The winners of the semifinal matches will face off this evening with the winner earning the title of U.S.I and the right to represent the U.S. as part of its Junior team in international competition.

What a Spingold day! Final: Baze vs. Nickell

Richard Schwartz thought his team had beaten Grant Baze by a single IMP -- BAZE thought they had won by a single IMP. One of the Spingold semifinalists was wrong. A careful check of all the results uncovered 1-IMP errors on boards 33 and 45 from the third quarter, and both mistakes were against SCHWARTZ. That meant a final tally of BAZE 141, SCHWARTZ 140. So BAZE will get the chance to defend their 1997 Spingold victory in today's

The surprising John Onstott team started fast against Nick Nickell. ONSTOTT led after 29 boards, but

three boards later at halftime, NICKELL was in front by 15. Then the roof fell in on ONSTOTT. In the third quarter NICKELL scored 82 unanswered IMPs before finally giving up seven on the last deal of the set. NICKELL had no trouble holding on, winning easily, 183-73.

NICKELL, winner of four of the five past Spingolds, will field a team consisting of Nickell and Dick Freeman, Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth, and Bob Hamman and Paul Soloway.

Back to the SCHWARTZ-BAZE match. It was high drama. SCHWARTZ

Plus 800 for a 7-IMP loss

Howard Weinstein, a member of the Bramley team which lost in the quarterfinal of the Spingold to the Cinderella ONSTOTT squad, shared the following story. Any bridge player who's brought back a good result to his teammates in a team game only to discover that IMPs were actually lost on the board will sympathize.

At Weinstein's table, here's what happened on Board 42:

A quick perusal of this layout is sufficient to see that 3♥ doubled is not exactly going to be a success for East-West. Declarer finished down three, so Weinstein and Garner were plus 800.

When they compared scores on the deal with their teammates, however, they discovered they had actually lost 7 IMPs.

Weinstein's teammates went for 1100 in $5\clubsuit$, for a net loss of 300 points and 7 IMPs.

199er action

The Chicago-area winners of the National 199er Pairs, Madelyn Bachman and John Javella, scored a 381.5 in the two-session event to take the first-place honors by a board.

Several good things happened for the winners on this deal. First, Javella and Bachman were allowed to play in 4Ψ (the opponents decided not to compete to $4\triangle$). Second, Javella, who declared from the South position, received the lead of the Ψ J.

Javella won, played a second round of trump and played three rounds of diamonds, discarding a spade from the closed hand.

Next, he played the ♣J from dummy: queen, king, ace. West now played the ♠A and another spade, which Javella ruffed.

Declarer played the ♣8 and ran it when West ducked. Making five was a cold top.

Double victory

Daniel Levin of Chicago won consecutive midnight Swisses playing with totally different teams.

On Thursday his teammates were Hank Youngerman, Roman Shapiro and Sam Ehrlichman. He won again on Friday with Margie Michelin, Jill Steinbaugh and James Barry.

Is this a first?

This may be a first. In one of the semifinal matches of the Friday-Saturday Knockouts yesterday, there was not one American on either team.

One foursome consisted of four English players -- Andrew Macnair, Tim Rees and Peter and Dee Lindon. The other team was tri-national: Brigitte Mavromichalis of Switzerland, Glenn Grotheim and Terje Aa of Norway, and Paul, Jason and Justin Hackett of England. Among the Hackets, Jason and Justin are the twin sons of Paul.

Hook the Four

There has been great depth in the field here in Chicago, indicative of a trend in the North American team games. With so many outstanding European pairs competing, the round of 32 matches are no longer easy, and even the round of 64 can be quite harrowing. To lose in the round of 128 and go 0-for-(the tournament) is the most extreme humiliation. Our group, replete with Bermuda Bowl medalists and national champions, dodged a bullet in the very first round against a team of talented Chinese engineers who hone their partnerships on the Internet with OKbridge.

My partner was Kyle Larsen, and we were joined by George Mittelman, Peter Nagy, Joey Silver and Alan Graves. We trailed at the dinner break, but won by 23 IMPs. More than half the margin came on this wacky deal:

Sitting South, I agonized over 3♣ redoubled. For his redouble I placed Kyle with a strong club holding, probably no worse than king-queen-9-fourth. His 2NT opening had promised 23 to 24 points. With 30 points between our two hands and a triple club stop, I imagined we'd be a good bet for nine tricks in 3♣ redoubled, but if the doubler had seven-card club length or extreme distribution we might easily go down 400 -- or even 1000.

If we make 3♣ redoubled, that's worth 760, not all that much more than the 600 or 630 we figure to score in 3NT. If we go down, that will be VERY expensive.

On the other hand, Kyle is one of the soundest bidders I've ever partnered. If he wants to suggest 34 redoubled as a contract, why not? I passed, and West, suddenly queasy, also passed.

On the lead of a low diamond I had rather an easy time. I won the opening lead in my hand and led the jack of trumps. West covered, and I happily noted the fall of the 8. I now played a spade to my king and a club towards the Q-7-6-4 in dummy.

West split his ♣10-9; I won the queen in dummy and played the 7 of trumps, driving out West's 10. At this point West was helpless. He exited with a diamond and I cashed out dummy's winners. West had to follow to all three spades. With four cards left I took the ♥A in dummy and continued with the jack. When West won the trick and played the 3 of trumps, I was able to take the marked finesse of the 4 (!) and claim the last trick with the 6 of trumps over West's 5.

Three clubs redoubled with two overtricks, vulnerable, plus 1660.

Be careful with your lead-directing doubles. They can be *very* expensive.

Still having fun



The opening spade lead went to the ace, and I led the ♣Q. North covered with the king and was non-plused when he saw his partner win the ace. Another spade came back and I sluffed a diamond as North won. South ruffed the club return and cashed the ♠A. A diamond to North's king followed, and the ♥J went to declarer's king. Declarer cashed the trump queen, dropping North's 10.


With dummy down to good cards in all the side suits, South couldn't score any more of his little trumps. Making 1♥.



(1) Spades and a minor.

We weren't in game, but I still tried to make a lot of tricks. The opening spade lead went to the 10, and I won the spade continuation. I took a successful finesse to the ♣Q and cashed the ace. Next came the ♠A, a diamond ruff, a spade ruff and a diamond ruff. Then I ruffed a club low, leaving:



When I led a diamond off dummy, South ruffed with the KING. Now North tried to claim one more trick with ♥Q-8-3 in front of ♥A-J tight. But South had to lead a black card! I ruffed with the 9 or 10 and North's trump trick disappeared -- a smother play.

Note that if South does not ruff with the king, I ruff low and ruff my last club with the jack. South overruffs and once again plays a black card, smothering North's queen.

Uptown Play

4 a.m., commiserating with my Canadian teammates Joey Silver and George Mittelman after our tough 3rd-round Spingold loss. Mike Nadler, the young, ambitious owner of the Doubles club in bridgemad Toronto, suddenly asks me, "Why did your partner try to drop the king of hearts the last round in the LM Qualifying? We were doing lousy and you guys were practically leading."

"I've been meaning to give that hand to the Daily Bulletin," I reply, nodding "That was one of the great plays of the tournament."

The entire deal:

West wins the ΔJ lead and returns a small spade. Obviously, the hand is solid after the spade lead except for missing king-jack-third of trump. The percentage play is low to the queen, but since this will lose a trick if the suit splits 3-0, it is equally good to bang down the ace and play for a singleton king, if you can be certain that West would never play the jack of hearts from jack-doubleton. Since many Wests would often play the jack from that holding, and Zia might even usually play the jack from a doubleton, the odds favor leading to the queen.

But a truly great player, like Kyle Larsen, my partner on this deal, will look a little deeper. Kyle wins the ΔK , crosses to dummy in clubs, and leads a *low diamond* from the table. East, fearing a doubleton queen in Kyle's hand, rises with the king and tries to cash a spade trick. Kyle ruffs and takes stock. West, who passed in first position, has already shown up with the ΔA -Q, the ΔK , and possibly the ΔK or the ΔK .

Kyle determined that the ♥K in the East hand would give that player at least 12, and possibly 13 or 14 points. With a good 12 points like ace-queen fourth of spades, four or five diamonds to the king, and a hypothetical king-doubleton in hearts, the vast majority of players would open the bidding.

"Kyle placed you with the ace-queen of spades, from your partner's lead of the jack, the king of diamonds you went up with when he led a diamond from the table, plus a possible jack of diamonds or jack of clubs. The king of hearts would give you an opening bid. Isn't that an inspired play, leading a low diamond from the table?"

"You *should* give that to the Daily Bulletin," Joey tells me, resplendent in his Macabbi Bridge jacket, "That is a truly great hand."

Not so easy

John Kelsey produced a fine piece of declarer play on this deal from the first final session of the IMP Pairs. Of course a purist might have wanted to play the grand slam and go down, but even a small slam was not cold.

John reached $6\clubsuit$, cold on any lead but the \P A. However, East-West had been in the auction and West duly led the \P A. John ruffed, cashed the \clubsuit A and ruffed a club. If West had overruffed life would have been easy, but he discarded.

John now realized that spades were 3-1, so drawing trumps would be fatal. He changed his attack, ruffing heart, taking the diamond finesse and then ruffing another heart. Now he cashed the ◆A, ruffed a diamond and threw his last diamond on the ◆K. West could ruff, but that was the defense's only trick.

People-dealt hand

Michiko Tsuda of Chicago by way of Japan was startled when she picked up the West hand on this deal from the Bracketed Knockouts -- an event in which the hands are dealt by people, not computers:

Michiko decided to bid spades first even though she had longer hearts. Partner passed when she jumped to 4Ψ .

She ruffed the opening club lead and immediately led the ♠A, followed by the jack. North ducked, but Michiko wasn't fooled -- North had bid 1NT so she knew he had the ♠K. She let the jack ride, then led another spade, covered by the king and ruffed. Again she ruffed a club and knocked out the trump ace to score up 12 tricks.

Unlikely game

I didn't think much of my chances on this deal when I saw the dummy, but you always have to give a hand your best effort, no matter how hopeless it looks. East made a small error that gave me my chance. The board was played in the first qualifying session of the IMP Pairs.

West led the $\clubsuit J$ which rode to my queen. I led a second club and won West's 10 with the king. Next I led a low diamond off the board , and here is where East went wrong -- he went up with the king. But then you can't make games like this without some help. East thought he was going to be endplayed in spades.

East switched to the ΔQ , and West overtook with the king to unblock. He cashed the $\Delta 9$ and then returned his last spade, which I ducked. I won the next spade and took dummy's two good diamonds. During all this West was having a difficult time discarding. He had to keep four hearts and he had to keep the ΔA to guard against dummy's $\Delta 8$. But he had to come down to just four cards. When he came down to three hearts, I was able to take the last four tricks with my hearts. I took four hearts, two diamond, two clubs and a spade to gain 11 IMPs.

The Facts: 4♣ made four, plus 130 for N/S. North called the Director immediately after he bid 4♣. The Director determined from all parties that South hesitated a minimum of 15 seconds, perhaps more than 30 seconds. The Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative and imposed it (Law 16A2) after determining that the break in tempo suggested further action and N/S improved their score by bidding 4♣. The contract was changed to 3♠ down one, plus 50 for N/S (Law12C2).

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. N/S stated that: (1) a very high percentage of their peers would bid 4 in this position; (2) the hesitation did not suggest action; and (3) the auction militates in favor of bidding since South has at most one spade and very likely at least two clubs and if 4. fails, 3♠ may well make.

E/W stated that: (1) they agreed that probably more than half the field would bid 44, but thought the break in tempo made the bid easier; (2) the hesitation suggested extra values and extra safety; and (3) North hit his partner with 15 HCP and distribution.

Through questioning, the Committee ascertained that N/S's methods did not include any descriptive method for North to bid directly over 1♠.

The Committee Decision: The Committee found that: (1) there had been a break in tempo by South; (2) The break in tempo suggested bidding; and (3) pass was not a logical alternative.

According to Law 12C2, in the event of unauthorized information, the offending pair should receive the most unfavorable result that was at all probable. The Committee decided that North's peers would bid 4♣ in the semifinal of the Life Master Pairs sufficiently often to satisfy this criterion. The Committee acknowledged that there might be an occasional expert who would pass, but decided that there would not be a significant number who would do so. The 4♣ bid was allowed and the contract was changed to

4♣ made four, plus 130 for N/S.

Chairman's Retrospective Note: This Committee (the Chairman included) may have erred in failing to pursue questions about the defense and play of the 4♣ contract. North must play the hand very well to make 4\(\Delta \) against good defense. It is possible that E/W may have erred in the defense to permit the contract to make. If E/W had a chance at a better score on defense than they had playing 3♠, then the Committee should have probed the quality of the defense to determine whether E/W forfeited their right to an adjustment. However, if the answer had been affirmative, the Committee decision would have still have been E/W minus 130. Then the Committee's principal finding would have supported the N/S plus 130.

The Facts: $5 \heartsuit$ made six, plus 680 for N/S. There was an agreed 30-second break in tempo before South doubled 4♠. The Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative for North but that E/W were not damaged because the likely result in a 44 doubled contract was down three, minus 800. The Director allowed the table result to stand.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. North, South and West attended the hearing. West stated that he believed that passing 4♠ doubled was a logical alternative for North. West also believed that the following defense was most likely and would lead to minus 500: ♥A lead, club to the ace, ♣K, ♦A cashed, diamond ruffed, club. When South could not overruff the third round of clubs, the position of the **★**K would be exposed.

North stated that he bid 5♥ because his defensive values were doubtful and he had great playing strength.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided the actual result that would occur without the break in tempo was so unclear that it was impossible to assess whether damage to E/W had actually occurred. Reasonable defense could lead to minus 800 $(\P A, \text{ club to the king}, \P A, \text{ diamond ruff, club to the }$ ace, diamond ruff). Imaginative defense could lead to minus 200 (underleading the ♥A to get partner in to lead diamonds).

The Committee decided that E/W had not been damaged because it was most likely that the defense would lead to minus 800. Therefore, for E/W the table result was allowed to stand. N/S were assessed a procedural penalty (Law 90A) in matchpoints equal to the difference between the score for plus 680 and plus 500.

The Facts: 3NT made five, plus 460 for E/W. The E/W agreement was that 2NT showed both three hearts and four spades. West's 2NT bid was explained (upon request during the auction) as denying three hearts and denying four spades. The Director ruled that N/S's poor result was a consequence of the misinformation and allowed the table result to stand. The Director assessed a one-quarter board procedural penalty against E/W for failing to notify the opponents

that the explanation of the 2NT bid was believed to be erroneous (Law 75D2).

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. North, South, and East attended the hearing. On the lead of the ♠3, West won the ♠10 in dummy and led a heart to the 10, losing to the queen. North then decided that since declarer was going to make 3NT, it was right to defend passively, continuing spades. North contended that with the correct information he would have led a diamond at trick one to which South would have contributed the discouraging 9 (upside down signals) and he could then have played the ♣A and ♣10 after he won the ♥Q to defeat the contract

E/W admitted that there was misinformation and that they accepted the procedural penalty. They thought, though, that North's stated defense was unlikely.

The Committee Decision: It was the opinion of the Committee that the misinformation affected the opening lead and that North would have led a diamond if he had been given the correct information. On the diamond lead, it was very likely that West would have won in dummy and finessed South for the ♥Q. When North won that, it was very unlikely that North would continue with the ♣A-10. A passive defense attempting to give nothing away was far more likely. Even though North would have a complete count on the hand, cashing the ♣A is too fraught with danger to be a likely defense or even a probable one. Although on the play of eight red tricks North would come under some pressure, the Committee thought it likely that N/S would defend well enough to win three tricks. The contract was changed to 3NT made four, plus 430 for E/W (Law 12C2).

The Facts: 4♠ made four, plus 420 for N/S. North broke tempo before he bid 3♠. At the end of the auction North explained that 3♦ showed four-card spade support, a doubleton diamond, and a maximum. The Director ruled that there had been a break in tempo and that the 4♠ bid would not be allowed. The contract was changed to 3♠ made four, plus 170 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. South and East attended the hearing. South said that his was by no means a practiced partnership. He thought that had his partner not been interested in game, he would have re-transferred by bidding 3\nline and then passing 3♠. He interpreted his partner's 3♠ bid as invitational. He acknowledged that there was a short break in tempo. He claimed that his 3♦ bid showed only four spades and two diamonds, not necessarily a maximum.

East stated that North had admitted at the table that they had no such agreement that 34 was invitational. He added that North said that his understanding of their partnership agreement was that the 3♦ bid showed a maximum as well as four trumps and a doubleton diamond.

The Committee Decision: The Committee decided that once South showed a maximum notrump opening with four spades and a doubleton diamond, Daily Bulletin Page 5


he had told his whole story. Without a clear understanding that $3 \triangleq$ was encouraging by North, South's decision to accept his own invitation to game might have been influenced by his partner's break in tempo. The Committee was in agreement that pass was a logical alternative to South's $4 \triangleq$ bid. The Committee considered a split decision possibly awarding E/W minus 420. However they determined that minus 170 was an E/W result that was very likely and would probably occur about 80% of the time. The contract was changed to $3 \triangleq$ made four, plus 170 for N/S.

When the players were called back, South accepted the Committee's explanation and decision in an exemplary manner. It was also explained that had his partner bid 3 in tempo, and had he then wished to "take a shot," no one would have questioned him. Once the break in tempo took place he was no longer allowed to be brilliant. The Committee commended both players for good conduct during the appeal.

Chicago — a major bridge center

5-A

The Chicago area has been a major bridge center for more than 100 years.

In the early days, Chicago was home to the Chicago Whist Association, the Midwest Bridge Conference and the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago.

The club donated the Chicago Trophy in 1929 for the four-session national Open Board-a-Match Teams. The trophy remained in play until 1965 when it was retired and replaced by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy.

(The Chicago Trophy was un-retired in 1995 and is now awarded to the winners of the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams.)

The Forties were the formative years of the Chicago Contract Bridge Association (CCBA), which provided all levels of competition in an expanding bridge market.

The Kibitzer, one of the first locally published bridge publications, was born during this period and continues to be published monthly.

The Fifties was a decade of turmoil and change. The CCBA was incorporated in March 1956.

During a reorganization of the ACBL in September 1956, districts were formed. Chicago became a part of District 13 which also included

Northern Indiana, Wisconsin and Upper Michigan.

As more people began to play bridge, the ACBL again created more units and districts. In the mid-Sixties District 13 was changed to include only Chicago (CCBA), the Milwaukee area (GMBA) and WUMBA, the middle and upper part of Wisconsin and upper Michigan.

Today the District boasts a membership of more than 4900 ranging from players with multiple NABC titles to school students just learning the game.

District 13 Directors

Joseph J. Stedem (1899-1983) served as ACBL president in 1968 and was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1971. Stedem served two terms on the Board of Directors: 1949-50 and 1964-69.

He was a trustee of the ACBL Charity Foundation 1972-75 and served as Foundation president 1973-74. He was also president of the CCBA and the Midwest Bridge Conference.

Stedem helped initiate the ACBL policy -- be-

ginning with the Summer NABC in 1949 -- of holding the championships in many locations. Most previous championships had been held in the Greater New York area but the success of the Chicago tournament cemented the new policy.

Grace (Mrs. Leigh) Grant was elected in 1955 for a two-year term. Grant lives in Munster IN, at that time a part of District 13.

Irving A. Berkson (1915-1991) was elected in 1958. He was a company president who lived in Northbrook IL and won several regional events.

Northbrook IL and won several regional events. **Dorothy Collins White** (1904-1997) was known

as "Mrs. Bridge" in Racine WI. She was a member of the ACBL Board of Directors 1961 to 1964 and served as executive secretary of the Wisconsin-Upper Michigan Bridge Association for more than 15 years.

Stedem served his second term from 1964 to 1969.

Leo Spivack, retired Chicago attorney and investment banker who now lives in Miami, was ACBL president in 1979 and chairman of the Board of Directors in 1980. He served as a member of the Board of Directors from 1970 to 1985.

He was chairman of the ACBL Appeals and Charges Committee in 1974, 1975, 1977, 1978 and 1982. He was

CCBA president 1968-70.

Barbara Nudelman, retired Chicago advertising executive, was ACBL president in 1993 and chairman of the Board of Directors in 1994. She represented District 13 on the Board from 1985 to 1997 when she chose not to seek re-election.

Nudelman served as chairman of the ACBL Board of governors in 1983 and 1984 and as president of the ACBL Educational Foundation 1991-92. She is president of District 13.

She was chairman of the 1980 Summer NABC in Chicago and is chairman of this NABC.

Harriette Buckman was elected District 13 director in 1997 and took office in 1998. She lives in Lincolnwood IL and is a retired teacher who now geaches bridge. A Gold Life Master, Buckman is a member of the board of directors of Unit 123 (Chicago). She is also unit membership chairman, unit record and chairman of the unit's conduct and ethics committee.

Solomon-like solution

Early in a session of the IMP Pairs, Richard Potter was playing a hand, and he believed he had received some illegal information about the deal He had overheard someone say it was necessary to finesse in trumps (there were between and dummy, missing the queen), and it looked as if this must be the hand. DIRECTOR!

The director was not Solomon but he solved the situation like Solomon. He told Richard and his brother John to change seats so that John, who had not heard any remark, would play the hand. John didn't take the finesse -- down one.

Ike would create a bridge channel

Ike Mutlu, son of Ulkur Mutlu and general manager of Armstrong Cable Services, was asked the following question, as were executives of other cable businesses:

"If you had all the money in the world, what kind of cable channel would you start?"

This was Ike's answer:

"In honor of my mother and senior citizens, I'd create a channel all about duplicate bridge. She goes to tournaments all over the country, like one where 42,000 attendees filled 14,000 tables. These players tend to have high-end demographics, and they are avid, rabid bridge players."

Killing defense

We came up with this defense in the final session of the IMP Pairs.



Declarer won the opening lead of the ♠J and ruffed a spade. When he ducked a club to North's jack, North fired back a trump to the ace. Declarer led a club to the ace and gave up a club to North's king, South discarding the key ♠9. North led a low diamond to the queen and ace, and a diamond came back to North's king. The spade switch then sealed declarer's fate. He ruffed in dummy but had no escape. He chose to try a diamond, ruffed by North and overruffed by declarer. He now had to lose the last trick to South's long trump -- or give up a spade to North. Down one for a gain of 6 IMPs.

Inference in the auction

Partners Linda Lewis and Karen Barrett, members of the winning MUNSON team from the Wagar Knockout Teams, had an excellent auction on the following deal from the second final session:



Lewis' 2NT was natural and non-forcing. Barrett's 3♥ bid asked Lewis to clarify the nature of her stopper. The double by West and Lewis' pass suggested a tenuous heart stopper with North. Barrett now knew that there were few wasted heart values on the deal, so she jumped to 5♠ to suggest her pattern to Lewis, who now properly evaluated her side-suit aces to bid the slam.

This result was an 11-IMP pickup for the MUNSON team, since the opponents stopped in 5♣ in the other room on the following auction:

Here, the 1♦ opener was Precision. This, coupled with the heart barrage by the opponents, made it difficult for the opponents to judge the extent of fit on the deal.

At both tables, the contract was 3NT by East after an uncontested auction.

In one room Barrett was on lead against Juanita Chambers of the WEI-SENDER team. Barrett led the $\bigstar K$, which Chambers allowed to hold the trick.

Barrett then switched to a low diamond and Chambers went into the tank. She finally guessed correctly to put up the Φ K, and made the contract with one spade, two hearts, one diamond and five clubs. Note that if Chambers lets the diamond ride toward her jack, North will win the queen and clear the suit, making Chambers dependent on the heart finesse, which fails.

In the other room, Jill Levin of WEI-SENDER was on lead against Kitty Munson.

Levin also led a high spade, but decided to continue the suit at trick two. Munson won the ace perforce, ran the clubs and also decided to try the diamond finesse instead the heart finesse. Making three for a push.

In a gripping match, Baze-Whitman and the Poles jumped out strong, leading by 37 at the half. Schwartz nearly blew out the Polish sausage in the third, smoking back 76 IMPs to lead by 33, headed to the wire. In the toughest loss imaginable, the I-95 boys, (Levin-Weinstein), Frisco Smith, and Horse-Canyon (Lair-Schwartz), lost 12 IMPs on the last board to lose by 1.

Earlier in the fourth quarter, Zmudzinski chose to defend four vulnerable spades holding the equivalent of a strong 2 spade bid -- amazingly his opponents contracted to take ten vulnerable tricks at spades -- despite containing a total of two trumps. The Z-Ski analyzes all 52 cards during the bidding, he gets it right! No slam his way, and he collects 800 on defense -- no double, just down EIGHT vulnerable tricks! Simultaneously, the other Ski's go plus 200 against 6 spades doubled. If it wasn't what happened, it could not be true. Fortunately, this amazing confluence of events saved the Bull from an ignomious 0-2 in the semifinals.

For the Bull, this was not the only bad news of the day -- the Bull himself was nearly hamburger meat (and I mean Bovine fatality) as Hamman-Soloway and Meckwell stampeded roughshod over a tired Cinderella Onstott. Congrats to the losers, it's tough bridge. A special salute by the Bull, to Wittes-Grabel, winning the GNT, before succumbing four-handed with Compton-Onstott, to Nickell, the U.S. Bermuda

Bowl representatives.

#1 Baze v. #2 Nickell

Nickell's boys are rested, Baze never sleeps, Whitman in the finals for the first time ever, Meckwell super strong, Hamman-Soloway the world's best pair? Folks, the team can play. A special tribute for Zmundzinski-Balicki and Lesniewki-Szymanowski: the first foreigners to begin to consistently perform in the big three -- Spingold, Reisinger, and Vanderbilt. They have mental toughness -- look for them to win in Lille. In Albuquerque and Chicago combined, the Poles and Baze have won three matches by a total of 4 IMPs.

In the final, only 64 boards, Nickell is fresher because of a romp in the semis. The Poles hang tough, but Meckstroth-Rodwell use MAFIA in the fourth quarter to bid to the cold 7 clubs with KQJ10 opposite Ax. At the end, Nickell stands up to take a bow, Nickell by 2.



From childhood dream to World titles

Mary Jane Farell built a childhood fascination with bridge into an all-star career that includes four world championships and induction into the ACBL Bridge Hall

She and former teammate Dorothy Truscott, another Hall of Fame inductee, were the first two American women to earn the rank of World Grand Master, the World Bridge Federation's highest ranking.

Mary Jane earned the rank by winning the 1966 World Mixed Pairs with Ivan Erdos, the 1970 World Women's Pairs with Marilyn Johnson and the 1978 Venice Cup with Johnson and teammates Truscott, Emma Jean Hawes, Jacqui Mitchell and Gail Greenberg.

She added the World Women's Team Olympiad crown in 1980 with the same team.

Mary Jane's bridge career began in Cincinnati where she grew up. "I saw bridge at home and was fascinated by the time I was nine," she says. "I couldn't wait to get home from school to kibitz whenever my mother had a game at our house. I loved it."

She was introduced to duplicate at age 17 when the family moved to Los Angeles. "Once I began playing duplicate, I couldn't play often enough."

Mary Jane married one of her partners, Arnold Kauder, shortly before World War II began. The couple was later divorced but Mary Jane remembers Kauder as "a marvelous bridge player. It was he who put the polish on my game."

She began teaching after the war ended -- "women used to call me up and ask for advice on bidding, play of the hand, defense -- whatever."

Her professional playing began much the same way. "People made me a pro," she once said. "They offered to pay for babysitting and card fees, and they would pick me up and transport me to the tournaments."

Her feelings toward bridge are favorable. "It's really nice to have a hobby that turned into a living. I feel very fortunate. Bridge has been good for me and to me."

She's given back to bridge, serving on appeals committees at regionals and NABCs -- and hosting "Coffee with Mary Jane" seminars.

Today Mary Jane describes herself as "a crusader and a champion of the less experienced player." She plays mostly at the club level with longtime pupils. "My friends are the little people in the bridge world" is her proud boast.

When the singleton heart was led from dummy, Fisher was now able to duck, allowing Hamilton to win his king. The defenders were also due a diamond trick, so the contract was defeated one trick. Plus 200 for North-South.

Note that if Fisher goes up with the ♥A, declarer can now take a ruffing finesse against South's ♥K to shed the diamond losers in dummy.

This was a 7-IMP pickup for Fisher's team, since the opponents went down one in $5 \triangleq$ at the other table.
