Last-round rally propels Women's BAM champions

Four women from the Bay Area, one of them suffering with bronchitis, came from behind on the last round to win the Women's Board-a-Match Teams by .23 points.

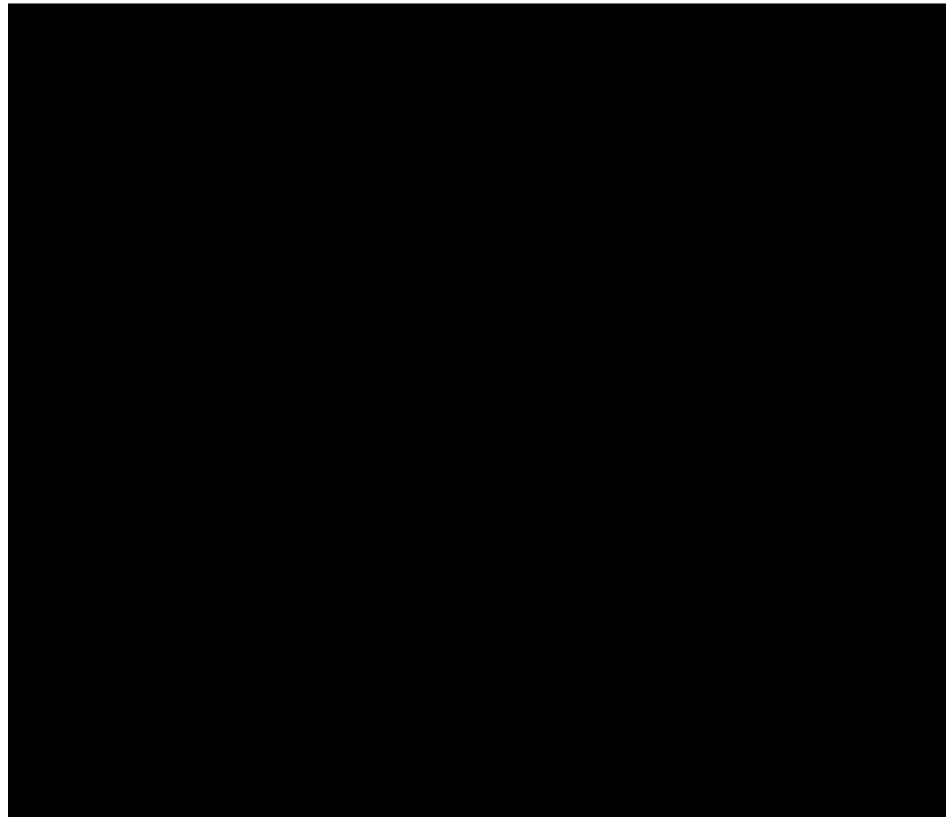
The winners are Sherie Greenberg, Palo Alto; Jyme Schmieder, Saratoga, and Fran Dickman and Diane Shannon, San Jose.

They finished with a score of 35.73

to 35.50 for the team that led going into the final round: Joann Glasson, Pennington NJ; Jo Ann Sprung, Philadelphia; Sue Picus, New York, and JoAnna Stansby, Castro Valley CA.

In third, .45 out of second, were Laurie Vogel and Gail Greenberg, New York; Jill Blanchard, Riverdale NY, and Rozanne Pollack, Warren NJ.

Baldwin quintet runs away with Open BAM

A five-man team captained by Robert Baldwin of Las Vegas took the lead after the first final session of the Open Board-a-Match Teams and stormed to victory by more than five boards.

Baldwin, president of the Mirage Hotel in Las Vegas, was playing with Robert Levin, Orlando; Peter Weichsel, Encinitas CA, and Zia and Michael Rosenberg of New York.

Their final score was 39.06. In second, with 34.04, were a foursome from England -- David Mossop and Paul Hackett of London, and Jason and Justin Hackett of Manchester.

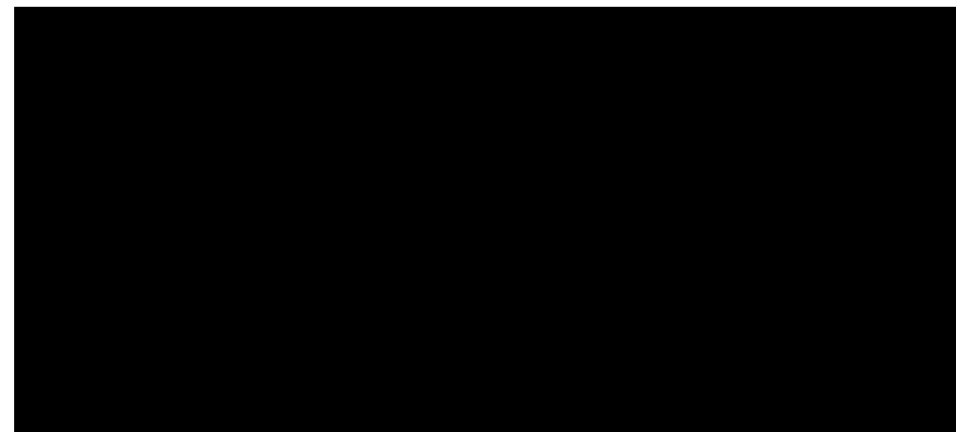
In third, just .03 behind the Mossop

team, were John Russell, South Barrington IL; Howard Pilch, Andover MA; Andrew Chesterton, Lexington MA, and Rob Crawford, Fort Lauderdale FL.

The Baldwin team's win was a strong effort for a squad which trailed at the halfway point by two and a half boards.

The victory represents Baldwin's first North American championship. A longtime bridge player, he met Levin about 20 years ago at a tournament. For the past year and a half, the two have been playing together on the Internet.

Berkowitz-Cohen: first back-to-back winners in Blue Ribbon Pairs?

No pair has ever scored back-to-back victories in the Blue Ribbon Pairs, but considering the record compiled by David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen at the last three NABCs, this may be the time.

Berkowitz-Cohen won the Blue Ribbon Pairs in Atlanta last fall, the Open Pairs II at the Spring NABC in Philadelphia and the six-session Life Master Pairs at the Summer NABC in Miami Beach.

Cohen, for one, isn't predicting a win. "I don't think any pair can ever enter this event and have more than a one-in-ten chance," he said.

"There's so much luck involved," he added. "You have to be leading at the time they decide there are no more boards."

The Blue Ribbon Pairs is played over three days and includes two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and two final sessions.

Entry is restricted to winners and runners-up in regional championships -- plus high finishers in North American championships, members of current Grand National district championship teams, members of current official teams representing ACBL and the top 100 lifetime masterpoint holders.

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy, awarded for the National Open Pair Championship and donated by the Cavendish Club of New York in 1928. Since 1963, the trophy has been awarded to winners of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Dorothy Truscott and B. Jay Becker won the inaugural event in 1963 -- and Truscott remains the only woman winner.

Bob Hamman has four wins, each with a different partner: Lew Mathe in 1964, Ron Von der Porten in 1986, Nick Nickell in 1991 and Michael Rosenberg in 1993.

Larry Cohen also has four wins: with Ron Gerard in 1981, with Marty Bergen in 1983 and 1988 and

with Berkowitz last year.

Kit Woolsey has three wins: with Steve Robinson in 1973 and 1975 and with Ed Manfield at San Francisco's last fall NABC in 1990.

In the 32-year history of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, there has been only one tie: in 1984, Jack Kennedy and Bobby Wolff tied with David Funk and Mark Lair.

Lair waited another 10 years before claiming his second title in 1994 with first-time partner Alexander Weiland.

Board 17 made him think back to 1990 -- the last time San Francisco hosted an NABC -- when he came across two "intra-finesse" situations, diagnosed both of them and blotted out the opponents' honors. Dawson, of Oakland, played with Dick Walker of Emeryville.

North got off to the imaginative lead of the ♠2, ducked by Dawson to South's 7. South returned a spade to dummy's ace, and Dawson began to experience *deja vu* as he eyed the diamond holding between his hand and dummy. "It was just like 1990," Dawson said.

In dummy with the spade ace, Dawson played a low diamond toward his hand. South popped up with the king and fired back a spade to dummy's king. Dawson, convinced that fate had dealt him another intra-finesse, played the deal wide open. He cashed ♣K and the ♥K, then played a heart to his hand and cashed the ♣A. Then came the test. He put the ♦J on the table -- low, low. . .10. Bingo! The next diamond picked up the queen and Dawson had 10 tricks and a fine score for plus 430.

"The only reason I played it that way was because of 1990," Dawson said.

No double? No trouble

The leaders in the Women's Board-a-Match Teams after two qualifying sessions were Joann Glasson, Pennington NJ; Jo Ann Sprung, Philadelphia; JoAnna Stansby, Castro Valley, and Sue Picus, New York. Picus's middle name is Jean, and the team briefly considered having her change it for the event.

Having dismissed that thought, the team got down to some serious bridge and forged a board-and-a-half lead going into Monday's play. They outdid themselves on this deal from the second qualifying session.

North became declarer at 4♠ at both tables. At one table, Picus (East) doubled and led a club. Stansby took the ♣Q and ♣A and switched to a heart, giving declarer no chance.

At the other table, Glasson played 4♠ undoubled, also with a club lead, but West, after taking the ♣Q and ♣A, switched to a diamond. Glasson took full advantage of the mistake.

She won the ♦A and played a spade to dummy's jack, getting the news about the 5-0 trump split when West showed out. Unruffled, Glasson continued with two more high diamonds and the good ♣J before playing a fourth round of diamonds. East ruffed in and was overruffed in dummy.

Glasson then played a low spade to her queen and East's ace. This was the position as East realized the defense had run out of ammunition:

East opened 1NT and South doubled. North of course Alerted. When asked for an explanation, North said, "That bid shows a one-suiter -- probably not spades."

No, he was not offering any unauthorized information. He and his partner were playing DONT in which the overcall of 2♠ is reserved for a spade one-suiter. So naturally South's long suit shouldn't be spades.

Question of priorities

Fit to be tied

Down three in a freely bid game usually doesn't feel like a good result, especially when an opponent has made a tricky opening lead you didn't work out. Thus, Paul Soloway was happy to end up with a push on this deal from the second qualifying session of the Open Board-a-Match Teams.

Soloway and Bobby Goldman played against Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell. The deal was reported by Art Desmond of Houston.

Meckstroth hit on the diabolical opening lead of a low spade and Soloway, hoping for some luck, played low from dummy. Rodwell won the ♠10 and shot back a club. Soloway misguessed by playing the king, and Meckstroth won the ace to return the ♠8. Soloway put in the jack, losing to the queen, and then saw Rodwell cash the ♣Q and return a spade to Meckstroth's ace. The defenders still had the ♦A coming, so Soloway finished at minus 150 in the pushy game and was pretty sure the board was a lost cause.

He was surprised, therefore, to find that teammates Mark Lair and Richard Schwartz were plus 150 on the deal despite defending a different contract. At the other table, North became declarer at 3NT and misguessed on the lead of a low club from East. The defenders took five clubs and two aces for their own plus 150 and a push -- the hard way.

All fouled up

On some deals, even if you're a world champion, you're just not destined for glory. That happened on this deal from the second final session of the Open Board-a-Match Teams -- and John Russell of South Barrington IL was right there to take advantage. Russell was playing with Rob Crawford of Fort Lauderdale FL against a pair of former world champions.

West knew little about the deal except that South had a pretty good hand -- and partner preferred clubs to hearts.

Thus West got the defense off to the wrong start with the ♠10 lead. Declarer won the ♣Q, cashed the ace and ruffed a club in dummy. Next he played a low diamond to his queen and West's ace. West had a chance to defeat the contract by playing another diamond to East's 10 so that East could make the killing heart switch, but West got out with the ♥K to 2, 10 and ace.

Russell then played a spade to dummy's queen and a low spade toward his hand. East split his spade honors and Russell won the ace. Next he played a low diamond from his hand, putting in dummy's jack. East won the ♦K and continued with the ♥9. Russell played low, and the blockage in hearts kept the defenders from cashing two tricks in that suit immediately. East had no choice but to continue with the ♦10 -- a spade play would be into Russell's tenace -- but Russell ruffed and exited with the ♥J, leaving West on play at trick 11 with the fourth and last trick for the defense. Russell held the ♠K 7, East the ♠10 5. That was plus 140 and a clear win on the board.

Bridge-playing family

We received an impassioned call from Mimi Waugh of Santa Barbara, winner of Sunday's Flight B Swiss Teams. The problem was that the wrong Waugh was listed as a member of the team.

It was not difficult to get this straightened out, but then we got talking with Mimi. Over the weekend, all of her sisters were here with her playing bridge. Catty Beyhan of Tulsa, a Life Master like Mimi, is still here, but the other sisters have returned home to Tulsa. They are Sally Jordan and Mimi's twin Betty Wills.

No question about it -- this is a bridge-playing family.

Mildred White, their mother, was an avid player -- many times over a Life Master. She actually won a big regional event just two days before she died.

Their dad, Carl White Jr., was more into football than bridge, but he loved a good game of bridge. While he was in high school he played under the legendary Knute Rockne. He played for Yale and was an honorable mention as an All-American center.

"Dad wanted a football player, and all he got was a bridge team -- four daughters," said Mimi. "Mother and Dad got us all playing bridge by the time we were nine years old. Catty and I continued on playing, but Sally and Betty only recently have started to take up the game again."



This is the first NABC Mimi has played in for 30 years -- "raising a family and other activities took up my time," she said.

John Mohan's redouble was a muddying action - ordinarily it means that he has only three-card support. His subsequent 3♥ bid showed that he had good heart support, but Kay Schulle-Mohan, with a reasonably square hand, decided to go for notrump.

Dave Smith led a low diamond, and Kay guessed correctly, winning the 10. Hearts looked like a good source of tricks so Kay finessed the jack -- successfully! Not only did Richard Oshlag not win the trick - he falsecarded with the 8.

Look at the situation from Kay's point of view. It appeared that South had the ♥K, and Oshlag had dropped the 8. It seemed likely that Oshlag had the 10-8 and Smith the K-5-3.

So Kay, thinking it more likely that Oshlag had longer clubs, led the ♣Q. Oshlag won the ace and cleared the diamond suit. Kay led the ♥Q, hoping to pin the 10, and was very disappointed when this lost to the king. She was even unhappier to note that South had not followed suit, so she was going to be able to take only two heart tricks.

If Oshlag had won the first round of hearts, Kay would have discovered the situation by playing the ♥A. Then she could have finessed the ♥9 for a third heart trick.

Not only that, but the diamonds had been cleared. She had no alternative at this point -- she had to cash out for down two.

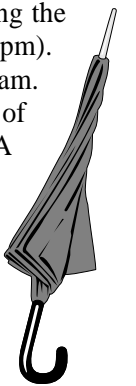
Travelers to explain long-term care plan

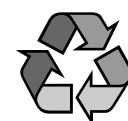

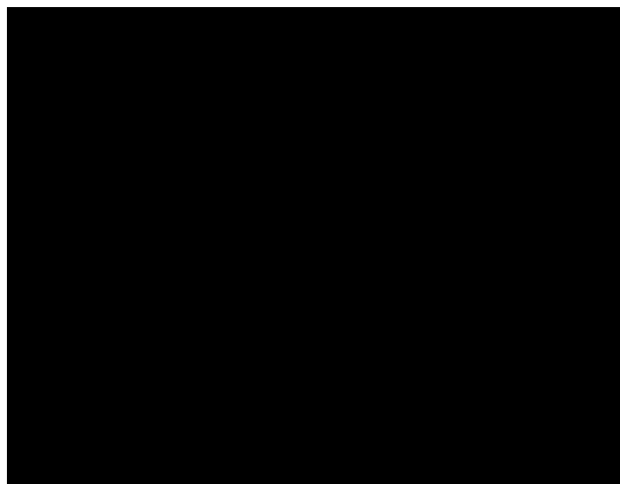
New players are active

There's going to be lots of action. In addition to the casino games, there will be a raffle and a silent auction.

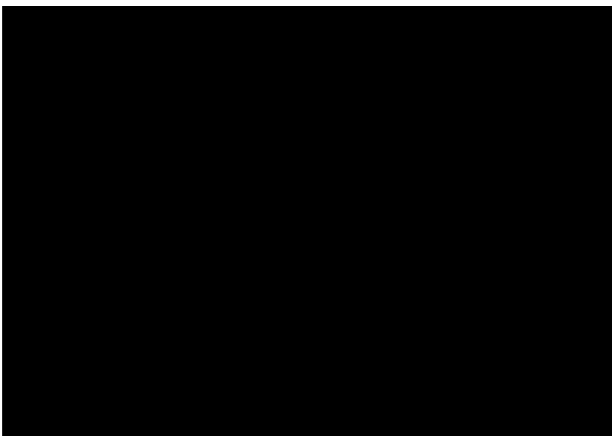
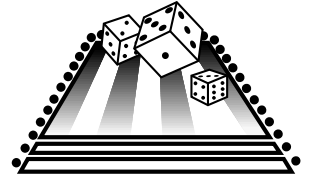

Players donate their ACBL Bulletins to the unit. We tape schedules to the Bulletin and donate them to various professional waiting rooms around Reno. This is another example of a Dick Shaver idea put into practice.

Journalist scoops up brilliancy prize -- not!

It's the Swiss teams, round seven, and are chugging along in the middle of the field. The current match is going exceedingly well -- so well, in fact, that you can afford to experiment in search of that ever-elusive brilliancy prize.

You pick up

♠ K 10 8 7 4 ♥ K 6 ♦ A 4 3 ♣ 9 5 2

and pass in first seat with no one vulnerable. You heart the opponents reach 4♥ on the following auction:

All Pass

You lead the ♦A to see

♠ A Q 6

♥ 9 7 2

♦ J 8 7 5

♣ 10 7 4

Everyone follows and you play a second diamond. Declarer ruffs and starts thinking. You build up a picture of declarer's hand, perhaps

♠ J x x ♥ A Q J x x ♦ x ♣ A K J x.

Declarer will take a spade finesse, then play a heart to the queen. If you duck, declarer will use his remaining entry to dummy to repeat the heart finesse.

Now you win, cash your spade and exit with a diamond. Declarer must lose a club at the end. If you win the first heart, declarer can use his remaining entry to take the club finesse and will come home.

Your mind is made up: declarer takes the spade finesse and plays a heart to the queen. You duck, declarer shrugs his shoulders, lays down the ♥A, dropping partner's jack, and gives up a spade and a club for his contract. The full deal:

You consider blaming partner for not putting in the ♥J on the first round (or even for opening a weak 2♦), but you don't quite have the nerve. All you can manage is, "Sorry."

Partner, quoting Victor Mollo, says, "Maybe if you didn't try to be so clever you wouldn't end up looking so stupid."

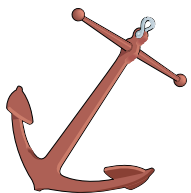
49er Pairs win points, prizes

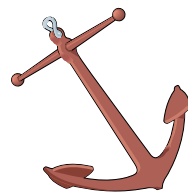

This deal defeated all but one of the East-West pairs. The key is that East's ♠Q was worth a whole trick so his two diamonds could be discarded on West's top spades.

Most Easts heard their partners make a bid to show a raise in hearts after South had overcalled in spades, and most of them quickly jumped to game.

Pat Collins hit the jackpot by making a trial bid of 3♣. When Derek Patterson cuebid in spades he showed a diamond control in return, and Patterson cuebid in spades again. Now that he knew his ♠Q was working he could use Blackwood and bid slam. This won 13 IMPs for his team.

Resolutions

These Resolutions first appeared in Tom Stoddard's *Bridge Forum* in 1938. They are certainly in keeping with the modern spirit of bridge.

Resolved:

➤ That I will at all times be courteous to partner and opponents alike.

➤ That I will make certain that all players at each table are acquainted.

➤ That I will not take unfair advantage of opponents.

➤ That I will not hold up a game through post mortem discussion to the inconvenience of other players.

➤ That I will not appear at any club without the requisites necessary of neatness and cleanliness.

➤ That I will give the tournament director my full cooperation in all matters under his jurisdiction.

Lights, Please

At one point during the World Championships in Rhodes, Greece, there was a total power failure. Suddenly the vugraph room was in total blackness -- and so were all the playing areas. The power came on intermittently for a while after that, but there were several more short blackouts. Eventually all the games finished, but the vugraph never came back on again. Everyone had to wait until the match was over to learn whether the slam that was on the screen actually was made or went down.

That power failure reminded me of an incident at the European Championships at Ostend, Belgium in 1965.

The setting was the Grand Casino Ballroom. Spectators were allowed at the tables. Screens were unknown. The Belgian organizers had provided a recorder at each table -- mostly nice little old ladies -- who made notes not only of the bids but also of the play.

Switzerland against Italy: Seated around the table were Jean Besse and Pietro Bernasconi (the world's premier problem maker), and Giorgio Belladonna playing with Mondolfo.

The bidding just ended with four hearts, all pass, when the lights went out.

Complete darkness, a moment's silence, then West said: "I lead the spade ten".

"OK" said declarer, "what's your hand, partner?"

Dummy rattled off his cards, then play proceeded with the players naming the cards to each trick, ignoring the protests from the otherwise so friendly scorer: "Please, you can't do that, you can't do that!"

Yes, the contract was made.

Picture pretty

One of the marks of an expert is the ability to picture the opponents' hands so as to make a plan -- as declarer or defender. Larry Cohen, late of Little Falls NJ but now a resident of Boca Raton FL, proved on this deal from the first qualifying session of the Life Master Open Pairs that he knows how to handle the tough situations. Cohen was playing with Gerald Sosler of Purchase NY.

Although the two hands combine for 25 high-card points, the mirror distribution and the bad break in trumps makes 4♥ a rather forlorn contract. In fact, minus 200 and 300 were not uncommon results on the deal.

Cohen, however, managed to bring home 10 tricks.

South started with the ♠Q, taken by Cohen in hand with the king. He played a heart to dummy's jack, and North won the king, missing an opportunity to duck and make things more difficult for Cohen.

Back came the ♠10 to dummy's ace, and when Cohen cashed the ♥A, South pitched the ♠6. This was revealing to Cohen in several ways.

First, Cohen figured South started with five spades. South would hardly have discarded from a four-card suit, taking a chance that Cohen had four. So Cohen placed South with five spades to go with his singleton heart.

Based on South's pass over Cohen's 1♥ bid, Cohen figured South had little in high cards outside spades -- and he figured it was also unlikely that South was 5-5 in spades and another suit, or he might have entered the auction even light in high card points.

Cohen's picture of the South hand was formed, and he guessed that South's pattern was 5-1-4-3.

Backing his judgment, Cohen played a club from dummy, inserting the king when North played the 9. Now came a key play -- the ♣7, covered by the 8 and ducked in dummy. North won the ace perforce, and that was it for the defense.

If North, down to all red cards, switched to a diamond, Cohen had an easy play for his 10th trick -- he knew that South did not have the ♦K (he would have overcalled 1♠ at his first chance if he did). A heart exit was also futile, but in a much more complex scenario.

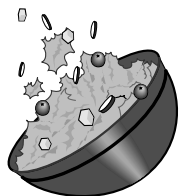
On a heart exit, Cohen would win in hand with the 9 and cash the queen, forcing discards from South. Cohen would then lead the ♠10 to dummy and, because of his foresight in playing the ♣7 earlier, cash the ♠6, remaining in dummy. In the three-card ending, if South retained one spade and the ♦J 6, Cohen could stick South in with a spade, forcing him to lead a diamond away from his jack. If South retained two spades, blanking his ♦J, Cohen could play the ♦Q from dummy and pick up that suit for no losers.

6396 tables so far

San Francisco 1997 is still on track to top San Francisco 1990 as the biggest San Francisco NABC ever. The total here to date is 6396 tables, compared to 5667 six years ago.

That may seem to be a huge margin -- but it really isn't. Attendance always drops at Thanksgiving time, so Wednesday and Thursday probably will see a major falloff. But six years ago Thanksgiving did not fall in the middle of the tournament, so the table totals stayed strong throughout the week. The 1990 grand total was 13,239 tables.

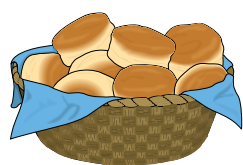

Among them, Baldwin's teammates have four firsts and three seconds in world championship play - and dozens of North American championships.

Levin remains the youngest player ever to win the Bermuda Bowl, which he did in 1981 at the age of 23. He has more than a dozen North American championships.

Weichsel won the Bermuda Bowl in 1983 and the World Mixed Pairs in 1990. Weichsel now has 19 North American championships, including five wins in the Spingold Knockout Teams.

Rosenberg was a member of the winning squad in the Rosenblum Knockout Teams at the World Bridge Championships in Albuquerque in 1994, and he has a second in the World Team Olympiad in 1992. He was ACBL's *Player of the Year* in 1994 as the winner of the most masterpoints in national events during the calendar year. His eight North American championships include this year's Vanderbilt Knockout Teams.

Zia, the globe-trotting superstar who has represented his native Pakistan many times in international competition, was the 1991 *Player of the Year*. He was second in the Bermuda Bowl in 1981 and in the Rosenblum KO in 1986, both times representing Pakistan. He was a member of the winning 1996 Vanderbilt squad. □

Schmieder was second in the Master Mixed Teams at the 1985 Summer NABC in Las Vegas, and Greenberg has a fifth-place finish in the event. 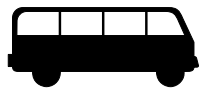
Schmieder and Dickman are former school teachers, and Shannon works as a realtor. Greenberg, team captain, does a lot of bridge teaching.

The Facts: The opening lead was the ♦9, after which 6♥ made six, plus 980 for E/W. Everyone agreed there had been a break in tempo before East doubled 5♠. The Director ruled (Law 16) that East's break in tempo was unauthorized information and that pass by West was a logical alternative. The Director canceled the 6♥ bid and changed the contract (Law 12) to 5♠ doubled, down four, plus 800 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. West told the Committee that she was going to bid 6♥ whether her partner doubled in tempo, doubled slowly, or passed, because she thought there was a good chance that N/S could make 5♠. N/S stated that they thought pass was a logical alternative because West had a defensive trick, was short in clubs, and the quality of the heart suit was poor.

When the Committee inquired about the break in tempo, all four players agreed that it had been 25-30 seconds.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided that the admitted lengthy hesitation before the double of 5♠ could well have suggested that a 6♥ bid might be more successful than passing. West could not know that East's hand was as strong as it actually was since East had merely made a support double at the one-level. West on her own quite normally bid 5♥ at her next turn based on distributional values rather than high-card values.

The Committee rejected as self-serving West's statements about the 6♥ bid. West's statements completely overlooked the fact that if N/S could make 5♠, E/W would certainly go down at least three (doubled) in their 6♥ contract. The Committee therefore canceled the 6♥ bid and changed the contract to 5♠ doubled down four, plus 800 for E/W.

The Committee believed that the 6♥ bid bordered on taking blatant advantage of unauthorized information. However, in view of the apparent lack of experience exhibited by the E/W pair, even though they were Life Masters, the Committee elected neither to assess a procedural penalty nor to keep the deposit. E/W were given a stern warning about their responsibilities in such situations.
