## Meet your TDs

This is part of a new series of articles profiling tournament directors who work at NABCs.

Growing up in Vista CA, North of San Diego, Ken Horwedel knew about bridge because his mother and grandmother played. He didn't take up the game, however,
 because "they wouldn't teach me."

The reason is not clear, but Horwedel made up for it later in life by becoming "addicted" to the game. As keen as he is to play, he's even more into being a tournament director.
"I have found my niche," he says. "I can't think of anything I would rather do."

National TD Matt Smith, a mentor of sorts to Horwedel, says that's a good thing. "Ken has as much potential as anybody," says Smith, "and he's already a long way there."

At the NABCs, the 35 -year-old TD works in Tournament Services - unloading equipment, setting up playing areas, and performing dozens of other key logistical jobs that keep the NABCs humming along.

Horwedel believes he owes a lot to bridge and the ACBL

After high school, Horwedel went to Germany to study philosophy at Alexander von Humboldt University in Berlin. An exchange student he met in high school influenced him to do so.

## Under control (or not) By Barry Rigal

The first board of our 32-board match in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams set the tone when this apparently unchallenging deal came along.

At our table, where South played in $4 \boldsymbol{\bullet}$, West cashed two high clubs and shifted passively to a trump. It was easy enough to draw two rounds of trumps with dummy's king and queen, find the bad news, then knock out the $\wedge \mathrm{A}$. West could duck the first spade, win the second and play a third round. South could ruff high and claim by drawing trumps.

At the other table, North played $4 \vee$ on a club lead. George Mittelman, West, won the top two clubs and played a third round. Declarer ruffed in dummy and immediately played the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$, ducked, then a spade to the queen and ace. Mittelman played back a third spade, ruffed high by declarer to produce this ending:

To succeed in this ending, declarer must cash the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$, then play the $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{K}$ and ruff a diamond,

ruff a spade with the $\vee 10$ for the trump coup. When declarer actually cashed the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$ and $\downarrow 10$ at once, she could not avoid shortening herself and losing trump control for down one.

# <br> <br> What's your system? <br> <br> What's your system? By Lynn Berg 

 By Lynn Berg} JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

That's a question you may be asked when you sit down to play. Most of us say "Standard American," a vague term that can mean different things to different people. It generally means you are playing five-card
 major suit openings, better minor openings with at least three cards and usually, strong 1NT openings in the range 15$17 / 18$. Many variations exist, as well as the many conventions that can be added on - the reason why convention cards are necessary.

The proliferation of conventions isn't new it's been going on since the mid-Eighties, when the ACBL introduced the Standard American Yellow Card, familiarly known as SAYC. The idea was to print a card with the most popular conventions - like Stayman and transfers, for example - and very little room for variation.

You and a partner could agree to play the card without much discussion. Nor would the opponents have to scrutinize it carefully because it was a set card. This simple, convenient approach has never been very popular in the ACBL, though it has been hugely successful in online bridge.

SAYC has been modified over the years, especially with the additions of key card Blackwood and Cappelletti (over 1NT openings). Ranges for notrump jumps by responder have changed, too, to reflect what is most popular in duplicate bridge today. It reflects the general trend in bidding toward lighter openings and more aggressive competitive bidding.

ACBL tournament rules require that both partners have conventions cards - filled out
identically and accurately reflecting their agreements. It's inappropriate to have a generic card you carry no matter the partner. Instead, you should use filling out the card together as a way to check on your agreements and remind yourselves of the details. The card actually has three functions: (1) to use with partner to make agreements, (2) to record your scores as you play, and (3) as information for your opponents. The opponents should be able to get the same information if they ask one of you or if they look at either card. That's why the cards should be identical and you should have consulted with your partner when filling out your card.

The most popular new system is called $2 / 1$ game force. Not much about $2 / 1$ is really very new - it's a variation on Standard American combined with the forcing 1 NT bid over a major opening described by Kaplan-Sheinwold in the late Fifties. The most important difference from standard is that bidding a new suit at the two level after partner opens is a game force. Because many hands with 10-12 points aren't good enough to make a game-forcing bid, the forcing 1NT bid is necessary.

When you sit down to play against new opponents, you may not consult your own card once you have cards in your hand. Put your card where it's easy for them to see. This is the time to scan their card. Look at the front top first: there should be a description of their general approach, as well as the nature of their strong forcing bid. Then look down to the left at the 1NT box: Although they are supposed to Announce their 1NT range, you should know already. If the 1NT opener is "weak" - perhaps 12-14 - does that change your overcalls? For instance, the proponents of DONT say it's ineffective over weak 1 NT s because you lose the opportunity to make a penalty or equal-value double.

Then look down at the major suit and minor suit boxes: Bergen or other gadgets over majors? Inverted minors? Now down to the two-bids:

there are lots of $2 \bullet$ bids out there that aren't just six-card preempts.

Now turn the card over. The top two boxes come up often: special doubles on the left and notrump overcalls on the left. What are they playing? Then look down at the preempts and check out their overcalls of your 1NT.

None of this should take long. If they are playing something strange to you, you can ask before you get cards in your hand. You can also discuss issues with your partner. If you play DONT and encounter a weak 1NT, for example, do you want to change to some other system?
opening-bid strength with a spade stopper. It asks partner to bid notrump with a heart stopper. East doubles $2 \boldsymbol{A}$ to make sure partner leads a spade against any eventual contract.

Defensive commentary: East has asked for a spade lead and West obliges. West hopes East has a quick spade entry and will lead a heart through declarer's king.

Play commentary: It's pretty clear what is going on here. Take the South seat. Judging from the double of $2 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$, East has the $\boldsymbol{\wedge} \mathrm{K}$ and will surely punch a heart through your king if he gets on lead. You, on the other hand, barring 4-0 clubs, have at least nine tricks by simply winning the $\uparrow A$ and cashing out: five clubs, three diamonds and the A A makes nine.

So what's the problem? The problem, in case you didn't notice, is if clubs break 3-1 the clubs are blocked! If you cash the $\approx \mathrm{AK} \mathrm{Q}$, merrily playing low clubs from the dummy, the fourth round of clubs will be won by North. Don't look now, but you have no way back to your hand to cash the fifth club, and if diamonds don't break 3-3, down you go. Misery.

If you notice that club block. you can survive it. Unblock the $\approx 9, \AA 8$ and $\AA 6$ under the ace, king and queen. Now when you play the $\approx 5$, you can triumphantly underplay dummy's 4 and take a fifth club trick with the 2.

Standing ovation, please.

# A workout from Deep Finesse

Three deals almost in succession at the start of the set of boards played in the second final session of the Lebhar IMP Pairs and the second semifinal session of the NABC+ Platinum Pairs produced much burning of the midnight oil for the analysts, trying to match Deep Finesse's offhand statement of the tricks available at double-dummy. Here are the deals. You may care to test yourself after reading

On board 3, I believe everyone in the field went down in 3NT on a diamond lead. But DF knows the answer. Win the $\star \mathrm{K}$, North retaining the $\diamond \mathrm{J}$, play the $\uparrow \mathrm{Q}: 7,4$, ace. Win the diamond return with the ace, play a low spade to the jack and queen, and spade to the 10 , low heart to the ace, cash the $a \mathrm{~K}$, leaving this ending:

South still has to discard. If he pitches a club you can drop his \&Q and make 10 tricks. If he pitches a diamond, you set up a heart in peace and quiet. So he pitches his heart. You play a diamond to cut the defenders' communications, and if South wins he is endplayed. So North wins and plays a club. East wins the \&A and sets up his heart. No problem!

Deal 4 is far more difficult to analyze. Bart Bramley took 15 minutes to explain the analysis. Let's try to summarize. The deal, repeated for convenience:

West leads a low diamond against 1NT by South. East covers dummy's card, South ducks his $\vee$ to cut communications. After cashing the - A, East must shift to the 10 or $\vee 9$, West must overtake. If declarer ducks this, West finds the obvious shift, the $\uparrow 4$ !! Declarer can't duck, or the defenders go back to diamonds and have seven tricks. So declarer wins the $\uparrow A$ and goes after the clubs. The defense duck twice, perforce, declarer plays a second spade. West wins, cashes the $\because \mathrm{A}$ and goes back to hearts.

If North wins the first heart after East shifts, he goes after clubs and West ducks twice. Now declarer runs the $\uparrow \mathrm{J}$, covered all around, and plays a second spade. East wins and leads a low heart to West's queen. If North wins he has no entry - the spades are dead. If he ducks, West cashes the \%A and plays a third heart to set up the defenders' seventh winner.

There are many, many more variations, but the bottom line is that DF was right. Who knew?

Now to board 6, repeated for convenience:

Let's look at the normal defenses to $4 \vee$ by East. On a diamond lead, be it low or high, declarer ducks. A spade shift looks best. Declarer wins and plays the $\bullet$ A and takes a diamond ruff, then unblocks the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ and leads a club to the king. South can win and force declarer, but East has trump
control - just.
On a spade lead, as Josh Parker discovered, declarer ducks a diamond, ruffs the spade continuation and plays the $A$ and a diamond, then ruffs a spade, crosses to the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ and ruffs a spade, then sets up a club trick. Declarer is up to eight tricks and down to the $\vee \mathrm{J}$ doubleton. Eventually, South must ruff the third club but is endplayed at trick 12.

The winning defense is for South to find the "obvious" low heart lead. Declarer wins the $\downarrow \mathrm{K}$ and plays a club. South must duck this, win the next club and lead a low diamond to the 10 and North's queen. If North is allowed to hold this trick, he gives his partner a club ruff. So declarer must win the $\bullet \mathrm{Q}$ with the ace and return a low diamond. A spade back taps declarer for the first time, and after ruffing a diamond in dummy, declarer is stuck there. A club lets South ruff, a spade ruff allows South to win and administer the third tap to give him trump control.

## No chance to duck By Barry Rigal

On this deal from the Lebhar IMP Pairs, reported earlier, Marty Hirschman made a nice duck in the trump suit against an East player in $4 \vee$, resulting in defeat of the contract. Two declarers who made the contract - David Grainger and Nader Hanna - had to deal with a tricky opening lead.

Both successful declarers reached $4 \vee$ from the West seat (well done) after East came in with $2 *$ over North's 1NT opener, showing a hand with one long major suit.

Each declarer received the sneaky lead of the $\checkmark 7$ from North. Both ran the lead to hand - what next?

Hanna elected to cash the $\uparrow \mathrm{A}$, pitching a diamond from dummy, then repeated the heart finesse and tried the bold move of the ゅK. As Hanna hoped, North ducked the trick, although winning and returning the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$ looks safe enough.

Now Hanna ran the trumps and in the four cardending, North was strip-squeezed:


On the last trump, West can spare a club, but North has no answer.

Grainger also won the $\vee 9$ at trick one. He went for the legitimate choice of finding a doubleton $\vee \mathrm{K}$. He cashed the $\uparrow$ A, pitching a diamond, led a club to the queen, ran the hearts and achieved the same winning ending.

Facts: The contract was $4 \&$ doubled by South down three for a score of minus 500 after the lead of the $\vee 10$. The director was called at the hesitation and after the play of the deal was completed. Both sides agreed to East's break in tempo (BIT). After the ruling was delivered (three rounds later), EastWest contended that East had bid in her normal random slow tempo.

## Hard lesson

Gary Near of San Francisco learned a hard lesson in the Robert Hattrup Side Swiss Teams on Tuesday.

On the last round, with his team in contention for the win, he was defending a $4 \boldsymbol{\uparrow}$ contract. At one point, as declarer played on trumps, he pulled two cards from his hand - a trump and the $\& 9$.

Later in the play, Near won the lead and was told by his opponent he had to play the club. When he did, declarer got a ruff and a sluff to make the vulnerable game. That cost 12 IMPs, and Near's team lost the match, falling from first in the event to fifth.

It turns out, of course, that had a tournament director been called when the irregularity occurred, everyone at the table would have been told that Near would not have been obliged to play the $\% 9-$ a minor penalty card - if he won the lead later.

The lesson, of course, is that a director should

A brief player poll had some passes and some $3 \wedge$ bids

Director's Ruling: The vulnerability (unfavorable) makes pass a logical alternative (Law 73C). The result was changed to $3 *$ by South down two, and a score of North-South minus 100

The Appeal: East-West appealed the director's decision. East was the only player who did not attend the hearing.

East-West said that hesitations by East are random, and it was just a short break (about five seconds). East must have two clubs so is likely to be 2-4-5-2 after no raise with no small doubleton in either black suit. The opponents found a 4-4 club fit, so it is unlikely the field will be in $3 \boldsymbol{\infty}$; so defending it will be about a $15 \%$ board. Therefore, bidding $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ is clear.

North-South felt that pass is a logical alternative.

The Decision: Some committee members felt strongly that five seconds was not a BIT, but the committee voted that there was unauthorized information. When deciding what the UI suggested, the majority judged either nothing specific or nothing more than the authorized information from the auction, namely that partner had a doubleton club. If the UI could not demonstrably suggest one action over another then West could bid as he pleased, per law 16B1(a) Therefore, the committee restored the table result of $4 \&$ doubled by South down three, North-South minus 500 and East-West plus 500.

what he calls a "rough patch" in his life. "Bridge pulled me out of a bad situation," he says.

Horwedel rediscovered bridge one night at a bar when he heard some people talking about their game results. Horwedel showed his curiosity and was taken under the wing of a local player. He soon became a fixture at the Vista Bridge Club.

Immersed in the game, Horwedel read every bridge book he could get his hands on, and when he felt a level of competence, he started playing a lot at the club and in tournaments. "I was a bridge bum for awhile," he says, "but I decided I didn't want to do that."

It was a natural progression for him to become more involved in running games. He was already involved with the local unit. "It wasn't a real stretch for me to start directing."

Horwedel says directing is "difficult and challenging, and I love that aspect of it. I really enjoy the players and making sure they have a good time."

He became an ACBL tournament director in August 2005 and was taken on as a full-time employee shortly thereafter. He has been a workhorse since signing on, working 370 sessions last year. He expects to hit 400 sessions in 2010.
"He works a ton," says Smith.
Horwedel is gratified to know he has the respect of other TDs, and he really admires Smith. "The first time I worked with Matt," Horwedel says, "I liked the way he worked, and I decided I would just emulate him."

About two years ago, Horwedel was working as the caddy master at a bridge tournament when he met Julie McDonald, who was caddying. They married two years ago and now live in Las Vegas, where she is in school studying physical therapy.

Directing, Horwedel says, is a dream job, not least because he likes his fellow TDs. "I don't work with anyone I don't enjoy."

South started with two high diamonds, not best, and continued with a third round of the suit. Polowan ruffed with the $\vee \mathrm{J}$. When that held, he knew how to play the heart suit, cashing the king and playing a heart to his ace, felling the queen.

Now he cashed two more hearts and the $\diamond J$, reaching this position, with North still to play:

North is caught in a trump squeeze. If he discards a spade, Polowan can play a spade to the ace, felling the now-singleton honor and take the rest of the tricks. In practice, North discarded a club, so Polowan played the $\& \mathrm{~K}$, a club to the ace and ruffed a club, establishing the $\$ 5$ for 11 tricks and a near top.

South can hold Polowan to nine tricks by switching to a spade, a club or a low diamond at trick two. Even a heart switch would have prevented the overtricks.

Arnie Malasky found a deceptive duck and a squeeze to overcome entry problems on this deal from the second qualifying session of the Levintritt Silver Ribbon Pairs.

South led the $\uparrow 3$ to 3NT. Malasky, East, could see severe entry problems, especially if the defense played diamonds early, so he played a low spade from dummy and smoothly ducked his $\boldsymbol{A} \mathrm{A}$ when North played the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$. This convinced North that his partner held the $\boldsymbol{A} A$.

Malasky was hoping that North also held the $\vee$ A. If so, he would surely "know" that partner could not have both the $\uparrow \mathrm{A}$ and $\boldsymbol{\propto} \mathrm{K}$ and therefore would not find the damaging club shift.

North shifted to the $\downarrow$. Malasky won the $\downarrow \mathrm{K}$ and led a heart to dummy's king and North's ace. North switched to a spade and Malasky could now see the possibility of a black-suit squeeze if South held the $\& \mathrm{~K}$.

Malasky played low from hand on the spade lead and won South's $\uparrow 10$ with dummy's $\uparrow$ Q. He then ran four heart tricks, discarding two diamonds and a club from his hand. He led to his $\uparrow A$ and cashed the $\bullet$ and $\bullet$, which caught East in a spade-club squeeze. Plus 660 was worth 20 out of 25 matchpoints.

## Women's Pairs compete for Whitehead Trophy <br> Play begins today in the Whitehead Women's

 Pairs with two qualifying sessions, followed by two final sessions tomorrow.This is the 79th Women's Pairs. At stake is the Whitehead Trophy, donated in 1930 by Wilbur C. Whitehead of New York, a great bridge authority and a member of the team that won the Vanderbilt Cup in 1928, the first year it was in play.

Whitehead (1866-1931) was president of the Simplex Automobile Company, but bridge held such a fascination for him that he retired from business in 1910 to devote his life to bridge.

He was the inventor of many bidding and play conventions, the quick-trick table of card values, the Whitehead system of requirements for original bids and responses and the Whitehead table of preferential leads.

Whitehead was instrumental in standardizing procedures in auction bridge and later in contract bridge.

## Bean Red Ribbon Pairs begins today <br> The Bean Red

 Ribbon Pairs, an ACBL event with national rating open to players with fewer than 2000 masterpoints, gets underway today.Players earn qualification by placing first or second overall in regionally rated
 events of at least Flight B status. Neither member of a qualifying pair may hold more than 2000 masterpoints at the time of qualification.

The four-session event began in 1986 and winners have their names inscribed on the Percy X. Bean Trophy.

## Bean Trophy

The trophy was designated by the ACBL Board of Directors in 1996 to honor Bean, ACBL president in 1972 and chairman of the Board in 1973.

Bean (1916-1992) represented District 19 on the Board from 1964 until 1988 and served as president of the ACBL Charity Foundation from 1974 until 1981. He was a member of the National Goodwill Committee and the National Board of Governors and general chairman of arrangements for the World Team Olympiad in Seattle in 1984.

Bean and his wife, Anne, were named $A C B L$ Honorary Members for 1992, the first time that honor was bestowed on a husband-wife combination.

Bean was the editor of Mad, Mad World of Bridge, a publication that strongly championed players of less than expert class.

When declarer cashed a trump, West discarded the $\leqslant$ (a club wouldn't help), Cappelletti discarded the $\uparrow 6$ from dummy and East played the $\downarrow 2$. Cappelletti led the $\leqslant 4$ to the ace and ruffed a diamond. Now, when he led his last trump, West had to discard a club or the $\vee \mathrm{J}$ would be good.
