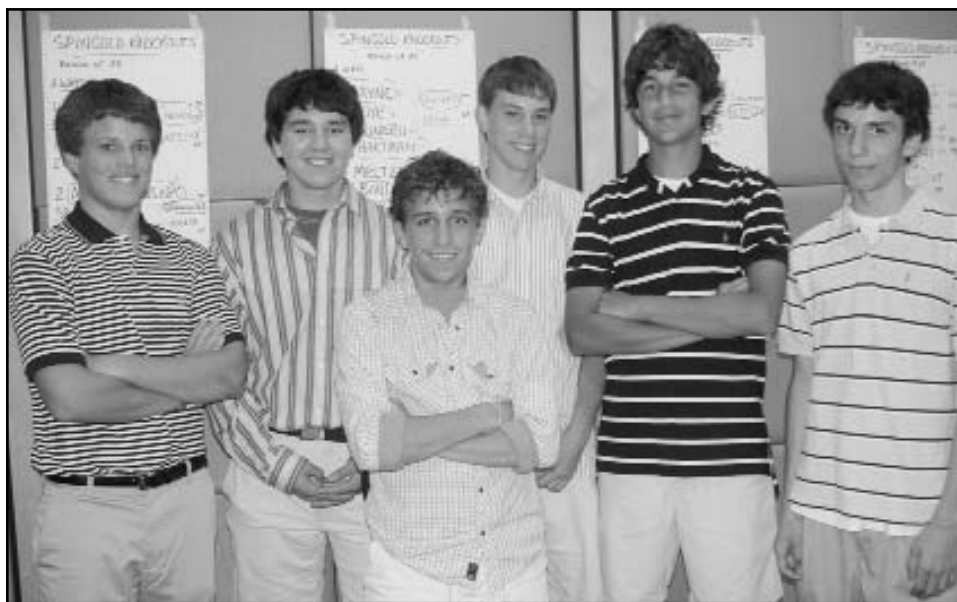

Caddies keep the NABC running

He might be the smallest caddy at the NABC in terms of size, but Nikita Ladyzhensky is making a big impression on the other caddies – and the players. While Nikita was being interviewed for this article, a player passed by and said, “He’s the best caddy I’ve ever seen.”

Nikita is one of 60 caddies at the 2005 Summer NABC, all under the supervision of ACBL’s caddy master, Tournament Director Jackie Matthews.

Matthews has special plans for Nikita, who lives in Ellenton FL with his bridge-playing parents, Alex and Irina Ladyzhensky. Nikita was born in the U.S., but his Russian-born parents speak their native language around the house, so Nikita is fluent in Russian as well as English.

Matthews believes Nikita, now working his first tournament, will come in handy at future NABCs for the major events, which attract many more foreign players – including Russians – than in past years. Sometimes the TDs have difficulty communicating with the foreigners, and Matthews thinks Nikita would make a good interpreter.

Nikita says he gets lots of practice in Russian at home, especially “when my parents are mad at me. Then they talk to me only in Russian.”

As far as caddying duties, Nikita prefers team events to pairs. “I like to fly around the room,” he says. At home in Ellenton, near Tampa, Nikita plays guitar and plays a lot of soccer, his favorite sport.

Matthews usually appoints national head caddies at the NABCs, and Atlanta is no exception. This year’s newest caddy leaders are Irv Schneider of Nehalem OR and Matthews’ daughter, Pam Hughes of Bend OR.

Schneider got into caddying because his uncle is

Defending champs lead Fast Open

Peter Weiden and Richard Zucker — winners of the 2004 NABC Fast Open Pairs in New York — are leading the 2005 contest after the qualifying round. Weiden and Zucker had a 62.31% game in the morning and a 63.46% game in the afternoon to post a two-session total of 819 (top=25).

In second with 795 are David Gurvich and Michael Lipkin. Gurvich and Lipkin had a 68.23% game in the morning, but paired it with a 54.08% game in the afternoon.

In third were Joseph Godefrin and Jeffrey Hand with 793.7.

Of the 168 pairs that entered the event, 78 qualified for today’s two-session final. Play resumes at 10 a.m. in the Centennial I Ballroom.

Table count at the 2005 Summer NABC zoomed past 10,000 on Thursday. Through the 3 p.m. sessions, there were 10,543 tables in play. Expectations were for 13,300 tables for the entire tournament.

Life Master news

Roger Staneslow of Calgary AB is a new Life Master. He earned the requisite masterpoints in the 299er Swiss Teams on Wednesday. He and his partner, wife Carol Staneslow, joined with Lynn and Curtis Johnson of La Palma CA in the team event.

With his team's win in the Senior Swiss Teams, **Jim Murphy** of Chesapeake VA became a Grand Life Master. Before the Summer NABC, Murphy had more than 14,000 masterpoints but did not have the North American championship he needed for Grand LM status. After the win, he was impressed with the sportsmanship of the many other players who took the time at this tournament to congratulate him on the victory and the achievement.

Roz Supera of Chicago earned her gold card with a third-place finish in Strat B of the Wednesday Stratified Open Pairs. She needed only 1.7 gold points to become an LM, but she and Marilyn Kroll of Boca Raton FL earned 10.13 for their good showing.

James Nichols of Birmingham AL came to the NABC needing about 12 points to become a Bronze Life Master. So far, playing in knockout teams, he has racked up about 35 masterpoints, playing with Doug Hoadley, also of Birmingham.

Atlanta Transportation

Atlanta has outstanding public transportation. MARTA rail service is available with 15-minute service from the airport to the Hyatt. The MARTA rail stops at the Peachtree Center station, which is underneath the Hyatt with an escalator ride to the hotel. The cost is \$1.75 for one-way fare with free transfer, but the real deal is in unlimited-ride convention passes, \$11 for specific five-day periods or \$23 for 12 days, July 20-31. JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Planning the Play

Start the play of any contract by having a look at the opening lead. What does it tell you? Make sure you remember the bidding, especially the auction was competitive: what do you already know about the

distribution of points and cards around the table? Use the bidding to paint a picture of the hand. For instance, if your side has 27 points and one of the opponents opened the bidding, the chances are the other defender has no points.

Look at the dummy. There's a famous cartoon in which declarer says to his partner, "Now show me the hand you had when you were bidding!" For instance, you opened 1NT holding

♠A 4 3 ♥K 10 9 6 ♦Q 10 2 ♣A K 10,

and partner jumped to 3NT. Partner's hand might be

♠8 6 4 ♥2 ♦A K 7 5 4 3 ♣Q J 6 or

♠Q 6 2 ♥J 4 3 ♦A K 8 7 ♣9 7 6.

Partner would jump to 3NT with either hand, but your plan for play would surely be very different with the two.

At notrump, count your winners and look for more. There are four strategies for gaining tricks at notrump.

1. High cards.
2. Promotion.
3. Long suits.
4. Finesses.

Be wise with your high honors. Especially

when one hand is much stronger than the other, cherish the winners in the weaker hand. Plan on using high cards as transportation from one side of the table to the other. Remember to use hold-up plays to disrupt communication between defenders. When an honor is led by the opponents, use it to locate the other high cards in the suit.

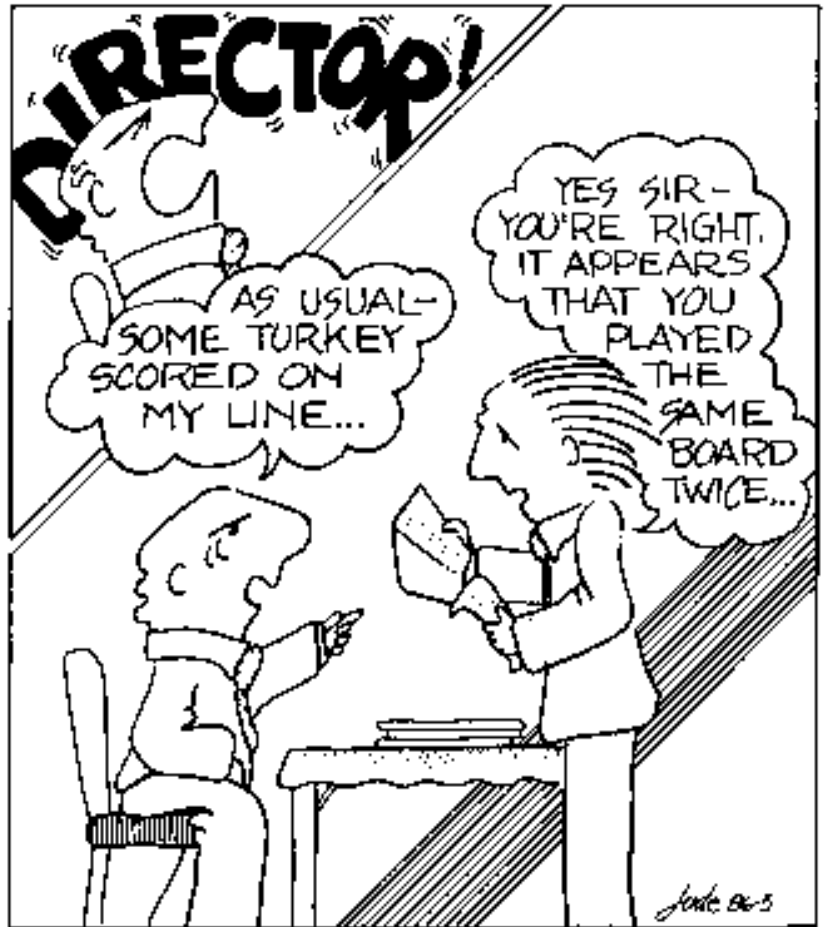
One of the best tips I've ever heard for playing notrump is to "do the hard stuff first." If you can't easily count up a sufficient number of tricks to fulfill your contract, hold on to the assured stoppers while you work on establishing needed tricks.

Go to work on promotion right away. If you have Q-J-10 in a suit, you are entitled to a trick only if you force out the ace and king. The opponents won't always do it for you.

If you have an eight-card fit in a suit, it will probably produce a trick for you even if you have none of the honors. But timing is everything: you must work on such a suit from your first opportunity.

Finesses should be your last resort, especially if there is a "dangerous" opponent. You must determine which opponent's being on lead imperils your contract. That knowledge will sometimes determine which finesse you choose.

Make a plan and count your tricks. Your first responsibility is to make your bid. Don't put the contract in jeopardy unless you have a reasonable chance of succeeding. Still, if there is only one lie of the cards that will allow you to make a contract, go for it!

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♠A (ace from A-K in unsupported suits at trick one)

Bidding commentary: South's 3♥ was played as preemptive, resembling a 3♥ opening bid. Many, however, use the 3♥ response as a splinter jump, showing a singleton heart with diamond support, a game force. If 3♥ is being played as a splinter, second hand must have passed.

Defensive commentary: East "sees" four defensive tricks if West can be coaxed to cash the ♠K. If East plays a low spade at trick one, West is apt to switch to a club trying to build up a trick in that suit before the ♠Q can be established for a club discard. East "sees" that a minor suit shift could be disastrous. It is up to East to take charge and play the ♠10 at trick one, "faking" a doubleton. No matter. Once West plays that ♠K, the contract is defeated.

Every so often a defender encourages partner to continue the suit that has been led even though third hand has worthless cards in the suit. Why? Third hand can see that if partner continues the suit, the contract will be defeated. A little white lie comes in handy every so often.

Georgians win National 199er Pairs

Ellen Cohen and Genny Whitaker, both of Macon GA, posted the top score in the National 199er Pairs, a two-session pair game for players with fewer than 200 masterpoints. Cohen and Whitaker (see photo page 1) posted huge sessions to easily win the event. Their morning score was 68.56% which they followed in the afternoon with a 67.24% game, for a two-session total of 391.09.

They finished two-and-a-half boards ahead of the second-place pair William Mauldin of Mount Airy NC and David Banh of Annandale VA who scored 364.91. In third place were Christopher and Liane Tsai of Roswell GA with 357.82.

Cohen and Whitaker were co-workers for many years. Both were professors of mathematics at Macon State College. Whitaker retired four years ago.

The duo credits their success to teacher Emory Whitaker, Genny's husband. His name may be familiar to readers of the Daily Bulletins in Atlanta — Emory finished second in the Wernher Open Pairs which concluded Wednesday, missing first place by less than a matchpoint. Emory declined to take any credit, however.

"They did this all on their own," he said of the winners.

Cohen learned bridge as a child from her parents, but only began playing duplicate two years ago. Whitaker took up duplicate in the Seventies, but she joked, "I took a thirty-year vacation from the game to save my marriage." After retiring, she began playing with Cohen, with

Emory acting as mentor.

For winning the event, Cohen and Whitaker were presented with a pair of ACBL watches provided by the Bridge Gold Group.

One hundred and two pairs played in the event.

The University of Illinois, 1974

It was a cold winter night twenty years ago
When I found the courage to make my debut
And headed, alone, for the duplicate
Known on campus as the Thursday Zoo.

I'd heard this club was a tough one,
That it had launched many a bridge career.
Woolsey, Martel, Ewen and the Bjerkans
Had all started playing here.

But one look at this group and I understood
How the "Zoo" had earned its name.
The room was packed with loud, rowdy men.
I was the only woman in the game.

I meekly approached the director, who said
He'd fix me up if an "odd person" came.
Some serious arm twisting later,
Odd Person and I had a game.

The director scribbled on the recap sheet.
I took a peek when he was done.
We were listed as "New Girl & Victim,"
Followed by the numbers "100:1"

Odd Person was an undergrad
Who boasted he had "experience."
He was third in the last club championship
And he had been playing six whole months.

He sat me down and began rattling off
A litany of confusing conventions.
He said we had to play them all
And I would have to play attention.

This is a mental game, he preached at length,
So I promised that I'd try real hard
To concentrate on every bid,
On each and every card.

A constant clamor filled the room.

This was the wildest club in town.
But the racket didn't really rattle me
Until the final round.

"Now don't be nervous," Odd Person warned.
"Here comes the best pair in the game."
For what was about to happen,
Perhaps those words would be to blame.

With their arrival came the major source
Of the roar in the room that night.
On my left was a loudmouthed comic
And his straight man was on my right.

The Mouth hogged the play on the first hand.

The next hand, I opened the bidding

He was intent on declaring again.

The Straight Man seemed amused, but passed,
So we sailed easily into our game.
I had just relaxed, when from my port side
A bellowed Four Spades came.

They were white and we were red.
Hadn't partner lectured me on this situation?
Bid one more, I thought he had said,
That his pass was an invitation.

All the other tables had finished.
The noise was now a dull roar.
As players began drifting toward our table
To await this final score.

I pondered my bid for what seemed like hours,
But the Mouth soon tired of sitting.
"Girl in a coma! Call the medics!" he yelled
And scared me into bidding.

Five Hearts was barely past my lips
When his Double pierced the air
So loud, it brought more vultures
To watch the New Girl declare.

Odd Person was obviously insulted
That our judgment had been attacked.
Or maybe it was the flock of kibitzers
That made him send it back.

As partner proudly spread his dummy,
He cautioned: "Concentrate!"
The Mouth rapid-fired the club ace-king,
Then a spade, and sat back to wait.

I cursed myself for bidding,
For getting us into this fix.
But when I finally looked up at dummy,
I saw eleven tricks!

I called the spade ace with stifled glee.
I thought I'd died and gone to heaven.
The rest of the tricks, even I could see:
Two suits solid down to the seven.

The Mouth's frown told Odd Person this was cold,
My claim he was awaiting.
But I remembered what I'd been told. . .
So I started concentrating.

I took a deep breath and formed my plan.
I would risk a contested claim.
I'd carefully play out the entire hand
And make my first-ever redoubled game.

I focused my energy on forming each word.
"Small trump," I called to start my plan.
And with those two words locked in my head,
I played a small trump from my hand!

"I knew we could beat this!" crowed the Mouth,
As he won his singleton six.
Through concentration I had found
A way to lose three tricks.

The room erupted in laughter and I in tears.
But as I fled from my disgrace
I thought I saw a look of pity
On the Straight Man's face.

I vowed that I would play no more,
But the very next day, the telephone rang.
Someone I'd met the night before
Was asking me for a game.

So the next Thursday and many after that,
I discovered how much fun this game could be,
That the secret to concentration
Was having the Mouth across from me.

Two decades later, the volume has dropped
But not the spirit he brings to the game.
The Mouth is still my most colorful partner
And he can still live up to his name.

The night we won our first regional,
The entire ballroom heard him bestow
Himself with the dubious credit:
"I taught her everything she knows!"

I think back now that if I'd made Five Hearts,
If I'd taken a less "memorable" line of play,
I'd have remained the nameless New Girl
And we'd have gone our separate ways.

So I still thank that redoubled disaster
For bringing such special partners into my life.
For today, the Mouth is one of my closest friends,
And the Straight Man? I'm his wife.

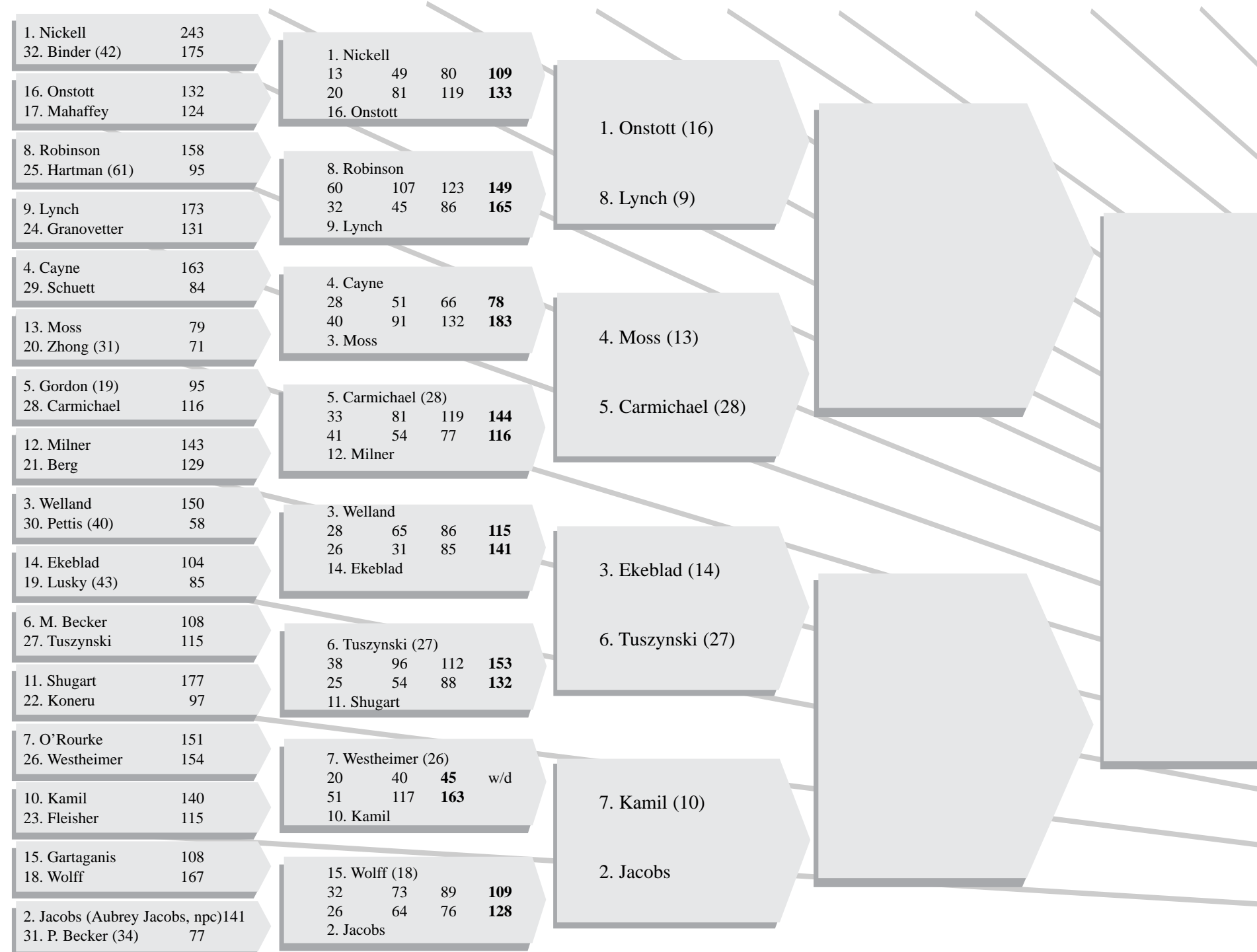
Convention card reminder

- Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

- Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

customer service in the tradition of the late Jane Johnson, manager of Club and Member services who died in 2000. Carol Robertson, now manager of that department, and Dave Smith, who manned ACBL's computer help desk before joining the staff of the Bridge Bulletin, are the 2005 recipients from Headquarters.

As for Case, her selection had wide support among the tournament directors.

"Everybody loves Janet – the players and the directors," said Carey Snider, fellow TD. "She's just a terrific director."

Bid box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

Ruling the Game

Claims — part 1

Problems with faulty or poorly stated claims help directors keep busy at tournaments. This series of articles will help players and directors deal more effectively with disputed claims.

A claim is defined as a statement by a player that he will win a specific number of the remaining tricks in a deal. In order for a statement to be a claim, it must refer to tricks other than the one currently in progress. A player may also be deemed to have claimed when he faces his hand or suggests that play be curtailed.

Should a player make a claim?

While it is true that claims occasionally create problems, the answer to this question is almost certainly yes. Prolonging the play of a hand unnecessarily is actually a violation of the Laws.

How should a claim be made?

Any claim should be accompanied by a clarification statement, a comprehensive statement about the order in which the claimer intends to win the number of tricks he is claiming. If there is an outstanding trump at the time of the claim, it should be mentioned. If finesses remain to be taken, the intended order of play should be stated. At the time of his claim, the claimer should face his unplayed cards, allowing his opponents time to examine his hand and the claim.

What happens next?

1. The opponents may choose to acquiesce if they agree that the claim is valid. Then, they move on to the next board.
2. If the opponents take issue with the claim, they call the director. Until he arrives at the table, no one takes any further action.
3. Play ceases after a claim! It is contrary to the Laws to play on, and the director is to void any plays made after a claim was disputed.

What procedure should the director follow when he gets to the table?

1. Find out what the contract is.
2. Ask the claimer to repeat his clarification statement.
3. Have his opponents face their unplayed cards and state their objections to the claim.
4. Adjudicate the claim as equitably as possible to both sides, resolving doubtful issues in favor of the non-claiming side.

As I mentioned earlier, some contested claims are merely badly stated. Others are bad claims. The following two deals from recent NABCs will illustrate the difference.

The contract was 4♥ by South. West led the ♣K which won. West then played a spade to the ace, and the low club return was ruffed by declarer. A low diamond toward dummy was captured by West's king. The diamond exit was won in dummy. The ♠K J were next (South pitching diamonds) followed by the trump king and a trump to the queen in the closed hand.

At that point, declarer claimed, saying only, "my hand is good." After some discussion, the director was called. In this case, the director should rule that declarer was aware of the outstanding trump. The line of play adopted is consistent with this state of affairs. Once he has drawn exactly two rounds of trumps, he knows his hand is good, and he most assuredly knows that one trump is still outstanding.

The contract was 6♠ by South. The lead was the ♥A. West switched to a diamond, won by declarer's ace. A trump to dummy's ♠K was followed by the ♠Q on which West pitched a club. At this point, declarer detached the ♠A from her hand, faced her cards, and said she would overtake her second diamond in the dummy. West said he could ruff the diamond.

Here, the director should rule in favor of the defense. North has failed to mention the 4-1 trump break. Additionally, she could have claimed after the king of spades cashed and both opponents followed suit since only a 5-0 break could have hurt her. Those two facts make it possible, indeed even likely, that she was not aware of the distribution of the trump suit.

What was he thinking about?

Stephen Gladyszak and Patrick McDevitt won the six-session von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs which ended on Sunday. On this deal from the first final session, declarer Gladyszak took an inference from the tempo of the opening leader to find the best line of play. The defenders were Hemant Lall and Bob Hamman (deal rotated):

Gladyszak opened the cheesy South hand 1♣. McDevitt responded 1♦, Alerted and explained as possibly showing a minimum balanced hand with as few as three diamonds. The 1NT rebid was Walsh-style, showing a balanced hand but possibly containing one or both four-card majors. 3NT was the conclusion.

Lall, on opening lead, pondered his choice for some time before finally producing the ♣J. Gladyszak could see that he needed to successfully bring in the diamond suit to make the contract. At first glance, it seems as if declarer can score two spades, five diamonds and three clubs, but managing the entries is very difficult on this layout. In order to take the diamond finesse, the first trick needs to be won in the closed hand. This will tangle the clubs and declarer runs the risk of not being able to enjoy three club tricks.

Gladyszak decided to win the opening lead in hand and played the ♦J. This was covered by the king and ace as Hamman, East, played the 9.

Gladyszak began to wonder what had taken Lall so long to find the opening lead. A major-suit lead would seem normal on this auction, but Lall had selected a club. If West had held the ♣J 10 9 x, the lead might have been made more quickly, so perhaps West had something else to consider. Gladyszak decided that the "something else" was that West held diamond length; the pause may have come from West deciding whether or not to lead the suit North bid in the auction.

When East followed to the first diamond trick with the 9, declarer's suspicions about 4-1 diamonds increased. Backing his judgment, Gladyszak returned to his hand with the ♠K and played another diamond. Lall played the 7 smoothly, but declarer called for dummy's 8. Even if this had lost to the 10, the contract was secure since the defenders could cash only three hearts.

After the ♦Q and a diamond to West's 10, the defense cashed out, but Gladyszak had nine tricks and an above-average score.
