Defenses to 1NT



Ask a group of experts about their favorite methods of competing when an opponent opens a strong 1NT (15–17), and you will receive a variety of answers. The Daily Bulletin will feature one method each day during the NABC.

Today's expert is Larry Cohen.

Note: Players should be aware that several of the systems described in this series use Mid-Chart conventions and are not permitted in events that are restricted to the General Convention Chart. The director in charge can provide the information you need.

The system I prefer and have used for more than 25 years is DONT. It was developed by my former partner, Marty Bergen. The system was initially called Bergen over Notrump but Marty also coined the acronym DONT (Disturbing Opponents No Trump), which caught on.

DONT is a simple method for getting into the bidding when an opponent opens 1NT, and it is popular with many players.

I used it with Marty and now with David Berkowitz.

There are variations that have been invented, possibly improvements, but we prefer to keep it simple:

Dbl = one suit

2♣ = clubs plus a higher–ranked suit

2♦ = diamonds and a higher–ranked suit

(a major) 2♥ = hearts and spades

 $2 \blacktriangle = \text{spades}$

2NT = any strong two-suiter

3 level = natural, preemptive

We use this system in the direct seat and in the balancing seat. Typically, the two suits are 5–4 or 4–5 or longer either way.

I like DONT because it allows you to show all one— and two–suited hands without having to bid at the three level. You always find your fit (if you have one) on the two level, which is important for following the law of total tricks.

The method is very effective at matchpoints, letting you get in and disturb, safely, on many hands. The downside is that the system is not great for identifying which of your two suits is the five-carder, so you sometimes miss a major—suit contract, but the goal is to just get in. It also isn't great for game bidding.

I have had enough good results with DONT over the years that I wouldn't consider changing. Some additional points:

• Suit quality and length depend on vulnerability and position. In the balancing seat, a

DONT bidder can have a pretty weak hand.

• We presume there is no game, but if we want to ask, 2NT by advancer (the DONT bidder's partner) asks for more information (minimum, maximum, etc.).

• After a double, showing one suit, if you show spades, it is a good hand (no direct 2♠ overcall).

• After 2♣, partner bids 2♦ to play in the other Continued on page 4

Breed, Zeckhauser are Mixed Pairs champs

Trailing by a substantial margin with a round to go, Mildred Breed and Richard Zeckhauser had a monster last round to overtake the leaders and win the Rockwell Mixed Pairs. Their winning margin on a top of 91 was 2.09 matchpoints.

The runners-up, who scored only 42 out of 182 matchpoints on the final round, were Jane and Bob Teel of Birmingham AL.

Breed, a full-time player from Austin, and

Zeckhauser, an economics professor at Harvard University, play only about once a year, but they did have a second in the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams at the 2003 Summer NABC in Long Beach.

With two rounds to go, Breed and Zeckhauser trailed the Teels by more than a board, and the margin was close to that with two boards to go.

The winners took 76% of the available matchpoints on the final two boards while the Teels scored just 23%.

Breed has multiple North American championships. Zeckhauser and Charles Coon won the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbons Pairs in 1966.

Breed and Zeckhauser got together when he asked Paul Soloway who he should play with, "and Paul said Mildred."

They played what Zeckhauser described as standard Eastern Scientific. "I was petrified something would come up that I would not know about," said Breed, "but nothing did."

Zeckhauser has just published a new book, entitled Targeting in Social Programs: Avoiding Bad Bets, Removing Bad Apples. Such principles, he said, have many applications to bridge.

Bramley foursome takes out Jacobs in Vanderbilt

The four-man team captained by Bart Bramley led from start to finish in a 161-122 defeat of the No. 2 seed in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams. Bramley is playing with Mark Feldman, Martin Fleisher and Mike Kamil. Bramley was originally seeded No. 18.

Matchups in today's round of eight, by captain, are No. 1 Nick Nickell versus No. 8 (25) Piotr Tuszinski; No. 2 (18) Bramley versus Christal Henner-Welland; No. 3 James Cayne versus No. 6 Ron Rubin, and No. 4 Lou Ann O'Rourke versus No. 5 Rose Meltzer.

The Nickell team trailed the Reese Milner squad by 28 at the halfway point but took the third quarter by 60 IMPs to win going away. Cayne trailed Jim Mahaffey 65-37 after two sets but bombed their opponents 97-6 in the third quarter to win in a walk.

Local partnership takes 49er Pairs

Ann Gruver and Sara Fabick put together two solid games to win the National 49er Pairs yesterday. They are from the St. Louis area and began playing together last May.

"We started playing as good partners and now are good friends," said Fabick. "We didn't know each other before we met at party bridge and Ann

Defend with me

You are playing in the first final of the Leventritt Silver Ribbon Pairs when a defensive problem occurs. This was board 12 (deal rotated).

Dummy

◆ A Q 10 7 6

♣ 5 4

You

♠ QJ8653

♥ K 9 3

♣ K Q 10 3

West North East South You1 \spadesuit Pass 3NT All Pass

You lead the ♣K against 3NT. The opponents are playing a weak 1NT opening not vulnerable so you are pretty sure declarer has 15–17 high card–points. Partner plays an encouraging ♣8 and declarer contributes the 2. You continue with the ♣Q partner following with the 7 and declarer the 6.

At this point you picture declarer with a hand something like this:

♦K9 **♥**AJ84 **♦**KJ43 **♣**A62.

You are worried about being endplayed and having to lead from your ♥K, so you lead a third round of clubs, but the ♣10 rather than a low one so you have an entry to partner's hand later. Partner overtakes with the jack and declarer wins the ace, and cashes three rounds of diamonds. You discard three low spades – so far no problem. Declarer now cashes the ♣9 – arrgh. Of course. You see now that if partner originally started with ♣J 9 8 7, he would have signaled with the 9 the first time. Dummy pitches a heart on the club.

New Life Masters

All new Life Masters please report into the Daily Bulletin office to be recognized. Include you and your partner's names and hometowns, the event you were playing in and teammates if that applies. The Daily Bulletin office is located in the Renaissance Hotel on the Mezzanine level in the Parkview Room.

Declarer now cashes the $\bigstar K$, partner playing the 4, and leads a diamond to dummy. You have to discard on this and on the fifth diamond. This is the layout:

You discard a low heart on the fourth round of diamonds. On the fifth diamond you see that if you discard another spade, dummy's 7 will be good, so you grit your teeth and discard another low heart, blanking your king − maybe partner has the ♥J or declarer will misguess.

Declarer now cashes the A and discards a low heart! He leads the Q to his ace, dropping your king – making five. Declarer tricked you in spades and partner could have protected that suit. This was the entire deal:

Clear thinking

What do you take me for, an idiot?

The Fast Open Pairs at 10:30 a.m. is too early for coherent thinking, but our opponents bid well, and then had to play equally on this deal (hands rotated).

West led a club to the king and ace. The ♣9 went to the 10 and queen. Declarer cashed dummy's ★A. What trump should East play? At the table, the ★7 got the job done. Declarer next led to the king and conceded one down.

Is the ♥7 the right play? A lot depends not only on the caliber of East–West but also of North–South – and how they rate each other.

If South believes that East should "automatically" follow with the ♥7 from four to the J–7, then South should definitely play East for length when he produces the ♥7. So East should not play the ♥7 against such opponents. Any spot card but the 7 leaves declarer with a blind guess.

Having said that, I would advocate following with the highest spot cards you can afford in these positions, at least until this article appears in the Daily Bulletin.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS



After playing bridge for several years, I noticed that the really good opponents kept bidding suits I had already bid. When I inquired as to what the

cuebid meant, they would usually grunt something like "forcing." I knew I was headed for another bottom board. I decided that if I couldn't beat 'em I might as well join 'em. After all, they were having a great time bidding my suits!

Let's say you are South and hold AA 10 3 ♥9 4 ◆K 7 3 2 ♣A Q 6 2. The bidding:

West North East South $1 \checkmark$ $2 \diamondsuit$ Pass ?

Your partner has made a two-level overcall and should have close to an opening hand for his bid. Well, you have an opening hand also and a good diamond fit. What are your options?

You have much too much strength to simply bid 3 ♦ (you would make that bid with four low cards in clubs instead of the A–Q). If you jump to indicate your strength and diamond support, you will go right past the most likely game contract. Especially at pairs, when you have a big fit in a minor and enough for game, the best contract is usually 3NT.

So what do you do? You start with a cuebid: 2Ψ . This tells your partner that you have limit—raise values or better and a diamond fit. Partner might feel his hand is not good enough to go to game if all you have is a limit raise, so he might try to sign off in $3 \spadesuit$. If he does, you will try once again with a second cuebid (3Ψ) . Partner will get the message and bid 3NT with a heart stopper. If partner can't stop hearts, you will

probably stop in 4♦. You have a good hand, but probably not enough for partner to make game if all he could bid was 3♦ over your cuebid.

What about this hand? Again, you are South, holding

♦96 **♥**K J 6 **♦**A 7 4 **♣**K J 7 6 2. West North East South 1♣ 1♠ ?

Don't even think about bidding clubs at this point. Clubs are for the golf course. Cuebid 2. That tells partner you have good club support (he could have as few as three clubs) and at least limit—raise values (and, in the absence of a negative double, fewer than four hearts).

If partner has a spade stopper, his most likely action will be to bid 2NT (with at least 14 high—card points and a spade stopper, he will probably bid 3NT). If partner doesn't have spades stopped, you will bid or raise clubs and hope to land on your feet. Minor—suit games require 11 tricks, and if partner has a minimum opening hand, a part score is likely your best spot.

This time you have

♠ A J 10	♥ K 6 2 ♦ .	A J 10 2	♣ J 7 2

There is no need to cuebid this time. Just bid 3NT. You have and opening hand and a double stopper in spades.

Keep in mind that if partner has opened a minor or made a minor–suit overcall, a cuebid of the opponents' suit is usually looking for a stopper for notrump. This all assumes that the opponents bid only one suit. What if they have bid two different suits? You are South, holding ♠9 4 ♥K J 10 ◆A K Q 7 6 3 ♣9 4.

Note that North shows five spades. He would have made a negative double with only four spades. Now the opponents have bid two suits, so partner's 3. bid is showing you a club stopper and wants to hear 3NT if you have the hearts under control. Bid 3NT.

How do you know if a cuebid is asking for a stopper or telling about a stopper?

Remember the Ts – two suits tell.

Opening lead: ♥K.

Bidding commentary: West has an automatic 4♥ opening with eight strong hearts and less than opening—bid values. South, needing so little in partner's hand to make a slam, can do no less than bid 6♠. A 4♠ bid is beyond the pale, even a leap to 5♠ is conservative. After all, South, how often do you expect to ever hold a hand like this? Live it up!

Lead commentary: Normal. Do not try to be a genius when holding an honor sequence.

Play commentary: As South, before playing to the first trick, review the bidding! West has shown a likely eight—card suit, in which case East is void. If the ♥A is played

from dummy, East will probably ruff and you will be at the mercy of the club finesse. Why not duck the opening lead, and if a heart is continued, duck again, ruffing high in the closed hand? Now trumps can be drawn ending in dummy and the AQ pitched on the A

More contracts are lost at the first trick than

any other, so slow down, review the bidding and take a good look at the entire deal before playing to the first trick.

As South, when ruffing with a powerful trump holding (the second heart), avoid ruffing too low. That low trump (the \$42) may be the only way you can get to dummy!

suit.

• After 2♦, partner bid 2♥ to play in the major.

• It is important for your partnership to discuss what happens in competition, for example, if they double the DONT bid.

It is my opinion that penalty doubles of 1NT are not great. It is very hard to defend against 1NT and the double lets the opponents run to 2♣ or 2♦, contracts they can't reach without the penalty double.

That said, we do not use DONT against weak 1NT openings. You do need a penalty double in that situation. Against weak 1NTs we use the following, but have no strong feelings about the best method:

Dbl = Penalty (at least equal strength)

 $2 \blacklozenge =$ one major

2 of major = that major and either minor

IMP Pairs begins today

The four-session IMP Pairs — two qualifying sessions followed by two final sessions — gets underway today with the Lebhar Trophy at stake.

The trophy was donated by Bertram Lebhar Jr. in 1948 in memory of his wife, Evelyn. The trophy was previously given to winners of the Mixed Teams but re-designated for the IMP Pairs by the ACBL Board of Directors.

Lebhar (1907–1972), under the name of Bert Lee, earned a national reputation as a sportscaster and later as a bridge player and administrator. In private life, he owned radio and television stations in Florida.

Lebhar was one of the founders of the Greater New York Bridge Association and was elected its first president in 1948.

Lebhar was also a player: he won the Spingold in 1940 and the Master Mixed Teams in 1946. His team was his wife Evelyn along with Samuel Katz and Alicia Kemper.



Women's Pairs compete for Whitehead Trophy

Play begins today in the Whitehead Women's Pairs with two qualifying sessions, followed by two final sessions tomorrow.

This is the 78th Women's Pairs. At stake is the Whitehead Trophy, donated in 1930 by Wilbur C. Whitehead of New York, a great bridge authority and a member of the team that won the Vanderbilt Cup in 1928, the first year it was in play.

Whitehead (1866–1931) was president of the Simplex Automobile Company, but bridge held such a fascination for him that he retired from business in 1910 to devote his life to bridge.

He was the inventor of many bidding and play conventions, the quick-trick table of card values, the Whitehead system of requirements for original bids and responses and the Whitehead table of preferential leads.

Whitehead was instrumental in standardizing procedures in auction bridge and later in contract bridge.

Facts: The final contract was 3♠ making three for a score of North-South plus 140 after the lead of a low club.

North–South have an agreement that 2♥ is a spade raise. North told the opponents that 2♥ was not natural after 3. East told the director he would not have done anything differently in the auction had 2♥ been Alerted in a timely manner.

Director's Ruling: There was misinformation (MI), but it was corrected prior to the end of the auction. Therefore, any damage is unrelated to the infraction. No adjustment as South's unauthorized information (UI) was judged not to affect the result. (Law 40.C). The director ruled 3♠ making

The Appeal: North–South had agreed to play transfers over $1 \spadesuit$ – double with $2 \heartsuit$ as a constructive raise. North acknowledged at the table that he was initially uncertain whether 2♥ was a spade raise and that he initially failed to Alert the 2♥ bid. After North bid 3♥ and South bid 3. North became certain of the meaning of 2♥; so he Alerted and explained its meaning.

East led a club against 3♠, which resulted in North taking nine tricks. East contended that he would have led a trump if a timely Alert had been given.

Since East–West were fully aware of North-South's agreement before the defense, the director ruled that no adjustment was appropriate.

East-West appealed the ruling. All players except West attended the hearing. East contended that North's uncertainty in the auction had created the possibility that his $3 \vee$ bid was intended as a "heart raise" rather than a game try, which made a trump lead less appealing than otherwise. East said he would have led a trump if given a timely Alert, making it clear that North's 3♥ bid was a game try rather than a raise.

The Decision: The committee considered this contention carefully, and it inquired closely about North-South's agreements regarding the auction including the values shown by the 2♥ bid and the type of game try (help suit) played by North-South.

The committee agreed with the director that there was no basis upon which to adjust the score because East-West had received accurate information about North-South's agreement before play of the hand began. In any case, it did not appear that a heart "game try" would be a substantially different hand type than a heart raise in North-South's methods.

The committee also considered whether South's second round call might have been affected by North's failure to Alert. The committee concluded that at matchpoint scoring, there was no logical alternative to South's 3 \(\text{call}, \) where South had shown "constructive raise" values through his 2♥ bid and had three poor trumps and no heart honor. Therefore, the final result was 3 \(\text{making} \) three for a score of North–South plus 140.

The committee considered whether the appeal had merit. It concluded that, in light of potential language difficulties with this East–West pair, it was reasonable for East-West to bring the matter before a committee to permit a careful examination and analysis of North-South's agreements. Accordingly, the committee declined to issue an appeal without merit warning.

Facts: The contract was 4♠ by West making five after the lead of the ♦Q. East–West scored plus 450.

The director was called at the end of the hand. All the players agreed to the auction and hesitation. North stated that partnership agreement is that 2NT shows strength and 2 \(\infty \) would be a cue-bid. In addition, North stated that an immediate double of a weak 1NT shows 14 or more HCP (any distribution). South stated that 2NT was intended to show the minor suits.

Director's Ruling: The director judged that pass was a logical alternative to bidding 4♦ with the South hand. Two players were polled and they both passed the double in the auction given. The result was adjusted to 3\(\text{\(1\)}\), doubled, making five, East-West plus 730.

The Appeal: North stated that since their

partnership agreement was that 2NT by South in this sequence showed strength, and 3NT by the North hand would be to play, that double would be pass or pull since her partner knew she didn't have 14+ HCP. South stated that she was aware of North's hesitation, but that her 4♦ bid was automatic.

East pointed out that North could have one more spade and an ace and king more than she had and still have fewer than 14 HCP.

The Decision: The committee asked the North-South pair if they had any notes or anything else in writing to support the agreements referred to in their appeal. North stated that the notes were in her room, but not with her. The committee considered the lack of any written notes indicating the North-South agreements, and the fact that in an undefined auction, the hesitation before doubling by North, suggested bidding with the South hand.

Since pass by South was considered a clear cut logical alternative to the action taken, the committee upheld the director's ruling of 3. doubled making five, +730 East–West. This was per Law 16, unauthorized information from break in tempo. The play to take 11 tricks is straightforward and 11 tricks was the result achieved at the table.

An Appeal Without Merit Warning (AWMW) was issued to East-West.

in a row.

Her first big tournament, naturally, is among her most memorable.

It took place in her home town of New York City. It was the summer of 1956, and Greenberg had just graduated from high school. She already knew about bridge from her family, so she and a friend, Stephanie Rosen, made their way to the Biltmore Hotel in New York to check things out.

They ended up kibitzing the legendary Oswald Jacoby for a session. "He couldn't have been more adorable," says Greenberg, noting that Jacoby was so impressed with his two young spectators that he took them to a snack bar in Grand Central Station and bought them orange juice. While they enjoyed their refreshments, Jacoby gave them the lowdown on tournament bridge.

"We were both infatuated," Greenberg says. They immediately began planning to head for Pittsburgh, site of the next Summer NABC. Their parents didn't like the idea of two young girls going so far away on their own, so Greenberg and her friend asked Harry and Ruth Fishbein if they could go with them.

It wasn't until later that Greenberg met her first husband, Steve Shane, at Columbia University Law School and started to improve significantly as a player.

In 1965, she started playing with Mike Moss "and that was when the curtain lifted and things fell into place."

She had started the streak in 1966 when she and Moss, who she later married, went to the 1967 Summer NABC in Montreal to enter the Mixed Board–a–Match Teams (known at the time as the Master Mixed Teams). They played with Mike and Kathie Cappelletti, and their victory was Greenberg's first North American championship.

"I was so nervous," she recalls, "but I played well."

That was the first of more than a dozen North American championships Greenberg has collected to go along with five world titles.

Many of her wins have come with Jacqui Mitchell.

Although Greenberg has never missed an NABC, she has been late on occasion, and two of them have been memorable.

In 1971, she was due in Atlanta to play in the Women's Pairs with Mitchell but a 24–hour virus made it impossible for her make it on time, so Mitchell recruited Amalya Kearse to fill in. They won.

In 1984, Greenberg was again scheduled to play with Mitchell in the Women's Pairs in San Antonio, but bad weather kept her airplane on the ground in New York City, so she missed the game. Fill-in Judy Tucker and Mitchell won the event.

Through the streak, Greenberg has visited 52 different cities, some multiple times. She has played in Chicago six times, and Atlanta and Las Vegas five times each.

She says she always felt that she had an advantage in Las Vegas because she doesn't gamble and always had plenty of rest for the bridge games, unlike some of her competitors who stayed up late playing games other than bridge.

Red Ribbon Pairs begins today

The Red Ribbon Pairs, an ACBL event with national rating open to players with fewer than 2000 masterpoints, gets underway today.

Players earn qualification by placing first or second overall in regionally rated events of at least Flight B status. Neither member of a qualifying pair may hold more than 2000 masterpoints at the time of qualification.

The four–session event began in 1986 and winners have their names inscribed on the Percy X. Bean Trophy.

Bean Trophy

The trophy was designated by the ACBL Board of Directors in 1996 to honor Bean, ACBL president in 1972 and chairman of the Board in 1973.

Bean (1916–1992) represented District 19 on the Board from 1964 until 1988 and served as president of the ACBL Charity Foundation from 1974 until 1981. He was a member of the National Goodwill Committee and the National Board of Governors and general chairman of arrangements for the World Team Olympiad in Seattle in 1984.

Bean and his wife, Anne, were named *ACBL Honorary Members* for 1992, the first time that honor was bestowed on a husband–wife combination.

Bean was the editor of *Mad, Mad World of Bridge*, a publication that strongly championed players of less than expert class.

As for changes since she started her streak, Greenberg says it's no contest. "By far the biggest change," she says, "has been in the bidding."

These days, Greenberg spends her time helping to run two bridge clubs, Honors in New York City and the Hartes Club in Westchester, which she operates with her sister, Alisan Harte. Greenberg's maiden name is Harte.

She also teaches nine bridge classes a week and plays with some of her students.

Greenberg enjoys watching two of her children – Jill Levin and Brad Moss – play. Both are stars of the game who proved to their mother that they could get an education and learn the game at the same time (she didn't want them to play bridge until they were out of school). Son Andrew plays but not as much as the other two. Daughter Penny is the only non–bridge player among Greenberg's children.

Greenberg has no plans to end the streak any

time soon. As long as the ACBL keeps putting on NABCs, she will be there, fighting for matchpoints and IMPs. It's just her nature, she says: "I'm a highly competitive person."





Convention card reminder

- Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.
- Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play



only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6–board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Too fast in the Fast Pairs? By Barry Rigal

When the leaders in the Fast Open Pairs on Wednesday met the second–place pair, the eventual fate of the 4♥ contract would determine the winners of the event.

Consider it as a single-dummy problem.

As game contracts on the minority of high–card points go, this is a pretty fair one.

You ruff the lead of the \bigstar K, play a club to the jack and ace, ruff the next diamond, then lead a low heart to the ace and a heart back to the king, West producing the \bigstar 8, then the queen.

Now everyone follows to the **&**K, West follows to the **&**Q, East pitching a diamond, and on the fourth club, won in dummy, East and West discard diamonds. This is the position:

♣ Q 5 4
♦ 10
♦ 10
♣ ♠ A 9 7 2
♥ 9
♦ ♣ -

What's going on? West appears to have either 3=3=4=3 or 4=2=4=3 shape and to have stayed silent throughout. East backed into a live auction with six diamonds to the A–J and the *A. Is there any inference as to who has the *K?

The point is that if West has either pattern you suspect, you must ruff a diamond before playing the ♠A and another spade. But if he has the 4=2=4=3 pattern and not the ♠K, the winning line is to duck a spade at once. West wins, and whether he gets out with a spade or a diamond, the ♠A drops the king and you lose only a trump trick.

At the table, declarer ruffed a diamond and played the A and a spade, and East claimed the last three tricks.

Perhaps a clue to the right line is that West might have split his honors if he held three hearts to the Q–J when you played on trumps. If East can be assumed to hold the ♥J, the winning line is not so unreasonable. East's "pre–balance" with a 10–point hand is possible, but slightly less likely than his actual hand. The full deal:

Ear to the ground

Barry Harper of Regina SK is one of the celebrity speakers for Intermediate/Newcomer players. He is scheduled to discuss opening leads on Saturday at 12:15 p.m.

On this deal, he showed why that's a good topic for him.


Harper held

The opponents were young stars Jenny Wolpert and Kent Mignocchi, who had this auction, leaving Harper on lead.

The key is always to analyze the bidding. Looking at a good spade holding in declarer's second suit, a trump lead seems obvious, but Harper was concerned about side winners. Because of the 3♦ bid, he decided any side winners for his side were in hearts, so he started with the ♥K. It held, and he shifted to a trump at that point. This was the full deal:



After the trump switch, declarer could still have made the contract, but Wolpert took the percentage play of finessing a spade at trick three. That allowed Harper to play another trump and the contract could not be made.

On a trump lead, declarer will win in hand, unblock the $\bigstar K$, cash the $\bigstar A$ and ruff a spade, discard the $\blacktriangledown Q$ on the $\bigstar A$. When the $\bigstar K$ falls on the third round of spades, declarer will have 12 tricks.

Your chance to play in a world championship

For most world championships, it is necessary to qualify. This fall, at the World Bridge Championships in Shanghai, China, you can play in the 6th World Transnational Open Teams without playing in a team trial.


The event is open to players nominated by their national bridge organizations - the ACBL for most players reading this. There are no quotas. Each NBO may nominate as many players as they wish. Teams may be made up of players from different countries.

The Transnational Open Teams begins on Oct. 8 and runs through Oct. 13.

The format will be Swiss teams, usually played in 10-board matches for 15 qualifying rounds, with a quarterfinal knockout round starting Oct. 11, semifinals on Oct. 12 and the final on Oct. 13.

The world championships begin Sept. 29 and continue through Oct. 13.

NABC Diary



Easy come . . . or something like that

Never accuse Ken Monzingo of not having a sense of humor.

In the first qualifying

session of the Rockwell Mixed Pairs, he and partner Bonnie Bagley played the first set of boards, then passed them to the next table. They played round two, then passed the boards . . . or so they thought.

After round three, a tournament director approached their table and told them they had played the same boards on rounds two and three.

"That's not possible," said Monzingo, looking at his private score, which showed four different contracts, four different declarers and four different scores for the two rounds.

Monzingo, of San Diego, and Bagley, of Colorado Springs CO, have about 15,000 masterpoints between them, yet they had managed to play the same two boards twice without noticing.

Of course, two of the scores had to go.
"The worst thing," he said, "is that they threw
out our two best boards."

A zloty for your thoughts

Shawn Quinn, a familiar face at NABCs and other ACBL tournaments for many years, hasn't been seen much in the U.S. since mid-December of last year. Her husband, Joe, is on a work assignment in Poland, and the two have been enjoying life in Eastern Europe since then.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bidding boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word – such as "transfer" – and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.
