Nickell rallies for breath-taking victory in Vanderbilt

In a match that could have gone the other way on the final board, the Nick Nickell squad won their first Vanderbilt Knockout Teams title with a thrilling 161-143 victory over the valiant Richard Schwartz team.

The champions are Nickell, Richard Freeman, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell, Bob Hamman and Paul Soloway, the veteran who kept returning to the bridge table from the hospital, where he was being treated for an infection.

The runners-up are Schwartz, Drew Casen, Zia Mahmood, Michael Rosenberg, Robert Levin and Steve Weinstein.

The win is the last piece of the puzzle for Nickell and company, winners of every other major team championship on the ACBL calendar for which they are eligible. They have won six of the last seven Spingold Knockout Teams titles and three Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams (several with former teammate Bobby Wolff) since forming in the early Nineties. The team also has victories in the International Team Trials and two wins in the Bermuda Bowl, including the 2000 championship in Bermuda in January.

Hamman was asked how it felt to enter the elusive Vanderbilt winner's circle for the first time since 1973. Said the world's No. 1-ranked bridge player: "It's better than losing."

Soloway, who said he plans to take a couple of

International pair out front in Open Swiss

Two Italians and two Americans took a slim one-point lead in the Open Swiss Teams qualifying. Andrea Buratti and Massimo Lanzarotti of Italy plus Gerald Sosler and Kay Schulle of the U.S. will lead 44 teams into today's final.

Only a point behind were Mike Cappelletti, Gary Cohler, Mark Lair and Richard Finberg.

Another Italian-American team was in a tie for third place. On the team are Alfredo Versace and Lorenzo Lauria of Italy plus Americans George Jacobs, Ralph Katz, Steve Garner and Howard Weinstein. They are tied with Les Bart, Craig Ganzer, John Saxe and Steve Gladyszak.

Wei-Sender ahead in Women's Swiss

The team captained by Kathie Wei-Sender took a lead of 7 Victory Points into the final day of the Women's Swiss Teams. Playing with Wei-Sender were Juanita Chambers, Betty Ann Kennedy, Jill Levin, Janice Seamon-Molson and Tobi Sokolow. Twenty teams made the cut.

An all-New York City team was second – Gail Greenberg, Laurie Vogel, Jacqui Mitchell, Lynne Tarnopol and Amalya Kears.

Teams captained by Hjordis Eythorsdottir, Flo Newlin and Brenda Jacobus were in a three-way tie for third place, 16 points behind the leaders.

They're invisible, but they do the job

The two persons whom most players never see are the tournament directors who run the show. That's because they're too busy making sure everything is going just right, that the conditions are the best possible for the players.

At this tournament, the head director is Chris Patrias of St. Louis, and his assistant is John Ashton of Portland OR.

"This has been a good tournament," said Patrias. "For once we have not had a cause celebre. Everything has been going along smoothly, and the few glitches that occurred were not apparent to the players. One of the biggest pluses: we were able to keep the same type of events in the same venue all the time."

Ashton thoroughly enjoys working with Patrias, "and the only chance we get to do this is at NABCs – our tournament paths don't cross. As for the tournament itself, the players have been exemplary, with

Two teams from District 21 were next. Bruce Tuttle of Berkeley CA and Sathya Bettadapura of Campbell CA were in second place, followed by Mark Robichek and Franz Lanziner of Sunnyvale CA.

In fourth place were District 1 representatives Karl Hicks of Dominion NS and Bernie Britten of Howie Center NS. Hicks is a regular at NABCs, but usually as a member of the directing staff.

Georgia pair out front in NAOP C

Jane Bachman of Dunwoody GA and Andrew Gaffner of Decatur GA, representing District 7, were the leaders in Flight C of the North American Open Pairs after two qualifying sessions. They will lead 28 pairs into today's two-session final.

Close behind were two pairs from District 1. Anne and Leo Mahoney of Hillsborough NB were second, followed by William Sharp of Orleans ON and Philip Inshaw of Gloucester ON. A District 5 pair, F.X. Plunkett and William Bedard of Bolivar PA were fourth.

On the lead of the ♦2, East, Vince Oddy, won the king and shifted to a low heart that went to dummy's queen. Trying to make something of dummy's spades, Dunitz led a low spade to the 10 and jack. Not a good start, but when West, Barbara Clinton, shifted to the ♣10 Dunitz had another chance. He put up the ♣Q to the ace, won the diamond return in dummy and ran the red suit winners.

On the ♣10 lead, Meyers ducked – an imaginative shot. She won the club continuation and could succeed legitimately by ducking a heart. But this needed a lot of things going for it to be right. Instead Meyers played a spade to the ace and another spade. East's best move is to put in the jack (Meyers would be hard-pressed to read this), but he won the king and shifted to a low diamond to the 10 and jack. Back came a diamond to the king. Then the ♣A squeezed a heart out of East.

Now Meyers cashed the ♥A-K, then exited with a diamond to East. East could cash the ♦A-9, but then had to lead a spade at trick 12. Meyers guessed right for nine tricks and a great board.

Cincinnati NABC table count tops 10,000

Another better-than-expected day Saturday boosted the 2000 Spring NABC table count to 10,182.5 with one day to go.

Although it's unlikely that the tournament will equal the 11,003 from the previous Cincinnati NABC, there is still a chance. Table count often drops dramatically as the tournament draws to a close, but attendance has held steady throughout the week.

The International Bridge Press Association gives annual awards for the best defended hand of the year. It will be hard to better this one by Zia and Rosenberg from the Vanderbilt semifinal.

Zia led his singleton diamond to the jack and ace. Declarer played the ♣J and when South did not cover flew with the king to North's ace. Rosenberg cashed one top diamond as Zia pitched a low spade. Now North carefully cashed his ♠K, extracting declarer's loser before crossing to his partner with the ♣Q. Another club was ruffed by Rosenberg with the ♥10 as declarer overruffed with the jack. The ♥Q went to South's ace. Zia played a fourth club ruffed with the 7 and overruffed with the 8. The position was:

Declarer had made three tricks and led the ♥6. Zia played the 3 and now declarer was in the unenviable position of either playing another trump allowing Zia to claim the rest or playing a diamond which would let Rosenberg cash two tricks as Zia pitched his two black cards and then enjoy his king-5 of trumps for down four and 1100 to North-South. This was a 12-IMP swing to the Schwartz team when North-South made a non-vulnerable game.

It may seem that declarer can save a trick by discarding a diamond when North ruffs in with the 10, but this is not so. North continues with two high diamonds, and when declarer ruffs with a high spot South discards. He takes the first high trump and leads another club which North uppercuts with the 7. Now declarer has the J64 of hearts left to the the A53 with South and must lose two more trumps.

Problem solving

Nearly everyone played 2♦ here when on the auction 1♦ - 1♥ - 2♣ - 2♦ neither East nor West had much chance to reopen with 2♠. When the defense started with three rounds of hearts, Debbie Rosenberg ruffed and played ace and another spade. West (a hotshot jurist), seeing the trump promotion, ducked smoothly, but Debbie put up the queen notwithstanding and now was in dummy to play a club to the queen. For doing his best to confuse by following with the 10, setting up an idiot's finesse. Now Rosenberg guessed the ♦/q correctly by passing the jack. Then she drew trumps and led a club to the king, collecting plus 130 and virtually all the matchpoints.

This board posed a number of problems for both sides – here are two of the nicer declarer plays made.

The auction typically started with South doubling 1♠ and saw East-West compete to 3♣ over 2♥, but then the paths diverged. When Brian Crossley was West, he bid 3♣ and South doubled him off. The defense led the ♦10, and when Crossley put up the king, South erred by winning to lead three rounds of hearts it is best to duck the diamond so as not to aid the trump coup). Crossley ruffed, finessed the spade, led a club to the jack, then played the */S*A and ruffed a spade. This was the ending:

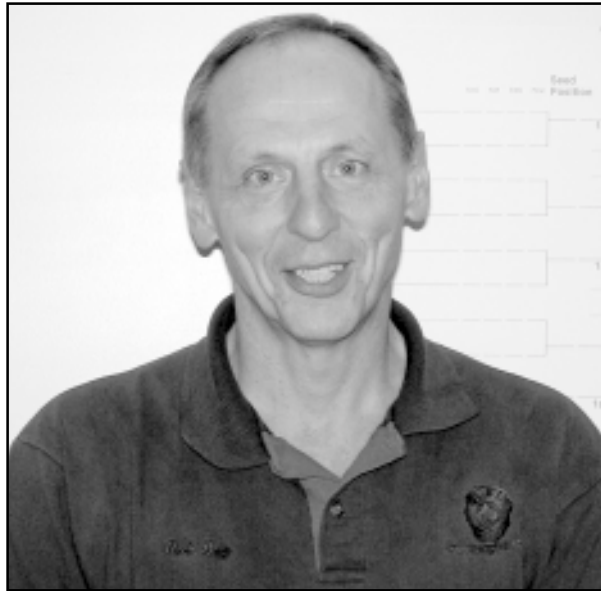

Crossley led a diamond to dummy, ruffed another spade and exited with a diamond to collect is *A-Q for plus 470.

Debbie Rosenberg competed to 3♥, and the defense led a club to the jack. Now best defense is probably to lead the ♣A and another club (he hand is practically an open book for West now since there are only 16 high-card points between East and North). But West quite reasonably shifted to the ♠9 East cashed two rounds of spades and played a third. Rosenberg ruffed, cashed the top hearts and led a low diamond to the 10 and queen. This was her ending:

When you play against the ACBL's finest, you've got to work it all out. Again, there was not much diversity in the auction (our action was 1♦ 1♠ Dbl Pass 1NT 2♠ All Pass)

Typically East got to play 2♠ in a competitive auction, and South had no real reason not to lead a diamond, his partner's suit. The whole hand revolves around declarer trying to reach dummy to take the spade finesse, which the auction has indicated will succeed. Should he win the first diamond and lead a sneaky low heart toward dummy? This ploy fails if North has the ♥A and also if South is awake (would I have been, I wonder). Dave Smith actually returned a diamond at ricktwo, and Rosenberg won the 9, cashed the ♣K and ♦K, then exited with the ♥7. Smith put up the ♥K, but I knew he had six spades, three diamond and a club. Since I knew all of my partner's high card points, I ducked this, and the ♥Q. I won the third heart to play a club, locking declarer in hand to hold him to 110 for a 75% board.

What happens once can happen again

Tournament Director Bob Donaldson saw this proved during Friday's Senior Pairs event. He was called to a table where dummy had gone down with one ace. The contract was 6♥, and the dummy had been asked how many aces his partner had shown with a 5♦ response to Blackwood. "One," he said – but he still had gone on to the slam. To go down only one it was necessary for declarer to knock out both aces – otherwise he was headed for a two-trick defeat.

Three rounds later Donaldson got another director call. It was the same board, and the dummy

This is not about whether West made a good or bid reopening bid – it's about the defense that the champions found. Rosen, North, got off to the most effective lead, the ♥J.

This held the trick, as did the ♥10 at trick two. She shifted to the ♣K, taken by declarer, and declarer tried the ♦Q. Rosen took this and offered declarer a useless sluff-ruff, cashing the ♣Q and continuing with a third club.

Declarer ruffed in dummy and pitched a diamond from hand. She led the ♠8 from dummy, put up the 10 and lost to Rosen's ace. Once again she led a club. Declarer ruffed in dummy with the jack, dummy's last trump, and sluffed another diamond from hand.

This allowed Stein to get rid of her last diamond. When declarer tried to cash a diamond, Stein ruffed and led the ♥A.

Declarer ruffed with the 5, so Rosen was able to overruff with the 9. She led still another club, forcing declarer to ruff, so Stein still had to score a trick with her trump queen. Declarer was held to five tricks while Rosen and Stein chalked up plus 500 for all the matchpoints.

New Life Masters

WOJCIECH KANIEWSKI went over the top in style. He needed only one gold point to make the Life Master Grade, but he won the third bracket of the Compact Knockout Teams and won eight golds. His partner was Wojciech Golik of St. Louis, and their teammates were Charyl and Scott Davis of St. Louis.

Another who went over in style was JERRY HUNTSMAN of Richmond IN. His team won the Flight B Swiss Teams on Thursday. His teammates were Bill Armstrong, Nancy Perz and Bonnie Hertzog.

RITA BOEH of Cincinnati made the grade in the Fast Pairs.

Another victor – she won the Friday night 299er Pairs – earned far more than the .54 points she needed to go over the top. That was JOY CELLARS of Centerville OH. The victory won her 2.42 points. Her partner, Sandy Milford of Centerville, has all the colored points she needs, but she still needs to win another 115 points of any color.

was down with one ace. When he had been asked what his partner's 5♦ response meant, he said, "One ace." But he took went on to the slam with only one ace and no void.

It turned out that both players who went on to six thought their partner had made a mistake in saying 5♦ because the earlier auction seemed to indicate a hand that had to have at least two aces.

The Facts: The contract was 3♥ and the opening lead was the ♠9. The following end position was reached:

South, on lead, led the ♦6. Dummy heard ? diamond and separated the two cards but didn't pick up either or put either in a played position. North thought declarer had called diamond and thought dummy's separation of the 8 from the king was putting the 8 in play so he played the 9. Declarer said, believing he had called for the king and seeing that he had won the trick, discarded his good spade. He said if North had covered the king with the ace, he would have trumped and won the last trick with his good spade.

The Director ruled that dummy had played a card that declarer did not name (Law 45D). Therefore, the Law allows the play of the king. North was allowed to change his play to the ace and declarer was allowed to change his play to the ♥K. The contract was assigned as 3♥ made three, plus 140 for E/W.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. In screening, all four players agreed that the ♦K had not been called. They all agreed that declarer had called for either a diamond or a low diamond. N/S believed that declarer had made an error in playing to the trick from his own hand based on a misunderstanding about which card had been played by dummy and that he was not entitled to change his play once he had made that mistake. Declarer believed that both tricks should belong to him, since both cards in his hand were high and since he would never have played as he did unless he believed his hand was high.

The Panel Decision: Since there was no longer any disagreement about the incomplete call of the card from dummy, the Panel thought it was right to apply Law 46B2 which says "If declarer designates a suit but not a rank, he is deemed to have called the lowest card of the suit indicated" ("except when declarer's different intention is incontrovertible"; Law 46B). Since no change of play by dummy was being allowed, the trick stood as played. The contract was changed to 3♥ down one, plus 50 for N/S.

(1) Break in tempo

The Facts: 7♥ made seven, plus 1510 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♣J. The Director was called after the 7♥ bid and was told that a long hesitation had preceded the 6♥ bid. The Director ruled that there was unauthorized information from the break in tempo and that the 7♥ bid could not be allowed. The contract was changed to 6♥ made seven, plus 1010 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. N/S thought it ridiculous that a 16 HCP hand could not bid a grand slam after a 2♣ opening bid. They agreed that a 5NT bid would have shown all the keycards. South thought Roman Key Card in hearts applied while North thought Roman Key Card in clubs applied. When asked why she had not bid seven over 4NT, South said that North was in control. When asked why she bid seven over 6♥, she said because her hand was so good.

The N/S convention card showed 22+ for 2♣ opening bids, although this pair's style was to open with less if enough tricks were present. They were told to mark their cards accordingly. They agreed that ♠Kxx ♥AKQxxxxx ♦--- ♣x was a 2♣ bid as was ♠AK ♥KQJxxxxx ♦x ♣x. E/W (who had been interviewed separately) believed it took North one minute to bid 6♥.

The Committee Decision: Interviewed together, two expert players thought that pass was not a logical alternative for South until they were given the two example hands which with this pair would have opened 2♣. They then said that pass would be a logical alternative to 7♥. The other two players consulted also thought that pass was a logical alternative. All thought the slow 6♥ bid "demonstrably suggested" bidding 7♥ (Law 16). The contract was changed to 6♥ made seven, plus 1010 for N/S. Two expert players thought this appeal had merit, one thought the players of the experience level involved (5000 and 3800 masterpoints) should have known that this appeal lacked merit. The Panel decided the appeal lacked substantial merit and assigned N/S an Appeal Without Merit Penalty Point.

few exceptions, even though it seems they have had to walk endless miles to and from the events. And the staff has come through every time we've asked them to do something special. It's been a good tournament."

Patrias' spirits were especially high yesterday – not only was the tournament progressing well, but he was helping his wife Charlotte celebrate her birthday.

Patrias was a late starter in bridge – he didn't learn the game until his dorm mates needed a fourth. He read Alfred Sheinwold's "Five Weeks to Winning Bridge" – "it took me six weeks."

He really crammed during spring break, and then a few weeks later he represented Michigan State in the Intercollegiate.

How is this possible? Well, all Patrias had to learn was partnership bidding. He was a veteran of cut-throat pinochle – the three-cornered version. The play of the cards is just as important – and just about as difficult – as in bridge, and you have to bid to name the trump on every hand.

"I learned pinochle in college, too. There was no card playing in my home. But I took to cards like a duck to water."

He played casual bridge for a while, finally joining the ACBL in 1971. He became a Life Master by placing first in the old Senior Master -Advanced Senior Master Pairs event at the Denver NABC in 1972. His best playing year was 1976 when he finished well up on the McKenney list.

Yes, but how did he get into directing? "Bobbie Shipley and Dale Egholm ran the tournaments I attended, and I used to get my matchpoints over their shoulders. One day they asked me if I had any interest in becoming a director. I told them I'd like to try it."

That was the start. He certainly remembers the first sectional he ever ran. "I had 26 tables in the Open Pairs, and I ran it on a 25 top. I had to matchpoint both 25-top sheets. I never did that again!"

He also remembers his first board-a-match event. When he started directing, everything was Swiss Teams. But there are a couple of BAM events at NABCs, and he was assigned to work one. There he was, working an event that he had never even played in. "It was a Reisinger, and it ended in a four-way tie. I was really sweating – I figured I must have made a mistake. But it really was a four-way tie."

Ashton's bridge career started early – his parents saw to that. They taught him the game when he was 8, and they took him to play in his first tournament when he was 11. He started attending Nationals (that's what they were called then) in the Sixties – he remembers that his first one was Louisville in 1964.

"I learned bridge from my parents, but I learned BRIDGE from Easley Blackwood. I lived in Indianapolis, and Easley ran the bridge club there. He taught me two major lessons – how to win and the importance of ethics."

He remembers Dean Weisbach, the national director from Cincinnati, very fondly. "She had a commanding presence. When she said, 'Find your places,' we rushed to find our places. She was the person who first got me interested in directing."

If he enjoyed playing bridge so much, why did Ashton turn to directing?

"Money! I needed to earn a little extra money. And I enjoyed the work. I was always some kind of mathematical whiz, so I enjoyed doing those sheets we used to do. And the camaraderie was great. It was always fun working with my fellow directors. There isn't as much camaraderie today – guess we can blame the computers for that. Now a director will handle four or five sections, so you're not around the other directors as much as we used to be."

Multiple winner

Ken Schutze of Austin TX has placed first in five events at this tournament – North American Pairs Consolation, Bracket 1 of the Charity Knockouts, one of the Board-a-Match Teams, the Flight A Swiss and Bracket 1 of the Morning Knockouts.

Eber took on the job with customary energy and put together one of the top 10 all-time Spring NABCs in terms of attendance, due in no small measure to the emphasis placed on food and entertainment. "If you get them here," she says, "we'll keep them here."

Players had a great time in 1994 and, thanks to Eber's experience and continued emphasis on entertainment, the 2000 Spring NABC has lived up to expectations again.

In fact, at the point in the NABC where attendance starts to drop dramatically – with two to three days to go – the tournament is holding steady. The steep dropoff has not happened.

"I believe attendance has stayed up because of the entertainment," Eber said. "In the long run, that's what people remember. We make sure they have a good time."

Eber says she was surprised when the ACBL decided to schedule another NABC in Cincinnati just six years after the previous one. "I never dreamed they would come back so soon," she says.

Eber managed to get the majority of her committee chairpeople from 1994 to work on the 2000 tournament, and they spent the better part of the last two years getting ready.

For her, Eber says, the real crunch started about the first of the year. "Since January," Eber says, "I have had no life – just my job and the NABC."

Lucky for the ACBL, Eber's job has prepared her well for organizing an event such as the Spring NABC.

She is executive director of the Family and Children First Council, an umbrella organization for about 80 agencies serving children in the Cincinnati area. The council is considered the top one of its kind in Ohio.

"I organize a lot of workshops and big meetings," Eber says.

The NABC, of course, most certainly qualifies as a big meeting – and Eber, with the assistance of her various committee chairs and about 600 volunteers, has managed the "meeting" with only a few glitches.

Most players, she is convinced, have had a great time. "I can't tell you how many strangers have come up to me and said thanks for all the work we've done. It's been very gratifying."

Eber said the ACBL staff, in particular Nancy Foy and Jeff Johnston and his crew, have been outstanding. "I can't say enough about them," Eber says. "My people have told me all they have to do is think about something and these guys take care of it."

She also praised her own group. "Everyone has been wonderful about helping out – even with something that wasn't in their areas."

Eber is proud of the entertainment assembled for the NABC – and her favorite part was the appearance by Elvis (Ryan Pelton). Eber, a die-hard Elvis fan, believes she may have made a few converts that night: "I knew it would be a hit."

months off, said he feels "a lot better than before" the match. He suffered much of the week from an infection relating to removal of a vein from his leg for open-heart surgery late last year.

The way the event started, it appeared Nickell team members were going to have to wait until next year to add the Vanderbilt to their trophy cases.

Schwartz, seeking to win his third Vanderbilt in the last four years – with a variety of teammates – jumped out to a 58-14 lead after the first 16 boards.

Nickell stormed back with a 54-26 second set and seemed ready to put on a run to the championship. Schwartz added another 9 IMPs to the team's lead in the third set, however, and entered the final 16 boards ahead, 113-88.

The Nickell squad picked up 11 IMPs in the first three boards, to pull to within 14, but an 11-IMP setback put them down by 25.

With eight boards to play, the Schwartz squad seemed in control, leading by 20 IMPs.

With Hamman-Soloway at one table and Meckstroth-Rodwell – arguably the world's hottest pair at present – at the other, the Nickell team made their move. Over the next four boards, they put together two game swings, a slam swing and a partscore swing to forge into the lead, 150-134.

The Nickell squad seemed in control, but on the next-to-last board, Hamman and Soloway bid to a miserable 4♥ and suffered minus 300 on tough defense by Zia and Rosenberg. Meckstroth and Rodwell went down at the other table for a loss of 9 IMPs.

With a board to play, Nickell was ahead by 7 IMPs. The Schwartz team had a chance to win on the final board.

Rosenberg knew Soloway was void in diamonds, so he underled his ♦A K, forcing dummy. On the lie of the cards, the slam was unmakeable as long as dummy was tapped a second time. Hamman ruffed the opening lead and played a spade to his ace, followed by a second spade. In with the ♠K, Rosenberg could have defeated the slam by playing another diamond, forcing dummy and establishing a long spade winner for Zia. Rosenberg, however, got out with a club, and with the ♥Q falling doubleton, Hamman was able to claim for plus 980 and an 11-IMP swing. Had the slam been defeated, the Nickell team would have lost 11 IMPs – and the championship by 4 IMPs.
