Esberg, Chaikin claim Silver Ribbon title

The New Jersey-based pair of Bill Esberg and Marla Chaikin took advantage of a good carryover and a strong finish in the second final to win the Silver Ribbon Pairs. It was the first NABC title for either player.

Esberg, a retired English teacher, and Chaikin, the owner of a needlepoint store, won the event by more than two boards. Their total was 1793.08 (51 was top).

"It's been a lifelong ambition of mine to win a national championship," said Esberg, who has two previous second-place and third-place finishes. Esberg has had a good run in Pittsburgh – he also won the Flight A Open Pairs on Saturday. He described Chaikin's play as "wonderful all the way through."

Chaikin also has had several near-misses in national events. She was effusive in her praise for Esberg. "He's the best partner anybody could want."

The pair has played since 1988. They played in their first Silver Ribbon Pairs at the Cincinnati NABC in 2000, but they have been unable to play in the event since then until Pittsburgh.

"I didn't play aggressively enough in Cincinnati to get a good carryover," said Chaikin. "I learned my lesson."

In second with 1675.28 was John Zilic of Houston TX and Thomas Peters of Grapeland TX. In third were the defending champions, Joseph Godefrin of Sarasota FL and Ed Schulte of Tampa FL with 1612.94.

The target: four straight wins in Flight B of the Senior Swiss Teams.

The longtime partners, teaming with Dan and Donna Simon of South Bend IN, were first in the event in Pittsburgh and in Philadelphia in 2003. McNitt and Boser also won the event at the 2004

Spring NABC in Reno NV.

Asked how they did it, Boser had a succinct answer: "Dumb luck."

McNitt is captain of the squad, apparently mostly because "I show up last so they put my name on top."

Boser and McNitt were playing with the Simons in the Senior Knockout Teams Monday afternoon. Said Boser of the couple: "They're gluttons for punishment."

Life Master advancements

The partnership of Janice Smith and Doris Hess has a double reason to celebrate today. The pair, playing in the Marge Tamres Bracketed KO, earned enough gold for Smith to become a Life Master. Hess, who has more than 500 masterpoints but was lacking a few gold points, became a Life Master and a Bronze Life Master at the same time.

Smith lives in Beaver Falls PA, and Hess lives in Beaver PA.

Richard Krauland of Pittsburgh PA became a Life Master in the 84 Lumber B/C/D Swiss Teams on Monday. Krauland played with Russ Poppleton of Harrisburg PA. Krauland needed just seven points of any color to earn his gold card, and his team won the C and D Flights of the event.

New pre-Alert/Disclosure forms

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a new pre-Alert/Disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockout and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available.

Thinking Bridge – 5

Opening lead: *J

6NT

Bidding commentary: 6NT is a normal contract with 33 HCP between two balanced hands. Notice that 6NT has 11 top tricks, but 6♦ is cold. It's not easy to uncover a 4-4 minor suit fit after a 1NT or 2NT opening bid.

All Pass

Lead commentary: Leading against 6NT is not like leading against 3NT. When the opponents land in 3NT, figure they have about 25 HCP. West has 6 high-card points, so East figures to have about 9 HCP, possibly with a spade honor or two. That's valid when the opponents are in 3NT, but not slam.

When the opponents land in 6NT, figure them for about 33 HCP. In this case, West can figure East for about one point! A spade lead is no longer attractive. When leading against 6NT holding most or all of the missing high-card strength, lead passively, unless, of course, you have a perfect sequence. The \$\displaystyle{3}\text{ stands out.} When dummy comes down, each defender has a pretty good idea of partner's count within a point.

Play commentary: With 11 top tricks, declarer has two chances for an extra trick: hearts 3-3 or the spade finesse. In order to test both, declarer attacks the longer combined suit first, hearts. A heart is ducked at trick two, a technique that allows declarer to retain control of the suit. Declarer wins the likely club return,

runs the diamonds and tests the hearts. If hearts are 3-3, there are 12 tricks. If not, there is always the spade finesse to fall back on.

With A x x facing K x x x, A x x x facing K x x or x x x facing A K x x the normal way to develop three tricks suit is to duck the first round of the suit. Then you cash the high honor from the short side, and then over to the other honor. If the suit does not break 3-3, declarer retains the lead. If you simply cash the top honors and continue with a third round of the suit, you lose a trick you don't need to lose — and go down if you are in slam — when the suit does not divide 3-3.

Duplicate Experiences

Bridge is a partnership game.

There is nothing more important to your enjoyment of bridge than having a compatible partner. Notice we said enjoyment. We did not refer to winning, although that should follow if your relationship is healthy and congenial. Think about your favorite partner as you read these suggestions on how to improve your partnership.

Always conduct yourself in a respectful and courteous manner. Verbally abusing your partner is a very serious breech of the proprieties. It gains nothing, makes everyone at the table uncomfortable and makes you an object of derision.

No one purposely makes an error. Every player tries to do his best, and avoid disaster. But we are human and under the pressure of competition, we make mistakes. We judge badly or make a plain bonehead error.

Jumping on your partner can only cause deterioration of the partnership and will not bring about improvement in the future results. People do not play well when they are more concerned with not making a mistake than with doing their best.

Your partner knows she made an error. Concentrate on partner's good plays and graciously put her miscues behind you. If you can't do that, find another partner. Hint: look for one that's perfect, like you.

Work on your agreements (and disagreements) away from the table. Bidding styles vary. And specific bids in specific situations vary. This is especially true when not playing with

a steady partner. Unless you have gone over every bid and response for every situation, there are bound to be misunderstandings. Make a note to review these items after the session and decide on your agreements.

Assigning blame doesn't make for positive feelings. The issue is not who is right and who is wrong, but what is right. Or at least, *what* is right for your partnership and how you agree to play in the future. This makes the partnership stronger both technically and psychologically.

Bridge is a game and a recreation. It is not life and death, nor is winning worth the unpleasantness that comes from being nasty or offensive to partner or others. Simple motto here, the Golden Rule.

Remember that you play with a person presumably because you respect their skill and enjoy their company. If you don't, neither of you is going to have much fun and you probably won't win very often. If that's so, think about parting company as friends. Failing that, working on your game in a positive way will improve your results and increase your enjoyment.

Facts: 2♦ was Alerted as Flannery. At his first turn to call West broke tempo 15—20 seconds. The contract was successful with an overtrick, plus 750 East-West. The director was not called at the time. The players agreed to some break in tempo at the table, but because of time pressure all agreed to bring the matter to a director after they caught up on the clock.

Director's Ruling: Law 16. The Director ruled that the Unauthorized Information arising from the slow pass demonstrably suggested further action by East. The contract was changed to 5♣ by South, minus 100 North-South.

The Appeal: East, West and South attended the hearing. Flannery, as played by East-West, normally showed 4–5 in the majors, though occasionally 4–6. They had no agreement that it could be 5–6. East, with a passed hand on his right and a preempt on his left, would very likely find some values in partner's hand. Since East had a club void and two extra cards in his suits it was clear to him to bid 5 ♥. South believed that pass was a logical alternative. None of the players could remember if the STOP card had been used, but all agreed that West had clearly exceeded the 'normal' tempo break after a skip bid.

The Decision: Was there a break in tempo? If yes, was a specific action demonstrably suggested? If yes, was there a logical alternative? All agreed to a break in tempo. From East's viewpoint, West was very likely to have some values, given his hand and the auction. West, in hesitating, could have been contemplating $5 \checkmark$, $5 \spadesuit$, double or even $5 \spadesuit$. The committee judged that the likelihood of West's thinking about doubling to be great enough, relative to the chance that he was considering bidding $5 \checkmark$ or $5 \spadesuit$, that the break in tempo did not demonstrably suggest the $5 \checkmark$ call by East. The committee restored the table result of $5 \checkmark$ doubled, plus 750 East-West.

Facts: East-West made 7NT, plus 1520. The Alert was 'pick a slam'. West broke tempo as indicated in the auction. The Director was called when play ended. East said he was always going to bid a grand, as 6♠ invited (forced?) a grand slam. East-West did not seem to agree on this point.

Director's Ruling: The hesitations provided UI for East. With two tries at a grand, and a non-cooperative partner, pass was a logical alternative to 7NT. Based on Laws 12, 16 and 73 the contract was changed to 6NT, plus 1020 for East-West.

The Appeal: East-West felt that the tempo did not provide any information that wasn't already available from the auction.

The Decision: East-West provided these example auctions: 5NT-6♦-6NT would invite 7NT; 5NT-6♦-6♠ was pick a grand slam. The committee did not accept this last example in the context of the auction, since no system notes were offered. Arguably 7♣, instead of 6♠, would have been asking partner to name a grand. While slam auctions are often slow and thoughtful, the one-minute break before bidding 6NT was beyond the grace period. In this auction the slow 6NT could only be showing something extra. The committee affirmed the table director's ruling of 6NT, plus 1020 East-West.

the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

Italian duo claimed Mott-Smith Trophy

Fulvio Fantoni and Claudio Nunes tied for first in last year's battle for the Mott-Smith Trophy, awarded to the ACBL members who earn the most masterpoints at the Spring NABC.

Fantoni and Nunes, reigning World Open Pairs champions, won Wernher Open Pairs II, finished second in the Jacoby Swiss Teams and tied for ninth in the Vanderbilt. Their 364 total is the record in the masterpoint contest.

The trophy

The trophy was donated by friends in memory of Geoffrey Mott-Smith in 1961 and made retroactive to 1958 to include all the winners.

Mott-Smith (1902-1960) was co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission, editor of the ACBL Bridge Bulletin 1935-36, a contributor to The Bridge World, a writer and cryptographer.

Mott-Smith was one of the first to operate a bridge club and to direct bridge tournaments. He was the director of the annual intercollegiate tournaments and other "par" bridge events.

During World War II, Mott-Smith served as chief instructor for the OSS in the training of cryptographers and cryptanalysts.

He authored or co-authored more than 29 books on games and served as games consultant for the Association of American Playing Card Manufacturers.

Mott-Smith was regarded as a great player, brilliant theorist and one of the soundest and most lucid of the early writers on contract bridge.

With Wass and Nolan in charge of the tournament, it has set records for attendance, including last year's turnout of 8207.5 tables, larger than some past NABCs.

Reeve said the job they do is especially impressive because both of the live an hour away from Gatlinburg. "They have to bring everything into town," said Reeve.

ACBL President Roger Smith told the gathering that he is very happy to be serving his term during the 50th anniversary of the establishment of the Goodwill Committee. "Every one of us," he said, "has a chance to influence whether this organization grows or shrinks. Let's keep spreading the word."

ACBL's chief executive, Jay Baum, was surprised to be called to the podium as the newest member of the Goodwill Committee. "I'm shocked and honored," Baum said. "Goodwill is mandatory," he added. "Bridge is a game for ladies and gentlemen and if we keep it that way our numbers will increase. I'm honored to be in a position to make the ACBL better each day."

Sharon Fairchild, who represents District 5 on the ACBL Board of Directors, praised NABC Chair Roni Gitchel for inspiring all the volunteers who have made the tournament a success.

Later, Gitchel took part in a surprise presentation to former ACBL President Jim Zimmerman. "When I first started bridge," Gitchel said, "there was someone I could go to and ask

anything. He has always been there."

Bobby Wolff, another former ACBL President, told a story about the late John Gerber when he was on the ACBL Board many years ago. "Johnny would sit in the lobby of the hotel where the Board was meeting and talk to each member as they came in," Wolff said, "and he could tell you how every vote would go. Jim did John Gerber one better – he made things happen and he spent his time doing what was best for bridge."

Zimmerman recalled the time 20 years ago when two Board members – Ira Zippert and Joan Gerard – approached him to say they knew a woman in New York City who would make an excellent Goodwill Committee chair. The vote on the appointment, Zimmerman recalled, "was 13-12." Since then, of course, the votes have been overwhelmingly in her favor.

Also at the meeting, there was a report on New York Times bridge editor Alan Truscott, an NABC regular who is recovering from serious surgery in New York. He is expected to leave the hospital in about a week.


An insult worth accepting

Convention card reminder

- Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.
- Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

Kamil, who was not having a stellar set, decided to try something else. He played a low diamond from hand at trick two, attempting to confuse the defenders. When West showed out, pitching a heart, Kamil played dummy's ◆8, taken by East with the 9. A spade went to West's ace and a third spade cleared the suit. Now Kamil ran the hearts, and this was the six-card ending:

On the last heart, East had to discard a club or Kamil's diamond suit would run. Kamil pitched a club and noted that West discarded a spade (he did not know Kamil had such good diamonds, so he was worried that Kamil might have the *A). This was the clue that East had the *A.

Kamil played the $\diamond 3$ to the 10 and ace, and when he exited with a club to East's now-bare ace, East had to lead into the \diamond K Q 7 at the end for the overtrick.

Asking questions about the auction

On Thursday
night, a player came
up to me and asked me
why I had not
answered his question
regarding asking
questions of the
opponents during the
auction. After a brief
discussion, I promised
that I would get back
to him with an answer
before the end of the



tournament. To date, I have not done so, and, since I cannot remember his name, this is the forum in which I have chosen to answer, hoping that he will read this letter in the Daily Bulletin.

The issue raised had to do with the fact that asking questions only when interested in the answer or considering a call at the time creates unauthorized information for partner, and he suggested that a way to prevent this occurrence was to occasionally ask questions about which one had no interest. The upshot of this practice of randomly asking questions would be that partner would no longer be able to draw inference from the act of asking a question.

During the next couple of hours, I spent my time asking expert players, members of the National Appeals Committee, and other directors their opinion of this practice. To a person, they all responded that they rarely ask questions, and then only if they needed an answer at the time. Further, they all felt that while asking questions randomly might eliminate the problem with unauthorized information to some extent, it would in turn create more problems than it would solve. Many also pointed out those asking questions to benefit a partner or to draw his attention to something of significance in the auction is improper.

One of the problems added to the mix by asking random questions is that while it is improper for your partner to draw inference from a question, the other side may do so, but only at their own risk.

In cases where a player draws a false inference from such a question and is thereby damaged, while it is true per law 73D1 that inferences drawn from such questions may be taken only by the other side and then only his own risk, the director should consider awarding an adjusted score under law 73F2 if there is no demonstrable bridge logic for the question being asked and if the offender could have known at the time that he asked that it might damage the non-offending side. I know that a player following this practice would surely claim innocence in such a situation, but I would respond that he would have to prove it to a committee if he felt that the ruling was incorrect.

Anyway, the Laws are set up to deal with the issue of unauthorized information. By law, a player must carefully avoid making a call or play that could have been suggested by extraneous information conveyed by an alert, asking a question, or the answer to such a question. They are entitled to base their actions only on the actual auction and play of the cards. If a player believes that there may have been a violation of proper procedure with regard to unauthorized information, the director should be summoned and allowed to deal with the issues raised.

In short, asking questions about the auction when not interested in the answer is a practice to be avoided, even though it may be motivated by the noblest of intents.

Rexford explained his 2♥ bid this way: "I don't know why I did it."

Obviously, East didn't take it as natural, nor did Schenker, who competed with his weak but shapely hand.

If West had put his hand on a trump for the opening lead, there might have been a different story to tell, but West started with the ♥J, ruffed by Schenker. He then played a diamond to the ace and a diamond to the king, dropping the queen. West ruffed the ♦J and was overruffed by dummy. Another heart ruff was followed by a diamond ruff with dummy's ♠K. Declarer then ruffed a heart to hand, played a club to dummy's ace and ruffed a fourth heart for nine tricks and plus 140.

That exhausting effort helped the team to a 3-IMP gain (their teammates at the other table played in 3♥, down one). Alas, it didn't help the team. They were booted out of the event by the Richard Pavlicek squad.





On the lead of the ♥10, Bloom won the king and passed the ♣10. The ♣J was covered, and Steve ducked the next heart, won the third and cashed two more clubs. The last club put unbearable pressure on East. If his partner had the ◆A J instead of the ◆A Q, it would be necessary for him to retain his fifth heart, so he parted with a diamond.

Now Bloom had to divine the spade position. The count on the deal suggested that West's shape was 2-4-4-3, but which doubleton spade did he

There are more $\blacktriangle J x$ and $\blacktriangle 10 x$ holdings than $\triangle x \times x$ – but here's the key: West did not open 1NT (strong), so J-x was not part of the equation. Therefore, the balance of probability was that he started with two low clubs instead of 10-x. This was the ending:



Bloom led the AA, a spade to the 8, cashed the king and exited with a heart. If East did not overtake West's ♥9, West would have to concede the ninth trick in diamonds. If East overtook the ♥9 to cash the long heart, he would have to play a spade at the end to give Bloom his game-going trick. It would not help for East to split his spade honors. The endplay would still work.

The squeezer

On this deal from the North American Pairs, Bart Bramley read the cards nicely, and then found the way to extract the maximum from the deal (spots approximate).

Playing 3NT on a fourth-highest spade lead, Bramley (South) won in hand. He advanced the \$10, covered to his pleasure by the queen and ace. He won the spade return in dummy and ran three clubs. West pitched two low hearts and a low diamond.

Bramley now reflected on why West would let go of a diamond. The carding had marked West with 4-4-4-1 shape. Why did he pitch a diamond? Bramley presumed what West thought he could afford it – hence West's most likely holding was K-Q-x-x.

Trusting his judgment, Bramley cashed three

hearts, ending in hand. West was squeezed on the hearts. He was forced to pitch a spade, so Bramley cashed his $\bigstar K$ and exited with a low diamond, endplaying West to concede the last two tricks to Bramley's $\bigstar A$ J.

Bramley called it the "ace squeeze. Some might call it an immaterial squeeze. Whatever you call it, I call it very elegant.
