## Fantoni, Zeckhauser lead pack in LM Pairs

Fulvio Fantoni and Richard Zeckhauser are the leaders after the second day of play in the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs. Capping a 57.02% game in the first semifinal session with a huge 69.31% game in the second, Fantoni, of Rome, Italy, and Zeckhauser, of Cambridge MA, have a total of 3260.02 matchpoints, including carryover. (Top was 77 in yesterday's round.)

In second with 3205.92 are the Chicago duo of David Yang and Xiadong Shi. Close behind in third are Bob Hamman and Justin Lall with 3204.76.

Seventy-eight pairs have survived to today's two-session final.

## Strizhevsky, Kreslavskiy on top in Bruce LM

Michael Strivhevsky and Mikhail Kreslavskiy of the Marietta GA area lead the field in the Bruce LM-5000 Pairs after the semifinal round. With a very strong 68.70% game in the afternoon session and a 54.97% game in the evening, Strivhevsky and Kreslavskiy have a two-day total of 2069.04 (semifinal top = 47).

In second with 2058.71 are Texans Phillip Grothus and Ed Rawlison.

Fifty-two pairs made the cut to today's final round.

## Young LM quals led by Cowan, Feldman

Toronto-area players Christopher Cowan and Debbie Feldman are the top qualifiers in the Young LM-1500 Pairs after yesterday's semifinal round. Cowan and Feldman turned in 60% efforts in both sessions to finish with a score of 776.04 (with carover). Top yesterday was 17.

In second with 759.18 are local player Gregory Reichert and William Howard of Arizona.

Today's final round will be contested by 18 pairs.

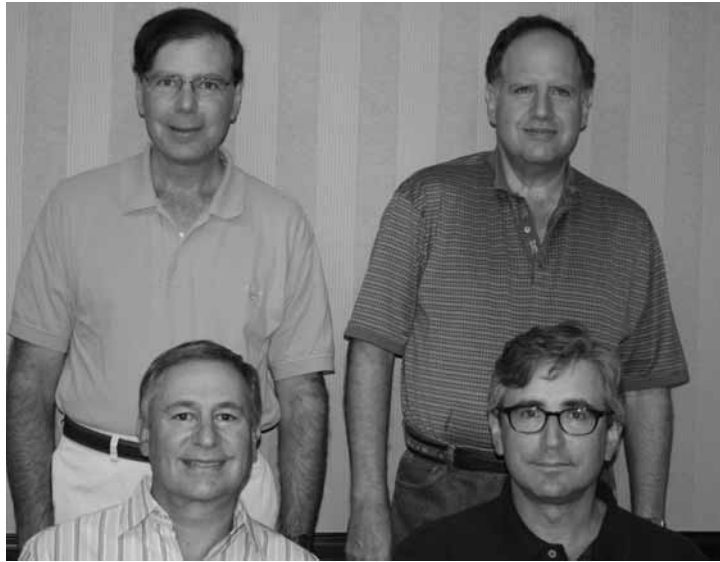

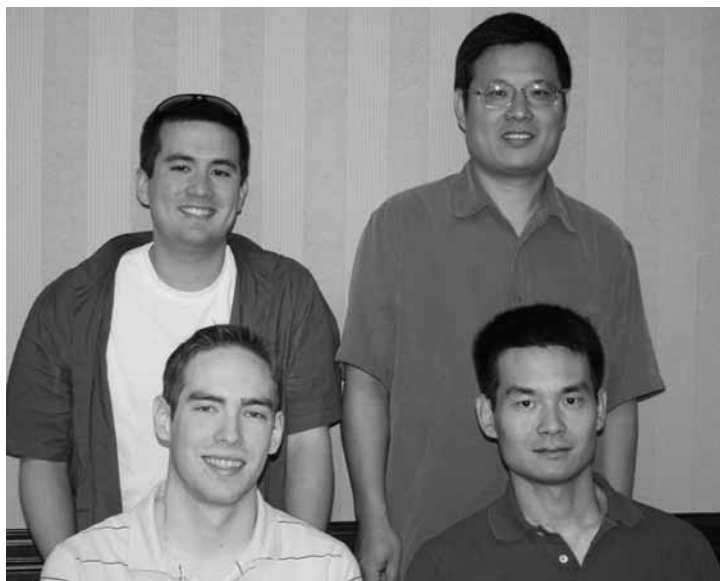
### D21 cruises in GNT-B

### D16 wins GNT-C

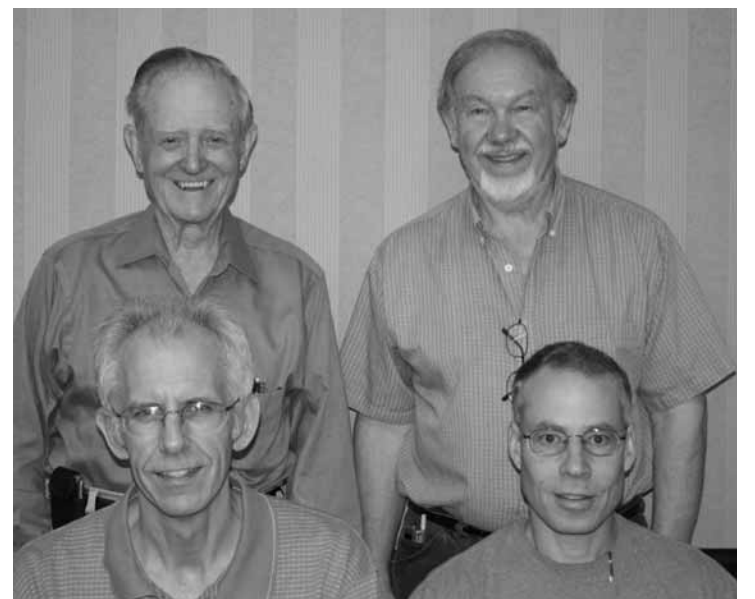
A team from the Houston area won the GNT Flight C, and in the process two members achieved Life Master rank.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

## Creating a partnership

At its best, playing bridge is a creative process. It's not just the memory of and



application of rules. With the billions of card combinations and only a 15-word code, we have to improvise to deal with new situations. Add to this mix the personalities and abilities of the players and we have a dynamic process which changes all the time. No wonder the

results can be so different from one table to another.

At its best, a partnership is also a creative process. Its basis is an agreement on bidding and defensive style — what we call “Standard American” or “2/1” or whatever. One of the best ways to achieve this part of the partnership is to fill out a convention card together. The Laws require that we each have a card and that they be identically filled out. Even if you play with the same partner all the time, compare notes and check the accuracy of your card often. If you play with several different partners, have a separate card for each one. Not only are the opponents entitled to an accurate description of your agreements, but you and your partner will play better if you both know what you've agreed to.

If you aren't sure how to fill out your card, get help. The two of you can find a teacher, a director, or a good player willing to mentor. Get one of them to go over the card with you. You can also find all sorts of information on the ACBL web site ([www.acbl.org](http://www.acbl.org)). Just type in “convention card” in the search box on the home page to access the great assets of the ACBL. Download the free convention card editor, and

you can produce professional-quality cards for you and your partners.

The more important element of developing a partnership isn't so easy to quantify. It begins with having a compatible idea of the game. It's no fun if you like taking chances and your partner is not only timid but disapproving when you push. Attitude is more important than skill level. Whether you are looking for a mentor or a partner, don't commit long term until you have had a chance to make sure you have the same approach to the game. If you both love the game but can't seem to get along, stay friends, but not partners. This applies to spouses and best friends, too. How important are rules? Can you depart a little from what's written on your card without upsetting your partner?

An important element of the partnership is how you deal with adversity — when things go wrong, how do you behave? Can you tolerate lapses of memory and mistakes? Can you talk about disaster without placing blame? Can you take the blame? Do you know when to quit talking about a problem because enough has been said? If one of you loves analysis and the other never wants to talk about the deals, you probably



don't have a happy future as partners.

How do you go about changing your agreements? Are you comfortable with your bidding system as it is while your partner keeps wanting to add gadgets and tweak the system?

Do you get a mental version of hives when you're faced with new ideas? Effective partnerships do change, but carefully. Whether you have a comfortable, successful team or you are making changes because of problems, add only one new item to your card at a time. And remember that even desired changes create stress as you try to remember and to make adjustments to deal with the new ideas.

## Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♠K.

**Bidding commentary:** East needs longer and stronger clubs to double the 2♣ bid (Stayman). This lead-directing double typically is made with five or six clubs headed by three honors.

**Defensive commentary:** East overtakes the ♠K, unblocking the suit, and returns a spade. East-West rattle off the first five spade tricks. It is pretty close to automatic to overtake the lead of a king at notrump with A-x unless dummy has something like J-x-x or 10-x-x-x, in which case overtaking sets up an undeserved trick in

dummy.

**Defensive commentary #2.** As an aside, East knows quite a bit about the deal from the bidding, the lead and dummy's strength. From the bidding, East knows that South does not have four spades.

From the lead, East knows that West has at least five spades (South can't have four) headed by the K-Q-10 or K-Q-J. If West's spades are weaker, West leads fourth-best. From the strength

of the dummy (12 high-card points), East knows that the opponents have 28 high-card points between them, give or take one point. (East assigns South 16 HCP, a middle count, to make this calculation). If the opponents have 28 HCP, East-West have 12. East has 7 HCP, and he knows partner has the ♠K Q for 5 HCP. That's 12! Bidding, lead and strength calculations help defenders map out strategy.

## Talking Bridge

I remember that at the Maastricht Olympiad in 2000 the local restaurants all displayed signs saying "Bridge spoken here."

If you wander into the downtown area of Nashville after the afternoon session you will not see the sign, but you will find it impossible to avoid hearing the inevitable precursor to any bridge discussion: "You hold . . ."

I got the chance to chat with quite a few players, and there was plenty to talk about.

You generally find that most of the discussion centers on bidding problems, although occasionally a tricky play or defense will enter into the conversation. Here are just a few of the deals that entered our particular spotlight:

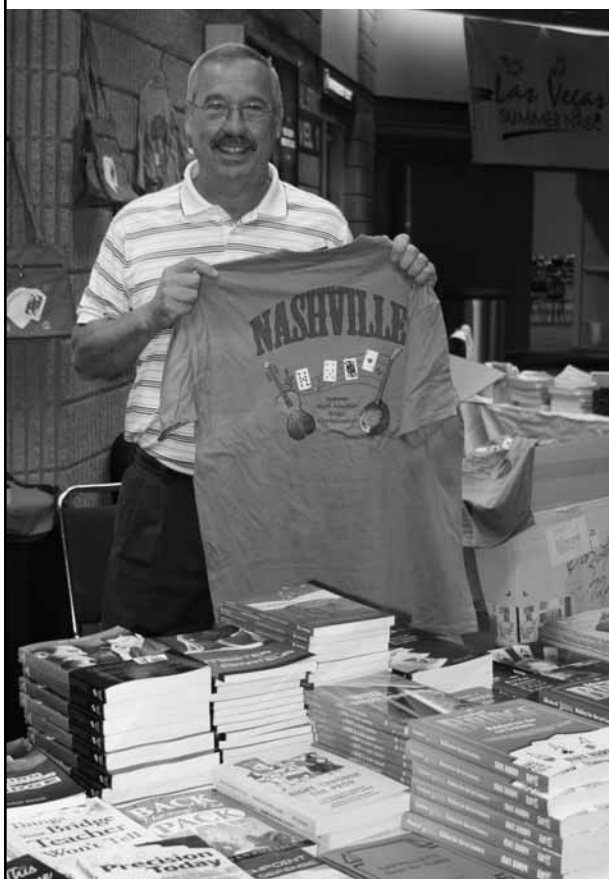

I prefer 1NT on this type of deal, mainly because if you open 1♥ then you may find it difficult to get your hand across after a response of 1♠ or even 2♣/2♦.

Let's suppose you prefer to open 1♥. What should North respond?

In the good old days, North would respond 3♣ to show a good hand, but modern theory says that you should only force with a very good suit of your own or a fit for partner, so you may prefer to respond 2♣. How should South continue?

The bid chosen was 2♦, but the subsequent auction did not go well, as North elected to play in diamonds, and 7♦ was one of the grand slams that could not be made.

After 2♦ North's best bid may well be a simple 2♠ – fourth suit forcing – after which South can bid 3♣. Mind you, there is still a long way to go before North can justify trying for all the tricks.

If South opens 1NT then North will immediately be thinking in terms of a grand slam – one obvious way to start being a response of 3♣, raised to 4♣ by South.

At least that was a deal where you would expect everyone to bid some sort of slam, but this next one looks much tougher:

The perfect fit makes 6♠ a great contract, although there are two major problems: how to reach it and how to play spades, the latter being just as important in a pairs game even if you stay out of slam.

North has an obvious 1♠ bid, but if South then uses the currently popular response of 2NT, North has no obviously good bid. Indeed, the North player who told me about the hand simply bid 4♠ which ended the auction.

(The key to bidding slam is to discover that North's second suit is clubs, but most players seem to think that a bid of 3♣ or 4♣ by North should show a five-card suit.)

As to the way to play the spade suit: If West happens to bid then it should be clear that it must be based on distribution, so you should play East for length in spades.

If West happens to ask you about the meaning of 2NT, thinks for a moment and passes you might draw the right inference.

In a pairs game, some players think they should take a bid whenever it is their turn, but that can prove to be a double-edged sword, as on this deal:

When South opened 1♣ (a tactical bid that would not be my first choice), West felt constrained to overcall 1♦. North bid 1♠ and South rebid 1NT, which was passed around to East

who bid 2♠, the final contract. With careful play, declarer can take seven tricks, but that was not forthcoming and two down, minus 200 was the usual matchpoint disaster.

Evaluation is one area that is constantly under discussion: Just how good a hand do you have? Take a look at this deal:

South opens 1♦, North responds 1♥ and South rebids 2♣. What should North bid?

With four-card diamond support, a vital king in partner's second suit and an ace, for me the answer is clear – 3♦ is what your hand is worth. South is likely to bid 3NT, and unless West happens to find a heart lead, declarer should have no trouble wrapping up nine tricks.

Here's another evaluation test:

What do you think is the best opening bid with the South cards?

There is something to be said for passing, intending to show the distributional nature of your hand on the next round, without overstating its defensive capabilities, but 1♠ looks the natural thing to do.

Suppose, however, that South opens 3♠? (I know one good player who thinks it is a reasonable gambit to open this type of hand 4♠!)

What should North do?

I think it's clear to raise to game – no certainty that it will make – but there will surely be some sort of play for it even if partner has a modest preempt.

So there you have it, just a few of the deals that came under discussion and we haven't even mentioned a whole series of tough play problems or difficult defenses that received an airing.

## Killer lead scuttles grand plan

Steve Goldstein's California-based team was down 30 IMPs in the semifinal round of the Grand National Teams (Championship Flight) in a match against the squad led by New York's Glenn Milgrim. When this deal came along, it gave Goldstein a chance to narrow the opponents' lead, so he went for it. Goldstein was playing with Marshall Miles against Milgrim and Robert Levin:

1♦ was artificial, showing 11-16 HCP and denying a five-card major. 3♥ was a four-card raise with an undisclosed singleton. 4NT was Roman Key Card Blackwood, and the 5♥ response showed two key cards without the ♥Q.

Goldstein needed the IMPs, so he bid the grand slam despite missing the trump queen. In his favor was the good chance that his left-hand opponent, Milgrim, might well lead a trump against 7♥, a common defensive stratagem against suit grand slams. If the opening lead was not a trump, however, Goldstein would play the opening leader for the queen.

The opening lead, however, was a low diamond. Goldstein played low from dummy, but Levin, East, ruffed! The full deal:

The defense chose well: not only did Milgrim elect to begin with a diamond, but Levin also avoided a Lightner double to direct a diamond lead. That might have pushed North-South to 7NT, a likely maker when West's diamond length is discovered early in the play, causing declarer to take a favorable view in hearts.

Had Goldstein succeeded, his team would have gained 13 IMPs; the comparing score was 6♥, making. He lost 17 instead for a 30-IMP swing. His team lost the match by 28 IMPs, so the diamond lead may well have won the match for Milgrim.

## Pre-Alert/Disclosure forms

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a pre-Alert/Disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockout and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available.

## Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

## Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.



# Nashville NABC: A look back to 1988

The last time an NABC was held in Nashville was 1988. Nashville is called "Music City U.S.A." and the nightly entertainment reflected that. There were square dances, sock hops, Dixieland bands, jazz bands, country, gospel and bluegrass music and more. There were banjos, fiddles, dobros (a type of guitar) and pianos. There was an appearance by Minnie Pearl, a midnight cruise on the Cumberland River and a trip to the Grand Ole Opry.

While these are fun things to do at an NABC, in the end it's all about the bridge. Here are some of the more interesting deals from 1988. Hands may be rotated.

### Sometimes it's better to be doubled

This board gave most declarers fits. The usual contract was 6♠ and the bad trump break usually proved too tough. But some declarers were doubled, and a few actually scored up the slam as a result.

South was declarer most of the time and the opening lead was usually the ♦J. Declarer takes the ace, pitching a club. Next come the top clubs followed by a club ruff. A diamond ruff puts declarer back in his hand, and he cashes the ♥A and overtakes the ♥Q with the king so he can ruff another diamond.

Next, he leads a spade to the queen, which West must duck. That's 10 tricks in the bag with the lead in dummy. Declarer calls for dummy's last heart, and West is finished. West, down to the ♠K 10 9, is forced to ruff the trick and lead a trump into declarer's ♠A J.

### Make six? No problem

Glenn Lublin and Peter Boyd, who finished second the Life Master Men's Pairs, enjoyed this deal. They made a 6♥ contract missing the ♠A K and the ace-king of trumps.

"No," said Lublin as he clocked the six hearts and the spade void in dummy. "I'm missing the ♥A K and I know they are not in the same hand because nobody doubled."

### It's a jungle out there

Jim Gardner had to work hard to halve this board from the first final of the Men's Board-a-Match Teams.

Jimmy Cayne, West, led the ♦A and continued the suit. Gardner accepted the force, cashed the ♥A, then led the ♠10. When Cayne played low, Gardner ran the ♠10, then led a spade to the ♠Q, finessed in trumps, drew the last trump and cashed the winning spades. Gardner then threw a diamond on the fourth spade, and endplayed Cayne by exiting with the ♣K—just another routine game.

### The seed was a weed

Nancy Passell, winner of the Life Master Women's Pairs with Nell Cahn, planted a seed in declarer's mind on this deal. The seed grew into a full-blown idea, and suddenly there was no way for declarer to recover.

South bought the hand for 3♦ and Passell started with the ♥K, ducked. Declarer was surprised when Passell shifted to a spade. Cahn won the ♠Q and continued with the ♠K, ruffed.

Now declarer stopped to do a little thinking. She knew Passell knew she was hoping to ruff a heart. Why hadn't Passell led a trump? Of course — she had the queen and didn't want to lead away from it. That's why she tried to get to her partner — so East could lead a trump.

That meant a trump finesse was out of the question, so declarer banged down the ♦A and the ♦K and led a third round. Disaster! Cahn now had two trump tricks to go with two hearts, a spade and a club — the champions had scored the magic number — plus 200.

If declarer had been right, the defense would have taken the third trump, but the ♥A was still in dummy to guard that suit. If the clubs split, declarer would then have the rest of the tricks.

Cahn had fun on this deal from the second Life Master Women's final.

Cahn took the opening club lead with the ♣A and played the ♠Q, ♠K, ♠A and a fourth spade to West's ♠J. West led another club to dummy's ♣K, and Cahn cashed the good spade. Next came the ♥A, a finesse to the ♥J and the ♥K. Now Cahn gave up a heart to East's ♥Q and East was forced to lead a diamond (she had discarded her third club). Cahn guessed correctly to put in the ♦10, so she took the last two tricks with the ♦A and the ♦Q. If East had kept the ♣J, Cahn still could have succeeded with the same guess, placing the ♦J with East the ♦K with West. At trick 11, she could have led the ♦Q, pinning the jack. In fact, if West covers with the ♦K, Cahn actually would take 12 tricks — the diamonds would be good.

# My favorite bridge story

The opening lead was made and Bob took Charlotte’s hand from the board and put it down as dummy. Lo and behold, he had a chance for it! All he needed was a successful finesse of the ♥K.

He played slowly and carefully, postponing the finesse until the last possible moment.

Meanwhile, Charlotte had regained her composure and decided she would return to play the last deal. Just as she reached her chair, Bob took the finesse, which lost.

He looked up at Charlotte, and exclaimed, “You just had to bid 3♥, didn’t you?”

## Shuttle service



A system of shuttle services is being provided throughout the tournament to assist you in transportation needs. These shuttles cover the following:

1. Service to or from the Nashville Convention Center and the host hotels in the downtown area (Sheraton, Best Western, Doubletree, Courtyard by

Marriott (4th & Church), Hampton Inn (behind Hall of Fame) and

2. Dinner service to restaurant areas.

**Please note** – While these services are provided as a convenience to help you enjoy your visit with us, we are not equipped to move everybody. All of the unattached host hotels and many fine restaurants are within a relatively easy walk from the Convention Center. The transportation is there in case you find it too steep, too hot, your puppies are just too tired, or you

can't believe you ate the whole thing. If it rains, be prepared, because not all will be able to ride.

### What to Look For

Service can be provided by any of three shuttles:

1. Large - Anchor 55 passenger – usually white,
2. Medium - White Mini Bus with blue trim (yes, this is a used vehicle),
3. Small- Black 15 passenger van.

(opposite the driver). Each has a "Bridge Buggy" sign as well as another sign to identify the mission (route) it is currently on.

#### Hotel Service

Service begins at 8 each morning, and it will run continuously through most of the day. There will be planned breaks in service for an hour at 10 a.m. and for a half hour at 1 p.m. Service will be more frequent before and after the bridge events.

Hotels served include the Sheraton, Best Western, Holiday Inn Express, Hampton Inn (4th and Korean War Veterans), Courtyard Inn (4th and Church) and Doubletree. Guests at the Wyndham should walk to the Holiday Inn.

##### Dinnertime Shuttle Changes

Effective today, the West End Dinner shuttle will no longer operate. Instead the Downtown Dinner and Hotel shuttle loops will be combined between the hours of 4 and 8 p.m. This will concentrate more resources to moving everyone from the Convention Center to their hotels and /or the many downtown area eating establishments. Check at the Information Desk for additional information on the stops on the revised Downtown Dinner shuttle.

In addition, today only, we have a Soul Train shuttle to Nashville's famous Sweatt's that will depart the Convention Center at 5 p.m. with return service at 6:30 p.m., plus a Germantown shuttle that will depart the Convention Center at 5:30 p.m.

with return service at 7 p.m. Please sign up for these special destination shuttles at the Information Desk to ensure your place.

#### Convention Center is the Hub

The Convention Center is the hub of the action. Important: The Convention Center loading and unloading point is the Commerce Street entrance. This also applies to tours or any other special transportation.

#### LP Field Parking

If not staying downtown, you can park in Lot A / B at the Titans stadium lot at LP Field. This is an existing service for people who work downtown, and is available for us during the tournament.

Just check in with the security guard. Cost is generally free, but if the lot fills, the overflow lot is \$1. They have an existing shuttle service that costs \$1 each way. Look for the bright yellow Park It bus.

There is a change, however, from previous information published (web site, etc.). They will not be altering their route during the tournament. The nearest stops to the convention center are 4th & Church (Courtyard by Marriott) where you can transfer to our hotel shuttle service. Or, you can exit at the next stop, 3rd and Commerce. Both stops are about two blocks away, but 3rd and Commerce is generally uphill.

The yellow shuttle service runs from 7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Return service is from either of the aforementioned stops. The frequency is normally every 20 minutes, but every 10 minutes at peak, from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.

After 6:30 p.m. use the Downtown Dinner route, and ask the driver to drop you off at LP

Field. After 10 p.m., request service from either the driver of either the Minibus or the Passenger Van as they stand or stop at the Convention Center.

**Important** – this parking option is not available on the last Saturday or Sunday of the tournament.

#### Vanderbilt Bridge Club

You can park and ride from the Vanderbilt Bridge Club.

Departure times: 8 a.m. & 11 a.m.

Return service:

1. Through the West End Dinner route (ask the driver to drop you off),
2. Midnight from the Convention Center.

#### Frequency of Service

Generally, the services are to be provided in a continuous loop, and there will not be scheduled arrival or departure times. No announcement will be made in the hotels. **Please: it is important that you actively look for the bus so that you make the connection!** The bus will wait only a couple of minutes at each "stop," and if no patrons are seen, the driver will move on to the next location. Especially on the dinner routes, be prepared to get the driver's attention. Many of these streets are very busy or narrow, and they are not conducive to any type of long-term stop or blockage of other traffic.

**Hotel Service Frequency (note – these are estimates)**

Sheraton: 8 a.m. to 10 a.m., 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., 10 minutes; all other service periods – 20 to 30 minutes. All other hotels, 20 to 30 minutes during service periods.

**Drivers do appreciate tips!**
