 get out her way.
"That's wonderful, Elaine! Now, let's go get lunch."
"Wow, red points! You know, Leslie, red is my favorite color. I look really good in red, too."

I could see that this was going to take a while. "Well, I think the restaurant's soup du jour is tomato. You should be ecstatic. Let's go."

We got her matchpoint scores, prize and a hand record and were finally on our way. Wryly, I noted that we walked on red carpet. As we entered the dining room, I saw that the curtains, chairs and menus were also in red. I finally realized that I had entered (eerie music swells) "The Red Zone."

After placing our orders, we picked up our hand records. Glancing around the room, I noticed a familiar face two tables away from us. "Pssst, Elaine. See that guy over there? That's Paul Soloway. He has over 40,000 masterpoints!"
"Really?" Her eyes widened. "Do you know how many of them are red?"

Masterpoints are awarded in certain colors, and you must have a minimum number of points in a variety of colors to reach Life Master status. The most common is black points, which you can win in a club duplicate game. Most silver points

Bidding commentary: West's passed-hand takeout double shows 9-11 HCP, plus support for the unbid suits. In addition, West is likely to have four hearts, the unbid major. North's jump to 2 NT is "conventional." It is the equivalent of a limit raise because a jump to $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ after a takeout double is considered preemptive. South, with a minimum and balanced hand (the pits), signs off at $3 \boldsymbol{n}$.

Defensive commentary: West cashes three hearts and shifts to the $\bullet \mathrm{J}$.

Play commentary: As South, you see that
are awarded at sectional tournaments, but they are also available in special games at clubs. The games are referred to as STaCs (Sectional Tournaments at Clubs). The elusive red and gold points come from regional tournaments and NABCs.

New requirements for attaining Life Master status will take effect Jan. 1 for players who join after Dec. 31 or who let their memberships lapse after that date before becoming Life Masters. Current members who maintain active status can qualify under existing rules. Under the new rules, players will need 500 masterpoints with at least 50 gold; another 50 red or gold; 75 silver and 75 black. Current requirements are 300 total points with at least 25 gold, another 25 red or gold, 50 silver and 50 black.

Two ways to mine for gold points at this NABC:

1) Knockouts: Also known as KOs. Scored by IMPs (as are Swiss teams), your team plays a session against another team (see Tournament Terminology below). Whoever wins that match advances to the next round. Usually there are four or more rounds. If you win two matches, you will win some gold points. This is the easiest way to win your gold points.
2) Section top or overall placing in Strat A or B of a two-session open pairs. My first two gold

West, a passed hand, has already turned up with 10 HCP, so East must have both black kings. There is still a chance. Win the $\bullet$, cash the $\wedge A$, continue with the $\star A$ and $\bullet K$, stripping that suit, and exit a spade. On a good day, East will have $\uparrow \mathrm{K} x$ and be forced to return a club. Knowing East has the $\approx \mathrm{K}$ makes it easy to play the $\approx \mathrm{Q}$ and make the contract. ## Tournament Terminology 101

If you're confused by the terms used to describe the different types of bridge events played at clubs and tournaments, you're not alone. Here is a list of some common bridge events with explanations.

Knockout teams: an event in which one team of four, five or six players - with four playing at a time - plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out," and the winners play other winners until only one winning team remains.

The length of a KO match may vary from a single session to a full day (the Vanderbilt and Spingold) to a multi-day event (the Bermuda Bowl).

Bracketed knockout teams: a KO in which teams are divided into groups - usually of 8,16 or 32 teams - based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group - Bracket I - and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

Compact knockout teams: a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.
points were achieved this way. Being first in your section in Stratum A (open) or B (usually up to 2000) will net you some gold points for that session. Placing in the final for both sessions of the event will also win gold. But you need to be very good or very lucky (sometimes both) to be successful in this event.

*K, play a low club from dummy hoping East has the jack.

If a passed hand turns up 10 HCP , play the partner for any missing queen, king or ace. If a passed hand turns up with 11 HCP, play the partner for any missing jack, queen, king or ace. If a passed hand turns up with 12 HCP , you are playing against a very conservative bidder!

Swiss teams: an event in which a team of four, five or six players - with four playing at a time - plays other teams in seven-, eight- or nineboard matches. Team A sits North-South at Table 1 and East-West at Table 2 while Team B sits East-West at Table 1 and North-South at Table 2. The results are compared and scored by International Match Points (IMPs).

Pairings for the first round are random. Pairings for succeeding rounds are determined by a team's win-loss record or victory point total.

International Match Points (IMPs): the most common method of scoring Swiss teams matches. Scoring example: if Team A scores plus 620 for bidding and making $4 \boldsymbol{A}$ on a particular deal and Team B scores only plus 170 (they didn't bid the game), the difference is 450 - which converts to 10 IMPs. The IMP chart is shown on the inside of your convention card.

Victory Points (VPs): a method of scoring Swiss teams matches. After the scores are compared and converted to IMPs, the IMP total is converted to victory points. A team's VP total may be used to determine its next opponents and its final standing.

| Pass | 4* | All Pass |  | hearts and gave his partner a ruff. She exited with the $\star$ Q to Mayefsky's singleton king. He played a spade to dummy's queen, cashed the $\because A$ and ruffed a club to hand, then ran the rest of his trumps.

In the three-card ending, declarer had the A 97 opposite $\bullet$ K J 5. Mayefsky knew Bruce had five hearts, and he had followed to two spades and three clubs. Inferring that West's $\Leftrightarrow 10$ was a true card, that gave him $2=5=3=3$ shape, meaning he was a slight favorite to hold the $\diamond$ Q.

Backing his judgment, Mayefsky played a diamond to the king and followed with the jack, pinning East's doubleton 10 to bring home a tough contract.

## ACBL bans electronic devices in national events

The ACBL Board of Directors approved a comprehensive ban on electronic devices for all national level events, but not regional or Intermediate Newcomer contests:

Electronic devices, excluding health related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.

These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.

A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.

Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

Participants in the following contests will be reminded not to approach the playing area with a personal electronic device in their possession, even if the device is turned off: all flights of the Grand National Teams, the von Zedtwitz, Bruce and Young Life Master Pairs, the Spingold Knockout Teams, both Mini-Spingolds, the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams, the Truscott/USPC Senior Swiss Teams, the Wernher Open Pairs, the NABC+ Fast Pairs, the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, the Open Swiss Teams and the National 199er Pairs.

The Facts: The director was called after the play was concluded. The E-W explanation was confirmed by what appeared on the convention card. West chose to bid $2 \uparrow$ because he thought it was more likely to be partner's suit. South said that he thought $2 \boldsymbol{\sim}$ required an Alert as pass or correct. E-W believed that heart tolerance was implied by the free $2 \wedge$ bid and it was not pass or correct.

The Ruling: The director determined that there was no infraction or failure to Alert. Therefore, the table result of $3 \wedge$ by South making six, N-S plus 230, was allowed to stand.

The Appeal: N-S appealed. All four players attended the hearing. In response to a question by South (before South bid $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ ), North stated that East had explained after some thought that West must have heart tolerance.

East stated that he had explained West's bid as willing to play $2 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$ or $3 \boldsymbol{v}$. East denied a significant pause before the explanation.

North responded to East's statement by indicating that such an explanation was, in effect, "pass or correct."

The committee determined that the $2 \bullet$ bid is a Mid-Chart convention and, as such, required a pre-Alert before the start of play. No pre-Alert was given.

The Decision: The committee determined that in spite of the failure to pre-Alert the $2 \bullet$ bid and the failure to Alert the $2 \wedge$ bid, the damage to $\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{S}$ was self-inflicted. Per Law 21B3, E-W gained no advantage from the irregularities. Therefore, the committee allowed the table result of $3 \boldsymbol{a}$ by South making six, N-S plus 230, to stand for both sides.

The committee determined that the appeal had merit.

## Russell tops 20,000 MPs

John Russell of North Barrington IL crossed the 20,000-masterpoint milestone at the Summer NABC in Washington. Russell is a Grand Life Master who won the Silver Ribbon Pairs in 1997 playing with Chuck
 Said of Nashville. Russell also scored a second-place finish in the same event in 2003 with partner Bernace De Young of Miami.

Russell is a practicing certified public accountant.

## A guide to successful partnerships

Bridge is a
partnership game. This is the first tenet of bridge. It is the basis for all subsequent understandings agreements and happy cohabitation at the bridge table.


## Choosing a partner

What do you look for in a partner? Ideally, you want someone you can be in sync with, whose mind set is similar to yours. You want a partner you can communicate with, argue with, laugh with, and in the end, start over with.

How does your mind work? Do you like a bid to mean the same thing every time? Are you very literal? Very creative? Do you like to experiment? These are factors that should influence how you complete your convention card, how you choose your partners, how you approach the game, but these factors are often overlooked.

If you want a simple game, a light hobby, a straightforward convention card, you are not going to be happy with someone who takes the game very seriously, wants to try any and all conventions, and analyzes each deal to the nth degree. Know yourself and choose your partners wisely.

## Choosing a system

Now you and your partner must choose and learn the language with which you are going to communicate. Go over your convention card. Ask questions.

What are the best conventions? They are the ones that suit you, your personality, your game, your approach to the game. They are the ones you and your partner agree on and discuss thoroughly.

It is amazing the different ways there are to play almost every convention. Don't just ask, "Do you play Gerber?" Once you agree to play Gerber, ask your partner, how do you play Gerber? Do you play straight Gerber, do you play it only over notrump, do you play 1430 mini-maxi Gerber, etc. Almost all partnership misunderstandings arise from lack of thorough discussion.

Remember, too, you are striving to create a unified system - one that works and flows together, that meshes. Check for duplications. Do you have two bids for the same hand type? Does the card seem more than you can handle right now? Too much too soon is a common source of misunderstandings and friction. You want partnership rapport, not necessarily every convention in the book!

## Keeping a partner

One factor that should remain constant, however, is flexibility. That convention card is only a piece of paper. A system is not written in concrete. It can be amended, changed, modified. It can be screwed up in a ball and thrown away!

If a system or convention isn't working for you and your partner, change it, try something new, experiment. Ask an expert, read a book, take lessons.

If you are a serious student of the game, keep a log with all your bidding agreements. Upgrade it regularly. Go over it with your partner at least once a month. Constant memory enhancement
helps reduce misunderstandings. Ask if you are both happy with this system. A happy partner is one of the keys to success.

## Misunderstandings

And finally, when misunderstandings do occur - as they inevitably will - stay calm and cool. Ask yourself what you would want your partner to say to you if you had made that stupid bid! After all, you both have the same goal in mind. These misunderstandings can be good learning tools and engender illuminating discussions. A "bad" bid can lead to bigger and better things. You may even thank your partner for his or her mistake!!

## End result

So, partners, discuss your goals, learn your own special bridge language. Be flexible and open-minded. Use your misunderstandings to lead to even greater understandings. Then you will always have a good time at the bridge table, with a great chance for success.

## For want of a club

Roz Teukolsky found herself in $6 \vee$ on this deal from the second qualifying session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Open Pairs.

6 NT is the best slam, but $6 v$ on a trump lead was very awkward. Roz put in the $\vee 10$, and when it was covered by the jack, she was in deep doodoo.

She recovered nicely, however. She played a heart to dummy's ace, entered hand with the $\bullet$ A and drew trumps, then cashed another high diamond. This was the ending:

North had made a fatal error by pitching a club. Now declarer could find the very stylish counter of cashing the $\diamond K$ and exiting with the \&J. North won and was endplayed. Whichever black suit he returned gave declarer two extra tricks. Had North retained the $\& 4$, he could have won the club and exited with a low club to take trick 13 with his remaining club honor.

## Final-board blues

 By Barry RigalThe last board of the session is often one where avoidable mistakes are made - how can you wait those extra 30 seconds to read the burners?

At our table, the opportunity for careless play arose. Let's see who took advantage of their opportunities.

After East's reasonable but ill-timed 1v overcall, we were warned against playing 3 NT . As North, I knew that Eric Leong, my partner, might be using $3 \boldsymbol{A}$ as a try for $3 N T$, but I thought bidding the notrump game was against the odds.

Indeed, Leong had already assured himself a reasonable result simply by playing $5 \star$.

On the lead of the $\downarrow 2$ (third and fifth), East won the jack and played a top heart. Leong ruffed, then guessed very well to play trumps from the top. West won the $\boldsymbol{\bullet} \mathbf{Q}$ - dummy pitching the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$ and East the $\checkmark$ A - and exited with a heart.

Leong ruffed, advanced the $\diamond$ Jand went up with the king, cashed the A , noting the fall of the 9 , then ran the 10 , pitching a spade, and claimed 11 tricks when it held.

So who made the mistake?
East deserves some blame. The lead of the 2 should have alerted East to the fact that no more hearts were cashing. That being so, although a spade switch could pick up a vulnerable queen in partner's hand, declarer was surely marked with only four spades - so dummy's threatening diamond spots required a spade shift at trick two to dislodge that entry from dummy.

If East shifts to a spade, declarer will give up the spade entry at once, or West will dislodge it later.

Finally, might West have considered a devious shift to the J J trick six? If declarer gets that right and works out how to play diamonds from there, good luck to him!

## Eats，shoots \＆Leaves

Eats，Shoots \＆Leaves：The Zero Tolerance Approach to Punctuation is a non－fiction book written by Lynne Truss．In the book，published in 2003，Truss bemoans the state of punctuation in the United Kingdom and the United States，and describes how rules are being relaxed in today＇s society．Her goal is to remind readers of the importance of punctuation in the English language by mixing humor and instruction．

The title of the book is an amphibology－a verbal fallacy arising from an ambiguous grammatical construction－and derived from a joke on bad punctuation：

A panda walks into a café．He orders a sandwich，eats it，then draws a gun and proceeds to fire it at the other patrons．
＂Why？＂asks the confused，surviving waiter， as the panda makes towards the exit．The panda produces a badly punctuated wildlife manual and tosses it over his shoulder．
＂Well，I＇m a panda，＂he says．＂Look it up．＂
The waiter turns to the relevant entry and，sure enough，finds an explanation：
＂Panda．Large black－and－white bear－like mammal，native to China．Eats，shoots and leaves．＂

You may be wondering why I have mentioned this，but I＇ll come to that in a moment．With the Rabbi deciding that a trip from Santa Fe to Washington was a bridge tournament too far，I had to decide how to occupy my free time on Friday． Picking up a few stories from the first session of the Life Master Pairs was on the agenda（when the Spingold starts on Monday，I have plans for a series of articles entitled＂The Rabbis of Summer，＂although to some extent this depends on discovering an appropriately composed team）．

Anyhow，I decided to watch a few deals involving the German superstars Sabine Auken and Daniela von Arnim－I assure you it had nothing to do with the fact that they were sitting North－South and are easy on the eye．

By now I expect you are ready for a few deals，so turning reluctantly to the play．．．．

It＇s not clear if East＇s support double（a convention that in my opinion is a candidate for inclusion in 25 Conventions You Don＇t Need to Know）might have made it possible for West to bid 3NT with slightly better clubs．As it was，East－ West sold out to $3 \boldsymbol{a}$ and discovered that letting your opponents play in their optimum contract is not the way to generate a significant number of matchpoints．Declarer had to lose two trumps and two diamonds，plus 140.

On a spade lead，East will win and might switch to the queen or ten of diamonds，and if West leads a heart declarer will put in the jack and then try a low spade，but neither lead is obvious， and West selected the $\because \mathrm{J}$ ．With declarer having no sure entry to hand，she had to run the club suit． With seven discards to find from dummy she went for the maximum，parting with four hearts and three diamonds before running the $₫ \mathrm{Q}$ ．

East won with the king and switched to the five of diamonds，but West had discarded two diamonds，and after he took the $\star$ ，declarer had the rest，plus 660 being more than useful．

With an awkward hand，East decided to start at a low level，but made a strength－showing bid at his next turn．When West（having rejected a raise to $2 *$ on the first round）now came to life，East naturally went on to game．North gave some though to bidding on（the winning action here）but she had just enough defense to persuade her otherwise．Minus 400 was a modest score for North－South．

At this juncture the point of my introduction may become clearer as I left the table to take a walk over to the Zoo with Ray Lee（CEO of Master Point Press）．During the course of our visit，we checked out the Giant Pandas，who were actively engaged in munching their way through vast quantities of bamboo．By the time we got back to the hotel the session was coming to an end．

A glance at the convention card suggests that this was an awkward pattern for North to describe， and South chose a bad moment to take a view by passing a forcing bid．With 3NT making，North－ South achieved one of their poorest results of the session．

You might make $5 \boldsymbol{*}$ on the North－South cards， but it＇s not exactly a gimme．On a diamond lead， declarer has to win in hand and play a low heart． If the $\mathbf{Q}$ takes the trick，declarer has to hazard the spade finesse．


With such a defensively orientated hand，I＇m not sure East should have bid $3 \boldsymbol{v}$ ，and he paid a heavy price．

South led the 4 ．Declarer took North’s jack with the ace and played the $\& \mathrm{Q}$ ．North won with the ace and switched to her diamond．South won with the ace and returned the 9 for North to ruff． South ruffed the spade return and gave North another diamond ruff．A third spade was ruffed by declarer＇s queen and overruffed by South，who cashed the $\uparrow \mathrm{K}$ for three down，plus 300 and a virtual top．

My featured pair posted around $60 \%$ ，but I also picked up a couple of interesting stories over dinner．

I imagine most pairs bid these hands to $6 \vee$ or 6 NT．With nine top tricks，the only issue on the deal is how to tackle the heart suit．The best chance for four tricks is to start with the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ ， intending to finesse the jack on the next round． When the 10 comes up，you play low from North and cover East＇s card．Depending on the caliber of your opponents，you might decide to play West for $\checkmark$ Q 10，but any Life Master worth their salt should be up to dropping the 10 from $\vee 10 \mathrm{x}$ ．

I leave you to draw your own conclusions about anyone who tackled this suit by starting with a low heart to the ace．

I＇ll leave you with what was probably the wildest hand of the session：


It's a matter of individual taste as to how many clubs East should bid on the first round. Over the modest overcall South was stretching a long way with $3 \boldsymbol{\downarrow}$. I wonder if South would have found the heart lead that is necessary to defeat $5 \boldsymbol{*}$ ? (So perhaps North should have bid $3 \bullet$ on the way to $4 \boldsymbol{A}$ ?) When North led the $\star 10$, declarer made an overtrick.

I'm off for a Bamboo on Rye.

Only two masterpoints shy of making Life Master, Catherine Hess of Honolulu tried to buy an entry in the Young 0-1500 Life Master Pairs. She was turned down for the obvious reason, so she and her partner, Peter Galbraith, also of Honolulu, entered a side game on Friday. When the session was over, Hess had 2.24 masterpoints - and her gold card.

Walter Mitnick of Owings Mills MD is now a Bronze Life Master, having gone over 500 masterpoints in a knockout teams. His partner was David Ruppert of Towson MD. Their teammates were Michael Ford of Severna Park MD and David Sterner of Odenton MD.

Joan White of Fairfax VA is a new Life Master after earning 3.46 gold points in the Saturday-Sunday Knockout Teams. She was playing with Jacqualine Newman of Stroudsburg PA. Their teammates were Robert Poriss of South Ogden UT and Luigi Calicchia of Farmington UT.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word - such as "transfer" - and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.


## Today is Canada Day

Canada, the northernmost country in the ACBL, has a long and distinguished bridge history filled with the names of great players. With more than 17,000 ACBL members (out of 160,000 league-wide), Canada has some of the most active and loyal players at the club and tournament level.

There are four ACBL districts in Canada: District 1 (Quebec and the Maritime provinces), District 2 (Ontario and southern Manitoba), District 18 (Alberta, Saskatchewan, and northern Alberta) and District 19 (British Columbia).

Toronto, Ontario is a regular hive of bridge activities, and the city has been the host of some of the most successful NABCs in history. The 1986 Summer NABC in Toronto, for example, attracted more than 21,000 tables of play, making it the second-largest NABC ever. Other Canadian cities to serve as NABC hosts include Vancouver, Winnipeg and Montreal.

Canada offers a slate of terrific regional events each year, including Penticton on beautiful Lake Okanagan in British Columbia. Penticton regularly attracts more than 3000 tables each year, making it the regional largest tournament in Canada - the Gatlinburg of the North.

Bridge greats such as Eric Murray, Sami Kehela, Percy Sheardown, Doug Drury, (originally from Canada), Peter Pender (ditto), Agnes Gordon, Eric Kokish and George Mittelman are familiar names to all students of the game. New talent, however, testifies to Canada's place in the world of bridge: Nicholas L'Ecuyer, Gavin Wolpert, Vince Demuy, Daniel Korbel and David Grainger are all stars of the game.

On this deal from the second qualifying session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs, Canadians Daniel Korbel and Jonathan Steinberg defended $4 \boldsymbol{a}$ on this layout in which declarer's line of play made the spot cards in the trump suit very important late in the deal:

The auction to $4 \boldsymbol{a}$ was uncontested. Korbel, West, led the $\leqslant$ K. Declarer ruffed and played a low club to the queen and ace. Steinberg, East, continued with the A, declarer again ruffing. Two more rounds of clubs allowed declarer to shed a heart from dummy, but when declarer played the $\vee \mathrm{A}$, East ruffed the king and played a third diamond. Declarer ruffed yet again and played a heart toward dummy.

Korbel ruffed with the 7, overruffed by dummy's king. This was the position:

Declarer can succeed at this stage by playing a trump to the closed hand, extracting West's last trump, and ruffing a heart in the dummy, but declarer ruffed another diamond in his hand (East pitching a club) and tried to ruff a heart in dummy. West, however, ruffed high in front of the dummy and played yet another diamond. Declarer tried ruffing with dummy's 4, but East overruffed with the 5 , and took the last trick with the $\uparrow 3$, smothering dummy’s $\boldsymbol{A}$ 2!

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may
use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a $1 / 6$ board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.
