Judy and Robin Kay honor Norman's legacy



Judy and Robin Kay celebrated Norman Kay Day by playing in the game named for their husband and father.

If you don't think Norman Kay's legacy goes far beyond his bridge expertise, follow Judy and Robin Kay through a section for a round or two. Judy, Kay's widow, and Robin, their daughter, are constantly reminded of how much Norman meant to the people he touched during his life.

"Sometimes," says Robin, "someone will do something nice, make a kind gesture, and you might remember it for an hour or two. People remembered things Daddy did for 30 years."

Just being Judy and Robin Kay is generally enough to bring on lots of comments about Norman's stature as a gentleman and a role model. On Friday, there were two additional reasons: Friday was Norman Kay Day at the Spring NABC, and the women were playing in the Norman Kay Stratified

Open Pairs.

"He made such an impact on so many people," says Robin, who lives in Egg Harbor NJ, "and he never knew."

Says Judy: "I can't think of a better role model for bridge."

The Kay women, who play together once a week, didn't win the Norman Kay Pairs, but they wouldn't have missed it for anything. "We didn't play like Daddy," Robin said after the first session, "but we try to emulate him anyway."

In all the years she kibitzed Norman and the late Edgar Kaplan, Judy says, she never heard an unkind word spoken between them, even away from the table. Says Robin: "It takes a special person to be that way behind closed doors."

Judy recalls that when her husband died, she

Greco, Hampson top Open Pairs qualifiers

Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson scored nearly 68% in the first qualifying session and added a 62% game in the evening to take the lead in the Silodor Open Pairs I, which concludes today. Greco, who lives in the Philadelphia area, and Hampson, of Los Angeles, are former Life Master Open Pairs champions.

Their score of 2165.96 is 37.65 matchpoints ahead of the second-place pair, Nikolay Demirev, Des Plaines IL and Vish Viswanathan, West Windsor NJ. In third place were England's Tony Forrester and Norway's Boye Brogeland with 2069.20. Top was 64.

'Philly Connection' portraits unveiled

Jerry and Francine Silodor traveled all the way from Boca Raton FL for the Spring NABC. They are both bridge players, but they didn't turn a card while they were here.

Lure of an overtrick

By Gene Benedict

The following deal came up in the first qualifying session of the North American Open Pairs. North was the declarer, but I am making South the declarer to allow the reader to follow the hand more easily.

Dir: North ♠ 9 5 4
 Vul: E-W ♥ 10 8
 ♦ J 7 4 3
 ♣ J 10 8 4

♠ 10 6 ♠ J 8 7
 ♥ J 7 6 ♥ Q 9 5 4 3
 ♦ K 10 9 6 5 ♦ 8 2
 ♣ 9 7 2 ♣ K Q 3

West North East South
 Pass Pass 3NT (1)

All Pass

(1) 26-28 high card points.

Opening lead: ♦10.

When I was talking about this hand after the session, Phil Becker used it as an example to show how unlucky he was. Instead of leading a diamond, his LHO led a low heart. Phil ended up taking only nine tricks for a poor matchpoint score.

I replied that I had led a diamond but declarer still took only nine tricks. "Impossible!" said Becker. "He has 10 tricks now."

South won the first trick with the queen and rattled off five rounds of spades, putting pressure on the defense. West had to make three pitches – he threw two low clubs and a low diamond. South continued with the ♣5, covered by the 9, 10 and queen. Bob Brandow (East) returned the ♥Q, and South won the ace followed by the ♦A and the ♥K. This is how things looked like with three cards left:

♠ — ♠ —

 ♣ — ♣ A 6

Making the same play that Zia no doubt would have made, declarer exited with the ♥2! Thinking that East must have the ♥J because he led the queen earlier, South thought East would be forced to lead away from his ♣K and give him a valuable overtrick.

Instead a surprised West won the jack and took two more diamond tricks to hold declarer to nine tricks.

Section tops

An aggressive double

When you're virtually certain your partner has full values for his call, it's a lot easier to take an aggressive action. Bruce Keidan knew that Jim McCarver, the all-time baseball great, would have a solid hand for his takeout double on this deal from the Educational Foundation Pairs. Why was he so sure? Because McCarver seldom plays competitive bridge and as a result has not learned to take the chances that modern players often take. So Keidan doubled a partial with minimum values.

Keidan led a diamond to McCarver's ace, and McCarver switched to a low heart. Declarer's queen won and declarer tried the losing club finesse. McCarver led a diamond, and declarer discarded a heart as Keidan took his king. Back came a heart to declarer's ace, but the defense already had three tricks, and the trump spots were such that the defense came to three more tricks there. Plus 200 was a tie for top.

McCarver thoroughly enjoyed his short visit to this NABC. Bridge is an important part of his life, and he found it fun to hobnob with some of the greats of the game..

Discounted parking

Future reservations

This applies to any event, NABC+ or regional, which permits Mid-Chart or Super-Chart methods. Look for the light blue forms on the tables where convention cards and pencils are located.

received more than 600 messages, the vast majority from bridge players.

Robin says one of the messages that touched her most deeply was from Chris Willenken, a young expert from New York. He had played against Kay and Kaplan in Kaplan's last event. When Willenken's team won, the players scattered throughout the hotel. It took some effort, Willenken related to Robin, but Norman found each member of the winning team and offered his congratulations. Willenken told Robin he would never forget that gesture.

Says Robin, "Daddy would always say that anyone would do the same — and he would really mean it."

Judy says the special day honoring her late husband is sad in a way because it reminds her that Norman is gone, but it's also happy because "bridge really enriched Norman's life so much."

"Dad was one in a million," says Robin, "and with every day that passes, we miss him more, not less."

Convention cards — it takes two!

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Class A conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

the Grand Ballroom, Salon E, are B. Jay Becker, John Crawford, Bobby Goldman, Charles Goren, Robert Jordan, Norman Kay, Peter Pender, Olive Peterson, Arthur Robinson, Helen Sobel Smith, Charles Solomon, Dave Treadwell and Sally Young.

The unveiling was a family affair for the Silodors and Beckers. Other Silodor relatives were Jerry's sister, Susan Hoyt; her husband, Bill Cohen and her brother, Bruce Birch. Becker's sons, Michael and Steve, also were present.

District 4 Representative Craig Robinson emceed the unveiling, noting that Philadelphia has "a rich history of bridge stars." He did acknowledge that Treadwell, from Wilmington DE, was "kidnapped" to be part of the group.

For Jerry Silodor, the event had special significance because of his memories of his father and his bridge exploits.

Jerry remembers kibitzing for about three hours during the final of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams in 1956 or 1957 in New York. Silodor was playing with Crawford in the open room of the event, which Silodor's team won. "It was very exciting," Jerry says.

Jerry and Fran have been playing bridge seriously for about six years, mostly at clubs in Florida. Interestingly, Jerry says, there are many players from Philadelphia at the clubs where he plays who took bridge lessons from his father. "When they hear the name," Jerry says, "they go crazy."

Jerry still feels the loss of his father, who died in 1963 at the age of 56. Jerry's parents were divorced and he lived with his mother, so he didn't get the bridge influence he might have had under different circumstances.

Says Francine of her husband: "He could have been the best. He's a really good player."

Jerry, a retired ophthalmologist, says he recalls receiving a phone call from his father one day about a year before he died. "He said he couldn't add up his bridge scores," Jerry recalls. "He came to my office and I examined him. He had lost half his vision, and I thought he had had a stroke, so I recommended that he see a neurologist. He was diagnosed with a brain tumor and he died about a year later."

Although Jerry has not achieved bridge expertise commensurate with his blood line, he does enjoy the game. "It's the only card game I like," he says. "It makes you think."

Still, he says, "I don't like to tell people my last name. They expect too much."

Silodor Trophy is the Open Pairs prize

The names of the winners of Open Pairs I are engraved on the Silodor Trophy, presented in memory of Sidney Silodor, winner of the Bermuda Bowl, the McKenney Trophy and more than 30 North American championships.

Silodor, a member of the team that won the first Bermuda Bowl World Championship in 1950, won the Vanderbilt eight times, the Reisinger six times, the Spingold, the Open Pairs and the Master Mixed Teams three times each and the Mixed Pairs five times — a record.

Silodor was an original member of the Bridge Hall of Fame, elected in the Sixties when the institution was the province of its creator, *The Bridge World* magazine.

The trophy was presented in 1963 in memory of Silodor and made retroactive to include winners of the event, which began in 1958.
