Kennedy, Woolsey elected to Bridge Hall of Fame



Betty Ann Kennedy and Kit Woolsey – both winners of multiple international and North American competitions – are the newest members of the ACBL Hall of Fame.

The results of the most recent ballot were revealed in Memphis late last month. Induction ceremonies will take place in Atlanta this summer.

Kennedy, a five-time world women's champion, is a WBF World Women's Grand Master and an ACBL Grand Life Master.

She won the Venice Cup in 1974, 1976 and 2003; the World Women's Team Olympiad in 1984 and the World Women's Pairs in 1982. She has won 14 North American championships.

Kennedy, of Shreveport LA, is a member of the Louisiana Hall of Fame (the second woman to be chosen) and the Shreveport-Bossier Sports Hall of Fame.

For many years, her partnership with Carol Sanders of Nashville – they were known as the



Belles because of their Southern roots – was one of the most formidable in bridge.

Kennedy won her last world championship – the Venice Cup in Monte Carlo in 2003 – playing with Kathie Wei-Sender.

Woolsey won the Rosenblum Teams in 1986 and the Transnational World Senior Teams in 2000 and 2003. He is a WBF World Life Master and an ACBL Grand Life Master who has 14 North American titles to his credit.

He is also a frequent commentator at vugraph shows.

Woolsey is the author of *Modern Defense Signals, Partnership Defense in Bridge* and *Matchpoints*, and the CD *Play the Vanderbilt*.

Kennedy and Woolsey will be joined in the Hall of Fame by Marshall Miles and the late Percy Sheardown, recipients, respectively, of the Blackwood and von Zedtwitz awards for service to bridge.

Jacobs, Versace lead Silodor Open

Spurred by a game that might be the biggest ever in a major event, George Jacobs and Alfredo Versace took the lead after two qualifying sessions in the Silodor Open Pairs I.

With only four minus scores on their card in the first session – and their worst score half a matchpoint over average – Jacobs and Versace scored a 508.5 on an average of 325 (25 top) for a 78.23% game. That's more than seven boards above average.

Imagine the lot of Mark Itabashi and Chris Larsen, who posted a 72.85% game – and found themselves trailing the leaders by more than a board.

Jacobs and Versace settled down in the second qualifying set, scoring 56.46% enough to lead the field with 875.5 matchpoints.

Right behind them were Pierre Saporta of France and Pierre Zimmerman of Switzerland, with 835.75. In third with two final sessions to play are Ken Cohen of Philadelphia and Neal Satten of Wynnewood PA with 810. Last year's champions – David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen – were one matchpoint behind them in fourth place.

successful teams in the history of the game. Zia Mahmood, a member of the selection

committee for the award, praised Nickell as eminently worthy of the honor. "There's no one who knows Nick, who, if you asked them about him, wouldn't say he's the nicest guy in the world. He's a great champion and he plays the game the way it should be played." Nickell joins previous winners Lynn Deas (2004), Larry Cohen (2003), Rose Meltzer (2002) and Paul Soloway (2001).

Duplicate Experiences By Marshall Pearlman

Basic bridge etiquette

For most of us, bridge is a social game. At our club (in Southern California), we play for enjoyment. Winning, although important, should not be achieved at the expense of good manners and conviviality.

Here are a few of the more common and troublesome issues we all face.

- 1. Remember to *greet the next pair* arriving at your table. If you don't know them, introduce yourselves and make them welcome.
- 2. During the auction, *always use the Pass card* even if you think the auction is over. It may not be. Partner or opponents may bid or double. Actually, tapping the table as a sign of passing could be giving unauthorized information. Tapping may say "I don't want any more bidding, at least by us." It may take an extra moment to place the Pass card on the table, but that's the correct thing to do.
- 3. If you are on lead, make your lead first *before* you write the contract on your scorecard. This gives the other players time to consider their plan before play commences.
- 4. Stay away from the bid box until you know for sure what call you want to make. Avoid fondling the cards or pulling them partly out. Yes, occasionally you will want to change your mind and that is legal. The key word here is "occasionally" and it should be rare.
- 5. Congratulate partner and opponents alike on their good plays.
- 6. Save the post-mortems until after the game (if at all), at the very least until the round is completed. If the next deal is a tough one, you may need the time to keep pace with the other pairs. Some players make notes in their scorecard about things to discuss later.
- 7. Try to arrive at the next table promptly. Be considerate and reserve your restroom visits or food trips for rounds where you finish early. These are a few of the more common points of bridge etiquette which, if observed by all, will make our time together even more enjoyable.

Bidding commentary: West has a choice of non-forcing rebids (unless 2 + is played as a game force): 2NT or $3 \blacklozenge$. Given the weakness of the diamonds, 2NT is superior. Notice that one choice is **not** $3 \mathbf{v}$. In order to raise a secondary suit directly, four-card support is needed. This is an important bidding principle. As it happens, whether West rebids 2NT or $3 \blacklozenge$, East rebids 3♥ to show a five-card suit. Responder happily raises to game. Lead commentary: South's spade holding suggests a trump lead to stop spade ruffs in dummy, but his diamond holding suggests the more attacking club lead. Defensive commentary: When dummy plays low at trick one, North plays the jack. The lead of a low card suggests an honor, and the only honor not visible is the king. After the defense cashes three clubs, both defenders know that East, who has shown 10 major-suit cards during the auction, has a diamond void. Furthermore, whoever winds up on lead after three clubs have been cashed should shift to a trump to stop spade ruffs. A trump switch

combined with North's **not** playing the A when a low diamond is led from dummy, defeats $4 \heartsuit$.

Play commentary: If the defenders do not shift to a trump after winning three clubs, declarer gets home on a cross-ruff, but must cash the two top spades **before** crossruffing.

Monster mashers

Records about big games in big events don't exist, but no one can remember a bigger game in a major event than the monster posted by George Jacobs and Alfredo Versace in the first qualifying session of the Silodor Open Pairs I (see page 1).

On a top of 25, with 325 average, the two scored 508.5 – more than seven boards above average - for 78.23%. "I think 50 people told me they had never heard of a bigger game," Jacobs said midway through the second qualifying session.

In the 26 deals they played, their worst score was 13 – half a matchpoint above average. They scored 20 or better on 11 boards, and they had only four minus scores.

Versace is a member of the powerful Italian team that won the World Team Olympiad in Istanbul, Turkey, last fall.

The following two deals contributed to the big score.

(1) Ostensibly for the minors, but actually a creative notrump "cuebid."

East started with the top two hearts, switching at trick three to the *****Q. Jacobs won in hand, played the AQ to the king and ace. The A9 drew the last trump, and Jacobs played a low diamond from dummy, ducking when West played the queen. A diamond was returned to the ace, then Jacobs played a club to the jack and king and got out with a diamond. Down to all red cards, East had to give Jacobs and ruff-sluff, and the losing club went away. Plus 140 was good for 19 out of 25 matchpoints.

Versace did even better on the following deal.

two more hearts, on which East was experiencing difficulty.

A club went to dummy's king and the A was cashed. Another club went to Versace's ace, and he took note of East's spade discards - the 2 and the jack.

Correctly reading the position, Versace played the $\blacktriangle 10$ from hand and let it ride. East won the queen, but with nothing left but spades, he had to give declarer the $\bigstar K$ in the end.

Plus 660 was good for 24 out of 25 matchpoints.

This deal, from the second qualifying session, shows how deeply Versace can think. Would you make the winning play? You are West.

Your partner, East, leads the $\bigstar 3$ to the 5, your queen and declarer's 7. What is your next move?

At the table, Versace made the killing switch of a low diamond: 9, jack, ace. This forced declarer to take his other two high diamonds then or never, which set up the setting trick for the defenders. The full deal:

As you can see, unless Versace plays a diamond at trick two or three (after cashing a second high spade), declarer has time to set up his ninth trick in hearts before taking his three diamond tricks.

If you are as bad an opening leader as the rest of the world, you start with the $\mathbf{v}Q$. Declarer won the \mathbf{V} K as South played the 4. Declarer then led a heart to dummy's 10, following with the ace, pitching a club, as South played the $\mathbf{v}8$ then the ♥9.

Declarer can take 10 tricks from this point to earn a fine matchpoint score if he plays a spade to the ace, followed by a low spade.

If declarer makes the mistake of finessing the ▲ 10 on the first round of the suit (okay, mea *culpa*), North must win the AQ and use the suitpreference inferences of partner's heart plays to cash the A and then play a fourth round of hearts, allowing partner to ruff with the $\bigstar K$ to hold declarer to nine tricks.

If, however, North plays the heart before cashing the A, West can simply pitch his second club away and he's back to 10 tricks.

King/Queen of Bridge

Graduating from high school this year? If you're an ACBL member who plays and promotes bridge, why not apply to become the 2005 King or Queen of Bridge?

The winner was originally determined by total masterpoints but recent winners have been cited for deportment, demeanor and sportsmanship at the bridge table and for extra-curricular bridge activities such as teaching and directing.

The contest was established in 1973 by the late Homer Shoop and the International Palace of Sports, which he founded. The King or Queen of Bridge and other youth scholarships are funded by the International Palace of Sports Foundation.

The ACBL Educational Foundation, funded by a grant from the foundation, presents a \$1000 scholarship to the winner. Previous winners include Jeff Meckstroth, Robert Levin, Steve Weinstein, Richard Pavlicek Jr., Brad Moss, Eric Greco, Kent Mignocchi, Joel Wooldridge and John Kranyak.

West led a low diamond, and East withheld the queen as Versace won the jack in hand. He played the \checkmark A at trick two, noting the \checkmark 10 from East on the first round of the suit. When Versace played a heart to the queen and East followed, Versace inferred that the $\checkmark 10$ had suit-preference implications. He cashed the ♥9 (East pitched a diamond), then played a low diamond to the king,

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

Regional championships: \$14 for ACBL members, \$16 for all others

Convention card reminder

• Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

• Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Monitoring

At this and future North American championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

Zero Tolerance

The ACBL Board of Directors — citing a commitment to "improving acceptable player behavior at all times" — adopted Zero Tolerance as ACBL policy in 1998.

Unacceptable behavior has decreased – the goal, however, is to eliminate unacceptable behavior as much as possible.

Please report conduct that is unacceptable while keeping in mind that we must be tolerant of other people in general — and bridge players in particular. Also report conduct that is outstanding or refreshing.

Commendable behavior includes (but is not limited to):

• Being a good "host" or "guest" at the table.

• Greeting others in a friendly manner.

• Praising the bidding and/or play of the opponents.

• Having two clearly completed convention cards readily available to the opponents. This is also a regulation.

Unacceptable behavior includes (but is not limited to):

• Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence.

• Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.

• Gloating over good results.

• Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table.

• Loud and disruptive arguing with a director's ruling.

If you experience someone exhibiting

discourteous behavior or being other than civil, please call a tournament director immediately. If you feel that there was a very serious breech of discipline, in addition to the resolution by the tournament director at the table, please discuss the problem directly with the Director-in-Charge of the tournament.

tournament director, you may simply state: "This player is interfering with my enjoyment of the game."

The director will then attempt to determine the facts. If he establishes there was unacceptable behavior, an immediate 1/4-board disciplinary penalty (3 IMPs in team games) shall be assigned to all offenders.

This may involve any one or all four players at the table, regardless of who initiated the unacceptable behavior. If both members of a partnership are guilty, the penalties are cumulative (1/4 board each = 1/2 board or 3 IMPs each = 6 IMPs).

If it is determined that a second offense has occurred in the same event, the offender(s) shall be ejected from future competition in that event.

An offender removed from an event shall be deemed not to have played in the event, no masterpoints will be awarded and no refunds will be made.

In the case of a serious offense and in the case of multiple offenses (three) during a tournament, a disciplinary committee may determine whether the offender(s) should be allowed to play in other events at the tournament and/or whether additional sanctions may be appropriate.

While the director may issue a warning, directors are strongly encouraged to give penalties and a warning should be given only when there is no clear violation, where the facts cannot be clearly determined or there are mitigating circumstances. Offenders should receive an immediate penalty. Regardless of who may have initiated unacceptable behavior, all offenses are punishable. Retaliatory behavior is a punishable offense. Frivolous accusations will also be considered as offenses under this policy.



Balderson followed low, and North, being a good partner, unblocked the $\bigstar K!$ Balderson was then able to make eight tricks total: three spades, one heart, one club and three diamonds.

Plus 380 was a near top which was badly need by Balderson and Schaeffer. The pair qualified for the final by only a few matchpoints.

Rules for being a good partner

I have always believed that your attitude toward your partner is as important as your technical skill at the game. – Rixi Markus, one of the all-time great players.

Before you sit down to discuss what you are playing, you should start your partnership off on the right note. Half the battle of winning is being a good partner. Always observe the following:

1. Do not give lessons – unless you are being paid to do so. According to an evening paper, there are only five real authorities on bridge in this country. Odd how often one gets one of them as a partner. Punch (British magazine).

2. Never say anything to your partner unless you would want him to say the same to you. If you are unsure whether your partner would want you to say something, don't.

3. Never "result" (criticize your partner for a normal action just because it did not work this time).

4. Unless your intent is to clear up a misunderstanding, avoid discussing the hand just played. If you cannot resist, be discreet.

5. Remember that you and your partner are on the same side.

6. Do not forget that your partner wants to win just as much as you do.

7. If you feel the urge to be nasty, sarcastic, critical or loud – excuse yourself and take a walk.

8. When there is time between hands, do not discuss bridge.

9. When you want to consult another player about a disaster, ask about your hand, not your partner's.

10. Do not ever criticize or embarrass your partner in front of others.

The auction is somewhat unusual. Schaeffer and Balderson play a Polish Club system, so the $1 \diamond$ opening showed four or more diamonds and an unbalanced hand (or 18–19 HCP, balanced). That makes Balderson's choice of 1NT slightly eccentric, though not silly. North re-entered the auction with a very aggressive double, and South, rather than try the normal 2Ψ , decided at favorable vulnerability to go all out for the big score by passing.

North led the \checkmark 10 and dummy's king won. Balderson tried the \bigstar K, but South won and continued hearts. Declarer had to find four pitches from dummy, so he let go of four low diamonds, leaving only the ace. From the closed hand, he discarded two low diamonds.

After cashing the last heart, South, noting the now-bare A in dummy, exited with the Q.
