# Paul Soloway 1941 – 2007



Paul Soloway, the ACBL's all-time leading masterpoint holder and one of the great players of all time, died of complications from an infection on Nov. 5 at a hospital in the Seattle area. He was 66.

At the time of his death, Soloway's masterpoint holding was at 65,511.92, more than 6000 ahead of second on the list.

Tributes to Soloway poured into ACBL Headquarters as word spread of his death, and it was reported in many newspapers across North America. Many stories and remembrances of Soloway will be included in subsequent Daily Bulletins.

Bobby Wolff, another of the game's great players, praised his colleague and former teammate:

"Paul touched everyone in positive ways . . . He was always the same, one of the greatest bridge players ever (top five for sure), a truly fierce competitor, a wonderful and understanding teammate with a totally ethical and honest approach to the game (never seeking undue advantage), always ready to play, and one who never made excuses for anything. Yet, his life was gentle, (if Shakespeare will excuse me) but the elements so made up in him that nature might stand up and say to all the world, 'This was a man!' "

Former ACBL Board Member Alan Le Bendig added, "Paul loved this game, and he did what he could to make others enjoy it. His ethics and sense of fair play were always beyond reproach.

We lost a true giant of this game with Paul's passing."

Soloway was elected to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 2001, the first year he was eligible (minimum age of 60) and was inducted in 2002.

He was a key member of the Nick Nickell team that has dominated North American and world bridge for more than a decade. He was a member of the winning Bermuda Bowl team five times, the latest in Monte Carlo in 2003. He also won more than two dozen North American championships.

At his last NABC this summer in Nashville, Soloway was part of the winning squad in the Spingold Knockout Teams, his ninth win in that event. He was scheduled to play with the Nickell team in the Bermuda Bowl in Shanghai, China, this fall but his illness kept him from making the trip.

Soloway lived in Mill Creek WA, a suburb of Seattle, with his wife, Pam.

I've been asked to write a few words to you every day, welcoming you, encouraging you and helping to ease your way into the world of bridge. "You've got creative freedom, Marti," said the editor of this great little newspaper. "Just keep it to

about 500 words." (Yeah, sure.)

After reading this, Mr. Editor may just revise that creative freedom policy. Defensive commentary: East signals encouragement with the ♠8 (not the 7!), the higher of equals. The ♠8 also denies the ♠9. The defense reels off three spades, and East switches

with the ♦Q, South ruffing.

Play commentary: East, a responder who has passed an opening bid, has shown up with 4 HCP, the ♠A. If East had the ♣Q, he would have had enough to respond. West must have the ♣Q, so there is no point in finessing. After trumps are drawn, declarer plays the ♣K and ♣A, hoping the queen drops doubleton. Guess what?

## Memorials and Honorariums

#### Walter Miller II

"It's time to look at your partner, tell them you love them, all is forgiven." This is the closing announcement Walter makes during the last hand of every game he runs. It never fails to bring quite a few chuckles in the room, for haven't we all done something that needs "forgiving" at the bridge table? Walter likes nothing better than to have a room full of happy people playing bridge.

The rules of his game are stringent: 1. Have fun; 2. Be nice to your partner; 3. Be nice to your opponents. Walter teaches active ethics, proper bridge etiquette and a love for the game, all with his dry sense of humor that brings newcomers not only back to his game, but also into the folds of the ACBL. His 49er game continues to be the game of choice for newcomers. They wish to remain in his game even after they graduate. Walter is a superb teacher and mentor. His book, Duplicate Winning Bridge, is the source he uses to give free mini-lessons at the beginning of each game. He has taught more than 1,000 students over the years.

Bridge was interfering with his studies at Harvard, so he gave up the game — for a while. Walter has won three regional events, was listed in the top 300 of the national masterpoint competition in 1985 and even created a convention called the Miller.

## In Memory of Irene Miura

Irene Miura was born in Santa Cruz on July 18, 1939. During WWII, she and her family were sent to the Japanese American internment camp at Poston AZ. They returned to their home in Santa Cruz after the war where she completed her education, eventually graduating from UC

With her masters degree from the College of Notre Dame and PhD from Stanford, she was a professor of child development at San Jose State and later executive assistant to the president at thw school, retiring in 2004. She published more than 45 articles and abstracts and presented more than 90 papers in various professional conferences worldwide.

She served as a member and president of the California Alumni Association Board of Directors and was a member of the UC Board of Regents and the UC Berkeley Foundation Board of Trustees. She remained involved in both the athletic and academic aspects of Cal throughout her life.

She loved the challenge and competition of duplicate bridge and will be remembered as a brilliant and hardworking person with a great sense of humor. She was very upfront and honest, a person with humble beginnings who placed a great value on education, family and friendships.
