ACBL President for 1999: Val Covalciuc

Val Covalciuc, who has represented District 14 on the ACBL Board of Directors since 1994, was elected ACBL President for 1999 in Board meetings last week.

A bridge teacher for 27 years, Covalciuc has also served bridge as an administrator in a variety of posts. She was president of Unit 241 in 1986 and 1987 and president of District 14 in 1992.

Besides teaching bridge, she has also run Teacher Accreditation Programs and now is teaching bridge on the Internet.

A native of Chicago, she is a graduate of Cornell College in Mount Vernon IA with a double major in English and Latin.

Covalciuc is a Diamond Life Master with about 5700 masterpoints. Her favorite and most frequent partner is husband Rick, with whom she has won dozens of regional championships.

Directors to rule on some appeals

On an experimental basis, appeals for all events except NABC+ will be heard and resolved by tournament directors rather than appeals committees. This will be done at the Spring and Summer Championships next year.

The decisions made by the directors will be reviewed by the Chief Tournament Director, an advisory panel consisting of knowledgeable experts, and senior staff. The review process will assess current decisions with the intent of improving future deci-

sions by pointing out errors and developing a guideline manual. The comments of the reviewers will be made available to the Board of Directors.

decisions will be published in the Daily Bulletin.

Traditional appeals procedures involving appeals committees will be used for appeals in NABC+ events.

Dutch team tied for Open BAM lead

A team captained by Kyle Larsen was tied with a squad of Dutch players atop the standings after two qualifying sessions of the Open Board-a-Match Teams. Both scored 35 out of a possible 52.

Larsen, of San Francisco, was playing with Brian Gunnell, Jacksonville FL; Ralph Cohen, Memphis, and Venkatrao Koneru of San Antonio TX.

They were tied with a team from the Netherlands who provided only their last names: Vesrhees, Vis, Visluis and Hoogenhamp.

There was a six-way tie for third.

Japan-U.S. foursome leads Women's BAM

A squad of players from Japan and the U.S. took a lead of a board and a half after two qualifying sessions of the Women's Board-a-Match Teams.

In first place with 35.5 on a 26 average were Morella Pacheco and Ayako Amano of Tokyo; Ginny Schuett of Riverwoods IL, and Ora Lourie of Delray Beach FL.

In second with 34 were Susan Miller, Boca Raton; Ellasue Chaitt, West Palm Beach; Judi Cody, Annandale VA, and Mary Lou Payne, Los Angeles.

In third place with 32 were Nadine Wood, Silver Spring MD; Mickie Kivel, Potomac MD; Claire Tornay, New York; Barbara Heller, Decatur GA; Liz Swanson, Athens GA, and Terry Michaels, Prairie Village KS.

4 Senior teams score easy wins

The No. 1 seed captained by Mike Levine of Boca Raton FL advanced the easy way in the opening round of the Senior Knockout Teams. Levine, Zeke Jabbour, Fred Hamilton, Arnie Fisher, Tom Sanders and Chuck Said led by more than 100 IMPs at the halfway mark and their opponents withdrew.

Three other teams also advanced when their opponents withdrew. Jim Koley, Gene Simpson, Gene Freed, Syd Levey and Simon Kantor led by 72 IMPs after 16 boards and their foes gave up. The teams captained by Jack Coleman and Bob Rosen also had the night off.

Thirty-four teams entered the event, so there were two three-way matches in which only one team advanced. That means that 16 teams will square off in today's 64-board matches.

Player of Year race tightens in stretch

Paul Soloway still holds the lead in the battle for 1998 *Player of the Year* honors, but new contenders emerged after the first national event of the Fall NABC, the Life Master Open Pairs -- and the race could well produce a photo finish.

The *Player of the Year* is the ACBL member who earns the most masterpoints in nationally rated events in a calendar year. Last year, the award went to Bart Bramley.

Soloway entered the Fall NABC with a lead of 38.95 masterpoints over David Berkowitz, who narrowed the gap to 13.85 with an 11th-place finish in the LM Open Pairs with Larry Cohen.

Moving into serious contention with a secondplace finish in the LM Open was Richard Schwartz, who trails Soloway by only 14.39 masterpoints. Schwartz earned 112.50 MPs for his showing in the pair game with Ron Smith. Before the tournament

Yoga classes



The right place

Going into the final of the Life Master Open Pairs, Lew and JoAnna Stansby were far down on the leader board. They took care of that by posting a 68% game in the first final session, assuming a lead they never relinquished.

Reflecting on the huge session, Lew pointed to an unusual number of penalty doubles by his side that resulted in lots of matchpoints. These two deals were indicative of what was going on for the Stansbys.

Lew converted JoAnna's responsive double because of the quick tricks in his hand, plus the good possibility that JoAnna could get a heart ruff (she would have raised hearts had she held more than two). JoAnna did indeed get a heart ruff. Combined with three diamond tricks and the A, the result was plus 300 and 71.5 out of 77 matchpoints. Four boards later, Stansby converted another one of JoAnna's doubles.

Lew acknowledged that it was a guess as to whether it was right to pass JoAnna's takeout double. "I thought it would be easier to defeat 3♦ than to make 4♣."

In fact, it would have taken a heart lead -- unlikely on the auction -- to defeat 4♣. Lew's pass turned out to be inspired, however, and plus 300 earned his side 67 matchpoints.

Heart broken

Overheard in the Stratified Senior Swiss Teams: "Why didn't you lead a heart?

Didn't you see my high heart?"


"Yeah, I saw it, but then you threw a low heart and I thought you had changed your mind."



Maneuvers

This deal from the first qualifying session of the Life Master Open Pairs presented an awkward problem for a number of North-South pairs. There seem to be four easy tricks for the defense -- two top clubs, a spade and a trump. The fifth trick is not at all simple. Conversely, declarer has eight easy tricks but no sure ninth winner, so the battle is really about the overtrick.



A diamond lead against 2∇ by East looks best for the defense, but the $\triangle Q$ was the popular choice. When Judi Radin was declarer, South's $\triangle Q$ was overtaken by North with the ace, and a spade was continued. Radin won the $\triangle K$ and led the $\triangle J$ from hand, losing to the singleton king. A diamond was returned and Radin won dummy's king, killing her $\triangle Q$ in the process.

She then ruffed a spade to set up dummy's 9, cashed the top hearts in her hand and exited with the ♣Q. North won the ♣A but had to give dummy an entry for two discards, and Radin's last club could be ruffed in dummy.

That was not the best result for East-West in a heart contract. At one table, a No. 1 seed (who shall remain nameless) defended 2♥ after this auction:

The ♠Q was allowed to run to the ♠K, and declarer seized the opportunity to pitch his losing spade on a high diamond. East then played a club from dummy to his 9 and South's king. Back came a diamond, ruffed by the ♥J and overruffed by declarer. Now the ♣J went to North's ace, and a heart back to declarer's ace left South with the master ♥Q and a low heart.

East led the ♣Q from hand, and to hold the contract to three, South had to ruff high and lead a trump to stop the crossruff. He forgot to do so, however, so East ended with plus 170 and 42 out of 51 matchpoints for his efforts.

A partner named John

John Cobb of Raleigh NC won the Non-Life Master Pairs in partnership with **John** Mackey. A few weeks ago, he won a Flight C Grand Nationals berth in Vancouver -- his partner was **John** Kirby. Shortly afterwards he earned a Flight C berth in Vancouver. His partner? **John** Marriott!

Executive Committee

Jim Kirkham has been elected as Western Zone representive to the ACBLBoard Executive Committee for a three year term from 1999 through 2001. Roger Smith was elected as Western Zone alternate for the same three-year term,


Escaping the crocodile

Rhoda Walsh, who finished second in the Life Master Women's Pairs in partnership with Shannon Lipscomb, thought she saw a way to make an overtrick on this deal from the first final session -- but she had to escape from the crocodile to make it work.

Making nine tricks is easy -- you lose three diamonds and a heart. But how do you make an overtrick?

South started with the ◆A and then switched to the ♥J. Walsh won with the king and cashed three top trumps. She of course had worked out that North must have the queen doubleton in diamonds -- if South had the queen she would have continued the suit at trick two. So Walsh first cashed dummy's top clubs and ruffed a club, then cunningly led a low diamond toward dummy's 10. South, unaware of Walsh's plan, put up the jack, but North was forced to win with the queen. North was able to get out with a heart to the ace, but moments later Walsh led a heart and North made the mistake of rising with the queen. As a result, she was forced to lead a heart or a club, either of which gave Walsh a sluff-ruff for the 10th trick.

Sometimes just knowing when to cash out can mean a bundle of matchpoints.



Walsh cashed the ♣A at trick one, then switched to a heart to the 9 and ace. Declarer led the ♣J and won it with the ace. Then she cashed the king and gave Walsh her queen. At this point Walsh did a little thinking. Clearly declarer had four spade tricks. And she must have the ♠A since she hadn't gone after that suit, so she had five diamond tricks. Plus two hearts -- that adds up to 11. So she quickly cashed her ♣K, a move that more than tripled her matchpoints on the board.

Courtesy bid

Hugh Ross faced a dilemma in the auction on this deal from the first final session of the Life Master Open Pairs. His solution, in the end, was to give the opponents just a little more rope. Ross was playing with Kyle Larsen.

Ross's 2NT bid is an extension of the lebensohl convention. When used in this auction, 2NT usually denotes a weak hand and asks partner to bid 3. A direct bid of a suit, therefore, shows at least moderately constructive values.

"I didn't know whether my hand was bad enough," Ross confessed, but he bid 2NT anyway.

Larsen bid 3♣, as directed, and it was Ross's turn again. He still wasn't sure what was right with his hand, so he did what he could to keep his options open. He bid 3♠.

"I wanted to give everyone a chance to bid again," Ross said.

It worked like a charm. West passed 3♠, as did North, and East could not resist one more shot. His 3♠ bid was doubled by a grateful Ross, and he and Larsen collected plus 500 with two top hearts, a heart ruff, three diamond tricks and the ♣A. That was good for 74.5 out of 77 matchpoints.

Giant killers

Betty Parker of North Miami Beach and Freerk Polling, formerly of the Netherlands and now a resident of Aventura FL, were giant killers during the final session of the Life Master Pairs Saturday. They had the highest score in that session -- 67% -- and that was good enough to elevate them to 12th place overall.

They got 70 out of a possible 77 masterpoints for getting to the right contract on Board 23.

The opening spade lead went to the jack and ace, and Parker led a diamond to the queen as West played low. She ran the ♥10 (not covered) and then finessed to the ♥J. On her next diamond lead, West rose with the ace and continued the suit. Parker played a spade to her king and ran the good hearts.

Shy on points, OK on tricks

Sharon Hait and Barbara Sartorius, victors in the Life Master Women's Pairs, were a bit shy on high card points for 3NT on this deal from the second final, but the six-card diamond suit more than made up the difference.

Sartorius liked the position of her spade honors and she thought her ♥Q might be prove helpful, so she took another bid over 3♦. Hait was happy to bid 3NT with her heart holding.

Hait put up the queen on the opening heart lead and immediately took the diamond finesse. She wound up with 10 tricks -- six diamonds, two hearts and two spades -- although she probably could have won 11 if she was willing to gamble a bit. But her feeling was that bidding and making game was going to be enough, and she was right -- 32 out of 38 matchpoints.

When someone mentioned that East-West were a bit short in the point count department, Sartorius was quick to point out, "One point for the fifth diamond and two for the sixth. That's what I always tell my students."

Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as "transfer" -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

Want a funny hand?

Bart Bramley strolled into the Daily Bulletin office and said, "Want a funny hand?" We never say no to a question like that. The deal comes from the second final of the Life Master Open Pairs.

(2) Tempted to bid 3NT, but reason prevailed.(3) Shortness in hearts.

Bramley noted two defects in an opening 2NT bid -- there are only 19 high-card points and the distribution -- 5-4-2-2 -- is wrong. He figured the defects canceled each other, so he opened 2NT anyway. After Mark Feldman showed his minor-suit hand, Bramley was tempted to bid 3NT, but he finally shrugged and bid 4. When Feldman bid 4. Bramley of course Alerted and explained that Feldman was showing either a singleton or void in hearts. And then Bramley PASSED!!

Feldman, with his singleton heart, was a bit nervous as he waited for Bramley to put his dummy on the table. He relaxed a bit when he saw the strong support in his trump suit. North led a trump, and Feldman cashed four rounds. Then, figuring South might be short in clubs since he was holding so many trumps, Feldman cashed the ♣A and finessed the 10. The defense got their trump and their two spades, but Feldman scored up plus 620, good for 58 of 77 matchpoints. Why not even more? Because sometimes, when the contract was 3NT, South underled his ♠A-K --and sometimes North was on lead and didn't find the spade lead.

But how often do you pass your partner in a splinter -- and it's right?

started, Schwartz trailed Soloway by nearly 115 masterpoints.

Also surging strongly was Lew Stansby, who won the LM Open with wife JoAnna. Stansby vaulted from 11th to fourth place, only 22.54 points behind the leader.

With literally hundreds of masterpoints available in the four remaining national events, most of the top contenders have a chance for the prestigious title.

The winning team in the Open BAM will earn 125 masterpoints. Other first-place awards: Blue Ribbon Pairs, 175; North American Swiss, 150, and Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, 200. The latter two events run concurrently, so no player can win points in both.

Some of the players at the top of the *POY* list have no chance to win because of their partnerships. Cohen, for example, trails Berkowitz by 100 masterpoints and is playing with him throughout the NABC.

All six members of the team Soloway is playing on in the Open BAM and the Reisinger are on the top 20 list, but unless the others score heavily in the Blue Ribbon Pairs and Soloway does poorly, Soloway will maintain the lead on his teammates -- Nick Nickell, Richard Freeman, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell and Bob Hamman. Whatever success they have in the two team events will be duplicated by Soloway.




North American championships will return to Orlando in 2004. Orlando will be the host to the Fall NABC. The 2003 Spring NABC will take place in Pittsburgh.

Here's how Non-LM victors earned title

John Cobb and John Mackey put together four strong sessions to win the Non-Life Master Pairs. The following deal gives an indication of why their winning margin was more than three full boards.




It looks like a one-trick set, losing three trumps and two aces, but Mackey made his contract.

East made the surprise opening lead of the ♣J which Mackey won with the queen. He led a heart, winning with the queen when West ducked. He called for the ♣K, losing to the ace, and East switched to a trump. Mackey made the key play, going up with the ace and leading the good ♣10. West discarded a heart as Mackey got rid of dummy's last heart. Mackey cashed the ♠A, ruffed a diamond, ruffed a heart, ruffed a diamond and ruffed his last heart.

When Mackey then led a diamond off dummy, West was down to the king-jack-10 of trumps. He was forced to ruff and then had to concede a trick to Mackey's trump king -- Mackey's ninth trick good for all the matchpoints on the board.

Overcoming adversity

Just about all the cards were in the wrong place for Kyle Larsen on this deal from the second final session of the Life Master Open Pairs, but he still made his game.



As the cards lie, it appears that Larsen has to lose two clubs, a diamond and a trump. He won the ♥J opening lead with the king and cashed the ace of trumps. South attempted to muddy the waters by dropping the jack, but Larsen was able to take advantage of this play. He cashed his other high trump, then led his ∇Q , but Peter Weichsel refused to ruff. Then Larsen, now knowing North must have the last trump because of South's falsecard, led a third round of trumps. Weichsel won this trick, but he wasn't happy. He had to lead either a diamond or a club, and both options were distasteful. After some thought he led a diamond. Larsen called for the queen, then led a club to the king and ace. Weichsel got out with a club, but Larsen had the picture -- he called for the jack from dummy, and that was his 10th trick.


Shuttle service
