## Energetic Rick Beye savors new position as Chief TD

The time: the mid-Eighties. The place: St. Louis. The person: Rick Beye, on the fast track to corporate stardom with 3M, one of the world's largest businesses.

Beye had it all --- big salary, stock options, a new car every year. "I did okay," he recalls.

In 1985, however, Beye, then 39, decided the corporate life was not for him. He had earned enough to be able to "retire" in comfort, so he walked away from the corporate big time --- and into bridge.

Seventeen years later, Beye is respected as one of the ACBL's best directors --- certainly one of the most popular and visible among the TDs who do it all at more than 1000 ACBL tournaments a year.

As of November of 2002, Beye is ACBL's chief tournament director, charged with managing nearly 200 full- and part-time TDs.

## Retek "blessed with support of people"

For ACBL President George Retek, 2002 has been a year of travel, of seeing old friends, of meeting new friends and of ending the year with ACBL in "a wonderful financial position."

Retek, a chartered accountant by profession, said he was determined not to increase any dues or fees during his year as president. "I had lots of help working with wonderful chairpeople -- Richard Anderson, Glenn Smith and Harriette Buckman. Dan Morse was great, as was Bruce Reeve. I really was blessed with so many supportive people."

Among many others, he thanked Don Mamula, president of the Board of Governors; Jim Kirkham, chairman of the board, and incoming ACBL President Al Levy. "It's just a great group of people to work with."

Retek expressed special thanks to his wife, Mari, "a most outstanding First Lady of Bridge. She is a magnificent woman."

It was Mari's idea to invite new Life Masters to the president's suite to "come and celebrate" the occasion with the Reteks. The invitation was extended in Houston and Washington DC and is in effect here in Phoenix starting Sunday night after the evening session.

In addition, Retek was pleased with the success of half-price ACBL memberships offered at regionals. "The program was in effect during the tournament when I was there," he said. "The new member paid half-price. The other half was covered by the President's budget or we shared it with the sponsoring organization. More than 100 new players joined."

Retek also presented certificates of appreciation

Jean-Claude Beineix of France, first vice president of the European Bridge League, is the man who has been



given the job of making the First European Open Bridge Championships work. It's a formidable task, but Beineix's history shows he's equal to the challenge.

The tournament is a new venture for the EBL. The history of European bridge is a series of tournaments where teams and pairs from individual nations in Europe fought for the titles. This time anyone can play -- anyone from any place in the world. And all events are transnational. For instance Americans and Europeans can play together as partners or teammates.

Beineix is one of a group of EBL leaders who are here in Phoenix to bring the message of the tournament to the ACBL. The championships will include a wide range of events, and the games will be staged in

## A well-defended hand

Dave Treadwell and Paul Soloway won the Educational Foundation Stratified Pairs on Thursday, and Treadwell says Board 28 is his idea of a well-defended hand. "I had a two-count, followed suit nine times, then declarer led a diamond and I claimed the rest."

North declared 1NT and Soloway led the ♥K: 2, 8, 4. He shifted to the ♠5: 6, queen, king. Declarer played a low club and dummy's jack won the trick. Another club went to declarer's queen and Soloway's ace. Soloway continued spades, and dummy's ace won the trick. A diamond went to declarer's queen and Soloway's ace.

Soloway led his last spade and declarer won his jack. Declarer cashed the ♣K and led a diamond: jack, king, 6. At this point, declarer could have cashed his ace and made his contract.

Hoping that Soloway held the ♦10 and would be forced to lead into the heart tenace, declarer led dummy's last diamond – and Treadwell claimed: his ♦10 9, ♣9 and ♠Q were all good.

to volunteers – directors and workers – at the regionals he attended. Longtime bridge partner Brian Fraser accompanied Retek to many of these tournaments. "We've been playing a quarter of a century together, for better or worse," said Retek.

A highlight of the year was the success of the fourth IOC Grand Prix before the start of the Salt Lake City Olympics. "Canada's win was the icing on the cake, but it was wonderful to see how the Canadians cheered for the U.S. and how the U.S. cheered for the Canadians."

And then came the World Championships in Montreal, "the biggie in our life. It would have not been possible without the enthusiastic support of so many volunteers. Preparation took a few years out of my life."

Retek served as WBF Liaison for the championship, while Dr. Tibor Bertalan was chairman of the organizational committee. Retek served as WBF treasurer for 12 years "and now I am in my fifth year serving as vice president."

His selection to the WBF's Committee of Honor was "the ultimate recognition.

"What made this year so nice for Mari and me" was the chance to attend not only regionals but clubs and sectionals as well," Retek said. They particularly enjoyed seeing longtime friends.

He was also impressed with the "wonderful enthusiastic young group" of unit officials at a New York City regional.

## Bid box Alerts

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say Alert at the same time. When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as transfer -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

Jay Baum, ACBL's chief executive, says, "We're very excited and pleased to have a person with the skills and experience that Rick has as our new chief tournament director.

"We're all very confident that he will help lead and the improve the entire corps of tournament directors."

One of Beye's mentors from his early days as a director is Chris Patrias, national tournament director who lives in the St. Louis area. Says Patrias of Beye: "He's full of energy. He likes to keep as close to the game as he can."

Beye has had an association with bridge for most of his life.

Growing up in St. Louis, where he lived until moving to the Memphis area in 2002, Beye remembers sitting on his father's lap and learning to count high-card points. He didn't know about duplicate then, but he knew he enjoyed bridge.

After graduating high school in 1964, Beye earned a bachelor's degree in marketing from Southeastern Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau.

He was drafted into the U.S. Army after college and spent time in Vietnam. He also honed his bridge skills, playing regularly with three other college grads he met in the Army.

After his service, he earned an MBA degree in finance from Southern Illinois University.

When he became disaffected with the corporate life, bridge took over. By then he had discovered duplicate, and he jumped in with both feet. "I was playing just about every day," Beye recalls. A month after quitting 3M, he attended his first big tournament, the 1985 Summer NABC in Las Vegas. He didn't know it at the time, but a new career was taking shape.

Two years into "retirement," Beye became involved with the planning for the 1987 Spring NABC in St. Louis. Beye's marketing experience proved very helpful.

He recalls sitting in a planning session with ACBL officials, who were projecting that the St. Louis NABC was going to draw about 9000 tables. "I was at the end of the table shaking my head," Beye says. "I said it would be 11,000 tables. I knew what I had been doing to promote the tournament."

The final count was 10,829 tables. "They all wanted to know how I did it," Beye recalls, "and they wanted to know if I could do it at another NABC."

Beye tried again for the 1987 Summer NABC in Baltimore. That tournament drew 17,052 tables. "We had people playing in the hallways, at the top of the escalators. It was amazing," Beye also managed to talk the *Baltimore Sun* into devoting an entire page every day to the NABC.

"It was all a lark for me," Beye says. "It was fun."

Beye's work with the NABCs caught the attention of veteran TDs, notably Patrias, Phil Merry and Bobbie Shipley. "They liked my style, I guess," says Beye. When they asked if he would be interested in directing, Beye was right there. "I said yes to everything in those days," he recalls.

At the time, there wasn't formal training for TDs, Beye says. What TDs learned was strictly on the job. "They gave you a law book and pushed you out on the floor," he says.

Beye cherishes the opportunities he had to work with TDs such as Merry, John "Spider" Harris, Bill "Kojak" Schoder, Karl Johnson and Dale Egholm.

Beye says Patrias was most influential. "He was my godfather all the way. Chris always tried to steer me in the right direction. He would cheer me when I was down and try to slow me down when I was going too fast."

Beye worked a few tournaments for free just to learn. His first tournament for pay, he recalls, was a

sectional in Mount Vernon IL. Patrias was running the tournament by himself and found a much larger crowd than expected. He called Beye in St. Louis and asked if he wanted to work. Beye was on his way to Mount Vernon within the hour.

Patrias recalls that Beye was tested that first day.

"I had to put him in an area where there was no ceiling light --- an atrium. As the sun went down his light disappeared," Patrias recalls. "Talk about a baptism of fire --- Rick had a baptism in darkness." Despite the problem, Patrias says, "He did a good job."

Says Patrias of Beye: "He picked things up very quickly. Not a whole lot escapes him."

Although Beye will be more or less office bound with his new position, he does not plan to give up working tournaments altogether. "I hope to be out there at least once a quarter," he says.

His strengths, Beye says, are the people skills he has developed over the years. "I'm visible, approachable and accessible," he says. "I'm a floor director. I like it out there."

Beye sees his mandate as chief TD to be sure the directors are happy and serving the membership. "I don't want to make every TD into me. I want them to have their own style, but I want them to please the members."

Although he is a Life Master and a good player, Beye plays only occasionally, usually online with fellow TD Mike Flader, who writes *Ruling the Game* for *The Bridge Bulletin*.

Beye stays fit by swimming when he has the opportunity, and he also enjoys rollerblading and biking. Since he has been in Memphis, he has discovered the charms of nearby Oxford MS and has even attended a couple of Ole Miss football games.

Beye says he was gratified to receive more than 100 phone calls and e-mails of congratulations and support after his appointment was announced. He knows that life will probably change for him now, but he's looking forward to it.

## Expectations satisfied

When you sit down with a new partner, the first deal is often a critical indication as to how things will go. Of course, Bobby Wolff is expected to get everything right, but ... it is always nice to have one's expectations fully satisfied.

We were playing against Mike Cappelletti Jr. and Ron Smith (San Francisco).

I led a spade. (Yes, there is a case for a heart lead, but on the very first deal of a partnership, should you risk it?)

Ron won dummy's ♠K and led a club. Bobby took his ace (but how many people forgot?) and played a second spade. When declarer played on diamonds, I took my ace and cashed my spades.

Minus 400 would have given us 29 out of a possible 51 matchpoints (declarer can make his contract by playing on diamonds at trick two) but down two -- plus 100 -- was a nice start: 48.5 out of 51 possible matchpoints.

My defensive play was more challenging and, I have to admit, I got it wrong.

I nearly doubled 3♥; I had my defense all planned. It was more lucrative, however, to double 4♥. I led the ♦A K, showing a doubleton, and Bobby followed with the ♦3, 9.


If I had trusted him, I would have led a spade then. He wins the ♠A and gives me a diamond ruff, trumps a spade, then leads a club to me for a second spade ruff.

But I failed to trust him enough. I underled my clubs at once and only gave him one spade ruff - that meant plus 500 instead of plus 800.

I was afraid that might cost us a few matchpoints, since our side would score plus 600 in 5♣, but we actually collected 49 out of a possible 51 matchpoints.

a beautiful locale-- Menton, France, on the Riviera coast. It's going to be a 15-day event -- June 14-28, 2003.

North American championship events have proved much more challenging and interesting since top players from around the world have come to our shores to compete against our stars. Beineix is convinced that the same will be true in Europe now that open events will be staged. In addition to improved competition, there will be a greater camaraderie among bridge players the world over when they have the chance to meet each other face to face.

Beineix is very interested in having lots of Americans come to Menton for the games. "Your Board of Directors has already approved the awarding of ACBL masterpoints in Menton -- and World Bridge Federation masterpoints will be given as well."

Beineix, a member of the World Bridge Federation Committee of Honor, has had lots of experience with major tournaments -- he has been a key fixture for World Championship events for many years. He has been an operations figure in four world championships held in America -- in New Orleans in 1978, in Seattle in 1984, in Miami in 1986 and in Albuquerque in 1994.

## A great deal

February is ACBL's annual Junior Month where for just \$1 extra, all players --- not just Juniors --- are eligible to win masterpoints at sectional rating. Clubs may run as many Junior Fund games as they have sanctioned sessions.


District 7 (North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and East Tennessee) has led the ACBL for the last six years in funds collected and number of games played during Junior Month. Last year the district tallied 1463.5 tables and \$5860 collected.

ACBL totals were 7525.5 tables and \$30,094 with the money going for Junior programs in the United States and Canada.

## Trump trick disappears

A quick glance at this hand makes it clear that you're going to make your game, but whether you'll get an overtrick is questionable because the ♥K lead stands out. But declarer wound up with TWO overtricks.

As expected, the opening lead was the ♥K, and declarer took his ace. He considered going after trumps, but he changed his mind and decided to try to get rid of his remaining heart on dummy's diamonds. He cashed the king, crossed to the ace and led the queen. But East ruffed. Declarer overruffed and returned to dummy with a club to lead the ♦J. This time East pitched a heart, so declarer got rid of his losing heart.

Why did East not ruff again? Two possibilities occurred to declarer -- East didn't have any more or the only one he had left was the ace. Declarer called for a spade, and sure enough, East had to play the ace. Declarer ruffed the heart return and pushed the ♠J through West, picking up the suit. Then dummy's last diamond let him sluff his last club and he had 12 tricks and all the matchpoints.

Could the defense have done anything? Yes! What if East just discards on the third diamond instead of ruffing in? Now declarer has to play the trumps completely on his own, and he must lose two tricks in the suit on the actual layout.

Did you choose a top club? Too bad! Your opponents made their vulnerable game with an overtrick. This was the full layout:

On a top club lead, declarer ruffs, crosses to dummy with the ♠A and ruffs a second club, draws trumps and runs diamonds for 11 tricks.

Considering the bidding, leading a club clearly had negative aspects -- too much chance declarer would ruff and gain the timing. One defender decided to pin his hopes on the heart suit. He led the ♥K and continued to partner's jack. West cashed the ♥A as East discarded the ♦6. West, practically certain that declarer had no clubs because of the three he saw in dummy, returned a diamond, and East was able to ruff for the setting trick.



## A little praying helps

When your partner makes a preemptive overcall at the four level, it's sometimes just as hard for partner to know what to do as it is for the opponents. This deal came up in the Educational Foundation Pairs Thursday evening.

East had lots of top tricks -- the question was how solid was partner's diamond suit? Since their side was vulnerable, East decided the diamonds must be quite good, so he leaped to the slam.

Declarer wasn't exactly elated when she saw the dummy, but her face didn't show it. She won the opening heart lead and led dummy's singleton diamond. When South played low, she put in the jack -- she was quite relieved when North had to play the ace to win the trick. When a spade came back, she was just about sure North wasn't leading from the king, so she called for the ace. She said another little prayer as she led a second trump, and her prayers were answered when the queen came tumbling down.

She proceeded to cash all her trumps, coming down to the ♠ 10-9 and the ♣ 6. Dummy still had the ♣ A-K-J. South was fixed -- he couldn't guard both black suits. Declarer guessed correctly, going up with ♣A and dropping the queen under dummy's king. 6♦ bid and made.

## Everyday resolutions

*Note: This list of 10 resolutions appeared in the Daily Bulletin at the 1992 Fall NABC in Orlando.*

1. I will not criticize or express disapproval of an opponent's play or bid.
2. I will politely call "Director, please" whenever there is an irregularity.
3. I will not comment that an opponent's error was anticipated or needed for my action to succeed.
4. I will refrain from offering unsolicited advice.
5. I will not discuss previously played boards with my partner in the presence of new opponents.
6. I will stop all cross table conversation as soon as one hand is removed from the next board.
7. I will not engage in lengthy postmortems between hands and between rounds.
8. I will keep cards in my hand until it is my turn to play.
9. I will not take the cards of other players from the board after play.
10. I will remain at the table until the next round is called and will pass the boards immediately.



Wilson agreed, adding that the pair was average or above average on 21 of 24 boards in the afternoon session. They scored 80% on boards they defended in the evening session.

The Non-LM Pairs is usually a four-session event but due to the low turnout – only 12 pairs – the event was reduced to two sessions and ended last night.

Fagan, a dentist, and Wilson, a product manager for AT&T, have been playing together four or five years. Fagan learned to play bridge in college but took a vacation from bridge for a few years.

Wilson's parents and grandparents taught him to play bridge when he was 9 or 10. He played some duplicate while in college but gave up the game for about 25 years while he went into the Army and had a family.

With the non-LM win, Wilson became a Life Master. Fagan needs about 50 black points.

A strength of their partnership, the pair said, is that they read the same bridge books. "I would say that the late Bill Root and Eddie Kantar are our favorites," said Wilson.

"Instead of getting upset about results, we try to figure out why." There were no upsets on this deal from the first qualifying session:

"An injudicious re-opening" was Wilson's verdict. Fagan led the ♠5 and Wilson ducked "in case he had a doubleton. I wanted to make it hard for declarer to get to dummy."

Declarer cashed the ♦A and ruffed a diamond. Now he led the ♠K and Wilson won his ace as Fagan pitched the ♠Q.

Wilson cashed the ♠K and led a club for Fagan to ruff. Next Fagan cashed the ♠A and ♠J, then cashed his ♥A and exited with a heart. Declarer won in his hand and ruffed another diamond in dummy. Dummy was down to clubs and spades and Fagan scored his long heart for down two and plus 500.

## Zero tolerance

The Zero Tolerance program is going strong and receiving credit for an exodus of players from intermediate games into open games.

Barbara Seagram, owner/manager of Kate Buckman's Bridge Studio in Toronto, says ZT "has made such a huge difference. We have always provided our less-experienced players with a separate room in which to play, along with their own director.

"This has made for an expensive but flourishing newcomer/intermediate program. The downside was that the players got so comfortable there that they were petrified of moving into the open game in the big room."

ZT has changed that, according to Seagram. "Over the past few years, the atmosphere has improved so dramatically among the open players that there has been a huge exodus from the intermediate games into the open games. We have had to hand out very few scoring penalties for Zero Tolerance. The fact that the policy is in place seems to keep the players in line and the perception that we are monitoring behavior at all times makes everyone happier.

"The players now never hesitate to report unpleasantness whereas before they considered it part of the game that they had to tolerate."

Seagram added, "We have had to ask several players to take a vacation from our club. They must be subjected to an interview with us before they are permitted to return. The bad ones don't."

## Ever play Jo-Jotte?

Richard Colker was foraging through a bookshop recently when he came across a book authored by Ely Culbertson that he had never heard of before. The title was Play Jo-Jotte, with a subtitle saying, "The game that is now sweeping Europe." It's a two-handed card game played with 32 cards (the 6's, 5's, 4's, 3's and 2's are eliminated). The high card in the trump suit is the jack, but it's the ace in the other suits. Even the 9 is more powerful than the ace in the trump suit.

Colker couldn't resist – he paid a dollar for the book. Interestingly, that was the price on the inside cover of the book – the price back in 1937 when the book was published. Colker later discovered that the book is somewhat of a treasure, the few copies available often selling in the \$50 range.

When Colker discovered that there was no Play Jo-Jotte in the ACBL Library, he donated the book to the ACBL.

# Honor your partner – he's your friend

Consider your partner to be a friend. Treat your partner well, even (especially) if you are playing together for the first time. Always offer your partner a drink -- tea or coffee is a good starting point. This will lead to a relaxed atmosphere, enabling you both to play your best. By the way, always be a pleasant and courteous opponent.

Tolerate errors. Never go on about partner's mistakes -- just forget about them and move on to the next deal. You may be able to make a constructive comment at the end of the session. Your partner will surely show you the same consideration.

Be encouraging. Always be prepared to support your partner -- "well played" always goes down well and a "thank you" for the dummy does not go amiss. In one of my partnerships, if dummy was exactly what was needed, "mille grazie" would let partner in on the good news!

Keep a straight face. Never make the mistake of pulling a face or raising an eyebrow. Apart from hurting your partner's feelings, being deadpan does not let your opponents know that something may have gone wrong.

Win or lose, always stay calm at the end of the session and thank partner for the game. This is especially important if things have not gone so well. In my most successful international partnership, the first time we played together was absolutely hopeless but we stuck with it.

Coping with disaster: The best way to cope with the inevitable disasters is to laugh them off. This tends to disconcert even the best opponents who are used to seeing their opponents argue.

Conventions: Stick to the ones you both feel comfortable with. A player trying to remember some convention he is not familiar with will make errors in other departments.

I recently played in a tournament in the Netherlands with a strange partner. We would have won but for a couple of expensive mistakes when I forgot a couple of things because we were playing some conventions I was not familiar with.

Who's the boss? In most partnerships, one player tends to be regarded as the boss. If you are the stronger player, go out of your way to make life easy for your partner: make easy-to-understand bids, leads and signals. Don't land your partner in a tough contract -- well, not on purpose.

Have fun! You are both out to enjoy yourselves. If your partner leaves the table feeling happy, you have done your job. Of course you want to win but that objective should not mean spoiling the game for your partner or the opponents.

## It takes two

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Class A conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, he or she may give warnings or assign such penalties as he or she deems appropriate under the circumstances.

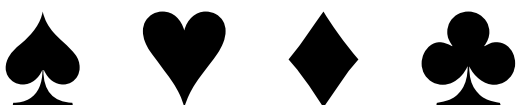
