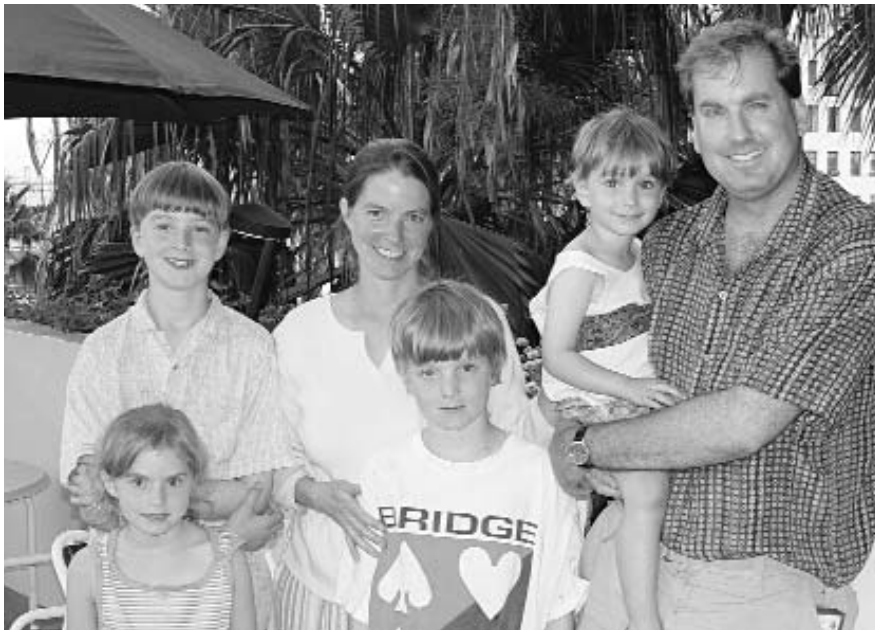

## Florida, California reach GNT final

It's East vs. West in the Grand National Teams Championship final. The District 9 team, representing Florida, will attempt to win the title for the second straight year. Their opposition will be District 17 (California), most of whose members were on the winning Bermuda Bowl team in 2001.

Both teams are loaded with talent. Playing for Florida are Larry Griffey, Spike Lay, Eric Rodwell, Jeff Meckstroth, Michael Seamon and Russ Ekeblad. All but Griffey and Lay were on last year's victorious team.

Rose Meltzer once again is in a major final, playing with Peter Weichsel, Chip Martel, Lew Stansby, Kyle Larsen and Hugh Ross.

In yesterday's semifinals, Meltzer defeated the District 25 team from New England, 122-96, and Griffey topped the District 17 champions, 190-121.

It's North vs. South in the Flight A final. District 5 (Ohio) will oppose District 16 (Texas). Ohio outscored New England (District 25), 144-82, and Texas overcame Central New York (District 3), 142-105.

## Berkowitz, Cohen lead LM Pairs

David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen topped the list of qualifiers in yesterday's opening round action in the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs, posting a two-session score of 1662.63.

In second with 1653.50 is the English-Norwegian duo of Tony Forrester and Boye Brogeland, and the third-place spot is held by the (relatively) local pair of Robert Schwartz and George Siegel with 1640.50.

330 pairs entered the six-session contest, and 158 pairs survived the cut to today's semifinal round.

Two new "mini" Life Master Pairs events were inaugurated this year.

In the David Bruce LM-5000 Life Master Pairs, Californians Jackie Hess and Mary Ann Coyle posted a total of 1993.26. In second with 1973.01 are Barry Purrington and Michael Cassel of Minnesota.

Of the 134 pairs who played in Friday's qualifying rounds in the Bruce LM Pairs, 64 will be back for today's action.

In the Sally Young LM-1500 LM Pairs, Jim and Sandra O'Brien of Oconomowoc WI lead the qualifiers with a score of 1151.61. In second with 1132.38 are Joyce and Richard Hart of Piedmont CA.

94 pairs participated in the Young LM Pairs; 52 made the cut.

## District 23 to award 4 scholarships today

Four local high school seniors will receive scholarships from ACBL District 23 today at 1 p.m. in the Exhibit Hall at the Hyatt. Rand Pinsky, District 23 president, will make the presentations.

All four youngsters are bridge players – some even have gold and red points. Some have been caddies as well.

Each will receive \$1000 for their freshman year in college. The scholarships are renewable for each year, so any student who finishes college will receive \$1000 a year for four years. To qualify they must carry a full academic workload and maintain at least a B average.

## Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

## NABC+ entries

In order to play in NABC+ events (nationally rated events with no upper masterpoint limit), a player's ACBL membership dues or Life Master service fees must be current.

These events pay platinum points and the entry is \$15.50 per player per session.

Other nationally rated events (those with an upper masterpoint limit, such as the 0-1500 Mini-Spangold Knockout Teams) pay red and gold points. The entry is \$14 per player per session for players whose ACBL membership dues or Life Master service fees are current – or \$16 per player per session for all others.

## Bridge survives Pakistani turmoil

We have all read, watched and listened to all sorts of stories about all that has happened in Pakistan over the past couple of years. Bridge used to be popular in that country before all the strife. Has bridge managed to survive?

“Absolutely!” says Abdul Waheed Khan, a textile manufacturer from Lahore, Pakistan. When Khan heard about the big American bridge tournament from his friend, Dr. Manzoor Ursani of Torrance CA, he found some business he had to do in the United States so that he could see what an American tournament is like.

“Bridge is still very popular in Pakistan,” he said. “We have big clubs in all the major cities. We play the same kind of bridge you do – we play five-card majors or a strong club. We have a major tournament every year in honor of the late Balijie, a fine bridge writer who helped promote the game in our country.

“Of course bridge games in Pakistan are nothing like the games here. When we have a 17-table game, it’s chaos. Here you have hundreds of tables playing at the same time and everything goes so smoothly. I can’t conceive how you do it.”

His friend, Dr. Ursani, moved to the U.S. from Pakistan 10 years ago to make sure that his children would get a good education. Four of his children have their degrees from Cal State at Long Beach, and the fifth just finished high school.

Khan isn’t getting many chances to play – he has to return to Pakistan on Monday.

## New pre-Alert/ Disclosure forms

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a new pre-Alert/Disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockout and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available.

## I/N Speakers Program: for players of all levels’

The ACBL Intermediate-Newcomer Speakers Program has been a mainstay at North American Bridge Championships since 1984.

Designed originally for players with 0-100 masterpoints, the program now encompasses the entire I/N program: 0-5 Newcomer Pairs, 49er Pairs, 99er Pairs, 199er Pairs and 299er Pairs.

The program features 45-minute talks by bridge teachers, players, administrators and others.

These talks are scheduled at 9:45 a.m. and 6:45 p.m. each day in Room 101 of the Convention Center.

The audience may range from brand new players to ACBL Grand Life Masters. The I/N Speakers Program “is a tremendous draw for players of all levels,” says Julie Greenberg, manager of the ACBL Education Department.

## Offered a carrot, declarer is sliced

Many foreign players will participate in the Summer NABC here in Long Beach. Two to watch out for are a pair of new ACBL members from Sweden. They are well known in their homeland and, if they play in Long Beach as they did on the following deal from the 1st European Open Championship in Menton, Cote d’Azur, in June, they will attract notice in the USA as well.

The players are Anders Morath and Marten Gustawsson, who reported on his partner’s great defensive play in the Open Pairs.

Morath has been in the headlines before. He and his partner used the Carrot Club – named for Morath because of the red hair he had then – in the Bermuda Bowl Championships in Manila in 1977, where Sweden finished third. He also finished third in the Bermuda Bowl in 1991. On this deal, The Carrot, as he is known, offered a carrot as bait, and declarer got sliced when he accepted the Greek – oops, the Swedish – gift.

Morath led the ♥Q, taken in dummy. Declarer unblocked the ♠A and played a low diamond from dummy. Gustawsson put in the 9, declarer the queen and Morath... the 5!

Now declarer played the top spades and a fourth round to East, who returned a heart to the 8, 9 and king. Because Morath had played the ♦5 in perfect tempo, declarer was certain he knew where the ♦K was, so playing the ♦A and a diamond would be a great way to get to his hand to enjoy the 13th spade. An eerie feeling no doubt began settling over declarer when Gustawsson produced a low diamond on the ace, and another low diamond on dummy’s 6.

The feeling turned to reality when Morath won the ♦K and cashed three hearts to defeat the contract. Plus 50 was worth 45 out of 50 matchpoints. Bridge purists, of course, would want to give Morath and his partner a complete top. Well done!

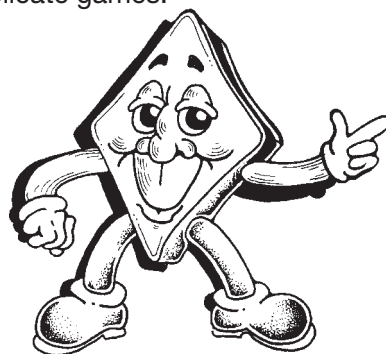

# Israeli duo wins World Junior Pairs

The venue earlier this month for the fifth World Junior Pairs was Tata in Hungary, 50 miles from Budapest. The location was an Olympic Sports camp – excellent facilities and very comfortable surroundings. Almost 200 pairs participated. Scoring was by barometer, so everyone played the same deals at the same time, and the updated results were available after every four deals.

The winners were Yuval Yener and Adi Azizi of Israel, followed by Jerome and Guillaume Grenthe of France. In third place were Bas and Bob Drijver of the Netherlands.

The USA had sent five of the six players from the team that will be favorite in the World Junior Teams in Paris in August, and two of the partnerships (Mignocchi-Bathurst and Kranyak-Grue) did well. Here are some of the more stimulating deals from the event.

Kranyak as West opened 2♥ (hearts and another, weak) and played there on the lead of a top diamond, on which South, Lo Presti, discouraged with the 6. When Sbarrigia continued with a second diamond, declarer was back in control. The spade shift came now, and Kranyak ruffed the second spade, led a heart to the jack and king, ruffed the next spade, crossed to the ♥A, and advanced the ♣Q, covered all round. He led the ♥Q to leave Lo Presti with the master trump, and ran the clubs. When Lo Presti ruffed in he had no spade left to lead, so declarer had eight tricks.

The most challenging defense is to play spades at tricks two and three. When declarer ruffs, his only chance to make the hand is to play a diamond himself, not to take the trump finesse. If he plays a heart to the jack, South wins his ♥K and plays a third spade. Declarer can ruff and unblock the ♥A, then start running the clubs. But at some point South can ruff the fourth club and lead a diamond to his partner to let him cash the fourth spade, on which South's diamond loser goes away.

It appears impossible to stay out of trouble with the East-West cards; 4♥ looks down at least one trick, does it not? Well, Kranyak passed the West hand, and that apparently got his side off to a good start against Katerbau and Rehder of Germany, who at that point were in third place. But Grue as East opened 1♥ in fourth chair, and now when South overcalled 1NT (modified Michaels), Kranyak jumped to 4♥. On a low club lead Grue put up the ♣A, ran the ♥Q, covered all round, then led a low diamond from hand to dummy's queen (good!) and tried a heart to the 8 (better!). Now he had 10 tricks by simply arranging a spade ruff in hand, and virtually all the matchpoints.

To set the hand, South had to win the ♦K at trick two. Once he ducked, even if North had split his heart

honors at trick four, Grue would simply have won, cashed the ♣K, and then gone to dummy with the ♠A to lead a third club, after which the defense is helpless. When North discards, Grue can win, then cash the ♦A for his side's eighth trick, followed by ruffing the fourth club with the ♥7 to ensure two more trump tricks

After the Junior Pairs had finished, 150 of the participants loaded up their stuff and went 50 miles down the road to the Villa park at Vargesztes. There we found a venue ideally suited to a bridge camp. There were enough sporting facilities to entertain the players, be it swimming, volleyball, table tennis or swimming.

The camp format was to play sports in the morning, have a lesson in the early afternoon, play bridge in the afternoon and evening, with a post-midnight game available for the really desperate thrill-seekers.

Playing in 3NT after a standard 15-17 no trump Stayman auction, Alon Birman as East received a club lead to North's ♣A, and a shift to a spade, ducked to the queen. Back came a heart, and dummy's ♥9 held. Birman crossed to hand with the ♥A and found the fine play of a low diamond to the ♦Q and ♦K – the entries to dummy are good enough that it is sensible to block the diamonds to try to ensure a re-entry to hand. In this ending:

North exited with a spade rather than a diamond, and Birman took the ♠A, cashed the ♥KQ pitching a club from hand, came to the ♦A, and squeezed South into coming down to two spades and two clubs. He had the choice of endplaying South with a spade to lead clubs into the tenace, or with a club to lead spades round to his ♠K9!

The next deal features John Kranyak and Yoram Bar-Yosef combining very nicely together. Just look at the West hand and decide what you might lead on

the auction shown.

Kranyak found the inspired club lead! Yoram won his ♣A and underled in spades to John's jack for a club ruff and another spade to the ♠Q for a second club ruff. Since 3♠ was the limit of the East-West cards because of the heart ruff, +500 was worth virtually every matchpoint.

The award for the Schroder Cup, given for best performance in the various pairs competitions, went to Jeroen Bruggeman of the Netherlands. Meanwhile the WBF awards for the players best exhibiting the spirit of the camp went to Kare Gjaeldbaek of Denmark, Ben Green of England, Filippos Karamanlis of Greece, and Joel Wooldridge of USA.

## Three-session KOs complete in one day

## Grand Nationals now is 4 events

The GNT was originally a North American contest with all 25 ACBL districts participating. Now it is a United States event, with only the 23 U.S. districts participating.

In 1985 the event was subdivided into three separate events: flights A, B and C. Another change came in 2001 when the GNT Championship Flight — for players with more than 5,000 masterpoints — was created. Flight A is now a 0-5000 event.

The winners in each event will have their names engraved on the Morehead Trophy, donated by The New York Times in memory of its longtime bridge editor Albert H. Morehead.

### Albert H. Morehead

Morehead (1909-1966) was born in Flintstone GA and educated at Baylor and Harvard. Ely Culbertson hired him in 1932 because of his outstanding ability as a player and analyst and made him technical editor of *The Bridge World* in 1933.

He proved so invaluable that in 1934 he was made general manager of all Culbertson enterprises. He was only 25 when he played on the Culbertson team that defeated the British in the second international match for the Schwab Cup.

Morehead was the first bridge editor of *The New York Times* with a Sunday column from 1935 and a daily column from 1959. He resigned from the Times late in 1963 to devote full time to writing, editing and publishing of the dictionaries, encyclopedias and thesauruses that made him one of the foremost American lexicographers.

During those years, Morehead found time for tremendous service to organized bridge. He was an officer of the United States Bridge Association when that organization amalgamated with the American Bridge League in 1937.

He became a governor of the newly formed ACBL and served as president in 1943 and chairman of the board from 1943 to 1945. He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1946.

Morehead was a member of the National Laws Commission and was in charge of production of the *International Laws of Contract Bridge*. He was also the author of the constitution of the World Bridge Federation — the first formal definition of the scope, structure, powers and duties of that organization.

Morehead was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

Some insight into the man behind all this talent can be found in his obituary in the November 1966 issue of the *Bridge Bulletin*. Editor Dick Frey wrote:

“No one ever saw him lose his temper at the bridge table or heard him speak an unkind word to a partner. He smiled often, but the only player he ever laughed at was himself.

“Rarely if ever did he turn down a plea for help. Writing this, I am proud to acknowledge the debt I owe him and to claim that he was my best friend. The secret of his greatness was that there are scores of others who will truly say exactly this of Albert Hodges Morehead.”

Last year Russ Ekeblad, Sheila Ekeblad, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell, Michael Seamon and Mark Molson led from start to finish against District 17 (Lou Ann O'Rourke, Billy Miller, Roger Bates, Garey Hayden and Marc Jacobus).

Russ Ekeblad, Meckstroth, Rodwell and Seamon are back but this year their teammates are Spike Lay and Larry Griffey.

### The 'Meckwell' insurance plan

It must be nice to have Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell as teammates. Imagine the sense of security that imparts to other team members.

Take, for example, these deals:

Consider this contract as declarer (North). East leads the ♣A and shifts to a diamond. You play low from dummy and West plays the ♦J. You win the ace and decide to go all out to make your contract — if the spade finesse works, you can cash the ♠A for a diamond pitch.

Unfortunately West wins the ♠K, gives East a club ruff, wins the diamond return and plays another club.

So you're down three. Feel bad? Don't. You just won 11 IMPs.

At the other table, your insurance — Meckwell — defended the same contract in the same manner but they stopped off to double declarer first — and were plus 800.

Here's another example. You are West, vulnerable against not, and hold:

♠ A J 10 7 5 4 ♥ 10 4 3 ♦ 6 3 ♣ 4 3.

The bidding begins 1♣ on your left, pass by partner, 1♦ on your right. You decide to exercise restraint at these colors and pass quietly.

LHO rebids 1♥, partner passes again and RHO bids 1♠, Alerted as a (possibly) artificial force. Now let's say you decide to double — just to help partner out in case he's on lead.

Things now take an unpleasant turn, as LHO redoubles and this is passed back to you. You sheepishly pass and your opponents proceed to take nine tricks without breaking a sweat.

So you're minus 920. Feel bad? Don't. You just won 2 IMPs. Meckstroth and Rodwell got to the laydown 6NT and scored up plus 990.

## Sheinwold and Mac Nab Trophies for Flights B, C

Qualifications in Flight B and Flight C of the Grand National Teams were earned in the grassroots event earlier this year. Flight B winners will have their names engraved on the Sheinwold Trophy while the names of Flight C winners will be engraved on the Mac Nab Trophy.

### Alfred Sheinwold

Alfred Sheinwold (1912–1997) was one of the greatest bridge writers in the history of the game. He was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

His syndicated bridge column was considered by many to be the best – he had a knack for getting his point across to even the least experienced players. He managed this by making sure that every column had only one main point, marking it easier for his readers to focus.

“You could read a Sheinwold column and know in an instant that nobody else could have written it,” said Frank Stewart, co-author of the column in Sheinwold’s later years. “He enlightened and entertained players through seven decades and earned millions of fans.”

Sheinwold was an editor of *The Bridge World* from 1934 to 1963 and editor of *The Bridge Bulletin* from 1953 to 1958. He was also the author of perhaps the most successful bridge book ever written, *5 Weeks to Winning Bridge*, a book that sold in the millions.

Sheinwold served as chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission from 1964 to 1975, as chairman of the appeals committees at NABCs and as chairman of the ACBL Board of Governors from 1970 to 1973. He was named ACBL *Honorary Member of the Year* in 1983.

### Robin Mac Nab

Robin Mac Nab (1915–1985) served as a member of the ACBL Board of Directors from 1956 to 1981. He was ACBL president in 1965. He was a past president of the Western Conference, a member of the ACBL Laws Commission and a member of the executive council of the World Bridge Federation.

Mac Nab, a graduate of Cornell University, was a member of the U.S. Olympic track and field squad in 1936.

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.
