In ACBL play, Sokolow has won all five women's national titles at least once and holds the rank of Grand Life Master. She lives in Austin TX and is a former realtor and social worker.

Hand and Greenberg had a maximum carryover of four boards. Their score of $50.12 \%$ in the first find dropped them to fourth place. "We were depressed," said Hand, "but we didn't give up."

The pair rallied to score $57.66 \%$ in the evening session. Even so, they were only ahead by 1 matchpoint with one round to go.
"We knew we were back in contention," said Hand, "and we were playing hard at the end."

The winners' final tally was 2049.50. In second place were Steve and Kerri Sanborn. Their score was 2030.62, just ahead of the third-place pair of Tobi and David Sokolow who finished with 2028.04. (Top on a board was 64.)

The winners have been partners for nearly four years. He is a full-time player and Greenberg owns Honors Bridge Club in her hometown of New York City. Hand lived in Panama for 19 years, but moved to Florida after leaving. He now resides in New York

## Memories of Detroit

Coming to Detroit was not just a trip to attend another bridge tournament, but it also marked my return to a grand city with great history and tradition. It was here that my bridge story began to take shape, where my exposure to good bridge started a
 long and gratifying journey. And although I lived in Ann Arbor and loved that magical university town, its people and the fine quality of bridge that was played in its clubs, my fondness for Detroit, my second home, will endure as long as I live. No matter where I am, I'll always cheer the city, root for its sports teams and cherish my many wonderful memories, especially those with the bridge crowd.

## Rubber bridge with Fred Hamilton

Before there was Cobo Hall, the Silverdome or the Palace, there was the Metro Bridge Club in Southfield. The elite of Detroit bridge played at that club during its heyday (in the late Sixties), and on any given day, you could find such greats as Chuck Burger, Sylvia Stein, Fred Hamilton, Bud Smith, Joan and Vince Remey, Howard Perlman, Judy Radin, the legendary Helen Sobel Smith, Cliff Bishop and many others.

One day, I drove to Detroit (from Ann Arbor) early. I had lunch at the deli across the street from the bridge club, then waited at the door for Russell Roosen, the manager and noted bridge player, to arrive. As he let us in, some of us decided to play money bridge, Chicago style.

## Seeds 1, 3, 5, 6, 8 exit Vanderbilt

The high seeds took a pounding in yesterday's Round of 16 in the Vanderbilt Knockouts. Jimmy Cayne's top-seeded team (Weed, npc) lost narrowly to Jim Mahaffey's 16 -seeded team, 126123.5. (The odd amount was the result of an appeal adjustment.) Mahaffey - Gunnar Hallberg, Fredrik Nystrom, Peter Bertheau, Zhao Jie and Fu Zhong becomes the 1 seed.

The No. 3 seed led by Lou Ann O'Rourke could not hold on against a late-charging John Onstott, the 14 seed, losing the match 135-114. Onstott's lineup includes Jim Krekorian, Tarek Sadek, Walid Elahmady, Terje Aa and Joergen Molberg.

No. 4 Ralph Katz trailed Andrew Rosenthal's squad by 19 IMPs after three quarters, but won the last set by 27 IMPs to advance to the quarterfinal round, 139-131. The Katz roster features George Jacobs, Robert Levin, Steve Weinstein, Zia Mahmood and Michael Rosenberg.

Aubrey Strul (No. 5) fell behind early in their match against Ron Rubin's team (No. 12), and despite narrowing Rubin's lead in the second quarter, faded in the second half. Rubin advances 155-119. Team Rubin: Russ Ekeblad, Peter Weichsel, Marcin Lesniewski, Louk Verhees and Jan Jansma.

The Russian/Polish Gromov team (No. 6) had a dreadful first quarter against the all-Polish Martens team (the original No. 22 seed), and did not recover. Martens won 125-97.

No. 8 Connie Goldberg lost to No. 9 Barnet Shenkin 139-101.

## E-ban takes effect at Summer NABC

Players are reminded that a new ban on electronic devices goes into effect for all nationally rated events at the 2008 Summer NABC. The new policy reads as follows:

Electronic devices, excluding health-related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and mini-computers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.

These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.

A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.

Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

These devices are not permitted near the playing area, even if they are turned off.

# （1）UST FOR NEW PLAYERS <br> Taking advantage of opposition bidding 

## By Lynn Berg



Sometimes it seems as if the opposition action is really a bother — using up our bidding room and making it hard for us to communicate．There are also times when we can take advantage of their actions to make problem solving easier． A takeout double is
a fine example．Suppose you hold：

Most of us wouldn＇t open this hand in first or second seat，but a $1 *$ opening on the right allows a takeout double，promising at least 12 playing points and at least three cards in each unbid suit．

Consider this hand：
ヘKJ92 •32 AKJ64 ャ97． $1 *$ is opened on your left．Your partner passes，and your right－hand opponent bids $1 \boldsymbol{\bullet}$ ． Now your double is for the unbid suits，a convenient way to tell partner what you have．

Lead－directing doubles are another way to use the opponents＇bidding．When they use an artificial bid or a cuebid，your double tells partner what to lead．
－If the opponents use Stayman or transfer bids after a 1 NT or 2 NT opening，double to tell partner where your length and strength is．
－If partner opens 1 NT ，double their $2 \boldsymbol{*}$ overcall to say that you had planned to bid Stayman yourself．Some players also double $2 \star$ and $2 \downarrow$ overcalls of 1 NT as＂stolen bid transfers．＂
－Suppose the auction goes：1v－2＊（partner） $-3 *$（limit raise or better in hearts），double 3＊as a lead－directing bid．
－If the opponents are using Gerber or

Blackwood，double a response to tell partner what to lead．You should have a holding with at least a couple of honors，such as K－Q－x－x．

Do you remember the Sherlock Holmes story about the Hound of the Baskervilles？Holmes makes a deduction based on the fact that a dog didn＇t bark．You can do the same if you are using lead－directing doubles． Let＇s say you have：
＾972 ๒ J 108 •J1087 \＆743．
You are leading against $6 \boldsymbol{\sim}$ ． Blackwood was bid on your right，and the answer was $5 \boldsymbol{v}$ ．Your partner didn’t double，so lead the $\bullet$ J．Either suit might be right，but you know partner didn＇t double for a heart lead．

You can also take advantage of the opposition bidding to let your partner know what sort of raise you have． Consider these hands：
1．ヘ92 ヤKJ8＊ 5432 ャQ643 2． 92 ヤKJ86 5432 ＊Q63


Partner opens $1 \downarrow$ ，RHO overcalls $1 \boldsymbol{\downarrow}$ ．Now it＇s your turn．

With the first hand，you have a single raise to $2 \vee$ ．

In competition，you can agree that with hand \＃2 you bid $3 \boldsymbol{\vee}$ ．This shows single－raise values with four－card support．It＇s obstructive to the opponents， informative to your partner，and it＇s usually safe because of the nine－card fit．

With hand \＃3，you should bid $3 \bullet$（limit raise） without the overcall．You have a limit raise with four－card support．If you play－as you should－ that $3 \vee$ shows a weaker hand（in competition），you have to come up with a plan after the opponents

interfere．With hand \＃3，bid $2 \boldsymbol{A}$ ，showing at limit raise or better．

You can also use the opponent＇s bid to respond to a take－out double：

Say LHO opens $1 \boldsymbol{*}$ ，partner makes a takeout double and the next player passes．What does it mean if you now bid $2 *$ ？

The cuebid asks partner to continue describing his hand．The cuebidder will usually be 4－4 in the majors．The cuebid helps the partnership find the best fit．
diamonds，and assuming East winds up on lead，East shifts to the $\& \mathrm{~J}$ ．If West winds up on lead，he shifts to the $\boldsymbol{\bullet} \mathrm{K}$ ．

Play commentary \＃2：South has lost three tricks and needs to find East with the $\downarrow \mathrm{K}$ to make the contract．As it is likely that East has more than two hearts，declarer must plan on taking two heart finesses．Translation：Two dummy entries are needed．

They are there－if declarer is willing to take a risk．Declarer must lead a low spade to the 8 ， hoping West has the $\boldsymbol{\wedge} J$ ．Success！Now the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ still has be with East．It is！Declarer can finesse hearts twice and make the contract．The point is that it is worth a risk to go down an extra trick if the reward is making your contract．Play to make！

## Red Ribbon Pairs

The Bean Red Ribbon Pairs, an ACBL event with national rating open to players with fewer than 2000 masterpoints, gets underway today.

Players earn qualification by placing first or second overall in regionally rated events of at least Flight B status. Neither member of a qualifying pair may hold more than 2000 masterpoints at the time of qualification.

The four-session event began in 1986 and winners have their names inscribed on the Percy X. Bean Trophy.

## Bean Trophy

The trophy was
 designated by the ACBL Board of Directors in 1996 to honor Bean, ACBL president in 1972 and chairman of the Board in 1973.

Bean (1916-1992) represented District 19 on the Board from 1964 until 1988 and served as president of the ACBL Charity Foundation from 1974 until 1981. He was a member of the National Goodwill Committee and the National Board of Governors and general chairman of arrangements for the World Team Olympiad in Seattle in 1984.

Bean and his wife, Anne, were named ACBL Honorary Members for 1992, the first time that honor was bestowed on a husband-wife combination.

Bean was the editor of Mad, Mad World of

Bridge, a publication that strongly championed players of less than expert class.

## IMP Pairs begins today

The four-session IMP Pairs - two qualifying sessions followed by two final sessions - gets underway today with the Lebhar Trophy at stake.

The trophy was donated by Bertram Lebhar Jr. in 1948 in memory of his wife, Evelyn. The trophy was previously given to winners of the Mixed Teams but re-designated for the IMP Pairs by the ACBL Board of Directors.

Lebhar (1907-1972), under the name of Bert Lee, earned a national reputation as a sportscaster and later as a bridge player and administrator. In private life, he owned radio and television stations in Florida.


Lebhar was one of the founders of the Greater New York Bridge Association and was elected its first president in 1948.

Lebhar was also a player: he won the Spingold in 1940 and the Master Mixed Teams in 1946. His team was his wife Evelyn along with Samuel Katz and Alicia Kemper.

## Women's Pairs compete for Whitehead Trophy

Play begins today in the Whitehead Women's Pairs with two qualifying sessions, followed by two final sessions tomorrow.

This is the 79th Women's Pairs. At stake is the Whitehead Trophy, donated in 1930 by Wilbur C. Whitehead of New York, a great bridge authority and a member of the team that won the Vanderbilt Cup in 1928, the first year it was in play.

Whitehead (1866-1931) was president of the Simplex Automobile Company, but bridge held such a fascination for him that he retired from business in 1910 to devote his life to bridge.

He was the inventor of
 many bidding and play conventions, the quick-trick table of card values, the Whitehead system of requirements for original bids and responses and the Whitehead table of preferential leads.

Whitehead was instrumental in standardizing procedures in auction bridge and later in contract bridge.

partner. On lead against a $4 \wedge$ contract, I judged to lead a trump. Specifically, I led the $\uparrow 5$ from the doubleton 5-2. Dummy's trumps were the $\uparrow 3$. The dummy and I each held a low doubleton in clubs, and declarer held $\boldsymbol{\wedge} \mathrm{A} \mathrm{K}$. In order to make the contract, declarer needed to ruff his low club in dummy. After winning the opening lead, declarer cashed the $\& \mathrm{~A} \mathrm{~K}$ and then led the third club. I sat there horrified, staring at dummy's $\uparrow 4$ and my own lowly $\uparrow 2$, unable to overruff. The contract made.

After the hand was over, Fred leaned over, and in a firm but gentle way, said, "For the rest of your life, you'll never again lead the higher of two low trumps." And I never have.

Fred and I became good friends. We played together in a few regionals and had good success Fred is a great player, and during the time we played with each other, I learned a great deal about bidding and matchpoint tactics. These lessons and tips advanced my game immensely.

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a $1 / 6$ board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

## TOURNAMENT APPEALS

In order to keep the bridge public informed of appeals results in a timely fashion, the NABC Daily Bulletin staff publishes
 write-ups. Every effort is made to ensure that these reports are accurate and complete. However, before they are published in the NABC Appeals Casebook revisions may be made.

(1) 15-17 HCP.
(2) Break in tempo (BIT). North said BIT was 10 seconds; East said 30 seconds.
(3) Announced as a transfer to hearts.

The Facts: The director was called after the 3* call and returned after the hand. The length of the BIT was as noted above.

The Ruling: The director determined that there was an unmistakable BIT, which demonstrably suggested that North take action and that pass was a logical alternative. Therefore, in accordance with Laws 16A2 and 12C2, the result was adjusted to $2 \vee$ by East, down two, East-West minus 200.

The Appeal: South (the appellant) was the only player to appear at the hearing. He agreed that he noticeably broke tempo before passing at his first opportunity to call. He did not agree that the UI suggested bidding. He said that from the auction, North knows that South has at least opening bid values. North also knows that South is not markedly unbalanced since the North-South methods handle one- and two-suited hands well. Their defense is:

Double $=$ a minor one-suiter or the majors
$2 *=$ clubs and a major
$2 \star$ diamonds and a major
$2 \boldsymbol{*}=$ hearts
$2 \boldsymbol{A}=$ spades
2NT = both minors
North had contended that within the context of the system, the $3 \bullet$ bid was clear-cut. If, however, the committee disagreed, then it should find that $3 \boldsymbol{*}$ was worse than a pass because $3 *$ was aimed at plus 110 or 130 , when plus 200 was available by passing.

The Decision: The committee found that the BIT did not demonstrably suggest a line of action - in this case, bidding. By bidding, North may be trading a plus score for a minus score and he also might be trading a plus 200 for a plus 110 or 130. The stronger one thinks South's hand is, the more likely this unprofitable trade might be. Therefore, because bidding was not demonstrably suggested by the BIT, the committee permitted North to bid $3 *$. East could then have passed, as some Easts did, and have received a good score. It was East's decision to double that caused East-West to dive "back into the soup." Therefore, the table result of $3 \vee$ doubled by East,
down three, East-West minus 800 was reinstated.
The committee believed the appeal had merit and did not impose a procedural penalty.

The Facts: The director was called at the end of the hand. North played out of tempo to the second diamond. According to North, the break in tempo (BIT) was not "long, long." North-South play thirdand fifth-best leads versus suit contracts.

The Ruling: The director determined that:

1. There was a BIT.
2. South chose from among logical alternatives (LA) one that could have been demonstrably suggested by the BIT, which resulted in damage.
3. Therefore, the result was adjusted to $3 *$ by West making four, East-West plus 130.

The Appeal: South knew that West had at most three hearts from his failure to make a negative double. Additionally, if West was 6-4 in the minors with the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$ and the $\curvearrowleft \mathrm{K}$, he might have opened the bidding. Thus, it was quite likely that North held the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$. A shift to the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ would, at worst, break even.

East-West argued that West could easily have the $\checkmark$ A Q in which case North-South would lose their diamond trick if South played the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ at trick three. North's BIT before playing the 3 told South that he started with four diamonds in which case playing a third round of diamonds would not be successful.

North claimed that he took two to three seconds to play the $\leqslant$. He was quite surprised when West followed to the second round of diamonds. He did a quick recount of the diamond suit and, realizing that, if he played the $\uparrow 7$ or $\uparrow 9$, South would surely continue, he played the 3 . East-West estimated the time that North took to play the three at seven to eight seconds.

The Decision: The committee determined that a BIT took place before North played the $\leqslant$. The UI that South had from the BIT demonstrably suggested that a heart shift was more likely to be successful than a diamond continuation. Since a diamond continuation was a LA to the $\vee K$, the committee upheld the director's decision to disallow the play of the $\downarrow \mathrm{K}$ and to adjust the score to $3 *$ by West making four, EastWest plus 130 as the result that would have been achieved if a third diamond had been played.

The committee discussed the merit of the appeal and decided that there were enough factors to process so as to allow North-South to avoid an appeal without merit warning (AWMW).

Facts: The director was called after the play. The East-West agreement, which was clearly marked on the convention card, is that Drury does not apply in competition. North expected his partner to be short in hearts, given the information that $2 *$ was a heart raise, and would have passed $4 \vee$ had he known that $2 *$ was not Drury.

Director's Ruling: The director found that there was misinformation. In accordance with Laws 12C2, 21B3 and 40C, therefore, the score was adjusted to $4 \vee$ by West, down three, and a score of minus 300 for East-West.

The Appeal: East felt that North "took his chances" by bidding $4 \boldsymbol{A}$. East also said North looked at her convention card before bidding it, so he should have known Drury was off in competition. West seemed resigned to the fact that the score should be adjusted, but he thought down three was excessive. At first, West said he could make $4 \boldsymbol{\bullet}$; then he decided he would be down one

North thought is was unfair to allow West to play the hand double dummy after the fact. South had no comment.

The Decision: Eight players were asked what they would do with the North hand, given the information that $2 \boldsymbol{q}$ was Drury. Four bid 4^, using the same reasoning as the North player ("Partner is short in hearts, and is likely to hold some spade length. If I don't make this, it should be a good sacrifice.") $4 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$ was less attractive if $2 *$ was natural. The panel, therefore, agreed with the director's decision to adjust to a contract of $4 \vee$ by West in accordance with Laws 21B3, 40C and 12C2.

The play in $4 \vee$ presented a different problem. Several of West's peers were polled and asked how many tricks they could take in $4 \boldsymbol{\vee}$. They thought a competent West could take eight or nine tricks, depending on the defense. Since East-West was the offending side, the panel changed the director's adjustment to $4 \boldsymbol{v}$ by West down two. A score of EastWest minus 200 was the most favorable result that was at all probable for North-South (the non-offenders) and the most unfavorable result that was all probable for East-West (the offenders).

The appeal was found to have merit.

of Directors on the New Jersey Bridge League and the Michigan Bridge Association, where she received its Goodwill Award. Beverly competed successfully and respectfully with a smile and a good word for all.

Her 18 consecutive New Year's Eve bridge parties in East Windsor NJ and West Bloomfield MI, at which the prestigious $\$ 2.95$ "Bluth Bowl" was awarded to the winner of this 48 -person individual event, happily concluded and opened the bridge year for her many close player-friends.

Sid and Lorraine Heinrick were popular and successful players in the Detroit bridge scene in the Forties, Fifties and Sixties. They were the parents of local player Lynne Schaeffer and her sister Marybeth Kravets of Deerfield IL. The Heinricks lived in Detroit until 1957 when they moved to Franklin MI. Sid owned Testagar, later Fellows-Testagar, a pharmaceutical company.

Edythe Schelberg began playing bridge "seriously" after getting her B.A. from the University of Michigan at age 62! Don Hocevar was one of the leading Detroit players, especially in the Sixties
and Seventies. After he suffered a major stroke, his bridge activity was severely limited, and he eventually died in the 1990s, having never completely recovered. He was a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law

School, but after practicing law for a short time, he devoted his time to teaching mathematics at Detroi Country Day School. He was also the Harvard recruiter for the Detroit area until his death. He was instrumental in interesting several young players in learning the game more deeply. I was fortunate to be one of those players. Sponsored by Bill Arlinghaus.

Jon Froemke was my good friend, colleague and favorite bridge partner for more than 20 years, until his untimely death 10 years ago. We played many sessions in the 1981 Detroit NABC. I'm sure he would have loved to participate in this NABC as well.
