## Defenses to 1NT

A group of expert players was recently polled on their favorite methods of combating 1 NT openings. The Daily Bulletin will feature the preferred defense against 1NT of a different expert each day of the NABC.

(Players should note that several of the systems described in this series use Mid-Chart conventions and are not permitted in events that are restricted to the General Convention Chart. Players should check the director-in-charge for details.)

Today's expert: Mike Cappelletti
Mike Cappelletti walked into the Daily Bulletin office Sunday night and said, "I see you're running a series on notrump defenses."

We can take a hint.
With the proliferation of 1 NT defenses, the reputations of older systems such as Cappelletti among expert players have sometimes suffered. The newest toy is always shiniest. Cappelletti, however, continues to enjoy immense popularity with many club and tournament players who embrace it for its simplicity .

The eponymous Mr. Cappelletti provided some history about the convention, as well as his views on bidding theory.
"When I started playing bridge, the convention Brozel was very popular as a defense to 1 NT . At the same time, however, the KaplanSheinwold system was coming into vogue, and the weak 1 NT it uses was robbing us blind. We needed a penalty double, but in Brozel, double showed a one-suited hand. So I thought 'Why not make double for penalty, and let $2 *$ show the single-suiter?'" Thus, Cappelletti was born. Its structure is this:

> Dbl = penalty/values
> $2 \boldsymbol{2}=$ one-suited hand
> $2 *=$ majors
> $2 \vee=$ hearts and a minor
> $2 \boldsymbol{\wedge}=$ spades and a minor
> 2NT = minors

Cappelletti is unwavering in his view that double needs to be defined as value showing and penalty oriented.
"You need the penalty double. These fancy systems are giving up too much. If you have a balanced 16 or 17 points and they open 1 NT in front of you, double is best in the long run. It's like blackjack: when dealer has 10 , but you have 11 , you should double down. On a particular hand it might not work, but in the long run it's best. Remember that you're 'over' the 1NT opener and that you get to make the opening lead."

According to Cappelletti, whatever the range of the opponents' 1 NT , double should show a good 14 or more.

On weak notrumps, he said, "If you don't double, but defeat 1NT by one or two tricks (plus 50 or 100), you get an inferior score at matchpoints or IMPs if you could have made 1NT yourself for plus 90 or plus 120 .

For many years, Alan Stout enjoyed the unusual distinction of being the ACBL member with the greatest number of masterpoints who had never won a North American Championship. With his victory Monday in the Leventritt Silver Ribbon Pairs with longtime partner Allan Siebert, Stout finally put that distinction to rest.

Pairing a $62.65 \%$ first final session with a $57.36 \%$ effort in the second final, Siebert and Stout won the four-session contest (restricted to members 55 and older who had previously qualified to enter) by more than a board. Their two-day total including carryover was 2140.54 .

In second with 2045.56 were Charles Nemes and Martin Morris of the Chicago area. Top on a board was 64.

This was the sixth NABC title for Siebert of Little Rock AR. On the all-time list of ACBL

## Stayman

By Mark Ehret
Our priorities at bridge are to play in the majors first, notrump second and the minor suits last. The Stayman convention is designed to discover 4-4 major
suit fits when partner opens 1NT.
As South you hold:

North opens 1NT (15-17). Now what?
You have enough high-card points to invite game, and you have a four-card major. Your doubleton in clubs may provide opportunities for partner to take some ruffs in your hand, but only if you have a $4-4$ spade fit. The way to find out is to bid $2 \%$.

That is a conventional bid - it has nothing to do with clubs and everything to do with finding out if partner has a four-card major. His responses:

$$
2 \vee=\text { no four-card major. }
$$

$2 \boldsymbol{v}=$ four-card heart suit (maybe four spades).
$2 \boldsymbol{n}$ = four-card spade suit, but not four hearts.
Some partnerships agree that opener's rebid of 2NT denies a four-card major and shows that the top of the 1 NT range. This is not recommended. Just bid $2 \bullet$ to say no four-card major. Partner may need the bidding space that remains at the two level to further describe his hand.

Let's say that North now bids $2 v$. If you hold the example hand, what should you bid next?
$\operatorname{Bid} 2 \boldsymbol{A}$. That tells partner you have a raise to

## Opening lead: $\vee 2$

Bidding commentary: South is too strong to overcall $1 \boldsymbol{A}$, so he doubles, intending to bid spades next. With this distribution, a double followed by a suit bid shows 17-18 high-card points. Given the strength that South is showing, North has enough to raise to $4 \boldsymbol{A}$. A raise to $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ is possible but a touch conservative.

Lead commentary: Holding three low cards in partner's unsupported suit, lead low to deny a doubleton. If you raised partner's
opening bid, lead high to deny an honor. Partner knows of your length.

Defensive commentary: The possession of four to the ace in the opponents' trump suit is a powerful weapon, particularly when holding a low as you can. consider: major). Now what? article in this series. and a minimum 1NT.
or even

2NT with a four-card spade suit. If North has a minimum 1NT opener and four spades, you can stop at the two level. 2NT by you would send the same message (you wouldn't have used Stayman without one major and you don't like hearts), but if partner has four spades and a minimum, you will end up at the three level. When game is not in the picture, stay as

Here's another hand to
AK J 105 Q J 5 3 2 J 74 • 6 .
Partner, North, opens the bidding 1 NT, and you bid $2 *$ to check on his major-suit holdings. Predictably, partner bids 2 (no

If you bid $2 \boldsymbol{\bullet}$, you are showing the hand you hold: five hearts, four spades (you would simply have transferred to hearts without four spades) and 8 or 9 HCP. More on transfers can be found in another

Partner now has the option of passing $2 \boldsymbol{\vee}$, raising to $4 \vee$ with three-card support and a maximum or bidding 2 NT with a doubleton heart

Finally, let's look at a hand that represents the exception to the rule that you should always have at least 8 HCP to use Stayman. Say you hold

long, strong side suit. East plays three rounds of hearts, forcing South to ruff. South and East now have four spades each. When South begins to draw trumps, East is careful to win the third round with the ace. Not the first, not the second, but the third round. Why? Because the third spade is the one that exhausts dummy. Now East can play a fourth heart, forcing South to ruff with his last spade. East remains with a high spade

"Also, it's important to compete against the weak notrump (with appropriate values). If you can show both majors, you're at a terrific advantage since your partner will have a good idea of what to do. I've run many, many computer simulations that show it's right to compete with the majors even if you're only $4-4$ with hands as light as 10 or 11 high-card points."

What about the "modified" Cappelletti convention?
"I can't stand it. Using $2 *$ to show several possible hand types is inferior to just showing your major-minor two-suiters with $2 \boldsymbol{\downarrow}$ or $2 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$. The problem with using $2 *$ as first step in modified Cappelletti is that the opponents compete over $2 \star$, your side could wind up losing the major."

## Fearful Symmetry?

Before we played the first deal of our Vanderbilt round-one knockout match, a 32-board affair, I wondered if I should tell my partner about the last deal I'd played against our opponents. They had doubled my partner in $4 \boldsymbol{a}$ and he had blown the overtrick for plus 790, on a deal where they could collect 1370 their way.

I decided to say nothing, and this was the first deal:

Phillip Alder, my partner, received the lead of the $\uparrow 8$ (yes, you or I would perhaps not make that lead). Alder impressively played dummy's 7 rather than cover with the 9 .

East looked at him suspiciously, sure that something was up. Maybe declarer had something like this:

East took his $A$ and shifted to a heart.
That was plus 650 to the good guys -- and, lo and behold, the opponents had a makeable slam!

At the other table, our teammates had never bid and conceded 420, so we gained 6 IMPs and won the match by 4 IMPs.

Facts: North played in 1NT making three for plus 150 after the opening lead of the $\uparrow$. The director was called after trick seven. The play to that point had been: $\uparrow 9$ to the 10 and ace. The $\downarrow$ Q was won by the king. Declarer advanced the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$ won by East with the ace. The $\uparrow 8$ was led to West's jack, dummy pitching a spade. West shifted to the $\wedge 3$, won by the $\wedge$ A. Declarer led the $\vee 10$ and overtaken in dummy with the king.

At trick seven, declarer led the $\vee 9$. After following to the $\varphi$ with the $\bullet 2$, declarer said the word "heart." Declarer stated that he was attempting to correct his revoke.

Director's Ruling: The director judged that declarer, by saying "heart," was playing to the next trick. The revoke, therefore, was established In accordance with Laws 61-64, a one-trick

## Touring St. Louis

## St. Louis City Tour

penalty was imposed and the result adjusted to 1 NT making two for a score of N-S plus 120 .

The Appeal: At the end of trick seven, declarer was in dummy in which there remained one good heart. Declarer still had one heart in his hand due to his revoke at trick seven. The declarer then said "heart." A moment later (one or two seconds), he took the heart from his hand and started to exchange it for the club he had played to trick seven. There was conflicting testimony about whether declarer's trick seven card was face down at that point. Dummy had not played the remaining heart and West had not played.

After a brief exchange between the players, E-W called for the director. E-W said they though a heart had been called from dummy. Declarer said it was not his intention to call a card from dummy; he just said "heart" because he wanted to correct the revoke.

The Decision: The committee heard the testimony of three of the players and two kibitzers (who had been sitting on either side of dummy) The kibitzers' testimony was requested and consented to by both sides.

Although Declarer had said that he had fully named each previous heart played from dummy, the committee found that his stating "heart" constituted an incomplete designation of the heart from dummy. The laws provide for incomplete designation by deeming it be the lowest card in dummy of the suit named, unless that was incontrovertibly not declarer's intention (Law 46.B.2). The testimony did not suggest that it was clear that declarer was muttering rather than naming a card to be played. Declarer did not say "heart," in a slip of the tongue, intending to say something else. He was in a position where cashing dummy's last heart was the logical next play and he said "heart" in such a way that it reasonably could be construed to be a designation of a card he is proposing to play.

Under those circumstances the committee decided the heart in dummy is played and the revoke on the previous trick was established. Therefore, a one trick penalty was appropriate and the decision of the table director was upheld.

The committee found that the appeal had merit.

Your second stop is at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis. Archbishop John Glennon began the building of the Cathedral in 1907. Its unique design combines architecture of Romanesque style on the exterior with a wondrous Byzantine style interior. The cathedral is the home of the largest mosaic collection in the world.

On your ride home down Market Street, you will pass Union Station, a former passenger train terminal that has been restored into a shopping center and entertainment complex.

## Dying by the Sword, Living by the Sword By Bob Lafleur

The sword for my long time partnership with Al McRae is $11-141 \mathrm{NTs}$, and we pride ourselves on not getting caught for numbers. We run before the doubling starts with most weak hands and have methods to describe single-suited and twosuited hands if 1 NT has been doubled in the direct position. Responder with 8 or more balanced points passes after 1 NT-Pass, and opener Alerts, informing the opponents, if asked, that the expectation is a 8 to a bad 11 HCP.

Playing in a KO on Saturday, it was a real disappointment when holding
 and passing after partner's 1 NT had been passed, to have LHO double. Partner and RHO passed, and envisioning a make, with perhaps doubled overtricks, I passed as well. The opponents defended flawlessly, everything lay well for them and we were down 500 . We can't remember the last time we were caught so badly.

This brings us to Board 18 in the second qualifying for the Silver Ribbon Pairs:

In third seat favorable I opened the West hand 1NT. Not everyone's idea of a quality bid (including partner). North, with16 balanced HCP, doubled, and partner passed, which I Alerted. When asked, I explained that partner had a twosuited hand which did not include spades or wanted to play 1NT redoubled to punish North for getting into our auction. South passed and I redoubled per agreement. North passed, partner passed and South had nowhere to go.

North led the $\diamond \mathrm{K}$ and, liking my chances, put up dummy's ace, getting even better news when South played the jack. I followed with the 7. A club to my jack was taken by North to play the - Q and after some thought South unblocked the 10. North continued a diamond to my 9. I ran the clubs pitching my low hearts and came back to my hand with the $\uparrow$ A to cash my diamonds. This was the position when I cashed my last diamond:


North was caught in a simple squeeze for my 11th trick and plus 1360 . Why weren't we playing IMP pairs?

## Free isn't always free

Sometimes you are given something free. But free often isn't really free as Jan Jansma's opponents found out on this deal from the Vanderbilt KO Teams on Monday. (Spots cards are approximate.)

Jansma, a world-class player from the
Netherlands playing with countryman Louk Verhees, won the opening $\uparrow 3$ lead in his hand with the 9 . He could see he needed to ruff a club in dummy to have any chance to make the contract so he led low toward the $\& \mathrm{~K}$. West rose with the ace and returned another spade. Declarer won in hand and led another club to the king on which East played the jack. Declarer now could visualize West with 5-5 in the black suits, so it looked as if his plan to ruff clubs in dummy would not work. West was most likely 2-1 in the red suits. If so, perhaps there was an answer.

At trick five, Jansma led a heart from dummy and ruffed - instead of ruffing with his $\uparrow 2$, however, he ruffed with his $\star$ ! He was happy to see the $\vee$ A fall on his left - the $\vee \mathrm{K} \mathrm{Q}$ were now good - but how could he enjoy them?

Next he played the A , his left-hand opponent, dropping the queen, followed by the $\leqslant \mathrm{J}$ to LHO's king. West exited with a spade which East refused to ruff. If East ruffed, he had nothing but hearts left and would have to lead to dummy's $\vee \mathrm{K}$ Q.

Jansma was not denied, however, as he led the carefully preserved 2 to East's 7 . This was a "free" trick, but nothing's really free. East down to all hearts had to lead one to dummy's $\vee \mathrm{K} \mathrm{Q}$ on which Jansma discarded his two losing clubs. The "free" trick had generated interest and was worth two tricks in return.

Note that it would have done East no good to ruff the third round of spades as he would have been endplayed into leading to the dummy one trick sooner.


Jansma thus made an overtrick in $3 \diamond$ for a score of plus 130. At the other table, the declarer also played $3 \bullet$ but went set one trick for minus 50 . This was worth 5 IMPs for Jansma's team.

## St. Louis NABC A look back

## Clued in

When the opponents are bidding all around you and they have a grand total of 9 high-card points, that's information you can often use to your advantage.

Marinesa Letizia, fresh from her triumph in the Venice Cup in Tunisia, showed that she can read clues as well as anyone on this deal from the Life Master Women's Pairs.

West led the $\$ 3$, taken with dummy's ace. With such weak trumps, Letizia knew she needed some help, so she tried a gambit she had seen before - a low trump away from the A-Q-7. East hopped up with the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$ and returned her singleton heart as West signaled encouragement.

Letizia won the $\vee$ A and played a trump to dummy's ace, noting the fall of the 10 - a sign that trumps were dividing 4-2. It was certain, of course, that East had not started with $\uparrow \mathrm{K} \mathrm{J} 10$.

Because both opponents had bid with almost no values, Letizia deduced that at least one of them was acting because of her shape.

Figuring East for a possible 5-5 or better in the minors, Letizia made the key play at trick five - she called for the $* \mathrm{~J}$ from dummy, letting it ride when East played low.

After this play, the contract made. Letizia lost two spade tricks and a heart. Plus 420 was worth 43 out of 51 matchpoints.

## The absolute top

Marinesa Letizia made 4a on this deal, but Joan Stein did better - she made 3NT with an overtrick.

The opening $\downarrow 6$ lead went to the jack and king, and Stein cashed two top hearts followed by a third heart to East's queen. Of course these heart plays placed quite a discarding burden on West. She didn't want to give up all her good diamonds, so she pitched only one along with one club.

Reading the situation with absolute accuracy, Stein cashed the $\cdot$ A and pushed the jack through West when East dropped the 10 . As a result she took 10 tricks - four clubs, three hearts, two diamonds and a spade.
