What's happening on other fronts

NABC Open Swiss

Bart Bramley, Howard Weinstein, Russ Ekeblad, John Sutherlin and Sidney Lazard led 48 qualifiers into today's two final sessions. They had a 2 Victory Point lead over a multinational team: Eddie Wold of the U.S., George Rosenkranz of Mexico, Magnus Magnusson and Jon Baldursson of Iceland, and Berry Westra and Henri Leufkens of the Netherlands. The event drew 111 teams.

NABC Women's Swiss

The team captained by Gail Greenberg took a 5 VP lead into the final two sessions. The final will consist of 22 teams from the original field of 38. Playing with Greenberg are Sylvia Moss, Linda Perlman, Laurie Vogel and Janice Seamon. Close behind are Kathie Wei-Sender, Juanita Chambers, Stasha Cohen, Jill Levin and Irina Levitina.

NAOP Pairs B

Californians Steve Castellino of Fremont and Edward Lee of San Jose had a narrow lead over A.D. Both and Sun-O Ho of Brookfield WI. Close behind them were Charles Nauen of St. Paul MN and Jonathan Cohen of Prior Lake MN. Twenty-eight pairs representing various ACBL districts will fight it out in today's two-session final.

NAOP Pairs C

Ray Boehne of Monterey CA and Bryan Osborn of King City CA led 28 qualifying pairs into today's two-session final. They had a half-board lead over Tien-Chun Yang of Stanford CA and Fang Wu of San Jose. Charles Forsythe of Wichita KS and Theo Lichtenstein of Goddard KS were third, almost a board behind the leaders.

Schwartz repeats Vanderbilt victory

When Garey Hayden of Tucson AZ finished second in the Strati-Flighted Pairs, he joined a select group of play-


playing bridge since age 8, has passed the 10,000-masterpoint plateau and is now an ACBL Grand Life Master.

Seamon makes an incredible play

In Vanderbilt Round of 16 Wednesday, Michael Seamon, playing for the Cayne team, pushed a little and found himself in a "hopeless" contract.

and when the 8 appeared on his right he smoothly played the 9 from his hand. This exposed him to a possible quick ruff, and another heart lead would indeed have defeated the game, though only by one trick.

But West felt sure that Seamon would have won the first trick if he could, for fear of a ruff, so he assumed that there was a singleton on his right. That meant that his partner had begun with A 8 3, and that continuing hearts would permit South to establish the king eventually.

No chance to ruff

Hugh Ross knew he was in trouble when his opponents let him play $1 \clubsuit$ but he hoped to make a few low trumps and cut his losses.

Ross was playing with John Sutherlin in the second qualifying round of Open Pairs II. Their opponents were Richard Henderson and Mike Savage.


Savage led the $\clubsuit A Q$ and shifted to the $\forall K$. When Henderson played the $\forall Q$, Savage led a low heart to Henderson's 10. Henderson now shifted to the $\bigstar 8 - 9$, 10.

Savage led another low heart to Henderson's jack and back came the \bigstar 7. Ross won the king and led the \bigstar 6. Savage won his \bigstar J and continued with the \bigstar Q. Ross won his ace and, not wanting to lead diamonds himself, exited with the \bigstar 4 to Savage's 5.

Savage cashed the $\blacktriangleleft A$ and led a diamond to Henderson, who won the $\blacklozenge A$ and cashed the $\clubsuit K$. Ross was down five for minus 500 and 11 out of 64 matchpoints. "They defended it really nice and never gave me a chance to ruff anything," said Ross.

Promoting the ♥J

Margie Gwozdzinsky and Susan Wexler cooperated on a fine defense to score plus 200 on this deal from the second final session of the NABC Women's Pairs.



Most players with the South hand would pass a raise to 24, but Seamon liked his aces and pushed on. He regretted his enterprise when he saw the dummy, for he could count four losers and eight tricks -- there seemed no chance of ten.

But when the $\forall Q$ was led, Seamon did something extraordinary: he played low from the dummy

West therefore shifted to a trump, won in dummy. A diamond was ducked to West, who played a second trump, still in the grip of the illusion created at the first trick. South won in dummy, led to the A, and played two more rounds of trumps. West still thought he knew the heart position, so he discarded two cards in that suit in order to guard against a hypothetical club suit in declarer's hand.

Now Seamon was able to cash two heart tricks, discard his singleton club on dummy's fourth heart, and establish a diamond trick to make the game. "That was the best play I've ever seen," declared Seamon's partner, Mike Passell. And as the second-highest masterpoint winner, he has seen plenty. In the replay South failed, rather surprisingly, in 3⁺, and Seamon's team gained 10 IMPs.

Wexler led the A and when Gwozdzinsky discouraged, shifted to the K. Another diamond went to Gwozdzinsky's 9 and she continued the A, ruffed with the G and overruffed with the 8.

Wexler led the \bigstar 8 and declarer ducked to her jack. She led the \clubsuit K and Gwozdzinsky won her ace. A diamond through promoted Wexler's \clubsuit J for the second undertrick. Plus 200 was worth most of the matchpoints.


Kitty Munson decided to believe her opponent on this deal from the first final session of the NABC Women's Pairs. Munson and partner Carol Simon were runners-up in the event.

South led the AK and Munson won her ace. She led a low heart and South won the 10 and shifted to the A4: 3, jack, king.

Munson could not afford to duck another heart -- North could win and give her partner a spade ruff -- so she ran all her trumps. This was the three-card ending.



Now she led a heart and North was forced to win her ace and lead into the spade tenace.

Mixed-up Mixed Pair

Elayne Kadis of Brookline MA played East-West in Section VV in the afternoon session of the Mixed Pairs. In the evening she asked her partner where they should go. "Section R," he said. So off they went to Section R.

They had played five rounds without incident, but a pair of women showed up at their table for the sixth round. "What are two women doing playing in the Mixed Pairs?" Elayne asked.

"The Mixed Pairs! This is the Open Pairs."

Elayne contacted a director, and it turned out they were supposed to be at RR, not R.

The series of coincidences that made this possible were quite amazing. First of all, where were the folks who were supposed to be in R? Well, they were no-shows. And didn't the directors running the Mixed Pairs notice that someone was missing? Of course they did, and they instituted a futile search. Finally they decided to run Section R with a bump movement.

When Elayne and her partner finally showed up in Section RR, they took their places and played the final eight rounds.

No, there is no happy ending. Elayne and her partner had a bad game.

Magnificent defense

Wafik Abdou and Danny Sprung combined for a magnificent defense against 3NT on Board 9 from the first final session of Open Pairs II.

Abdou could see no good reason for leading a spade -- declarer already had announced he had four, and Abdou had only one possible entry even if spades could be set up. So he decided to try to help his partner -- he led the ♥K. Declarer ducked this but won the continuation with the queen. Of course declarer wondered why North had made such an unusual lead. With a two-way guess for the \mathbf{A} , he decided to play North for it, losing to Sprung's jack. Sprung switched to a spade to dummy's singleton king, and declarer decided to go after clubs. On the low club from dummy, Sprung, knowing partner was short of entries, put in the jack. Declarer ducked this, and Sprung switched back to spades. Declarer won and knocked out the \$A. But Sprung was able to get out with the KING of clubs. Sprung still had hearts under control, and he had opened a line of communication in the club suit with partner, so declarer was able to take only three spades, two diamonds, two hearts and a club for down one.

Tough bidding, tough play

Some of the most difficult hands to bid are those with borderline game values, no eight-card majorsuit fit, and no possibility of playing 3NT. Look at these North-South hands from the Mixed Pairs final: Dlr: East K Q 10

After a pass from East, should South open? Ken Barbour of Scottsdale AZ chose to bid $1 \clubsuit$, liking his three quick tricks. His partner, Carol Simon, had a problem of her own when West overcalled $1 \clubsuit$. Instead of bidding $2 \clubsuit$, suggesting a club fit and at least invitational values, she ventured a negative double ostensibly showing four spades. The bidding staggered on like this:

 $3 \blacklozenge$ was an improvisation. $4 \clubsuit$ was the best of a bad job, and West cashed two heart winners. He shifted to the $\clubsuit Q$, and South won with the ace and tried a diamond finesse. East took the king, perhaps an error, and played his last heart. He thought this would put the defense on top, but not so. After South ruffed in dummy the position was this:

South decided that West would not lead the $\mathbf{P}Q$ from Q x or a singleton, so he led to the $\mathbf{P}K$, collecting the jack. Then he cashed the $\mathbf{P}K$ -Q and took a club winner. Three rounds of diamonds ruined East, whose trumps were trapped.

International Team Trials

The 1998 International Team Trials (ITT) will take place June 14 through June 22 at Sam's Town Hotel and Gambling Hall, Robinsonville MS (just south of Memphis). The ITT will be used to select one of the two teams to represent the United States in the 1999 Bermuda Bowl to be hosted by Bermuda in January 2000.

ACBL will handle all reservation requests. Room rates are \$49 for a single or double, \$59 for a triple and \$69 for a quadruple. Room tax is 9%.

The entry deadline for teams without byes is May 29. Late entries will be considered, but may or may not be accepted. The deadline for applications for teams with byes -- in order to assure their bye position -- is April 24.

The Facts: E/W called for the Director when they discovered North's pass promised some values. This was during the next hand. After that hand was finished, the Director ruled there was not sufficient reason to adjust the score.

The Appeal: E/W appealed. East stated he would not bid $4 \mathbf{\Psi}$ if he was told North's pass promised values.

The Decision: The Committee decided the table result would stand. East's statement he would not have bid $4 \forall$ if South alerted North's pass did not convince the Committee. East knew South promised 12-14 HCP for his 1NT bid. Even though North's pass was not alerted (promised moderate values), East should not be surprised that North held 6 HCP. His hand was well within East's expectations. The Committee also determined that the N/S agreement allowed North to have zero points with a long minor suit. Finally, East could have protected himself by asking a question. The Committee decided the lack of disclosure about North's pass did not affect the auction.

The Facts: E/W called for the Director after finishing the hand. The Director ruled that the misexplanation demonstrably suggested (Law 16A) to North that he bid 3NT over 3Ψ , rather than 4Ψ . He changed the contract to 4Ψ , down 2, E/W +200. The Appeal: N/S appealed. North stated that South's 3♥ bid showed solid hearts and a good hand. He showed the Committee system notes to prove this. North chose to bid 3NT because the hand would play as well in notrump. He added that 4♥ would probably make. The Decision: The Committee decided the final contract would be 4, down 2, for E/W +200, 3NT. rather than 4Ψ , is strongly suggested by the unauthorized information. Law 16A ("may not choose from among logical alternative actions one that could demonstrably have been suggested over another") requires the contract be 4. The probable club lead would lead to down one or two on most lines of play.

The Committee decided that down two was the most probable result. Because this happened in a Continuous Pairs, the Committee decided to explain to North his obligations under Law 16A rather than consider a procedural penalty.

The Facts: Before the opening lead of the \bigstar 7, East asked North about the meaning of South's double. North said they were playing a new system, and he was taking the double as Stayman. E/ W called for the Director. Away from the table, East told the Director that she was not satisfied with the explanation. If the double was either Stayman or promised general values, she wanted to lead clubs. If the double promised clubs, however, she would lead a spade.

North said he was taking it as Stayman. When East asked South about the double, he said the partnership had no agreement. The Director ruled there was no violation of Law 40C ("If the Director decides that a side has been damaged through its opponents' failure to explain the full meaning of a call or play, he may award an adjusted score."), and the table result would stand.

The Appeal: E/W appealed. They stated if they were properly informed, then East would have led a club and beaten the contract. North said that 3NT can be made by winning the third round of clubs and playing on hearts.

The Decision: The Committee decided the table result would stand. N/S have an obligation to know their partnership agreements, but this is a relatively rare sequence. The Committee felt N/S were not required to have an agreement for the meaning of South's double. East's assumption that South's double was based on a club suit was the key factor in E/W's poor result. The Committee felt that as this double is normally played as either Stayman or general values, North's explanation of the double was adequate. There was no violation of Law 40C.



The Facts: N/S did not Alert South's 3 bid as not promising a major suit. East led a spade. After the play was done, E/W called for the Director. He ruled that N/S did not make it clear that on this auction South did not promise a major suit. With full disclosure, East would lead a heart. Therefore, the result was changed to 3NT, down one, E/W +100.

The Appeal: N/S appealed. They stated their only way to invite game in notrump was first to bid Stayman. It was also the only way for them to show a maximum negative hand with a diamond suit. North was not aware that a rebid of 2NT on this auction required an alert.

The Decision: The Committee decided the table result would stand, and assessed N/S a 1/8th board penalty for failing to properly alert the 3♦ bid. The Committee decided that West had the means to show both major suits over South's 1 + response. West's failure to show his heart suit was the reason East led the \$4, not North's failure to explain that South might or might not have a heart suit.

The auction should go this way (it didn't at our table and we played 4⁺-but never mind). The task is to make nine tricks on the $\mathbf{A}Q$ lead to the ace and a low club shift. I ran this around to East's king and a club return reassured me that the suit was 3-3.

I led a heart to the king with some optimism but West won the ace and returned the suit. The defense played three rounds of hearts by which time West had shown three clubs, three hearts and six diamonds. This was the ending:

Padding the lead



Open Swiss Teams revives fond memories

The North American Open Swiss Teams revives memories of Dallas 1997 and the last NABC win for bridge legends Edgar Kaplan and Norman Kay.

Kaplan and Kay -- with teammates Brian Glubok, Walter Schafer, Bart Bramley and Geir Helgemo -hit their stride on the final day of competition, scoring three blitzes and a near-blitz to claim the title.

Their victory was probably the most popular among bridge players since Kaplan, Kay, Bill Root and Richard Pavlicek added an ailing Oswald Jacoby to their squad and won the 1983 Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams. Jacoby died the following year.

The win remained Kaplan's greatest thrill in bridge. His career spanned six decades and covered every aspect of bridge. He was a champion player, editor and publisher of *The Bridge World*, expert vugraph commentator, theorist and the authority on the laws of the game.

Kaplan died in September after a two and a halfyear battle against cancer. He was 72.

Kay, Kaplan's regular partner and close friend for more than 50 years, has retired from competition.

'A present for Edgar'

In Dallas, Kaplan played seven of the last eight matches -- including one round with Helgemo, the young Norwegian star who has already won a silver medal in the Bermuda Bowl.

This was Helgemo's first North American championship and this now-famous 6♦ contract was "a present for Edgar."

Helgemo ruffed the opening heart lead and drew trumps in one round. If the opposing spades divided 3-3, he could cash two high spades and give up a spade. His fourth spade would be good and he could pitch dummy's losing club, ruff a club and come to 12 tricks.

Helgemo reasoned, however, that spades were not

At Bramley's table, 6♦ was also the contract, and declarer -- despite Bramley's bidding hearts and clubs and showing up with a singleton diamond -- played spades from the top and duly went one down.

Jacoby Trophy

The Jacoby Trophy goes to the winners. The trophy is named for Oswald and Jim Jacoby -- one of the premier father-son pairs in ACBL history -- the first father-son combination to win a national championship and the first father-son combination to be elected to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame.

The senior Jacoby (1902-1984) won his first major title -- the National Team Championship of the American Whist League -- in 1929 and his last major title -- the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams -- in 1983.

In between, he won the *McKenney Trophy* (now the *Barry Crane Top 500*) four times. He was the first player to win 1000 masterpoints in a single year and the first player to earn 10,000 masterpoints.

Jacoby won seven Spingolds, seven Vanderbilts, two Reisingers and more than a dozen other major titles. He was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1965.

He and son Jim are the co-authors of Jacoby Transfer Bids, Jacoby 2NT and other bidding ideas. Together, they won the Reisinger in 1955 -- when Jim was 22 -- and the Vanderbilt in 1965.

Jim Jacoby (1933-1991), elected to the Hall of Fame last year, won the Bermuda Bowl in 1970 and 1971, the World Mixed Teams in 1972 and the World Team Olympiad in 1988. He won more than 14 NABC titles and captured the *Barry Crane Top 500* in 1988 -- the same year he won the Olympiad title.

He is one of only three players to win the masterpoint title and a world championship in the same year -- Charles Goren won the Bermuda Bowl and the McKenney in 1950 while Barry Crane won the World Mixed Pairs and the McKenney in 1978.

Celebrate silver in Vancouver '99

When Vancouver, British Columbia kicks off the 1999 Spring NABC, we'll be celebrating silver -- the 25-year anniversary of the city's first North American Bridge Championships.

Here's a trip down memory lane -- back to March 22-31, 1974.

The tournament was held in the landmark Hotel Vancouver (unlike the 1999 event which will be held in the more recently built Pan Pacific Hotel-Trade and Convention Center complex). Back then we had Nationals rather than the politically correct North American Bridge Championships!

In his "Diary of the Spring Nationals" (May 1974 Bulletin), Henry Francis wrote, "The beauty of the city overpowered us as we drove in from the airport. Vancouver is framed by mountains, and the various inlets and bays are all a sparkling blue."

Since those early days we have developed into a major Pacific Rim gateway with a population approaching three million people. Despite rapid urban growth, our city is clean and safe. Also, Henry and other previous

visitors will be glad to know that Vancouver's beauty is still unparalleled!

At the bridge tables Barry Crane won yet another matchpoint title: this time the Open Pairs playing with his usual partner, Dr. John Fisher. Henry wrote, "What more can you say about Crane and Fisher? Not only did they win the Open, they walked away with it. Their margin of victory exceeded three boards."

At that time Crane had more than 16,000 masterpoints. How many would he have today, one wonders?

In 1974 we had the not-so-politically correct Men's Teams, now no longer run. The Precision Team of Ron Andersen-Hugh MacLean-Mark Feldman-Merle Tom-Steve Goldstein scored an impressive win to put C.C. Wei's newly invented system in the headlines.

In the similarly defunct Men's Pairs, our neighbors from Washington State, George Steiner-George Slemmons, nipped Steve Robinson-Kit Woolsey to take their first North American title and give the locals something to cheer about.

In the Women's Teams, the easy winners were Marilyn Johnson-Dorothy Truscott-Jacqui

Mitchell-Gail Moss-Mary Jane Farell-Emma Jean Hawes.

Victory in the Women's Pairs went to Pat Leary and Jan Martel (then Stansby).

The premier event, the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, featured major upsets with all four seeded teams eliminated in the quarter finals. The final had some Canadian content pitting Joey Silver's squad (Joey Silver-Eric Kokish and the Crossley brothers) against Kathie Wei's Precision Team (Ron Andersen, Steve Goldstein-Merle Tom-Mark Feldman).

Henry Francis' first diary entry read, "As we flew over the Coastal Range into Vancouver, we wondered how much of an attraction a Nationals in British Columbia would prove to be."

ACBL needn't have worried. Total attendance was 8329 tables, about 1300 bigger than any previous National in the Pacific Northwest. With the great success of our area's most recent NABC in mind (Fall 1993 in Seattle), we invite you all to visit us in 1999 and once again set a new Pacific Northwest attendance mark!

There are always hands that cause problems. Check out this deal from a recent Vanderbilt match. Your hand is:

♦Q953 ♥AK1053 ♦AQJ **4**3 Your plan is to open 1, but what do you do if your partner responds with a forcing 1NT? 24 is a bit much, so you must plan to rebid 2. Of course you have to make your plan early so that you can bid in tempo.

My partnership with Larry Cohen had a different problem. Although I could open a strong club, I too would have to get to 24 to show this hand. I decided on a little white lie by opening $1 \mathbf{\nabla}$. South overcalled 1, Larry made a negative double and North passed. What now?

1NT? That was the bid at the other table. 2NT? Maybe, but it didn't feel right. $2 \diamondsuit$? Or maybe $3 \bigstar$? Both could easily be right.

Have you figured out the hand pattern yet? If we give our partner at most two hearts, it seems that 2-2-4-5 or 2-2-5-4 are the most probable distributions he can hold. Our bidding indicates dummy will be bereft of high cards. So I went for the throat -- I passed 1 doubled for penalties with only queen-9-fourth -cord low for me. This was the full hand

NAOP winners to get Baldwin Trophy

The finals of the North American Open Pairs Flight B, a grassroots event limited to players with 0-1500 masterpoints, will take place today.

The first stage is conducted at the local club level and qualifiers advance to unit competition. Those qualifiers then advance to the district finals where two pairs qualify for the North American final.

The winners will have their names inscribed on the Baldwin Memorial Trophy and will also receive a certificate of recognition.

The trophy is presented in memory of Col. Russell J. Baldwin (1889-1969), army officer and expert on tournament procedure who was ACBL Honorary Member of the Year in 1943.

One of the leading American bridge personalities, he was active as an organizer from the earliest days of contract bridge and became a director and treasurer of the American Bridge League shortly after its foundation in 1927.

A member of the ACBL Laws Commission from its foundation in 1933, Baldwin was primarily responsible for the first Duplicate Code issued in 1935. He played a considerable part in formulating subsequent codes.

He was the author of the McKenney-Baldwin schedules for Howell movements and constructed other movements.

His contributions to tournament procedure include the official ACBL method of dealing with fouled boards.

Baldwin was active as a tournament director from 1927 until 1941. After service in World War II, he was ACBL business manager from 1946 until 1951.

He was recalled to military serve at the outbreak of the Korean War and retired from the U.S. Army in 1957. He rejoined ACBL in 1958 and was in charge of tournament scheduling until his retirement in 1963.



Later on he struggled to handle studies and bridge -- in fact he got all A's one semester. But bridge had exerted its magic power on his psyche.

He joined the ACBL in 1969 and over the years has become one of the most successful bridge pros in the business. Yes, he's tried other lines of work -- 10 years owning a computer company, 10 years in travel work and five years with tropical fish. But bridge was almost foremost through all those years.

Well, yes, he does have another hobby -- he and Cookie, his wife of 22 years, throroughly enjoy showing dogs. In fact, while Garey was here in Reno, his wife showed Lisa in a very tough competition. Dogs get points just like people -- for dogs it's majors, for people it's masterpoints.

People need 300 points to become a Life Master. Dogs need 15 majors to become a champion. Well, Lisa won five points -- the maximum -- at the show this week, and that was just enough for her to become a champion. Garey definitely was more excited about Lisa's achievement that he was about getting his 20,000th masterpoint.

No story like this is complete without a list of the star's achievements, and Garey has many. His North American victories include the Men's Teams, Men's Pairs, Open Pairs, Board-a-Match Teams and three Swisses. In addition he has had seconds in the two toughest pair games, the Blue Ribbon and the Life Masters. As recently as St. Louis last fall, he had a second in the Open Pairs in partnership with Dennis Kasle.

A graduate of Cornell University, Mac Nab was a member of the U.S. Olympic track and field squad in 1936.
