

# **Carteaux wins Senior KO;** Adams, Childs now Grand LMs

For the second day in a row, the team captained by Robert Carteaux dug themselves a hole by falling behind early in the Senior Knockout Teams. Also for the second day in a row, the Carteaux team was awesome in the final quarter, blasting their opponents, 59-11, to win handily.

The fourth quarter surge lifted the Carteaux squad to a 132-106 win over the team captained by Mike Levine.

The victory made Grand Life Masters of two members of the Carteaux squad. Bridge pro David

Adams of Marietta GA and Al Childs of Little Rock each have well over the required 10,000 masterpoints, but they needed a win in a North American championship to earn the Grand Life Master designation.

Other team members were Carteaux, a retired businessman from Fort Wayne IN; bridge pro Chuck Said of Nashville, and Ralph Cohen, former chief executive of the ACBL.

They defeated Levine and Zeke Jabbour of Boca Raton FL; Russ Arnold, Miami; Arnie Fisher, Clementon NJ; Jim Linhart, Piscataway NJ and P.O. Sundelin, Stockholm, Sweden. Jabbour and Arnold had their winning streak in the event ended -- the two had won all three previous Senior KOs.

The Levine team dedicated their efforts to Rita Rand, who was to have been a member of the team

# Falk, Wildavsky score victory in **Blue Ribbon Pairs**

Adam Wildavsky and Allan Falk took the lead after the first final session then survived a rocky first round to earn a close victory in the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Their final score of 789.13 put them just ahead of Geir Helgemo of Norway and Tony Forrester of Great Britain, who posted their fifth secondplace finish in a major ACBL pair event. Chip Martel and Robert Levin were third.

Although they were leading after the first final session, Falk and Wildavsky were pretty sure they had dropped out of first after their first round. It turned out that they had scored only 7 out of 50 matchpoints on the round, but they ignored the results and maintained their focus on the goal of taking as many tricks as they could for the final 24 boards.

It worked like a charm, and Wildavsky credits the use of what he calls the Keller convention (named in honor of Helen Keller, who was deaf and blind). The main feature of the Keller convention, said Wildavsky, is the rule that partners don't discuss hands during the session.

"I've won more matchpoints and IMPs with Keller than any other convention I use," said Wildavsky, who won the Blue Ribbon for the second time. His other win came five years ago in partnership with Haig Tchamitch at the Orlando NABC

Falk, of Okemos MI, has won two previous North American titles -- both Open Pairs events

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# P.O.'s postscript on directors

P.O. Sundelin, the Swedish star who is a regular at NABCs, saw the article in Thursday's Daily Bulletin about the national directors working the St. Louis tournament, and he wanted to offer his own view.

Sundelin, who has played all over the globe, said he considers the standard among all ACBL directors -- not just those with national rank -to be the highest in the world.

"Your directors," Sundelin said, "are truly professionals."

He said ACBL directors are particularly good at handling difficult players. "Whenever I hear them dealing with people at the table," he said, "no matter how unpleasant they are or how upset they are, your directors have a great way of handling them. Your standard is remarkably high.

One more addition to the national directors' story: the late Ray Oakley should have been on the list of inactive or former national directors. Tom Quinlan remembered that whenever Oakley was running a tournament, he always started the game with this message for the players: "Blue skies and green lights to you all."

# Learning the whole hand from the opening lead

After the bidding and the opening lead on this Blue Ribbon Pairs hand from the second qualifying session, Peter Weichsel was able to tell a kibitzer just what his left-hand opponent held.

Kyle Larsen, North, led the  $\bigstar$ 10, and Weichsel turned to his kibitzer and told him, "Declarer has 4-2-0-7, he doesn't have the  $\bigstar$ 9 and he doesn't have either red ace." Then he played LOW and allowed the  $\bigstar$ J to win. His aim was to hold declarer to 11 tricks even if he took the successful trump finesse -- but he thought the odds were against declarer's finessing in clubs.

Once Weichsel played low on the first trick, declarer of course could make five. Go to the board with the  $\forall A$ , discard a heart on the  $\diamond A$ , take the successful finesse in trumps, and the  $\diamond 8$  would be promoted on power because of the doubleton 10-9 in the North hand.

But Weichsel was right -- declarer didn't take the club finesse for fear of a spade ruff. Instead he cashed the ace and led a second club to Weichsel's king. Since he couldn't do anything about it anyway, he returned a diamond, declarer discarding a heart as he won with the ace in dummy.

But now Weichsel's low play at trick one paid off because Larsen's 9 was of equal value with the king and queen. As a result, declarer had to lose two spade tricks, making only four, which was a good score for Weichsel and Larsen.

North-South are not due to make more than nine tricks in 3NT on the lead of either minor, and 4♥ has no play. But 4♠, the contract at our table, was quite promising.

On the lead of the  $\diamond 10$  my partner played the  $\diamond J$  to the queen, and Judy won to shift to the  $\forall 9$ . When declarer inserted the 10, Gail Greenberg took her  $\forall Q$ , and down went declarer.

Should declarer get the position right? I think the argument is that if the  $\Psi$ Q is right,  $4\Psi$  may be making, so putting up the king is a big position. As against that, shifting to a heart from Q-9-(x) is a big play.

The contract of  $2 \checkmark$  doubled and redoubled usually yields either a top or a bottom, and so it proved on this deal from the first session of the Blue Ribbon qualifying. Surprisingly, there were two tables (maybe more) which ended in this strange spot on the following auction: West North East South

When my partner was declarer against Kay Schulle and John Mohan, the defense led the  $\Psi K$ . My partner won this, finessed in diamonds and led a spade to the jack and queen. Back came a diamond and the  $\bigstar$ 10 went to the ace. A second trump from Mohan left the defense in control, and they actually emerged with plus 600 for 63 out of 64 matchpoints.

When Tony Forrester was declarer, he got the same excellent opening lead of the  $\mathbf{V}K$ . He won this to take the diamond finesse and advance the  $\mathbf{A}$ 10. When the defense ducked (an understandable error) he was able to run this to the queen. Back came a diamond, and he finessed to play a second spade. East won the ace and played the  $\mathbf{V}J$ , which held the trick. Next came a third spade and Forrester took the king, cashed the  $\mathbf{V}Q$  and led the  $\mathbf{A}J$ , ruffed by East, who was now endplayed in this three-card ending:

The point is that if East had a diamond to lead, the suit would be splitting. East is marked with the A from West's failure to double  $1 \forall$  on the first round of bidding.

Wildavsky said he owed two thank-yous for his win in the Blue Ribbon -- one to his sweetheart Ann Raymond "for letting me play bridge on Thanksgiving" and a "very belated" one to his favorite partner, Gerry Seixas, for "fixing me up with Haig in Orlando."

## Smooth operator

When it comes to major pairs events, David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen are probably the top twosome over the past two or three years. In the Blue Ribbon Pairs, they were first in Atlanta in 1995 and second in San Francisco in 1996. One good reason for their success is Cohen's outstanding card play. This deal from the first semifinal session of the Blue Ribbon is a case in point.

With no ruffing value in either hand, Berkowitz and Cohen did well to play game in notrump rather than their 4-4 spade fit.

East led the \$3, which Cohen took with the 8. With the finesse working, the spade suit provided four tricks. As Cohen ran the spades, West discarded two low hearts. East one club.

Reading the cards perfectly, Cohen took the heart finesse through West. On the third heart trick, East had to find a discard, and whatever he did was going to be wrong.

If East pitched a club, reducing his holding to two cards, Cohen could cash the A and get out with a club, forcing East to break the diamond suit. As long as Cohen played for the diamond honors to split, which he was going to do, he could play the suit for no losers.

If East discarded a low diamond. Cohen could handle that, too, by simply playing a diamond to the king and ducking on the way back. East, winning the  $\mathbf{A}Q$  perforce, would then be forced to lead away from the &K for Cohen's 11th trick.

In practice, East did discard a diamond and Cohen played it just right. Plus 460 was good for 58 out of 64 matchpoints.

# **Wool puller**

Hugh Ross made a sneaky play that worked out well for him on this deal from the first semifinal session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, Ross was playing with Peter Nagy.

West led the \$3, which Ross read as low from a three-card holding. Taking the small risk that East had been dealt &A K 8. Ross played low from dummy. East, convinced that Ross held the \$8, thought for a while before finally playing the king. When Ross did not follow with the \$8, East thought his partner had led a singleton club, so he banged down the ace.

Ross ruffed and played his top three trumps. On the third round, West discarded the v8. Ross got out of his hand with his singleton heart, and West rose with the ace. At that point, he had no good card to play. A heart return would put Ross in dummy with all those good club tricks, so West got out with the  $\blacklozenge 9$ . Ross put up the  $\blacklozenge K$ from dummy, and the defenders were helpless. Ross let the diamond return run to the 8 in dummy and he claimed for plus 420.

But what if East had figured out what was going on and put in the \$7 at trick one? Said Ross: "I don't even want to think about it."

# Top performer to win Lou Herman Trophy

The player with the best overall individual performance record at this Fall NABC will win the Lou Herman Trophy.

The trophy was donated in 1951 by Sally Lipton, formerly Mrs. Lou Herman, in memory of her husband. Lou Herman (1908-1950) was a Houston jeweler who lived in New York at one time.

Mrs. Lipton was a member of the ACBL office staff in New York and an ACBL tournament director.

The record performance for the Herman Trophy was set by Michael Rosenberg, who won 445.77 points -- all in nationally ranked events -- at the Fall NABC

in San Francisco last year. Zia won 412.75 points at the same tournament and

was second. Jeff Meckstroth was the first player to score 400

or more points at an NABC, racking up 407.77 points at the 1995 Fall NABC in Atlanta. That record lasted only one year. Early winners of the Lou Herman Trophy were:

# Hammamet Hubbub: Appeal in Tunisia

Although the auction was not reported, the final contract was four spades by South down three, minus 150 for N/S.

The Facts: The Director was called to the table after the play. Declarer won the opening diamond lead in hand, led the heart five to East's eight, ruffed the heart return low (noting the fall of West's ace), thought for several minutes and then led a club toward dummy's king-jack. West, who had his cards in his lap, raised them to eye level and took a moment to locate the club three. As he withdrew the card from his hand he said, "I'm sorry." Declarer, who had intended to play the king from dummy, was convinced by the apology that West must not have the ace. (Why would he apologize for thinking if he had something to think about whether to win the trick?) Declarer therefore played the club jack and went down three, minus 150 for N/S.

While this table had been on Vugraph at the time of the incident, none of the commentators had noticed West fumble. The Director ruled under Law 73D1 that there had been an inadvertent variation of tempo from which declarer drew conclusions at his own risk; the table result was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. While denying any suggestion that West's intent had been to deceive. South said that, in his view, one apologized in these situations in order to protect the opponents - not merely because of a fumble. Therefore, the apology had affected his understanding of the reason for the fumble. West stated that he had not meant to play out of tempo, but that there had been a mechanical problem for which he apologized. As there had been numerous helpful exchanges between the players during the match, he just wished that South had inquired about the apology, so that he could have explained that he was just fumbling for the club three. West's team captain observed that this was a momentary lapse on the tenth day of the Championships by a player somewhat fatigued and whose mind was wandering. North then stated that it was a difficult defensive hand and West might not have been quite clear in his mind what was the correct defense. (In fact, he should have risen with the club ace and given his partner a diamond ruff.) While there could be no suggestion of malice on West's part, players do their best to win for their side, deliberately or not. It was clear that South's correct play of the club king had, however inadvertently, been jostled by the apology.

The Committee's Decision: During the deliberations the Chief Director was asked several times to expound on the effects of, and the differences between, Laws 73D1 (a player may take an infer-

ence from his opponents' manner and/or tempo of bidding or play at his own risk) and 73F2 (if an innocent player is deceived by the manner or tempo of bidding or play by an opponent who could have known at the time that his action could work to his benefit, the Director shall award an adjusted score). The Committee agreed that West's apology itself confirmed that there had been a fumble, but that, under pressure to play promptly, West would not have had time to appreciate the possible implications for declarer of his apology. It was also determined that, according to E/W's signaling methods, East's return of a small heart at trick three indicated a desire for a diamond ruff. On the other hand, the combination of the fumble and the apology did confuse South. West's own testimony suggested he had no bridge reason for the fumble, making Law 73F2 applicable. The Committee concurred with South's (unchallenged) assertion that he would have made his contract had he played the club king, but as a matter of equity they also believed that South was not entitled to the full score for four spades making. The Committee decided to adjust the score under Law 73F2, but to invoke Law 12C3 (allowed in international competition, but not in the ACBL) to restore equity. N/S were assigned seventy five percent of the score for four spades made four, plus 420, and twenty five percent of the score for four spades down three, minus 150. The Committee also requested some guidance from Laws experts on situations in which an apology (or no apology) for a breach of tempo would be desirable.

#### The Controversy

This case sparked a controversy over the interplay between two provisions of Law 73, one (73D1) which states that players choosing to act on an opponent's variation in tempo or manner normally do so at their own risk and the other (73F2) which states that, if there is no demonstrable bridge reason for a variation, and if the player could have known at the time that it could work to his benefit, an adjusted score should be awarded. The question is, which provision should apply in these circumstances?

While there are honest differences of opinion over this issue among law framers, law enforcers, and students of the law alike, my own view is that the player taking the inference should act as though he is doing so at his own risk (expecting to keep his score), while the player who varies his manner or tempo should expect to be held accountable for his action and not be surprised to have his score adjusted whenever he cannot demonstrate a legitimate bridge reason for it and it is judged that he could have known at the time that it could work to his advantage. It is then up to a Director or Appeals Committee to evaluate each situation independently, to determine which of the provisions (or possibly both) applies. Of course West's remark should be treated just like any other variation, since it is an extraneous act which might influence declarer's play.

But here declarer's three-minute study before playing to trick four almost certainly contributed to West's inattentiveness, making him (declarer) a contributor to the problem. He then chose to attach bridge meaning to West's remark when you or I might have interpreted it as just the opposite

— that the fumble had nothing to do with bridge and had no implication for West's card holding. In addition, while there was a possible bridge reason for West's fumble (he could have been thinking about playing the club ace), and although his remark could have concealed that from declarer, the Committee found that there was not sufficient time for West to appreciate these implications of his remark for declarer.

What this all suggests to me is that declarer should have been held accountable for his own actions, and N/S assigned the result which occurred at the table, just as the Director ruled. Similarly, E/ W should have kept their score. If, however, it had been determined that West could have known the effect which his remark could have on declarer, then E/W's score could have been adjusted to minus 420.

#### Wolff's Problem (and Solution):

What approach should be taken to the general problem of players making extraneous comments at the table? Clearly, if West had said nothing declarer would have been on his own, living or dying with the result of his decision. Bobby Wolff, many time World and National Champion and member of USA II, thinks that all such comments are improper and should be eliminated from the (high level) game. He favors automatic score adjustments for extraneous remarks at the table if they result in a problem for an opponent (and maybe even if they don't).

This approach has several drawbacks. For one, it would create an undesirable antisocial atmosphere at the table. (Bobby proposes that it apply only to "major" events, including World Championships and the later rounds of major NABC+ events.) Players would no longer be at liberty to be polite, or cordial, during the play of a board. If a player inadvertently bumped the table, fumbled with a card, or committed some other inadvertent act he would be forced to either ignore the effect of his action on the other players or risk being placed in jeopardy for his remark.

Another drawback is that, once a remark slips out (as it might for many of us) it would create a host of "double-shot" scenarios for an opponent who wished to take advantage of the situation. This would be even worse at knockout scoring, where any score adjustment, even to only one side, necessarily accrues (in part) to the opponents.

A third problem is that a player who hesitates inadvertently would be forced to make a decision whether to "excuse" his action. Failure to say anything could place his side in jeopardy for misleading the opponents if there was truly nothing to hesitate about, especially if he "could have known at the time . . . ." But equally unfortunately, saying something would create a prejudicial situation against him. In addition, it might not be possible to make this decision quickly enough before the next hand played. This would result in the same predicament as saying nothing. And what if a player gives the outward appearance of wanting to excuse his fumble, but doesn't actually say anything? Does that count as a remark? You betcha!

Wolff says that "fumbling carries a price, and that's as it should be." You lose if you fumble, you lose if you say "Sorry," you lose if you blurt out "Umph" as you catch yourself, and you even lose if you simply grimace. Is this how you want to play bridge?

We need to recognize and accord a place to the social aspects of the game, even at the highest levels. Players are responsible if they contravene the laws, but reason and judgment must be applied in addressing each incident within the context in which it occurs. Wolff is concerned that Committees are not equipped to handle such incidents in a prudent and consistent manner. He wants strict laws, applied in a uniform manner, to remove any judgment factor from Directors and Appeals Committees alike. Is this bridge in the twenty-first century? What do you think?

## Active Ethics

Claire Tornay and Barbara Sartorius gained a point on a score revision in the qualifying round of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, but that turned out to be not quite enough.

They qualified easily for the Blue Ribbon final -- until they noticed that they had been credited with a score that really had been earned by their opponents. They went to the director and reported the mistake. Suddenly they had 29.5 on the board instead of 60 -- and they missed qualifying by 83 hundredths of a matchpoint.

# **Nickell team seeking new Reisinger streak**

The Nick Nickell team, eliminated in the semifinals last year after three consecutive victories in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, will be looking to start another streak here at the Fall NABC in St. Louis.

Nickell & Co. (Nickell, New York; Richard Freeman, Atlanta; Jeff Meckstroth, Tampa; Eric Rodwell, Naperville IL, and Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff, Dallas) won Reisinger titles at the Fall NABC in Seattle in 1993, in Minneapolis in 1994 and in Atlanta in 1995.

Along the way, the team -- with non-playing captain Edgar Kaplan -- won the Bermuda Bowl in Beijing, China, in 1995.

"Both our streaks (the team also won four Spingolds in a row) are over," noted Wolff, "and we can't have that. We'll just have to play better."

#### History of the Reisinger

The event is contested for the Reisinger Trophy (the Chicago Trophy until 1965). It is a sixsession open team-of-four event scored by boarda-match with two qualifying sessions, two semifinal sessions and two final sessions. It was contested as a four-session championship until 1966.

The event began in 1929 as the North American Open Team Championship and the prize was the Chicago Trophy, donated by the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago. (In 1928, the open team competition was for the Harold S. Vanderbilt Cup.)

The Chicago Trophy was replaced in 1965 by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy, donated by the Greater New York Bridge Association in memory of Curt H. Reisinger.

Reisinger (1891-1964), of New York City, was a principal patron of contract bridge and the American Contract Bridge League in the early years of both.

Reisinger was a great-grandson of Anheuser and a grandson of Busch, co-founders of the brewery from which he inherited great wealth. That wealth enabled him to become a stalwart financial supporter of the game, as well as a noted philanthropist on a far larger scale.

In the years when there was often a struggle to meet the League's modest payroll, Reisinger was often called upon and never failed to help with a loan or an outright gift. His support made possible several early contract bridge tournaments, clubs and books.

Among the positions in which he served were director of the United States Bridge Association, president of the Greater New York Bridge Association and chairman of the ACBL. In 1953, Reisinger was named ACBL *Honorary Member*.

#### Looking back

• The only all-women's team to win the Reisinger -- or any other major open team event -- was Sally Young, Jane Jaeger, Paula Ribner and Kay Rhodes.

They tied in 1947 with John Crawford, Ted Lightner, George Rapee and Sam Stayman; and Robert Appleyard, Simon Rossant, Morris Berliant and M.A. Lightman.

Young, Life Master #17, was the first woman to earn Life Master rank. Among her successes were three additional wins in the Reisinger, seven wins in the Women's Teams, four wins in the Women's Pairs, five wins in the Mixed Teams and one win each in the Fall Open Pairs and Fall Mixed Pairs. She died in 1970.

Ribner and Jaeger, both now living in Florida, are Gold Life Masters who remain active players. Jaeger was a member of the winning squad in the Grand National Teams in 1973, its inaugural year.

Jaeger and husband Lewis were the first married couple to attain Life Master rank -- #74 and #94, respectively -- and Lewis was a member of the winning Reisinger team in 1934. Together, they were second in the Vanderbilt in 1956.

Jaeger recalls that the 1947 Reisinger was "pretty close, as I remember. We were on pins and needles for a while."

Ribner remembers that the four "were all very good friends. We all played with each other."

Rhodes, a Silver Life Master who died in 1996, recalled in a 1995 interview that the three-way tie

"had us all checking our scores, trying to find a win."

• Fifty-one years ago, at the Fall NABC in Hollywood FL, Edith Freilich became the 13th woman to win the Reisinger. Her teammates were Mitch Barnes, John Crawford and Al Roth.

Freilich and Roth repeated their victory in 1952. This time, their teammates were Harold Harkavy and Tobias Stone.

• The history of the Reisinger is dotted with back-to-back wins but only the Nickell squad has the three- and four-peat. The team of John Crawford, Charles Goren, Charles Solomon and Sally Young won in 1937 and 1938 -- the same squad, plus B.J. Becker, also won in 1939.

• Oswald Jacoby won his first Reisinger in 1955, playing on a team with his son Jim -- the only father-son combination to win the event.

• Jacoby's second Reisinger win came in 1983 when he was invited to join the team of Edgar Kaplan, Norman Kay, Richard Pavlicek and Bill Root.

Jacoby was battling cancer but he was a vital part of the team effort that won the Reisinger.

On this deal, Jacoby was plus 450 at his table while Pavlicek-Root scored plus 100 at the other table. Pavlicek doubled 4 and they beat the contract one trick.

Jacoby played 4 undoubled and made five without any warning about the trump suit.

The opening diamond lead went to dummy's ace, and Jacoby played a heart to the king and ace. East thought it was a good idea to underlead his A. It wasn't.

Jacoby put up the  $\clubsuit K$ , then cashed the  $\blacktriangledown Q$ -J to pitch his last club. Then he ruffed a club and ruffed a diamond, ruffed another club and ruffed another diamond.

Next he led the fourth heart from dummy and when his right-hand-opponent followed, he ruffed with the  $\diamond$ 9, overruffed with the jack.

East led a trump (perforce) and Jacoby was down to the  $\bigstar K$  8 in his hand and the  $\bigstar A$  10 in dummy. He won the 10 and had a high crossruff with the ace and king, East futilely underruffing at the end.

 John Crawford holds the record for most Reisinger wins with 10. His victories spanned four decades: 1937, 1938, 1939, 1942, 1946, 1947, 1953, 1954, 1956 and 1961.

• Helen Sobel and Sally Young share the record for most Reisinger wins by women with four.

Sobel was the last woman to win the Reisinger
 her victory came in 1957.

• A multi-national team won in 1987. Team members included Zia, Jaggy Shivdasani, Billy Cohen and Ron Smith.

Said Zia: "The best thing about this was that we had a black (Smith), a Jew (Cohen, who is a Canadian citizen), an Indian (Shivdasani) and a Pakistani (Zia) playing together." Zia is a Muslim and Shivdasani is a Hindu.

"It's good to show how bridge can bring together people from such different backgrounds," he added. "It just shows a special magic about the game of bridge."

• A multi-national team won again in 1989. Zia was on the team which included Sam Lev, Israel; Michael Rosenberg, U.S. but formerly of Scotland; Chris Compton, U.S., and Mark Molson, Canada.

 Molson scored a rare double at the Fall NABC in Lancaster PA that year. He took top honors in the two premier events of the tournament -- the Reisinger and the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

The record margin of victory in the Reisinger
 10 full boards -- was set in 1966 by Kaplan,
 Kay, Robert Jordan and Arthur Robinson.

• A handful of ACBL presidents and members of the board of directors have won the Reisinger: Charles Solomon, Jeff Glick, Waldemar von Zedtwitz, Bobby Wolff, Lew Mathe, Peter Leventritt, John Gerber, Ira Corn, Don Oakie and Edgar Kaplan.







The win for Carteaux, who recently retired from the wholesale electronics business, was his first North American championship. He is active in District 8 and Unit 154 politics and has been tournament chairman for northern Indiana regionals for seven years

Carteaux, who bowled professionally in the Fifties and Sixties, has played bridge for about 12 years and not long ago topped 5000 masterpoints. Adams plays bridge for a living from his base

in the Atlanta area. He has more than 19,000 masterpoints.

Childs pointed out that his Senior KO win was actually his second national title -- the first was in an intercollegiate dairy cow judging contest. Childs has a degree in animal husbandry specializing in dairy cows, but says he is "allergic to too many things on a farm to be a farmer." He runs a glass business in Little Rock and also raises English springer spaniels.

Cohen and Said, who played together, each won his third North American title. Cohen and Renee Mancuso won the IMP Pairs at the Summer NABC in Boston in 1990. In 1995, the native of Canada reunited with some old friends from Montreal to win the Open Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Phoenix.

Said racked up his second win in the Senior KO. His first was in the inaugural event at the 1994 Fall NABC in Minneapolis, Jabbour and Arnold were his teammates then.

Said and John Russell won the Silver Ribbon Pairs at the Spring NABC in Dallas earlier this year.

As they did the previous day, the Carteaux quintet fell behind early, trailing by 10 IMPs after the first quarter. Levine and company picked up another 13 IMPs in the second quarter to lead at the half, 68-45. Carteaux cut the margin by only 1 IMP in the third quarter and was down 95-73 with 16 boards to go.

The #1 seed was too strong for their opponents in the final quarter, however, giving up only 1 IMP over the first 15 boards while scoring 59 themselves. The only major swing occurred on the final board, when the winners were firmly in control.

The Facts: 7NT made seven, plus 2220 for E/W. Both the 4v and 6NT bids were made after agreed lengthy breaks in tempo. The Director was called after the 7NT bid. At the end of the auction West explained that 4 had been Blackwood and 5 howed one ace. West stated that the entire auction had been slow. The Director ruled that pass over 6NT was a logical alternative and changed the contract to 6NT made seven, plus 1470 for E/W

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. E/ W were a new partnership that had been formed that morning. East stated he was not sure that 4 & was Blackwood but he did know that 5 & would be taken as either one ace, or a cuebid that showed the &A. East knew he was on shaky ground as to exact meanings of agreements in high level auctions but that either interpretation his partner chose would match his hand. West chose to bid 6NT because he was unsure of the meanings of other bids over 5.4. East bid 7NT because aside from the A he had already shown, he had two kings that had not in any way been disclosed in the auction.

The Committee Decision: The Committee discussion focused on whether Blackwood followed by slam meant partner could not bid more. Eventually this line was abandoned because the Committee concluded that 4 was not clearly Blackwood and therefore the partnership was not involved in a final decision over the Blackwood auction. The Committee decided that a slow 6NT bid did not convey any different information from a fast 6NT bid. The Committee decided to allow the 7NT bid and changed the contract to 7NT made seven, plus 2220.

The Facts: 6 made six, plus 980 for N/S. North's 3 bid was not Alerted. After the auction and before the opening lead, North announced that there had been a failure to Alert and that 3 \$ showed a singleton. East called the Director and stated she would have doubled 3 + had the bid been Alerted. East also said that she played the same methods as North (that 3 + was a splinter in support of clubs) but did not want to ask at the time and clear up a misunderstanding. The Director ruled that there was no misinformation because East was aware of the possible meaning of the 3 bid. The table result was therefore allowed to stand.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East, West and South attended the hearing. East stated that after the hand was played North said she would not have bid 6 if the 3 been doubled. East wanted the Committee to consider the possibilities that if 3♦ had been Alerted and doubled that (1) the final contract of 6 may not have been reached; and (2) West may have doubled the final contract for a diamond lead. The Committee inquired about E/W's agreements regarding lead-directing slam doubles and found that they had none. East also stated that the Director told her that she should have called him at the time of the 3 • bid, but that she did not want to for fear of disclosing a misunderstanding. South stated that she did not Alert 3 because she didn't think they played splinters over minors; she bid 3NT because she believed her partner had diamonds. Although both were experienced players, N/S had not played together for seven years.

The Committee Decision: The Committee found that N/S had no agreement that  $3 \blacklozenge$  was a splinter and that there was no violation of procedure. North and South had both bid according to what they thought their agreement was, and North had appropriately disclosed her version of the agreement before the opening lead. North was apparently playing a private convention known to her (and East) but not to South. East had all of the relevant information before the opening lead. The Committee agreed that West would have been very unlikely to double 6A even had the auction been different. The table result of 64 made six, plus 980 for N/S, was allowed to stand. The merit of the appeal was discussed and a close decision was reached to return E/W's deposit.

Regarding the table Director's statement to East that she should have called him during the auction, the Committee consulted with a Senior Tournament Director. He disagreed strongly with the table Director's instruction. The appropriate time to call the Director would have been at the end of the auction, when North announced the failure to Alert.

The Facts: 4 doubled went down two, plus 500 for N/S. The Stop Card had apparently been used. E/W stated that South broke tempo for a few seconds more than ten. N/S stated that the tempo break was no longer than ten seconds. The Director ruled that the double would not be allowed and changed the contract to 4v down two, plus 200 for N/S.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. E/W did not attend the hearing. The facts were in dispute. Specifically East's use of the Stop Card and South's pause after the bid. N/S both agreed that East had taken a long time to bid  $4\Psi$ . North said that when East bid  $4\Psi$ , he simultaneously put his bid, and the Stop Card, on the table. He then immediately removed the Stop Card. South did not see the Stop Card at all. When she was aware that a bid had been made, she paused for what she considered to be the requisite time and then passed. South said that she considered her pass automatic. There was no reason for her to break tempo. North said that his style was to always have four spades for a takeout double unless he had a very good hand. When he overcalled 2\* it was with the intention of doubling hearts at whatever level they were bid for takeout. He considered his actions to be automatic.

The Committee Decision: The Committee asked the Directing Staff to describe the correct use of the Stop Card. They were told that the correct procedure is to place the Stop Card and the bid on the table. ACBL rules are that the next player should try to bid after ten seconds. The skip-bidder does not "control" his LHO by use of the Stop Card. Having dealt with that issue, the Committee then determined that, on the facts as presented, and given E/W's absence, they could not establish that a break in tempo beyond the ten seconds had occurred, the Director's ruling notwithstanding. There was unanimous agreement that, even had there been a hesitation, a player of North's ability would unquestionably have doubled 4v at his second turn. There was no logical alternative to that action. The Committee therefore restored the table result, 4♥ doubled down two, plus 500 for N/S

North, with no outside entry, disdained the heart lead and opted for the +9 as his opening shot. That went to the queen, king and ace. It appeared that I needed the A onside or to make a winning guess in hearts on the automatic heart switch by South.

Rather than running diamonds in the futile hope that the expert defenders would discard poorly, I immediately led a spade to the king and South's ace. Back came the ¥10, as expected, and I played the jack, misguessing, as usual. When North won the ♥Q, it looked like down two or three.

After long thought, however, North misread the position and returned a club, taken by dummy's jack. Now I ran the diamonds, reaching this end position:
