## Radin, Westheimer win Women's Pairs

Judi Radin won her first-ever NABC women's pairs event and Valerie Westheimer won her first-ever NABC event when the New York twosome took the NABC Women's Pairs yesterday.

Carol Simon and Kitty Munson were second, followed by Cheri Bjerkan and Sue Weinstein. These three pairs were the only ones to top 1200 matchpoints.

Radin has won all four of the major world women's events: the Venice Cup, the World Women's Pairs, the World Women's Olympiad and the McConnell Teams.

She's also won six NABC titles but this was her first women's pairs championship.

Westheimer, recording her first NABC title, commented, "Judi and I played together more than 25 years ago and I haven't played since. We started playing again about a year ago."

In that year, the two have been second in the Women's Swiss Teams at the Dallas NABC last year and fourth in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams in St. Louis. They've also won a few regional events.

## George & Gracie steal the show

George & Gracie are alive and well -- and performing in Joe Jabon's new show, *The George Burns and Gracie Allen Vaudeville Revue*.

The cast, which played to rave reviews last night, will present an encore performance at 11:30 tonight in the Crystal Ballroom.

The 40-minute show is produced by Seattle's only Bridge Burlesque and features music, dancing and comedy by the cast.

## Cayne tops Rapee on last board

The playing rooms for the Cayne-Rapee match were packed four-deep as the teams wrestled for a berth in today's final. A lot of folks were rooting for 83-year-old George Rapee to make a grand appearance in the final -- but it was not to be.

The match was decided on the very last board. Rapee and Co. were leading by a single IMP. David Berkowitz was playing three spades in one room, and he suffered a one-trick defeat. Russ Arnold and Billy Eisenberg got one trick higher, were doubled, and suffered a one-trick loss. Because of the double, CAYNE gained 3 IMPs to win the match by 2, 123-121.

CAYNE will face the defending champions captained by Richard Schwartz. SCHWARTZ took the lead from the start against ROBINSON, eventually scoring a 194-103 triumph.

CAYNE (James Cayne, Chuck Burger, Mike Passell, Michael Seamon, David Berkowitz, Larry Cohen) will play SCHWARTZ (Richard Schwartz, Mark Lair, Chip Martel, Lew Stansby, Bobby Goldman, Paul Soloway) in a 64-board match on vugraph and on Internet for the Vanderbilt crown.

Breathtaking in a losing cause for RAPEE were George Rapee, John Solodar, Billy Eisenberg, Russ

## Fallenius-Moss win Open Pairs II

Bjorn Fallenius won his first NABC pairs event and Mike Moss had a repeat win in Open Pairs II yesterday.

Evan Bailey and Joseph Kivel were second, followed by Bryan Maksymetz and Gregory Arbour. These were the only pairs to top 2000 matchpoints.

Fallenius, European champion in 1987, has represented Sweden in international competition. A WBF World Life Master, he was third in the Bermuda Bowl in 1987 and 1991. His NABC wins are the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams and the Open Board-a-Match Teams, both in 1991.

Moss won Open Pairs II (then the Men's Pairs) at the last Reno NABC in 1989. A WBF World Master and ACBL Grand Life Master, Moss placed second in the World Mixed Teams in 1972 and the Rosenblum Teams in 1990. He has won six previous NABC titles.

## Steve Greenberg

Steve Greenberg, 66, of Germantown TN, a star player for decades, died of an apparent heart attack yesterday while playing golf at the Big Creek course in Memphis.

"He died celebrating life," said his wife Julie, who is head of the Education Department for the ACBL. "On the very last hole he played, the sixth, he hit a 50-yard shot that stopped just an inch from the hole, according to Jack Hudgins of Memphis, who was in his foursome. Jack says Steve was playing the best he had even seen him play. He died the way he would have wanted to die."

According to Jim Wilson of Germantown, who was riding with Steve in the golf cart when he died, Steve said, "I'm not feeling so well. I may be having one of my spells." Seconds later he was gone. Hudgins, Wilson and Rea Higgins of Germantown,

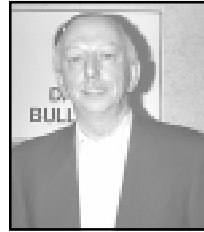

# head

I'm told it pays to balance aggressively at matchpoints. I'm not certain I'm convinced. Here's an example from the first session of Open Pairs II.

One danger of balancing is that the opponents may bid and make a game. Here they reached a better partscore. Was it better though? Declarer took 12 tricks in hearts. Afterwards I asked my partner, Steve Beatty, what he would have led against 1NT. He was obliging enough to claim that he'd have led a heart. That would have led to -240 instead of the -230 we actually scored.

Net result? We scored 55 1/2 on a 64 top. There were three other -230's and no -240's, so had I passed out 1NT we'd have scored 54. Sure enough, balancing paid off!

## Geir Helgemo — 'Possibly' or 'probably' the best?

Geir Helgemo is earning a reputation as "possibly" the greatest player in the world. Look at these two deals from the Vanderbilt quarterfinal and see if you think "possibly" should read "probably."

Helgemo held:

 and heard his left-hand opponent open 1♣, pass by partner, 1♦ by right-hand opponent. Helegemo doubled. LHO redoubled, showing a strong notrump. Partner and RHO passed, and Helegemo bid 1♠. LHO rebid 2♣, partner passed again and RHO bid 2NT, passed out.

Helgemo led the ♦K and continued with the queen. Martel could take his ace when he liked. When Forrester gained the lead in clubs, he shifted to a spade, as suggested by Helgemo. Now Helgemo could wait for his ♠10 to come up and cash out diamonds for down one.

Goldman led the ♥8 to Soloway's king and Robson's ace. A club toward dummy's queen lost to Goldman's king and he shifted to the ♠9. Dummy's

♠Q was allowed to hold and Robson led a second spade to his ace. Now he cashed the ♣A, pitching a diamond from dummy. The ♣10 went to Goldman's jack. Robson claimed nine tricks for plus 600 and a 12-IMP pickup.

A few deals later, Helgemo held:

# HALL OF FAME

## John Gerber

John Gerber won fame as a player, as a strong team captain and as the inventor of the ace-asking 4♣ bid that bears his name. A more important legacy to bridge may be found in the lives he influenced and continues to influence.

"Chances are I wouldn't be playing bridge today if it hadn't been for Gerber," says Sidney Lazard, considered by many to be one of the all-time greats of the game.

Bobby Wolff, another legendary bridge figure, calls Gerber "a father figure." Gerber, Wolff says, "may have had the most influence on me when I first started to play."

Gerber (1906-1981) was a strong captain of North American teams and a fine player in his own right. He won four NABC titles, was nine times a runner-up and won many regionals. He represented North America in the Bermuda Bowl in 1961.

### Defense and tactics

In recognition of these achievements, Gerber has been elected to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame, the fourth Texan to be so honored (Wolff, Oswald Jacoby and Jim Jacoby are the others)

Lazard recalls playing with Gerber early in his own career. "I had about five mentors and he was certainly one of the main ones. The two strengths of my game -- defense and tactics --- I learned from Gerber. "His offensive bidding might have left something to be desired, but he was a fine defensive player and a fine tactical player."

Lazard remembers an incident during a Memphis tournament about 1949. He and Gerber had two kibitzers, one a woman and the other a prominent member of the ACBL Board of Directors.

"Two men came to our table and one of them used a vulgar, four-letter word. Two things happened: one was that Gerber refused to play the two boards against that opponent and the other was that the Board member demanded the offender be thrown out of the tournament. When that didn't happen, he resigned from the Board in protest."

Gerber was one of the first to realize that if an opponent discarded a suit and there were four of that suit in dummy, the opponent likely had five or more. "And that was more than 30 years ago," adds Lazard, "long before anyone else even thought about it."

Wolff recalls kibitzing Gerber. "He had a tremendous feel for the game. I remember kibitzing once when the bidding went 1♥--Pass--2♥--Pass; Pass and he balanced with 3♦. He was vulnerable and if the opponents had stopped to double him, he would have gone down a bunch.

"Instead, they went to 3♥ and went down themselves. I asked him later why he had taken such a risk and his reply was: 'Did you check to see what our matchpoint score would have been for minus 110?'"

### Dynamic matchpoint player

Wolff says Gerber was "a dynamic matchpoint player. It seemed his score was always 200-plus with 156 average."

Gerber was no slouch at board-a-match play either. His team (Mervin Key, Harold Rockaway and Paul Hodge) won the 1964 Reisinger, averaging 71% over four sessions.

His regular Texas team --- Hodge, Ben Fain and George Heath --- was "a very fine team in the Fifties and early Sixties," recalls Dan Morse, a fellow Texan

## Alphonse "Sonny" Moyse Jr.

Sonny Moyse, one of the newest members of the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame, was publisher and editor of *The Bridge World* from 1955-1966, spanning the era between Ely Culbertson, the founder of the magazine, and Edgar Kaplan.

An experienced and talented author, Moyse was the ghostwriter for two of Culbertson's columns for more than 20 years. Moyse also wrote the humorous *Bridge with Jackie* stories, the fictional accounts of his and his wife's bridge misadventures.

Moyse was also an expert player, winning the Men's Teams (1949) and the Men's Pairs (1963), but generations of players will remember him best for his tenure as editor of *The Bridge World*.

Moyse joined the staff of the magazine in 1934 as assistant editor, and was the *de facto* editor from 1939 until Culbertson's death in 1955. Moyse then purchased *The Bridge World* from the Culbertson estate. In 1963, he sold the publication to McCall Corporation, though he remained as editor.

### The Moysian fit

Moyse was a champion of the natural school of bidding, and his views in this matter were unapologetically anti-traditionalist. Armed with an acerbic wit and an unflinching ability to analyze cleanly and clearly, Moyse took on decades of scientific-bidding advocates in the pages of his magazine. He was a proponent of four-card major openings and 4-3 "Moysian" trump fits.

Moyse recognized, however, that the advent of more scientific approaches to the auction was a regrettable (in his view) inevitability. As editor of *The Bridge World*, therefore, he published the ideas and theories of expert players of the day. Moyse provided a necessary forum for the evolution of bridge theory.

As director of the ongoing bidding-panel series of the magazine, the *Master Solvers' Club*, Moyse would increasingly find himself in support of minority opinions, but he accepted it all with a keen, acidic sense of humor and an unflappable faith in clear, sensible bidding. In fact, Moyse enjoyed playing the role of the curmudgeon, criticizing in indignant tones the views of other experts. The following excerpt from a 1960 issue of *The Bridge World* is pure Moyse:

"Not out of modesty but from awareness of fact we must observe that (last month's Master Solvers' problems) were not as good as we could have wished --- no drama, no 'cuteness,' and not controversial enough to warrant high indignation on our part, a state to which we're accustomed and which therefore is healthful for us."

### All bark and no bite

Moyse died in June 1973 at the age of 75, weeks after being selected as an International Bridge Press Association Honorary Member, the first American to receive the honor.

*The Bridge World*, in an obituary and tribute to Moyse, praised the former editor and reminisced over his choleric disposition:

"After retiring, he kept his eagle eye on us. Only recently he called up in high dudgeon (and his was the highest dudgeon of any man we knew): 'You're letting the magazine go to the dogs!' --- he had detected a fused participle, a grammatical form he detested.

"Sonny had a hot temper, and his rages were magnificent. But it was like a violent tropical storm --- over in an instant with bright sunshine to follow. He roared at everyone and no one ever minded, for he was all bark and no bite --- there was not a drop of malice in him."

## Peter Pender

There are those rare individuals who are talented at everything they do, whose every endeavor seems to meet with success. Peter Pender was such an individual, and his accomplishments as a bridge player are celebrated by his induction into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame. Yet bridge was just one of the many facets of Pender's career.

Pender attended Harvard and was an accomplished pianist. He was also a highly skilled figure skater who qualified to compete in national singles events four times and national pairs twice.

### Champion figure skater

He was a gold medalist for both the United States and Canadian Figure Skating Associations.

Skating competitions took him frequently to Montreal, where he encountered the Canadian bridge elite of the late Fifties. It was there that Pender would meet future bridge partner Hugh Ross.

In 1960, Pender moved to San Francisco. He successfully owned and operated an exclusive resort, Fifes, located on the Russian River in the Bay area.

Pender's talents also, of course, encompassed bridge. He became Life Master #1795 at the age of 22. He won the 1966 McKenney Trophy (now the *Barry Crane Top 500*) and in the same year helped England's Jeremy Flint become an ACBL Life Master in 11 weeks, a record at the time.

Pender tallied 13 NABC wins: five in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams (1968, 1970, 1981, 1985 and 1986); two in the Life Master Men's Pairs (1967 and 1984); four in the Grand National Teams (1982, 1983, 1985 and 1987) and two in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams (1984 and 1987).

Pender was a member of the victorious U.S. squad in the 1985 NEC Bermuda Bowl in Sao Paulo, Brazil, and second in the 1989 Bermuda Bowl in Perth, Australia. He was second in the 1982 Rosenblum Teams and won the Pan-American Invitational Pairs in 1974 and 1975.

Pender and Ross formed their now-famous partnership in 1981. The pair, playing with teammates Lew Stansby and Chip Martel, were arguably the most powerful squad in the world during the Eighties.

### A team without rancor

After winning the 1981 Reisinger, Pender offered this comment about the success of the foursome: "I think one of the reasons why our whole team did so well was because there is no rancor within the pairs or the team."

Pender continued to perform well in high-level competition through the late Eighties, despite battling the effects of HIV infection, the virus that causes AIDS.

Ross, in a posthumous tribute to his partner in 1990, said, "In the last four years, when he was constantly enduring pain, nausea and fatigue, he never gave up."

Pender was so ill during part of 1987 that he was unable to attend the Bermuda Bowl in Ocho Rios, Jamaica. Mike Lawrence filled in for the ailing Pender. The U.S. defeated Great Britain for the championship.

Pender recovered and succeeded in qualifying for the 1989 Bermuda Bowl held in Perth, Australia. His planned trip to Perth became controversial, however, when the Australian government initially refused to grant Pender a visa because of his HIV status. The decision was later rescinded following public outcry over the policy.

Pender finally succumbed to effects of the illness in November of 1990. In early 1991, it was announced that Pender had bequeathed \$2.26 million to the American Foundation for AIDS Research, the largest donation ever received by the organization.

who now represents District 16 on the ACBL Board of Directors.

He also remembers Gerber, an early riser, sitting in the hotel lobby at NABCs "willing to give advice. He was better at giving advice rather taking it."

Morse, who has enjoyed considerable success as a non-playing captain, notes that Gerber was npc of North American teams in Bermuda Bowl competition in 1962, 1963 and 1965. In New York in 1962, he split the partnerships of Bobby Nail-Mervyn Key and Lew Mathe-Ron Von der Porten, putting Mathe and Nail together as partners in an unusual move that worked well and almost captured the title.

Gerber, says Morse, "believed in good card play rather than long-established partnerships."

The next year in St. Vincent, Italy, he broke up another long-established partnership, pairing Nail with Howard Schenken and benching Jim Jacoby and Peter Leventritt. This move was not successful and may have cost the Americans the championship.

### 1965 cheating incident

The championship began with an incident that occurred when Gerber arrived at the Grand Hotel Bilia. An anonymous letter, written in Italian, was delivered to him.

He secured a translator but after the first paragraph was read, he asked the translator to stop; to deliver the letter to Italy's captain, Carl' Alberto Perroux, and to explain that Gerber had listened only to the first paragraph. The writer had accused the Blue Team of cheating.

Perroux, after reading the letter to his team, suggested that the match be played with screens running across the tables (this was 12 years before present-day screens were used), but Gerber refused.

The exchange inspired Perroux and his team to present their championship trophies to Gerber and the American team in an unprecedented gesture of goodwill. Perroux, speaking of Gerber, said, "They (the Americans) have discovered a great captain."

Gerber returned as North America's npc for the next Bermuda Bowl in 1965 in Buenos Aires, the scene of another controversy. Two members of the American team brought cheating charges against a British partnership. Gerber spent 10 minutes in the grandstand watching the pair, who were accused of using finger signals to tell each other how many hearts were held.

The 10 minutes were enough to convince Gerber, and he became one of the strongest witnesses against the pair when the World Bridge Federation suspended them.

My favorite hands of the tournament so far came up in our losing effort in the Vanderbilt.

(1) Semi-forcing

West led the ♠4 in an attempt to protect his heart holding. East won the king and returned the ♦6. West took the ace to shift to the ♥2. This seems like an unusual shift, but it's hard to see how West could have beaten the hand in any case. I played low from dummy, and when the 9 held I was playing for overtricks. I played the ♠9 to the queen, East ducking and West pitching a heart. I led a club to the king and then dummy's last spade, East winning the ace while West pitched a diamond.

East returned a diamond which I ruffed, and when I drew the last trump West had to pitch his next-to-last diamond while I threw a club from the dummy. I cashed the ♣A to extract West's remaining club and led a heart toward dummy in this position.

Had West ducked I'd have won dummy's 10, cashed the king, and perforce played a diamond, using West's ♦Q as a "steppingstone" to score my ♥A. West could see this coming so he split his hearts. This

didn't help -- I now led the ♦8 from dummy and West could choose whether to give the last two tricks to dummy or to the closed hand!

This kind of position has no doubt been noted before, but in case it hasn't I hereby christen it the "Steppingstone with a twist!"

Next try a play problem. I like this one because while we dealt it at the table, it could appear as is in a lesson book.

I reasoned that East was a favorite to hold the ♠J and that if he did I was cold. I ducked a club to East who returned another trump which I won in dummy. Now I led a low spade and after winning the jack (I'd make four if he ducked) East had no effective counter. If he switched to diamonds I could ruff both of my remaining clubs. Instead he led his last trump so I conceded a trick to the ♠K and claimed the remainder.

# Vancouver invites players "Under the Sails"

The next North American Bridge Championship in the West will be held one year from now in Vancouver BC. It will be right downtown, on the waterfront, at the Vancouver Trade & Convention Centre -- the building "Under the Sails."

The Centre was originally the Canada Pavillion at Expo 1986 and is now the main terminal for cruises to Alaska during the summer.

The two main host hotels will be the adjacent Pan Pacific Hotel and the Waterfront Centre Hotel across the street (the latter will be used for some bridge events). Rates, especially when converted to U.S. dollars, will be very attractive for this class of hotel. Alternative accommodations will also be available. Exchange rates vary but at the moment the Canadian dollar is worth about 0.70 \$U.S.

Vancouver is one of North America's most attractive cities, especially in the spring when it is ablaze with blossoms and flowers. Within walking distance, or a short ride by taxi or Skytrain, are restaurants catering to every taste and pocketbook, two major theaters, a concert hall and General Motors Place -- home of the NHL Canucks and NBA Grizzlies.

We are planning to schedule bridge such that some days, even if not a Senior, you'll be able to play two sessions and have the evening free to enjoy our city.

For those who wish to combine bridge with other activities, consider these options: In Vancouver, you have the chance to golf and ski on the same day. There are three ski hills on the North Shore Mountains, just a half hour or so from downtown. Depending on the amount of accumulated snow, these may or may not still be operating by mid-March, but if not, Whistler-Blackcomb, about two hours north on the spectacular Sea-to-Sky Highway, stays open into May.

Golf is almost a year-round activity and there are

(you don't have to ski) and Victoria, our charming Provincial Capital. (By the way, Victoria is hosting a Regional next month, April 13-19, that is well worth attending).

So, come for the bridge, but take time to enjoy what makes Vancouver so popular with all our visitors. See you next year!

Remember Phil Wood? Of course you do! Especially if you live in the Northwest. He's the guy who used to run all your regionals and most of your sectionals. **The Facts:** There was an agreed break in tempo before West bid 6♠. The Director was called when East bid 7♠. He ruled that the break in tempo demonstrably suggested interest in bidding on, and that pass was a logical alternative for East. The contract was changed to 6♠, making seven for E/W +1010.

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed. They first stated there was no hesitation, but West admitted she did take a moment to count the kings before bidding 6♠.

**The Decision:** The Committee decided the final contract would be 6♠, making seven for E/W +1010. E/W were relatively inexperienced, and West stated he had to show his kings before he could bid 7♠. The Committee determined there was a break in tempo, and that the break demonstrably suggested interest in bidding a grand slam. Pass was a logical alternative for East, as he did not bid a grand slam at his previous turn. The play in either contract would be the same, so the Committee could determine the number of tricks East would take.

**The Appeal:** N/S appealed. They stated the explanation was correct as far as South knew at that time.

**The Decision:** The Committee decided the table result would stand. Law 40C states if "a side has been damaged through its opponents' failure to explain the full meaning of a call or play, [the director] may award an adjusted score." Even if South's explanation of the cuebid was not complete, E/W created their own problem. East could not have spade support, or he would have doubled North's 2♠ cuebid. West had to know that either North or East had some heart length. Finally, either East or West could have asked another question if they were not certain what the cuebid showed.

RAPEE went into the final quarter trailing by 16, 94-78. On the very first board they picked up 11 IMPs when Eisenberg preempted to four spades. Passell reopened with a double, and CAYNE wound up playing five hearts doubled, down one. At the other table, Berkowitz preempted only to three spades, and the Icelanders bought the deal for four hearts, making.

RAPEE actually went ahead on the next deal when the Icelanders made three notrump while Arnold and Eisenberg managed to buy the contract for three spades, down four for a 9-IMP pickup. They increased their lead to 16 two boards later when Arnold made his notrump game while Cohen suffered a one-trick defeat.

Over the next seven boards the teams broke about even, but CAYNE made a major gain on Board 60. Cohen and Berkowitz managed to buy the hand for two hearts after a very weak notrump opening bid. This contract went down only one trick. Arnold passed in first seat at the other table, so Passell and Seamon got into the action, arriving in a spade game that made for an 11-IMP pickup.

CAYNE pulled within a single IMP on Board 63, the next-to-last board. RAPEE got to game in both rooms, going down one each time for a 4-IMP loss. And then came that fateful Board 64.

*Probationary Swami has agreed to a leave of absence without pay beginning at the conclusion of the 1998 Vanderbilt and extending until the be-*

*ginning of the 1998 Spingold in Chicago. In return the League agrees to seal the results of the Swami's DNA test indefinitely. This matter will be reviewed by the ACBL Board of Directors at their Fall meeting in Orlando.*

#1 Schwartz v. #4 Robinson. The Horse made the Swami look like good by jumping on the emotionally drained Little People early — but the predicted rally by the Little People never came to be as Schwartz, with four defenders from the 97 Vanderbilt, Horse-Canyon and GoldWay, joined by Mutt 'n Jeff, steamrolled into the Finals. For the second time in two days, four-handed takes its toll, as the Little People containing TLA-Boyd, also 1997 Vanderbilt champions, fall short.

#2 Rapee v. #3 Cayne. If it had been only a 63-board match, the Swami would have been canonized for having exactly predicted a 1-imp Rapee victory. However, despite Swami's best efforts, the last board was played and Cayne escaped by 2. Good show, Broadway Billy, Miami Russ, Hopper, Grand Old Man, and Icelanders. The President and Chuckles earned this victory for Cayne. The legend of George Rapee grows larger.

Can the Mikes and Berk-Cohen pay back their teamies for new life in the finals against the red-hot Schwartz team? Look at the quarter if Cayne does not have a big lead, the pressure of the last board semifinal victory will lead quickly to a 7-length Schwartz runaway. GoldWay sent their jerseys to Memphis to be held for eventual Hall of Fame induction, retiring from national competition with back-to-back Vanderbilt Cups. The President and Chuckles get their umpteenth second of the last five years, as Schwartz beats the emotionally drained Cayne by 23.

the other member of the foursome, attempted to resuscitate Steve, but it was impossible. As they called 911 for help, they also found a doctor on the course. The doctor checked Steve and told his friends that there was nothing that could be done.

Steve had had some problems with his heart and with his breathing, but it had not been considered life threatening. However, on more than one occasion Steve said, "I've got a bad heart. I don't know when I'm going."

Steve was a Diamond Life Master with one North American championship to his credit -- he won the National Mixed Pairs with Ann Fizer of Houston. He also won the national Non-Master Pairs with Roger Sarfaty back when he first started playing bridge.

The Greenbergs moved frequently over the years. Wherever they lived, Steve set up partnerships with some of the best players in the area. For the past couple of years he was been a regular on OKbridge, partnered most often by Shirley Lazarus.

His one goal in life was to win one of the big ones -- maybe the Spingold or the Vanderbilt. He actually made a good start in the National Senior Ribbon Pairs here -- he was second with Carl Keller after the first qualifying session. But it was downhill after that.

The delight of his life for the past couple of years has been his two-year-old grandson, Branch Yarbrow, who lives with the Greenbergs along with his mother and father. Steve had been teaching Branch to play golf. He even had a custom-made putter and driver made for the youngster.

He has two other grandsons -- Ethan 7 and Evan 4 -- in Oklahoma City. Steve was in Oklahoma City for about six months recently and was able to spend a good deal of time with his grandsons. Guess what he did for them? That's right, he had golf clubs custom-made for them as well.

"Steve didn't have a clue how many people were crazy about him," said Julie. "He was the kindest, most soft-hearted person I ever knew. Sometimes his temper got the best of him when the incredible pain he suffered for 10 years got the better of him. But he'd just blow off steam for a few minutes and he'd be back to loving everybody."

"It was always fun to be with him. He lightened the tough moments with his humor. He used to make up songs on the spur of the moment, and everyone would get a good laugh from his compositions."

"Steve was one of the most interesting and memorable people I ever met," said Roy Green, CEO of ACBL. "And he was an absolutely great card player. He was a good friend whom I will miss sorely."

Debby Boyd of Germantown, one of his closest friends in the Memphis area, said, "He loved the game and he loved the people who play it. I don't think there was a more ethical player in the game. Despite the severe pain that was a constant companion, he went right on doing things with and for the people he loved. He was the most loyal friend in the world. He lived for his family and friends."

Pat Slate of Germantown "never knew a man with such a golden heart. He truly was a wonderful and loyal friend."

"He was very special to me," said Dorthy Francis of Memphis, a regular partner for many years. "There never was a kinder, more warm-spirited person than Steve."

In addition to his wife and grandchildren, he leaves a son, Bradley, and three daughters, Leslie, Tracey and Stacey.

Funeral services will take place tomorrow at 1 p.m. at the Memphis Funeral Home.

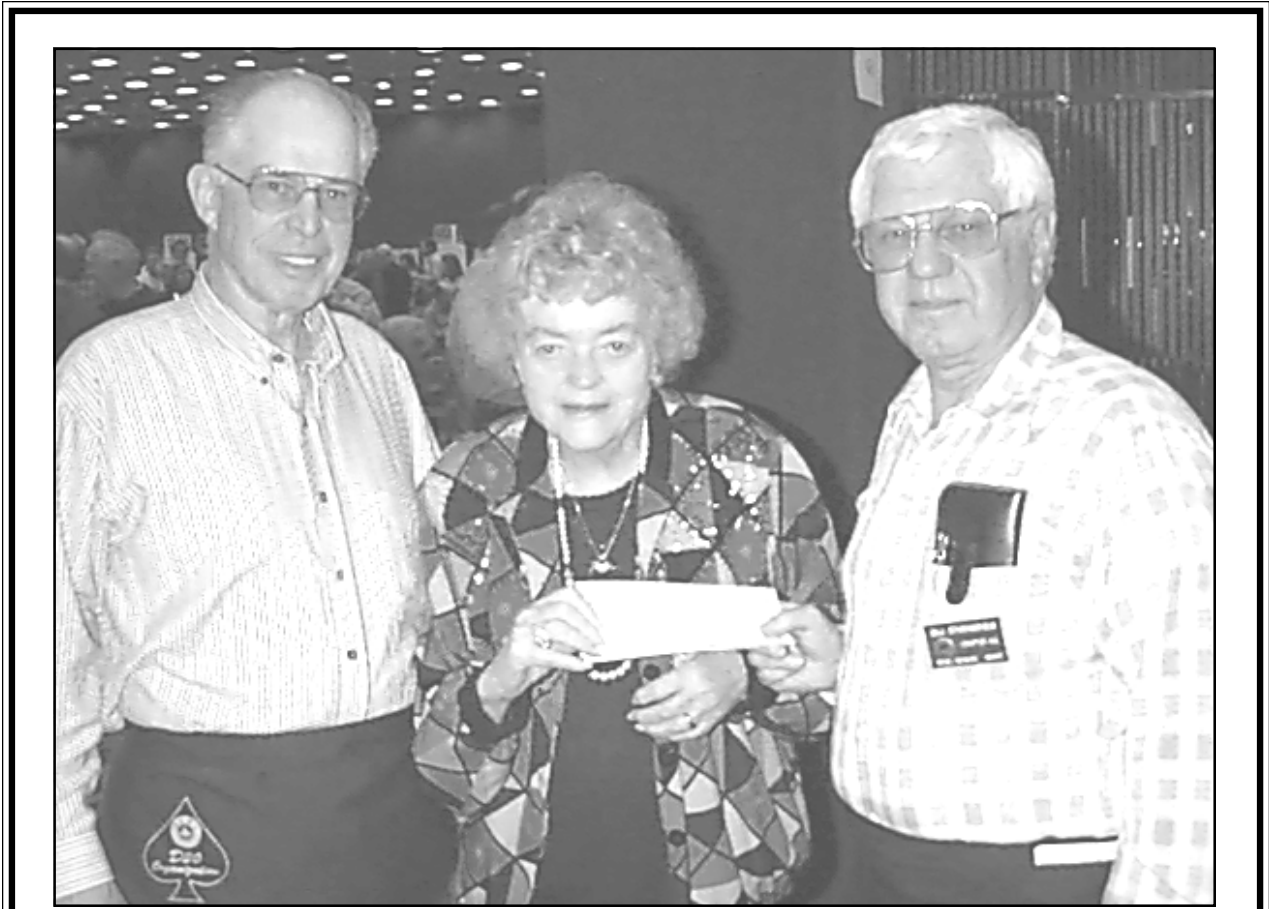
