Glickman, a film producer working on a major musical depicting the love affair between Maurice Chevalier and Mistin Guett, joined the ACBL two years ago and already has piled up 155 points. This is his second NABC - he also went to Las Vegas last fall and won 23 points, including 12 gold.

The 2002 Worldwide Bridge Contest is scheduled for Friday June 7 and Saturday June 8, and the organizers are hoping for an even bigger participation than last year.

The contest will again be scored dynamically across the field using Internet, with each club scoring the local heat using specially developed software, then uploading the files directly to a central server farm in England. The results will then be scored, together with the results from the hundreds of other clubs, across the field to give an overall winner.

The Web Site, at www.ecatsbridge.com, will link to the results, generating a great deal of excitement as they come in and the scores are updated. The frequencies on each board can be examined in detail.. Each player's personal scorecard is displayed, giving board-by-board matchpoints and percentages.

The deals - which, incidentally, are not "selected" in any way but are a straight set of deals - are written up with excellent commentary by Eric Kokish and are given to players as a printed souvenir booklet as well as being displayed on the site. In addition, players have the opportunity to add their own comments to the web site, which adds an interesting dimension as they tell of individual triumphs and disasters!

The contest provides an exciting, enjoyable and challenging game to the participants. The rare opportunity to join a major event and compete with players from so many other countries provides a stimulating experience. The commentary booklets give everyone a chance to discuss the hands afterwards. Add to this the enjoyment of watching the scores change as new results come in, the fun of adding your own comments to the site and this becomes an event not to be missed.

## Bob Crossley becomes Grand Life Master

Bob Crossley fulfilled a major requirement for Grand Life Master way back in 1974 - he won the Vanderbilt with his brother Dave plus Joey Silver and Eric Kokish - perhaps the youngest team ever to win that event. This week he fulfilled the other requirement - he scored his $10,000^{\text {th }}$ masterpoint.

The Vanderbilt was the vehicle once again - he finished tied for fifth in the Vanderbilt playing with Jack Coleman and with teammates Aleksander Petrunin and Andrew Gromov of Russia and Cezary Balicki and Adam Zmudzinski of Poland. They lost to Reese Milner, who went on to win the event.

Bridge has been Crossley's life. He became a Life Master when he was only 16, and that's also the time he turned pro. Nowadays he teaches on bridge cruises and at resorts. He also plays a lot of golf - and he juggles when he wants to get away from it all. H actually is good enough at juggling to do well in major competitions.

His other major victories in bridge include the Albany Cup in Denmark and three Central America-Caribbean championships.

He enjoys talking about his father Cap and his grandfather, who also was Cap. He remembers when they won the All-Western back in the Fifties against Lew Mathe's team. His grandfather psyched on the very first board, and his opponents were watching him closely for additional psychs - but that first one was the only one. His plan of action completely confused the opposition.

## Today is St. Patrick's Day!

The person who was to become St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was born in Wales about AD 385. His given name was Maewyn, and he almost didn't get the job of bishop of Ireland because he lacked the required scholarship.

Far from being a saint, until he was 16 he considered himself a pagan. At that age, he was sold into slavery by a group of Irish marauders who raided his village. During his captivity, he became closer to God. He escaped from slavery after six years and went to Gaul, where he studied in the monastery under St. Germain, bishop of Auxerre, for a period of 12 years.

During his training he became aware that his calling was to convert the pagans to Christianity. His wishes were to return to Ireland, to convert the native pagans to Christianity. But his superiors instead appointed St. Palladius. But two years later, Palladius transferred to Scotland.

Patrick, having adopted that Christian name earlier, was then appointed as second bishop to Ireland.

Patrick was quite successful at winning converts. And this fact upset the Celtic Druids. Patrick was arrested several times, but escaped each time. He traveled throughout Ireland, establishing monasteries across the country. He also set up schools and churches which would aid him in his conver-
sion of the Irish country to Christianity. His mission in Ireland lasted 30 years.

After that time, Patrick retired to County Down. He died on March 17 in AD 461. That day has been commemorated as St. Patrick's Day ever since.

Much Irish folklore surrounds St. Patrick's Day. Not much of it is actually substantiated. Some of this lore includes the belief that Patrick raised people from the dead. He also is said to have given a sermon from a hilltop that drove all the snakes from Ireland. Of course, no snakes were ever native to Ireland, and some people think this is a metaphor for the conversion of the pagans.

Though originally a Catholic holy day, St. Patrick's Day has evolved into more of a secular holiday. One traditional icon of the day is the shamrock.This stems from a more bona fide Irish tale that tells how Patrick used the three-leafed shamrock to explain the Trinity. He used it in his sermons to represent how the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit could all exist as separate elements of the same entity. His followers adopted the custom of wearing a shamrock on his feast day.

The St. Patrick's Day custom came to America in 1737. That was the first year St. Patrick's Day was publicly celebrated in the United States, in Boston.

## Yesterday was Bill Anderson Day

Yesterday was Bill Anderson Day at the NABC and we'll remember a man who enjoyed life and bridge. "He was such a stitch," says daughter Dianna Gittelman.

Anderson was a Gold Life Master who played with experts and newcomers alike. Today is the fourth anniversary of his death.

## Here are memories of Bill:

During my early days as a novice, Bill impressed me with his unique ability to be super polite and make us (as novices) feel at home at his table.

In those days all scores went on a traveler and I learned if Bill scored it and put it away quickly - complimenting us in some manner (good bid or good lead or good whatever) - this meant the score was good his way and do not ask to see the traveler (as one would be very disappointed).

On those very rare occasions when the score was OK or good our way (this seldom happened against Bill), he'd score the traveler and then hand me the traveler to see.

If all players were as wonderful with the novices (and, indeed, all players) as Bill was, our Houston sectionals would have attendance more like an NABC.

The tone of the Vanderbilt final was set in the very first three boards. After a push on the first board, Reese Milner's squad picked up 10 IMPs on Board 2 by making 4at ane one table and beating the same contract at the other table. Another 13 IMPs went Milner's way on Board 3 .

One problem with opening such bad suits with a weak two-bid is the lead problem if partner is on opening lead. That was the situation here - Bob Hamman started with the $\vee$ K, ducked. Hamman switched to the J, and Jacek Pszczola won the queen. He led a diamond and allowed Paul Soloway's queen to hold. He won the heart return and set up another club trick. Eventually Hamman was endplayed in spades, so Pszczola wound up with 10 tricks.

The Milner team played Board 16 at both tables, making a partial in one room and a game in the other.

Milner's leap to 3 effectively silenced Freeman. Marc Jacobus had no problem taking nine tricks, losing two clubs, a diamond and a heart. But the course of the bidding was altogether different at the other table.

Soloway merely raised to $2 \boldsymbol{\alpha}$, so that gave Piotr Gawrys the opportunity to show his support for clubs. Pszczola asked about a spade stopper, so Gawrys, looking at the king, carried on to the notrump game. Hamman led the $\$ K$ and Gawrys was home. He won with the ace and knocked out the queen to make his game with two overtricks for a 13-IMP pickup.

Board 26 was out-and-out unlucky for the Nickell team. Guessing the correct position of the spade honors made a difference of 26 IMPs - plus 13 if the guess was right, minus 13 if not.

With the horrendous spade split, the spade game was not any kind of success. The opening lead of the 10 went jack, king ace. Meckstroth led a spade to the ace and wasn't happy to see East show out. He led a club to the king, losing to the ace, and a club came back to the 10 . West was able to ruff the diamond return and lead a heart to the jack and ace. The defense still had to come to a heart trick and two more trumps, so Lev and Mohan defeated 4 three tricks.

There was no way Hamman or Soloway were going to play a contract undoubled on this deal. Pszczola led a club to the king and ace. Hamman led a diamond to the jack, king and ace, and Gawrys shifted to a spade to partner's ace - continuing clubs probably would have worked out better. Hamman ruffed the A , of course, and then was able to score his small trump by ruffing a diamond. He ruffed a second spade and got off dummy with a diamond to South's queen. Gawrys led his other club to dummy's queen, and Hamman scored another trick with the V K when Gawrys ducked the heart return. Hamman got another spade ruff, but that was the end - North ruffed the next diamond trick, cashed the $\pm \mathrm{J}$ and led the Q to partner's ace so South could cash another heart trick at the end. 500 to Milner and another 13 IMPs.

The loss on Board 45 was the result of an out-andout bidding foulup by Rodwell and Meckstroth.

This was the Kokish commentary.
The Standards and the rationale for opening a weak two-bid have changed over time, but despite the claims of the hyperactive pre-emptors it's far from clear that "less is indeed more."

I'm not heartened by the fact that in today's game almost every South will start with a weak 2 or a Multi $2 \downarrow$. With considerably better intermediates in spades, the bid would make much more sense to me, but I am aware that I am in the minority on this issue.

West has a decent suit but a poor and balanced hand. Once in a while it would be productive to enter the auction with 3 , but overall this unsound action rates to be a loser. Not only might your partner play you for a much better hand when he has enough to bid, but once he sees what you have this time he will also start making allowances in the future and you will miss some easy games and slams.

Opposite a "real" vulnerable weak 2a, North has good reason to consider trying for game, particularly if his methods include a mechanism to ask for singletons.

Opposite a modern weak two-bid might be touch-and-go with nothing on for the opponents, so pass might be the winning decision.

Even though it's important to aim for a plus score on marginal deals at matchpoints, it is also important to bid with a fit, particularly when the fit is in the high-est-ranking suit and your intention is to compete later, if necessary. By bidding immediately there is less danger that the opponents will double you when you're going down.

It would not be outrageous to jump to 4@, but that may be going too far to shut out the opponents after one of them has passed and they figure to hold only about half the high cards. 2NT (traditionally asking for a feature) might silence East when his side can make something but $3 \boldsymbol{a}$, assuming captaincy and blocking out the three-level, feels like the middle-of-the-road action.

East might feel that he is having his pocket picked but he can hardly bid at the four-level, and the same will be true for West, on the way out. The equivalent, for Multi 2 users, would be a jump response of $3 \boldsymbol{\downarrow}$, asking South to pass with a weak $2 \boldsymbol{\square}$ or correct to $3 \boldsymbol{1}$ with a weak 2 opening.

As luck would have it, trumps are 2-2 and both red aces are onside for North-South, so 10 tricks are there for the taking. Switch the East and West hands and make the trumps 3-1 and a trump lead might beat 24 .

Consider what might happen if West were to overcall 3 . North might decide that his cards were favorably placed and jump to 4@, or he might compete to 34, then double everything higher (East would not pass over 3 ).

The scores varied from 1130 to North-South for 34 doubled, making four, earning them 6170 matchpoints and an outright top, to 710 to East-West for $4 \diamond$ making (on, one assumes, indifferent defense!) giving them a top in their turn. There were 35 scores in between, showing the great variations in bidding and play during an event of this type.

nament got under way. He found two partners with whom he had instant rapport - Bob Butterfield of Dallas and Charlie Zander of Houston. He has had victories with each in several events.

In a way, Glickman is not a newcomer. He was an ACBL member 30 years ago, but he allowed his membership to lapse soon after he joined because bridge was taking too much time away from his career and family. He had earned 60 one-hundredths of a point before his membership ceased.
"My goal is to achieve Life Master (and more) and to earn ACBL teacher accreditation," said Glickman. "I want to be able to introduce bridge to deaf children at the Aspen Camp and School for the Deaf. I am vice president on their board."

Glickman does not plan to go the NABC in Washington DC this summer. "June, July and August are the nicest months of the year in Aspen," he said. "I live on a ranch and I like to spend time with my horses. There's so much activity there in the summer that I prefer to do my traveling at other times of the year." The Facts: 3 NT made three, +600 for E/W. The opening lead was the $\mathbf{P Q}$. The Director was called after the play. N/S had different methods over $1 *$ depending on whether it was strong and artificial or natural. $2 \boldsymbol{\square}$ was weak over a natural $1 \mathbf{2}$ but was as explained over a strong club. The Director ruled that North had unauthorized information, that raising South's natural $2 \boldsymbol{A}$ bid to $3 \boldsymbol{a}$ at his second turn was a logical alternative, and that East would have doubled. The contract was changed to 34 doubled down five (with a spade lead), +1400 for $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. In addition to the players, Billy Miller attended the hearing as the E/W team captain's designee. N/S contended that bidding 3s was not clear after West had shown a strong ( $17+\mathrm{HCP}$ ) balanced hand with 2NT because opposite a passed partner long, strong spades were not likely. They also believed that, even if the 34 raise was imposed, down five was not a clear result. North agreed that South could have long, weak spades and that behind screens he might have bid 34. However, he said that he obviously wouldn't do so after the misunderstanding. Most hands with six good spades would open Multi $2 *$ and two-suiters with spades and a minor would likely open 2 .

The Committee Decision: The Committee determined that in addition to other calls, bidding $3 \boldsymbol{1}$ was a logical alternative for North. The Committee debated at
some length whether it was clear that a double of 34 by East would be penalty, but eventually accepted E/W's statements (with corroboration from a Committee member) that they would play this double as penalty. The defense was then discussed and three results were considered. Down four after the lead of the K (declarer can win the first five tricks) was not considered "the most favorable result that was likely" for the non-offending side. However, down five after a trump lead or a high heart followed by a trump shift did meet that standard. Down six was possible but was not considered to be an "at all probable" result for the offending side. Therefore, the Committee changed the contract to 34 doubled down five, +1400 for $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$. Some members of the Committee were not comfortable that the laws required imposing an unclear bid followed by a more successful defense that combined to create a huge windfall result for the nonoffenders. The Committee requested that the proper authorities review this circumstance.

## Case \#4

Subject: Unauthorized information
Event: NABC Silver Ribbon Pairs, March 11, First final session


## (1) Al All Pas

The Facts: 3 made three, +110 for $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$. The opening lead was the A. The Director was called at the end of play. East had ruffed the third round of hearts high and led a low diamond to the eight, losing to the jack. North said that their agreement of the double was penalty and their agreement would continue to be penalty doubles, but he did not have enough to either pass 2 doubled or to double 3 4 . Both N/S convention cards had the double marked as penalty. The Director ruled that N/S may have
given unauthorized information or South may have tried to do something outside their agreement, but E/W had bid 3 anyway. In the play, East had seen enough cards to know that South probably didn't have a penalty double with at most only two aces, a queen and four diamonds to the jack. Thus, the table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players to attend the hearing. They believed that North's hand was an appropriate pass of a penalty double and that North should be required to pass. Failing that, North should have doubled $3 \downarrow$. East believed that North should have told him that his partner had probably forgotten the meaning of the double when dummy was faced after which declarer would judge the play better to make an overtrick. Finally, West stated that when North Alerted the double of $2 \downarrow$, she detected an almost imperceptible flinch by South, which could have tipped North off to South's having forgotten their agreement. The table Director reported that North said he had not noticed any mannerism from his partner when he Alerted the double. South was silent regarding whether she had twitched when her partner Alerted. Also, at the table E/W had requested redress giving the same reasons in the same order as they presented them to the Committee.

The Committee Decision: E/W claimed damage as a result of misinformation and North's unauthorized information. However, the mention of South's mannerism in response to the Alert of the double was the last thing that they told the Director and the Committee, almost as an afterthought. Neither East nor North had noticed any reaction by South. When an opponent makes a special mannerism or gesture that conveys unauthorized information, it is important to call the Director promptly so that the facts can be determined while the action is fresh in everyone's mind. In view of E/W's delay in calling the Director, the order of importance they apparently placed upon the gesture in mentioning it last, North's denial of any mannerism and West's description of it as virtually imperceptible, the Committee determined that there had been no unauthorized information. The N/S convention cards clearly showed that the partnership meaning of the double was penalty and North maintained that was correct. He simply did not consider his hand suitable for passing. Although one may disagree with North's judgment, his choice to remove the double to a good suit with a weak hand was not so strange as to contradict both the convention cards and his statement. Thus, the Committee decided that there was no misinformation and allowed the table result to stand. The Committee also informed East that North was not permitted by law to tell declarer that his partner had probably forgotten her agreement when the dummy was faced.
