### Marshall Miles

Marshall Miles was presented the Blackwood Award for his tremendous contribution to bridge. Master of Ceremonies David Berkowitz read excerpts from a letter from Eddie Kantar, a long-time partner of Miles. "Of all the players I've known, no one loves the game more than Marshall," wrote Kantar. "Marshall never gets angry, even when faced with disasters. He is an honest and honorable person."

Kantar described a hand in which Marshall played 7♣ with ♣A-K-8 facing a void. When they discussed it after the session, Marshall said "I was down five but they could have set me six. I scored my ♣8," he related with a smile.

Eli Borok presented the award. "Miles' writing has benefitted players all over the world. Many of us were inspired by All 52 Cards and How to win at Duplicate Bridge," stated Borok. "What shines through is his love of the game. The gentleman of bridge is Marshall Miles."

Miles spoke and described being stationed in the Navy in San Diego. He heard about bridge, so he went to the local duplicate bridge club. The first time he played he came in last. "I improved the next time, though," Miles continued. "I came

When they left the playing area Sunday, Pat McDevitt and Stephen Gladyszak thought they had finished second in the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs, right behind last year's champions, Zia Mahmood and Walid Elahmady. The defenders appeared to have edged the Massachusetts pair by about half a board on a 38 top.

Thanks to a late score correction, McDevitt and Gladyszak are the new champions. The resulting change in the score cost them one matchpoint, but Zia and Elahmady dropped more than 24 MPs, enough to cause them to fall to second, about six matchpoints out of first.

The problem was, neither of the new champions knew right away about the turn of events. McDevitt,

## Two chances to play in a world championship

The 5th World Transnational Open Teams will be played in Estoril, Portugal, this year during the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup. The WTOT will start Oct. 31 and conclude Nov. 5.

Unlike the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup, you don't have to qualify to play in the WTOT. It is open to players in good standing with their national bridge organizations. Team members may be from different countries, and there are no quotas for participation. It is a Swiss teams, usually played as 10-board matches for 15 qualifying sessions, followed by quarterfinal, semifinal and final play.

If you can't make it to Estoril, you will have another chance at a world championship in 2006, the 8th World Bridge Championship in Verona, Italy, June 8 to 24. ## Convention card reminder

- Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

- Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

## Ruling the Game

### *Associate National Tournament Director Played Cards — part 1*

Of all the problems encountered by players and directors alike, among the most common are the various situations that can arise when a player commits an irregularity in leading or following to a trick.

Let's start out by looking at what constitutes a played card, bearing in mind that played cards are defined differently depending on which player is involved. Law 45 deals with this issue.

1. In general, each player plays a card by detaching it from his hand and facing it on the table immediately in front of him. In the case of the opening leader, ACBL states that his card is considered to have been played when it is placed face down on the table (Law 45A).

2. A card is played from the dummy when declarer names the desired card, after which his partner picks it up and faces it on the table. The declarer may, if necessary, pick up the desired card himself (Law 45B). A card from dummy must be played if it has been touched by the declarer except for the purpose of arranging dummy's cards or of reaching for a card above or below the card or cards touched (Law 45C3).

3. A defender's card is considered to be played if held in a fashion so that it is possible for his partner to see its face (Law 45C1).

4. Declarer's card is considered to be played if detached from his hand and either touching or nearly touching the table or maintained in such a position as to consider that it had been played (Law 45C2).

5. A named or designated card must be played unless the designation was clearly inadvertent and the player who makes such a designation changes it without pause for thought.

That all sounds easy enough, but players frequently disagree on the facts, and directors are called upon to determine the facts in each case to ascertain whether a card is played. In the articles to follow, we will examine some of the criteria that have been established by the ACBL Laws Commission and other administrative bodies to deal with what can sometimes be a thorny issue.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

## Be alert about Alerts

The Alert procedure is part of what makes competitive bridge different from playing in a strictly social situation. Of course, when we play at home, among friends, we either know how everyone

at the table bids and plays, or we don't really care because we're just playing for fun.

At the duplicate table, we are required to have agreements, to describe these agreements on our convention cards, and to reveal these agreements to the opponents in a fair and timely manner. The convention card is a good tip-off to what needs to be Alerted: what you check or fill out in black print needs no Alert; blue areas require Announcements, and anything in a red check box or on a red line asks for an Alert.

The proprieties for Alerting are really pretty simple. When your partner uses an Alertable bid, just say "Alert." Don't offer any explanation unless you are asked. It's just as wrong to volunteer information which hasn't been asked for as it is to fail to inform the opponents when you should.


Ideally, your Alert should come before the

next person takes action. If you forget or are late in Alerting, the opponent may wish to change his call. Ask a director to come to the table so everyone will have his interests protected in this situation. A delayed Alert is better than none.

Your side gets the contract, but you still haven't remembered that your partner made an Alertable bid, but your partner knows you forgot, so he should tell the opponents before the opening lead is made. Again, if the opponents feel the need, they should call the director to find out about their options. If your side is defending, you must wait till after the deal has been played to speak to the opponents about the forgotten Alert.

There is also a proper way to ask about Alerts made by the opponents. During the auction, ask only at your turn to bid. You are entitled to know only the agreements the opponents have made—not what's actually in the bidder's hand.

A good way to ask for information is just to say, "Please explain." Never ask during the auction unless you need the information to make a bidding decision on that turn. Don't interrupt the



flow of the bidding or give away inferences about your own hand unless you will benefit from the information.

The idea of Alerts is to make the game fair for all participants. If you keep that notion alive as you bid and play, you'll find Alerting easy.

**Bidding commentary:** South would like to enter the fray but his sordid distribution plus the vulnerability dictate otherwise. West's raise to 2♠ shows the same strength as a direct raise from 1♠ to 2♠. The raise of a secondary suit, however, guarantees four-card support in the best circles.

**Lead commentary:** Questionable in dummy's first bid suit. An alternative is the ♦5, the unbid suit.

**Defensive commentary:** Once North discourages in hearts (all hearts lower than the 6 are visible), South shifts to a low diamond. North plays ♦A, ♦K a diamond to East's queen.

**Play commentary:** East has five top losers, two hearts, two diamonds and the ♣A. The idea is to locate the ♠Q without guessing who has it. Both opponents are passed hands and neither figures to have as many as 12 HCP. South has turned up with the ♥AK, and North with the

♦AK: 7 HCP each. If East drives out the ♣A, the player who wins the trick, in this case South, will have turned up with 11 HCP and can't have the ♠Q and have passed. North has the ♠Q. East has just made a discovery play – driving out a "relatively" unimportant honor (♣A) to discover who has a very important honor, the ♠Q.



## Young player shows poise, confidence



Friederike Ach has been playing bridge only for about a year, but she exhibits the poise of a veteran player.

It might have something to do with her world travels. She was born in Frankfurt, Germany, and has lived in Indonesia and Australia. She

visits the U.S. regularly. When she is not playing bridge at home in Bonn, she practices dance – including ballet and jazz.

She came to the NABC with her grandmother, Angelina Fong of Cliffside Park NJ.

In fact, it was Fong who introduced Friederike to bridge.

The youngster visits her grandmother during

the summer, and last year she began to wonder where Grandma went every night. It turned out to be bridge at the local club. Since Friederike took up the game, she and Fong have played at clubs in New Jersey and New York.

Friederike has also played some rubber bridge with her mother, Diana. She prefers duplicate, however, especially Swiss teams.

Duplicate, says Friederike, "is not like any other game." She also likes the fact that, in duplicate, some of the luck element has been removed because "everybody gets the same cards."

As for bridge, Friederike has a definite preference between bidding and play: "I like the play best."



It took some doing, but Lauren McDow of Atlanta, left, talked her grandmother, Frances Weatherly of Stone Mountain, into trying duplicate. Weatherly has played for 50 years but only party bridge. She and McDow played in a newcomer game on Sunday, and Weatherly allowed that after she adjusted to the new way of handling the cards and the dummy, she enjoyed herself. ... tied for last." He also related some of the fun partners and games he has played in over the last 50 plus years.

### Percy Sheardown

The late Sheardown received the von Zedtwitz Award given to bridge stars from many decades ago. Ralph Cohen spoke of Sheardown's many accomplishments. He won the first Chicago Board-a-Match Teams, now the Reisinger. He was Canada's first Life Master in 1948. Even more impressive, however, was the effort he gave promoting and mentoring bridge players. Cohen listed a who's who of Canadian bridge stars who passed through his bridge club and his teaching.

### Betty Ann Kennedy

"More than her championships, Betty Ann's demeanor at the table sets the standard on how to treat partners and opponents," said Carol Sanders, who presented Kennedy. "Not once in 26 years did she make a derogatory remark at the table. She was always a lady."

Kennedy spoke and described beginning to play bridge as a complete accident. At age 22 she had a near fatal case of encephalitis. During recovery she could not swim, play tennis, or do the other activities she normally did. Her doctor asked her if she played bridge and recommended she learn to play to occupy her time. She signed up for bridge lessons and went to the club. At first she had no partners, so she kibitzed until other players begin to ask her to play.

Her first tournament was in New Orleans. She went without a partner and again resorted to kibitzing. A director approached her and asked her to fill in with another woman in the Men's Pairs. They not only filled in but they won! She described bridge as not only a life-saver but a ticket to the world. She thanked not only her partners but her supportive husband, Jack, a fine player in his own right, and her children, two of whom were present.

### Kit Woolsey

Fred Stewart introduced Kit Woolsey for induction to the Bridge Hall of Fame. Besides bridge, Woolsey is one of the best in the world at backgammon play and theory. Stewart stated that when he did a Google search of Woolsey on the Internet, there were 30 pages of references. Woolsey contributed to the law of total tricks theory more than 25 years ago in his book Matchpoints.

"Kit loves to tinker with conventions," said Stewart. "Once we had a disaster when our weak notrump was doubled. Kit came up with 26 pages of notes on a sophisticated run-out system. Kit is a bridge purist who loves the game."

"When I was six or seven years old, my parents bought me a game called Auto-bridge," said Woolsey. "I was hooked on chess and they wanted me to take up a game that was more sociable. Bridge has been a wonderful experience for me." Steve Robinson also spoke of some of experiences with Woolsey.

### Nick Nickell

Sidney Lazard presented Nick Nickell the Sidney H. Lazard Jr. Sportsmanship Award. It is named for Lazard's late son.

"Nick is gracious and impeccably mannered," Lazard spoke. "He is a fierce competitor, which makes it an even greater honor."

"Bridge has been wonderful to me," stated Nickell. "It teaches you problem solving and many things, including how to deal with adversity." Nickell thanked Randy Joyce for teaching him bridge, Bob Hamman for teaching him how to be tough and Dick Freeman for putting up with him.

When Amrine visited the campus bridge club as a freshman, he found one table in play. He volunteered to help promote the club and he soon became the club manager, game director and campus bridge teacher. Today, the club averages eight tables per session and is the only club in District 15 to have earned two-star status from ACBL.

Amrine stressed the importance of the free lessons and free entry fees in drawing students to his club. He also sponsored a 299er sectional that introduced the campus players to tournament play.

**David Banh**, 17, of Annandale VA will be a freshman at the University of Virginia this fall. He plans to major in math, physics and law, and find time to play some bridge, too.

Banh learned to play four years ago from friends (neither of his parents play) and began working to start a bridge club at his high school. His promotions, which he describes as "very aggressive," were more successful than he expected. By his senior year, the club was hosting 16-17 tables every Friday afternoon, and he developed a mailing list of more than 130 students who either play in the club or have expressed serious interest. That's nearly 10% of the entire student body.

"We're a magnet school for science and technology, so we already had a lot of students who were interested in intellectual games," Banh said. "The free cookies were a big draw, too."

The cookies and other incidentals were paid for by the local unit, and Banh said this support was a key factor in the club's success. Even more important was the volunteer work of Leo Cardillo, president of the Northern Virginia Bridge Association, who helped Banh establish the free lesson series and run the club.

Banh said his high school's class schedule offered the perfect setup for a bridge club. "We have a 90-minute activity period twice a week that all students are required to attend," Bahn explained. "They can watch movies or go to club meetings, or do something active like play bridge, so we're offering a fun alternative."

The Junior Corps was started by Hall of Fame member Bobby Wolff to acknowledge players age 25 and younger who are active in promoting bridge to other young people. There are about 50 members. ## The immaterial squeeze

Steve Bloom, South, played 2♠ doubled on this deal from Sunday's Flight A/X Swiss Teams.

The lead was the ♥8 (third from even, low from odd). He carefully ducked in dummy and won the ♥10, then tried to cash the ♦K and ♦Q. West ruffed the second diamond and East followed with a suit-preference ♦J.

West exited with a low heart, ruffed by East and over ruffed by Bloom. He now led the ♠8 to West's ♠J. Back came another heart, ruffed with the ♠9 and over-ruffed with the ♠10. Bloom now exited with another trump, won by West with the ♠K.

This was the ending:

West cashed the ♠A, Bloom pitched the ♣10 from dummy, and East was squeezed. He chose to pitch a diamond. Now what was West to do? A heart lead would make dummy high, so he played the ♣A and ♣9, which East ducked ... and so did Bloom. West was now forced to lead a heart to the good dummy.

Had East overtaken his partner's ♣9 with the ♣J or ♣K, the defense would still have taken only one more club trick. Either way, East-West were limited to +100.

So why was the position an immaterial squeeze? In the other room, the North-South pair had agreed to play a 2NT overcall as the two lower unbid suits. When West opened a strong 1♣, North overcalled 2NT to show (he thought) the red suits. South, however, interpreted this as showing the minors (since the 1♣ bid was artificial), and he jumped all the way to 5♣, doubled and down 1400.

So Steve's efforts to get out for down one instead of down two amounted to a gain of 16 IMPs instead of 15 IMPs ... an immaterial gain!

## What's behind those names?

Bracketed knockouts are the No. 1 reason for the ongoing popularity of Mid-Atlantic regionals. our tournaments. Morning KOs, prime time KOs, compact KOs, dinner bell KOs, late-night compact KOs . . . no one offers more. So each knockout is named after one of our District 7 regional sites, or another locale for a specific reason listed below.

Also, we are paying tribute to those players who gained fame and admiration within our borders. Various side game series bear the names of past bridge giants. (If you notice that Margaret Wagar of Atlanta is not included, that's because the ACBL already has the Wagar Women's Knockouts in Summer NABCs.)

Here's what's behind the names, in chronological order.

**Atlanta KOs:** Your hosts, of course, and usually the site of the ACBL's largest Labor Day regional. This year, however, the Atlanta Regional will be even more festive, running Dec. 26 through Jan. 1, including a big New Year's Eve party.

**Lou Bluhm Side Game Series:** For those who played tournament bridge in the Seventies and Eighties, you know that no one better exemplified our game than Lou Bluhm. He was one of this country's leading players, winning numerous NABC pair and team titles. But Lou might best be remembered as a player whose ethics and professionalism were beyond reproach. A member of the ACBL Hall of Fame, he won the first ACBL Distinguished Player Award — an award that was created because of Lou. He died in 1990.

**Coastal Georgia KOs:** Unit 202 covers an eastern swath of the state and has been host to regionals in Augusta, Jekyll Island and Savannah, most recently last October at Jekyll.

**Chuck Whidden Side Game Series:** A behind-the-scenes pioneer in many aspects of the game, Chuck was best known as the Mid-Atlantic's first web master. He was a tireless, unselfish worker who sought no recognition. After Chuck's death in 2003, his wife, Kathy, said that Chuck was most proud of being voted the Georgia State Unit Sportsman of the Year. Kathy, an award-winning director, retired this year . . . although she is overseeing the information desk at this tournament.

**Gatlinburg KOs:** ACBL seven-day regional record-setter for four consecutive years. Is a 10,000 table regional possible?

**Knoxville KOs:** The center of Unit 165, which hosts Gatlinburg every year and provides many of the volunteers. Knoxville also runs two of the district's larger sectionals each year in the city-owned bridge center.

**Bernard Warshauer Side Game Series:** Bernard, a well-known judge from Sumter SC, was a five-term district director, from 1979 until 1994. He served in various other volunteer and administrative positions and was a member of the ACBL Goodwill Committee. Bernard died in 1998.

**Columbia KOs:** The Mid-Atlantic holds a regional in Columbia every three to six years, and the hosts always do a great job. We return Oct. 16–22, 2006.

**Charlotte KOs:** The last Charlotte Regional was 10 years ago — when, as this year, there was an Atlanta NABC and the Labor Day regional landed in Charlotte. We've got a great new site for the Aug. 30–Sept. 5 tournament, one we already have booked for autumn 2007.

**Morganton KOs:** Eldon and Susie Clayman moved here in 1992, set up a bridge club in the basement of their home, and put this foothills town on the bridge map. The unit has fewer than 250 members, yet hosts four sectionals a year — averaging close to 300 tables each — with unparalleled hospitality.

**Hilton Head KOs:** Always one of our most popular sites, and it will be one of the ACBL's

largest regionals next year. Schedule your midwinter respite for Feb. 6–12.

**Bobby McMahan Side Game Series:** A past District 7 president and our district director from 1994 until his death in 1997, Bobby was a longtime force in South Carolina bridge. A skilled player, teacher and goodwill ambassador, he was one of our most outgoing and popular officials.

**Myrtle Beach KOs:** Ever since our last regional in 1999, one of the most asked questions has been, "When are we going back?" The answer: Dec. 5–11. A brand-new Marriott property on the beach is our venue, and we'll return for the 2008 and 2010 New Year's regionals.

**Washington Side Game Series:** The nation's capital is the District 6 capital, too. The next NABC is Summer 2009.

**Macon KOs:** The most active bridge group in Unit 114 outside Atlanta is 90 miles south. Two open and one non-LM sectional are run each year at the new clubhouse, the product of fund-raising and generosity in the bridge community earlier this decade.

**Raleigh KOs:** Our Memorial Day regional in even-number years, and it's always the largest in the ACBL. Next: May 23–29, 2006.

**Jerry Machlin Side Game Series:** Jerry is identified with District 6, but as the founding father of the Mid-Atlantic Bridge Conference, he also had a great impact on District 7. Jerry, a longtime and colorful director, died in 1997.

**Cape Fear KOs:** Regionals in February of odd-number years are held in downtown Wilmington, a fun and easy-to-get-around site. Next: Feb. 19–25, 2007.

**Greenville KOs:** District 7's most recent regional (June) was in downtown Greenville, close to the geographical center of our district. We return June 11–17, 2007.

**Nashville KOs:** A tip of the hat to District 10, which reciprocates with District 7 in advertising, publicity and fund-raising. Our neighbors have contributed to hospitality here, just as District 7 is contributing to hospitality at the Summer 2007 NABC in Nashville.

**Chattanooga KOs:** One of our infrequent but reliable regional sites. Next visit to the Choo Choo is Dec. 1–7, 2008.

**Billy Woodson Side Game Series:** Best known around the Charlotte area, Billy is a former Mid-Atlantic president and was our district director from 1973 until 1979. He served as special consultant to the ACBL one year and is in the South Carolina bridge hall of fame. He is inventor of the Woodson Two-Way No-Trump.

**Charleston Strati-Flighted Swiss Teams:** The site of our inaugural New Year's regional in 2003, Charleston instantly became the ACBL's most popular. Attendance soared this year, and we'll be back to ring in 2007 and 2009.

## Life Master news



# History of the Spingold

The Spingold Master Knockout Teams, first known as the Challenge Knockout Teams, was contested for the Asbury Park Trophy in the early days.

The runner-up team in the regularly scheduled portion of the event had the right to challenge the winners to a playoff. This right was never utilized.

In 1934, 1936 and 1937, the Masters Teams-of-Four and the Asbury Park Trophy were separate events, providing two sets of winners.

In 1938 the event became the Spingold Master Knockout Teams and a part of the Summer NABC.

At one time, the Spingold was a double elimination event, usually lasting nine or 10 sessions. It was scored by International Match Points and was restricted to players with 100 or more masterpoints.

In 1965, the double elimination method was replaced by three qualifying sessions (subsequently reduced to two), followed by single elimination knockout matches. The preliminary qualifying session were dropped in 1970.

The Spingold Trophy, donated by Nathan B. Spingold in 1934; the Vanderbilt Trophy, awarded to the winners of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams at the Spring NABC, and the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger and awarded to the winners of the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, are ACBL's most highly prized team trophies.

Spingold (1886-1958), a New York publicist, motion picture executive and patron of the arts, was one of the most influential men in bridge administration from 1937 to 1943.

Born in Chicago, he became a reporter on The Chicago Examiner, The Chicago Record Herald and The Chicago Tribune. Spingold's interest in show business brought him to New York City in the Thirties.

In 1932 he joined Columbia Pictures in a public relations capacity. He was named to the board of directors in 1940 and three years later was appointed vice president in charge of advertising, publicity and development. He became a vice president of the company in 1954.

Active in bridge from its earliest days, Spingold was named ABL Honorary Member in 1936. He was instrumental in effecting a peaceful merger between the American Bridge League and the United States Bridge Association in 1937 and became president of the newly formed American Contract Bridge League the following year.

He served for many years on the League's Board of Governors and Board of Directors. Spingold was also president of the Cavendish Club in New York.

## Atlanta Transportation

Atlanta has outstanding public transportation. MARTA rail service is available with 15-minute service from the airport to the Hyatt. The MARTA rail stops at the Peachtree Center station, which is underneath the Hyatt with an escalator ride to the hotel. The cost is \$1.75 for one-way fare with free transfer, but the real deal is in unlimited-ride convention passes, \$11 for specific five-day periods or \$23 for 12 days, July 20-31. Special MARTA pass packages (for rail or bus) are available at any RideStore cashier.

All MARTA stations and rapid rail cars are fully accessible to handicapped and elderly passengers. Special MARTA L-vans have lifts for

easy boarding and safety belts for securing wheelchairs. Routes are established in response to individual requests and door-to-door service is provided. One-way handicap fare is \$3.50. Required attendants ride at no additional cost. Also there are 150 bus routes to locations such as sports venues, Underground, Omni, Lenox, and the Arts Center.

Train service is reliable from about 5 a.m. to 1 a.m. daily.

This is how the auction should have gone but instead South passed, scoring a meager plus 50, when only a spade lead defeats 5♣.

Suppose West leads a normal diamond, won by South with the ace. After drawing trumps, declarer may rely on West having a doubleton heart honor. If he does, he makes his contract by playing off the ♥A and ♥K, ruffing dummy's remaining diamond and then leading a spade in:

South now leads a low spade, playing the jack from dummy to endplay East. A major suit return sets up a winner in dummy for the 11th trick, as does a diamond, for it concedes a ruff and discard.

While this plan is an admirable one, it is not best for you would fail when the full deal was:

Dummy's throws the ♦J on the penultimate club and East is in trouble. If he parts with a spade, South ducks a spade, ruffs the diamond return, throwing a low heart from dummy, and then ducks another spade. East has only hearts left, so declarer makes the last three tricks. A heart discard is immediately fatal – declarer plays the

♥A and ♥K to set up the 10. So, that leaves a diamond. Now one way home is to cash the top hearts, ruff a heart and then lead a spade to the jack. East takes the ♠A and ♠Q, but dummy takes the last trick with the ♠K.

On a final note, you need East to guard hearts alone if you are to make 5♣ when, as seems likely, East holds the ♠A Q. The odds of East doing so by holding five hearts is about three times as likely to occur when compared to the chance of his holding exactly four hearts to the Q-J.
