# Recalling a terrifying day in New Zealand

The way Gianarrigo Rona remembers it, being in Christchurch, New Zealand, on Feb. 22 of this year was like being in a boat as it is tossed on the waves of an angry sea.

"That is a very bad impression," says the World Bridge Federation president, who is visiting Louisville during the Spring NABC.

On Friday, Rona and John Wignall, first vice president of the WBF, recounted their experience during the devastating earthquake that struck New Zealand.

Rona was visiting the country to check out the

convention center in Christchurch as a possible site for a future world championship. The WBF president had done a radio interview the morning of Feb. 22, and was heading with Wignall to a vineyard run by two Italians.

In Wignall's BMW, the two were heading for the town of Lyttelton on Summit Road.

"All of a sudden," Wignall recalls, "a thick mist descended on the road." Wignall didn't take long in deciding to turn around and head back

# Youth trials scheduled

In 2011, the United States Bridge Federation (USBF) will select teams of young bridge players to compete for the United States in two international events: The Second World Youth Congress (WYC) in Opatija, Croatia, Aug. 21-30, and the World Mind Sports Games (WMSG), Aug. 11-25, 2012 (location to be determined).

For each event, the United States will field a team of players who are younger than 26 years old (U26) and a team of players younger than 21 (U21). For the WMSG, there will also be a team of players younger than 28 (U28).

# Zia, El-Ahmady lead Kay Platinum Pairs

Zia Mahmood and Walid El-Ahmady scored nearly 69% in the first qualifying session of the Norman Kay Platinum Pairs, then followed with a 59% game to take the lead heading into the semifinal sessions today. Two final sessions are scheduled for Sunday.

Zia and El-Ahmady, an Egyptian star player, will have a carryover of 62.5 matchpoints, 14 ahead of Mike Kamil and R. Jay Becker, the pair in second place. Right behind them are Californians Alexander Kolesnik and Jim Munday.

The event, which debuted in Reno last year, is open to ACBL members who meet the following criteria: have earned 50 platinum masterpoints over the three calendar years prior; earned at least 200 platinum points lifetime or have attained Platinum Life Master or Grand Life Master rank.

# Esberg, Budd lead IMP Pairs

Bill Esberg of Long Branch NJ and Richard Budd of Portland ME scored two good sessions to take the lead into today's final of the Lebhar IMP Pairs. The pair earned 62.61 IMPs in the afternoon and followed with 61.18 in the evening. Their carryover of 27.60 IMPs is slightly more than 7 IMPs ahead of the nearest pair.

Thorlakur Jonsson of Kopavogur, Iceland, and Jon Baldursson of Hafnarfjordur, Iceland, are in second place. Their carryover is 20.53.

Several pairs follow closely. Carlos Pellegrini of Buenos Aires, Argentina, and Hector Camberos of Charlotte NC have a 19.82-IMP carryover. The fourth-highest qualifiers are Pierre Flatowicz of Omaha NE and Phillip Becker of Beachwood OH.

# More from the racetrack By Marti Ronemus

For those of you who didn't read yesterday's column, my father was a small-time amateur racehorse owner and trainer. Thusly, most of my early opinions about the world were formed

in the stables and at the track. I'm sharing this wisdom to help you in your quest for bridge excellence! My dad

horses, we had



to help provide for their health and comfort. For us, that meant mucking out stalls, truly unskilled labor. Do vou have any idea how much poop (I can use that word: I checked George Carlin's list) one horse can produce? It's a lot.

While it made my sisters and me strong, it also developed in me an almost pathological hatred of hard work, undiminished to this day. Maybe I shouldn't confess this to you, but that's why I make my living in bridge. It's not work! If I had to get a real job I would be asking you if you wanted fries with that!

But I digress.

Never being one to suffer in silence, I complained mightily about my slavery and servitude. This did nothing to dissuade my dad, which brings us to today's lesson:

Being knee-deep in horse manure isn't the worst thing that can happen to you.

In one of the Easybridge! books, Edith McMullin tells the story of the little bird who, in his attempt to elude a hungry cat, hides in a pile of the aforementioned. He finds he's warm, sheltered and because of the smell, the cat can't find him. He concludes it ain't so bad.

And now for our bridge tie-in: "Down one is good bridge!" It is very hard for newer players, especially those new to duplicate, to understand that finding yourself knee-deep and going down can actually put you, like our little bird, in a winning spot. In a competitive auction, going down 50 or 100 when the opponents could have made 110 or higher is a good thing.

A brief word of sanity here: going down

one is not a good thing if (a) the opponents were already going down - called a "phantom sacrifice" - or (b) you went down because of sloppy declarer play or (c) you are doubled at unfavorable vulnerability...story for another day.

Take a minute and look at this. No one is vulnerable, which will be part of our decision-making. Here's a possible bidding sequence with West as dealer:

This board is going to be played all over the place! It easily makes 2♦ for East-West. It just as easily makes 2 v for North-South. What should West do now? West is a big fan of The Law of Total Tricks, and knowing they have a nine-card fit, she's willing to go down one in  $3 \blacklozenge$ . Even doubled, she knows she shouldn't go down more than 100, being non-vul. She also knows that if her bid pushes North-South  $3 \lor$ , they'll go down,

Incidentally, I'd like you to notice that North's double was a heads-up to East, who without it, might very well have bid 1NT. The double was a warning North held the majors, making East's major holdings questionable.

West's willingness to be kneedeep in you-know-what turned out to be a very good decision. You can't always tiptoe around those piles of manure. Being willing to walk right in can make you a much better player.


side usually has 24 HCP between them, minimum. South's Pass indicates a full opening bid (more on this later) and West's raise shows four-card support with 16-18 support points.

So there you have today's philosophy from the racetrack; pick up your shovel and dig. You could be in worse places.

One final digression: I believe so strongly that "down one is good bridge" that I have asked for it to be on my tombstone. I was telling this to a non-bridge friend (try explaining *that*!) who spent 17 years paying off her son's Princeton education. She wants her tombstone to read "Loving Mother and Grandmother, and Proud Princeton Parent."

Well, there it is. More than you wanted to know about all sorts of things, straight from the horse's mouth. Let me hear from you about your adventures. I actually want to hear them. mronemus@comcast.net.



which West can read as shortness because the ♣9 is in the dummy. Whenever partner leads an honor card and the next lower card is visible, assume shortness. West takes two clubs and gives East a club ruff for down two. It is the only defense that defeats the contract. Note: Some lead the queen from the A-K-Q.

#### **Opening lead: A**K.

Bidding commentary: North's redouble shows 11 or more high-card points (seldom 10) and East is allowed to show a four-card suit at the one level. West knows that East can't have much given the North-South bidding. The redoubling

six-card suit, tack on 3 extra points if your hand has no singleton, 4 if it does, and a whopping 5 extra points if it has a singleton and a doubleton. Don't look now, but your hand is now worth 17 points, perhaps less as the **&**K may not be working on the bidding.

Lead commentary: Holding the ace-king in a suit partner has bid, the king, *not* the ace, is the proper lead. The lead of an ace in a suit partner has bid, or in a supported suit, denies the king. In either of these scenarios, an ace is often led without the king.

Defensive commentary: East plays the AJ at trick one, the equal honor signal showing the top of a sequence. West, who wants a club shift, leads a low spade at trick two to East's 9. East shifts to the \$10,

## Subbing For Mom By Julie Warner Klaper

I don't think I remember a time when my mom and her sister did not play bridge. I know my mom was a Life Master and I assume my aunt was, too. They each had their own duplicate, party and couple's games.

The one time they were in the same room, bidding at the same time, was a bi-monthly game at the Dayton Women's Club. I never did think to ask why they didn't play as partners. Maybe because it was the phone conversation after each session, analyzing the day, that was more fun. It was never a competitive exchange, not a sisterly "I did that better than you did." It was more about learning from each other, inserting a bit of gossip with the sharing of a tip and reliving what was their favorite way to spend an afternoon.

They dissected every hand – what they each bid, what was led, who got the best outcome. I am now their age when this tradition began and I am still amazed that they could continue to track each play, almost card by card, until the routine ended with my mother's death in 2005 at the age of 89. My aunt was 92.

I was a not-very-serious bridge player from college but enjoyed the game even then. You knew it was finals week because we played with textbooks on our laps, studying when we were dummy.

I had the pleasure of playing a few hands with my mother but I was clearly not in her league. After she died, I moved to South Carolina from Indiana and now had the time to learn more about the game these sisters loved.

I started taking lessons at our local bridge center, and that is when I began to substitute for my mother. My aunt and I then lived 750 miles apart. A critical part of our weekly phone conversations was recounting the details of a few favorite hands that we each had played that week, in separate states.

We could not share the same cards and duplicate boards as she and my mom did, so the setup of each hand took a bit of time. My aunt's recall was better than mine. Mayno still used what she and I called "old style" bidding. She opened a strong two-id and thought a transfer was something you needed when traveling on a bus in a large city. I was learning newer conventions, So I kept my part of the conversation to things that related to her style of bidding. The tradition, slightly revised, continued.

But the best part was when we did get to play together. I would give Mayno some advance warning of when I was going to Dayton to visit her. I had to work pretty far out because I didn't want to interfere with her usual busy schedule, including playing bridge with her friends two to three times a week.

In addition to organizing and finding subs for these various groups, she would corral a couple of opponents for us when I came into town. We played her conventions, which worked out fine. As sharp as she was about her affairs and her detailed recaps of her games, I was still curious how she would do with the actual play of the hand. the last card played, was the one that clinched the contract, and she knew it was good.

Mayno suffered from macular degeneration and her vision continued to fade so she was almost blind. She was always concerned about it getting so bad that she would not be able to see the cards. Fortunately, that didn't happen. On one of my excursions home, we picked up a high-power lamp, normally used by seamstresses for doing detail work. That assisted with her seeing the difference between a club and a spade and helped her to continue to play.

I have a sister who used to play bridge, starting as I did, learning from our mom. She is six years older, and I remember helping her ready the duplicate boards when my parents did their rotation for their couple's bridge group. Becky did not rely on the randomness of the deal but chose to set up the hands her way, to make things a bit more interesting for the guests. My parents never knew. Today, we live in different states but we share a love for the game of golf. A portion of many of our conversations includes recapping shots from a recent game or sharing a tip. The tradition continues, albeit with a slight variation in the vocabulary. If she played bridge, we would have just that much more to talk about.



Quite a few pairs had bid to 3NT, so Grue needed to rake in the overtricks just to get to average. When a low spade was led, he correctly stuck in the 8, and took West's jack with his king. The  $\mathbf{V}$ K held, and a low heart went to the 10, jack and queen. West shifted to a low club, and Grue ran it around to dummy's 10. That was good enough for plus 210 and 7 out of 13 matchpoints.

On this deal, Grue and Blanchard can make 3NT, but it's tough to get to that contract after one of your opponents opens a strong 1NT. No matter they did even better.



The deadline for entering this event is April 1. For the U21 team, the online trial is May 21-22, with an April 22 deadline for entering.

For the 2012 World Mind Sports Games, the U28 trials will be in Detroit, June 10-11, the same time as the trials for the women's and Senior teams. The U26 trials for the WMSG will take place at the 2011 Fall NABC in Seattle. The U21 trials will be at the 2011 Summer NABC in Toronto, July 31. The USBF covers expenses for the international competitions and charges no entry fees for the online and in-person trials. # **Electronic Device Policy**

1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.

2. For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.

3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

decision. We would have been in trouble if we had continued."

As they headed back to Christchurch, the two men were thinking about their wives back in the city. The women had planned lunch together, and their husbands were concerned for their safety.

Wignall says he wasn't thinking about anything but getting home: "You worry about how you feel later."

In no time, continuing the journey back to Christchurch in the car became impossible, Wignall says. "We got hit with a wave of people on foot and in cars. It was gridlock." Offices had emptied and people, many of them crying, filled the streets.

Rona and Wignall abandoned the BMW and set off on foot for Wignall's home in Christchurch. As they went, the ground intermittently shook beneath their feet.

Rona says the continued tremors were difficult to deal with "because you don't know if the next shock will be strong."

Wignall reckons the trip on foot covered six to seven kilometers, three and a half to four miles.

On the way, they passed a hospital that had been evacuated. Patients were outside in hospital beds, some with drips still attached to their arms. They saw a cathedral built in 1850 in ruins, its spires on the ground and the stained-glass windows shattered. They stopped in at the main bridge club in Christchurch to survey the damage. The club won't reopen for at least six months, Wignall says, and it might have to be torn down.

The two arrived at Wignall's home to find their wives unharmed, but the house was a mess. The quake had sent various glass items tumbling from shelves and mantles. "There were lots of broken things in the house," Wignall says.

There was no water, no power and no telephone service. Mobile phones did not work. They got water by melting ice that was in the freezer. They ate a meal by candlelight.

About 8:30 p.m., electricity was restored, and the two couples began to take in the reports from around the country.

"On the ground," says Wignall, "it's worse than anything you see in the news."

He says at least 2500 homes in Christchurch will have to be torn down and rebuilt, and up to half of the businesses in the city will probably meet the same fate. Christchurch, population about 400,000, is the second-largest city in New Zealand.

There is still a 6:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. curfew in the central city. A 26-story hotel is leaning to the side, and "the engineers are trying to figure out how to keep it from falling."

The country is still reeling from the natural disaster, the third earthquake in New Zealand in the space of four months. Wignall says the latest count of the dead from the Feb. 22 quake is at 167 and

may go as high as 200.

Rona left the day after the earthquake, as he had been scheduled to do. Wignall says flights were delayed, but the runway at the airport and the control tower were not damaged, so aircraft could take off and land.

In Australia, Rona followed the developments in New Zealand with keen interest, reflecting that he and his wife "were very lucky" to have gone through the tragic events unscathed.

Wignall, meanwhile, is still witness to a very difficult time in New Zealand history. "You have to see it to believe it," he says. "We are still coming to grips with it."

# Glossary of bridge terms, part 2

Mini-McKenney races: In 1974 the ACBL Board of Directors voted to recognize masterpoint achievements among player below the rank of Life Master. The Bridge Bulletin recognizes leaders ACBL-wide. At the unit level, winners in each category receive recognition and special medallions.

All points won during a calendar year are counted in these races.

Ace of Clubs contests: This competition was created in 1984 to recognize achievement at the club level. Winners are recognized at the unit level as well as ACBL-wide.

Points won only at the club level -- excluding the North American Open Pairs, the Grand National Teams and STaCs -- are counted in these races

Masterpoint races: ACBL recognizes the players who win the most masterpoints in their categories during the calendar year. The categories include 500-1000, 1000-2500, 2500-5000, 5000-7500, 7500-10,000, 10,000-plus, Youth, Junior, Sectional (points won only at sectional tournaments during the year), Senior and Richmond Trophy.

These are the various categories and the requirements for each category at the beginning of a calendar year: **Rookie:** 0-5 masterpoints

Junior Master: 5-20 points

Club Master: 20-50 points

Sectional Master: At least 50 points, including 5 silver

Regional Master: At least 100 points, including 15 silver plus 5 red or gold

NABC Master: At least 200 points, including 50 pigmented points of which 5 must be gold, 15 must be red or gold and 25 must be silver

Life Master: 300-500 points including 50 black, 50 silver, 25 gold and 25 red or gold

Bronze Life Master: 500-1000 points Silver Life Master: 1000-2500 points Gold Life Master: 2500-5000 points Diamond Life Master: 5000-7500 points

Emerald Life Master: 7500-10,000 points

Platinum Life Master: 10,000 points, but no

North American Bridge Championship

Grand Life Master: 10,000 points and a North American Bridge Championship or its equivalent

Youth: age 19 and younger Junior: age 25 and younger

Sectional: points won only at Sectional

tournaments Senior: 55 years or older, points won only in

Senior events

**Richmond Trophy:** awarded to the Canadian Bridge Federation member who wins the most points in a calendar year.

#### Announcements

When using bid boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

Strong, independent and smart were not qualities valued in young women of the early 20th Century. Miriam was the fifth child of seven, born from parents who emigrated from Eastern Europe at the turn of the last century. Her mother, equal in intelligence and wit, gave birth to twin boys, two more sons, Miriam, followed by twin sisters at two year intervals. Life was not a cake walk for MiriamCaghan and her large family.

Miriam's father owned a grocery store, and all the children were required to work. Highly intelligent, she graduated from high school at

age16 despite attending school only half days and working at the store the other half. In those days, there were no calculators, so Miriam began honing her memory skills adding up the cost of goods in her head. Numbers were always her strong suit and strong was her will. Her father deemed that college was unnecessary for women, so at 18 she left her home in Canton OH and ventured to Cleveland to live with a relative and get a job. From the stories I have heard, she fell in love with Southern California and then fell harder for a soldier from Louisville KY. As they say, the rest is history.

While raising three children, Miriam began her weekly bridge game with friends, and monthly couple's games with the husbands. This would continue for the next 50 plus years. Make no mistake, Miriam was extremely competitive and playing bridge was not merely a social passtime. She was a fierce competitor and played to win. Agitated and impatient with average players, Miriam had no tolerance for mediocrity at the card table. With a gifted photographic memory, by the end of the passing, she had already assessed how the game would go. When she would play couple's bridge with her husband Jim as her partner, her aggravation level would rise. As he put it, "I played bridge like I played poker — taking changesgambling a bit— but not Miriam." His wife played bridge scientifically and with serious calculation and intent to win! You would have loved being her partner!
