Gitelman: Grand Life Master



Fred Gitelman has advanced to Grand Life Master, a rank that requires winning an unrestricted NABC event and earning more than 10,000 masterpoints. He lives in Las Vegas, but is originally from Toronto.

Gitelman has established himself as one of the ACBL's best players. He's won several major team games, most recently the Spingold Knockouts in Atlanta in 2005. Gitelman also won the IMP Pairs in Dallas in 2006 playing with Geoff Hampson. In 2003, he won the Cavendish Invitational Pairs, a prestigious tournament that awards cash prizes, playing with Brad Moss.

Gitelman's success has extended to the international level as well. A WBF World Life Master, and he won the IOC Grand Prix Open Teams in 2002 in Salt Lake City. Playing for Canada, he was second in the World Team Youth Championship in 1991. He was second in the World Team Championships in Beijing, China in 1995. He was also second in the World Transnational Team Championship in Bermuda in 2000. In 2005, he placed third in the World Team Championships held in Estoril, Portugal playing for the U.S.

Gitelman, a computer programmer, established Bridge Base Online, a successful Internet bridge site. About 100,000 people have signed up to play on BBO and the traffic on the site is in the thousands every day. Besides being a popular online site for playing bridge, BBO is considered a premier site for broadcasting important team games over the Internet. During a live broadcast, thousands of people watch at any given time. His software powers the vugraph shows at the NABCs.



and Charity foundations, meetings and classes for directors, club managers, bridge teachers. Most of these are open, and you'd be welcome to sit in. Volunteers from all over the country take time during the NABC to work on the foundations and to represent the grass roots of our game at the Board of Governors.

There are two free lectures designed for nonexperts every day, offered by the luminaries of the bridge world. These take place in the I/N playing area, a special place set aside for Newcomer and Intermediate players. In addition, three great bridge teachers - Jerry Helms, Marti Ronemus and Barbara Seagram - will be offering free two-hour lessons. Check these out! They are added value for attending an NABC.

You may have noticed

some bridge players in your home area wearing little square gold pins with ACBL on them. These are Goodwill pins, and one of the greatest honors in bridge is to be named to the National Goodwill Committee. You'll see a goodwill message every day in this Daily Bulletin, and there will be a reception for members of the Goodwill Committee during the tournament. By honoring the tenets of goodwill - courtesy, friendliness, consideration for others - you, too, could be on your way to earning one of those esteemed pins. 
Bidding commentary: An opening bid of a four of a major with a strong eight-card suit and fewer than 10 high-card points is more or less automatic. Preemptive openings in first and second seat are supposed to be weak bids and seldom, if ever, have two aces. In third seat, facing a passed partner, all bets are off. The preemptor may have almost anything, particularly at favorable vulnerability. A wise partner seldom messes with a third-seat preempt. Fourth-seat preempts, however, are a horse of a different color. These preempts show good hands, more often than not with opening-bid strength. After

Defensive commentary: After winning the \diamond A, it should be clear to East that a club shift is necessary. Besides, East can be near certain that West has the \bigstar A, assuming that South has a normal first-seat preempt. Actually, the idea is not whether to shift to a club. That's a given. The question is which club. We are back to our old friend, the "surrounding play." When 10-x-(x)-(x) is to the right and the player on lead has the K-J-9-(x) or A-J-9-(x), the proper card to lead is the jack. If declarer has Q-x-x-(x) and partner the expected ace or king, the lead of the jack gives

Mike Passell that year. In 1988, three years after the still-unsolved murder of Crane, Sanborn moved to New York City and began a career in options trading. She soon met Steve Sanborn, a fellow trader, whom she later married.

The move east was also significant in that she began playing with Karen McCallum. That partnership has lasted 20 years and has produced many victories.

Sanborn is an ACBL Grand Life Master and a WBF Women's World Grand Master. She won the Women's Pairs (1972, 2003), the Women's Teams (1978), the Mixed Pairs (1975, 1977, 1982), the North American Women's Swiss Teams (1989, 1990, 1993), the Master Mixed Teams (1980, 1987, 1990) and the Wagar Women's Knockouts

life. He used to be my idol, not just because of his bridge skill, but also for his lifestyle. Although Zia has a justified reputation for being a tricky player, he taught me about the beauty of the game."

2006.

Rosenberg also emphasized Zia's role as an ambassador of the game and as sponsor for bridgerelated charities to benefit his native Pakistan following a devastating earthquake in 2005. Zia spearheaded a program to build a school there which will admit 250 children this fall.

Zia, who claims homes in London, New York and Pakistan, said that the greatest honor of his life was representing Pakistan in their Bermuda Bowl match against the U.S. in 1981.

"Although the U.S. won, it helped promote bridge in my country."

Even though bridge was his first great love, Zia's family —- his wife and two children —- are now his second.

In a nod to Rosenberg, Zia said, "I've learned something from marriage, and that's to say 'I'm

Zia's list of accomplishments include his titles as an ACBL Grand Life Master and a WBF World Open Grand Master. His ACBL wins include the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams (1987, 1989, 1996), the Spingold Knockouts (1991, 2003), the Vanderbilt Knockouts (1994, 1996), the Life Master Open Pairs (1990, 1991), the Open Boarda-Match Teams (1991, 1996), the Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs (1998) and the Life Master Pairs (2000, 2004, 2005).

He placed second (representing Pakistan) in the Bermuda Bowl in 1981. His other accomplishments include winning the Omar Sharif Individual (1991) and the Transnational Mixed Teams (2004).

Zia was ACBL Player of the Year in 1991, 1996 and 2000, and ACBL Honorary Member in

After playing with some of the bridge greats in the late Sixties and early Seventies, including exhusband Mike Shuman, Harold Guiver, Rhoda Walsh, Peter Rank and Mike Smolen, Sanborn became best known for her hugely successful partnership with the late Barry Crane.

"I had a good temperament for playing with him," she said.

"Barry played kingmaker in the McKenney (Top 500) race each year, and in 1974, he decided (2003, 2005).

Her world titles include the World Mixed Pairs (1978), the Venice Cup (1989, 1993) and the World Women's Pairs (1990).

After thanking many past and current partners and teammates, Sanborn concluded, "Thank you so much for this wonderful tribute."

The evening finished with Alan Osofsky's presentation of 2007 inductee Alan Sontag.

"Alan was already a star when I met him," said Osofsky, who noted that they first met when Sontag was teaching backgammon to his mother.

"He was a terrible teacher," joked Osofsky, blaming Sontag's great energy and speed for making his explanations non-understandable.

"Alan trucks along at 78 rpm when the rest of us are at 45 rpm."

Later, Sontag became Osofsky's mentor at bridge. Sontag's lightning-quick play analysis became legendary.

"An opponent once called the director on Alan for playing too fast —- in the fast pairs!" said Osofsky, who added, "Sonty loves bridge; he's an artist whether he's declaring or conjuring up losing options for declarer when he defends."

Sontag told the story of how he learned bridge from newspaper columns before venturing to a tournament to kibitz. He asked the tournament director, the late Harry Goldwater, who he should watch, and Goldwater pointed him to Victor Mitchell's table. Mitchell, also a Hall of Fame member, became the 16-year-old Sontag's mentor.

Citing a youthful cockiness, Sontag said, "I later decided I was good enough to try to hustle players in New York at the \$2-a-point game at the Mayfair." The game was run by the legendary Al Roth who took an interest in Sontag despite

finding his bidding undisciplined.

"We need more people like Roth in the bridge world," said Sontag. "Strong players who help new players." Sontag's career has had many successes. An ACBL Grand Life Master and a WBF Open Grand Life Master, Sontag has won the Vanderbilt Knockouts (1972, 1988, 1999), the Reisinger **Board-a-Match Teams** (1973), the Spingold Knockouts (1980, 1982, 2000), the Men's Teams (1971, 1979), the Life Master Men's Pairs (1971), the Life Master Pairs (1977), the Men's Swiss Teams (1985, 1987), the Master Mixed

Teams (1989), the Grand National Teams (1994) and the Open Board-a-Match Teams, (2001).

His world titles include the Bermuda Bowl in 1983 and 2001, the World Championship Transnational Teams in 2000 and the World Senior Team Championships in 2005.

Sontag is the author of the *Bridge Bum*, *Power Precision* and co-author of *Improve Your Bridge Fast*.

Sontag thanked three people: Gladys Collier for helping him win his first regional in 1968; Rose Meltzer, "who rejuvenated my career in 1999. No one is easier to play with, and she is so optimistic."; and his wife, Robin Taylor: "You stayed with me through thick and a lot of thin."

Grand National Teams

The GNT was originally a North American contest with all 25 ACBL districts participating. Now it is a United States event, with only the 23 U.S. districts participating.

In 1985 the event was subdivided into three separate events: Flights A, B and C. Another change came in 2001 when the GNT Championship Flight - for players with more than 5000 masterpoints was created. Flight A is now a 0-5000 event.

The winners in each event will have their names engraved on the Morehead Trophy, donated by The New York Times in memory of its longtime bridge editor Albert H. Morehead.

Albert H. Morehead

Morehead (1909-1996) was born in Flintstone GA and educated at Baylor and Harvard. Ely Culbertson hired him in 1932 because of his outstanding ability as a player and analyst and made him technical editor of The Bridge World in 1933.



He proved so invaluable that in 1934 he was made general manager of all Culbertson enterprises. He was only 25 when he played on the Culbertson team that defeated the British in the second international match for the Schwab Cup.

Morehead was the first bridge editor of The New York Times with a Sunday column from 1935 and a daily column from 1959. He resigned from the Times late in 1963 to devote full time to writing, editing and publishing of the dictionaries, encyclopedias and thesauruses that made him one of the foremost American lexicographers.

During those years, Morehead found time for tremendous service to organized bridge. He was an officer of the United States Bridge Association when that organization amalgamated with the American Bridge League in 1937.

He became a governor of the newly formed ACBL and served as president in 1943 and chairman of the board from 1943 to 1945. He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1946.

Morehead was a member of the National Laws Commission and was in charge of production of the International Laws of Contract Bridge. He was also the author of the constitution of the World Bridge Federation — the first formal definition of the scope, structure, powers and duties of that organization.

Morehead was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

issue of the Bridge Bulletin. Editor Dick Frey wrote:

"No one ever saw him lose his temper at the bridge table or heard him speak an unkind word to a partner. He smiled often, but the only player he ever laughed at was himself.

"Rarely if ever did he turn down a plea for help. Writing this, I am proud to acknowledge the debt I owe him and to claim that he was my best friend. The secret of his greatness was that there are scores of others who will truly say exactly this of Albert Hodges Morehead."



Players vie for von Zedtwitz Gold Cup in LM Pairs



The first-time partnership of Bart Bramley and Bjorn Fallenius captured first place in the 2006 von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs in Chicago. Bramley and Fallenius formed their partnership less than a week before the event, which they won by one board.

The play

The Life Master Pairs is a six-session event with two qualifying, two semi-final and two final sessions. It is restricted to Life Masters. At stake is the von Zedtwitz Gold Cup.

In 1930, Waldemar von Zedtwitz donated the Gold Cup, which was presented to the winners of the Life Master Pairs. The first winners: von Zedtwitz and P. Hal Sims.

The trophy was initially contested by master players who had qualified by winning a national championship. It was a four-session event, and the field was limited to 64 players so that a complete movement could be played.

The trophy was originally presented on the basis that three wins by one player would secure him outright possession of the trophy. This feat was achieved by Howard Schenken in 1934. (Schenken won in 1931 and 1933 with David Burnstine and in 1934 with Richard Frey. He also won in 1941 with Merwyn Maier and in 1943 with John Crawford.)

The cup, put back into competition by the donor, was stolen in 1954 while in the possession of John Hubbell, who held the LM Pairs title. The theft followed a television appearance during which Hubbell had exhibited the trophy and given the address of his bridge club where the cup was normally displayed.

The trophy was never recovered and the present cup is an exact replica.

Mary Jane Farell and Marilyn Johnson are the only women's partnership to win the event. Their victory came in 1978.

The von Zedtwitz Gold Cup

Mini-LM Pairs contests begin today

The Mini-Life Master Pairs will begin play today with players able to compete in three separate categories.


The **von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs** - for the Gold Cup B is open to all Life Masters.

The **David Bruce LM-5000 Pairs** is open to players who have earned LM status and have won up to 5000 masterpoints.

The **Sally Young LM-1500 Pairs** is open to players who have earned LM status and have won up to 1500 masterpoints.

The three divisions honor three of ACBL's alltime great players, all members of the ACBL Hall of Fame.

Waldemar von Zedtwitz (1896-1984), ACBL president emeritus, was president of the ACBL in 1948 and of its parent organization, the American Bridge League, in 1932. He was named Honorary Member by the ABL in 1931.



When dissension threatened to break up the ACBL in 1948, the contesting factions agreed to von Zedtwitz as president and chairman with carte blanche power. He is credited with saving the ACBL. In 1949, upon the League's rehabilitation, he immediately returned his carte blanche power to the Board of Directors.

He helped found the World Bridge Federation and played a major role in the formation o the ACBL Charity Foundation.

As a player, von Zedtwitz was noted for his versatility in playing with exponents of different systems. He was one of the first 10 to be named Life Master – he was #4 – when the category was created in 1936.

Von Zedtwitz won many national auction bridge champions and nearly all the contract bridge championships. He and Barbara Brier won the World Mixed Pairs in 1970 when von Zedtwitz was 74 and legally blind. Like von Zedtwitz, **David Bruce** (1900-1965) was one of the first 10 to be named Life Master – in fact, he was #1. A tremendously successful player in the early Thirties, he was known as a soothing partner but an unsettling

opponent. Bruce played with Oswald Jacoby and Howard Schenken on the first of the outstanding teams, the Four Horsemen, captained by P. Hal Sims.

In 1933 with Schenken, Jacoby and Dick Frey (joined shortly afterward by Michael Gottlieb), he organized the Four Aces. This team took the leadership in competition and held it for the next decade.

Unlike von Zedtwitz and Bruce, **Sally Young** (1906-1970) was not one of the first 10 to be named Life Master. She was, however, Life Master #17 and the first woman to earn the rank. Young earned success in open and women's



events – she is the only woman to "three-peat" in the Reisinger. Young and teammates John Crawford, Charles Goren and Charles Solomon won in 1937 and 1938. They added B. Jay Becker to the squad in 1939 and won again.

Young also won the Reisinger in 1947 with teammates Jane Jaeger, Paula Ribner and Kay Rhodes. They remain the only all-women's team to win a major open team event.

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may

use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by



the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word --- such as "transfer" --- and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

Dress Up Night

Players are encouraged to dress up for the evening session, Saturday, July 21. This is a regular feature of all NABCs.

Shuttle service

A system of shuttle services is being provided throughout the tournament to assist you in transportation needs. These shuttles cover the following:



1. Service to or from the Nashville Convention Center and the host hotels in the downtown area (Sheraton, Best Western, Doubletree,

Courtyard by Marriott (4th & Church), Hampton Inn (behind Hall of Fame) and 2. Dinner service to restaurant areas. **Please note** – While these services are provided as a convenience to help you enjoy your visit with us, we are not equipped to move everybody. All of the unattached host hotels and many fine restaurants are within a relatively easy walk from the Convention Center. The transportation is there in case you find it too steep, too hot, your puppies are just too tired, or you can't believe you ate the whole thing. If it rains, be prepared, because not all will be able to ride.

What to Look For

Service can be provided by any of three shuttles:

1. Large - Anchor 55 passenger – usually white,

2. Medium - White Mini Bus with blue trim (yes, this is a used vehicle),

3. Small- Black 15 passenger van.

Look for signs in the front curb side window (opposite the driver). Each has a "Bridge Buggy" sign as well as another sign to identify the mission (route) it is currently on.

Hotel Service

Service begins at 8 each morning, and it will run continuously through most of the day. There will be planned breaks in service for an hour at 10 a.m. and for a half hour at 1 p.m. Service will be more frequent before and after the bridge events.

Dinner Shuttle

1. Downtown loop that covers lower Broad, 2nd Avenue, Church Street and other locations that are within the nearby area (frequency – about 30 minutes). Operates from 4 to 10 p.m.

2. West End - High concentration of some of Nashville's finest restaurants (frequency – about 40 minutes). Operates from 4 to 9 p.m. There is a change, however, from previous information published (web site, etc.). They will not be altering their route during the tournament. The nearest stops to the convention center are 4th & Church (Courtyard by Marriott) where you can transfer to our hotel shuttle service. Or, you can exit at the next stop, 3rd and Commerce. Both stops are about two blocks away, but 3rd and Commerce is generally uphill.

The yellow shuttle service runs from 7 a.m. to

Departure times: 8 a.m. & 11 a.m. Return service:

1. Through the West End Dinner route (ask the driver to drop you off),

2. Midnight from the Convention Center. **Frequency of Service**

Generally, the services are to be provided in a continuous loop, and there will not be scheduled arrival or departure times. No announcement will be made in the hotels. It is important that you actively look for the bus so that you make the connection. The bus will wait only a couple of minutes at each "stop," and if no patrons are seen, the driver will move on to the next location. Especially on the dinner routes, be prepared to get the driver's attention. Many of these streets are very busy or narrow, and they are not conducive to any type of long-term stop or blockage of other traffic.

3. Special destinations – look for additional information to come

Convention Center is the Hub

The Convention Center is the hub of the action. The dinner routes will generally operate independently from the hotel service. So, consider the Convention Center a transfer point if you want to get to both destinations. Important: The Convention Center loading and unloading point is the Commerce Street entrance.

LP Field Parking

If not staying downtown, you can park in Lot A / B at the Titans stadium lot at LP Field. This is an existing service for people who work downtown, and is available for us during the tournament.

Just check in with the security guard. Cost is generally free, but if the lot fills, the overflow lot is \$1. They have an existing shuttle service that costs \$1 each way. Look for the bright yellow Park It bus. 6:30 p.m. Return service is from either of the aforementioned stops. The frequency is normally every 20 minutes, but every 10 minutes at peak, from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.

After 6:30 p.m. use the Downtown Dinner route, and ask the driver to drop you off at LP Field. After 10 p.m., request service from either the driver of either the Minibus or the Passenger Van as they stand or stop at the Convention Center.

Important – this parking option is not available on either Sunday or the second Saturday. If you are staying at the Ramada Ltd., call Mr. Wilson (the day before, please) for a transportation appointment at 615-525-7024.

Important – the bright yellow buses will not run the first Saturday, but will be replaced with one of our buses, with service about every 30 minutes. (Free that day!)

Vanderbilt Bridge Club

You can park and ride from the Vanderbilt Bridge Club.

Hotel Service Frequency (note – these are estimates)

Sheraton: 8 a.m. to 10 a.m., 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., 10 minutes; all other service periods – 20 to 30 minutes. All other hotels, 20 to 30 minutes during service periods.
