Eythorsdottir wins Wagar in OT

After 64 boards of play in the final of the Wagar Women's Knockouts, the score was 143-143. In the eight-board playoff that followed, the team led by Disa Eythorsdottir npc outscored Carlyn Steiner's squad 39-7 to claim the victory.

The members of the Eythorsdottir team are Lynn Baker, Debbie Rosenberg, Karen McCallum, Kerri Sanborn, Beth Palmer and Lynn Deas. They fought back from a 39-IMP deficit in the third quarter to tie the match before the playoff.

Playing with Steiner were Marinesa Letizia, Janice Seamon-Molson, Tobi Sokolow, Jill Meyers and Randi Montin.

There was some confusion about the result of the match after the fourth quarter. The bracket sheet indicated that Steiner was ahead by 40 IMPs after

the third quarter. Although Steiner lost the final quarter 63-24 (a 39-IMP loss), it appeared they had managed to hang on by 1 IMP.

A faulty score comparison earlier in the day, however, had gone uncorrected; Steiner's true lead was actually 1 IMP less than was reported on the bracket sheet. After some discussion, both teams agreed that the final result of the match was indeed tied. This set the stage for the early-morning playoff in which Eythorsdottir was victorious.

In quarterfinal Spingold action, Roy Welland's team overcame a 28-IMP deficit at the half to oust Steve Landen's squad 141-92. Landen's 68-40 lead was ruined when they were held to 3 IMPs in the third quarter, while Welland tacked on 55.

Gerald Sosler's team trailed in their match against Steve Robinson after the first quarter, but it was all Sosler after that. Sosler won the second quarter 66-6 and never looked back. Final score: 163-127.

Rose Meltzer enjoyed an approximately 20-IMP lead throughout much of their match against Lew Finkel's squad. Meltzer won 124-106.

Nick Nickell continues to cruise. After a close first set, Nickell jumped out to a 31-IMP lead at the half which was also the final margin of victory: 132-101.

In today's semifinal matchups, Welland will face Sosler, while Nickell will take on Meltzer.

West Coast duo wins Nat'l 199er

Californians Gus Haggstrom and Mitch Tuller won the two-session National 199er Pairs yesterday, and each earned their first-ever gold points.

Haggstrom, of Pacific Palisades, and Tuller, of Encino, scored 62.79% in the morning session and 66.59% in the afternoon to post a finally tally of 340.00.

Close behind in second with 337.50 were Maureen Warman and Jessica Lai of Danville CA.

Haggstrom and Tuller met at their place of employment, the Rand Corporation. Haggstrom, who is now retired, was a mathematician specializing in statistics. Tuller is a computer programmer. They have been playing together nine months.

Radjef takes lead in \$12,000 LA Open

Terry Radjef of Dallas has been playing BPT Prize Money Bridge since its inception and yesterday the cards fell in the right place for him. Radjef finished first overall in the \$12,000 Los Angeles Open Individual semifinal with a 69% game.

"I've come to realize that you can impact only six to eight hands out of 24," said Radjef.

The Professional Tournament Directors Association (PTDA) annually names two of its members as recipients of special recognition awards. This year's winners are TDs Patty Johnson and Ron Johnston.

National Director Patty Johnson of Sebring FL is the 2003 recipient of the Fred Friendly Award. Created in 1986, this award honors the director who best exemplifies the spirit of the late Paul Stehly, an Associate National Director who was legendary for his warmth and good cheer. Stehly's nickname was Fred Friendly.

Johnson has been a director for 27 years, and is the ACBL's Tournament Director Field Supervisor for the Southeastern U.S.

Associate National Director Ron Johnston is this year's recipient of the Tom Weeks Memorial Award. Created in 1972, it was originally presented to the PTDA member who demonstrated the greatest improvement in all facets of bridge direction. It

Quinn played 3NT on this deal from the Life Master Pairs qualifying session. She took the ♦Q opening lead with the king and cashed the ♠K. She led a club to the jack which West ducked smoothly – this might have been the right defense on a different day.

But not here! Quinn cashed her top three spades and pitched two clubs. Then she led a club to East's ace and received the forced heart return. She cashed three hearts ending in hand and ran her last two spades, squeezing West in clubs and diamonds for 12 tricks.

A true Renaissance man

Chip Martel always gives the appearance of being a straight man at the table. But there are hidden depths as was revealed by this deal against a strong Spingold opponent East and West were playing a complex relay system, which perhaps explains Martel's choice of action on the following deal:

Martel opened 1♣ to prevent his opponents from having the auction to themselves. Thereafter he ran to 2♣ intending to redouble and let Lew Stansby have the fun of declaring the deal – but Stansby preempted him by redoubling himself!

In 2♦ doubled West led a trump and East played three rounds of the suit – an error since it left West with nowhere to go. A low heart would have been best, but West thought Martel had long clubs to go with his three diamonds, of course, and thus would be short in hearts. So he shifted to the ♥J in intellectual fashion.

Martel put in the queen, cashed the ♥A and led a third heart, setting up the ♥5. West took his ♥K and exited with a fourth heart. Martel won and led a small spade from dummy. West was endplayed again – and 2♦ doubled miraculously escaped for minus 300 and an 8-IMP pickup against 630 in the other room.

So be warned: that quiet looking player could be out to get YOU!

Gavin Wolpert led a trump to the 10 and jack. Weichsel led his club, and Wolpert won to lead another trump. Weichsel ruffed a club, crossed to a heart, ruffed another club, crossed to another heart and ruffed dummy's last club. That gave him seven tricks, and he still had the two red aces and the ace of trumps for his game. This deal occurred in the third quarter when the Rose Meltzer team made a terrific comeback after trailing at the half by 65 IMPs.

Both Vincent Demuy and Weichsel made good plays at trick one. Sontag led a low diamond and Demuy played low from dummy. Weichsel put in the 8 and this forced the ace. Declarer took the losing heart finesse, and Weichsel did a little thinking before leading. He felt it was likely that declarer was going to set up some club tricks, so instead of leading a passive heart he tried the ♠Q. Wolpert won with the ace, crossed to dummy with the ♥A and led the ♣8. Weichsel played low in perfect tempo, and declarer guessed wrong by finessing the queen. To win he had to led the 8 ride – not that easy a play. Sontag won with the king, cashed the ♠K and led another spade. Declarer won and led a diamond, expecting to score the queen because of the play to the first trick.

Wolpert was not at all pleased when Weichsel took the ♦Q with the king and cashed his long spade. Weichsel led a low club, and declarer had a tough choice. If he finessed and lost, Sontag was going to take a lot of diamond tricks. So declarer decided to cut his losses by rising with the ace and cashing his hearts for down two.

If he had finessed, they might still be playing. The match would have ended in a tie instead of a

Strength not length

At the end of the Senior Swiss Teams, my partner, Ken Barbour, picked up

I opened 1♠, limited, and he discovered, by using relays, that I had 5—5 in spades and diamonds, with heart shortage. He now made an interesting decision: He chose to play 4♥ rather than 4♠. He says that he liked his heart strength. I suspect it was because he does not like me to play the hand.

A club was led, and he viewed this layout:

The ♥9 was led, and East overtook with the 10. This kept the communications open, so South was forced to duck. Reygadas gave up on hearts and made the devastating shift to the ♠J. Now the defense was ready to take five tricks before South could take nine. East still had his heart entry to play a second spade, and South could not score a club trick. A game that seemed easy had failed.

New Life Masters

Bruce Duran of Cambridge MA played his first club game with Gloria Tsoi, also of Cambridge. He also played in his first tournament with her. And here in Long Beach he became a Life Master playing with her. Duran got his final points in the Morning Knockouts. Their teammates were Brad Bozick of Waltham MA and Paul Landauer of Verna IL.

Ceil Conair of Victorville CA got the points that put her over the top in the Senior Knockouts. Her partner was Penny Barbieri of San Dimas CA and their teammates were Susie Eminger of Upland CA and Jane Pace of Victorville.

Save cost more than the slam

Lew Finkel and Bernie Miller got to a fine slam on this Spingold deal, but they weren't allowed to play it there. When their opponents took a save at 6♠, they defended for all they were worth and actually wound up with more points were than the 980 they would have gotten for 6♥.

West saved for the first time when Finkel jumped to 4♥. Miller liked his hand very much, so he cuebid his ♣A, at the same confirming good heart support. Finkel showed his diamond control and Miller leaped to the slam. West was virtually sure his opponents could make the slam, so he bid 6♠. Miller doubled.

Finkel started with the ♦K, then led his singleton club to Miller's ace. Miller thought partner had led a singleton, but he wasn't sure Finkel had a trump. So he led the ♦Q and switched to a heart to partner's queen. Finkel led the ♦J, suit preference for clubs since he also had the king, and Miller got the message. He ruffed and fired back a club, which Finkel ruffed with his singleton trump. 1100 to Finkel and Miller. At the other table North-South stopped in 4♥, so this represented a 12-IMP gain.

has since evolved to become a recognition of the highest standards of professionalism in tournament direction.

Johnston, of Cedar Falls IA, has been a director for 12 years.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Standard American Yellow Card conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

The solution – send two players to the United States to learn how to direct. That's the primary reason why Kyoung Won Yoo and Sunhee Han made the trip to this NABC. They both took the tournament director course. "We got all kinds of useful information from that course," said Yoo. "We are going to send another bridge player to the NABC in New Orleans in November to take the director course there."

They also have been playing regularly in the Intermediate/Novice games, and they are doing quite well. They've won more than 18 points so far. They're both ACBL members.

What's bridge like in Korea? So far it's not all that popular, according to Han. "But interest is climbing now that we have Han Bridge. That's an Internet program similar to OKbridge. Lots of young people like the challenge."

Yoo and Han learned their bridge from classes at the International Women's Association. "Since that was about the only place where bridge was taught, most of Korea's players are women," said Yoo. "But some men are beginning to be interested."

The visitors are having a great time here. "Newcomers get good treatment," said Han. "Everybody makes us feel as if we're important. There's no good program for beginners in Korea, so we want to do something about that, too."

In the mini-Spingsold for players from Life Master to 5000 points, it's an all-California final. In the other mini-Spingsold – for Life Masters through 1500 points – it's East vs. West. Zero Tolerance

As recorder for both Unit 166 and District 2, it is an absolute pleasure for me to say that the Zero Tolerance policy, which originated in 1995 here in Ontario, Canada, has had a tremendously positive effect on player behavior at the club, sectional, regional and national levels of the ACBL, and in many other areas of the world as well.

Duplicate bridge players now firmly believe that they are entitled to enjoy their game and will not hesitate to call the director to report any behavior that interferes with that enjoyment. In turn, directors who determine that a player's actions have violated the ZT policy will not hesitate to assign a MP penalty of one-quarter of a board for a first offense, expulsion from the event for a second offense and a disciplinary committee hearing for a third offense.

Can more be done? Of course! And to that end I urge all of you as you play each day in this tournament to make sure that every player treats you with the courtesy and respect due to you, and that you treat others the same way.

When you sit down at a table and say "hello," make sure your opponents say "hello" to you. If they ignore you and continue to discuss a previous hand, interject politely that you would appreciate being recognized.

Don't tolerate criticism or gloating of any kind at the table. Go out of your way to praise the bidding and play of your opponents (but not your partner, as that could be construed as gloating). Don't allow any form of rudeness, and don't give, or tolerate, uncalled for bridge lessons or hand analyses at the table.
