Welland strong in Spingold final

The squad captained by Roy Welland built a formidable lead in the first half of the Spingold final and then increased that lead in the second half to claim victory in the contest. Welland, playing with Bjorn Fallenius, Cezary Balicki, Adam Zmudzinski, Zia Mahmood and Michael Rosenberg, defeated the team of Rose Meltzer, Kyle Larsen, Peter Weichsel, Alan Sontag, Lew Stansby and Chip Martel 153-101.

This is the first Spingold win for Welland and partner Bjorn Fallenius, both of New York. Welland was second in 2000 (with different teammates) against the same Meltzer squad. Poles Balicki and Zmudzinski won the event in 1997. Zia and Rosenberg, also of New York, last won the Spingold in 1991.

To cover or not to cover, that is the question

This play problem came from the semifinal Spingold contest pitting Nick Nickell's team against Rose Meltzer's.

Alan Sontag, South, was declarer in 6♠. West was Paul Soloway, East was Bob Hamman.

The auction isn't available, but Soloway led a low club. Yes, a heart looks normal, but the auction may have indicated that a heart lead wouldn't yield a defensive trick.

Sontag won the ♣A and play a low trump to the ace, discovering the bad break. He continued with the ♠9 from dummy which Hamman covered with the 10. Sontag won the king and played the ♦J, overtaking with the king. Hamman won the ace and played a heart, Sontag winning the ace. A club to dummy's queen was followed by the high diamonds. Hamman ruffed the third round of the suit, but Sontag overruffed to produce this ending:

Declarer ruffed his last heart in dummy and played the ♦9, forcing Hamman to raise the white flag.

Does the defense do better on a heart lead? Yes, since declarer must play double dummy (tackling the diamonds first without touching trumps) to succeed. But what about with the at-the-table lead of a club? Specifically, what happens if Hamman doesn't cover the ♠9 at trick three?

The defense will come out on top in that variation, since if declarer switches to diamonds, Hamman can win the ace and play the ♠J, killing dummy's last trump which is one of the two entries to dummy declarer needs to successfully run the diamonds.

Does East have enough information at that stage of the deal to know that ducking is correct? And if someone of Hamman's stature can get this wrong, what hope have mere mortals?

5621 players win points at this NABC

A whopping 5621 players scored at least a fraction of a point during the course of this NABC. So far 14,949.93 masterpoints have been distributed.

I/N attendance

The Intermediate/Newcomer sections of the Long Beach NABC have attracted 1050 tables through Saturday evening.

There have been 1073 players participating in the I/N games. Of those, 872 players have earned a total of more than 2400 masterpoints.



Barlow is Grand LM

Ed Barlow of Sunnyvale CA earned his 10,000th masterpoint in early July, but needed an NABC victory to claim the title of Grand Life Master. He didn't have to wait long, however, as he was a member of the winning team in the Senior Swiss this week playing with Carolyn Bjorklund, Evan Bailey, Fred Hamilton and Arnie Fisher.

Barlow has had several high finishes in previous NABCs. In 1964, he finished second in the Life Master Men's Teams of Four playing with John Sutherlin. In 1968, Barlow and Sutherlin finished third in the Blue Ribbon Pairs. And in 2002, Barlow's team finished 3rd-4th in the Grand National Teams. Barlow played with Peter Friedland, Sally and Kit Woolsey, and JoAnna and Lew Stansby.

Barlow has had long-term partnerships with Sutherlin, Bailey and Peter Friedland. He also partnered Bjorklund in the Senior Swiss.

Barlow, who will soon be 70, is retired. He started his career as an engineer, but later became a computer programmer.

When a player of world-class talent such as Jill Meyers tells her partner, "Sorry, I forgot", it should make an impression on players of all levels of ability. Even the best can occasionally forget their bidding agreements.

What was it that Meyers was apologizing for? She and Montin had agreed that in this sequence involving the Multi 2♦ bid, double by responder would be pass-or-correct. Hence, after 2♦-(3♥)-Dbl, opener is expected to pass with hearts or bid 3♠ if that is her suit. On this layout, Meyers could double (since it really isn't clear which major her partner has) and Montin would pass. With the 6-0 trump break, McCallum would suffer a one-trick set in 3♥ doubled.

The final session of a contest that is several days long, however, can take its toll on memory. Meyers and Montin play that their weak two-bids (described by 2♦) are sound. The explanation of McCallum's 3♥ jump ("a good suit"), no doubt influenced Meyers to believe that Montin's suit was actually spades. This is a totally logical inference, but one that happens to be completely wrong on this deal. Meyers' 3♠ call was hammered by Sanborn, as was Meyers' retreat to 3NT.

Declarer could manage only four tricks. Down five, minus 1100, and a 14-IMP pickup for the Eythorsdottir team when East made 2♥ (plus 110) at the other table.

North signed off at 5♠, but Pinsky liked his diamond void and went on to slam. West led the ♥A and the ♣A and continued with another heart. What's the big deal? The hand has already been set. Well, the subsequent play did make a difference.

Declarer cashed the ♠A to learn about the tough trump break. He ruffed a low diamond and crossed back to the ♠K. He ruffed another diamond and got back to dummy with a club to ruff a third diamond. That left declarer with the ♠Q-10 over East's J-9. Declarer got back to dummy with another club. When he led the ♦A at trick 12, East had to ruff and declarer of course overruffed and also won the last trick for down one. A neat trump coup.

Big deal, you say. So he went down one instead of two.

Well, it was a big deal. This is the way Pinsky wishes he had played it. He didn't find the trump coup, so he actually was set two tricks. At the other table his opponents stopped in 5♠ and didn't find the coup, so they went down one trick. That means Pinsky's team lost 3 IMPs on the board. But the board would have been a push with the trump coup — and the Pinsky team lost the match by just 1 IMP!

The first seven calls were the same at both tables. However, Bjorn Fallenius felt his hand was worth another bid with his six-card suit, so he won the contract at 3♠. Meltzer felt she had nothing in reserve, so she passed, and Cezary Balicki corrected to 3♣.

Balicki took the club finesse and lost two clubs tricks as a result. However, he lost only the ♥K and a spade to score up plus 110.

At the other table Peter Weichsel led a club to Alan Sontag's ace, and Sontag switched to the ♥Q, which Weichsel ducked and dummy won with the king. Fallenius ruffed a club, cashed the ♠A and crossed to the ♠K to sluff his last heart on dummy's good ♣J. He ruffed a heart and led a diamond to Sontag's king. Fallenius ruffed the heart return and led another diamond which West was forced to win.

He led another heart for Fallenius to ruff with the queen. Fallenius took his ♦Q and lost the last trick to Weichsel's trump jack. Plus 140.

The last board was the most interesting of the second set

Chip Martel led a diamond to dummy's ace, and a spade went to the 10, king and ace. Martel crossed to the ♥A and cashed the ♠Q. He led to his ♣K and ruffed a heart. When he tried to come back to his hand with a club, Zia ruffed and led a diamond to Michael Rosenberg for the third defensive trick. Rosenberg still had the top trump, so 4♠ went down one.

Meltzer led her singleton club, taken with the king. Adam Zmudzinski led a spade to the queen and cashed dummy's ♥A. When he led a club to his queen, Meltzer ruffed, cashed the ♠A and got out with a diamond to the ace. Zmudzinski crossed to his ♠9, ruffed a heart and ruffed a diamond.

Then he drew the last trump with his king, carefully discarding the ♣A from dummy. That gave him two club tricks in hand for his game and a 12-IMP pickup That put Welland ahead by 64-25 at the half.

East-West were cold for 6♦ on this deal from

the third quarter, but North-South played the hand in hearts at both tables.

Stansby and Martel stopped short of slam, doubling 5♥. Stansby cashed his ♦A and led a heart to partner's ace. A club went to the queen and ace, and Rosenberg ruffed a club in dummy. He gave up a spade to the ace and ruffed the diamond return. This was followed by a spade ruff, club ruff, spade ruff and the trump queen. Rosenberg still had to lose a spade so he was down two – minus 300.

Subject: Change of card called from dummy

Event: Stratified Senior Swiss Teams, Second Session

The Facts: The opening lead was the ♥7. At trick six declarer, having already lost two tricks, called for a spade from dummy and South pulled a card from his hand and was preparing to play it when declarer attempted to change his call from dummy.

The Director was called and ruled there had been a pause for thought and that the card originally called (a spade) had to be played (Law 45C4). 4♥ went down one, plus 50 for North-South.

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling. West said that when he called small spade at trick six he immediately said "Oh," almost instantaneously. Dummy had started to reach for the card and South was detaching a card but had not played.

West said that he meant to play a heart to his hand so he could discard the ♣Q on the ♦K. He said he simply mis-spoke. East-West each had about 1200 masterpoints. N/S believed that at least 2 seconds passed between the call for a spade and the "Oh."

North-South said that South had detached the A from his hand but had not played it. North-South said that dummy was reaching for the spade and agreed that dummy had not flinched or otherwise indicated that he was surprised at the call for a spade. North-South each had about 500 masterpoints.

The Panel Decision: The Panel looked at four factors in determining whether the call for a spade was inadvertent. Their conclusions were: (1) Two seconds did not in itself constitute a pause for thought. (2) The players agreed that dummy did nothing to indicate the play. (3) South had not yet played to the trick, so declarer had gained no new information. (4) They believed that declarer had not simply gotten ahead of himself and had no intention of calling for a low spade at any time soon in the play.

Next, the play was examined. If declarer played a heart as intended, it was a simple matter for him to discard the ♣Q on the ♦K and ruff two clubs in dummy to make the contract.

The Panel determined that declarer had corrected an "inadvertent designation" without pause for thought and allowed him to play a heart from dummy. The contract was changed to 4♥ made four, plus 420 for East-West.

The Facts: 3♣ made six, +170 for East-West. The opening lead was the ♠2. The Director was called initially after the 2♣ bid and again later during the play (at which point the players could not agree on whether East or West had asked about the meaning of North's double). Regardless, East-West requested a ruling due to the misinformation (MI) about North's double.

The Director ruled that the table result would stand, saying that while there had been MI, he could find no connection between it and the inferior contract reached by East-West (Law 21B1).

Additionally, the Director was unable to take either East or West away from the table to discuss alternate bids since the MI did not come to light until several tricks into the play of 3♣. (South had corrected the MI following the 3♣ bid by East.)

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling. West did not attend the hearing. East believed that the improper explanation of the double had induced his partner to turn overly cautious in the bidding and miss a game.

He also raised a side issue of whether East or West had asked about the meaning of the double at their earliest opportunity. North-South said that East had requested information immediately after the double. East-West believed that West had initiated the query when the auction reached him.

As for the MI about the double, East produced a sample hand (♠ xx ♥ AKx ♦ KQxxx ♣ xxx) where West might have taken the best action since game is unmakeable without a spade stopper with ♣ Q10xxx in the North hand.

Additionally, East might have psyched his 1♦ bid or opened extremely light. East estimated that he psychs approximate twice per tournament and will occasionally open a light hand that the majority of players wouldn't. 2♣ was not a game force in competition and the redouble was just a flexible action not knowing how to proceed.

The Committee also determined that East-West played a two-over-one structure with five-card majors and strong notrumps. North-South stated that this was the last board of the session and everyone was very tired. South admitted she had forgotten that the double guaranteed a spade honor with

typically two- or three-card support (she hadn't bid a competitive 3♠).

The Committee Decision: The committee dismissed the issue of which player had asked about the meaning of the double since either query was legal and it was irrelevant to the MI issue.

The Committee then considered whether West had been damaged by the MI. The sheer strength of West's hand suggested that he bid again over the double in case either 3NT or 5♣ would make.

Additionally, East's 3♣ bid argued against his having psyched a 1♦ opening and suggested that if North's double were penalty North-South were attempting to penalize 2♣ with approximately 12 combined HCP, which seemed very unlikely.

After discussion, it was decided that West should have worked out what was happening and that his pass of 3♣ severed the connection between the MI and damage. The committee allowed the table result (3♣ made six, plus 170 for East-West) to stand for East-West.

As for North-South, they had profited from the MI (even though West should have worked out what was happening) and that could not be permitted. Therefore, judging that West could very reasonably have passed the double had he been given the correct information, the contract was changed for them to 2♣ doubled made six, minus 580 for North-South.

Concurring Opinion: (Mark Bartusek, Robert Schwartz) There was no opportunity to suggest that East-West deserved an Appeal Without Merit Warning because a couple of members of the Committee believed that they were damaged by the MI. We dare say that East-West's fate hung in the balance until the final moments of the deliberations. East-West were surely competent enough to deduce the possibility of MI given the highly suspicious auction and the combined assets of the partnership.

(1) East-West's convention card showed that they played 2♣ as Cappelletti over one of a major followed by 1NT.

The Facts: 2♦ made two, minus 90 for North-South. The opening lead was the ♥2.

The Director was called at the end of the auction when South asked if there had been a failure to Alert and East confirmed that there had been. East believed that his 2♣ bid was Cappelletti, but West disagreed and pointed out a notation on their convention cards that indicated that 2♣ was artificial showing a one-suited hand only after a 1NT overcall of their minor-suit opening.

The Director believed that both East and West had lived up to their obligations: East by revealing what he had intended his 2♣ bid to mean and West by correcting the explanation based on the information on East-West's convention cards.

Based on the instruction in Example 2 in the footnote to Law 75D2 ("the Director is to presume Mistaken Explanation, rather than Mistaken Bid, in the absence of evidence to the contrary"), the Director ruled that the evidence on East-West's convention cards indicated that 2♣ was supposed to be natural after one of a major-1NT and that East had forgotten his agreement and misbid. Therefore, there had been no misinformation and the table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: North-South appealed the Director's ruling. North did not attend the hearing.

South stated that if he had known that 2♣ showed an unspecified one-suiter he would not have doubled: He had only 7 HCP and a flat 3-3-3-4 distribution opposite his partner's 15-18 notrump overcall. North-South played a double of an artificial 2♣ bid as inviting competition and guaranteeing another bid. Despite the identically marked convention cards, South believed that East-West did not have an agreement for this auction and that the laws required the Director to presume misinformation in the absence of evidence to the contrary.

He cited an example of one partner filling out a convention card and marking the 2♦ opening as Flannery. The other partner then opens a weak 2♦ bid, not knowing of his partner's wish to play Flannery.

East-West had been a casual partnership for the last five years but this was only the second time they'd played this year. They had computer printed convention cards based upon the dozen or more pages of notes they maintained on computer. They admitted that this was the third time East had forgotten a convention at this tournament.

East never played club games and only an occasional tournament. East-West believed that a lot of players would double an artificial 2♣ bid with the South hand based on the fact that his partnership held the majority of the HCP. If South

The Committee Decision: The Committee noted that this particular East had been involved in several appeals over the last few years involving mistaken bids and/or misinformation. It seemed clear that East had failed to remember his conventional agreements which were carefully documented on the convention card.

The longevity of East-West's partnership argued for 2♣ being a mistaken bid as well.

Buffett offered a slightly different view.

"There's probably not a way to increase the general public's awareness of bridge through personalities alone. I don't see something like a Fischer-Spassky match that can focus public attention. On the other hand, I haven't met anyone who's invested time in the game who doesn't think it's the greatest thing in the world."

Compton next moved to the subject of attracting sponsorship for the game. Whether it was Compton's intention or not, the question carried with it a hint of "How about you guys? You've got plenty of money."

The audience laughed nervously as the two looked at each other. Deadpan, Buffett broke the ice with, "I'll let Bill go first."

Gates thought that increasing general media attention to the game was the first step to attracting more sponsorship, but Buffett countered that increased media attention would only come when more people played the game.

As a possible media attraction, Compton announced that Zia Mahmood had offered to play with Buffett against Gates and a partner of Gates' choice.

Gates brought down the house with his reply: "Only if it's not for a lot of money."

"He doesn't want me to get ahead of him," Buffett added.

An audience member asked Gates if he could foresee a time when personal computers could be purchased with bridge already loaded onto them, as solitaire is now. Gates replied that the Internet already made that possible by default, since so many sites provide access to the game. Having bridge pre-loaded onto the hard drive of most personal computers was unlikely to suddenly attract lots of players to the game.

Buffett said, "You have to get potential players to make that investment in the first 50 hours of learning the game. After that, most are hooked. Not all will play tournament bridge, but most will continue to play at some level the rest of their lives."

Compton closed the interview by asking the pair what attracted them to the game. Gates said, "It's fun. You have to concentrate, but it rewards you because you can feel that you're making progress."

The Committee concluded that North-South had not been given misinformation — East had simply misbid. Therefore the table result was allowed to stand.

The Committee also believed that a player as knowledgeable about the laws as South should not have brought this appeal; North-South were each assessed an Appeal Without Merit Warning.
