# UST FOR NEW PLAYERS 

## Long suits are to die for

By Barbara Seagram



When I was just learning to play bridge, my bridge teacher taught me, "When your partner lays down a five-card suit in dummy, you must smile and say, "Thank you, partner."" While courtesy dictates that we always thank partner, regardless of what treasures (or the lack thereof!) he produces, on this deal, declarer has every reason to be sincere in his thanks!

As the dummy is tabled, declarer warily counts losers. After the lead of the $\vee \mathrm{K}$, he has two heart losers and one loser in clubs. The latter can be easily ruffed in dummy. For the rest, he realizes that there is a potential for a diamond finesse and also for a finesse in clubs. However, none of South's diamonds is a loser - the $A$ and the king rest happily in the dummy - so if he takes a diamond finesse, he risks turning a non-loser into a loser, which would cost him the contract. The same fate could await in clubs.

Let's take a closer look at those diamonds. There are five in dummy and two in declarer's hand, making seven. That leaves six diamonds for the bad guys, an even number. Odds are that the suit will break 4-2. Can you see a winning strategy?

If declarer cashes two high diamonds and then ruffs two in his hand, eventually the 13th diamond in dummy will become a winner. Declarer can then discard a losing heart on it. Note that when you are establishing a long suit in dummy, very


Opening lead: 3 (fourth best lead) Bidding commentary: South's jump rebid to 3 is invitational. Think of it as showing a reasonable six-card suit with 9-11 high-card points.

Lead commentary: In the absence of anything brilliant to lead, the unbid suit is usually a sensible choice.

Play commentary: South might just as well play the king from dummy at trick one. Every so often an ace is underled through a dummy that has shown strength.

Defensive commentary: Given the lead, West cannot have more than five diamonds, which means South has at least three diamonds. Furthermore, West is marked with the jack given declarer's play of the king at trick one. If declarer had the $\diamond \mathrm{J}$, he would have played low from dummy. Also, the lead of a low card strongly
suggests an honor, and the only honor missing is the jack.

Defensive commentary \#2: Given this, East should play three rounds of diamonds, forcing dummy to ruff. Once dummy ruffs, East has two trump tricks as declarer can lead hearts from dummy only once.

Play commentary \#2: If the defenders do not play three rounds of diamonds, a diamond can be discarded on a spade and hearts can be led twice from dummy, limiting declarer's heart losers to one

often the only entries to dummy will be in the trump suit. Thus, when performing long-suit establishment, you must not pull trumps first.

For this to work, it is imperative that you preserve enough entries to dummy. How would you go about it?

Win the opening lead o with the A and then play the $\uparrow 8$ to dummy's queen, saving the 6 to get to dummy's $\boldsymbol{\wedge} 7$ later. Since both opponents follow in spades, you can now cash the $\AA \mathrm{J}$. Next, play dummy's top two diamonds and ruff a diamond. Now go back to dummy by cashing the $\% \mathrm{~A}$ and ruffing a club in dummy. Finally, ruff yet another low diamond and, lo and behold, the $\downarrow \mathrm{J}$ is high. Now you can play your carefully preserved $\uparrow 6$ to dummy's $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$, play the $\$ \mathrm{~J}$ and pitch a losing heart from declarer's hand. Well done!

## had 539.38. Top was 17.

Swartzman and Schoenfield have been law partners for 30 years. They met in law school at Northwestern University. They have been playing bridge together for about 14 years.
"We made an agreement not to let the law partnership interfere with the bridge partnership," Swartzman said.

A few years ago, Schoenfield talked Swartzman into changing their bidding system to Precision, a decision he now endorses.

As for the double partnership, Swartzman said, "We've had a lot of experience working things out."

With a session to go, Swartzman and Schoenfield were in second place, about 10 matchpoints out of first, but their final session was $60.07 \%$, enough to pull them into first.

## Extra ace not enough

South's 1NT was supposedly 11-14 high-card points. The redouble was the start of a runout, and $2 \vee$ presumably showed the majors.

Rogers led the $\vee \mathrm{J}$, and as South put down dummy, she apologized to her partner. "I miscounted my hand," she said. "I have an extra ace."

A sense of foreboding overcame Covalciuc and Rogers as they realized the auction would have been significantly different had South not made her counting error.

Still, there was nothing to do but play on.
Even with the extra ace, it was a tenuous contract, and North tried to scrape up some tricks by making a few low trumps. Declarer won the $\bullet$ A, cashed the $\leftarrow$ A and ruffed a club. Next came a spade to the jack, king and ace, and Covalciuc gave her partner a spade ruff, signaling for a diamond return next. Rogers ruffed the spade and returned a diamond. Covalciuc won the $\downarrow \mathrm{K}$, cashed the $\bullet$ A and gave Rogers a second spade ruff. A club back allowed Covalciuc to ruff with her bare queen for their sixth trick and the magical plus 200.

## Those extra chances

Everyone knows it's important to go for overtricks when you're playing pairs. Finding those extra tricks is often another matter. How would you play this deal from the second qualifying session of the Life Master Pairs (hands rotated)?

Your left-hand opponent's $2 \boldsymbol{v}$ is explained as natural but not showing a good hand. The opening lead is the $\$ 2$. Plan the play before looking at the full deal.

If you play as Eric Rodwell did, you win the $\bullet$ A, play a club to the ace, ruff a club, play a diamond to the king and ruff a diamond. Only now do you play a trump.

Your left-hand opponent wins, but he has no suitable out-card. A heart goes into declarer's A-J, a diamond gives a ruff-sluff. Either way, declarer has 12 tricks and 23.5 out of 25 matchpoints. The full deal:


As you can see, an initial heart or spade lead will hold declarer to 11 tricks because East can ruff the second round of hearts or West avoids the end play. Did you play as Rodwell did after the lead that gives you a chance for 12 tricks?

## Trump stack blues

Sometimes you need more than a lot of declarer's trumps to be sure a penalty double is going to be successful (good spots help, of course). East found that out on this deal from the second qualifying session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs.

Declarer was Dr. Richard Katz, who won the event in 1989 playing with his partner in this year's contest - Bobby Levin. Katz was South.

Katz had longer diamonds, but in responding to his partner's takeout double, he preferred the major because of the form of scoring. Levin's second double showed a bit extra, so Katz bid on. East mistakenly thought he had North-South where he wanted them when they got to the four level in his longest suit.

West started with the AJ, which went to dummy's queen. Katz then played the $\star$ and a diamond to West's king. West exited with a low club, taken by Katz with dummy's ace. He then played the $\uparrow \mathrm{A}$, pitching a club from hand, ruffed a spade with the 4 and played a diamond from hand. West ruffed in with the $\checkmark 9$, overruffed with dummy's jack, then came the fourth round of spades. East pitched his last diamond, Katz ruffed with the $\vee$, then ruffed a diamond with the $\vee$ in dummy (as East underruffed) and exited dummy with a club.

At that point, East was down to all trumps, so he had to ruff and return a trump into Katz's K-10. East got the final trick, but that was plus 790 for Katz and Levin and 24 out of 25 matchpoints.

According to George Retek, ACBL board member, the new insurance policy covers libel and slander in addition to standard coverage.

Unit and district officers attending the Summer NABC in Chicago are urged to attend today's meeting of the ACBL Board of Governors, after which there will be more information about the new insurance. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m. in Grand Ballroom A. The insurance discussion is likely to start at about 11 a.m., according to Retek.

He said that if unit and district officers complete the form for the insurance and send it in by July 26 , their coverage will be retroactive to July 11. Coverage for those who miss that deadline will begin upon receipt of the form.

Retek said unit and district officers are encouraged to consult their legal advisors to determine if the new insurance is appropriate for them. They are also encouraged to consult their legal advisors before terminating any other insurance.

When that held. East played the $\$$ Q to Berkowitz's ace. He ruffed a club, ruffed a diamond (East pitching a club), ruffed his last club and ruffed dummy's last diamond (East pitching another club).

At that point, Berkowitz was in hand with the ^ 843 and the $\vee \mathrm{K} 109$. Dummy held the original four spades and the $\vee$ A J. Berkowitz played a spade to the queen, cashed the $\uparrow \mathrm{A}$ and played a third round. It didn't matter which opponent won (say, if West unblocked the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$ ), Berkowitz could not be prevented from taking the rest of the tricks - without having to guess who held the Q .

Plus 650 was good for 77 out of 90 matchpoints.

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

## Toumament Terminology 101

If you're confused by the terms used to describe the different types of bridge events played at clubs and tournaments, you're not alone. Here=s a list of common bridge events with explanations.

Knockout Teams: an event in which a team (of four, five or six players - with four playing at a time) plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out" while the winners play other winners until only one winning team remains.

The length of a KO match may vary from a single session to a full day (the Vanderbilt and Spingold) to a multi-day event (the Bermuda Bowl).

Bracketed Knockout Teams: a KO event in which teams are divided into groups - usually of 8 , 16 or 32 teams - based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group - Bracket I - and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

Compact Knockout Teams: a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.

Swiss Teams: an event in which a team (of four, five or six players - with four playing at a time) plays other teams in seven-, eight- or nineboard matches. Team A sits North-South at Table 1 and East-West at Table 2 while Team B sits EastWest at Table 1 and North-South at Table 2. The results are compared and scored by International Match Points (IMPs).

Pairings for the first round are random. Pairings for succeeding rounds are determined by a team=s win-loss record or Victory Point total.

International Match Points (IMPs): the most common method of scoring Swiss Team matches. Scoring example: if Team A scores plus 620 for bidding and making 4a on a particular deal and Team B scores only plus 170 (they didn't bid the game), the difference is 450 - which converts to 10 IMPs. The IMP chart is shown on the inside of your convention card.

Victory Points (VPs): a method of scoring Swiss Team matches. After the scores are compared and converted to IMPs, the IMP total is converted to Victory Points. A team's VP total may be used to determine its next opponents and its final standing.

Side Game Series: a series of single-session pair games that pay red points. These series include at least three sessions and may have as many as six. You may play in as many sessions as you like, but only pairs who play in at least two sessions are eligible for overall gold points. Your best two sessions are used for determining overall winners.

Flighted pairs: When flighting is used, the field is divided by expertise or experience or both into several separate games. Flight A - "unlimited
masterpoints" - will be open to all players while the remaining flights will be limited. Flight B might be 0-500 MPs or 0-1000 MPs while Flight C might be $0-300$ or $0-500$.

Each flight is scored individually, and masterpoint awards are made for each flight.

The masterpoint holdings of the players determine their flight. If one player is quite expert while his partner is new to the game, the pair must compete in Flight A.

In flighted events, you may play up but not down. That means you may play in Flight A or Flight B even if your masterpoint holding qualifies you for Flight C. Conversely, you may not play in Flight B or Flight C if you are a Flight A player.

Stratified Pairs: The idea is to compete against everyone but to be ranked only with your peers.

Each pair is assigned a stratum or Astrat@ based on the masterpoint holding of the partner with more masterpoints.

Example: $\mathrm{A}=1000+$ masterpoints; $\mathrm{B}=300-$ 1000; C $=0-300$.

Thus, the most experienced players are placed in Strat A, intermediate players in Strat B and less experienced players in Strat C. Masterpoints are awarded for placings in all strats but gold points are awarded only in A and B.

The game proceeds normally - the difference comes when the scores are tabulated and ranked.

In a three-strat game, the scores are ranked three times. The first ranking is done as in a regular open game. These are the Strat A results.

If a $B$ or $C$ pair does well in this ranking, they receive full credit for that performance. It is not all that uncommon for a Strat C pair to place first overall, and they receive the full masterpoint award for that game.

Note: A pair is eligible for only one set of masterpoint awards and automatically receives the highest award.

The second ranking compares the scores of only the B and C pairs - the scores of the Strat A pairs are eliminated. Once again, if a C pair does well, they receive points for their finishing position in the Strat B results.

The third and final ranking compares the scores of only the C pairs - all the scores of the Strat A and B pairs are eliminated.

Strati-flighted Pairs: The top group plays in a game of their own - Flight A. The rest of the field in divided into strats and plays as in a regular stratified pairs.

There can even be stratification within Flight A. Flight A may be listed as 3000+ MPs while Flight X may be listed as $0-3000$ MPs.


When the Director finds for whatever reason that an innocent side has been damaged as a direct result of an irregularity by the other side, then, he is supposed to assign an adjusted score.

The purpose of this article and others is to closely examine this situation and to provide club directors with some guidelines to follow in the enforcement of Law 12.

The right of the director to assign an adjusted score comes from Law 12A, which states that the director may assign an adjusted score either on his own initiative or on the application of any player when the Laws empower him to do so. The most common situation in which a director awards an adjusted score is when one of the contestants calls the director because of an irregularity by his opponent, and the director finds that there has been an irregularity and that no rectification can be made that will allow the board to be scored and played normally.

There are other situations that may come to the director's attention in the course of a session, and it is possible that the director may decide the best course of action is to award an adjusted score, but he doesn't always have to do so. Law 81C6 gives the director the authority to "rectify an error or irregularity of which he becomes aware in any manner, within the correction period established in accordance with the Law 79C, but the law is worded in such a way as to suggest the director does not always have to perform such a rectification (The preface to this Law states that the Director's duties and powers "normally" include the following).

Thus, if the director becomes aware of a revoke by a player that is not noticed by his opponents, he may not always bring it to other attention of the non-offending side. After all, the players have some responsibility in this game to protect their own interests.

Of course, if it appears that the player who revoked may have done so deliberately or if he attempts to conceal his revoke by prematurely mixing his cards after a claim, the director should intercede. The Laws are designed to provide redress for inadvertent errors. When a player deliberately commits an irregularity, the director should make sure that his side does not profit.

In the case of a claim, the director may have to be more direct. After all, if he has been called to the table to adjudicate a contested claim,, the
players have already asked for his assistance. It is quite possible that they may not be aware of all of the nuances of the Law in this regard. That Law states that the director is to adjudicate the results of the board as equitably as possible resolving all doubtful points in favor of the non-claiming side. What that means is that the director may award a trick to the non-claiming side that the nonclaimers did not see they were entitled to. For example, say that the declarer claims with a trump outstanding without mentioning it. His RHO is on lead and if he leads one suit, his partner will get a trick with his trump. If he leads another, the declarer will get the rest. If the defense due to the fact that they are inexperienced does not see this line of play when the director asks them why they objected, it does not mean the director will not give them a trick anyway. Another example would be where the declarer claims in a notrump contract saying that his hand is high. Of course, one of the defenders has a winner in that suit. If the declarer discards the wrong card from the dummy, he will lose three tricks. If he discards a different suit, he will lose only one trick. Unless it is totally irrational to discard the wrong card from the dummy, the director should be willing to point this out to the table even if the defenders don't seem to be aware of the possibility. This is a case of protecting their rights.

The director also is to assign an adjusted score when the Laws provide no indemnity for the particular type of violation of law committed by an opponent. Probably the most common type of situation where this arises is when the penalty prescribed by the revoke law does not adequately compensate the non-offending side. Thus, if declarer goes down five in 3NT because one of his opponents wisely "held up" his stopper in the dummy's long suit, thereby depriving the declarer of access to those tricks, the director will usually award an adjusted score to give the non-offender the score to which he was entitled. Note that the director is not allowed to award an adjusted score on the grounds that the penalty prescribed by law is unduly severe or advantageous to one side or the other. Thus, it is still possible for the defense to lose the ace of trumps if one of them revokes before the other defender has a chance to take a trick with it.

The director may also award an adjusted score when for whatever reason normal play of the board is not possible. Thus, if one of the players at a table has seen one of his opponents hand or has overheard conversation at another table about a board he has yet to play, the director may decide to award an adjusted score if there is no way to get the board played. In cases like these, it may be possible to have someone else play that board in place of the player who has received the unauthorized information, provided that all four players at the table agree. Of course if this is not possible, then, the director must assign an artificial adjusted score. The number of matchpoints that a side may be able to earn on this board will be relative to their responsibility for the fact that it was impossible to play the board.

## No phones

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

## Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

## Want to play Mid-Chart conventions? Read this first!

Players who wish to use Mid-Chart methods (in events that permit them) must check the ACBL Defense Database for rules governing their use.

If you choose to play a method permitted by the Mid-Chart, you are required to do the following:

1. Pre-Alert the opponents about your method prior to the auction on the first board.
2. Have a complete written description of the method available for your opponents.
3. For certain methods, you must provide your opponents with an approved defense from the database. Visit the ACBL web site at www.acbl.org for details.

ACBL players: help players from outside North America who wish to use Mid-Chart methods to be aware of these rules.

## Killer Lead?

Leonard Harmon of East Hampton NY was the lucky recipient of "The Most Famous Opening Lead on Championship Bridge," the title of Chapter 2 of Charles Goren's book about his television show of the early Sixties.

Harmon appeared on the show four times with partner Ivar Stakgold of Wilmington DE. Together they won several national championships and were second to Italy in the 1959 world championships.

Harmon stopped playing in the early Seventies but has come back to the table following the death of his wife and retirement from his insurance agency. He won the Senior Swiss Teams in Smithtown NY last year. Stakgold remains an active competitor at NABCs.

if the diamond finesse works, there are only 12 tricks. Schafer and Fox climbed all the way to the heart grand slam, unaware of the duplication of the values in the club suit. Neither was particularly anxious to report the bidding.

West could have led the $\wedge \mathrm{K}$, but he opted for a trump, not at all uncommon lead against a grand slam. The spade would have worked, however, and the trump didn't.

Schafer won the opening lead in hand, cashed the $\because$ A and took the successful diamond finesse. Next came the trump ace, the $\Delta$ and the $» K$. When Schafer then ruffed a diamond, the burden of protecting the diamonds was thrust firmly onto West.

Schafer then cashed his trumps, and when he cashed the last one, West was down to the $\uparrow \mathrm{K} \mathrm{Q}$ and the high diamond. Whatever he discarded, declarer had the rest and made his unlikely grand slam.

Subeck (South in the deal above) is not a "shy" bidder. When you bid a lot, you must play the cards well.

The opening lead was the singleton $\downarrow$. East won and returned the $\bullet 10$, which was ruffed by West, who now led ace and a spade to Subeck's king. She ruffed a diamond, while East discarded his last spade. Subeck next shortened her trumps by ruffing a club. Then she led a trump to dummy, felling West's jack. She returned to her hand with a second club ruff, cashed the $\uparrow \mathrm{Q}$ and ruffed a diamond in dummy. The end position:


Subeck led the $\uparrow \mathrm{J}$ and showed her hand to East - making $4 \vee$ doubled for plus 790 and 63 out of 64 possible matchpoints.

## Columnists can play, too

Steve Becker, former editor of the Bridge Bulletin and now a syndicated bridge columnist and teacher, wishes that his singleton spade on this hand had been the deuce, instead of the 8 .


All Pass
Becker could have doubled instead of bidding $5 \star$, but he decided on the overcall because the suit was a six-carder. It looks as if West had a double, but he was much better off passing since he didn't find the killing opening lead - the $\vee \mathrm{A}$ followed by a second heart.

Instead he led the $\boldsymbol{\bullet} 10$, taken with the queen. Becker cashed the $\vee$, noting the fall of the 9 from East. Next came a heart to West's ace, and West continued with his other club. Declarer took this in hand and cashed his two top diamonds. Then he lead another diamond to drive out the jack. He won the heart return and ran the rest of his red cards.

As he cashed his last trump, he was left with a club and the $\uparrow 8$ in his hand and the $\& 9$ in dummy. East had to make a discard holding the $\uparrow 9$ (he had discarded all his high spades, hoping declarer didn't notice that the 9 was still out) and the $\& \mathrm{~J} 8$. No matter which card he discarded, Becker had the remaining tricks - $5 *$ bid and made.

Why did he wish he had the $\boldsymbol{\wedge} 2$ instead of the 8? He wanted the thrill he would have experienced by taking the last trick with the good deuce in a suit that had never been led - maximum style points.
