Quinn and Breed top LM Women's 2nd straight year

We featured them in yesterday's Daily Bulletin, and they proceeded to prove they deserved the accolades they received. We're talking about Shawn Quinn of Katy TX and Mildred Breed of Bryan TX – yesterday they successfully defended their championship in the Life Master Women's Pairs.

Quinn, now the highest rated woman player in the world according to the World Bridge Federation, and Breed led by four boards going into the last round – in other words they had already triumphed. Their final tally gave them the championship by almost four boards over fellow Texans Joan Jackson of Dallas and Robin Klar of Spring. Close behind in third place were Val Covalciuc of Fort Myers FL and Marilyn Hemenway of Omaha.

Quinn and Breed went into the final session back in 11th place, but "we had a mountain," said Quinn – and it was – 62.5%.

"We play intensely," said Breed, "but we're on each other's side all the time. We try to solve problems instead of arguing."

Quinn echoed this theme – "We're very much in tune and we try to do the right thing. We work hard on our system (two over one with lots of gadgets).

Meyers, Garner triumph in LM Open

Jill Meyers, picking up where she left off at the 1999 Fall NABC in Boston, won the Life Master Open Pairs last night, playing with first-time partner Steve Garner.

Meyers and Garner were about 1 1/4 boards ahead of runners-up Zia Mahmood and Chuck Burger. Perry Johnson and Jeff Meckstroth were third.

This was Meyers' second win in a major open event. She and John Mohan won the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs in Boston last year, only the second time in the history of the contest that a mixed pair finished first. Dorothy Truscott and B. Jay Becker won the inaugural Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1963.

This was also the second victory for a woman in the LM Open Pairs (the LM Men's Pairs until 1990). JoAnna and Lew Stansby won the event in 1998 and were runners-up in 1999.

Meyers, a three-time world women's champion (Venice Cup 1993 and 1997, World Women's Pairs 1998), has now won nine North American championships.

Peter Rank named League Counsel

Peter Rank of Los Angeles, a Grand Life Master with a strong background in law, was appointed as League General Counsel by the ACBL Board of Directors this week. He will replace Jeff Polisner who has resigned to take a position as counsel for the World Bridge Federation.

Rank is a partner in a Los Angeles law firm which provides health care, corporate, business and litigation legal services to hospitals, health maintenance organizations, preferred provider organizations, medical group practices, physicians and other health care related entities in the West.

His background in bridge is impressive. In 1958 he became the ACBL's youngest Life Master at the age of 20. When he retired from bridge in 1978, he was one of the top ten masterpoint holders. He had won three North American championships and was the McKenney Trophy (now the Barry Crane Top 500)

Florida couple win Non-Life Masters

Ernie and Sherry Fusco of Niceville FL weren't too happy after the first final session of the Non-Life Master Pairs – they had dropped to seventh place. But a solid 60.58% final session proved to be enough to earn them the championship. They had almost a two-board edge on runners-up Andrew Rieger of Swarthmore PA and Michael Albert of Dunedin FL.

They met at a bridge game in Key West two years ago, and six months later they made the partnership life as well as bridge. Ernie, who's been playing Precision for 15 years, convinced Sherry to try Precision two months ago. "I think I've got the hang of it," said Sherry. The results indicate that she's right.

Both are closing in on Life Masterhood – they have all their golds but need a few silver and black. This is their first NABC, but they've been on the regional trail in their new RV. "We park in state parks and do some hiking so we can get the physical exercise we don't get playing bridge," said Ernie.

Ernie, a retired administrator for the Illinois Central Railroad, and Sherry, a retired counsellor and teacher, had won two regional championships before coming to Birmingham.

The hand was dealt at the table during the 2000 Montreal Regional. My long-suffering partner, Brian Fraser, was quite innocent as were our teammates, Glenn Smith and Howard Piltch.

The obviously singleton ♠J was led on my left. I adore Broadway musicals but I missed this one (*The Bells are Ringing*). The all-important light bulb didn't switch on over my head, screaming THIS IS THE HAND. Did I recover and locate the hit song from the musical (*Just in Time*)? Read on.

I won the ♠A and now required a worthy opponent who would discard the ♥10 9 8 when I drew three rounds of trumps (otherwise, after a simple elimination of diamonds, a trump throw-in will succeed).

After the trump unblock, I can draw the fourth trump and still make the contract either by unblocking the ♣A on the third round of diamonds or a spade-diamond squeeze or a throw-in against my right-hand opponent. What a beautiful hand!

Did my lefty find the great trump unblock to make this possible? I regret to report that I foolishly didn't eliminate the diamonds before playing a fourth round of trumps.

Paradise Lost.

I'll be back searching for the next beauty. Maybe I won't have to wait another 30 years. In the meantime, I'll pay more attention to the lyrics of the musicals. The melody is not everything.

I was South. This will teach me to keep my big mouth shut. They'd have never gotten to slam if I had just passed. It happened in the second qualifying session of the Life Master Open Pairs.

You usually can't push Zia around - and probably shouldn't try - especially when he's going to end up being declarer.

Zia made quick work of this one (literally less than a minute). He won the ♣A at trick one and drew trumps. Next came three rounds of diamonds ruffing, followed by the ♠K-A and the fourth diamond. When South discarded, so did Zia - and North was endplayed. 1430 was worth 61.5 on a 64 top.

The receiving end

Leszek Rabiega found one of the best plays I have ever been on the receiving end of. See if you can match wits with him - he was sitting North.

As East, I led the ♠Q to the 4, 3 and 7. I woefully continued with a low spade. Wouldn't you?

Consider declarer's problem. If he wins and ducks a club, I lead a diamond through and though declarer gets one diamond away on the clubs, he can't get them both away - so he gets plus 140.

Rabiega found the brilliant play at trick two of ducking the second spade. That left my partner on lead; she played a club and Rabiega rose with the ace and cashed the ♠A, pitching the other club.

Now he ruffed a club, played the ♥A and a heart to the king, ruffed a club, gave up a heart and claimed plus 170. Very nicely done!

Strizhevsky led the ♣A and shifted to a low spade. Davis won the ♠A, dropping declarer's king, and cashed the ♠10. Now he shifted to the ♦Q.

Declarer, with no real hope, covered with the ♦K and Strizhevsky won the ace. He cashed two more spades and a high club, then exited with a diamond. Davis cashed his remaining six diamonds - and the defense had taken all 13 tricks: two clubs, four spades and seven diamonds for plus 5200.

He'd rather have qualified, said Strizhevsky, but this was the biggest score he'd ever piled up on one board.

The obligatory false card

At most tables I expect North would double a 1♠ opening bid, leading to North-South competing to 3♥, and now West had a tough decision. If he re-competes to 3♠, early trump leads leave him far too much to do.

North's re-opening double was far more dangerous than an initial action, and North-South did not escape unscathed. 3♥ was no picnic on the ♦7 lead which went to the 8, jack and ace. At the time, it seemed a sound idea to play the ♦J, not the ♦10, and so it proved.

Declarer played a spade to the ace and ducked a spade. Justine Cushing as West played a third spade, forcing dummy to ruff. Now came the ♥8 to the ace and a club ducked to the jack and queen. At this point, the evidence of the first trick suggested to declarer that he could cross to a top diamond to play a second trump. Wrong!

West ruffed, cashed the ♣A and gave me a club ruff. Another diamond ruff led to three down and all the matchpoints.

Montreal World Championships

Championship events for Juniors and Seniors and everyone in between will highlight the World Championships in Montreal from Aug. 16 through Aug. 31, 2002.

The major team events once again will be the Rosenblum (open) and the McConnell (women). Three pair events will be featured – Open, Women's and Mixed. Then there will be the Par Contest, Senior Teams, Junior Teams, Junior Pairs, Junior Individual, Zonal Mixed Pairs, Zonal Pairs, Zonal Teams and IMP Pairs. Add to that the Transnational Teams, which will take place during the second week.

Even that's not all. Running alongside the World Bridge Federation events will be an ACBL regional, starting on Aug. 16 and continuing through Sept. 2, Labor Day.

WBF and ACBL masterpoints will be awarded in ALL events, both in the world championships and at the regional.

The host hotels will be the Queen Elizabeth and the Bonaventure, with rates starting at US\$115 per night. There are lots of hotels nearby where the rates start at US\$75 per night.

winner in 1965. For more than a decade, he and Barry Crane were the winningest pair in North America. He returned to bridge from 1994 to 1996 so that he could become a Grand Life Master.

He served for five years on the National Appeals Committee, and he held administrative posts at the unit and district levels. He also produced a series of bridge musicals that were performed at NABCs and regionals.

His achievements cover several other areas. He has produced and written fund-raising events and shows that have raised more than \$5 million for a number of non-profit AIDS and drug and alcohol abuse organizations. These shows have starred the likes of Bob Hope, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Gene Kelly, Angela Lansbury and Carol Channing. He is an owner, breeder and exhibitor of pure-bred champion dogs. He also enjoys golf, where he has a 9 handicap.

His interest in the position of League General Council is a very personal one. "I owe so much to organized bridge, especially during my years at Stanford and the 20 years following. Not only has bridge been a source of keen intellectual and competitive satisfaction to me – I have met many people at the bridge table who have become lifetime friends.

"Now, after having established a successful law firm and with the flexibility of choosing the clients I serve, I am jumping at the opportunity to serve as League General Counsel."

Surprising attendance

The table count through last evening is 2473 for Birmingham 2000. Since the pre-tournament estimate for this time was 1988, we are running 24% over the estimate.

Originally officials believed this tournament would draw about 7500 tables. If present attendance continues, the total could go as high as 8700. If so, Birmingham will outdistance St. Louis 1997, which had 8632 tables, a good Fall NABC turnout. Birmingham looks like a cinch to top Minneapolis 1994, which drew 7181 tables.
