Patron Member + Cohen = fun in Charity Pairs

It's not unusual for a Patron Member to be nervous at the prospect of playing with Larry Cohen at an NABC. After all, Cohen is a many-time North American champion and a famous author.

None of this fazed Nanette Hegeman Thursday night. The Roseland NJ resident remembers playing against Cohen – formerly of New Jersey – years ago when his regular partner was Marty Bergen.

Just because she wasn't nervous didn't mean Hegeman wasn't excited, however.

"It was beautiful," said Hegeman of the Stratified Charity Open Pairs session. "He is so wonderful. He really knows how to treat his partner."

Hegeman, originally from New York, started her bridge career in the Empire State, playing with her husband, the late A. Stewart Hegeman, after he re-discovered bridge late in life.

Although she is retired as a computer programmer, she stays busy as the editor of the Unit 140 newsletter, *The Declarer*. "It's a lot of work," she said.

A longtime fan of Cohen, Hegeman said she is a faithful follower of *The Law* (the law of total tricks, the topic of Cohen's most famous book).

On the following deal, *The Law* was not really a factor so much as Hegeman's creative opening bid and an opponent's being in the wrong place at the wrong time.

Aging expert Roth still driven by love for bridge

At the age of 85, Al Roth knows his best days as a player are behind him. He has physical problems and, until he played in the Open Pairs I Friday with Terry Michaels, Roth had not picked up a card in nearly two years.

With failing vision and diabetes, the 85-year-old Roth is not the same player who won more than two dozen North American championships and represented the U.S. in the Bermuda Bowl three times in the Fifties and Sixties.

That does not mean, however, that Alvin L. Roth is through with bridge.

The Boca Raton FL resident still has a deep-seated love for the game and a burning desire to

John Kranyak of Bay Village OH and Peter Grover of Aurora OH held a slim lead after two qualifying sessions of Open Pairs I. Their total of 1695 put them slightly ahead of Mike Cappelletti of Red Bank TN and Lawrence Hicks of Coquitlam BC, who posted a two-session score of 1690.17.

In third place were Richard Katz of North Versailles PA and Grant Baze of La Jolla CA, with 1648.

The news is all good about Karl Johnson

Remember Karl Johnson? He's the National Tournament Director who was No. 1 in the Midwest from the day in 1967 when he was promoted to the top level until he retired in 1988. As mentioned in the Daily Bulletins at the Boston NABC last November, Karl has been having a running battle against cancer.

The news is good, according to Patty Johnson, the director who is in charge of Operations at NABCs and who now runs most of the major tournaments in Florida. "There was serious concern that the cancer had spread," Patty reports, "but a guided needle biopsy he had last Monday came back clean. He's going to start radiation next week to clean up whatever may be left. He should be good for several more years."

What makes Patty feel especially good is that Karl is strong enough to be back on the golf course. "He's back to shooting 83 and 84 the way he used to. He shoots a round a couple of times a week, but he's going to try to up that to three a week soon."

The Johnsons now live in Sebring FL, and they have lots of contact with other former ACBL people. Their most constant companions are Harry and Sandy Clark. Harry also is a former National Tournament Director who was best known for his quiet approach to tournament bridge – just about nothing ever got on Harry's nerves. And Sandy was Julie Greenberg's chief assistant in the Education Department. Now Sandy is the head paginator for the local paper. The Johnsons and the Clarks frequently get together to play mah jongg – usually about four times a week. And Harry is Karl's regular companion on the golf course.

The Johnsons and the Clarks also see a lot of Johnny Wisner, another former National Tournament Director, and his wife Daniela. Johnny and Daniela also are very much into the golf scene. They play bridge together about once a week. And they enjoy surfing around the Internet. They live in Florida only half the time – they spend summers in Montreal.

Higher and higher?

Look at the following North-South hands from the first session of Friday's Open Pairs I and decide how many spades (four, six, more?) you would like to be playing.

♠ A 6 5 2
♥ A 5
♦ K 7 6
♣ K 9 8 6

♠ K J 9 7
♥ Q 10 2
♦ A Q J 9
♣ A 4

Oh, all right, I'll tell you that the opening lead is the ♥4 (by East): 10, J, A. Any better idea of what contract you'd like to be in?

Well, Alan Sontag, sitting North, playing with longtime partner Gladys Collier, found himself in 4♠, probably not the optimum spot. The play to trick one went as described. Sontag then cashed the ♠A, everyone following, and led a second spade, East playing low and Sontag inserting dummy's jack, West playing the 10. On the ♠K West pitched a heart. Sontag then played four rounds of diamonds, pitching a heart from his hand as West pitched a... well, what should he pitch? The full deal:

Dlr: West ♠ A 6 5 2

Vul: E-W ♥ A 5

♦ K 7 6

♣ K 9 8 6

♠ 10 3

♥ K J 8 6

♦ 8 5 2

♣ J 10 7 3

♠ Q 8 4

♥ 9 7 4 3

♦ 10 4 3

♣ Q 5 2

♠ K J 9 7

♥ Q 10 2

♦ A Q J 9

♣ A 4

If West pitches a heart, Sontag ruffs out the ♥K, establishing dummy's queen for his 13th trick. If West pitches a club, Sontag plays ♣A, ♣K, ruffs a club in dummy to establish his 13th trick in the form of the 13th club -- a nifty little trump squeeze.

In practice, West pitched a club. Those who know him know that Sontag rarely stops for thought, even in quite difficult bidding or play situations. Well, this was no exception. Sontag played as described without so much as a moment's pause for thought.

Plus 510 may not have been a top, but the play was certainly tops!

Hegeman's 1NT opener would not be everyone's choice, but it worked out extremely well in this case. Cohen, guided by his high-card points and, to an extent, by the law of total tricks (West could have no more than seven spades, and he was contracting for an eight-trick contract with a paucity of high-card points), had no trouble applying the ax to West. The upshot was quick and bloody. West managed three trump tricks and the ♥A, finishing down four for minus 800. Hegeman was disappointed that the score was good for only 10 of 11 matchpoints, but she was thrilled with the evening of bridge. Said Hegeman: "We had a wonderful game."

You can score big on little hands

Gary Cohler found an attractive line to bring home a good matchpoint score here.

On the lead of the ♦J Cohler ducked, as did North. The ♥Q held the next trick, which may appear inferior but which might be necessary to cut the defense's communications. The ♥J went to the king, and Cohler ran the ♠J successfully. A spade to the queen (nice play) and king was followed by a club finesse, North ruffing. North tried a third heart, which Cohler ruffed, leaving this ending:

Cohler exited with a diamond, and North won his queen and ace. But then North was endplayed to concede a ruff and discard. Cohler could ruff in hand to pitch dummy's club, then cross to the ♣A and draw the last trump with dummy's 8 to make his contract.

see bridge rise to the level of popularity it enjoyed in the Forties and Fifties.

"I know I can do it," says Roth, who claims he hasn't slept much in recent weeks because of the ideas he has swirling about in his head – ideas he believes could bring about a bridge revival.

Roth is making his first appearance in years at an NABC at the behest of longtime friend Michaels, who played with Roth frequently when the two lived in Washington DC in the Fifties.

"We used to have a group that would play together," says Michaels, who now lives in Prairie Village KS. "We would have an auction that would go 1♠, Pass, Pass, Pass – making six – and it would be a push because there was another Roth-Stone pair at the other table."

Roth was not happy with his game on Friday, but Michaels seemed to be enjoying herself. "I've enjoyed talking to him," she says. "He likes to talk about bridge."

He should. He's been doing it throughout his playing career, which spans 65 years.

Generally regarded as the most original bidding theorist of his generation, Roth is the inventor of an impressive array of conventions still popular with tournament players. Here's betting you have these Al Roth inventions on your convention card: negative doubles, unusual notrump, forcing 1NT and weak two-bids.

He's still at it, too. Roth recently devised a convention card he's been giving away that features all of his gadgets. He claims it's a simple system, easy to learn and a perfect complement to the lectures he hopes to give to stimulate interest in bridge. Roth plans to give a copy of his convention card to each person who attends one of his lectures.

Throughout his long career, Roth has never stopped inventing – and tinkering with his inventions.

The sometimes cranky expert was born in New York and learned to play auction bridge at City College of New York. One day, someone mentioned that there was a new form of bridge being played – and overnight everyone Roth knew had switched to contract bridge.


He cut his bridge teeth at the Mayfair Club, owned and operated at the time by Harry Fishbein. Roth later bought the club from Fishbein and ran it for 25 years.

Along the way, Roth and Tobias Stone were credited with creating the Roth-Stone system, now synonymous with super-sound opening bids. Roth still believes in the efficacy of that approach. "When you open weak hands, you destroy your partner," Roth avers.

Roth has taught bridge in country clubs, run a bridge school in Washington DC and operated bridge clubs in Miami Beach and New York City, always inventing, and creating ways to sell bridge. "I had the first IMP duplicate game in the country, and I was the first to introduce bid boxes," he says. "I saw them at a tournament in Switzerland and brought them back to use at my club."

Roth claims to have influenced many successful players. Michaels counts herself as one of them.

"Al has no idea how many of the things he taught me that I still play," she says.



After leaving Board, Moeller is still busy

Is there life after Board for former longtime members of the ACBL Board of Directors. If Don Moeller, District 11's representative to the Board for 25 years, is any example, there may be more life after than during.

Here's a breakdown on the kind of life Don is leading now:

- Trustee for the ACBL Charity Foundation, including serving as treasurer since 1984.
- Treasurer of the Midwest Monitor since 1974.
- Member of the District 11 Board of Directors since 1970.
- Treasurer of District 11 since 1995.
- Volunteer for two days' work a week for the Kettering Medical Center.
- Co-manager of the development fund for the Lutheran school in Miami Valley.
- Trustee for the ACBL Pension Foundation.

"I don't miss being on the Board," Don says. "I'm not at all disappointed to be relieved of all that responsibility. I still enjoy the work I do with the Charity Foundation, and all those other activities keep me pretty busy."

"I also belong to a club, but I don't play bridge. I play gin rummy. I'm still interested in bridge, but more as an academic exercise than as a game to play."

Roth loves to tell the story about an up-and-coming player he counseled on one occasion. He told the budding expert that it pays to take a minute or two to think about the play of a contract. During that time, Roth told him – especially if you're looking for a key card such as a queen – the player holding the card might become nervous. If the nervous player puts his hand down in his lap, that could be a dead giveaway.

Later on, Roth found himself at the table against that very same player. As it happened, Roth needed to find a queen to make his contract. He paused after the opening lead, and noted his former student put his hand in his lap. Roth played his former student's partner for the missing card – successfully. "It was reverse psychology," Roth says with a laugh.

In 1955, Michaels and Roth, playing with Gratian Goldstein and Harold Harkavy, won the Master Mixed Teams at the Summer NABC in Chicago.

On one of the key deals, Roth held this hand

Michaels says she knew Roth had a huge fit with her, and "if they made the wrong opening lead, I would make it."

She was right. East, holding the ♠A K, tabled the ♣A, noting with horror the dummy Roth put down. Michaels' hand (spot cards not exact):

♠ 5
♥ A Q 9 8 3
♦ K J 6 2
♣ K Q 7

Says Roth: "The first rule of the game is to buy the contract, and I knew everybody's hand. I knew when the guy bid 4♠ that he had 10 or 11 black cards."

Another famous Roth story centers on the 1955 Bermuda Bowl. Playing against a team from Great Britain, Roth found himself in a contract of 2♠. After the opening lead, he left the table and approached the tournament director, Al Sobel.

Said Roth: "I've played this hand before."

"Impossible," Sobel said.

Roth insisted, and finally Sobel said he would throw out the deal if Roth could name all the spot cards in the other three hands. To everyone's amazement, Roth did just that. Interestingly, the first time Roth played the deal he was defending against a 1NT contract.

Stories like this, Roth says, help keep the interest of groups of aspiring players. Roth says he is willing to lecture to any group, and he hopes he will hear from some units or districts. "I can create interest in players to get better," he says. "I get them stimulated."

Glossary of bridge terms, part 2

Rookie, masterpoints, stratified pairs -- these terms may be confusing to new members of the American Contract Bridge League. Here's a list of terms and their meanings:

Masterpoints: the unit which measures bridge achievement in competition. Masterpoints are awarded at ACBL clubs and tournaments in amounts proportional to the size and classification of the event and the rating of the club or tournament.

- Black points: **awarded at club games. Some special club games award red, gold or silver points.**

- Red points: **awarded for section placements at regional tournaments and NABCs. Also awarded at clubs for special events such as the qualifying rounds of the North American Open Pairs and the Grand National Teams.**

- Gold points: **awarded for section firsts and overall placing in regionally rated or NABC events that have no upper masterpoint restrictions.**

Gold points are also awarded for sectional firsts and overall placing in regional events of two or more sessions that have a masterpoint limit of 750 or more points.

One gold point is awarded to section winners in the annual ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game in sections of seven or more tables.

In addition, new players may now win gold points in their own NABC events: .50 gold in the National 49er Pairs at the Spring NABC, 1.50 gold in the National 199er Pairs at the Summer NABC and 1.00 gold in the National 99er Pairs at the Fall NABC (the remainder of the award is in red points).

A major source of gold points is the Bracketed Knockout Teams. The overall awards for the top brackets are all gold while the lower brackets may receive a percentage of gold points and the remainder in red points.

- Silver points: **awarded for sectional and overall placing at sectional tournaments. Also awarded at Sectional Tournaments at Clubs (StaC).**

Barry Crane Top 500 race: This trophy is presented to the ACBL player who wins the most masterpoints during a calendar year. Originally the McKenney Trophy, it was put into play by William E. McKenney, ACBL executive secretary. It was known as the *McKenney Trophy* from 1937 to 1981.

The list was expanded to include the top 500 players in 1982 and called the *Top 500* from 1982 to 1985. It was renamed the *Bainry Crane Top 500* in 1986.

Crane, who was sl in July 1985, was ACBL's top masterpoint holder at that time and was acknowledged by his peers to be unequalled as a masterpoint winner

and a matchpoint player.

Mini-McKenney races: In 1974 the ACBL Board of Directors voted to recognize masterpoint achievements among player below the rank of Life Master. *The Bridge Bulletin* recognizes leaders ACBL-wide. At the unit level, winners in each category receive recognition and special medallions.

All points won during a calendar year are counted in these races.

Ace of Clubs contests: This competition was created in 1984 to recognize achievement at the club level. Winners are recognized at the unit level as well as ACBL-wide.

Points won only at the club level -- excluding the North American Open Pairs, the Grand National Teams and Sectional Tournaments at Clubs -- are counted in these races.

Masterpoint races: ACBL recognizes the players who win the most masterpoints in their categories during the calendar year. The categories include Life Master, Bronze LM, Silver LM, Gold LM, Diamond LM, Grand LM, Youth, Junior, Senior and Richmond Trophy.

These are the various categories and the requirements for each category at the beginning of a calendar year:

Rookie: 0-5 masterpoints

Junior Master: 5-20 points

Club Master: 20-50 points

Sectional Master: At least 50 points, including 5 silver

Regional Master: At least 100 points, including 15 silver plus 5 red or gold

NABC Master: At least 200 points, including 50 pigmented points of which 5 must be gold, 15 must be red or gold and 25 must be silver

Life Master: 300-500 points

Bronze Life Master: 500-1000 points

Silver Life Master: 1000-2500 points

Gold Life Master: 2500-5000 points

Diamond Life Master: 5000-10,000 points

Grand Life Master: 10,000 points and a North American Bridge Championship or its equivalent

Youth: age 19 and younger

Junior: age 25 and younger

Sectional: points won only at sectional tournaments

Senior: 55+ years, points won only in Senior events

Richmond Trophy: awarded to the Canadian player who wins the most points in a calendar year.

Don't be afraid to call the Director

Martha McGhee, co-chair of the 1998 Orlando NABC, was IN chairman at the 1992 NABC. This article appeared in the Daily Bulletin at that tournament.

Call the who ...? The Director! It's okay to call the director. In fact, if you don't, you may lose your right to call him later if you are damaged.

The director is the one who sold you an entry, the one who passed out the boards, the one who passed out the hand records and said, "Duplicate, please." The director is the one who organized the players and the boards so that everything runs smoothly at the right time, the right speed and the right direction.

The director is the one you need help from if and when an irregularity happens at your table. The director gives rulings pertaining to the "Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge."

In order for the conditions of the game to be fair, everyone has to follow the same rules. The director is familiar with these rules and is responsible for seeing that they are correctly applied.

The director is also the one who calls the rounds when it is time for you to meet your new opponents. The director puts the results of each board into the computer and posts the computer print-out of results after each session.

When you need a director, raise your hand and call out "Director, please" -- loudly enough for him to hear but not so loudly that it disturbs the other players. When the director arrives at your table, he will listen to what happened and explain to the players the ruling that pertains to the irregularity.

Some rulings have several options, so if you don't understand them fully, don't hesitate to ask for them to be repeated.

Since the conditions at each table must be duplicated as much as possible, all the players must adhere to the same set of rules. The director's main objective is to make the game as fair as possible for all the players involved, while ensuring that everyone has an enjoyable time.

Irregularities that may happen at your table for which you must call the director: a lead out of turn, an insufficient bid, a revoke, a card missing from a hand, a bid or pass out of turn, failure to Alert an artificial bid, changes of call, disagreements of tricks won, claims with trumps outstanding or disputed claims, bidding errors, etc.

The director is your friend. Do not hesitate to call him or her. In fact, if you don't call the Director, you may have lost the right to call him or her later when you discover you have been damaged.

North couldn't keep the high spade plus three diamonds, so Chambers took the 10 tricks she planned to take.

She thought this would be a win, but it was a push – the same squeeze in a notrump contract occurred at the other table. However, the half was enough – Chambers' team won the event by half a point.
