Kathie Wei-Sender competed against Kent Mignocchi and Gavin Wolpert: They seemed to be competing to see who could produce the neatest endplay! Mignocchi scored first.

Kent was in 3NT after a short Stayman auction and got the lead of the ♠2 (attitude).

He played the 10, hoping to seduce an honor, but had to win in his hand with the ace.

He went after clubs, leading low to the ace and misguessing by playing low to the king next, Kathie pitching a diamond. He played the ♣J next setting up the suit as Kathie sluffed another diamond. Juanita won the ♣Q and returned the ♠7 to Kent's king. Kathie gave suit preference with the 8.

Kent played two more rounds of clubs, pitching a spade on the fifth club, and Kathie was helpless. She did her best by pitching two more diamonds.

Kent read the position correctly, continuing with a diamond to the ace! He played the ♠9 from dummy giving Kathie 2 losing options: win the spade and be forced to underlead the ♥K after cashing her spade winners, or what she actually chose – refusing the endplay by ducking the spade – 9 tricks but a loss of 2 IMPs when at the other table declarer (Janice Seamon-Molson) guessed to finesse the clubs and finished with 11 tricks.

Juanita decided to prove that she also knows a thing or two about endplays.

The juniors' aggressive bidding kept Juanita and Kathie out of the excellent spade game that was bid at the other table where Brad Campbell chose to overcall 1♠ with the South hand.

The play started with "auto pilot" mode: Kent led the C2 to dummy's ace and Juanita immediately took the diamond finesse to the jack and ace. Kent contin-

ued with the ♣K, forcing declarer to ruff in hand.

A deep spade finesse to the 9 and Gavin's jack was Juanita's next move. The defense persisted with yet another club, shortening declarer's trump holding again. Juanita took another spade finesse to the queen, which held, and continued by cashing the ♦K and ruffing her last diamond in dummy. She then cashed the ♥A, stopping to think when the 10 appeared on her right. The position:

The contract can be made easily by playing another heart to the king and cashing the ♠A (the location of the ♠K is known) but don't forget our side contest. The bidding and the line adopted by the defense strongly suggested the way the cards are distributed between the opponents.

Juanita took a deep breath, cashed the ♠A and when West did not ruff (just imagine what happens if Gavin had another small heart and one fewer clubs and had made a brilliant falsecard under the ♥A) she continued with the last spade -- endplaying Kent who was forced to ruff and lead into declarer's king-jack.

She won a lot of style points but still lost 10 IMPs for not being in game.

The last word, however, belonged to the Juniors.

Gavin was the hero on this deal. The Juniors wound up in 5♦ after North made a takeout double of 1♦ and N/S competed in hearts. The defense started with the ace and king of hearts. After Gavin ruffed the second heart, he pulled three rounds of trumps ending in dummy and stopped to take count.

Gavin, needing seven of the last eight tricks, saw that bringing the clubs in for one loser would still leave him one trick short. The auction strongly suggested that the spade finesse would not work. Is there any hope?

Yes! Gavin found the only play – he cashed the ♣K and then ducked a club to North, setting up clubs and endplaying Juanita who had to give him a ruff and a sluff or lead into his AQJx of spades.

At the other table the women played in 5♣ which could have been set if Brad had found the spade lead. But he chose (not unreasonably) to lead his singleton diamond and the board was pushed.

The Juniors upset the more experienced Wei-Sender team, 187-134, in a match that was full of ups and downs.

Three places at the same time

Peter Friedland took a fine view in the bidding and followed it up in the play on this deal from the first qualifying session of Open Pairs I.

Friedland (East) judged very nicely to bid 3NT, not 4♥. He won the diamond lead and carefully played a spade to dummy at trick two. North did well to duck this and now declarer can take 10 tricks (because of the spade blockage) by clearing hearts.

Friedland, however, made clearly the right play when he led a second spade. North won and cashed his diamond winner – otherwise, he was not getting it – and shifted to the ♣10. Friedland won in hand and cashed the ♥A K. This was the ending:

Friedland went to dummy with the ♣Q and cashed the ♦10, throwing a heart and triple squeezing South. A spade discard would give up the rest and either a heart or a club would cost a trick too. Plus 630 was an excellent result for E-W.

Goodwill message

How pleasant it is to hear a player call, "Director, please" – instead of a shouted "DIRECTOR!" Why not extend the same courtesy to our caddies? Don't you think "Caddy, please" has a rather nice sound?

Remember that Kansas City is the first NABC for some of our players – and it's also the first NABC for many of our caddies.
